South Daytona fire chief retires; city will not fill position

SOUTH DAYTONA — Wishing to spend more time with his family, Fire Chief Tad Derr recently called it quits after working for the City for 23 years.

"I was at that point of my life where I was ready to make some changes," he said in a phone inter-

view. "My oldest daughter is in college in Miami and my youngest daughter is a senior in high school. I wanted to spend more time with my family."

Chief Derr, 47, retired from his post on Sept. 30. He worked for the City since 1988 and served as fire chief since October, 2009.

City spokeswoman Jeanne Willard said the City would not look

to fill the chief's position or take on an interim chief at this time due to budgetary constraints.

City Manager Joseph Yarbrough will assume the fire department's administrative duties. Meanwhile, fire commanders

Officials consider 'smaller scale' ideas for Riverwalk

PORT ORANGE — The vision for Riverwalk is changing with the times.

When city leaders met recently for two public meetings to discuss the project — developing 35 acres of prime real estate along the Halifax River — they looked at considering a smaller-scale, incrementally-developed project rather than trying to develop the whole property at once — something they believe is more "realistic" in today's economic climate.

To get the oft-delayed project off the ground, the

Town Center Community Redevelopment Agency Board evaluated policy issues related to Riverwalk to accommodate a plan presented by local developer Buddy LaCour that includes a floating restaurant, a Walgreens drive-through pharmacy, a hotel, a family entertainment center, and the reopening of a marina for public use.

Board members still believe Riverwalk should be a mixed-use destination with shops, restaurants and possibly residences. They agreed they would not bind a developer by setting minimum height standards for buildings or minimum

acreage requirements for an individual project.

It's a change in pace from the City's original vision of Riverwalk — a project dating back to 1998 — as a unified, master planned project, which was to include, among other things, the development of two high-rise condominium buildings.

One thing that hasn't changed is officials' wishes to retain ownership of the City's stake in riverfront land, where a public park will be developed.

Mr. LaCour proposed a land swap deal in which he would exchange six riverfront parcels he owns for

about 11 city-owned parcels at Dunlawton Avenue and U.S. 1.

Donna Steinebach, assistant to the city manager, said the City is interested in securing the riverfront parcels they currently do not own.

"LaCour's proposal

depends upon acquisition and transition of some city property," she said. "It would be dead in the water if there wasn't some sort of exchange contemplated."

A land exchange would require the City to obtain current appraisals of the

State, local job markets improve slightly

VOLUSIA COUNTY — The national, state and local job markets continue slogging toward better days. But no one is certain what better days will look like.

According to September employment figures recently released by the state, Florida's unemployment rate dropped from 10.7 percent in August to 10.6 percent in September. It's down 1.3 percent since January. Volusia's September unemployment rate was 10.8 percent, slightly higher than the state average. Last year, Volusia's September unemployment rate was 12.2 percent.

Economic and employment progress are happening, according to Rick Frasier, president of the Center for Business Excellence, the local branch of the state's Agency for Workforce Innovation. However, he said unusual circumstances have kept economists, businesses and consumers alike guessing, which seems to be slowing recovery. Economists hesitate to make predictions, so businesses hold off on hiring, and consumers put off vacations and purchases.

"It's the most unique economic

situation in my lifetime," Mr. Frasier said. "I've never quite seen anything like this. I think economists will say the same thing. There's agreement there'll be a recovery, but they don't know what that recovery will look like or how long it'll take."

Volusia's July unemployment rate was 11 percent. In August, it dropped to 10.9 percent. Flagler County is fairing much worse, with an unemployment rate of 14.6 percent, the highest in the state. Additionally, Brevard County—hard hit by the ending of the Space Shuttle program without an aggressive replacement—has an unemployment rate of 11.6 percent. Volusians are competing with job seekers crossing county lines who are increasingly willing to travel farther for work opportunities.

Rebecca Rust, the Agency for Workforce Innovation's chief economist, said in a teleconference that Florida's job numbers continue fairing poorly against the nation's. However, she said the state might have started trending better than the county. In September, the national seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate was 9.1 percent. However, the national

Smyrna Surfari Club to hold fundraiser, film premiere

A new documentary tells the story of the city's pioneer surfers and the longstanding club

NEW SMYRNA BEACH — Nearly 50 years ago, a determined group of teenagers went before the New Smyrna Beach City Commission to fight for their right to surf. Commissioners were considering an outright ban

on the new sport, afraid that it might threaten the city's reputation as the "World's Safest Bathing Beach."

Although the teens won their appeal, they were designated only a block's-length of beach to share amongst themselves.

Today, should a similar

group of young surfers approach the City Commission, they would be met by Mayor Adam Barringer, whom the youngsters probably would have seen surfing right next to them.

"Surfing is one of the main driving forces of New Smyrna Beach," said Mr. Barringer, who has surfed

on and off in New Smyrna Beach since moving to the city in 1979. "It's a major part of our culture and has a much decorated history here."

That history will be on display Friday night at Clancy's Cantina, 301 Flagler Ave., in a two-hour video documentary detail-

ing the journey the sport has taken in New Smyrna Beach, from almost being outlawed in the 1960s to helping make New Smyrna Beach one of today's most famous and consistent surf spots on the East Coast.

The documentary will

Film features oyster company

Port Orange Government TV channel 199 on Bright House cable will premiere "Sands Fish & Oyster Company" at 8 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 4. Viewers can enjoy an interesting historical look at a local company that impacted the community with jobs but also earned Port Orange the title of the "Oyster Capital of the World" from 1917 through the mid-1950s.

The Sands Fish & Oyster Company provided oysters to restaurants and markets along the eastern seaboard from Florida to Maryland. Located on Halifax Drive in Port Orange, the company was established and operated by William E. Sands. Not only did Sands Fish & Oyster Company produce hundreds of gallons of oysters per week during the season, but they also sold clams, shrimp, and fish from the waters of the Halifax River.

Dialogue for the production is provided by William E. Sands, III, the grandson of



the company's founder. Although he was raised in Holly Hill, William spent many days and weekends with his grandfather at the oyster house. He gives an inside perspective on the oyster business and offers details on how the oysters were harvested, cleaned, and shipped. William also showcases actual tools used, an original oyster lease sign, and the famous "Sands Dollar" that was given to employees in exchanged for each gallon of oysters

shucked. This production is pogTV's newest installment of the Port Orange Oral History Project that collects the stories of interesting people who have had a historical, cultural or political impact on Port Orange.

Giles, Paul Nelson and Tim O'Dell will lead operational duties with assistance from fire inspector Sandi Smitherman.

"The fire department has

three very experienced commanders who are well qualified to handle the day-to-day operations of the fire department," Ms. Willard said. "In addition, our full-time fire inspector will also assist with administrative duties."

She said the City followed a similar procedure when

Chief Derr's predecessor, Jim Quinn, retired in 2007.

His successors thanked the chief for his service and wished him well in his retirement.

"The Fire Department would like to thank retired Chief Derr for his service to the department and the community and wish him well in all future endeavors," Commander Giles said.

"He's served the city for a long time, and I wish him well," Mr. Yarbrough said.

Though Chief Derr has worked with the City for 23 years, not all of them were spent in the fire department. His first two years were with the city's public works department.

Following Chief Quinn's retirement, Chief Derr supervised the fire department under the rank of senior commander for nearly two years before he was promoted to fire chief in 2009.

A young couple drives north on Beach Street leaving behind the last homes and passing through the State Park. The lights of the Tomoka River Bridge are the last on the highway. The moonless night is black — pitch black.

Once deep into the hardwood hammock the lovers turn into an ancient logging road that is now almost grown over. As they pull away from the blacktop the fingers of the palmetto fronds brush each side of their car. It is a cool fall night. Just right to park with the windows down.

Once stopped, all of the car lights are turned off. Not even the dull glow of a radio dial breaks the inky darkness. chorus. Now the strange glow grows larger. It is rapidly bearing down on them. Surely whoever it is will soon stop. In an instant it is upon them and splits into two with a light going along either side of the car. Terrified, they hold each other tightly and watch through the rear window as the light reunites and soon disappears.

The young lovers have just experienced the famous Tomoka Lights, a legend in Northeastern Volusia County.

Now, you may believe this to be a Halloween tale of my own invention, but you would be dead wrong. Sure, I embellished it some for entertainment purposes, but the facts in my story have been retold many times. Almost as long as writers have been inspired to take up pen and paper to chronicle the history of this area there has been mention of the mystical Tomoka Lights.

At first it would be easy to pass these sightings of as

Schools awarded for volunteer involvement

VOLUSIA COUNTY — The proverb says, "It takes a village to raise a child."

That's the idea behind the Florida Department of Education's Five Star School Award. This year, 55 of Volusia's 69 public and

charter schools received the honor recognizing their efforts to increase community involvement. New Smyrna Beach High School has taken home the honor for its third consecutive year.

"I think the bottom line is that we are trying very hard to open our doors to the community," Principal Jim Tager said. "Part of the award that I relish is the fact we get a lot of community involvement at New Smyrna Beach High. We're very blessed we're a community school."

Mr. Tager noted that the school had more than 19,000 youth volunteer hours last school year. Adults donated more than 15,000 hours. Those volunteer hours went a long way in helping the school receive the recognition.

"How you get the Five Star is developing a lot of volunteer hours," he said. "It's about bringing the community into our school."

The award was started in the 1990s. By 1999, Volusia

had seven schools receive it. The number has climbed ever since. One of the first Volusia schools to receive the award was Indian Lake Elementary in Edgewater. That school has received the recognition 17 years straight, the most of any Volusia schools.

According to the Florida Department of Education, schools must fulfill 29 criteria in five areas to receive the recognition. Those areas are business partnerships, family involvement, volunteerism, student community services and school advisory councils.

As Craig Zablo takes the helm this year at Campbell Middle School in Daytona Beach, he's walked into the school's seventh year receiving the Five Star School Award. He said the consistent recognition give him much confidence in his new staff.

"Campbell is an excellent school," he said. "It really is. (The Five Star Award) is just a testament to the fact that Campbell reaches out

to all our stakeholders."

Mr. Zablo said the state education department recognizing community and parent involvement is particularly important for schools such as Campbell.

"Campbell has the highest percentage of kids on free and reduced lunch," he said. "We're not a wealthy school, but we do some wonderful things

with the kids."

Sweetwater Elementary School in Port Orange has taken home the Five Star 16 years straight. Pat Miller is the principal.

Port Orange Elementary is on its 15th year, Bonnie Gyarfus leads that school. Deltona's Timbercrest Elementary follows with 14 years. Spruce Creek Elementary is boasting its 13th year — Sandra Kaye is principal — while the town's high school has brought home the award 11 years. Dr. Todd Sparger is the principal there.

Tomoka Elementary in Ormond Beach, with Julie Johnson at the helm, is also a 13-year recipient, as are Deltona Lakes and Discovery elementary schools. Daytona's Ortona Elementary is on its 12th year, with Marie Stratton now leading the school. Sugar Mill Elementary in Port Orange is also on its 12th year. Janet Garzia is the principal.

Daytona's R.J. Longstreet Elementary is an 11-year recipient of the Five Star Award. There are seven schools celebrating 10 years of receiving the recognition: South Daytona Elementary, Coronado Beach Elementary, Creekside Middle, and DeBary, Enterprise and Friendship elementaries, along with Galaxy Middle.

Quick Answers to Common Legal Questions

Permanent Hearing Loss from Airbag Deployments in Auto Accidents

The Introduction of Automobile Safety Features

With the invention of the automobile followed the inevitable occurrence of auto accidents. As a result, manufacturers and scientists have been developing ways to minimize injuries to people involved in car accidents. New safety features are developed and introduced almost yearly in an attempt to reduce and ultimately eliminate injuries to occupants of automobiles during an accident. Such safety developments include antilock brakes, head rests, shatter proof windows, seatbelts and airbags.

The Unintended Consequences of Airbags

It has been estimated that there have been over two million airbag deployments in the last 10 years. Modern airbags fully deploy in approximately 20-30 milliseconds, with an incredible amount of speed and force that is necessary to deploy it quickly enough to have it inflate before the vehicle occupant strikes the steering wheel or dashboard during an automobile accident. However, deploying an object at such an incredible speed and force often comes with a cost. From an orthopedic standpoint, studies have shown there has been an increase in broken sternums, broken ribs, forearm fractures and shoulder injuries as a result of the power of the inflating airbag. However, studies also show that there is another, more unexpected result from this phenomenon: the effect that airbags sometimes have on an occupant's hearing.

Hearing Loss

The amount of noise associated with airbag deployment from a car accident varies with the type, size and location of the airbag. Deployment of a driver's side front airbag will generate mean peak sound pressure levels of approximately 160 dB (decibels). A passenger side front airbag will generate mean peak sound pressure level of 168 dB, while dual airbag deployments create a mean peak sound pressure level of 170 dB. When you compare these with the level of decibels that can cause hearing loss, the problem becomes evident. Studies have shown that the pain threshold from noise is about 140dB and that a single exposure to sound pressure of this level can cause permanent, severe hearing loss. The most recent development of side airbags as optional equipment in some luxury vehicles has only enhanced this problem. The deployment of a side airbag generates a mean peak sound air pressure of 178 dB. That is more than 20% higher than the level necessary to cause permanent severe hearing loss. Add in the fact that the side air bag deploys closer to the ear and the danger becomes escalated.

Steps to Take After an Accident

If you or someone you love has been involved in a car crash or truck crash that resulted in air bag deployment, it is important to have your hearing checked for any abnormalities. If you have ringing in your ears or experience dizziness, remember to seek immediate medical attention and know that you can always call an attorney for further help. 

I can't even see my dining room table because it is filled with notes about local eco-businesses and plans for three upcoming events I'm helping to plan. Crafts in various shades of orange, black and green made of up-cycled and eco-friendly materials are scattered anywhere I can stash them away from the reach of my own two tiny munchkins. Organized chaos is about the only way to describe it and yet, I wouldn't have it any other way.

What am I, do you ask? Besides being a tad bit nutty with a possible nonprofit addiction, I am a Green Halloween coordinator.

Green Halloween is a national, non-profit, grassroots, community initiative striving to create healthier and more eco-friendly holidays starting with Halloween. The goal is to show families how easy and affordable it can be to keep the fun, while losing the unhealthy and non-earth-friendly traditions. It's not about telling people how they should

celebrate — it's about inspiring them to make choices that make sense for their families, their budgets and their schedules.

The top reasons why so many of us would give so much of our free time to promote this initiative is very clear: Our children, our people, our planet.

Today's trick-or-treaters have a life expectancy that is shorter than their parents. One in three trick-or-treaters will get diabetes in their lifetime. One third of American trick-or-treaters are overweight. Seventeen percent are considered obese.

For the people, fair trade standards ensure fair wages, and help to eliminate child slavery and vile living conditions on cocoa bean plantations.

For the planet, swapping half the costumes kids wear at Halloween would reduce annual landfill waste by 6,250 tons — the weight of 2,500 midsize cars. Organic cocoa farming conserves energy, protects water supply, prevents soil erosion.

The Green Halloween movement works. Conventional candy companies like Cadbury and Mars are adopting and transitioning towards organic and fair trade certified standards.

have increased by over 170 percent — more than one million units of healthier choices in 2010 alone.

A noticeable increase in the number of PVC-free costumes, lead-free paints, and reusable trick or treat bags are on the market.

Green Halloween of Daytona Beach's signature event is the Hallogreen. The Hallogreen incorporates just about every aspect we are working to get people to consider to make more sustainable choices. We have Eek-O Costumes contests for kids and dogs. Treat-or-Treasuring (cuz we don't trick). Our vendors are nonprofits with eco- and family-friendly missions, local agriculturists and urban farmers and growers, handmade local crafters, up-cyclers, holistic pet care advocates and businesses, natural alternatives to beauty and health, and more.

All year, I plan for this event, researching and recruiting sponsors and vendors, making connections to take care of

needed improvements (can't always tackle all of them, but we try). In the beginning, it was hard because there were very few supporters of what was then a new movement. Four years later, although I could definitely use more help (who couldn't?). I am very privileged to be sharing this mission and movement with other families in the area, who are very supportive and find ways to share the load doing whatever they can. Daytona Beach even has two new Green Halloween Co-coordinators: Elizabeth Flynn of Daytona Beach BellyDance and the FNPS Pawpaw Chapter, and Cory Trust of Aquarian Bath, and our official graphic designer is Nancy Nashed of Wind Water Arts.

"Over the month, Florida gained 23,300 jobs," Ms.

Rust said. "One of the most important facts is Florida's job growth rate has exceeded the nation for the first time since February, 2007."

Florida's unemployment rates for the previous five months are at the lowest levels since August, 2009. The unemployment rate counts all job seekers

who've actively sought work in the previous four weeks. It doesn't count discouraged workers who've suspended job hunting, or involuntarily part-time workers. According to Ms. Rust, Florida's September underutilized-workers rate is 18.4 percent. The state has 4.5 job seekers for every advertised position.

Mr. Frasier said he's consuming the optimistic September jobs report with a dash of caution.

"There are some good things to look at," he said. "But, that's only for one month. It's like walking on eggshells. We haven't seen any consistency in that growth, and that's not good."

include pictures and interviews featuring some of the pioneers of New Smyrna Beach surf, including Gordon Smith, Skipper Eppelin and Bud Wright, the "three musketeers" who were there for the entire ride.

"(Surfers) were like the Hell's Angels back in the '60s," Mr. Smith said. "Everything has come full circle now."

The documentary will be presented by the Smyrna Surfari Club, a non-profit group created in 1979 to promote the sport of surfing in New Smyrna Beach. Each year, members of the club dedicate their time and money to sponsor several surf contests and fundraising events around town.

All of the aforementioned surf pioneers are members of the group. They are joined by more than two dozen other local men and women.

Among that group is Mayor Barringer, whose membership represents a

symbol of how far the sport, and group, has come, said Mike Martin, an inaugural Surfari Club member.

"Before, guys had to go ask the mayor for permission to surf, now the mayor is one of us," Mr. Martin said. "It has come a long way."

The documentary features interviews originally filmed by Paul Auo and Rod Faulds as part of an ongoing project to document the history of surfing in Florida.

The film was edited by New Smyrna Beach High School teacher Kevin Kehoe and his television production class.

"The school took what we gave them and were able to put together something great," said Surfari Club member Jeff Crawford. "We can't thank them enough."

Now, the finished product is a two-hour trip through the city's surfing history complete with stories about everything from early rivalries with Cocoa Beach surfers to surf trips to Hawaii in the early '60s and Hurricane Dora in 1964, which produced the biggest

surf New Smyrna Beach has ever seen.

"(Dora) sat in the middle of Florida and spun for three or four days, just deciding where to go," Mr. Wright said. "It was a wave-producing machine."

Law enforcement threatened to arrest any surfer caught trying to brave the harsh conditions, but that did little to stop Mr. Wright, who charged the beach and ended up with the biggest ride of his life.

"You could have driven two trains through these waves," he said.

Throughout its 30-plus year history, the Surfari Club has donated more than \$100,000 to graduating seniors from New Smyrna Beach High School. Each year, \$1,000 and \$2,000 scholarships are awarded to up to three students based on academic performance, financial need and involvement in local surfing.

"We want to encourage kids to continue on with education," Mr. Eppelin said. "We want to give them a shove to say 'hey, there's another side (besides surf-

ing) that's important."

This year, the program will add The Surfari Spirit, an ongoing award that will honor members and friends who passed away over the previous year. The new scholarship was introduced particularly in memory of beloved teacher and surfer Frederick 'Fico' Fernandez, who died while surfing this summer.

"We're getting to the age where we may lose some more people," Mr. Martin said. "We made this to commemorate them."

The documentary will be shown tonight at 6:30 p.m. at Clancy's during the Surfari Club's 15th Annual Spooktacular Weekend. There will also be a silent auction of donated items ranging from wine baskets to collectible surfing memorabilia.

Saturday morning, the club will host its annual Spooktacular Surf Contest at the Flagler Ave. boardwalk. There will also be a costume surfing contest, in which any surfer can paddle out in a costume of choice for a

chance to win a \$100 cash prize.

Saturday night, the club will rendezvous back at Clancy's, where a raffle drawing will award one person with a brand new, custom shaped surfboard.

"It's probably our biggest weekend of the year," Mr. Martin said. "But it's also the most fun."

If the ThomasMetz case is real, it will be interesting to see if this evidence holds up in divorce court. Hill points out that a New Jersey court case earlier this year resulted in a ruling that it's OK to track a cheating spouse via GPS.

properties being swapped. The City and Community Redevelopment Agency own 17 acres of Riverwalk land, while Mr. LaCour owns 11 acres.

On Monday, CRA board members said they would be willing to consider a land swap, and directed City Manager Ken Parker to develop a request for proposals on the exchange in accordance with Florida statutes.

Councilman Bob Ford spoke in favor of the land swap, especially since it will give the City ownership of a crucial part of the riverfront — the former Sweetwater's Restaurant property known as "the point," currently owned by Mr. LaCour. He said he believes the land should belong to the public, and the riverfront park will attract businesses to the area.

"Without the park," he said, "there would be no economic generator."

Mr. Parker said the current plan for the City's riverfront park assumes the City would own the entirety of the Sweetwater's Restaurant property and lease part of the point to private vendors.

This approach, he said, would mirror the City's current land lease agreement with Palmer College of Chiropractic, which has a campus on city-owned land. Palmer College, which owns the buildings located on the

land, pays the City a land lease once a year for using the land.

Other board members said that while it would be a good investment to purchase "the point" property, it is not absolutely necessary.

"I look at all the property starting at Dunlawton ... that's a whole riverfront," Board Member Ben Talluto said. "You can make yourself one hell of a park."

In a phone interview, Mr. LaCour said he wants to build consensus with city leaders and staff to ensure Riverwalk land gets developed and the public has access to riverfront lands, emphasizing that he is willing to swap the point lands to the City.

"My job, representing the development group and bringing forth this project," he said, "it (Riverwalk) must make sense to all concern. We all have to win."

For Mr. LaCour's development plans to come to fruition, policy issues in Riverwalk must be addressed formally through amendments to the CRA Plan, Comprehensive Plan and zoning ordinance.

At a recent meeting, city staff said drive-through facilities, hotels, game and recreational facilities and a riverboat restaurant are currently prohibited in the Riverwalk area.

That's everything Mr. LaCour wishes to build in the present and the future.

But officials have expressed support for most of the broad concepts he

presented.

Mr. LaCour touted his proposed floating restaurant, located on a 75-foot-long, 110-seat riverboat — with additional seating envisioned on docks or green space — as something that could be "an icon for Riverwalk."

Most officials were enthused by the idea of a family entertainment center, which would likely include a bowling alley, although they added they did not want it to face the riverfront.

"People like to be entertained," Vice Mayor Dennis Kennedy said.

But Councilman Don Burnette suggested this part of the project might be too ambitious for the time being.

"The reality of today is Riverwalk needs to be developed in small, bite-sized pieces," he said. "This is one of the biggest bites."

Mr. Parker said he envisions the family entertainment center concept as similar to Dave and Buster's, a chain of entertainment centers featuring a video arcade and sit-down restaurant. Dave and Buster's opened its first Central Florida location in Orlando in July.

On the idea of including a Walgreens, CRA board members said they believe a nationally recognized brand should anchor the intersection of Dunlawton Avenue and U.S. 1, a pharmacy is not their first choice.

"Certainly drugstores are a dime a dozen in this city," Mr. Burnette said.

Mr. Talluto suggested placing a hotel at the intersection

in question would be more appropriate.

But Mr. LaCour said getting interest from a hotel would not be possible unless the area has "viable businesses."

"A hotel would be the last

one in," he said.

But officials believe any name with national recognition — drugstore or not — could help boost the value of the project area.

"I don't see a mom and pop

doing well on that corner," Mr. Pohlmann said.

Mr. Parker said Comprehensive Plan, CRA Plan and zoning changes needed for Riverwalk should be finalized by next June.





Local jazzman played with many of the greats

"Because of you, I'm not afraid to dream or age with grace...Because of you I try to fix everything, or invent all the things I need that are not yet available. Because of you I hear music in my head that no one else can hear, and that does not scare me..."

ORMOND BEACH — Those words, taken from a poem that Gers Yowell's daughter Gina wrote for him several years ago, provide insights into the 88-year-old Ormond Beach Renaissance man. At an age when most people would be slowing down, Mr. Yowell is not only going strong, he's exploring new frontiers as he continues to pursue his lifelong love of music and "all that jazz," among other things.

Earlier this month, Mr. Yowell's life to date was immortalized in a podcast produced by another local jazz musician, Kenny Mackenzie, a keyboard player who lives in Palm Coast and frequently performs at restaurants and clubs throughout the area.


"I respect Gers' musicianship — his ethos and his taste," Mr. Mackenzie said. "After getting to know him, I knew he was a man whose talents need to be heard more, and whose amazing history should be examined and celebrated."

In the podcast, Mr. Yowell talks about his adventures as a musician in the big band and bebop eras. It also includes rare recordings of Mr. Yowell and jazz giants like Charlie Parker, Zoot Sims and Joe Cinderella. A 1950 jam in Mr. Yowell's New York City apartment became Mr. Parker's album "Apartment Sessions."

Mr. Yowell was born in Israel. His parents came to the U.S. and settled in New Jersey when he was a year old. He was surrounded by music growing up. His father played mandolin; his mother played guitar and he had an uncle who played violin for the New York Philharmonic and used to bring him along to rehearsals. Mr. Yowell began his own music study with the piano, but was uninspired.

"I had a lousy teacher," Mr. Yowell said. "We only paid 50 cents a lesson, so we couldn't expect too much."

A clarinet of his uncle's found in a closet heightened his

interest.

"I found a good teacher and really learned to play," he said. "When big band started happening, I wanted to play tenor sax so badly that I bugged my parents until they finally got me one. I was in heaven."

His parents were very supportive of his interest in music, but what they didn't know was that he was sneaking out the house in the evenings to perform at clubs.

"My parents certainly wouldn't have approved of me climbing out the window but I hooked up with a black band called the Sultans of Swing," Mr. Yowell said. "They played Count Basie's book and some originals. It was a great experience...a really swinging part of my life."

Jazz has always been the kind of music Mr. Yowell prefers to play.

"It's self-expression...coming from me," he said. "I don't try to emulate anybody. When I'm playing, I'm playing from inside."



Podcasts give musicians deserved recognition

Pianist Kenny Mackenzie is a jazz musician and producer of Palm Coast Jazz, a series of podcasts featuring original compositions written and performed by Florida musicians, as well as interviews with those artists.

The Gers Yowell podcast is the second in his series. He also plans to do one on another Ormond Beach musician, Sid Blair, in the future.

"I feel there's a hotbed of jazz talent here in Florida, some of it untapped, and much of it unknown," Mr. Mackenzie said. "The initial thrust of the podcast was to expose these players and their compositions to the jazz fans here in Florida as well as worldwide (we get lots of listens & downloads in Ghana, Italy, Turkey, etc.) and basically connect some real good music to a hungry audience."

These musicians don't get the attention they deserve, he said.

"I've met and befriended several jazz cats in their 80s, with incredible pasts and stories," Mr. Mackenzie said. "Most of them are still playing, but in the grand scheme of things have slipped into obscurity, and in some cases, have never gotten the fame they deserved."

Podcasting was a logical fix. "I saw the podcast as a great way to rectify that, as well as to let people in their communities know about the legends in their midst, and finally, to get their music out to a nice broad audience," he said. It's been an incredible experience for me, to be exposed to all this talent, young and old."

His passion for music remained constant throughout his life, but things happened that prevented him from pursuing his music on a fulltime basis.

"Life got in the way," Mr. Yowell said ruefully. He was drafted and served in the U.S. Navy for four years. After that he moved to Miami and played in some clubs there, but before he could break through to the big time, family matters called him back up north where he stayed.

He continued to seek out opportunities to perform at clubs in New Jersey, Manhattan, and Washington D.C. but he finally decided to get a "real" job and went to school to become a dental technician.

"That was my business for 45 years," he said. "I specialized in porcelain caps."

Ever inventive, he com-

bined those dental skills with his love of music and created a line of miniature musical instrument sculptures designed to be worn as jewelry.

"I'd borrow the instruments from a music store and then scale them down by eye, believe it or not," he said. "The detail on each tiny piece is exquisite."

Later, he created another line of jewelry based on American Sign Language signs. He gave the first piece he made, the sign for 'I love you', to his sister Abbie who lost her hearing after contracting spinal meningitis at the age of three.

Mr. Yowell would still perform when he could on nights and weekends, but his dreams of becoming a jazz legend faded over time.

Eight years ago, Mr. Yowell and his wife Myra decided to retire to Ormond Beach.

"We love it here. We're in a great location," he said.

Their spacious condo on scenic John Anderson Drive is in close proximity to the museums and restaurants they visit regularly. Their balcony faces the Halifax River and presents Mr. Yowell with infinite subject matter for his photography, one of many hobbies. "Check this out," he said as he turned on his digital camera and showed off the brilliant red sunset he shot the previ-

ous night.

There's a small stage set up in the living room with a keyboard, various percussion instruments and his instrument of choice these days, a Yamaha WX11, an electronic wind controller.

"It's wonderful," he said. "It can sound like several different instruments and I don't have to worry about reeds." He plays a few bars to demonstrate each of the different sounds and it's clear that he's still got "it."

Mr. Yowell still performs when he has the opportunity. More often, however, he and Myra enjoy attending live music performances at local venues. "That's how we found Kenny," he said. "We heard him play at La Crepe en Haut. I invited him over to jam and we became friends. He was impressed that I'm still playing at the age of 88," he said laughing.

"And in spite of everything, I am—playing, laughing and enjoying life." He gave Myra a hug. "She's my inspiration. There just aren't enough hours in the day for us to be together."

"Mr. Schweizer is one of the city's greatest musical assets," said Jason Ferguson of "Orlando Weekly," according to Mr. Schweiz-



'Unnamed storm' may take away our good fishing


Oh well, we had a pretty good run.

Fishing in the northern Halifax River had been back to normal for most of nine months after more than a year of dealing with the brown swamp water and lack of fish brought on by the downpours of mid December in 2009.

As I have reported many times, the flow of the Halifax was slowed by bridge construction and other thoughtless acts of man. So, with the slow tidal flow the polluted run-off could not make it out into the Atlantic where it can disperse. To see this phenomenon in action, if you are near Ponce Inlet on an outgoing tide, watch as the brown water approaches but only a small amount manages to escape while the incoming tide pushes it back north from where it came.

The "unnamed storm" of Oct. 8 and 9 has started that cycle once more. Let's see this time how long it takes before a strong north wind combines with the right tide to push it out of the inlet.

After watching the wind blow the palm fronds about for days I was antsy to get on the water. As soon as a

partial calm set in I was out the door. The water had definitely changed but was not yet as bad as it will become once all of the rainwater makes it into the river. One rule that seems to be a constant is that for the first two or three weeks after a big rain the fishing is great. Then, on a given signal all of the fish leave and the river becomes almost barren.

On this morning my very first cast brought in a nice 11 spot red of 19 inches. Good start. Trout were hitting all around me and I hooked two good ones without landing either. They don't bear the moniker "weakfish" for nothing. That name refers to their extremely soft mouth. If you are lucky enough to get into spotted sea trout expect to lose a few. Finally I got on a roll and bam, bam, bam! I had three trout in rapid succession. That bite ended early as it has for the past couple months. After the

trout quit biting I began to miss flounder. Two small ones managed to swim about with my jig and then escape without ever having been hooked. Then just as I was about to lift my bait from the water for another cast—POW! A really big flounder hit only a rod's length from me. It's always hard to land a big fish that bites right at the boat or at the end of your rod so I knew I had my work cut out for me. I quickly loosened my already loose drag and held on. The flounder did its best snook impression and made a long run for deep water. I could tell it was a doormat by the slick circular footprints it was leaving on the surface. "That's either a big flounder or a small manatee," I smiled.

Knowing full well that flounder are expert escape artists I soon realized this fight was lasting much too long for the odds to be in my favor. Finally, I did land it and when I looked into that cavern of a mouth the hood was way back and into the top of its throat. When I loosed the tension it just fell out. The barb was never in the fish. Any slack created by me or it would have lost

my prize. Just a shade under 24 inches, it may have been the largest one in my premier flounder year of 2011.

Remember, if the Halifax does get overly polluted, and the fish leave, go to areas less affected like the

creeks and the Tomoka River. You lucky souls who fish the Indian River on a regular basis won't have to worry either. So far the fingers of progress have not managed to bottle up that river. If things turn for the worse up here, watch for me






