Port Orange leaders, councilors finalize job announcement for city manager position

PORT ORANGE – Wanted: A new city manager.

City leaders recently authorized staff to release a job announcement for the city manager position to recruit candidates for a successor to the outgoing Ken Parker, who plans to retire Feb. 28 after 29 years of executive leadership in the community.

After discussions at a recent council meeting, city

council members settled on a salary range for the new manager position. The new city manager's compensation package, including salary and benefits, will range between \$120,000 and \$160,000, depending on qualifications and experience. Mr. Parker's current salary is \$119,558.

Due to the city's ongoing pension issues, Councilman Dennis Kennedy asked his peers to "stand firm" on offering a defined contribution pension such as a 401k

for the new city manager instead of a defined benefit pension.

In a defined contribution pension, money is put into an investment fund and the amount a retiree will receive in benefits depends on the performance of those investments. Defined benefit pensions involve an employee receiving a set amount of money per month upon retirement. Mr. Parker has a defined benefit pension and will receive nearly \$6,000 a

month from the city after he retires, according to Human Resources officials. According to the job announcement, city manager candidates must have a bachelor's degree in public or business administration and a minimum of five years experience as city or county manager in a city or county of comparable size.

Experience should include "the full range of municipal services" not limited to but including finance, labor relations, economic development and redevelopment, the application states.

Port Orange man charged with murdering two area women

PORT ORANGE – A man serving jail time for kidnapping and raping a 9-year-old girl is now facing murder charges after police say he strangled two women and buried their remains.

The State Attorney's Office recently charged James Lee Maxwell, 44, with two counts of first-degree murder in two different homicides after police identified him as responsible for the deaths of Chasity Starr of Holly Hill and Pamela Will of South Daytona.

Public Safety Director Gerald Monahan said he sympathizes with the fam-

ilies of the victims.

"Our heartfelt sorrow and thoughts and prayers go out to them," he said.

Mr. Maxwell was charged two months after human remains were discovered in the backyard of his residence on Brandy Hills Drive. A DNA test on the body identified the victim as Chasity Starr, who was 27 at the time it was believed Mr. Maxwell mur-

Daytona airport director has 'Big Apple' dreams

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Passengers will soon be flying between the Daytona Beach International Airport and The Big Apple.

Maybe. That's what Stephen Cooke, director of business development at the airport, is working on.

"What we'd like to see is New York service," Mr. Cooke said. "We're talking to Jet Blue about that. One of the things we're working on is a travel bank."

In short, the airport is asking area businesses to put money into dedicated accounts to buy airline tickets to fly out of Daytona International. That money, it's hoped, will show airlines that the needed customers are there to open direct service to New York.

"Consolidated Tomoka (Land Co.) has agreed to

\$10,000 in tickets," Mr. Cooke said. "That's the first one. We're going to get more."

Mr. Cooke said the Daytona Regional Chamber of Commerce is helping to promote the travel bank. He said getting \$50,000 to \$100,000 in the travel bank could tip an airline in favor of opening the proposed service.

"If they use the aircraft we suggested, the (Embraer E-175), if they ran that thing here a couple times a day they'd be up to 60,000 passengers a year easily," he said.

The aircraft carries about 100 passengers, depending on internal configuration.

Mr. Cooke said the airline industry, and business at Daytona Beach International, has been steadily improving since 2009. The airport has two carriers, Delta and US Airways. From July 2010 to June

2011, there were about 524,000 enplanings and deplanings at the airport. That went up to about 568,000 between July 2011 and June 2012.

"We tend to get a lot of business types in here," Mr. Cooke said. "We don't tend to get a lot of tourists. We get a lot of business travelers who don't want to put up with (Orlando International Airport)."

Nevertheless, Mr. Cooke said the airline industry is notoriously risk averse and slow to try new things. He explained that while the industry's expenses are very large, its profit margins are narrow.

"The saying goes that the Wright Brothers flew the first plane in 1903, and the airline industry hasn't made a nickel since," he said.

Port Orange seeks alternatives in scrub habitat restoration project

PORT ORANGE – City leaders said Volusia County's proposed compromise scrub habitat restoration plan at the Doris Leeper Spruce Creek Preserve is anything but a compromise.

As city council members prepare to meet with county and state leaders to discuss the plan, they expressed interest in finding alternative sites to restore scrub, an endangered habitat characterized by low growth such as shrubs that attracts native species such as the gopher tortoise and the scrub jay, that do not interfere with the city's conservational and recreational interests

in the preserve.

They identified one possible site, a 36-acre tract east of Interstate 95 and north of Pioneer Trail, known in city discussions and documents as the Stanaki property.

Volusia County officials sent city leaders a draft buffer plan for scrub restoration efforts within a 170-acre parcel off Martin's Dairy Road, which was intended to balance the need for scrub restoration and the interests of recreational users of the preserve.

But most city leaders, such as Councilman Don Burnette, felt there was no compromise despite the inclusion of 25-foot buffers on each side of the See **PROJECT, A5**

County unveils proposals for DeLand Sunrail



While construction has begun on the 32-mile first phase of the SunRail commuter transit system between DeBary and Sand Lake Road in Orlando, Volusia County planners are focusing their attention on an area east of the DeLand station that will be in the second phase of the eventual 61.5-mile project.

The first phase is expected to be operational in 2014, while phase two is scheduled to be online by 2017 from DeLand to Poinciana in Osceola County.

County officials recently conducted a public workshop to unveil two possible scenarios for about 262 acres east of the railroad tracks, south of State Road 44 and generally along the north side of Old New York Avenue, plus an area on the south side of Old New York from West Euclid Avenue to West Beresford Avenue. The proposed boundaries define what would become an Activity Center around the SunRail station.

At the workshop, Volusia County Planning Manager

Becky Mendez said the Florida Department of Transportation is "encouraging" what it calls "Transportation-Oriented Developments" - TODs -- around all the stations in the SunRail line.

The existing zoning within the Activity Center is a mix of industrial, agricultural, and residential designations, plus 57 acres that comprised a residential planned unit development called Pelham Square. That development, approved in 2006, was never built.

After working with planners from the city of DeLand and the Florida Department of Transportation for several years, county officials are proposing that 89 acres become the TOD core, while a large swath along the south side of S.R. 44 and the area south of Old New York Avenue become TOD transition areas.

Ms. Mendez presented two scenarios for implementing the TOD.

In the first scenario, the county would designate the entire area an activity center on future land-use maps. That would implement the SunRail TOD "to its fullest extent" and "clearly states the purpose and intent for the area." On the other hand, the existing zoning would be incompatible with the new designation, and would require any new development to comply with the new policies, she said.

The second scenario would allow property owners to develop under existing zoning and does not create incompatible zoning or non-conforming uses of existing properties. But that flexibility could result in development that is incompatible with the TOD concept, she said.

Existing businesses could continue to operate under either scenario, Ms. Mendez said in response to a question from the audience. But if a use becomes non-conforming after either scenario is adopted, those businesses would be prohibited from enlarging or adding structures on their property, and if abandoned for six months or more, would be required to be brought into a use that complies with the future land-use designation before reopening.

Ronnie Mills, a candidate

dered her on or about Jan. 15, 2011. She was reported missing from her Holly Hill residence on March 29, 2011, Mr. Monahan said.

Police said the investigation into Ms. Starr's murder identified Mr. Maxwell as also responsible for killing 48-year-old Pamela Will on or about Sept. 10, 2010. Ms. Will was reported missing from her South Daytona residence Sept. 24, 2010 and her body was found January 2011 in a ditch at the rear of International Trade Associates at West Tower Circle in Ormond Beach, where Mr. Maxwell was formerly employed.

When the victims' bodies were found, Laurreta Rogers, mother of missing Port Orange woman Laurel Rogers, feared the remains could be those of her daughter.

And although no one in Ms. Rogers' family personally knew Mr. Maxwell, the proximity of her family residence to Mr. Maxwell's was a concern to her.

"We (my family) just kept our prayers that anyone (police) found wasn't Laurel," she said in a phone interview. "But (Mr. Maxwell) is very close. He's not too far down the street from us."

Ms. Rogers said she understands the situation the families of Ms. Starr and Ms. Will are going through because of her difficulty facing every passing day without her daughter around.

"I know their hearts were breaking every day," she said. "You would never think you'd be in that position. Personally feeling that way, it's devastating. Your whole life is turned upside down. My heart goes out to them, my prayers are with them."

Police said an investigation remains ongoing to find additional evidence in the murders.

"We're not done," Mr. Monahan said. "We have more work to do and we will continue to do whatever we have to put this to a successful conclusion."

Mr. Maxwell has been held in the Volusia County Branch Jail on no bail since he was charged in December 2011 with child rape and abduction. Police said he kidnapped a 9-year-old girl after a party at her family's house and raped her.

According to the Florida Department of Corrections, Mr. Maxwell's criminal history dates back to an attempted murder in 1988. He pleaded guilty to the charges that stemmed from an incident in which he stabbed a prostitute in the heart with a knife and spent

a year and a half in prison. Records show after that, Mr. Maxwell had several burglary offenses. He has also been on drug and alcohol probation.

In a joint press conference with Port Orange police held recently, State Attorney R.J. Larizza described the murders as "chilling and very disturbing."

"Certainly one murder is one too many," he said, "but when you start getting into multiple murders, it raises our radar and our flags and causes serious concern."

Mr. Larizza also said it's "premature" to say if his office would pursue the death penalty against Mr. Maxwell, but said he would alert the news media when a decision is made.

Attempts to reach family members of Ms. Starr, Ms. Will and Mr. Maxwell before press time were unsuccessful.



trails, because trees in 85 percent of the preserve would be roller chopped to accommodate prescribed burns that would stimulate the scrub habitat restoration.

"I don't see compromise in that," he said. "Prescribed burns for fire control, I don't have a problem with that. But the prescribed burn I'm talking about is my belly when I see how much of that is going to be roller chopped. That is unacceptable to me as is."

He later added: "It feels like the compromise is I give and you take."

Mr. Burnette wasn't the only one who was skeptical of whether the buffer zones would sustain the trail sites. City Manager Ken Parker suggested the trees that aren't sent to the chopping

block could be lost in prescribed burns.

"How does a fire know to stop at a 25-foot buffer?" he said.

Plans to restore scrub habitat at Spruce Creek Preserve have been in the works since 1994, when the first local management plan for the project was developed. Last year, county and state leaders "conditionally approved" a land management plan calling for scrub habitat restoration.

County leaders voted to allow the roller chopping to begin last month, despite opposition from trail users, and trees along an 84-acre tract were cut down. Faced with the threat of a lawsuit from Port Orange leaders, they voted to pause the roller chopping following a July 26 meeting and seek compromise with stakeholders in the preserve including Port Orange leaders and those who use the

trails for biking, hiking and horseback riding, who felt they were excluded from the process of putting the plan together.

Mr. Parker, in explaining the history of the Spruce Creek Preserve to city leaders at a recent meeting, said in the late 1980s several local government agencies, including Port Orange, bonded together to acquire the preserve property for conservation and recreation purposes in response to a proposal to develop the property into a residential area. After that, state leaders took over ownership and requested Volusia County manage it on their behalf.

He said the city's priorities related to the preserve include maintaining public access of the property for recreational uses, preserving historical resources such as an ancient Indian mound, and protecting the environmental element.

Supporters of the Spruce Creek Preserve expressed agreement with the direction Port Orange leaders wish to take.

One of them was Suzanne Kosmas, a New Smyrna Beach resident and former congresswoman, who said she objects to the county's buffer plan because the destruction of the tree canopy and the resulting wind shifts would destroy the trails as she knows them.

She said all the stakeholders must be involved in the negotiations for a workable compromise to be achieved.


"If the stakeholders who were interested had been involved from Day 1," Ms. Kosmas said, "we wouldn't have awakened one day and seen roller choppers at Spruce Creek Preserve with no prior notification that this 'restoration' was taking place."

How much data is really on your hard drive?

Oh, I don't have that much stuff on my computer, just some pictures, music and email, not much."

That's a comment I hear fairly often and using just the tools that are built into Windows, how much data you are accumulating can be a tricky thing to keep tabs on. People are often surprised when they learn just how much data they really do have on their hard drives and are usually at a loss as to how to account for it.

On a typical Windows machine you should see a "my computer" icon either on the desktop or in the start menu. When you open it you should see the contents of the hard drive laid out in a logical order.

Among other things, you should find your disk drives labeled with name and a letter followed by a colon (ie: local disk C: or DVD drive D:). Now on a typical Windows machine, all of the data is saved on the C: drive so that's where we want to focus.

If we ignore everything else and then "right click" the icon that represents the C: drive a menu should open and one of the options should be "proper-

ties." Click the properties option and that should open a little window that shows the general properties and characteristics of the drive that you are looking at. You should see things such as the type of drive, file system and then (what we came here to see) how much space is used vs. how much is free.

This information is then artfully displayed in the form of a pie chart with the used space in blue and the free space in magenta.

Now we can "see" how much data is being used on a disk but what that pie chart doesn't tell us is where that disk space is being used. To figure that out we need to dig a little deeper.

Close the disk properties window and we should be back looking at the contents of your "my computer" window. This time, instead of right clicking the C: drive we are going to double click it, which will open the drive so we can see what's inside.

One way to look at it is like this: think of the C: drive (or any drive for that matter) as a file cabinet drawer and when you open it you see the same thing you would see if you yanked open a "real" file cabinet drawer, a bunch of manila folders.

To continue our quest to determine where all of our hard drive space is going we can now start measuring folders.

All of the little manila folder icons that show up when you open a drive each use up a little or a lot of drive space and the way to tell how much is to hold your mouse over each folder and stop. If you do it right a little message box will pop up telling you how large the folder is. When you have a folder that you want to look at more closely, right click it and then click "properties" and you'll be presented with a little more detail.

Now, that pretty much covers the basics of "determining folder sizes in Windows" but I'll be the first to admit, that whole procedure is a pain in the rear and really hard to determine anything useful. There has to be a better way to "see" what's going on and there is. Point your

browser to www.diskspacefan.com and grab a copy of Disk Space Fan. It's free of malware and viruses and free in price (there is a pro version available but the free version works just fine).

Once you've downloaded your copy, double click it and install it on your machine.

When you run it, a pie chart representing your C: drive will be displayed. Click the scan button and wait a little bit for it to scan your drive. When it's finished, you will be presented with a "fan chart" representing all the folders by color and size. Hold your mouse over the center of the chart and move outward to see the folder name and size of each segment of the chart.

Disk Space Fan does an excellent job of putting all that information into one chart you can understand at a glance.

Go ahead, run it on your machine. You may be surprised at just where all your hard drive space is going.

Commercial real estate picking up

The commercial real estate deals have picked up recently with the biggest one coming in at \$11 million for the Island Club apartments on Beville Road.

R.J. Finlay & Co., a New Hampshire multi-family housing developer and manager, acquired the 204-unit apartment complex from Colorado-based AIMCO, which bought it for about \$11.3 million in 2002. Finlay is renaming it the Granite at Porpoise Bay. Finlay already owns other commercial properties in Florida and is building new apartments in Port St. Lucie.

Another property that sold for about the same as its previous price was the Publix shopping center in Holly Hill. H&R REIT, a Downsview, Ont., Canada, investment company, paid \$7.9 million to Pompano Beach investors that had bought it for \$7.8 million in 2004. The real estate investment trust owns about 300 properties, including several in Florida.

The CVS Pharmacy at 101 S. Ridgewood Ave. in Daytona Beach was sold by a Coral Gables investor to Paul S. Phillos LLC for \$3.65 million. The Coral Gables investor had bought it under the name CVTONA LLC for \$3.05 million in 2011.

It's not just real estate that's selling, though. Fenner Advanced Sealing Technologies, a Houston plastics and elastomeric components maker, acquired American Indus-

trial Plastics, 724 Fentress Blvd., Daytona Beach. Fenner Advanced Sealing, a subsidiary of U.K.-based Fenner PLC, valued AIP at \$3.8 million. AIP develops precision machined products for the oil and gas, industrial and medical markets.

But the most surprising deal was by Syrian investors who bought the incomplete church at Madeline Avenue and Williamson Boulevard for \$427,800. I wasn't able to find out anything more this week, but I'll keep a close eye on this one.

There were also some smaller deals, but all-in-all it shows that investors and businesses continue to have a lot of interest in the Volusia County market.

Initial claims for unemployment compensation were at 1,944 in July, down 19.5 percent from 2,416 in July 2011. Fewer workers are going on the unemployment rolls, but it's still not at a level that shows employment is growing strongly. The indication of strong job growth will come when claims drop closer to about 1,000 a month.

Spanos Imports continues to grow, expanding its service department to be able to handle just about any type of auto. The auto dealer, at 520 W. International Speedway Blvd., Daytona Beach, which specializes in used luxury vehicles, now has 41 employees. Spanos offers free insurance estimates

and does complete interior and exterior body repair.

Some doubly good news is happening on the industrial front. Conelec of Florida has started work on revamping a building at DeLand Crossings to move its electronics manufacturing operation there from Stanford. Conelec acquired the building earlier this year after Intelitec lost the property in foreclosure.

Conelec is expected to have about 120 workers in the building at Interstate 4 and State Road 44 by the end of this year. But Intelitec isn't going far. It is moving to the former beer distributorship property at 1290 E. International Speedway Blvd. in DeLand where it will have about 40 employees.

On the restaurant beat, the news wasn't too good recently. Star Buffet Inc. of Scottsdale, Ariz., has closed the Holiday House restaurant in Ormond Beach. Star, which operates a variety of restaurants across the country, has struggled and is reorganizing under bankruptcy protection. Krystal is putting on hold plans for a new place in DeLand. It has acquired the property, but withdrew a request to the city for annexation, rezon-

ing and land-use change.

It's official now on Jimmy Johns opening in Ormond Beach, though. The commercial real estate team of Ron Frederick and Buddy Budiansky of Prudential Commercial Real Estate in Daytona Beach recently sold the property at the corner of Perrott Drive and Granada Boulevard to Triebel Family Enterprises. This will be the fourth store for owners Brent and Dawn Triebel, who operate Jimmy Johns in the area with their son, Cort, daughter, Brooke, and son-in-law, Jason. The Triebels bought the 1.05 acre for \$255,000 from LSM Holding, which was represented by Roy Akins of Adams Cameron & Co. The Triebels will be tearing down an existing 1,000-square-foot building and replacing it with a 3,000-square-foot restaurant/retail building. The restaurant is slated to open in November.

One last note, Roar Motorcycles, which specializes in motorcycles and accessories for women, has moved to 420 N. Beach St. in Daytona Beach. While it was by itself as far as motorcycle-related businesses go on Bellevue Avenue, it is now in the middle of motorcycle central on Beach Street.

refurbishing and updating runways at DBI, which cost about \$10 million. The Federal Aviation Administration and Florida Department of Transportation funded most of that. According to Mr. Cooke, Delta and US Airways have started flying larger planes into the airport, too.

In addition to negotiating with Jet Blue to open service to New York, Mr. Cooke said he's having conversations with international carriers for flights to Mexico and the Caribbean.

"Since the first of the year, I've had 20 face-to-face meetings with airways," Mr. Cooke said. "I think they're more receptive. Two years ago, we fell off a cliff, the airline industry, and hit a recession. We've been digging our way out of that hole."

for Volusia County Council who operates a family-owned septic service company on West Avenue near the station, wasn't pleased with either plan.

"(By doing this) you devalue the property, and devalue the business, if not force it out altogether," he said.

Mr. Mills will have several more opportunities to weigh in on the proposals. Ms

Mendez said the county's Planning, Land Development and Regulation Commission will discuss the plan earlier this week (Aug. 14) and at a public hearing tentatively set for Sept. 11.

The County Council could hold its first hearing on the TOD plan at its Oct. 4 meeting, she said, after which the Volusia Growth Management Commission and the state would have to review it. The County Council's second hearing could come sometime in December, she said.

"We're definitely having it discussed at the (Planning, Land Development and Regulation Commission) meeting Aug. 14," she said. "The rest of the hearing schedule is not set in stone."

Mike Holmes, DeLand's planning director, said he thought the county was going in the right direction.

"The county is indicating that if the station is built, they will seek changes to the future land uses," he said. "We've got plenty of time. I'll be interested in seeing what

the policies will be when it's done."

In a related matter, state transportation officials announced that the DeBarry station and four others in SunRail's first phase are eligible for additional funding for improvements "to increase transportation options for passengers and freight." According to a news release, the funds are designed for projects that help connect passengers and freight to the SunRail system.

business owner and city council candidate Ted Nof-tall, that description was amended to allow candidates with equivalent private sector experience to be included for consideration.

"It allows someone who, say, ran a large utility, to apply for it," Councilman Bob Ford said. "That keeps it open."

The city manager is required to live in Port Orange. Mr. Nof-tall also asked if the job requirements could state the position is also open to current city employees, but Mr. Parker said that would give the impression that city leaders are "pre-selecting" their candidate.

"If you're pre-selecting, you might as well not go through the advertisement process," Mr. Parker said.

Now that the salary range and details of the job

announcement have been completed, the announcement will be posted to the city's website this week. Candidates have until Sept. 30 to submit their resumes to city staff.

A citizens committee will review applicants between Oct. 1 and Nov. 16, and interviews with the finalists are scheduled for Dec. 10 and Dec. 14. The new city manager will be selected on Dec. 21 and will begin work on March 1 following Mr. Parker's retirement.


Possible closing of the Beach Street Tomoka River Bridge to fishing

There is a nasty rumor swirling that the authorities in their infinite wisdom will soon close the Tomoka River Bridge on North Beach Street to fishing.

As long as anyone can remember, that span has been a favorite for land-bound anglers.

The last time I fished there, I met two men from DeLand who told me that is the only place they fish. Please let the folks at Tomoka State Park and the County Council know if you want the bridge to remain a fishing spot.

On the upside, New Smyrna Beach will soon begin construction on boat ramps at the old Swoope power plant across from the

airport. It is intended to relieve the pressure from the ramps on the north causeway, but I believe it will be a better boon to the Ponce Inlet launch area. When it is completed next year, it will give us another way to get to the inlet. Water quality in the Northern Mosquito Lagoon is still in bad shape. The yellowish algae bloom that has occurred this summer is the worst in recent memory and may result in the loss of much of the important sea

grass beds. Due to the bloom, the fishing has been way off this summer and some of the old timers think it may not return for a long time. The water in the Halifax is exceptionally clear for this time of year. The usual summer algae bloom has not happened there.

Wading last week, I could see bottom in 3 feet of water. That seldom happens in hot weather.

This summer has been the best for Halifax River sea trout in some time. It seems that all of those undersized we have been throwing back for the past few years have finally grown.

Trout there are averaging from 16 to 20 inches and are plentiful. Just about every-one I speak with report

good catches. Flounder are still around, and while this year could not possibly match the last, it has still been pretty darn good.

At this writing, I have caught 56 flounder since mid-March. I have to say this summer's flounder have been a nice size. Fish more than 20 inches have been common and averaging around 17 inches.

Shrimp are still flowing down the center of the Halifax, but timing is everything. Not long ago, I netted an Asian shrimp as part of my catch. I caught it just north of Granada in Ormond Beach and when I notified the state, they told me that is as north as they have come. If you catch an

Asian (tiger) shrimp the state wants to know. Measure it and snap a photo, if you can then email to askfivc.com.

Spent the morning recently with 27 kids at the Casements Enviro Camp. That, my friends, is a wild time. Twenty-seven youngsters from ages 5 to 8 fishing at once? Oh my! Lots of squealing, a little crying and many questions.

The star of the show was the puffer fish caught by Jai Wan Rij of Ormond Beach, but a close second was the eel caught by Antonio Nogueiro, also of Ormond. Charlie Freeman caught the most, while Lucy Purvis lost a huge redfish. One little girl screamed for help because she had caught one, but

when I went over, it turned out to be the shrimp I had put on her hook for bait. How did the catfish get its name? Did the eel shock me when I took it off of the hook? When I asked one kid where he lived, he told me Florida. No use giving up too much information, I suppose.

If you think fishing is boring, take a few kids out and watch what goes on. Thanks to Siobhan Daly and her staff for the great job with the tiny anglers.

'Melt' the veggies for a traditional spaghetti sauce

Hello smart shoppers. Every couple of years I find it necessary to repeat my family's superb spaghetti sauce recipe, so here it is. Why no company can make a great sauce is beyond me but I've yet to find anything comparable. The recipe is from my mother and my father's mother; together it's the best. I was told to use an Italian brand of tomatoes since they're made with plum tomatoes, which are

sweeter. A basic tomato sauce, one to which you will add meat if you choose, does not contain oregano. Oregano is used in a marinara sauce that does not contain meat. Marinara sauce is served plain or with seafood. Disagree? That's fine, that's what it's all about, but try my sauce and you be the judge. The secret to great tomato sauce is one: in the ingredients; and two: in the

method of cooking. One thing you really need is a large heavy pot, so if you don't have one now is the time. Gone are the days when I used lard or bacon drippings. After learning my cholesterol was too high I changed many of my recipes to eliminate, if possible, high-fat and high-cholesterol ingredients. Today, my sauce is virtually fat-free. But amazingly, it's still delicious. Adding grated

Romano cheese to the sauce as it cooks adds a little fat but so much flavor. See you next week!

SPAGHETTI SAUCE serves 6 or more

- 1 large (28-ounce) can tomato puree
- 1 large (28-ounce) can crushed tomatoes with added puree
- Two small (6-ounce) cans tomato paste
- 2 large onions
- 2 medium carrots
- 2 large cloves garlic
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 5 or 6 large fresh basil leaves, whole, or 1 tablespoon dried basil
- Pinch of dried rosemary, crushed between fingers
- Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley (chopped) or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1 handful grated Romano cheese
- 1-1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- Few shakes crushed red pepper (optional)
- Water or chicken broth

Peel onions and garlic; trim and scrub carrots. Carrots contain a natural sugar, which usually eliminates the need for added sugar. Chop vegetables very fine (a food processor is great for this). Sauté in a large pot in the oil or use water if you want a completely fat-free sauce. As Mama used to say, "You must cook the vegetables until they almost melt." Since you are using a very small amount of oil you must keep adding water, about a cup at a time, as it

cooks down. This is the longest preparation process for the sauce and can take about 30 minutes. When I decide to make sauce I double or triple the recipe and freeze it in suitable size containers for future meals. Add tomato paste and cook a few minutes, stirring constantly. Add remaining ingredients and liquid until thinned to desired consistency. Stir well; bring to a boil. Lower heat to just a simmer, cover and let cook for 2 hours, stirring occasionally. Remember, a burnt sauce is bitter and cannot be fixed.

- 1/2 stick butter or 1/4-cup butter substitute such as Smart Balance

ing 2/3-cup biscuit mix with brown sugar. Using an electric mixer cut in butter or substitute until mixture is the size of small peas. Stir in milk until moistened. Drop batter by spoonfuls onto fruit. Bake at 400-degrees for 30 minutes until toothpick inserted into crust comes out clean. Let stand 5 minutes.

MICROWAVE FUDGE

This quick fudge is high-fat because of the butter, but what fudge isn't?

- 1 (1-pound) box confectioner's sugar
- 1/2-cup cocoa
- 1 stick butter
- 1/4-cup milk
- 1/2-cup chopped nuts
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift sugar and cocoa into ungreased 9-inch square microwave-safe glass pan. Cut butter into five pieces on top. Pour in milk; DO NOT STIR. Cook on high in microwave two to three minutes until bubbling. Remove from microwave; stir thoroughly; blend in nuts and vanilla; spread evenly. Refrigerate one hour, cut into squares.

Charming course in Melbourne Beach will test your skills

Watching the PGA Championship this past weekend made me long for playing a course near the ocean where the wind blows, and then blows some more. Being honest, I didn't really long to play in such wind, but I was up for the challenge.

The Island Links at Aquarina, located on South A1A in Melbourne Beach, just north of the Sebastian Inlet, fit the bill

nicely. The course sits with the Atlantic Ocean on the east and the Indian River Lagoon on the west. If ever a course can be windy and tricky, this may be it.

Designed by my late friend, Charles Ankrom, the course opened in 1996. Of all the courses he designed, this is probably one of which he was most proud. The challenges presented by the sand dunes, the salt air, the wetlands and more made

designing Aquarina difficult. Some of the innovative ideas he came up with won him awards from his peers.

Closed for more than a year, the development's homeowners' association purchased the club and reopened it the day after Christmas in 2009.

Located on the barrier island and adjacent to the Indian River Lagoon State Preserve, the course features an abundance of

wildlife including bobcats, horned owls, turtles, alligators and even an occasional Florida panther.

Most golfers wouldn't consider a course that plays to a par of 62, measuring just over 4,300 yards from the tips, to be a true test of golf. Ankrom, however, was a master of finding ways other than length to defend a course, yet make it fun, playable and fair for all.

The course follows the natural lay of the land with undulating greens and fairways. There are a couple of wetlands that require you to carry your ball to the green or to the fairway from the tee. The 14th and 15th holes feature a set of tees that won an award. Here you face a tee shot from a dock-style tee over the

wetlands. A bit of advice here: when on the 14th tee, aim just to the left of the fairway bunker that you see. Anything right of that may find trouble.

Aquarina starts off with a straight-forward, no frills par-4. From there it's onto a couple of par-3s, followed by a pair of tricky par-4s. The front nine ends with a lovely par-3, measuring 158 yards from the back tees.

The tees tend to be hidden in the trees, shielding you from the wind. This forces you to pay careful attention to the flag and the tops of the trees to figure out what the wind is really doing and make your club selection accordingly.

Since the course cannot defend itself with length, the greens' complexes are quite challenging. Proper



placement of your tee shot on the par-4s is paramount to having a good angle at the green. Otherwise you risk a difficult chip, pitch or sand shot should you miss your target.

The back nine starts off with a par-4 that requires two precise shots. The 11th hole is my favorite par-3 on the course. Measuring 181 yards from the back tees, it requires a confident tee shot. Depending on the wind and pin location, you could find yourself playing as much as two clubs extra



or less from the tee.

Sixteen is a very tough mid-length par-3. With water and sand guarding the green, and a hurting wind, you need to select the right club and make a good swing. Eighteen is the longest hole on the course and probably has the largest green and the widest fairway.

While the course doesn't have any par-5s, the eight par-4s and 10 par-3s will challenge your skills. After my round, I ran through my shots and found that I hit all but two clubs in my bag.

To find out more about the renewed and improving Island Links at Aquarina, call the pro shop at (321) 676-8923 or visit the website www.islandlinksgolf.com. Summer rates are in effect and a better value for your money may be difficult to find.

A couple of quick pointers before you head out to experience the course for yourself. Bring along a few extra balls, there are some water hazards and mangrove hammocks that will eat those stray shots. Also, bring along your best bug spray. The same mangroves that will eat your golf ball, also house some very hungry mosquitoes.
