Garbage hauling contract dispute leads to lawsuit

PORT ORANGE — Residents may have noticed a different garbage company has been picking up their trash since the beginning of the month.

That's because the City Council, after awarding Veolia Environmental Services its new five-year solid waste contract in July and negotiating terms of the contract related to a fueling station for a new fleet of trucks, abruptly ended its relationship with Veolia when negotiations

broke down last month.

At that time, councilors unanimously agreed to award a 45-day emergency contract with Waste Pro USA, the lowest bidder for the new contract, and negotiate a five-year contract with Waste Pro that will be considered on Dec. 6.

A large part of the disagreement is over the use of natural-gas fueled trucks and the location of a fueling station for those trucks.

Now, Veolia — the City's garbage hauler for the last 10 years — is suing both the City of Port Orange and Waste Pro.

In a recent filing with Florida's Seventh Circuit Court, Veolia officials allege city leaders failed to comply with the terms of their contract, city laws and bid specifications, and Waste Pro interfered with Veolia's business relationship with the City.

"We are suing the City because it repudiated its contract with Veolia, causing us to incur substantial damages," Doug Daniels, Veolia's attorney,

said in an interview. "...Veolia is suing Waste Pro for tortious (sic) interference on the basis that Waste Pro induced the City to terminate its business relationship





South Daytona moving forward with power purchase

SOUTH DAYTONA — Undeterred by what they called "stall tactics" from Florida Power and Light, city councilors recently made several steps in transitioning to a city-run electric utility.

First, councilors approved a resolution stating the City will exercise its purchase option including the payment of "stranded costs," then

awarded a contract to ENCO Utility Services to operate and maintain the electric utility's infrastructure, and finally, approved a resolution directing the city manager to apply for a U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Utility Services loan to fund the utility.

All three actions were approved 4-1, with Councilman Ralph Schoenherr, the council's sole opponent of a city-run electric utility, dissenting.

City leaders voted in July to exercise the purchase option in their 1978 franchise agreement with FPL after learning they would lose that option if they signed a new contract with FPL for electrical distribution. Circuit Judge William Parsons ruled the value of FPL's assets amounts to \$15.5 million.

City Attorney Scott Simpson said the coun-

Cities dealing with derelict boats

HOLLY HILL — Undocked and derelict boats won't have smooth sailing in Holly Hill anymore. The city occupies about three miles of the Halifax River — and has about 10 crafts illegally floating off its shore. Those boats are raising a ruckus among Halifax River homeowners.

"It seems to me that Holly

Hill has become the dumping ground for these things," Commissioner Donnie Moore said at a recent Holly Hill City Commission meeting. He added, "I threatened to shoot holes in one when it was close to my dock."

That incident was years ago, he quickly explained.

Holly Hill is hardly the only municipality dealing with this problem. Any city with river frontage has derelict boats in the water-

Libraries maintain traditional services, embrace new ones

VOLUSIA COUNTY—The Internet, mobile web, MP3 players, e-books, and smart phones are rapidly changing how people read and get information. But, apparently some folks still like the old-fashioned way of getting information -- from a library book shelf. That, combined with the efforts of Volusia County Library Services to integrate old-fashioned and

new-fangled services, have made the libraries more popular than ever, officials say.

Library Service Director Lucinda Collee recently presented five-year projections to the Volusia County Council. While staff expects library use to continue upward, funding will continue downward.

"Based on projections, we believe we'll see tax revenue decreases in the next five

years," she said in a phone interview. "We don't plan any expansion of services without reduction of our existing services."

The library has little choice but to expand some services. For example, one objective for the libraries, Ms. Collee told the county council, is increasing accessibility to smart-phone users. In an interview, council member Josh Wagner,

way.

Mr. Moore said that in recent months there has been an increasing number of undocked and derelict boats in Holly Hill. Halifax River residents recently urged the city commission to get boat owners to move their vessels. Mr. Moore said that the boats threaten docks, which are typically not covered by homeowners' insurance.

"They're very expensive to repair and replace," he said in an interview. "I have a problem with that when I see a derelict boat near my dock. I'm willing to bet that 99 percent of the time these boats don't have insurance."

An unknown boat recently collided with a city dock during a storm, doing about \$15,000 in damage.

The Holly Hill Police Department will soon have a boat, too. That'll make citing undocked and derelict boats much easier, according to Police Chief Mark Barker.

"We have a boat at city yards we used several times with oars to row out to these guys," he said in an interview.

Leaving the long arm of the law a little worn out by the time it gets to the offending vessels. Mr. Barker said that boat is getting an engine and makeover.

"We're going to properly mark it for these uses when we go out and cite these boats," he said.

In a separate interview, City Manager Jim McCroskey said the continuing poor economy seems to be worsening the problem of aban-

andoned and unattended boats. It's created another problem, too. What he calls "livaboards" — people living on their boats.

"About 85 percent of the problem boats are people living aboard, or people who just want to anchor in the river and not pay docking fees," he said.

He added, "By them being out there as pirates, they're not dumping their sewage in a normal place. They dump their sewage in the river. That's why livaboards need to move on."

According to Brandon Haight, Volusia County Sheriff's Office spokesperson, illegally dumping sewage in a waterway can fetch a \$250 state fine. The Sheriff's Office operates patrol boats on the Halifax.

Mr. McCroskey said that waterways are a murky legal area. Across the Halifax from Holly Hill is Daytona Beach. That city is on the barrier island to the east. The boundary between them is in the middle of the river. According to Mr. McCroskey, boat owners will move vessels back and forth between cities' limits to avoid citations.

"If they're outside the city limits, we have no jurisdiction," he said. "It's hard to know if a boat is in the city limits or outside the city limits."

Holly Hill has three vessels that are beached and need towing, according to Mr. Barker. He said the police department is in communication with the owners.

"There's a considerable cost in properly towing a boat, and some of these folks don't have the money for that," he said. "We're working with them."

Mr. Moore said he's pleased the city is trying a soft touch with boat owners, but that there should be limits to patience.

"All one needs to do is ride down the river from Ormond to the South Daytona area, and a lot of those boats are congested in the Holly Hill area," he said. "Daytona seems to have alleviated their problem, and it went to Holly Hill."

Joe Nolin, Volusia County Coastal Division director, said municipalities can sometimes get county reimbursement for removing derelict and unattended boats from the Halifax River. The county has helped remove three boats from the Halifax in the last year. One was between Oak Hill and Edgewater. The 35-foot vessel cost \$6,000 to remove and scrap. Recently, the county helped remove and scrap a 38-foot sailboat in New Smyrna, and in 2010 removed a 30-foot craft in Ponce Inlet.

with Veolia."

Mr. Daniels said Veolia accumulated "a great deal of expense" as a result of the contract not being honored, and suggested the City could avoid litigation by either paying for those expenses — which amount to about \$8 million — or by honoring its contract with Veolia.

He said Waste Pro representatives spoke at City Council meetings urging councilors to reconsider Veolia's contract.

Between Oct. 25 and Oct.

28, "Waste Pro and the City were already exchanging e-mails regarding a proposed transition plan and indemnification agreement if the City agreed to terminate its relationship with Veolia," Mr. Daniels said.

A hearing to consider a temporary injunction against Waste Pro, which would force the City to contract with Veolia for trash pickup instead of Waste Pro, was set for Nov. 16 with Circuit Judge William Parsons presiding. Details of the hearing were not available before press time.

City Manager Ken Parker would not comment on Veolia's lawsuit.

He did, however, clarify Veolia's assertion that the City rescinded the company's contract. He said Mr. Daniels withdrew the initial contract signed by Veolia for councilors to consider, replacing it with a revised contract that was given to city leaders on short notice.

"Veolia delivered a letter and a revised proposal to the City," he said. "In the letter

from their attorney, (Veolia) asked for the signed proposal they previously submitted to the city to be returned."

City staff cannot sign a contract until the City Council approves it, Mr. Parker said.

Mr. Daniels indicated the only major change to the revised contract was Veolia could no longer guarantee their natural gas fueling site would be located in Port Orange.

Mr. Parker asked Veolia to extend their existing contract for an additional 45 days to allow officials and staff enough time to review the document, but Mr. Daniels said Veolia's representatives did not give him authority to extend.

As for the transition to Waste Pro, Ron Pecora, the company's senior vice president of marketing, said the transition has gone smoothly, adding Waste Pro has demonstrated an ability to step up to serve city residents with trash pickup within a tight timeframe.

"Waste Pro's ability to

assemble staff and equipment between a Friday evening and the following Monday to serve Port Orange's 22,000 homes on Tuesday (Nov. 1, when Waste Pro began serving Port Orange) demonstrates our ability to respond and serve the residents," he said.

Mr. Parker said there were some complaints in regards to Waste Pro's service in its first week of operation in Port Orange, but the amount of complaints was "far less than we anticipated," he said.

The greatest challenge with the transition, he added, has been getting commercial dumpsters and compactors in place. But overall, the transition has "gone extremely well and extremely smooth."

Among the Volusia County cities Waste Pro contracts with for residential and commercial trash pickup is South Daytona. Its city manager, Joseph Yarbrough, spoke favorably of Waste Pro, saying the company has provided his city with "satisfactory" garbage pickup services.

"We haven't had any problems," he said.

Mr. Pecora would not answer questions pertaining to Veolia's legal action against his company and the City.

But he commented on Waste Pro's initial bid, saying the company is able to offer affordable pricing throughout the Southeast U.S. because of efficient route scheduling, new and reliable equipment, and experienced waste collection personnel.

The two city leaders who voted against awarding the contract to Veolia in July, Mayor Allen Green and

Councilman Bob Ford, favored Waste Pro because they put in the lowest bid for residential trash pickup.

Natural gas debate

At that time, Mr. Ford had doubts about whether Veolia would be able to commit to the investment in natural gas-fueled trucks, saying he wanted to see a fueling station built first.

Mr. Pecora said Waste Pro's initial bid did not include natural gas-fueled trucks because the City's request for proposals for the solid waste contract required trucks to be in place by Oct. 1, although Waste Pro recently announced a \$100 million investment in a transition to natural gas trucks and construction of fueling facilities.

"This action has been in the works for more than a year and we are partnering with Clean Energy, one of the largest U.S. providers of CNG facilities, to build our first complex now under construction in Ft. Pierce," he added.

Compressed natural gas was a driving factor in why three of the City Council's five members favored staying with Veolia in July.

While they also cited customer satisfaction rate and lower costs compared to their previous contract as their reasons for wanting Veolia to continue providing trash pickup, they were enthused by the idea of natural gas-fueled trucks because natural gas, according to Veolia, is less expensive and runs 90 percent cleaner than diesel fuel.

After the contract was

awarded, Veolia began developing a fueling site for natural gas in South Daytona to fit with "the City's aggressive timetable."

Councilors requested the fueling site be completed by Dec. 31, 2011.

But city leaders, however, advised Veolia to construct the fueling site in Port Orange instead of on their existing fueling site in South Daytona.

"Veolia based its bid on using its South Daytona facility, the site from which it had served Port Orange for the last 10 years," Mr. Daniels said, adding the site was properly zoned for compressed natural gas and the necessary equipment could be installed quickly and inexpensively with little permitting.

He said Veolia was cooperative with the City, and upon learning Veolia would work to meet their request, the City extended the deadline for building the facility to March 31, 2012. But to stay within budget, Veolia needed to find a property with proper zoning that required little permitting and few site improvements, Mr. Daniels added.

"Finding a Port Orange location should not have been difficult," he said. "We identified a property ... we began negotiating the lease, conducting engineering studies, and preparing site plans. After spending a great deal of time and money, the City abruptly withdrew its support for the site, claiming a change of use to fleet services, a zoning category that includes in its definition neither vehicle storage, nor repair, nor fueling."

Waste Pro also publicly expressed disapproval of the proposed fueling site location, arguing "it was not a proper use of the site."

Veolia's existing contract was to expire on Sept. 30, with the new contract going into effect Oct. 1, but the City Council extended the existing contract by 31 days to allow for more time for the new contract to be finalized.

But Veolia, according to city leaders, did not extend the same courtesy to the City when they threw out the initially approved contract in favor of a last-minute revision.

The City was forced in haste to finalize a 45-day See **GARBAGE, A5**



Pushed for space, a Spanish cemetery has begun placing stickers on thousands of burial sites whose leases are up as a warning to relatives or caretakers to pay up or face possible eviction.

Jose Abadia, deputy urban planning manager for northern Zaragoza city, said the city's Torrero municipal graveyard had removed remains from some 420 crypts in recent months and moved them to a common burial ground.

Torrero, like many Spanish cemeteries, no longer allows people to buy gravesites. It instead leases them out for periods of five or 49 years.

Abadia said the cases involved graves whose leases had not been renewed for 15 years or more.

He said the policy was a matter of graveyard management and that graveyards were not limitless in

space. "We're not doing it to make money or empty graves but rather to improve management," said Abadia.

emergency contract for continued trash pickup services, and councilors unanimously chose Waste Pro over Veolia to provide the service.

Councilman Don Burnette, who with Councilman Bob Pohlmann and Vice-Mayor Dennis Kennedy initially supported Veolia, reversed positions when the initial contract was withdrawn, saying he believed it was important to ensure the citizens they would continue receiving garbage pickup.

"Veolia has been a great partner, and I was looking forward to continuing that relationship with them doing pickups with trucks run on a domestic, cleaner burning fuel source," he said. "Unfortunately it didn't work out that way."

Port Orange citizens have differing opinions on which garbage hauler should continue providing trash pickup.

Ted Noftall, who lives and works in Port Orange, supported the City moving to a lower cost trash col-

lection provider such as Waste Pro because the contract with Veolia would rank Port Orange's trash collection rates as the fourth highest in Volusia County.

In an e-mail to the city manager, Barbara Sala, who has lived in Port Orange for seven years, expressed disapproval of councilors' action transitioning to Waste Pro due to satisfaction with Veolia's service and because the change came "without notice to the residents the city changes our garbage services."

"It appears that Veolia was willing to do what it would take to keep the contract and that the council suddenly changed its mind and again, without notice to the residents of this decision," she said, suggesting the City Council return the contract to Veolia.

Despite the disputes, Mr. Parker said both Veolia and Waste Pro's employees have done an excellent job of providing garbage collection services to the City.

"We have nothing bad to say about the collection crews working the streets," he said. "They have done a good job."

I think not.

Prematurity is the leading cause of death for newborn babies.

Those who survive their early entry into the world may require intensive care over many months in a neonatal intensive care unit. Many will face lifelong health concerns and disabilities.

There is much that can be done to lower the incidence of prematurity. Education is a key factor. Obstetricians and midwives should encourage their pregnant mothers to seek prenatal care as early in the pregnancy as possible and continue care throughout the pregnancy. This is not because pregnancy is a disease! But, prenatal care can allow

providers to identify a risk factor that exists, such as diabetes or twins — or one that develops during the pregnancy such as preeclampsia to be identified and addressed — so as to minimize the risk and get the healthiest mom and infant possible.

Without early and adequate prenatal care, these opportunities are missed and preterm birth is a greater risk.

Women and their families must first recognize that carrying a healthy pregnancy for a full 37 weeks is highly important. Delivery even one week early should be avoided unless there are other factors placing the mom or baby at risk. Obstetricians nationwide are campaigning to prevent elective inductions or cesarean sections before the 39th completed week of pregnancy. Even with early ultrasounds and prenatal care, the dating of pregnancy is not as accurate as many believe. A delivery occurring even a few days before optimal lung maturity can result in transient

tachypnea or other respiratory problems that require treatment in a neonatal intensive care unit. In addition to the stress for the infant and their families, the costs of these avoidable treatments nationwide has added up to many millions each year.

The March of Dimes recently contacted all obstetricians to remind them that November is Prematurity awareness month. We were reminded that in 2004, Congress passed the PREEMIE Act (P.L. 109-450), which expanded research and developed a public-private agenda aimed at reducing preterm labor and delivery. This critical piece of legislation has had positive impact: For the first time in three decades, the U.S. preterm birth rate declined for three consecutive years. The March of Dimes also wants to alert physicians and citizens alike that the PREEMIE Act needs to be reauthorized in order to continue the important work that is underway. According to the organization, the PREEMIE Reauthorization Act (S. 1440/ H.R. 2679) "represents a renewed commitment to our nation's efforts to reduce premature birth, the leading killer of newborns. If enacted, the

bill will authorize enhanced research, education and intervention activities aimed at improving pregnancy outcomes."

November is the time to contact our congress and urge them to re-enact this critically important piece of legislation. A further reduction in the rate of premature births can only improve the health and well-being of our children, families and society. All women of childbearing age and their families should consider the potential impact of premature birth and how to learn more. Discuss your concerns with your providers. Contact the March of Dimes. Look to your hospitals and learn about premature birth and the care of premature infants. Volunteer and support Healthy Start and other agencies in your community that provide education and services for pregnant women and their families. And let your legislators know that this is important to you and your community.

It could make a lifetime of difference for you or those you know.

Port Orange, said the Volusia libraries will face difficult choices in coming years.

"You've got to look at it as who are the users of the library," he said. "Some people are accustomed to going to get a book. Now you have people downloading them."

Two libraries have closed in recent months, the Holly Hill Branch Library and S. Cornelia Young, Daytona Beach. Additionally, the Volusia library system no longer runs a bookmobile. Holly Hill's

library was replaced with two lending machines patrons operate with library cards. Ms. Collee said there are no immediate plans for shutting down other facilities, but staff will consider more closures if needed -- something she does not look forward to.

"We're very strong and a vital part of our communities," she said. "We're involved in the communities."

On Jan. 25, Volusia participated in the Florida Library Association's annual Snapshot Day. On that day, 12,476 people visited the county libraries, and checked out

13,252 items. Around 1,800 used the public computers — 391 needed some help with that. Another 230 users accessed the public wi-fi networks. Patrons asked library staff and volunteers almost 2,300 questions and 115 students got help with homework.

Ms. Collee said there's been a noticeable swell in Internet and wi-fi use in recent months.

"While the majority (of visitors) are traditional library users who come in to check out materials, in the last 10 years, computers have brought in those traditional

users, but also a whole new customer who needs those computers for Internet access."

Back on the snapshot day, about 2,500 people visited the library system's website. A popular reason was to access the Newsbank newspaper database. That happened 158 times. E-patrons also downloaded 151 songs, along with 82 text and audio books.

The library system has six regional and seven community branches, with an operating budget of about \$13.9 million, about a million less

cil's action is not re-exercising the purchase option, but instead is saying the City would exercise it even if stranded costs were included.

He said FPL refused to negotiate with the City on an agreement to purchase the assets, as well as a wholesale purchase contract — needed to acquire funding for the utility — because the City did not make a commitment to paying stranded costs and does not have financing in place to fund the utility.

"It's kind of a chicken and egg thing here," Mr. Simpson said. "We've got to have the contract to get the financing."

He later said if FPL continues to refuse to negotiate a wholesale power contract, the City would select a different power company to contract with as a wholesale power provider.

The amount of what FPL can gain from the City in stranded costs, if anything, is unknown at the present time, and depends on a review by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

Stranded costs, which are separate from the price of purchasing FPL's assets, are estimated revenues FPL would have generated if the City remained a customer of the company.

Mr. Simpson explained the regulatory commission determines the value of stranded costs by taking the difference between the retail rate and the wholesale value of electricity and multiplying it by the number of years FPL anticipates serving the parting customer — in this case, the City of South Daytona.

Previous statements from FPL representatives say the company has a responsibility to recover stranded costs and the court had no jurisdiction to deny their claim for stranded costs.

FPL made a formal filing to the commission last month, claiming the value of stranded costs to be around \$8.1 million, two-thirds less than the \$24.4 million attorneys for FPL claimed in court were the stranded costs.

"It (the value in stranded costs FPL has claimed in the past) has always been a high number, and they've always threatened it," Mr. Simpson said.

Based on the filing, staff believes the acquisition of the utility is still "financially feasible" even if the City was to pay stranded costs, he said, but added he believes FPL will not be awarded

stranded costs.

"There is a very, very strong likelihood that (the value of) stranded costs will be zero," he said.

The City also made a filing to the regulatory commission, claiming FPL is not entitled to stranded costs in the event South Daytona's municipal-run utility intends to receive wholesale power from its former retail supplier.

When discussing the resolution, Councilwoman Nancy Long reiterated her support for the acquisition of the electric utility.

"Even if we add the stranded costs, we're still coming out with about a million-dollar profit a year," she said, "which would simply be money that, instead of paying FPL, will come back into our city and provide jobs. This will be money to improve our city situation."

But Mr. Schoenherr continued to express disapproval, saying, "this scenario has been going from bad to worse."

"It's been getting more complex as we go along," he said. "I looked at the pro forma, all the assumptions, and I still have the same issues I've always had. There's no sense in me to debate this, I'm a minority so I'll leave it at that."

In a related matter, councilors selected ENCO to handle operation and maintenance of the utility. Staff evaluated five bidders for the operation and maintenance contract, with ENCO receiving the highest rankings.

Staff said ENCO, which also contracts with the City of Winter Park — the most recent city in Florida to establish a municipal-run electric utility — would be able to provide services at the lowest fixed annual fee and with less employees than staff originally budgeted.

"We needed eight employees under contract," City Manager Joseph Yarbrough said. "They (ENCO) bid six employees."

Councilors also gave direction to the city manager to submit an application for a \$30-million USDA Rural Utilities Services loan, which would have a loan maturity date of 35 years from the loan's closing.

This loan, according to staff, would fund acquiring FPL's assets, but not stranded costs.

"Stranded costs would have to be funded separately," Mr. Yarbrough said.

City staff believes if the transition goes according to plan, South Daytona's city-run electric system will go live next year.

Amaryllis, Impatiens great plants for holiday color

With the beginning of the holiday season just a couple of weeks away, one of the most sought after novelty plant items is the Amaryllis bulb. These colorful plants are very easy to grow and they bloom with very little effort. They can be grown inside or out and they are a staple at most retailers during the holiday season.

These colorful plants actually originated in South America's tropical climate. The botanical name for the Amaryllis is Hippeastrum. Because of the large colorful flowers that the plants produce, this bulb is in large demand worldwide during the winter months. These gorgeous plants come in a wide variety of colors, including red,

white, pink, salmon and orange. You can also find many varieties that have variegated flowers with an array of colors in a single bloom. These bulbs will be available at many retailers in the coming weeks.

Amaryllis bulbs can be purchased in bulk packages as well as in kits where all you have to do is unpack the kit and water the soil. If you choose to plant your own, first place the roots and the base of the bulb in lukewarm water for a couple of hours. If you get your bulbs and you are not ready to plant them right away, store them in a cool place at 40 to 50 degrees. Your fridge is a great place to store the bulbs until you are ready to plant them.

Amaryllis bulbs like to be planted in a good quality potting mix such as Miracle Gro. Plant the bulb up to the neck area in the potting mix. Be gentle with the roots so you do not damage them. Firmly pack the soil around the bulb so it stays securely in place.

Your new bulbs will do really well in a warm place with bright light. The warm temperatures really make the bulb grow rapidly and it will bloom in no time. Water your new plant quite sparingly when it is first sprouting and gradually increase the amount of water the plant receives as

it grows. The blooms can last for several weeks and if you plant the bulbs at 2 or 3-week intervals, you can ensure lots of color for many weeks to come.

Amaryllis bulbs can be trained to re-flower by simply cutting off the spent flower. When you notice the stem starting to wilt, cut it back at the base of the bulb and the flowering process will start again.

When you walk in to almost any lawn and garden center, Impatiens will most likely be the dominant plant. You will find them in all colors and sizes from a small 4-inch pot all the way up to 14-inch (or larger) color bowls. Many stores also carry six packs and 24 packs. As a rule of thumb, if you are going to plant a garden with Impatiens, plant lots of them. You will be well rewarded with a garden to be proud of. During the holiday season, impatiens can be found in red and white color varieties. They can add real holiday flair to any garden or holiday display.

Impatiens will do best if planted in an area that does not get full sun all day. If you plan on putting in Impatiens just for the winter, this won't be quite as critical as the plants will endure more sun during the winter than the spring and summer. You will want to use a good quality potting soil such as Miracle Gro and plant them in an area that has good drainage. If water stands too long or the soil stays mucky, Impatiens will develop root rot. They do, however, need to be kept evenly moist. If you let an Impatiens plant dry out too much, the plant will wilt. Even though the plant will appear to recover when you revive it with water, there is still damage that has been done. Repeated bouts of drying out will compromise the plant quality dramatically over time. If you have a sprinkler system, do not rely on it 100 percent for your flowers. Always supplement your watering regime with hand watering.

Four modern musicians pay loving tribute to the Fab Four

DAYTONA BEACH — Fans of John, Paul, George and Ringo will have the chance to twist and shout to their favorite Beatles tunes when The Fab Four takes the stage at 7:30 p.m. Saturday at Peabody Auditorium in Daytona Beach.

The southern-California-based tribute show includes three costume changes representing stages of the Beatles’ career, and includes live performances of hits including “Can’t Buy Me Love,” “Yesterday,” “A Day in the Life,” “Twist and Shout,” “Here Comes the Sun” and “Hey Jude.”

The show begins with a recre-

ation of the band appearing on “The Ed Sullivan Show” and goes on to the band’s touring years, the Sgt. Pepper era and finally, their breakups. Along with the live musical performance, the show includes scripted portions and audience interaction.

“We try to put a lot of elements into the show, a little bit of showing the personalities,” said founding member Ron McNeil, who portrays John Lennon. “We require our cast members to be a little more than a bar band musician.”

Mr. McNeil said for the most part, the cast members who perform as the Beatles are musicians and singers rather than stage per-

formers. What makes The Fab Four unique as a tribute band is that they perform every song live onstage with no backing tracks, he said.

“The whole first third of the act is what the Beatles did live,” Mr. McNeil said.

After that, it gets tricky, since songs from the band’s studio era were never performed live. The Fab Four had to figure out for themselves how to play the songs with only four performers on stage.

“We ended up kind of orchestrating it ourselves ... switching around, finding out what’s historically accurate and what else we

Italian style turkey soup and delicious Thanksgiving treats

Hello, smart shoppers! This week I will cover what to do with that leftover turkey and turkey frame and then we'll add some additions to the holiday dinner.

If you have a lot of turkey left over do as I do, place some stuffing in a small zipper freezer bag. Do the same with the gravy. Place sliced turkey in a large bag; insert the other bags and freeze. In no time you'll have dinner in a flash. Then next week my versions of two other great quick dinners.

When it comes to turkey soup there's none to compare with my Mom's Italian style. It's a kid's favorite and, according to my grandson, Addison, has magical healing powers. He's 21 now, but from the time he was a little tyke, an upset stomach, a cold, a

headache, a scraped knee, even a burned finger would surely get better if only I would make him some "tourkey soup." Enjoy, see you next week!

TURKEY SOUP, ITALIAN STYLE

When I make soup, I always use a pressure cooker. Turkey soup will take about 1/2 hour to make in a pressure cooker and two hours in a pot.

1 turkey frame
1 large onion, 3-inches in diameter, peeled, sliced

3 large stalks celery with leaves, cut up
1 teaspoon salt
1/2-teaspoon black pepper
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley or 1 tablespoon, dried
Half of an 8-ounce can tomato sauce (adds nice color, very little flavor)
6-quart stock pot or pressure cooker

Wash turkey frame, remove all traces of skin and stuffing. If the frame is very large, you might have to do this in two batches. Never worry that you have too much, it freezes great.

Place all ingredients in the pot and fill two-thirds with water. Cook two hours in pot or as instructed with pressure cooker. Pour soup into large colander that has been placed over a large container.

When cool enough to

handle, remove meat from bones and add to soup. Too much meat? Freeze it for a casserole. Mash vegetables with fork or hands and add to soup.

Return soup to pot and bring to a boil. Make baby meatballs, about 3/4 inch in diameter and drop (raw) into boiling broth.

Cook about 10 minutes. Chill soup. When ready to serve, remove all fat that has congealed on top of soup. Bring soup to a boil, add medium size noodles that have been cooked halfway and cook until tender. Serve with a sprinkling of grated Italian cheese.

NOTE: My family always used Mueller's Kuluski noodles for this soup. Although not easy to find, they're sure worth the search.

I have recently found that broken up linguini pasta works great. When cooked they resemble the noodles in canned chicken noodle soup.

sauce for delicious cocktail meat balls.

1 pound "fat-free" fresh ground beef or brand-name ground turkey*
1/2-teaspoon garlic powder
2 eggs or egg whites or equivalent egg substitute
1/2-cup bread crumbs
1/2-teaspoon salt
1/4-teaspoon pepper
1 tablespoon parsley flakes
Handful grated Romano cheese

Mix all ingredients together with your hands, shape and add to boiling broth or simmering spaghetti sauce.

*Beware of store ground turkey—it can contain quite a lot of fat.

CRANBERRY SURPRISE RELISH serves 6 to 8

Try this wonderful relish in place of ordinary cranberry sauce.

4-serving package of cranberry or orange-pineapple gelatin
3/4-cup boiling water
1 large stalk celery, chopped
1 orange, peeled and

chopped
16-ounce can cranberry sauce, jellied or whole berry
1/2-cup chopped walnuts

Dissolve gelatin in boiling water, add remaining ingredients, place in mold and chill. Un-mold several hours before serving by dipping mold in hot water for a few seconds and inverting onto a plate. Chill until firm. Cut in wedges and serve.

ROASTED MIXED NUTS

All nuts taste better roasted, except for the butternut, (large, angular, hard to crack, dark brown nuts).

Place nuts on a cookie sheet, being sure not to crowd them and roast in the center of a 350-degree preheated oven for 12 to 15 minutes shaking pan midway through. Test a nut when cool, and if it's not crunchy and wonderful, place them back in the oven and roast a little longer.

"I saw a kid up there

singing Paul McCartney, and literally the hair on the back of my neck started standing up," he said.

Mr. McNeil, who had previously won the sound-alike contest as John Lennon, introduced himself to Ardy Sarraf, "and we kind of based the group from there."

The cast now includes fourteen performers. Each show is performed by four cast members as the band from start to finish, along with an actor portraying Ed Sullivan. While Mr. McNeil will be performing elsewhere this weekend, founding member Mr. Sarraf will play Paul McCartney at the Peabody. He has performed extensively as Paul McCartney, but as himself, an accomplished musician, he's appeared onstage with artists including Bruce Springsteen and John Fogerty.

Mr. McNeil said what he loves most about performing in The Fab Four is "traveling around and seeing people's faces light up when they hear those songs." Fans who are old enough to have seen the Beatles perform associate the songs with their memories, Mr. McNeil said, but

he also sees "8-year-old kids in the audience singing all the words."

"Good music will stand the test of time," Mr. McNeil said.

Boyd Jones, professor of organ at the Stetson University School of Music, echoed Mr. McNeil's assessment of the appeal of the Beatles' music. Mr. Jones, who attended a Beatles concert in Indianapolis as a boy and has seen Mr. McCartney and Mr. Starr perform live in recent years, said the band's music has been the subject of a number of "very serious academic books about their music that were written in very serious terms, not just the sort of pop-type books you might see at the bookstore."

"The (Beatles') music is really very substantive," Mr. Jones said. "I was reading somebody saying it was the only time in 20th century culture that the most popular thing is actually the best."

Mr. Jones said tribute shows appeal to fans' nostalgia or can be a way for younger audience members to experience music live that they've only been able to experience through recordings, but that underneath it all, the music itself might explain the popularity of the shows.

"There must have been some real merit there to cause people to reclaim that or revisit it, a group that broke up over 40 years ago now," he said.

Mr. McNeil said it's all about the message.

"As long as peace and love are prevalent in our society," he said, "then I think the Beatles' music's going to last forever. That's really what it's all about."

So many fish, so little time

Hard to believe that another year has cycled through and our many part-time anglers are returning from up north.

At this time of year, I begin to get interesting questions both in person and via e-mail.

I am sure someone will ask where they may buy earthworms for bait in the salt water or why they can't catch blue gill in the Indian River. Back home, you can catch blue gill most anywhere you drop a hook, they tell me.

Whenever I am fishing and encounter tourists, their inevitable question is what do we catch around here? Their faces are so joyful and excited I have a hard time letting them down.

"Snook," I say and watch their expressions change to confusion. "Spotted sea trout," I add, not helping at all. But when I say "redfish," they brighten.

"Oh, red snapper!"

"No," I explain gently, "not red snapper."

Most northern visitors know that sharks, snapper and barracuda swim in our waters but little else. It is only the very knowledgeable that have heard of grouper or drum.

When that happens, I always try to run down our list of reds, trout, flounder, snook, tarpon, snapper, drum, whiting, bluefish and all the rest and explain the method to catch each if they ask.

There is bound to be encounters with folks from Jersey who will call our flounder fluke and will laugh at how small our bluefish are.

Sometimes people from the north who fish for the same fish have trouble communicating. The bunch from New York will talk a lot about stripers, but when the people from Maryland catch them, they are called

rockfish.

They always arrive here with plenty of enthusiasm. The best thing about fishing is that most anyone can do it. A kid with a cane pole and a bobber can have just as much fun as the most accomplished salt-water fly fisherman.

Many times, our winter visitors need just a little nudge in the right direction.

One day last February, I stopped at the end of my street to dump a bucket of fish parts from the previous day's catch. The temperature was in the low 40s and a stiff north wind was whipping down the Halifax.

On the dock stood a bundled up lady, rod and reel in hand. Right away, I admired her fortitude. This was definitely no day to be out.

When I asked if she was having any luck, she told me she was not. At my request, she showed me her bait, which turned out to be a big plastic lizard hanging beneath a bobber.

This is a situation that I dread. I don't ever want to come across as that know-it-all guy from the newspaper, but sometimes I just can't help myself.

As nicely as I could, I suggested that fresh shrimp might be a better bait choice. She cringed at the thought.

"Oh, I wouldn't touch those ugly things alive or dead," she responded.

"But you do eat shrimp?"

She answered that she did. I then told her to buy a pack of pre-cooked and peeled popcorn shrimp from the supermarket. I also instructed her not to cast to the center of the

boat channel but to try it right along the sea wall.

Soon, she was catching snapper and grunts and having a ball. She sent me e-mails about her new found success.

That lady was Ms. Arline Zatz of New Jersey, and with just a little nudge, I made her a happy angler.

This winter, if you meet someone who really wants to fish and can't quite get the hang of it, stop and take a moment to help. You know, no matter what the politicians say, ours is still a tourist-driven economy. Giving them a hand is good for us all.

Besides, who knows, one day you could find yourself farther up the coast in need of some help to catch stripers or rockfish or whatever they want to call 'em.


