## Sides argue over resident vote affecting FPL purchase

SOUTH DAYTONA — In August, residents will vote to decide whether they should have a say on the city's purchase of an electric utility after a group got enough signed petitions to put a referendum on the ballot.

Some residents want a voice in the decision even though City Council members already approved, in July 2011, the purchase of the city's electric utility from Florida Power & Light.

The question is, does the referendum count only for future actions or will it be retroactive back to the July 2011 vote?

The answer depends on who you ask.

City Attorney Scott Simpson said he believes the referendum put forth by the FPL-backed committee, Take Back Our Power, would have no legal implications on the City Council's decision to purchase

FPL's assets because it cannot retroactively undo a previous council action.

He also said he thinks the referendum is the reason for FPL's continued attempts to stall finalization of the purchase with the City.

"They're trying to keep us as far apart (as possible) from buying the assets because they think the refer-

endum will hurt the purchase," he said.

## Food Brings Hope to students

Some Volusia County students sleep on the floor at a relative's house. Others move from one friend's couch to another, from one school to the next. They're among the more than 1,600 homeless students in Volusia County.

"It is total instability," said Daytona Beach City Commissioner Pam Woods, whose day job is homeless liaison for Volusia County Schools. "HUD doesn't look at that as homelessness, but we do."

While the number of homeless in Volusia County was estimated at 2,400 last year, an additional 1,656 were homeless students, Ms. Woods said. Many are in the family car or a tent, with parents wary of asking for help.

School attendance figures are dropping but not the number of homeless students.

"They don't want anybody to know that's where they've ended up because they're afraid (a case worker) is going to take their kids away," she said.

Help is spreading fast, though.



## A HAVEN FOR CRITTERS

### Recent transplant aims to rescue domesticated wild animals

DELEON SPRINGS — Jason Hoffman's love of wild animals began when he was just a boy of 6 growing up in New Jersey.

He remembers trying to pick up a non-venomous western hognose snake, which usually plays dead

when approached, and his father stepping in and killing the snake before he had the chance.

"I wanted to know why my big dad was so afraid of this little snake," said Mr. Hoffman, now 44. "I've been studying them ever since."

It's not just reptiles that Mr. Hoffman studies today.

He's interested in all animals, particularly exotic or wild species that have been raised by someone as a pet then abandoned when they get too big or start to show their wild sides.

At four "foster homes" around the county, where other partners help to care for the animals, Mr. Hoffman currently houses about 50 animals he's rescued in recent months.

# Spiritualism alive and well in Cassadaga

This is the first in a three-part series on Cassadaga.

CASSADAGA — Some might say that Mayberry meets "The Twilight Zone" in Cassadaga.

The small, unincorporated town in West Volusia, filled with houses from the early 20th century, is home to the Southern Cassadaga Spiritualist Camp Meeting Association — a testament to the time when Spiritualism was all the rage. This month, Spiritualists celebrate the birth of their religion.

## The auspicious beginnings

"Mr. Splitfoot, do as I do." With those words and two claps of the hands on March 31, 1848, a teenaged Kate Fox started a new, distinctly American religion. What happened

next that day has been disputed for 164 years.

Either a spirit answered with two raps, proving that there was life after death, or Kate Fox and her sister Margaret pulled one of the greatest hoaxes in our nation's history.

The Fox family had recently moved into a Hydesville, NY home that was supposedly haunted. Like others, the family repeatedly heard raps that appeared to be coming from inside walls. The raps became particularly pronounced when Margaret and Kate were around. The teens came to call the presumed ghost "Mr. Splitfoot," a common nickname for the devil in antebellum America.

After the spirit answered the girls' requests to mimic them, they worked out a code for

asking questions. What emerged from them was a story that he had been a traveling peddler named Charles B. Rosma who'd been murdered and hidden in the home years earlier. Searches for the body at the time turned up nothing, but in 1904 a human skeleton was found in the home's cellar wall. However, some claim the skeleton find was a fraud.

The girls found themselves in a whirlwind of investigation and publicity. While many were skeptical of their story, many believed it and claimed that the Fox sisters were mediums, people able to facilitate contact between the spiritual and physical worlds.

"Spiritualism took a hold and lasted," the Rev. Louis Gates, pastor of the Colby Memorial Temple in Cassadaga, said. "Spiritualism wasn't a religion at first; it was a movement."

Believers organized around those who claimed to be mediums. The centerpiece of the growing religion was the séance, small gatherings of people with mediums seeking to contact spirits. From that, Spiritualism organized and grew in the middle 1800s.

Dr. Lucas said the new political principals of freedom and democracy influenced

the growing religion. Additionally, he said, the growing calls for expanding freedom and democracy to more people found a religious home in Spiritualism, too.

"For the first time, women came front and center, for they were the majority of mediums — the central figures in this religion," he said. "In addition, anyone could be a medium, rich or poor, black or white, native born or foreign born."

## Spiritualism and Cassadaga

Today, Spiritualism, based on "a philosophy of joy, harmony and a fear-free understanding of the continuity of life," according to the National Spiritualist Association of Churches, is still practiced by several churches in America and Europe. While it does have some basis in Christianity, it differs in several ways, most notably no belief in a "particular savior."

Stetson University religion professor Dr. Philip Lucas said the nascent religion started at an opportune time in the second half of the 19th century — the nation would soon have millions of people hoping to talk with deceased loved ones.

"I think the surge of success was greatest between 1850 and 1890, and this had to do with the trauma of the Civil War and desire to communicate with lost sons, the lack of religious control in the rapidly

growing country — particularly in frontier areas, the rise of authority of science during this time, and the generally positive (public relations) Spiritualists created for themselves because of their service work and struggles for social justice causes," he said in an e-mail.

George Colby, a popular New York medium, headed to Volusia County in 1875. Spiritualists say he took his trip on the advice of spirit guides.

"He traveled to Cassadaga with (spirit guides) Seneca the Philosopher and the Unknown," Mr. Gates said.

Colby was about 30 and suffering from tuberculosis. The spirit guides allegedly helped him find a healing spring and he filed for a homestead there. Much of that homestead became Cassadaga, a winter home for Northern Spiritualists, in the 1890s. About 40 certified mediums now offer their services there year-

round. Additionally, a handful of metaphysical businesses offering psychic services have set up next to the Spiritualist community.

Spiritualists point to that moment Margaret and Kate Fox made interactive contact with the deceased Charles B. Rosna as the birth of their religion, and this anniversary is special, according to Mr. Gates.

"The planets are going to line up exactly as they were in 1848 when the Fox sisters (initiated contact with a spirit)," he said. "It's the first time since 1848 that the planets will be in exactly the same alignment."

To celebrate, Mr. Gates will have a transfiguration and trance demonstration from 7 to 9 p.m. on March 31 at the Slater House Education Center, 1188 Chauncey St.

Since 2007, Ms. Woods has worked closely with a Daytona Beach nonprofit called Food Brings Hope to provide these children with the essentials they'll need to survive. The program brings together homeless students with caring adults, homeless

support organizations and their peers.

After school once a week, Food Brings Hope clubs meet so homeless students can receive tutoring, socialize and eat dinner. Weekends, they attend cultural events and continue to bond as a second family.

Food Brings Hope director Beth Butera said the group's events are bittersweet.

"People in the community just have no idea that it's like that out there," she said. "We just want to get a hold of them and lift them up."

Food Brings Hope started with a heartbreaking observation by founder Forough Hosseini, senior vice president for ICI Homes in Daytona Beach.

Her daughter, Nina, was in fourth grade in 2005 when

one of her classmates lost her mobile home in a storm. She was living with a sibling and their grandmother.

Around the same time, the school's FCAT exams were administered, she recalled, and her daughter scored highest in her class. In second place: the little girl who lost her home.

Ms. Hosseini sent a construction crew to fix the home, but it was beyond repair, so she moved the grandmother and her grandchildren into an apartment and helped the woman find a job.

About six months later, she learned the grandmother was a drug dealer.

"It was so sad," she said. "When you give money and it goes to drugs or alcohol. I thought, how can we help kids when, in these cases, it involved problems that were created by their parents."

That's when she paired with Ms. Woods. The first program was at Hinson Middle School in 2007, with 26 homeless students, ending the year with 17.

"Those kids are graduating from high school this year," Ms. Hosseini said. "Now, we're helping them with getting into college and scholarships."

At Osceola Elementary School in Ormond Beach, where busing was first provided, the group went from 25 to 75 members immediately.

"I believe in the adage that charity begins at home," Ms. Hosseini said. "And when I look in my own hometown and see kids who are homeless, kids who literally go home hungry, I have trouble sending my money to Africa."

Until this year, the group had clubs in seven schools in East Volusia. A few months ago, it started its first club in west Volusia County at Deltona High School.

The club started with 11 members, said Deltona High School principal Susan Freeman, but is currently down to seven, since some members couldn't attend due to work or family obligations.

She's hoping to double or even triple the membership, though, as recent counts show the school officially has 26 homeless students.

"It's heartbreaking to know kids who are faced with these types of things," Ms. Freeman said, "but it's rewarding to know there are organizations out there that will contribute to helping them feel good about themselves and give them opportunities to experience some things that they normally wouldn't be able to do."

Deltona High's Food Brings Hope club recently attended an Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University basketball game. Westside Elementary School's club toured the Halifax Historical Museum in Daytona Beach.

Other schools without Food Brings Hope clubs are starting to help in other ways.

University High School in Orange City has at least half of its student body on free or reduced lunch and the highest number of homeless high school students in the county: 53.

Even though the school has yet to start a Food Brings Hope club, Stephanie Owens, who monitors progress for the school's

exceptional students, just started a food pantry near the school's bus circle.

With help from Food Brings Hope and Halifax Urban Ministries, the pantry will provide a 40-lb. bag of food to needy students every Friday afternoon.

Ms. Owens said teachers everywhere are used to being part-time social workers. Arrangements such as this will help to streamline those efforts.

Students will tell her about their needs and she then feels she has to "find a way to make them have what they're missing," Ms. Owens said.

Jim Tager brought the Food Brings Hope program with him two years ago when he went from principal at New Smyrna Beach Middle School to the high school.

He called it "invaluable."

"It gives these students a sense of belonging," he said. "On a middle school or high school campus, everybody has to have somebody they can relate to positively."







We'll know the positive outlook has really gotten better when a new hotel sprouts up along the beach. Trip Advisor gave Daytona Beach a thumbs up, ranking it the sixth-best beach spot in the nation based on its reviews by travelers. Also, more seats are available at Daytona Beach International Airport in March than in March 2011.

Port Orange continues as the busiest area for retail development in Volusia County. Work continues on the Altamira Village project, which includes a BJ's Wholesale Club, and now construction has started on the new retail center in front of Lowe's, which is sup-

posed to have a drive-through Starbucks. Lowe's sold the property for the center to the Ferber Co. of Ponte Vedra Beach for \$1.01 million. A former Blockbuster Video building is gone and a Chase Bank is going up on Nova Road just south of Dunlawton Avenue.

The word is that a new retail center the owner of Dunlawton Square is planning will have a Dunkin Donuts.

The only area WingZone, 1025 N. Nova Road in Holly Hill, has gotten a remodel. It now features flat-screen TVs and digital menu boards. The franchisees are Laura and Lee Barnes.

For the first time in years, the DiMucci Cos. is building a new condo at Bouchelle Island. The company will have 36 two- and three-bedroom units, but a slight twist on its usual marketing plan. Instead of just being able to buy them, DiMucci also is offering a lease with an option to buy. The prices start in the mid-\$200,000s, and the units will be completed this summer.

# It's time to change more than your clocks

We changed our clocks last week but it also was the date Volusia County's lawn watering schedule changed.

Residents need to reset their automatic sprinklers as they now may water their lawns twice a week until standard time resumes Nov. 4, when the once-a-week schedule will return.

People who live at odd-numbered addresses may water Wednesdays and Saturdays, and people at even-numbered addresses may water Thursdays and Sun-

days. Businesses may water Tuesdays and Fridays. Each irrigation zone may be watered no more than one hour and three-quarters of an inch a day. Watering is not permitted between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The watering restrictions apply to all county residents, including those who live inside city limits. They cover city and county water, private wells and pumps, but do not include reclaimed water. Unincorporated residents who violate the water conservation ordinance may be fined up to \$500.

The time change also is a reminder to change the

batteries in our smoke alarms. Smoke alarms can save lives if they are functioning properly, but studies show that most smoke alarms don't work because of missing, dead or disconnected batteries. According to the National Fire Protection Association, two-thirds of home fire deaths occur in homes without a working smoke alarm.

Volusia County Fire Services offers free smoke alarms to residents in unincorporated areas of Volusia County.



# Be smart about smartphones and save a lot of money

Many people eagerly spend \$200 or more every year for the privilege of owning the latest and greatest smartphone. Then they shell out another \$100 a month or so to ensure they can use that phone to talk, text and tap into the Internet as often as they like.

Certainly that buys you a lot of convenience. Smartphones and the service plans that support them give you constant, almost instant access to everyone who is important. The multitude of net-connected apps provide a wealth of constantly updated information about almost every conceivable topic.

But here's a little secret that the cell phone companies don't really like to talk about. You can spend a lot less and still remain well-connected. What's more, you won't be locked into one of those draconian two-year contracts the cell phone providers always insist you buy if you want the newest and most

advanced smartphone.

How much you save depends on how many of the high-end bells and whistles you are willing to sacrifice. But most people could easily save 50 percent without giving up too much.

The most direct route to those savings is through a company best known for selling low-budget cell phones and providing service on a pay-as-you-go basis — Tracfone. Oh, I know. Some of you are already rolling your eyes. But, hear me out.

Tracfone offers a service through Walmart called Straight Talk that provides unlimited voice, text and Internet for a flat \$45 a month. That's the total price. No extra fees. No hidden costs. What's more,

Tracfone contracts with many of the big cell phone companies for cell service so you have pretty much nationwide coverage. And there is no contract. Buy service only when you need it. Stop whenever you want.

So what's the catch? Well, if there is one, it's that you will NOT be able to use the most advanced smartphones with this plan. That means no iPhone, of any variety. No Galaxy Nexus. No Razr — at least not yet. If bragging rights associated with owning such phones are important to you, you can stop reading right now. No savings for you.

For everyone else, be aware that you can buy a decent, although not state-of-the-art, Android smartphone with a large touch screen and all the basic functionality of the phones sold by the big boys.

Your choices are far less than you would get with one of the big companies. But the current top-of-the-line is a LG Optimus Q for \$180. It features a full 3.2-

inch touch screen with slide out keyboard and runs Android 2.3, which is what is found in most Android smartphones. You can check out the entire lineup and get more details on the program at [www.straighttalk.com](http://www.straighttalk.com).

If you are not a heavy user, Straight Talk can cost even less — \$30 a month. That plan caps data usage at 30MB a month and limits you to 1,000 messages. (Be aware the more advanced phones require you to buy the \$45 a month plan.) And if you can get by with just basic cell phone service (no smartphone or advanced Internet access), it's hard to beat Tracfone's regular pay-as-you-go products. You can buy a year of service, which includes 400 minutes for \$100, less than \$10 a month. The phones generally cost \$30 or less.

Another low cost smartphone option to consider, if you don't travel a lot, is Metro PCS. Like Tracfone, it's a pay-as-you-go service with no contracts. Unlike

Tracfone, extra charges may apply outside your "home" area or there may be no service at all. But MetroPCS offers more advanced smartphones as well as the faster 4G data service in some areas. The most advanced model available now is the 4G Samsung Galaxy Attain, which goes for \$199. The monthly cost for service with Internet access range from \$50 to \$60, still far less than what the big cell phone companies charge. Get more information at [www.MetroPCS.com](http://www.MetroPCS.com).

If you lust for smartphone features but cannot stomach the monthly fees to support it, consider an iPod Touch (AKA, the iPhone without the phone) or a similar competitor like the Samsung Galaxy Player. All of these products provide access to the huge universe of apps most people use on cellphones. The big difference is they are Wi-Fi only, so you can only use them at home (if you have wireless Internet) or at public places

that provide free Wi-Fi. The cheapest iPod Touch is about \$200 while the similar Galaxy player is about \$180. The Touch allows you to use most apps designed for the iPhone while the Galaxy taps into the Android Marketplace used by all Android smartphones.

There are lots of options out there. Do a little research and pick the one that works best for you.

"I'm not a nuisance trapper," he said. "We're rescuing animals that are captive and, for one reason or another, can't be released again into the wild, like a store-bought parrot or a skunk. These animals can't revert to their wild nature."

Mr. Hoffman wasn't always into animal rescues. The first 11 years of his adult life was devoted to being a talent agent in Hollywood. He didn't move to Lake County until about 12 years ago to pursue his true passion for dispossessed animals.

He started small, with just a few foster homes and as many rescues as authorities would tip him off to. Five years ago, he moved to Deltona, then to DeLand in recent weeks. Now, he's got foster locations in DeLeon Springs, Deltona, Pine Lakes and at his new home.

He's saved hundreds of animals over the past decade. From Burmese pythons, rock iguanas and African spurred tortoises to parrots, foxes and skunks.

Many seem to have a special place in his heart — and none seems to frighten him.

One recent afternoon at his largest foster home, Larry's Reptile Farm in the outskirts of DeLeon Springs, Mr. Hoffman was crouching inside the roomy outdoor enclosure for a 5-foot-long Asian water monitor.

He slowly dropped the outside of his fist in front of the animal, then, after a few quick "sniffs" with its tongue and a few lashings of its tail, the 5-foot-long animal was slowly climbing up Mr. Hoffman's knee for snuggle time.

"If you don't scare them and you're gentle with them, you can make friends with these animals pretty easily," he said. "Look at this."

Just before this encounter, Mr. Hoffman was cuddling

with "my Cocoa," a chocolate skunk, with scent glands removed, that he rescued about three years ago from people who could no longer care for her.

"She's always in my house," he said. "I just brought her along so you could see what she looks like. She's de-scented, so she has no way to protect herself. In Florida, that's a quick death sentence."

Also at home: a 9-year-old wolf he just rescued last Thanksgiving.

"I'm here to take care of an immediate problem," he said. "That's all we can do."

Some animals are bred and their babies are sold off to other collectors. Others will live out their remaining years at foster homes like Larry's, owned by 65-year-old Larry Groskey, who can only give tours by appointment due to city zoning restrictions.

He's been involved in animal rescue and breeding for 50 years and appreciates the symbiotic relationship he and his colleague have formed.

"He's the one out there getting calls from residents or the (Florida) Fish and Wildlife

(Conservation) Commission or the zoos, and going here and there getting all these animals," Mr. Graskey said. "Me, I'd rather be here dealing with this all the time, making sure they're taken care of."

The main source of calls are from overambitious animal lovers.

"People will try to raise these animals," Mr. Graskey said. "Then, when they get bigger, they have to get rid of them."

They're not getting any help from the government, either, despite prohibitions against releasing various kinds of non-native species into the wild.

Mr. Hoffman only makes money through donations and fees for his traveling Critter Encounters show,

which features some of his more docile charges.

"You can't save the world," he said. "We can only do so much. I don't want to make a lot of money doing this. I'm more interested in educating the public like they should be about these animals."

One of his favorite friends is "Mr. Babs," who he'll often take around to area events. When visiting with children, the adolescent-age alligator's mouth is banded shut. But not on this visit.

He carries around and hugs the alligator like a toddler, kisses it on the mouth. When the gator starts to wander from his lap, his

command to "Stay!" brings the gator back to resting position, slung lazily over his shoulder.

"I'm so tired of everybody just trying to kill everything," Mr. Hoffman said. "Whether it's an alligator, a snake, an iguana in the bushes — it's always the same, 'Come and kill it. It's eating my hibiscus.' We still have a little wild left here to enjoy. So we should be sure that there's animals in it."

Volusia County Supervisor of Elections Ann McFall recently verified 1,100 signatures from Take Back Our Power calling for a charter amendment referendum that would require the city's formation of any municipal electric utility to be approved by a public vote.

Raymond Lawrence, Take Back Our Power's chairman, said he disagrees with the city attorney's opinion and believes the referendum will affect the City's electric utility purchase.

"Unless they (the City) are actively distributing power before the referendum (takes place), I believe the referendum will be valid and have an effect," he said.

One expert agrees with

Mr. Lawrence.

University of Florida law professor Joseph Little said he believes the charter amendment "would be a permissible provision" to put in South Daytona's city charter.

Although the City Council voted to approve the purchase in July 2011, Mr. Little believes the referendum would have an effect on the decision unless city leaders finalize a separation agreement with FPL before a public vote takes place.

"If (the City) hasn't completed what it needs to do, (the purchase) might be affected by this (referendum) if it passes and if the City hasn't acquired the distribution system," he said. That's why city staff believes FPL has stalled negotiations.

City spokeswoman Jeanne Willard said that FPL's lack of cooperation in the sale of the electric utility has cost the taxpayers in legal fees, time and inability to generate distribution revenues for residents.

"Eight months after the City Council voted to purchase the system, FPL still will not close the deal, because they are an unwilling seller," she said.

FPL's stall tactics, Ms. Willard said, included an appeal of the circuit court's See CITY, A11

denial of "stranded costs," or potential future profit losses, to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. The federal agency denied the claim in December 2011.

Contrary to city staff's statements, FPL spokeswoman Jackie Anderson said her employees are cooperating with city staff. But the materials needed to finalize a separation agreement with the City would not be ready until August, when the charter referendum is scheduled to take place, she said.

"There's actual physical construction and regulatory approvals that have to take place," she said. "Even if the vote wasn't an issue, according to our engineers, it simply can't happen (earlier than) that time frame."

Ms. Willard said the utility

purchase "simply does not belong on the ballot" because the issue concerns a large corporation spending thousands of dollars to change the city charter to protect its own financial interests.

"I think the majority of residents understand this referendum is only on the ballot because FPL is unhappy with the City exercising its purchase option and because FPL is willing to spend a boatload of money to defend its profits," she said.

Take Back Our Power's financial statements revealed FPL has contributed the most money by far -- \$20,000 -- to fund the petition drive for the referendum.

When asked if FPL gave the political committee any additional funds, Ms. Anderson did not give a specific figure, but said, "We definitely continue to support the committee."

Doug Kosarek, spokesman for the political

action committee Empowering South Daytona's Future, which supports a city-run utility, said he is bothered that a large corporation -- in this case, FPL -- is using the referendum as a way to maintain its business in South Daytona.

"Corporate interests are not aligned with citizen interests," he said. "I'm not a huge believer in government being the best answer for everything. In personally fighting for smaller government, I still feel the city of South Daytona is acting appropriately in this case (because) it's a big corporation pushing this small town around."

But Mr. Lawrence said he believes "the people deserve the right" to vote on whether or not a city-run electric utility is established.

"I just don't feel comfortable when you have elected officials paying more attention to the city manager than the people they were

elected to serve," he said.

A vote on the charter referendum is currently scheduled for Aug. 14. Mr. Lawrence said he suggested the City Council consider an earlier special election so the power acquisition issue can be resolved sooner.

## Balloon and Sky fest gets off the ground with lots of activities

NEW SMYRNA BEACH — From only 10 hot air balloons four years ago to more than 30 balloons and lots of extra activities this year, the New Smyrna Beach Balloon and Sky Fest scheduled for March 23-25 has grown to include something for the whole family.

And that something ranges from a World War II-era Red Tail plane flying and the U.S. Army Golden Knights parachute team performing in the air show, an Education Zone sponsored by Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, radio-controlled planes, drones from

ERAU, and exhibits from NASA. Festival Chairman Dr. Arlen Stauffer, who is also an airplane pilot, said the event has grown significantly every year and with good weather, crowds at the New Smyrna Beach Airport should be even bigger than previous years.

War II. Sunday's baton will go to Lt. Col. Hiram Mann, 91, of Titusville, who was a Red Tail Tuskegee Airman and pilot during WWII.

With the release this year of the movie, "Red Tails," the timing couldn't be better for "a huge exhibit 'Rise Above,' honoring the Tuskegee Airmen," Dr. Stauffer said. "We already had them booked before the movie came out to come here with a World War II-era Red Tail P51 Mustang and this will be their first stop in Florida."

Dr. Stauffer said he likes sharing the Tuskegee Airmen's message of persevering in the face of adversity, to aim high and to never give up.

The P51 Mustang is a flying tribute to the Tuskegee Airmen, a celebrated black military unit. The first group of black aviators in the then-segregated U.S. military, the Tuskegee Airmen were known for their distinctive red-tailed P-51 aircraft.

The pilot of the Red Tail coming to New Smyrna Beach is Brad Lang of California, a commercial pilot with Delta Airlines when he's not at air shows, Dr. Stauffer said. Lang is the son of Tuskegee airman Donald W. Lang Sr., who died in 2007.

Former New Smyrna Beach Mayor Sally Mack-

ay said she, along with Dr. Stauffer, Hospice and Palliative Care Physician at Halifax Health - Hospice, and attorney Paul Rooy, who is also a pilot and president of the New Smyrna Beach Airport, began the first balloon fest in 2009.

Ms. Mackay said she wanted a balloon festival here after she attended the famous Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta when she visited her daughter who was living in New Mexico at the time.

Those first 10 balloons help create a festival that continues to grow.

This year's event also features the Remembrance Rescue Project. A group of firefighters acquired the Rescue 4 truck from the City of New York Fire Department following 9/11. It is now a mobile memorial to educate, honor and remember the fallen firefighters from 9/11. Volunteers who travel with Rescue 4 work with and stay with host fire departments. Funds raised go toward restoring another truck, Rescue 5, and to provide activities for children of firefighters lost in the line of duty throughout the United States.

Admission to the balloon fest is \$2, children under 12 are free. Parking is free.


# Big fish have nowhere to hide in smooth, shallow water

Have you ever wondered how far a fish will travel to take your bait or lure? On a recent trip to Goat Island, I was able to get a look at just that. Before first light, I had launched my kayak in the Halifax. The plan was to paddle north and fish around behind Goat Island, the last spoil island north opposite Tomoka Basin.

Legend has it that back in the '50s, a goat herder had taken up residence there, and when he passed away, he just left his goats behind. When I moved here, there were goats wandering

around the place. I continued to see them until some time in the '70s. On this morning, the water's surface was glassy smooth. Conditions like that always make shallow water fishing much easier as the movement of our prey becomes more obvious.

As I eased into the curve of the Goat Island bight, I began the fishing in earnest. Whenever I fish right after a strong wind, I like to go to top water. With that in mind, I had tied on my red and white Mirro Lure. The action was the same as always with a slow retrieve

keeping it on top and a faster one making it dive. The water was about 14 inches deep, and even in the dim predawn light, I could see movement. I made a few casts without results and then got off a short cast just ahead of the Green Peanut. As usual, when the plug splashed down, I didn't move it for about the count

of four. Then I twitched it ever so slightly. As soon as I did that, I saw a fish streak toward my lure from about 40 feet away. A good-sized wake was making a beeline straight for my bait.

As I watched the long approach, I had plenty of time to get ready. Just before it hit, I flicked the plug once more, but I probably didn't have to. The fat 19-inch trout had made up its mind to eat the Mirro Lure from half way across the cove.

It hit on the dead run, and the drag screamed its warning. I don't know if it was due to the cold water,

but the trout fought much harder than it should have. Once I had it in the boat, I paused to think about how far it had come.

About a year ago, Capt. Leo Hiles and I watched a 26-inch redbait charge off the bank and take my jig. That was good fun, but the red had traveled only about 20 feet. I couldn't remember seeing a fish swim farther than 40 feet to take a bait.

A couple of casts later, I landed a 20-inch red and soon after had a nice 14-inch flounder. An inshore grand slam before 7:30 a.m. I would go on to catch a

couple of bluefish and then a fat 17-inch flounder to fill out my morning. All came on the same Mirro Lure. That should tell you about the versatility of that bait.

Big fish in shallow water are always fun, but when you can watch one zoom in on your offering from so far away, it is flat out fishing fun.

# You can eat well in tough times by shopping smarter

**H**ello smart shoppers. In my column, I try to ignore the terrible economy. Forgive me, it's time to smarten up.

According to the experts, people are getting heavier as they look for any way to feed their families, especially with fast (cheap) foods.

I've said before let's start getting smart again by saving money in the supermarket. Ground beef literally flies off the shelf in tough times. You can make the least expensive meals with ground beef, or can you? You look for cheap and grab those "fantastic" buys, ground beef at under \$3 a pound. That's nuts, it's almost half fat! Stop!

After browning the meat and pouring off the fat, you're left with about 1/2 pound. The cuts of beef that contain the least amount of fat and cholesterol are: flank steak, eye round, top round,

bottom round, sirloin tip or steak and lean chuck.

Some stores offer buy one get one free frequently. Any of these cuts can be used for ground beef. I prefer bottom round roast for grinding. It's lean, good tasting and frequently on sale. Pick a lean one and bring it to the butchers at the meat counter. Tell them what you want. They are the nicest and most accommodating people in the store. Tell them you want the meat ground twice. You decide: Low fat? Grind as is. Very low fat? Trim most of the fat. Virtually fat free? Trim all the fat.

Do you want it portioned

out? They will package it for you. Ask them to package the trimmed fat separately, then you know it has been trimmed and just how much fat you've kept out of your diet.

Now you're becoming a smart shopper. You will end up, after cooking, with just about what you started with; good, lean, fresh ground beef.

In most casserole dishes, you can use less meat than you usually would since there is no waste. Give back the good fat by adding 1 or 2 tablespoons olive or canola oil to each pound of meat.

When you shop you must pay attention to labels. Many additions, such as Hamburger Helper, contain fat, cholesterol and a great deal of salt, not to mention fancy words for MSG. Not only does it add things you don't need in your diet, it also

costs just about as much as the meat.

That bottom round roast also makes a delicious roast beef or pot roast and if you ask the butcher, he will also make you cubed steaks.

I cringe when I see people buying pork neck bones. Why are you paying money for bones when you can barely feed your family beef?

Buy a pork shoulder, trim the fat and cut it up. Want pork chops? Buy a loin of pork when it's on sale and have the butcher cut it into chops. Take advantage of buy one get one free on a boneless pork loin. You can cut it into cutlets, chops, double chops, roasts and stew meat.

It makes me laugh when we constantly hear, "eat at least five fresh fruits and vegetables daily." Right now the prices are untouchable

for many. Remember, a vegetable is fresh when it's sold or eaten no more than two days after picking. After that, you lose vitamins daily.

Frozen is cheaper and packaged the same day it is picked.

Canned veggies are still much, much cheaper and packaged the same day they're picked; still loaded with vitamins.

Look for no salt added. Try to buy store brands. Who do you think makes them? If you said the big guys, you're right.

Drain and puree canned veggies such as carrots, beans, green beans, anything you can think of and mix it with the ground meat. They'll never know the difference, you're stretching the meat and feeding them healthy food.

Five fruits a day? On what planet? I remember years

ago raising four kids saying, "I just want to be rich enough to keep my family in bananas." Including me and my husband, that's 49 bananas a week.

However, store-brand canned fruits prepared in pear juice or light syrup solve the problem.

Oatmeal is great, but the old fashioned, not the instant, has the most nutrition. Forget the instant flavored ones; expensive junk. You can add apple-sauce, cinnamon, maple syrup, brown sugar, nuts or whatever and a container of store-bought oatmeal can feed an army.

Pay attention, think, think, think.
