

## Homeless village gains support

DELAND — For a half-dozen years, local developer Michael Arth has been retooling his designs and corralling support for a centralized village for the chronic homeless called Tiger Bay.

Some would say his efforts have been quixotic; in fact, the Volusia/Flagler County Coalition for the Homeless has gone so far as to argue that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development doesn't even favor centralized emergency shelters like Tiger Bay, instead preferring scattered site housing options.

But that doesn't account for at least three other centralized facilities that Tiger Bay would mirror in other states that

have been developed in recent years with HUD financial support — and praise.

At Virginia Supportive Housing in Richmond, Va., "The Bridge" emergency shelter in Dallas and in downtown San Antonio, Texas, where planners are currently building a new centralized, \$35 million, one-stop emergency housing shelter on 37 acres, HUD funds efforts to provide housing options to those who, unlike families, veterans or single mothers, don't qualify for many government housing programs.

HUD even awarded "The Bridge" facility a 2009 Secretary's Award, just a year after opening its doors.

"The model works and it's more efficient," said Mr. Arth, at a recent Stet-

son University forum to discuss the Tiger Bay proposal with the public. "We know that."

Charles Gulley, director of programs for the Metro Dallas Homeless Alliance, which coordinates funding for The Bridge, said communities need a combination of scattered site and centralized services. That's what Dallas has done by creating The Bridge, he said — provide emergency shelter for homeless individuals who haven't been served by other social service remedies.

"If you want to rapidly get people out of the woods and out from under bridges and overpasses, then they need shelter immediately," Mr. Gulley said.

But not forever.

## City gets grant for 'Knox Boxes'

SOUTH DAYTONA — When firefighters respond to a call at a residence to help someone who's fallen and can't get up, they're often forced to break down a door or window to provide help.

But a grant the fire department recently received gives firefighters a tool that helps them enter without breaking anything.

The fire department received \$1,000 from the Daytona Beach Walmart

for Knox Boxes — secured, heavy-duty metal boxes that are mounted to the door of a residence or business that contains the key to unlock the door.

Lt. Don Howard, who applied for the grant from Walmart, said Knox Boxes give firefighters easy access to a residence or business in case of a fire or medical emergency.

"This way, we don't have to knock the door down trying to make entry," he said.

Lt. Howard applied for



# Another world

Thousands visit this tiny town for its metaphysical and spiritual traditions

*Editor's note: This is the second story in a three part series about Cassadaga's past, present and future.*

Cassadaga is a quaint town — Old Florida. Most of the houses date to the early- to mid-20th century. The roads are narrow — they were laid out for horses, not cars. With no fast food, convenience stores, or other signs of the 21st century, Cassadaga could be as quiet a little town as there ever was.

Except for the tens of thousands of visitors who flock there every year. They walk on a metaphysics fault line probably most never notice. Some are seeking alternative healers, such as Reiki practitioners who claim attunement to direct universal life energy that promotes health. Others are seeking metaphysical classes to expand their psychic horizons. But most probably go for the multitude of psychic and medium readers.

# Family Days Spring Fair offers lots of new events

PORT ORANGE — Crafts and pies will “bloom” at City Center next week to mark the coming of spring.

The Family Days Spring Fair, a four-day event featuring a number of family friendly, budget conscious activities, will take place from Thursday, March 29 to Sunday, April 1.

Jill Geddy, Executive Vice President for the Family Days Community Trust, said the new fair was designed to stand out from other Family Days events.

She said the annual spring event began to feel like a smaller-scale clone of the flagship Family Days event, a four-day festival held in October featuring a carnival, a business expo and a parade.

“It’s been turning into a mini-Family Days, which we didn’t want it to be,” she said. “We wanted it to be unique.”

The Family Days Community Trust has held a spring event at City Center for the last seven years. It took on a variety of formats such as a St. Patrick’s Day celebration and most

recently, “Kidz Dayz.”

This time, it’s not just the theme that’s new — so are the activities.

Instead of a business expo, the Spring Fair will include a Food and Craft Fair, which will feature about 125 to 130 food vendors and crafters. Ms. Geddy said about half of the crafters slated to attend are from outside of Volusia County, some of whom are visiting from other states.

“I was surprised. I didn’t know we’d have that kind

# Food trucks coming to Port Orange, New Smyrna Beach and Edgewater

PORT ORANGE -- Bike Week may be over, but another traveling convoy is ready to set up camp in Volusia County — this time, it’s food trucks.

The Food Truck Bazaar, a traveling group of Orlando-area gourmet food trucks, will expand to

southeast Volusia County with stops in Port Orange, New Smyrna Beach and Edgewater next week.

In Port Orange, the trucks will show up for the Family Days Spring Fair at City Center on Thursday, March 29 from 5 to 8 p.m.

Mark Baratelli, the producer and creator of the Food Truck Bazaar, said the concept was modeled after a similar event at the Hell’s Kitchen Flea Market in New York City, as well as the Miami Food Truck Round Ups where multiple food trucks gather in public meeting areas such as parking lots and parks.

“What I’m doing is bringing the Orlando food truck scene to city after city,” he said. “It provides a com-

pletely unique experience for each city we go to.”

Mr. Baratelli’s first Food Truck Bazaar was held in March 2011 outside Discovery Church in Orlando and featured eight food trucks. Today, he has 40 trucks on rotation that appear at food truck events throughout Central Florida.

The success of the food truck gatherings came as a surprise to him.

“I have done little types of events like Martini Tuesdays and panel talks I’ve hosted ... none of them ever really took off,” Mr. Baratelli said. “This one took off. I figured after the first one, maybe I should try it again.”

He tried it for the first

time in Volusia County earlier this month, in Orange City. Turnout for the bazaar’s Volusia debut was “unreal,” he said.

“Usually a new bazaar in a new city gets fairly good attendance,” he said. “But this was beyond our expectations.”

After the Spring Fair, Mr. Baratelli will take the food trucks to Flagler Avenue in New Smyrna Beach on Friday, March 30 for 5th Fridays at the NSB Waterfront Loop and to Edgewater on Saturday, March 31 for the Edgewater Expo. He plans to return to New Smyrna Beach in June, August and November.

# Beware of 'fishy' stories about fish

Recently I spoke at the Ormond Beach Public Library before a lively crowd of 70 to 80 people. My topic was fishing and as usual, when I was done my audience had several questions for me. When I was asked if I actually eat the fish from the "nasty" Halifax River I was ready, for that is the query I field most often.

Of course, the answer is yes and I explained that over the years I have raised my family on seafood taken from local inshore waters. I told my interrogator that when my children were young I had operated a 50-gallon saltwater aquarium for their pleasure but it was in reality a great live bait container. As I netted my shrimp and mullet, the by-catch would be an assortment of all of the juvenile critters that can be found locally. My aquarium had stingrays the size of a half-dollar and acrobatic mantis shrimp as well as various tiny crabs and such.

But the most important occupants of my fish tank were the baby snook and sea trout. Both of those were so very fragile that if I allowed the PH of the water to get slightly off they would die. I used the trout and snook as my "test strips" for the aquarium. After that I always believed that if those two fish are thriving in the rivers, the water must be healthy. Of course, that is not scientific, but it works for me.

The person who had asked the question then said that the Halifax water seemed too brown and dirty. At times that is true, but brown does not neces-



sarily mean polluted. That color comes from the tannic acid in the many oak leaves that wind up in the river. Right now the Halifax River water is very clear and green. Most people never see that because they are not out before the boat traffic begins churning up the water.

It is a fact that all of the local seafood markets sell fish caught in our brackish inshore waters and well they should. The rest of the world is suffering through a severe fish shortage but we have an abundance right at our doorstep. Some of our more environmentally conscious citizens will only eat farm-raised fish. That is a noble and well-intentioned act but it is probably not as good for the planet as they might believe.

The most popular farm-raised fish is salmon. In order to feed them, the

oceans are being raped of billions of important small baitfish. It takes around five pounds of fish meal to grow one pound of farm-raised salmon. Removal of all of those baitfish is interrupting the marine food chain. Right now, no one knows what the long lasting effects will be, but we know it is not good. The salmon are raised in big net cages that contain thousands of fish. The concentration of excrement they produce is left to be washed away by the tide. That proves toxic to the surrounding waters and the resulting algae blooms can effect waters for miles.

A slightly better choice of farm raised fish would be tilapia or cat fish. Both of those will eat food derived from plants, though the pollution is much the same. Another disturbing fact about farm raised fish is that it is not as healthy for

you as the wild variety. Farm-raised fish are more fatty and contain more chemicals. If you buy salmon at the market, you will find that the fish labeled wild Pacific salmon cost more. Fact is that much of the fish you purchase with the wild label is farm-raised. Not only that, it turns out it is not from the Pacific either. Pacific salmon die after spawning while the less preferred Atlantic salmon can spawn repeatedly. Which would you choose to raise?

When you buy salmon, ask questions. If the vendor does not have the answers go elsewhere. When you buy fresh fish it should never smell fishy. If it is in filet form push it with your fingertip. If it bounces right back it is good. If the dent you made remains, pass on it. Most fish we buy have been frozen. That is fine as long as it has not been thawed for too long. Ask how long it has been in the case and if you are not satisfied, ask for fish from the freezer that has remained frozen.

Never buy fish that has been thawed and refreeze it. When you buy fish be sure that you are ready to use it as soon as possible. If you buy fish whole make sure it has been handled properly. The eyes should be clear and the smell should be mild. My wife Lana has cooked more fish than most people on the planet and she tells me that on occasion she will leave the filets in the refrigerator for three or four days before cooking them. Although that is a long time for us that fish always turns out to be much fresher tasting than anything you can buy at the market.

As it stands right now our inshore fish are great to eat. As for the future, well, let's just keep our fingers crossed.

# DeLand charter school faces closure for low FCAT scores

DELAND — One of Volusia County's charter schools might face closure. But is the Volusia County Schools eager to dump a school it

never wanted, or concerned about the best interests of 296 students? Boston Avenue Charter School is, by state measurements, the lowest performing elementary school in the county. The state gave the

school a D for the 2010-2011 school year. The previous year, it got an F. It was the first time any Volusia school got an F since the first year the FCAT scoring was introduced, the 1998-1999 school year. That year, two elementary schools got Fs, but they both got Cs the next year.

Stan Schmidt, school board member, said he's concerned about Boston Avenue School.

"It's the only school that's ever gotten an F in recent Volusia County history," he said. "They brought that up to a D, which doesn't ring my bell."

At a school board meeting in December, Douglas Jackson, charter applicant,

attributed the low FCAT scores to the Volusia County Schools hiring away five teachers from Boston Avenue, which currently has 21 teaching positions.

Those low state scores aren't a convincing reason to close Boston Avenue to some parents.

"It's no secret that the Volusia County School Board is anti-charter school," Scott Franz said. "The FCAT score is just that—a score. It doesn't indicate performance."

Scott and Mequel Franz have two children at Boston Avenue: Adeline, 8, who's in the second grade, and Mathias, 6, who's in kindergarten. This is Adeline's third year at the school, which is run by Academies of Excellence, Inc. The couple investigated a number of schools before sending their children to Boston Avenue, and say they've been very involved with it since.

Mr. Franz noted that the Volusia County School Board Chair, Dr. Al Williams, has repeatedly said at meetings that he feels the state puts too much emphasis on

FCAT scores. Mr. Williams has said that he did poorly on tests, and counted on classroom performance to get through elementary to university classes.

Mr. Schmidt said it's true some children have problems with tests.

"Out of all the elementary kids in Volusia County, are you going to tell me that all your kids are in that group, the horrible test takers?" he said. "That can't be true unless you put up a sign that said, 'Only horrible test takers can come here.'"

According to a district staff report presented at the December 13 school board meeting, Boston Avenue School received a grade of 64 percent on fulfilling contractual obligations. The school board will discuss See **CLOSURE, A9**

# Local student wins social studies fair — again

DAYTONA BEACH — Sananda Muhammad is a regular at Social Studies Fairs.

The Campbell Middle school seventh grader once again won this year's Volusia County Social Studies Fair a few weeks ago.

Muhammad, 14, placed first in an individual category for his project: "The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade: Amistad and the 13th Amendment."

It's the third time that Sananda has won first place at the County Social Studies Fair. He also won back in the fourth grade when he was at Horizon Elementary School in Port Orange and last year as a seventh grader when he attended Silver Sands Middle School in Port Orange.

Sananda credits plain old hard work for his success.

"I go through the process of what is needed for the project to be successful," he said. "I study hard and work hard. I put in the time and effort that is needed."

Winning this year had a different feel than in previous years, Sananda said.

"There were a lot of old and new faces there supporting me," he said. "I had friends from both Campbell and Silver Sands there."

Tough and controversial subjects for his projects have been the norm for Sananda. Each year, he chooses his topics for specific reasons. Last year, his project was entitled "Segregation: Debated and Changed the Little Rock 9." It grew out of bullying and racism he said he had experienced at school.

"This year, I watched the movie 'Amistad' and I wanted to know more about it," he said. "I picked it out of a collection of books and movies

and chose it for my project."

This year's project, "The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade: Amistad and 13th Amendment," was broken down in three phases in 'Revolution, Reaction and Reform'.

Phase 1, "Revolution," deals with the commercial aspect of the slave trade. Europeans were trading spices, peppers, gold, jewels, guns and more with the Africans, which eventually led to the trafficking of humans.

Phase 2, "Reaction," looks at the Amistad slave revolt when African slaves took over a slave trading ship off the American coast.

Phase 3, "Reform," speaks of the Emancipation Proclamation and the 13th amendment. The 13th amendment to the US Constitution granted freedom to slaves and outlawed slavery in America.

He put together a poster board with information and graphs and built a couple of replicas of the ship.

In a day when most of the headlines about young people are negative, Sananda doesn't find it hard to be involved in positive activities.

"I have no choice but to be a good person," he said. "My mother doesn't tolerate bad behavior. I'd rather be a good person than have to deal with her."

His mother, artist and teacher Shyriaka Morris, is his biggest influence, Sananda said.

"I find myself to have a lot of her qualities," he said. "We are both very creative people and we both have a lot of great ideas. We are both good at putting things together."

Math and Social Studies are Sananda's favorite subjects. Currently, he sports a 3.84 GPA.

# County relies on kindness of strangers

Much like Blanche DuBois, Volusia County has always depended on the kindness of strangers. Whether it's visitors, such as the recently departed bikers, or employers in other counties, Volusia's economy would be decrepit without the help.

The most recent employment report from the state shows Volusia employers had only 900 more workers in January than in January 2011. But there were about 4,000 more county residents employed in January than in the year before. That means more than 3,000 workers found jobs outside the county. Of course, these are all estimates, but it definitely means the roadways will continue to be jammed with the morning and evening commute.

Speaking of jammed roadways, if the number of bikes in the area streets were any indication, Bike Week was on an upswing this year. While specific numbers to gauge it won't be available for awhile, it will be surprising if the end-of-winter biker rally didn't help add more to the area's economy than in the past two or three years.

But the picture still isn't pretty for area economic

developers, who obviously have a lot of work to do to allow more residents to stay in Volusia for good jobs. In the end, the Streetcar Named Desire didn't take Blanche where most of us would want to go.

Despite the painfully slow-growing area economy, commercial investment continues. Ormond Beach real estate investor Mark Venables paid \$1.255 million for the retail center at Pelican Drive and U.S. 1 in Edgewater. The strip center is mostly full and Edgewater could see some more commercial development in the near future.

Orlando's assault on the image of Daytona Beach is still going strong. **Orlando-hotels.org** was thoughtful enough to report that rates were way up along the

beach, way too pricey for Spring Breakers, who should go to Orlando instead, I guess. The report failed to note the rates most likely were higher because it was Bike Week.

At least one area manufacturer is going strong. **Sparton Corp.** got another \$13 million from the U.S. Navy for its ERAPSCO joint venture to build sonobuoys. About 47 percent of the work will be done at Sparton's plant in DeLeon Springs. According to the Employ Florida Marketplace, the plant is hiring.

Race fans apparently flew into **Daytona Beach International Airport** in greater numbers. Traffic through the county airport was up 15 percent in February with more than 50,000 people traveling through there.

With Port Orange the county's bright spot when it comes to commercial development, **The Pavilion at Port Orange** still isn't

going upscale. Its next building will be for a Dollar Tree store next to the new Party City.

The city of Daytona Beach is hoping to help facilitate local hiring, hosting a **job fair** from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Thursday, March 29, at Volusia Mall. There's no cost for employers to participate and they get a booth with a six-foot table and other accessories. Any employer interested, can call Shirley Stickney at 386-671-8011.

Offsetting any good economic news is the rapidly rising price of gasoline. The average price hit about \$2.86 early this week and the increase shows no signs of stopping until it tops \$4. So far, it doesn't seem to have slowed down travel too much, but you have to think that fewer families will be day-tripping to the beach.

"For people who are really the chronic homeless (estimated to include about 20 percent of all homeless), they can't live in a shelter forever because that really drains the resources of the community, so how we're moving forward is to provide (The Bridge) but then also have enough scattered site housing with wrap-around services for them to move into when they're ready," he said. "That's the ideal. That's the Cadillac."

Tiger Bay Village is envisioned on 80 acres of county land zoned for group

homes, wedged between the Volusia County Correctional Facility and the Pinegrove Behavioral Health and Detox Facility off rural Red John Road. To get the land — and secure needed funding — Mr. Arth, an urban designer who turned DeLand's "cracktown" into a reinvigorated Garden District, needs four of six Volusia County Council members to agree to donate the land.

Much of the opposition, said Volusia County Commissioner Josh Wagner, a Tiger Bay supporter who attended the forum, is due to how the original plan, unveiled about five years ago, included single family

homes along with group homes that would house 15 each. It was feared that Tiger Bay would be no place for children to live.

Another rallying point for opposition, Mr. Wagner added, has been how many social services agencies believe that Tiger Bay would attempt to take away their funding. But he disagrees.

The aim of Tiger Bay, he said, would be "not to take over but to supplement the problems that exist."

The plan no longer includes families, Mr. Arth said, and would merely attempt to reach out to those homeless who don't feel well-served by existing

services.

"Tiger Bay could serve as a transition to those with absolutely no place to go," Mr. Arth said, "and serve as a springboard to those on their way to permanent housing."

At the forum, Mr. Arth appeared to have wooed at least two other Council members closer to his side. In addition to Mr. Wagner and Councilman Carl Peris, who also voiced support for the updated plan, one of Tiger Bay's most outspoken critics, Councilman Andy Kelly, agreed to meet with Tiger Bay's organizing board, Villages for the Homeless Inc., to



whether to renew its charter at the next meeting, Wednesday, March 28. The charter expires on June 30 if it's not renewed. That meeting will start at 4 p.m., at the DeLand Administrative Complex.

Boston Avenue and the school district got off to a rocky start, and things haven't improved, according to pricipal Nichole Gaw. Academies of Excellence approached the district to open the charter school, but was repeatedly declined. It appealed to the state Board

of Education, and won. It opened for the 2008-2009 school year. The principal said she believes the Volusia Schools' staff is professional, but like everyone, subject to confirmation bias. She said the confirmation bias has unfairly colored evaluations and interactions.

"We're not a charter that they supported from the beginning," Ms. Gaw said. "I think there's some bad blood that's standing today, and we're paying the price for it. It's not fair to our students and teachers. It's not fair to anyone in this school building."

In an interview, Mr. Williams affirmed that he

does have a dislike for the fact that charter schools are held to lower accountability standards from the state than conventional public schools. He also has concerns about the fact many charter schools are run by for-profit companies, such as Academies of Excellence. In addition to Boston Avenue, the company runs Heritage Academy in Bunnell, a K-12 school. However, Mr. Williams said these sentiments don't figure into his concerns about Boston Avenue.

"We have some fine charter schools that are open now," he said, and noted Richard Milburn Academy

in Daytona Beach. "They take some of the toughest students who can't make it in high school and nurture them to graduate."

Mr. Williams said his concerns about the DeLand charter school are related to the poor FCAT performance, and failure to fulfill obligations.

"That's the problem we have with Boston Avenue,"

he said. "They have not adhered to the contract."

Nevertheless, other school board members and he said they'll reserve any judgments about whether to keep Boston Avenue open until the Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Margaret Smith, makes a recommendation at the March 28 meeting.

The Franz said they hope Boston Avenue stays open. If

it closes?

"Personally, I would explore all of our options—that's what I would do," Parent Mequel Franz said.

Mr. Schmidt said if the charter is revoked, he expects another fight with the school.

"This is going to go into litigation," he said. "You can see that coming down the track."

the grant after researching alternative funding sources for Knox Boxes when the department began running low. Before the grant, the fire department received the boxes exclusively through donations by the fire union and South Daytona Citizens Alert.

The grant covers the cost of six Knox Boxes, he said.

Under the fire department's program, a person who has mobility issues or is prone to falling can borrow a Knox Box from the fire department at no cost.

Every six months, the fire department contacts the residents who have a box at their residence to check if they still need them. If a box is no longer needed, it is returned to the fire department, which loans the box out to another resident.

"We've never turned down anybody," said Commander Dave Giles, who established the city's Knox Box program around 2000. "If they (citizens) say, 'We want a Knox Box installed for this reason,' we go out and install it if we have one available."

Only the South Daytona Fire Department can unlock the Knox Boxes installed within the city.

Lt. Howard said the boxes have both safety and financial benefits.

"I think they're a great idea. It makes sense so the firemen don't have to break or smash a door (to get in)."

"It's quicker access when they're hurt, (and) it's saving them money," he said. "A front door is not cheap when you've got to tear it up."

Mr. Giles said before the city began offering the boxes, what some residents did was leave a key under a mat for the fire department to access their houses in an emergency. But that's something he would never recommend because it could invite criminal activity.

"Any police officer can tell you how unsafe that is," he said.

About 16 residences in South Daytona currently have Knox Boxes installed.

Knox Boxes are also available to businesses, but unlike the residential program, businesses buy the boxes directly from the manufacturer rather than borrow them from the fire department.

Some of the local businesses that have the boxes include Sunshine Park Mall, Publix, Middleton Pest Control and Orkin.

Andy Clark, president of

Clark Properties, said about five to 10 properties his company owns, including Sunshine Park Mall, have Knox Boxes installed.

"I think they're a great idea," he said. "It makes sense so the firemen don't have to break or smash a door (to get in)."

Mr. Giles said the grant expanded the department's ability to offer Knox Boxes to residents in need without resorting to spending tax dollars.

"As we find other ways of funding, like Don did, we're able to add more to our collection to loan out," he said.

food trucks would appear at the three events.

The Orange City event held March 4 featured 16 participating trucks. Those participants included Big Wheel Provisions, Orlando Weekly's Food Truck of the Year for 2011; C&S Brisket Bus, which recently participated in a food truck event at the South Beach Food and Wine Festival; and Twisted Cuban and Firehouse BBQ, both based in DeLand.

Mr. Baratelli said the average food truck meal costs between \$6 and \$8. "These are not \$2 hot dog trucks," he said.

He also said customers should expect to wait in long lines and that some trucks may run out of food even as they're waiting in line. Most trucks accept credit cards and all

accept cash, he said.

Jill Geddy, Executive Vice President of the Family Days Community Trust, said she personally doesn't know a lot about the food truck craze, but many people who talked to her about it are big fans.

She said some people asked her if specific trucks would be in attendance at the Spring Fair.

"People really follow this thing," she said. "I'm amazed by it."

Liz Yancey, New Smyrna Beach's special events supervisor, said the Food Truck Bazaar would provide the community with a new activity, as well as raise awareness of the businesses along Flagler Avenue. One of those businesses, Café Heavenly, plans to participate in the bazaar with its newly purchased food truck, she said.

"We expect a very large crowd in the Flagler Avenue area. We feel it will be a wonderful experience ... it will help (those who attend) not only enjoy the food trucks, but also the community as well."

Jack Corder, Edgewater's Parks and Recreation Director, said the Edgewater Expo committee had been working for "several months" to bring the food trucks to their event.

He said the trucks would offer a variety of dining options for people attending the expo.

"We thought they were very unique and very different for the expo," he said. "It's a different type of food and there's a lot of variety for the people to sample and check out."

first time," said frequent visitor Denise Williams of Satellite Beach. "There's an energy about the place. There's a different feeling — a different feeling than anywhere else."

And, yes, she visits the readers when in Cassadaga.

A lot of people went into making Cassadaga Florida's metaphysical Mecca. Of course, there's George Colby, the Spiritualist trance medium who believers say followed spirit guides from New York to found the Southern Cassadaga Spiritualist Camp. It occupies 55 acres, or about half, of the town. Mr. Colby arrived in Volusia during the 1870s.

About a century later, in 1970, the late Ernie Sekunna followed his spirit guides to the town and opened the Universal Centre of Cassadaga, now Brigid's Well and owned by his son, Matthew Sekunna.

"(Cassadaga) used to be more about the Spiritualism itself," Mr. Sekunna said. "When my father opened this store, it opened up more of the psychic sciences here. He was the first one with tarot cards, palm readers, and other forms of metaphysics, not just dogmatic Spiritualism."

Spiritualist mediums eschew psychic devices such as tarot cards for doing readings. They're typically not interested in forecasting people's futures, but rather in facilitating contact between physical and spiritual beings.

County Road 4139, Cassadaga Road, is essentially the dividing line between the two approaches to metaphysical readings. In

addition to Brigid's Well, there are five other places on Cassadaga's north side to get tarot card, and other readings. Mr. Sekunna said his father was unpopular with many of the Spiritualists at first. But, attitudes softened, because his business was getting more visitors to town and everyone benefited.

Anne-Marie McCormack is co-owner of 6th Sense Connection, a more recently opened metaphysical shop in Cassadaga. The sixth-generation psychic medium said many readers

are attracted to the town for the same reason Mr. Colby was — the energy.

"The veil between the worlds is at its thinnest here," she said.

Cassadaga has had an unwanted energy over the years, too: a power to evoke fear, superstition and rumors. And attract thrill seekers. Perhaps the most famous rumor is about the "Devil's Chair." That's the one that draws a lot of thrill seekers, too. The legends vary, but they all have the same basic spooky element: There's a seat in the Cassadaga Cemetery called the Devil's Chair, and if one sits on it at midnight, he or she will see Satan.

What none of the legends account for is that there is no cemetery in Cassadaga. There is a cemetery in neighboring Lake Helen, home of several Christian churches and a pretty good pizza parlor.

Since the 1800s, many sermons were preached in local pulpits against Cassadaga. They included warnings against demonic activity and declarations of God scattering the Spiritualists elsewhere. Some of that still exists. Rev. John Ferro built a church, Dunamis Community & Outreach Center, about a mile from the Spiritualist camp. According to the church's website, the Lord told him, "it was time to possess the land in Cassadaga."

In a 2006 "Charisma" magazine article, Mr. Ferro attributed psychic and mediumistic readings found in the town to demonic entities.

"(Readers) are working in the area of familiar spirits," he told the magazine. "A familiar spirit can give you some really true information about your life because they are following your life. If people are not biblically grounded they can easily be seduced."

Ms. McCormack said that the only demonic entities antagonists find in Cassadaga are those they have with them.

"I've always felt Cassadaga is what you bring to it," she said. "You bring love and light, you'll find love and light. You bring scary things, you'll find scary things."

Despite rumors, sermons and metaphysical competition, the Spiritualists have held on, and Cassadaga is the oldest active religious community in the Southeast. That probably has a lot to do with folks such as Lylia Brachin, from Morriston. She enjoys visiting Cassadaga and getting readings, but said many of her neighbors would disapprove if they knew.

"I like the town and believe in Spiritualism," she said. "(My neighbors would) probably burn me at the stake for coming to a place like this."

Next week: We can see the future.

lend his expertise to the effort.

Not, however, until after he'd announced at the forum that Mr. Arth hadn't secured any matching financing or filed for 501(c)3 status with the IRS — technically disqualifying Mr. Arth's group from seeking HUD support through the homeless coalition.

"We have an individual who wants to do something," Councilman Kelly said, "and what we need is a nonprofit moving forward with that effort."

Mr. Arth said after the meeting that he would go

through the process to file for official non-profit status as soon as he saw the effort gaining steam.

"I'm holding off a bit with the IRS application," he said, "because I don't want to waste my time if it's not going in my direction. Why go out and spend thousands more and all those hours when council isn't ready to support it?"

The non-profit status would be moot, he added, if county officials had reacted to the plan the way he'd hoped.

"From the beginning, I've tried to get the Coalition for the Homeless to be the lead agency on this," Mr. Arth said. "I got a closed door everywhere I went and finally I had to say something about it."

Now six years into a 10-year plan to eliminate homelessness, the coalition has watched its annual county homeless count rise 60 percent over that time — to 2,248 last year.

Missy Kelly, the coalition's treasurer and wife of Councilman Kelly, was among four people who watched a presentation in January at coalition headquarters from Mr. Arth about Tiger Bay. It was among eight other proposals for scattered site developments.

She said it isn't the plan itself that has some homeless advocates skeptical, but how it's been organized.

"To be eligible for HUD funding and some grants, you have to be a 501(c)3 in existence for three years," she said. "He's got no track record, no numbers, no anything. They're not going to give millions to a group that's not a nonprofit yet, with no dedicated, sustainable funding source. It doesn't work that way."

And Mr. Arth can't seek that funding, he said, without the county land to use as leverage.

## Pop icon Neil Sedaka keeps it fresh, fun

When Neil Sedaka takes the stage at the Peabody Auditorium on Tuesday, March 27, his fans are in for a treat.

"I do all the Neil Sedaka hits, which I still love and I do some of the hidden treasures or the forgotten children," he said in a recent phone interview with *Hometown News*. "I refer to my songs as my children. Some of them were buried in LP's and I'm so very proud of them."

The legendary singer/songwriter may also "surprise the audience" with a classical piano solo.

Mr. Sedaka turned 73 earlier this month, but instead of slowing down, he continues to reinvent himself. In the case of the classical music, though, it's more like going backwards.

"After all these years, I got up the courage to go back to my roots as a classical musician," he said.

At the age of 8, Mr. Sedaka began studying classical piano at the prestigious Juilliard School of Music. He continued until he was 19, when much to his mother's chagrin, he turned his talents to rock 'n' roll.

The rest is history, as they say.

During his illustrious career, Mr. Sedaka has recorded almost 60 albums and has written hundreds of songs, many of which have been recorded by other well-known rock and pop greats including Connie Francis, Elvis Presley, Sonny and Cher, The Carpenters, Dinah Washington, Captain and Tennille, Tom Jones, Clay Aiken, and a host of others throughout the years.

"I'm very proud of the fact that some of these songs will outlive me," Mr. Sedaka said. "I still hear them on the radio. I've been writing for almost 60 years now and to hear 'Calendar Girl,' 'Breaking Up is Hard to Do,' 'Love will Keep Us Together,' and 'Laughter in the Rain' after all these years is a great accomplishment."

But, he's not one to rest on his laurels or his royalties.

"It's a very trendy fickle business. You have to raise the level of Neil Sedaka," he said. "You have to reinvent him. You have to try things out of your comfortable sphere. If you don't develop and grow and raise the level, then you get bored and the audience gets bored."

To this point, in addition to his pop recordings, Mr. Sedaka has released some children's albums including "Waking Up is Hard to Do" inspired by his grandchildren, original Christmas albums, and a Yiddish album. Additionally, his classical roots popped up in 1996 when he recorded "Classically Sedaka" in the United Kingdom, a place he penned lyrics to some of the most beloved classical tunes.

That album, by the way, has become a collectors' item. It was not released in this country and is out of print. A brand new copy currently sells for between \$124 and \$255 on Amazon.com and even used copies start at \$19.99 and skyrocket

upwards. Like the Eveready Rabbit, Mr. Sedaka just keeps on going.

"I like to keep it fresh," he said.

He also has another album coming out next month called "The Real Neil" with 15 new songs. He is most proud of the fact that he has also written a piano concerto and a symphony.

"I recorded it with the London Philharmonic Symphony a few months ago," he said. "I will be performing with them in October at the Royal Albert Hall. That's unusual because very few pop people — McCartney, Billy Joel—have done classical as well."

The very prolific Mr. Sedaka has received numerous awards in his lifetime. He has had eight No. 1 hits on the U.S. and European charts, been inducted into the Songwriter's Hall of Fame, was given a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, and had a street named after him in Brooklyn, his home town. But there's one accolade that is conspicuously missing. He has not been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Over time, there have been several efforts to change this. One fan in Belgium is currently circulating a petition that has almost 14,000 signatures from Sedaka fans all over the world and is growing daily. "I think that Neil Sedaka is one of the most underrated artists," said Jozep Van Gorp who is the fan behind the petition. "It's what can I do as a fan for an artist whose music influenced my own life. He may not be the greatest rock-'n'-roller of all time, but I'm sure he influenced many artists in the world, even artists that are already in the Rock and Roll Hall Of Fame."

Mr. Van Gorp has not yet sent the petition to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. He is "waiting for the right time" and more signatures. He encourages Sedaka fans to go to [www.sedaka.be/](http://www.sedaka.be/) or to search "Sedaka petition" on the Internet to sign the petition.

Mr. Sedaka is aware of this petition and other efforts as well.

"It would be nice," he said. "I would love to be in before I say goodbye to the world. It's a shame that so many great ones have been overlooked. Connie Francis, who I wrote songs for, has been overlooked as well as so many others."

But Neil Sedaka is not sitting around and waiting for that to happen. In addition to writing more songs, returning to his classical roots, and performing all over the world, he is looking forward to a totally new adventure. "There is a musical play based on my life coming out in London's West End this fall," he said. "It's called 'Laughter in the Rain' and actors play me, my wife, Elton John, Carole King and Connie Francis. The kid who plays me is an unknown Brit and he's absolutely terrific."

He's proud of the play, he said.

"To me that's a great accomplishment," he said. "For a couple of months I'll be coming out as the real Neil Sedaka at the end of the show to do a couple of songs with the ensemble. Now that's exciting!"


# Bountiful outing no 'fluke' for New Jersey fisherman and son

With the March winds in full blow I was very reluctant to allow my guest to pick a day for a fishing trip a whole week in advance.

Miracle of miracles the appointed morning dawned as calm as could be hoped. I welcomed Bill Kudlik and his dad Lou on board my 17-foot Polar just as dawn peaked over the High Bridge in extreme Northeastern Volusia County.

At the request of Executive Director Lori Gillooly I had donated a trip to Habitat for Humanity and Bill had made the winning bid at their fundraiser. Lou was down from New Jersey for a visit and both men were anxious to fish.

With the tide extremely low and just beginning to come in I knew I had some time to kill before the water would be high enough to get back onto the mud flats where the redfish live. I motored to an old favorite sea trout hole with the hopes of catching a couple as we passed the time. My new fishing buddies seemed a bit apprehensive when I insisted that they each use my famous chartreuse jig on

the light tackle that I was providing. It did take a while for the first fish to come on board but when Bill landed a nice 17-inch trout the mood immediately improved.

Bam! Bam! Lou and I each hooked up with keeper trout. Now we are fishing! I then went through a stretch where nothing would stick to my hooks but Bill was hot and kept putting fish in the box. Finally Lou and I got back into the game and soon nine nice trout were on board. Most of the fish we caught were keepers and we only had to release three or four.

After a while it became apparent that the trout had tired of seeing the jigs and quit biting. That was fine for the water had risen and now it was time to hunt red fish. With my little 50-horse Evinrude tilted way up I worked my way far back into the flats. I cut the

engine about 200 yards from my red fish hole and began to use the push pole and electric trolling motor.

We were making steady headway but I didn't like what was happening and told the guys so. We were going with the tide but the wind was in our face and causing the water to lap up against the bow of the boat. Just that little bit of noise would be enough to scare off the reds that I hoped were there. I was forced into making the decision to turn around and soon started up the outboard once more.

We would have to drive a bit to get all the way around the desired spot so that we could approach with the wind. Now as we drifted in much more quietly I hooked a 17-inch red right away. I had instructed the men to put a half-inch of fresh shrimp on their jig hooks and that worked fine. Bill picked up a 16-inch red and soon Lou's rod bent in that familiar arc that lets you know you are connected to a nice redfish. Lou is in his 80s but seemed to get younger as the fight wore on. After I put the net under his 22-inch redfish I shook

his hand for a job well done. His red sported 16 spots and had it been a count-the-spots tournament Lou would have been in the money. That battle finished that hole and after a short move we were into them once more. Six more reds in rapid succession would keep us all smiling. Eventually Bill would land a fat 17-inch flounder to round out his inshore grand slam of red, trout and flounder. Very nice!

Of course when the flounder came on board my New Jersey friends couldn't help but shout: Fluke! Fluke!

By morning's end we had caught more than 20 fish and had a lot of fun. The wind had been blowing over 20 mph the previous day and would be back up to 25 mph the following day but somehow Bill had picked the right day to fish.



# Try meatballs, sausage, ribs, bracirole and a special Italian cake

**H**ello smart shoppers, hope you had a good week. This column has additions to my spaghetti sauce that completes the feast.

A Casatta cake or a cannoli cake, an Italian specialty, tops off the menu. Ricotta, the soft creamy cheese used in pasta dishes, is also used in fillings and frostings for cakes. Love Cannoli? The filling is made with ricotta. Enjoy. See you next week.

## ITALIAN MEATBALLS serves 4 or more regular or low fat

When you use 'fresh ground' beef, meatballs can be low-fat. My meatball recipe was handed down to my mother. A combination of ground beef, pork and veal can be used but we prefer them only with beef.

I can remember as a teenager being told, "There are seven ingredients in the recipe plus the meat." You must count on your fingers: salt, pepper, egg, garlic, cheese, parsley and bread.

If you use regular ground chuck or beef, which contains a fair amount of fat, the seven ingredients still holds true. When using fresh, virtually fat-free ground beef, an eighth ingredient must be added to keep the meatballs from going flat; that is bread crumbs.

NOTE: Using fresh ground beef? Add 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil per pound.

- 1 pound fresh ground "fat-free" beef
- 2 large eggs or equivalent

- amount of egg substitute, or 3 egg whites
- 4 slices white bread or equivalent of Italian bread
- 2 medium cloves garlic, chopped
- 1 tablespoon plain bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2-teaspoon black pepper
- 5 or 6 sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1 handful grated Romano cheese

Soak bread in water, squeeze dry. If using Italian bread (preferred), remove as much crust as possible. Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix with your hands. Shape into balls a little larger than a golf ball. Years ago you would fry the meatballs, but now, to cut down on fat, we bake them. Place on a cookie sheet that has been treated with cooking spray. Bake at 350 for about 30 minutes.

Meatballs should be cooked in the spaghetti sauce an additional 30 minutes. Over-cooking will make them fall apart.

## ITALIAN SAUSAGE FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE

To reduce the fat, cut sausage into 3- or 4-inch pieces. Prick all over with a fork and bake on racks in a cookie sheet at 350 for about 30 minutes. Add to

spaghetti sauce and cook for 30 minutes longer. HINT: If you use both sweet and hot sausages, place a toothpick in the hot sausage to avoid unwelcome surprises.

## PORK SPARE RIBS FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE serves 4-5

Cut ribs apart between each bone and trim as much fat as possible. Place on rack in cookie sheet, bake at 350 for 30 to 40 minutes until browned. Add to sauce.

Ribs should be cooked in the sauce for about 1 hour or until fork tender.

## BRACIOLE serves 6

Ask the butcher for bracirole. Years ago flank steak was used; today we use round steak.

This is my family's recipe. I recently had bracirole with a sprinkling of breadcrumbs added to the meat and it was very good.

- 1 pound bracirole or round steak
- 3 or 4 large cloves garlic, chopped
- Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped
- Grated Romano cheese
- Salt & Pepper
- White string
- Spaghetti sauce

Score meat, cover with waxed paper and pound to flatten and tenderize.

Cover meat with next five ingredients. Roll and tie securely with string. Brown in a little oil or cooking spray.

Add to sauce. Cook for 1-1/4 to 1-1/2 hours until

meat is fork-tender. Remove from sauce, cut away string and slice in 1/2-inch pinwheels.

## ITALIAN CASSATA CAKE (NIB)

This recipe is from my cousin Ermalina. The cake is purchased from the bakery of a supermarket or a bakery store. I presume from her instructions it is a high cake.

- 1 sponge cake
- 1/3-cup raspberry jam
- 1 cup confectioner's sugar
- 1 cup candied fruit
- 1 container (2 pounds) ricotta
- 3/4-tablespoon orange liqueur
- 3 squares semi-sweet chocolate, chopped fine
- 5 tablespoons pistachio nuts, chopped

Beat ricotta in a large bowl until smooth. Add sugar, chocolate, nuts and candied fruit (save best pieces of fruit to decorate top of cake).

NOTE: Candied fruit is hard to find during the year, buy extra around the holidays or ask for it at your local bakery.

Cut cake into thin layers (3 or 4), moisten top of layers with liqueur, spread a little jam over top of layer and top with some ricotta mixture. Continue stacking layers, leaving top of cake plain.

Chill until set, (at least 2 hours). Cover top with leftover ricotta mixture or dust with confectioner's sugar. Decorate with reserved fruit.
