Port Orange will begin search for new city manager

PORT ORANGE — The Grammys drew more viewers than the Oscars. Van Halen released an album with lead singer David Lee Roth. And three Friday the 13ths fell exactly 13 weeks apart from each other. Those were all events that happened this year for the first time since 1984 — the last time Port Orange searched for a new city manager.

That was the year city manager Ken Parker was hired. Now, the City Council will begin the process of finding his successor after he announced he would retire on Feb. 28, 2013. Council members recently made the first decision needed to find a new manager — how to conduct the search. They unanimously agreed to do it in-house with assistance from a citizens committee and a Range Rider, a retired city or county manager provided by the

International City/County Management Association. Councilors also had the option of hiring a firm to conduct the search, but they decided against it due to the costs involved, estimated between \$25,000 and \$40,000. The next decisions council members must make involve the salary

range for the position and when the job announcement for the position should be released, Mr. Parker See CITY, A10

Town will negotiate settlement in Pacetta lawsuit

PONCE INLET — After a judge ruled in favor of a developer in a lawsuit concerning the proposed construction of dry boat storage, town leaders want to negotiate a settlement.

The Town Council recently voted 4-1 to authorize Councilwoman Mary Hoss and a member of the town's staff, most likely Town Manager Jeaneen Clauss, to approach Pacetta LLC property owners Lyder and Simone Johnson to discuss settlement options.

Town leaders hope a meeting between Ms. Hoss and the Johnsons could bring a resolution to the long-lasting litigation. They also hope to avoid a jury trial that would determine how much the Johnsons should receive in damages. "I think a mediated or

negotiated settlement with Pacetta would be the utmost victory for both sides," Councilman Scott Meacham said. Judge William Parsons ruled town leaders violated state and federal law by taking property rights away from the Johnsons, who

bought 16 acres of property along the Halifax River between 2004 and 2006 for a mixed-use planned waterfront development. Court documents said town leaders passed development restrictions that only affected properties

Local historian remembered for knowledge of city

PORT ORANGE — Although Harold Cardwell spent the last half of his life as a blind man, he was able to see into the eyes of history. A former landscape architect, horticulture therapist and teacher for the blind, he was well known throughout Florida for his historical expertise, writing 13 historical books and serving as a member on numerous historical societies, including the Port Orange Historical Trust. Mr. Cardwell, 85, died April 13 after a battle with cancer. His wife of 57 years, Priscilla Cardwell, collaborated with him on his historical books and served with him on the Port Orange Historical Trust. She described her husband as

a "wonderful father and provider." "He loved people. He loved life," she said. "He was an all-around good guy."

Ms. Cardwell, 80, said she had known her husband since she was 6 years old and first became acquainted because their respective brothers were friends. The Cardwells developed an appreciation for history early in their lives because their parents were also interested in history, she said. One aspect of history Mr. Cardwell

Artist immortalized on DeLand museum sign

DELAND — Harold Garde had the beaming glow of an artist who had finally "arrived" on Saturday night, bouncing from handshake to hug at the Museum of Florida Art on the Stetson University

campus. Not only was the museum honoring the New Smyrna Beach snowbird with a one-man show that featured a 16-panel mural — stretching 8-feet-tall and 24-feet long — that hadn't seen the light of day for 35 years; it was also installing a same-size

reproduction of that mural as the backdrop of its permanent signage outside. "It looks absolutely wonderful," said the 88-year-old artist before the unveiling. "I just love what this museum has been doing to support my work."



Cardwell had a fondness for was Civil War history, she said. "He loved the Civil War," Ms. Cardwell said. "We have gone to a number of the Civil War battlefields."

Mr. Cardwell would himself be a part of history for his work on a top-secret project during World War II. From 1944 to 1946, he was assigned to the atomic bomb project, which later became known as the Manhattan Project, in Oak Ridge, Tenn.

In a 2007 interview with Hometown News, Mr. Cardwell said his role in the project was working on thermal diffusion and uranium enrichment.

"We knew it was dangerous," he said. "We knew it was something on the order of a super bomb, but we couldn't discuss it."

Mr. Cardwell said at the time he believed his exposure to radiation led to his blindness, which forced him to give up driving and his landscape

architecture business.

It also caused his cancer, Ms. Cardwell said.

But his health never stopped him from living his life.

After losing his eyesight, he became a teacher at the Division of Blind Services in Daytona Beach. Until his death, he participated in many historical boards and societies throughout the area such as the Daytona Beach Historical Preservation Board, Halifax Historical Society, Florida Historical Society, Florida Anthropological Society and Florida Trust for Historic Preservation.

With his wife, he founded the Port Orange Historical Trust in 1986, where he served as president.

Colleagues remembered Mr. Cardwell most for his dedication to preserving the area's history. Matthew Romanik, a local attorney who is vice chairman of the Daytona Beach Historic Preservation Board, said he was honored to serve on the board with Mr. Cardwell.

What impressed him the most about Mr. Cardwell was

that he was able to recall those histories from memory rather than writing notes, and that he was deeply involved with the boards he served on in spite of his blindness.

"Harold unquestionably was one of the most knowledgeable Daytona historians ever," Mr. Romanik said. "He not only recalled his own history, but also sought out others' histories."

Kent Donahue, who served on the Port Orange Historical Trust with Mr. Cardwell, remembered working with him and his wife on several history projects over the years, including a historical book about the city entitled "Port Orange - A Great Community Volume 1."

"We're saddened by Harold's loss," he said. "He was not only a good man, but (also) passionate about history, especially Port Orange history."

In addition to his wife, Mr. Cardwell is survived by his son, Harold Cardwell Jr.; his daughter, Ruth Landau; eight grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Don't bring me red gumbo, no!

From time to time I have mentioned that I was raised in Southern Louisiana.

While that is true I am not a full-blood Cajun, no. My dad moved our family to the bayou so he could take a job in the off-shore oil fields. I was in the fourth grade. Truth is: I don't remember much before becoming a swamp-running, Hell-raising Cajun kid. You really can't live in the swamps along Louisiana's Gulf coast without adopting the lifestyle.

For most of my friends, English was a difficult second language that they just could not wrap their tongue around. English was only used in formal instances like school and maybe at the bank. At home or when there was no chance that a foreigner was listening, they would always revert to the more comfortable French dialect.

Ours was a tight-knit closed community that outsiders sometimes found impenetrable. Back then, the rest of the U.S. barely knew we were there and that was perfectly fine with us.

Sometime back in the 1970s, the nation and the world discovered Cajun food, Cajun music and the very different lifestyle of the people of Southwest Louisiana. There, the food is to be savored like good music and good music should be savored like good food.

Once we were found out you couldn't escape all sorts of Cajun flavored foods. Potato chips, corn chips, hamburgers and just about everything else that is consumed came out with a Cajun-flavored variety. It didn't matter that none of these things actually exist in Louisiana.

Same with the music. True Cajun music is the most simple of sounds. No horns, no orchestras. Just a squeezebox, fiddle, guitar and perhaps a tub base and washboard. Soon those of us from the Atchafalaya Basin area grew tired of all the fakery and denounced all imitations.

One of my own pet peeves is when a restaurant peddles a gumbo that is based on tomato sauce. Not long

ago I drove up to Flagler Beach on a tip from a reader to visit The Big Easy Cafe. When I walked through the door, my first question for owner Nicole Mazie was: "is your gumbo roux based?"

If she had said no, I would have turned and walked right out. That to me is a basic that cannot be compromised. Gumbo is a brown soup. No red sauce can pass in there, *no shah*. Once that hurdle was crossed I enjoyed my visit immensely. I was wearing my wife Lana's honorary Cajun T-shirt and Nicole's husband Walt snapped my picture for the wall. Back in the early '80s when I took Lana to my high school reunion, the Cajuns made her an honorary coonass (Cajun) by presenting her with the T-shirt and a quart bottle of Tabasco Sauce (made just outside of my hometown of New Iberia). Nicole Mazie is originally from Gretna, just across the river from downtown New Orleans so she is the real thing.

Right here I suppose we might as well deal with a couple pronunciations. There is no "wheez" in Louisiana. It is Lose-y-anna. There is no "leans" in New Orleans. It is New Orlanz. Okay, now we can get back to The Big Easy Cafe. What a find! First I ordered a muffaletta sandwich. Well, a half a muffaletta sandwich. No one could eat a whole one. For the un-initiated, it

consists of select salamis and hams with provolone and mozzarella cheeses on special round bread. The real secret is the delicious olive salad topping that Nicole makes beautifully. Although my half sandwich was still too much to eat I ordered three or four side dishes. I had a cup of their most savory seafood gumbo, a cup of dirty rice and a cup of red beans and rice. Me, I don't want to miss *nuthun*, no.

They also carry the famous Zapp's bayou chips. For sure, by the time my sandwich was made, I couldn't eat it, no. *Oh my my, dat was so much fun*. Before I left I had to buy a bottle of Louisiana Lightning Strike Sauce that is made in Abbeville, La., only 20 miles from my home.

Now listen up *shah*, if you are a homeless Cajun or even a Cajun wannabee, then paddle your pirogue on up to 213 S. Second Street just west of the Flagler Pier. If you go on Friday or Saturday morning, they will be serving authentic Cafe Du Monde beignets and coffee. I will be the one in the

corner with the powdered sugar all over his face. Ha. Ha! *Laizzez les bon temps rouler*. That's right, let the good times roll!

Police: Teacher filmed students

DELAND — Stephanie Anderson was appalled when she discovered pictures of nude girls on an iPad her mother had found on April 1 at Walmart. Weeks later, she was floored when she learned the device belonged to a math teacher at St. Peter Catholic School, from which she and her three sisters had graduated years ago.

"I was shocked," Ms. Anderson said from the front yard of her Minnesota Avenue home, "because I went to school there. My whole body was shaking. I want him on the sexual offender list. People need to know who he is and what he's about."

Police say the teacher, Joshua Waguespack, immediately began searching for his iPad after losing it at Walmart, using a tracing application on his iPhone that led him to Ms. Anderson's neighborhood.

It was Ms. Anderson's mother, Tina Jones, who found the iPad at the Walmart Supercenter. She took it home and gave it to her daughter to see if she could find out who it belonged to.

As Mr. Waguespack was searching the neighborhood

for his tablet computer, Ms. Anderson opened an application on the desktop that prompted the instant upload of seven nude pictures. They appeared to feature a young girl in her bedroom, exposing herself to the camera.

"I was disgusted and I was really concerned," she said. "I thought that somebody needed to know."

It wasn't long before she got her chance.

Mr. Waguespack was right across the street, where Ms. Anderson's neighbor suggested he seek help from a police officer who was parked a block away near Stone Street. He did that. Minutes later, he and two officers were at Ms. Anderson's front gate.

"I didn't hand him the iPad," recalled Ms. Anderson one recent afternoon from that same gate. "I just walked up and he literally took it from my hand. I was confused. I said, 'This is yours?' And he said, 'Yes.' That's when I said in front of the officer that was there, 'Can you explain to me why there's pictures of underage girls nude on here?'"

Though they had yet to view the images, the officers did seize his iPhone and iPad before letting Mr. Waguespack go that day. They also

impounded his truck, since he had a suspended license.

The incident ultimately led police to arrest Mr. Waguespack on April 26, after he admitted to surreptitiously video recording two of his math students at St. Peter Catholic School, aged 12 and 13, as they changed clothes in a closet. He told police about these recordings — and others — but insisted that the pictures Ms. Anderson viewed were of a young adult woman who now lived out of state.

Ms. Anderson refutes that: "This was a little girl," she said.

Mr. Waguespack is charged with three felonies: two counts of video voyeurism involving minors and one count of tampering with evidence. He's been granted a bond of \$10,000 for each of the three counts.

A police report notes how Mr. Waguespack admitted to concealing pen cameras to record the girls in his classroom closet, where girls would regularly change. On his iPhone, investigators also found a text exchange he'd had with a former student — at the time 16 years old — in which he'd stated "he was very close to crossing the line."

A detective wrote in the report that Mr. Waguespack

indicated "attractions toward younger females" and "a problem with voyeurism."

Police allege that he deleted the nude photos that

Ms. Anderson saw from his iPad at her front gate and threw away the pen cameras after the investigation began.

During the investigation, police say he also admitted to secretly videotaping co-workers in a changing room when he worked at a Walmart in Orlando.

Mr. Waguespack, whose last known address was 538 W. Ohio Ave. in DeLand, was fired from St. Peter on April 13. Diocesan officials say he was fully vetted with a background check before being hired in 2009.

"The safety and well-being of our students are very important to us," said Carol Brunati, spokeswoman for the Orlando Catholic Diocese, while reading a prepared statement over the phone. "...We pray for all those involved in the situation."

It's my greatest honor to be here right now."

Along with the giant 192-square-foot mural and sign, a few dozen smaller works were also on display nearby from the last 11 years of Mr. Garde's work.

They all employ the "Strappos" technique of printmaking, which Mr. Garde invented decades ago. This dry transfer technique is recognized by academics worldwide, with the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art permanently displaying Mr. Garde's work.

In a side gallery at the DeLand museum, 14 other Strappos works appear, all produced by Mr. Garde's former students.

As abstract expressionism goes, David Fithian, the museum's exhibitions coordinator, considers Mr. Garde's work on par with the likes of Picasso and Matisse. He said this particular work isn't "famous at all now," but having such a permanent, visible post won't hurt its public profile.

"I respect him," said Mr. Fithian. "He speaks the language of art and he has a great vocabulary for it. He knows how to critique it, how to teach it and how to

do it himself."

George Bolge, the museum's chief executive officer, said Mr. Garde's colorful and playful work "sets the bar" for future acquisitions.

"It shows an artist, over a period of time, exploring his avenues to express his creative responses," said Mr. Bolge, "dialoging with his past and present in a conversation that's still relevant and bearing fruit today. I'm sure you could ask Harold, 'Would you want to continue it?' and he would say, 'Yes, I can have several more'... because it's simply an artist who's doing a masterpiece who's never finished."

The mural, which was recently redubbed "Iconoclass" because Mr. Garde couldn't remember what, if any, name he'd once given it, was created one piece at a time over several years. It depicts a slowly meandering series of abstract figures in a myriad of shapes and primary colors.

In the early 1970s, Mr. Garde was raising a young family and teaching community college and high school outside New York City. That's when he painted the first few panels of the mural.

"I decided shortly after that that I wanted to keep making more," he said, "so what this ended up as is 16

individual paintings, but paintings that all link together."

Since the work took place during a formative time in his life as an artist, he came to think of them as "representing a continuation of life, this colorful, playful branching out."


Today, he says he sees nothing but "jubilation" when he looks at it.

That giant, visual playground will serve the museum well, said Judy Thompson, museum board president and the brainchild of mounting a reproduction of the painting outside.

"We had a problem," she said, "with the facility being virtually invisible to the community, so the fact that we found such an extraordinary piece of art that transforms the building into something everybody will see as they drive by... we couldn't be more excited."

DeLand Mayor Robert Appar presented the artist with a key to the city before the unveiling.

Local housing market no longer a nightmare

The long nightmare Volusia County's housing market has been floundering in for the past five years seems to be coming to an end as area builders are starting to wake up. While the recovery in prices will be slow, they at long last should be on the way up.

The U.S. Census Bureau reported that building permits were issued for 150 new single-family houses in the first quarter, up from 116 last year. While an average of 50 a month doesn't sound like a lot, it is a big improvement. That number creates sustainable growth and helps prop up prices. A number closer to 100 a month would be optimum in a market this size, anything more and we're back to building a bubble that isn't pleasant when it bursts.

With the builders adding to their inventory of vacant lots and the huge pile of foreclosures dwindling, we should see a modest increase in housing prices by the end of the year.

Further evidence an economic recovery is underway was the retail sales report for February from the state Department of Revenue. Taxable retail sales were up 5.8 percent from February 2011 as auto sales stayed strong and bigger Speed Weeks crowds help pushed the hotels and restaurants higher.

One area the Ocean Center has done well over the past few years is with religion-based conferences, and it just tallied another big one. 

owned by the Johnsons and colluded with a citizen group through a 2008 charter referendum that restricted the size of boat stacks, which won the support of Ponce Inlet voters but was struck down in circuit court in 2010.

The Johnsons did not respond to calls for this story.

Ms. Hoss said she wants to see the issue put to rest.

"I am tired of being

between a rock and a hard place," she said. "We need to get it settled and go back to peace and tranquility in this town."

Vice-Mayor Tami Lewis voted against authorizing the settlement talks because she believed an attorney should be present at any meetings between Ms. Hoss and the Johnsons.

But the rest of the council felt there would be a more positive outcome from the negotiations if an independent mediator, such as a representative from the Volusia League of Cities, were present

instead of someone who represented the town in the lawsuit.

While councilors attempt to begin settlement negotiations, they also voted 4-1, with Ms. Hoss dissenting, to seek a second legal opinion to determine if appeal is necessary. The town must decide whether to appeal within 30 days of the ruling.

Council members considered appeal as an option because they felt the ruling could have an effect on how the comprehensive plan is amended.

Ms. Clauss said in a phone interview the town charter requires public participation in the comprehensive plan's preparation, but the judge's ruling mentioned several 2005 meetings where comprehensive plan resolutions were discussed in relation to Pacetta's concept plan took place in the office of a former town attorney with no public involvement.

"Only what happens in the public should count (in preparing the comprehensive plan)," she said. "That's what our case has hinged on."

Ms. Clauss said if the case was settled out of court, there would be no appeal and Judge Parsons' ruling would not become legal precedent.

"The settlement would be the governing document," she said.

This is not the first time the Town Council discussed a possible settlement in the case. In November 2011, the Johnsons and a citizens group offered a \$13.7 million out of court settlement to avoid trial, but councilors voted it down.

One of several residents to speak at a recent meeting on the lawsuit was Rhonda Glasnak, president of the Ponce Inlet Business Association and owner of Racing's North Turn. In a meeting held last December, she was the only citizen to speak in support of a settlement and against bringing the case to trial, fearing a financial disaster for the town.

"I stood before you some time ago and said, 'What's going to happen if we lose?' We got no answer," she said. "Now, we've lost."

Ms. Glasnak also called for Town Attorney Cliff Shepard to be fired.

Gary Swanhart, a resident and two-time Town Council candidate, said when he ran for office in 2008, the year of the dry boat storage referendum, he warned that if the referendum passed, the Johnsons would be entitled to due process and they would sue the Town, but "nobody wanted to listen."

He believes the lawsuit should be settled and no more of the taxpayers' money should go towards Mr. Shepard's firm.

"What amazes me and what bothers me the most is we lined the pockets of an attorney for over a million dollars. These (dollars) should be going to city services," he said.

Only two citizens spoke in support of the town appealing Judge Parsons' ruling.

One of them, former mayor Tony Goudie, summed up his position in three words: "Appeal, appeal, appeal."

said.

If council members wish to have a new manager start work immediately after Mr. Parker's retirement, they must make their selection and approve a contract by the end of December. Most managerial contracts have provisions giving two months' notice for a city manager to begin work, he said.

Howard Tipton, a former Daytona Beach city manager with more than four decades of experience managing local governments, advised councilors to set high standards for the minimum requirements to attract high quality candidates. Some of the things he recommended included requiring candidates to have a master's degree in public administration from an accredited university, at least five years of city management experience, and knowledge of Florida law as it relates to city government, as well as passing a physical exam to guarantee good health.

He encouraged councilors to select a candidate with a balanced background, suggesting that someone who's worked in the private sector, but not in local government, might have a hard time adapting to the job.

"If you hire somebody who's a businessman who's never run a city this size ... you'd better hire somebody who hits the ground running and not give them two years to learn from," he said.

Dick Kelton, a local representative for the Range Riders who was a former Volusia County manager and the first city manager of Palm Coast, said he plans to speak before the City Council to discuss how the Range Riders will be involved in the

search. That meeting is scheduled for May 8.

"We can do as much or as little the city wants," he said in a phone interview. "That's the decision of the City Council."

Range Riders provide professional advice and guidance to managers-in-transition and help screen applications for management positions.

One benefit Mr. Kelton sees in the city's use of the Range Riders is, due to their experience in managing local governments, they generally have personal knowledge of some of the applicants. In addition, Range Riders have access to information professional firms do not, such as the International City/County Management Association membership database, which is used to help screen the managerial candidates.

"We have more than just paper knowledge of the applicants," he said.

Mr. Kelton, in a letter to city leaders, said finding a successor to Mr. Parker "may be the most important decision you are called upon to make during your term of office."

Council members strongly supported the Range Riders concept and the formation of a citizens committee, which would likely take place in October, to assist with the search.

"It's a great opportunity to involve ourselves in the process as well, utilizing them rather than having some canned response that would come back from a professional outfit," Councilman Dennis Kennedy

82-year-old rebuilds paddleboat

DELAND — Early one February morning in 2007, Richard and Ruth Knuebel were awakened by a disquieting call. It was the man who lived next door to where their 90-foot "Beresford Lady" paddleboat was moored across town on Lake Beresford — the boat that Mr. Knuebel had spent about 20 years building from scratch.

The "Groundhog's Day tornado" had just ripped through the area, leaving behind it a wide swath of splintered homes, utility poles and trees. Their lady was sinking, he told them.

"The place was basically just a shambles," Mr. Knuebel recalled one recent afternoon from the deck of the now-landlocked boat. "You couldn't walk anyplace because trees and poles were down everywhere. And the boat was just sinking. We watched it sink."

But the boat was all that sunk. Not the couple's determination. After the clouds cleared and the tears were wiped away, Mr. Knuebel got right back to work.

Almost every day for the past five years, the 82-year-old retired engineer has come to rebuild what was destroyed.

In a few months, he'll have it floating again.

"I come to work on it but I don't see it as a job," he said. "It's just something that's gotta be done or it's worthless. If I don't bring it back, it's

worthless to everybody."

If they'd just bought it and it sank, he said, that'd be one thing. But that's not how the Beresford Lady came to be.

Mr. Knuebel started building her when his now-middle-aged children were just leaving the nest. At first, the family thought he was a little crazy.

"When he said he wanted to build a boat, I thought he meant a 25-footer or something," said his wife. "Then I came home shortly after that, and there's this picture on the wall that he drew, and it's a 90-foot paddleboat. I thought, oh no."

The couple credit the project for Mr. Knuebel's speedy recovery from a heart attack when he was 59.

"If it hadn't been for her, I probably wouldn't have him today," Ms. Knuebel said. "He had to come to it every day. Up steps, down steps. It made him move, made him think. I can get mad at it and I used to because he'd be so busy and tired from it. But it saved his life."

The boat became a centerpiece around which family life revolved. Their daughter, Karen Knuebel, now 48, remembers being enlisted to help, along with her brother Mark, five years her senior.

"We would have these 'pour dates' when everyone would show up to help finish a hull section with concrete," said Karen, who followed in her parents' footsteps by operating a passenger ferry to Drayton Island in Putnam County. "We did this for sev-

eral years. It's a freaky passion of his. Who else is going to build a riverboat out of ferro cement (reinforced concrete)? It's basically a floating bridge."

She added, "And he's still all over this thing like a little monkey."

In 1999, just a few years after slapping on an eye-catching white-and-red paint job, the couple was ready to show her off.

They started with a wedding reception that gave them the confidence to start two daily dining tours, charging \$37.50 a passenger for four-hour catered tours through the area's old Florida habitat.

Eight years later, her hull was sitting on the bottom of Lake Beresford.

A witness told him — and the aftermath confirmed — that the winds had lifted the back of the boat as much as 10 feet from the water, then slammed it back down onto its dock pilings. Several of the posts poked into the hull like

toothpicks into a sandwich. The starboard paddle wheel was shredded.

"There was evidence that a paddle wheel used to be there," Mr. Knuebel said, "but that was it."

They hired divers from Louisiana to help raise the boat and pump out the water. Then Mr. Knuebel had 100 feet of shoreline removed to drag the boat ashore.

Once it was landlocked, he had a dam built behind it to keep the water out. The whole process cost about \$100,000, he said, and took the better part of a year.

Then it was time to get to work. The holes were repaired on the hull, with new steel, mesh and concrete. The decimated paddle wheel was

replaced with a new one built from scratch. Several feet of muck have been cleaned out, from not just the floors and bathrooms but also the electrical system and engine room. The engines are working again too.

They don't know if they'll give tours again when it's done, though. Ms. Knuebel

notes how, with Sanford's Rivership Romance tour boat now out of business, this area of the St. Johns River is now without any competition. Mr. Knuebel says it doesn't matter to him, as long as it looks like it once did again.

"I have to do this," he said. "If I don't who will?"

said.

Speaking about the requirements for the position, Councilman Don Burnette said while he did not want them to be so restrictive that some qualified applicants may not apply, he also felt the standards should reflect the need

for a manager who understands Port Orange is a "mature city."

"I don't want to exclude somebody who may be a young Ken Parker who didn't have that kind of experience when we hired him," he said. "The difference (between now and when Mr. Parker was hired) is we've grown and we're a mature city. We're not where a person who has the job can grow with the city."

A lost causeway, loving manatees and regained fishing chops

Last week, my guest aboard my 17-foot Polar was Diana Simmons. We have known each other for several years since we both serve on the Board Of Directors of the Ormond Beach Historical Society. This past January, I had donated a fishing trip to the Society for their annual fundraiser and Diana had been the high bidder at the silent auction.

Unfortunately, soon after she secured the winning bid, she had broken her ankle and been slow to heal. This fishing trip would be long-awaited and much-anticipated for several reasons. Diana had a long history of fishing with her husband, Mike, but had

lost him to cancer a few years ago. She told me that since his passing, she had not been able to muster up the courage to go fishing without him.

As we launched from Sanchez Park in Ormond Beach, I was well aware of her fragile state. I began by taking a long slow ride down Thompson's Creek which I believe is one of the most beautiful boat rides in the area. Halfway along the creek,

I pulled to a stop at the Lost Causeway. This is a place that all local historians are aware of, but few have actually seen.

Deep in the swamp, it is only accessed by water and then it must be high tide for most boats to make the trip. The causeway was a road built in the 1700s by British settlers in order to get their sugar and other product to market in what is now Ormond Beach. The portion of the causeway I showed Diana is where a lot of soil and shell was filled into a marsh to build a 10-foot wide road. To stabilize it palm trees were planted along both edges. The trees still stand. The bridge has long since fallen into the creek, but it is very obvious that this was once a road. After the causeway, we did quite a bit of bird watching and finally came to the Tomoka River,

where I planned to fish. I had been having a degree of success there with quite a bit of action, although nothing large had come up in some time. It seemed like a good place for Diana to regain her fishing chops.

Unfortunately, the fish didn't see it that way. Nothing much hit for three hours. Fishing with shrimp tipped jigs, I was only able to land one flounder. Nothing for Diana. The best part of our Tomoka River time was when we came upon a pod of six or eight manatees that were obviously thinking about beginning a family. This is a happening I have stopped to watch many times. It begins when a lone female comes in season and begins to emit a scent that calls the males. The males will herd her into shallow water and the mating begins, with the largest alpha

male leading the way.

The younger males constantly interrupt the love making as they seek a turn with the female. It is quite a sight to watch.

By now I was a bit worried that I was not going to be able to find fish, so I headed into Strickland Creek 1700s and switched to fishing shrimp on a 4/0 red circle hook. At my first stop, Diana hooked a very feisty sheepshead and managed to play it down. I felt some better. Next I went to one of my old favorite black drum holes and sure enough, I landed a nice keeper as soon as my bait hit the water. Before I could get it into the boat, Diana was hooked up to a bruiser that had to be around five pounds. The fight was long with first the angler and then the fish having the upper hand. Eventually the smart old drum dragged her

line over the barnacles and broke her off. Lost fish, but good fun.

Soon after my guest was able to hook up with a drum of a couple pounds and was more evenly matched. This time Diana did a perfect job and the drum was hers.

Never one to pass up a chance to perform, I told her I could talk to the animals and made the drum croak as I removed the hook. She humored me with a hearty laugh. Back at the boat ramp, I filleted the catch and sent her home with a smile. I hope Diana continues to fish.



Use delicious beans and pasta for affordable, healthy dinners

Hello smart shoppers. Let's delve into some inexpensive recipes to get you through these rough economic times.

If obesity was a problem in America before, resorting to high-fat fast food and tons of carbohydrates is sure to make it worse.

Let's look to foods such as white clam sauce, pasta fagiolo and red beans and rice. You could feed an army for practically nothing. Try whole wheat pasta or Barilla plus to get the good carbs. Enjoy. See you next week.

WHITE CLAM SAUCE serves 3-4

I use canned baby clams; they never get tough like minced, chopped or fresh clams. My recipe contains mushrooms. Even if you don't like them, once they're chopped you'll never know they're in there. Serve with a tossed salad and crusty Italian or French bread and enjoy. It's low in fat, cholesterol free and good for you.

- 1/4-cup extra virgin olive oil
- 10-ounce can baby clams
- 7-ounce can mushrooms stems and pieces
- 1 cup bottled clam juice

- 4 large cloves garlic
- 6 or 7 sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1/4-teaspoon oregano
- 1/2-teaspoon black pepper
- Few shakes crushed red pepper, optional
- 3/4-pound linguini or spaghetti

Cook pasta in boiling salted water. While water is heating, prepare sauce. Peel and chop garlic, reserving half. Lightly sauté half the garlic in oil, remove from heat. Add the clam juice, juice from clams, liquid from mushrooms, oregano and the black and red pepper. Return to heat and bring to a boil.

Coarsely chop mushrooms and add to sauce. Cover and cook over low heat.

When pasta is almost done, add the clams, remaining garlic and parsley to the sauce. Continue cooking until pasta is done. Add sauce to drained pasta and serve.

PASTA CON FAGIOLE serves 4

However you say it, pasta fazool, once considered peasant food, is pasta and beans, best made with small pasta like tubetti, tubettini or titolini.

My mom told me that years ago, pasta was sold in local markets in huge barrels and the broken pieces at the bottom were mixed together and sold for a penny a pound expressly for this dish; peasant food!

- 1/4-pound left over Virginia ham, if you have some frozen, or 1/4-pound boiled ham, chopped (this can also easily be vegetarian)
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 or 3 cloves fresh garlic, chopped
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1-1/2 8-ounce cans tomato sauce

- 1-1/2 cans water or broth
- 1/2-teaspoon dried oregano leaves
- Few sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 teaspoon, dried
- Two 15-1/2 ounce cans great northern beans or half white and half red kidney beans
- 1/2-teaspoon each, salt and pepper
- Few shakes crushed red pepper, optional
- 1/2-pound small pasta

Cook pasta in boiling salted water until al-dente; drain, set aside. Chop vegetables in processor, add ham and pulse until coarsely chopped. Sauté in oil or water until golden.

Add tomato sauce, water or broth and seasonings. Cook about 20 minutes. Add beans with liquid and continue cooking for 15 minutes. Add pasta, cook until tender. Serve in soup bowls with a sprinkling of grated Romano cheese.

RUTH COLEMAN'S RED BEANS AND RICE (NIB) serves 4-6

My dear friend, Ruth, was the sweetest southern lady. From her New Orleans heritage comes this recipe.

Wash and pick over beans, cover them with three times their volume of water. Bring to boil and boil 2 minutes. Cover pan, remove from heat, let sit one hour. Drain and proceed with recipe. This procedure is said to remove up to 80 percent of the gas-producing properties.

- 1 pound dried red kidney beans, prepared as above
- Water
- 1 large onion and 3 medium cloves garlic, peeled and chopped
- About 1/4-pound piece Virginia ham or 1/2-pound kielbassa or smoked sausage, sliced

- 3 small bay leaves
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Few dashes cayenne pepper

In large pot, cover beans with water, 1-inch over the top. Boil about 5 minutes. Add onion, garlic, bay leaves, a little salt and pepper, cayenne and the chunk of ham.

If you're using the sausages, add 1/2-hour before done. NOTE: Both available low fat.

Cover pot and simmer for about 1-3/4 hours, adding more water if needed, until beans are soft.

Discard bay leaves, remove 1 cup beans and puree in blender. Return to pot (this procedure will give the gravy the proper consistency).

Serve in large soup bowls over rice and pass the hot sauce.

No matter the sport, if you play outdoors, protect your skin

May is National Skin Cancer Awareness Month. With this in mind, I'd like to address the need to protect your skin from the damage that the Sun and UV rays can cause.

For those of us that work indoors, we really don't consider how much damage the sun can do to us in the short time we spend in our cars, walking in from the parking lot or the like. Yet, regardless of how little time you spend outside, you need to consider applying sunscreen.

As golfers, we spend a lot of time in the elements subjecting our skin to tremendous danger. If you don't already take precautions to prevent skin damage, the time to start is now! It's time to pay attention to your skin, make an effort to protect it, and allow yourself a healthier future.

For those of us that work outside or play outdoor sports, applying sunscreen to your face, neck, arms and so forth hopefully has become as routine as brushing your teeth or putting on deodorant. With sunscreen now available in convenient sprays and sticks, it's easy to apply quickly and without getting your hands greasy.

One in five Americans will develop skin cancer during his or her lifetime and more than 1 million Americans are diagnosed with skin cancer each year. Statistics show that someone in America will die of melanoma every 67 minutes. Of all cancers, skin cancer is the most common and nearly half of all Americans who live to age 65 will develop skin cancer. These are scary numbers. Fortunately, skin cancer is the easiest to prevent and cure if detected early.

The key to preventing and curing skin cancer is early detection and use of sunscreens to protect your skin. The most common warning sign of skin cancer is a change in the appearance of the skin, such as a new growth or a sore that will not heal.

Studies show that just one sunburn will double your risk of developing skin cancer. Children are especially at risk. On average, anyone under the age of 18 has three

times the sun exposure of an adult.

Melanomas are especially deadly, as they tend to spread quickly throughout the entire body. Basal and squamous cell cancers are much less deadly, but can leave your skin scarred.

When you know that you are going to be spending time outside, you should apply sunscreen at least 30 minutes prior to your activity. It's also best to reapply every two to three hours or immediately after getting out of the water. While any sunscreen is better than none, experts recommend using at least a 30 SPF rated sunscreen.

Something many people forget to protect is their lips. We now have lip balm with sunscreen available to us. Just as your lips can dry out and chap during the winter, they can also burn from the sun at any time during the year.

As golfers, we tend to ignore the sun, especially when it isn't too hot outside. We feel that a simple cap or riding in a cart protects us from the worst the sun has to offer. This simply isn't true. In fact, as much as 80 percent of the sun's rays penetrate clouds, mist or even fog.

Sun damage causes premature aging, wrinkles,

age spots and dry skin. None of us want to age, much less age faster than nature intended. Look at some of the older guys on Tour and you can tell which ones spent years without protecting themselves.

The most often used excuse for not putting on sunscreen is that it will leave your hands greasy and make gripping the club difficult. Companies have found ways for us sports-happy people to apply sunscreen without dirtying our hands. Sprays are one of the most convenient methods for application. I happen to prefer the stick. It never touches my hands and goes on with just a swipe. I think that I get better coverage with it and it fits neatly into my bag.

For extra protection for your face, neck and ears, wear a hat with a wide brim, not a baseball-style cap. There are even special clothing products available to keep your body cool, while covering your arms and neck.

Our world is changing and whether you believe in "global warming" or not, you must remember to protect your skin.

If you suspect that you have already damaged your skin from sun exposure or

your skin shows any warning signs, by all means, have your doctor or dermatologist give you a check up.
