'Justice for Trayvon' rally planned

The Rev. Dr. L. Ronald Durham along with several area pastors and the local NAACP will join Rev. Al Sharpton in calling for a "Justice for Trayvon" National Day of Action Vigil, which is part of a 100 Cities Action, at noon Saturday, July 20.

The Daytona Beach "Justice for Trayvon" National Day of Action will be in front of the Fifth District Federal Court of Appeals, 300 S. Beach St.

According to Dr. Durham, "the vigils, taking place in 100 or more cities, will be a

Council authorizes Votran to start fare-hike process

Votran riders could see a 50 cent fare increase, but not for several months and not all at once.

At its July 11 meeting, the Volusia County Council voted 5-2 in favor of proceeding toward higher bus fares throughout the county.

If cash fares are increased from \$1.25 to \$1.75, with an accompanying raise in pass prices, as proposed, the estimated additional annual revenue generated will be \$347,778.

To ease the financial burden to system riders, the council may opt to raise fares in two steps, beginning with a 25 cent cash fare hike in February 2014, followed by another 25 cent increase a year later.

With Votran facing a \$1.1 million dollar short-

fall in the coming year and projected increase of \$2 million for fiscal year 2015 to the general fund subsidy, revenue generated from increased fares would ease the funding challenge.

At \$1.25 for the fixed route cash fare and \$3 for the day pass, current Votran fares are lower than the statewide average — \$1.56 for full fare — of other Florida transit systems, Volusia County Community Services reported. The fee structure has not changed since 2007.

Before implementation of any increase, a federally mandated fare equity analysis and public participation process must take place. Completion of these actions is expected to take six months.

County Manager Jim Dinneen emphasized the full impact of the additional revenue would not

be realized right away.

If fares go up in February and the council decides to delay full implementation the additional first-year revenue will be around \$110,000, he explained.

"We have to start somewhere," he said. Councilwoman Pat Northey asked Votran gen-

Hard Rock ideas go back and forth

A Hard Rock Hotel and Café is coming to Daytona Beach in 2016, but, until then, there is lots of work to do.

The Daytona Beach Main Street/South Atlantic Redevelopment Area Board listened to a presentation on the design plans during its July 10 meeting.

"It's very exciting and everyone is on board to try to make this happen," said Reed Berger, Daytona Beach Redevelopment Director.

The presentation was given by Bayshore Capital. The Toronto-based company bought oceanfront property on A1A near Sun-Splash park where the Hard Rock will be located.

"We are required to do a concept and review by the Redevelopment Board. Tonight we showed some initial plans," said Glenn Storch, Bayshore's local

attorney.

Plans call for a 375,000-square-foot development, which will include a 250-room hotel, more than 100 condos, a ballroom, spa, memorabilia shop and a studio.

Construction will be in three phases. The first will be for the hotel and restaurant. The second phase will possibly be another hotel (based on need) with possible condominiums and alternative residential units. The final phase will be the construction of shops, which may include a Starbucks.

Plans for a parking garage also are being thrown around.

The city, developer and incoming business think that it's a win-win situation for all.

"It's a perfect marriage. Daytona has the motor sports and beach while the Hard Rock has the rock 'n'

Author relocates to Port Orange

"If you want to write a story, if you have a story to tell, you can do it," author Timothy Glass said.

Mr. Glass, an author, cartoonist and illustrator, recently moved to Port Orange from Albuquerque, N.M., and now teaches writing classes at the Adult Learning Center.

Mr. Glass is the author of a best-selling nonfiction book, "Just This Side of Heaven," the Sleepytown Beagles children's book series; and a novel, "Postcards," written under the name T. Faron. His cartoon series based on the Sleepytown Beagles is a regular feature on GoComics.com.

Mr. Glass said his writing students come from all over Volusia County, and range from aspiring beginners to experienced writers who want to try a new genre.

"You've got some real tal-

ent here in the Port Orange area," he said.

However, whether inherently gifted or not, Mr. Glass believes students can be taught to write. "It's a gift, but you can learn," he said. His teaching follows the approach of a former mentor, who would tell his class, "No one left behind," Mr. Glass said.

Despite the variation in media and genres in his work, it's not difficult to spot an underlying theme. With the exception of "Postcards," a novel Mr. Glass compared to a Nicholas Sparks story, beagles are prominent in his work. The author and his wife, Cathy, live with two tri-colored beagles.

"I do not own the beagles; they own us," he explained. "The beagles are like children. They're special."

The Sleepytown Beagle series began in 2006 with "Sleepytown Beagles: Panda Meets Ms. Daisy

Bloom." Mr. Glass said the idea for the children's series came while he was watching coverage of 9/11 on television, and heard Peter Jennings comment that children all over the world would have trouble coping with the tragedy.

"I created a safe haven, which was called Safety Town," he said. "I was trying to create life lessons, but also trying to create a safe haven," he said.

Each book of what became the "Sleepytown Beagles" series contains a lesson, such as patience or

dealing with a new sibling. "The backdrop of that story is all surrounded in safety," Mr. Glass said.

His nonfiction "Just This Side of Heaven" (Platinum Paw Press, 2008) was inspired by the loss of Penny, a beagle that had been one of his wife's two beagles before the couple married and the blended beagle family became the trio that inspired the Sleepytown Beagles.

The memoir touched readers around the world with its message of hope

eral manager Steve Sherrer to clarify an issue raised at the June 24 Daytona Beach International Airport meeting where county officials met with city leaders from all over Volusia to solicit more funding for Votran.

Ormond Beach Mayor Ed Kelley questioned the coun-

ty's statistics on the average Votran rider, saying it was important to consider how many system users are students.

Votran's youth fare, which applies to anyone under 18, is 60 cents.

Mr. Sherrer said statistics provided at the meeting showed the Votran rider median age is 16 to 24 with an annual income of less than \$10,000.

"We don't have a fare type for students," he said.

"But you can tell how many ride," Councilwoman Northey said.

"We count all passengers," Mr. Sherrer responded.

He also confirmed none of the Votran routes are profitable.

Votran's operational budget for 2013-14 is projected to be \$21 million, with \$7.4 million coming from the

general fund.

Fares represent less than \$3 million of the budget.

Ridership has increased each year since 2008, but higher fuel costs, demand for more routes and the ability to provide timely service during special events and on certain routes have presented challenges.

Cross-county Route 60 in particular has had issues with on-time performance, Mr. Sherrer told the council. Distance, increased traffic and construction along U.S. 92 are to blame.

"That route has gotten so busy it's almost impossible to operate without reducing mileage," he said.

As of July 15, Route 60 no longer will travel into the Volusia Mall parking lot, but will stop along West International Speedway Boulevard near the mall to save 10

minutes.

The Volusia Mall will continue to be served by routes 10, 11, 18 and 19 for customers who want a bus that stops closer to the mall, according to Votran's website.

Route 60 outbound passengers are advised to board and de-board at Hagen Terrace and International Speedway Boulevard. Route 60 inbound passengers should board and de-board at Midway Avenue and International Speedway Boulevard.

According to Votran the following Route 60 time points will have new departure times:

Outbound trips departing from International Speedway Boulevard and Tomoka Farms Road will arrive on the hour. Inbound trips to International Speedway Boulevard and Nova Road will arrive 16 minutes past the hour.

In West Volusia, the route stops at NorthGate Plaza at the Corner of Woodland and East International Speedway boulevards (U.S. 17 and U.S. 92) in DeLand. Riders can get on other buses there, a county spokeswoman said.

friends. They are having fun and learning."

The camp is just one of the ways Mr. Carter gives back to the community.

"It's important to give back for any athlete of any sport. The thing is to do it because you want to, not because you have to. I do it because I enjoy it. I come from a giving family. This is fun for me," he said.

In Daytona Beach, Mr. Carter's camp is a family affair.

"My brothers are here helping, my daughter and niece are participating, my aunts and mother are also here doing something," he said.

Over the years, Mr. Carter has seen kids from his camps grow.

"I have seen a lot of kids go on to play in college. Others have gone on to be doctors, lawyers, athletic trainers and successful people in life. Some have been here since the age of 6 while others have attended the camps in New Jersey and Toronto. They love the coaches who come and give their time, too," he said.

Mr. Carter also does charity work through his

Embassy of Hope Foundation, a non-profit organization designed to help children and families.

"We do college scholarships, holiday food baskets, Christmas drives, golf tournaments to raise money for foundations for different causes. I've donated memorabilia. My goal is to try to reach everyone, not just focus on one area or thing," he said.

The Embassy of Hope was created by Mr. Carter in 1998 and his mother, Michelle Carter-Scott, is its executive director.

The foundation also created Kai's Closet to assist families with clothing needs and donated money to Stewart Marchman for a drug rehab center in Flagler County, which bears the name Vince Carter Sanctuary.

Mr. Carter is from Daytona Beach and starred at Mainland where he led the Buccaneers to a state title in 1995 and was a McDonalds All-American.

In college, he starred at North Carolina where he helped the Tar Heels win two ACC Tournament titles and made two Final Four appearances.

The Toronto Raptors drafted him in the first

round of the 1998 NBA draft.

He now plays for the Dallas Mavericks, averaging 13.4 points per game last season.

"I love playing in Dallas. I've been told that I won't be traded. They are a straight up organization. It's satisfying to know that my hard work has paid off," Mr. Carter said. "The owner, Mark Cuban, is very passionate about his team and he often shows it when you see him cheering on TV. He will do what it takes to make the team better always."

In 15 seasons, he has played with the New Jersey Nets, Orlando Magic and Phoenix Suns, posting career averages of 20.8 points, 5 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game. Mr. Carter also has scored more than 20,000 points.

He is an eight-time All-Star, two-time All-NBA selection, an Olympics gold medalist and slam-dunk champion.

"It's year by year for me. I can still shoot. I feel that I can have a job as long as I can. I've played longer than a lot of greats. I wanted to play 15 years. I've passed that. I am thankful that I have been productive and effective," Mr. Carter said.

Road improvements change traffic

The Florida Department of Transportation has begun signalization and intersection improvements on U.S. 92 in Daytona Beach and widening and adding a left turn lane on State Road A1A at Lynnhurst Drive near Ormond Beach.

Signalization and intersection improvements on U.S. 92 extend from Clyde

Morris Blvd to east of Nova Road in Daytona Beach.

The improvements consist of milling and resurfacing, drainage, traffic signals, sidewalk, sod placement and highway signing. Traffic Control Devices Inc. is performing the work.

The project lasts about 100 calendar days, weather permitting. The project cost is \$875,321.

Lane closures are expected during the project.

FDOT has begun widening and adding a left turn lane on State Road A1A at Lynnhurst Drive near Ormond Beach.

The improvements consist of widening on both sides of State Road A1A to develop a left turn lane at Lynnhurst. The project also includes milling and resurfacing the existing pavement and drainage improvements. Masci General Contractor Inc. is per-

forming the work. The project lasts about 50 calendar days, weather permitting. The project cost is \$206,758.

Daytime single lane closures northbound or southbound are expected throughout project timeframe.

Motorists should be alert for construction personnel and equipment along the construction corridors, and drive with care.

They seem to have so many plans in their box of tricks that it is fun to go in and see what is new. It seems like every week something is new.

I love how the adult cats are walking around. You get to see how much fun they are. The staff loves to tell you about each animal's personality. They are very pro saving any animal that is savable. Their positive attitude is great; their efforts to get their community involved are amazing. I do believe Edgewater has made a very good decision to allow this organization to take over their shelter and make all the improvements. You should go over and check it out if you haven't.

Scam alert: "grandparent scam" hits Volusia County

The Volusia County Sheriff's Office is alerting the public to an old, yet effective, scam that has victimized some Volusia residents recently.

One woman, a 78-year-old Deltona grandmother, lost more than \$50,000 to the scammers. It's the "Grandparent Scam," in which someone calls the victim and pretends to be a grandchild in serious trouble. The fake grandchild asks for money to be sent to him or her in another country or state where the person was supposedly arrested or in a car crash. Once the money is sent by wire transfer, the money and the suspect disappear. Then the victim later finds out that the real grandchild was never in trouble or even in the place the money was sent to.

In the Deltona woman's case, she got the first in a series of calls in June from a distraught man claiming to be her grandson. He said that he was in a car versus house accident and he was now in jail. He needed \$5,000 to bond out. The victim sent the money through wire transfer to South America, where the incident allegedly happened.

Over the next couple of weeks she got more phone calls from the fake grandson's lawyer asking for more money to cover mounting legal expenses and to compensate the homeowner whose house was damaged.

Finally, she called her grandson directly and learned that he wasn't the one who had called her. The total amount she paid by the time she discovered she was being scammed was \$55,500.

In a separate recent case, an 82-year-old grandmother from New Smyrna Beach reported she had received a call from a man claiming to be her grandson. He said he had been in an accident and arrested for driving under the influence in New York. The victim told deputies the man's voice sounded exactly like her actual grandson's and so she believed the caller. The man asked for \$1,800 to pay legal fees. The victim relayed the money order information to a woman claiming to be the grandson's attorney. Later that day the victim contacted her grandson directly to see how he was doing and learned he had never been in New York.

The best way to avoid this type of scam is to be aware of it in the first place. Share this information, especially with grandparents. The scammers will pressure the victim to act quickly because of the emergency nature of the fake crash or arrest. Don't give in to the pressure. Before even thinking about sending money anywhere, contact the grandchild or other relatives to see if the emergency story can be verified or debunked. Keep in mind that once money is sent through wire transfer, it's gone. There is no getting it back.

If someone is victimized by this scam, report it to the local law enforcement agency. Don't be embarrassed by what happened. It's happened to lots of other people, too.

Safe Kids reminds caregivers to 'Never Leave Your Child Alone' in a car

The hot days of summer are upon us and Safe Kids Volusia/Flagler is working to increase awareness of the dangers of leaving children alone in a vehicle. Caregivers are urged not to leave a child alone in a vehicle, not even for a minute. Tragically, four children in Florida have already died this year from heatstroke while unattended in cars. Nationwide, there have been 20 fatalities.

Since 1998, 580 children have died from heatstroke because they were unattended in vehicles that became too hot for them to survive. "A child's body heats up 3 to 5 times faster than an adult's, and infants and young children have no way of protecting themselves when unattended in a hot vehicle," said Steve Parris, Community Health Manager for Halifax Health Healthy Communities. No one is immune to this kind of tragedy. Fifty-two percent of the children who have died from heat stroke were forgotten by a caring adult who became distracted when they left the vehicle. Twenty-nine percent of the children were left unattended by an adult, gained entry into an unlocked vehicle, became trapped and were overcome by the heat. Eighteen percent of the deaths occurred because the child was intentionally left alone in the car while the adult went to do something else. Mr. Parris said, "It takes only minutes for a child to be at risk of death or serious, permanent injury when unattended in a hot car."

Safe Kids is encouraging everyone to ACT:

- Avoid heatstroke-related injury and death by never leaving your child alone in a car, not even for a minute. And make sure to keep your car locked when you're not in it and your keys out of reach so kids don't get in on their own.

- Create reminders by putting something in the back of your car next to your child such as a briefcase, a purse or a cell phone that is needed at your final destination. This is especially important if you're not following your normal routine.

- Take action. If you see a child alone in a car, call 911. Emergency personnel want you to call. They are trained to respond to these situations. One call could save a life.

Environmental concerns creeping in

Sorry, folks, but it's time to talk about some stuff that can be boring.

With new home construction picking up and the northern population's migration to Florida getting back in motion, we also have to keep looking at the environmental impact.

There's only so much water, so much landfill space, so much sewage disposal to go around and when you start adding 100 to 200 new households a month in one county, even as big a one as Volusia, all those resources start dwindling. And it's picking up.

The trend right now is that by the end of this year, construction will start on more than 200 new houses a month. The big builders, such as D.R. Horton and KB Home, have been grabbing all the available lots they can. They've been getting them cheap because there were a lot of subdivisions started and never finished during the big old bubble of the aughts. It could slow down some if the Federal Reserve Bank starts raising interest rates, but it won't stop the population growth in Volusia County.

So where we're sitting is at

the crux of making sure the growth doesn't overwhelm the existing resources. That means impact fees on new construction are going to have to come back in a big way, especially when it comes to figuring out a way to provide more water.

In a recent story, *Hometown News* pointed out there was some talk about disbanding the Volusia Council of Governments, a group of county and municipal leaders. A better idea is to get Deltona back in the fold and give VCOG the job of looking for ways to best use Volusia's resources and alternatives. While the Volusia Growth Management Commission could continue its job of making sure big projects fit the county's growth plans, VCOG could take it a step further and offer real solutions to future growth needs.

Without a huge base of

manufacturing or high-tech operations, Volusia needs growth to help fuel the economy. But it's got to be responsible growth, driven by people who look at it sensibly without worrying about their own jobs.

It's really happening. International Speedway Corp. is spending \$375 to \$400 million on rebuilding the grandstands at Daytona International Speedway. ISC's general contractor on the project officially filed a public notice that it's starting construction. An interesting part of that filing is the proof the contract had to show that it has a \$315 million performance bond. It took several companies, domestic and international, to cover that bond, but it shows serious businesspeople have confidence in ISC and NASCAR.

Who knew there was even any room left for more buildings at Oceanwalk in New Smyrna Beach? The sprawling complex is getting another six-story, 33-unit

complex. For anyone not familiar with Oceanwalk (note the one word use to differentiate it from Ocean Walk in Daytona Beach), the huge condo complex was developed by Sylvestri Investments and is on west side of South Atlantic Avenue, but it's just a short walk to the beach.

Speaking of home builders buying up lots, D.R. Horton recently paid \$1.9 million for the remaining lots in the Enclave off of East Beresford Avenue in DeLand. Also, the Johnson Group just bought back a big chunk of Venetian Bay for \$3.2 million. Venetian Bay, along with Victoria Park in DeLand, is where the most new houses are popping up right now in Volusia. Kolter Homes just got permits to build 32 more homes in Victoria Park.

Free anti-texting and driving program attracts students at five high schools

Nearly 2,500 students from five area high schools recently entered a "text-free zone" as they participated in free hands-on anti-texting and driving lessons at their respective schools.

- Cold, pale and clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Fainting

What you can do to prevent heat exhaustion:

- Stay in an air-conditioned indoor location
- Drink plenty of fluids
- Wear loose, lightweight,

light-colored clothing and sunscreen

- Pace yourself
- Take cool showers or baths to cool down
- Check on elderly friends or neighbors
- Do not leave children in hot cars

• Check the local news for health and safety updates

It is important for people to know the very young and the elderly are at the highest risk for developing a heat-related illness. However, anyone can develop one with enough exposure to the heat. Remember air conditioning is the number one protective factor and stay cool.

roll legacy," Mr. Storch said.

"This will bring in a lot of new tourists that have never been here. It will also bring in a lot more revenue that will go back into that area, which means that we can make a lot of improvements in that area," Mr. Berger said.

The Hard Rock is expected to bring a lasting economic impact.

"We hope to start construction by the beginning of 2014. We estimate the creation of 350-400 permanent jobs per year at about \$35,000 per year. We estimate 700 construction jobs. The construction is expected to take a total of two years to complete all phases," Mr. Storch said.

Residents from that part of town like the idea of Hard Rock coming, but they have concerns in regards to beach access and parking.

"I moved back to the area recently. I grew up here. There was a lot more going on back then, especially in that part of town. I am excited to see something going up. I only am frustrated with how the county has chosen things for us," Chris Van Cima said.

"I have yet to hear what

this is going to do for the voters who live there. I have lived there since 1958. Consider the neighbors. We don't want to stop progress but we are giving up an approach to the beach," Mike Dennis said.

"I moved here from Atlanta. I often vacationed here in the past. When I moved here it took me a year to find a place to live. Then I found a place on Lenox Avenue. We have a wonderful view of the ocean and get a great breeze. We love our neighborhood. We appreciate this coming here, but we have concerns. I believe you have to sacrifice so that others can benefit," Susan Bousquet said.

Despite public concerns, the city and developer believe things are progressing.

"We have a formal public process through our boards and commission, but the Hard Rock and Bayshore have been meeting in the neighborhood and getting residents' input. It's been a very positive thing thus far," Mr. Berger said.





Smart Xeriscaping saves water

With natural resources such as fresh water at a premium, conserving these natural resources as much as possible is an absolute necessity. With this in mind, it is imperative to choose plants that are resistant to draught and require less water in order to thrive.

In order to create a landscape that is easy to maintain in draught conditions it is important to group like plants together. This will help make the watering of your plants much easier because all the plants in a particular group will have the same needs.

For example, if you want to use annuals or other plants that require more water, place them all together in a grouping. On the other hand, if you have plants that require minimal watering such as Crown of Thorns, Bougainvillea and succulents, try to keep them in another grouping. By organizing your plants in this way, watering will not only be easier, it will be more enjoyable and require less time.

One factor that is often overlooked when purchasing your plants is the quality of the product. Where you buy your plants is almost as important as what choices you make in plant species. When choosing plants that will withstand extreme elements that Florida often offers, local mom-and-pop plant growers will often offer the best quality plants for the money.

In addition, the plants are grown right here in our local area and are well adapted to our local conditions. So the next time you are out and about and you pass by that small local nursery you never pay that attention to, stop by and look around and chances are you will find some great plants that will

hold up very well in your local area.

In addition to designing your gardens for maximum water efficiency, you should also design your turf area for the same.

As I mentioned in earlier columns, you can increase the watering efficiency of your yard by using strategic methods of decreasing your lawn area. You can create islands that are filled in with decorative stone and decorated with interesting lawn ornaments.

Another tip for maximizing water efficiency is to install an irrigation system. A properly configured system will cover all the areas of your yard without wasting water. These systems can be configured to water on the days that are designated for your area without any interaction on your part. In addition, when properly installed, the system will turn off automatically when it rains so you do not waste any water.

When you are dealing with larger trees and shrubs, it is often difficult to get enough water on them to deeply penetrate down to the roots. This is where proper mulching will take effect. A heavy dose of mulch will go a long way in preserving the moisture around your trees and bushes so they will fare better between watering cycles. Although you may be tempted to run out to your favorite retailer and buy a truckload of cypress mulch, remember that there are natural choices that both look great and also help preserve our natural resources.

If your plants are of the acid loving variety, you can

use natural pine needles as a mulching material. You can also use plain hay to help preserve moisture around your plants. Hay is being used more and more by local communities in the landscaping effects of streets and parks. You can also create your own mulch by using the vacuum feature of your gas or electric powered blower. Simply rake the majority of the leaves in your yard to one location and use the vacuum of your blower to pick up and pulverize the leaves and grass. Use the contents of the vacuum bag

around your plants. This is both conservative and much less expensive than buying commercially produced mulches from a store.

As you can see, there are many ways to help beat the draught and still keep your plants looking as good as possible.

Widen your focus to find items on your desktop computer

I've noticed this phenomenon while instructing new computer users: A lost look will come over many new users when asked to click an object because they can't find it. Usually, I will hear "I don't have that," a short pause, and then the inevitable "Oh! Here it is!"

So, what's going on here? Why are many new computer users unable to find objects, links, menus and shortcuts that are present on any given system, even when the items in question are right there on the screen?

The answer is where people's eyes tend to go when a window opens.

Most of the time, the users' eyes are hovering

around a 4-inch circle in the center of the screen. If they don't see what they are looking for there, the response is usually "I don't have that."

Then (after realizing that maybe they should have whatever it is they can't find), they will broaden the search a bit, move their eyes around and locate what they were missing.

If you are having trouble finding things on your desktop, pay attention to where your eyes go when a window pops open. If you

see that you tend to focus your view to a small area in the center of the window, try shifting your view to the top left of the screen and work your way to the lower right through the center of the window. This will usually allow you to see what's what in any given window in the order of importance.

By the time you get to the lower right portion of the window, you will typically have enough information to complete whatever it is you are trying to do.

Have I lost you? Let's look at it another way.

When someone hands you a piece of paper or you open a page in a book, where do your eyes go?

Well, they certainly don't hover around the center of the page (or at least they shouldn't).

In Western civilization, we begin reading from the top left and work our way to the lower right. If we were to just focus on the center of the page, we would end up just reading a small chunk of what's written and miss the beginning and end. Without thinking, we know to start at the top left of the page and, working from left to right, line by line, move our way down the page.

We need to develop the same habit when we are using the computer because the same rules tend to apply.

Starting in the middle of the screen and then wandering around with our eyes will leave us feeling lost and out of control, and we will most certainly miss something.

Instead, try this: Every time a window opens, start

at the top left corner of the window and, moving from left to right and then slowly down the screen, you will find that most windows have been constructed in a logical order.

When we look at the top left corner of any given window, we will usually see an icon representing whatever program is running, followed by the title bar.

These are good things to know: the name (and icon) of the program running and its title.

The next line down that we may encounter is a line of pull-down menus. The pull-down menus are where we can find all the controls and commands that are available within that particular window grouped again, in logical sections. All of the filing-related

commands are grouped under file, all the editing commands are grouped under edit and so on, with the final pull-down menu usually being help.

They arranged it in this way so that if people don't find what they are looking for by going through each menu from left to right, they can look in the help menu as a last resort.

However, all programs are different; you won't see all of the items listed above in every window.

The point I'm trying illustrate is to start from the top left, and usually you can find whatever it is you are looking for.

It's time to invest in the most important club in your bag

Golfers love new things. We are always looking for the new driver or hybrid that can help us hit the ball farther and more accurately. While we attend demo days, beating balls until our arms ache looking to find that magical combination of shaft, loft, lie and more, we often overlook the most important club in the bag; the putter.

Many golfers will grab a putter off the rack, hit a few putts, and drop it in the bag. It's strange to think that we use our putter for far more strokes than any other club in the bag, yet it may be the one club in the bag that is the worst fit for our own stroke.

Most putters come too long. If your putter is too long you will be unable to get your eyes directly over the ball. The sole of the putter should rest flat on the ground, not with the toe or heel raised.

For some reason the same golfer who will not bat an eye at spending \$300 or \$400 on a driver, balks at investing that on a good putter.

A custom putter that is made to fit your stroke, please your eye, match your height, your grip size, and more, is worthy of an investment. You may spend a few hundred dollars, but what you wind up with is a magical stick that can save you strokes and win you a few skins.

There are a few artisans that make putters this way. Their putters are truly beautiful examples of a craftsmanship and passion that is becoming difficult to find in today's world.

Most of these craftsman customize the head with the colors and stampings of your choice. They offer numerous styles of heads in differing weights and finishes. They are so good, that they can fit you almost perfectly over the phone using measurements that you do yourself and provide to them.

In no particular order, here are a few. Some of these are long-time personal friends whose putters I have tried and fallen in love with. Perhaps you too will find one that you love.

Slighter Golf (360-668-8502 www.slightergolf.com) is based in Seattle. Tom Slighter's lineup features 16 different heads and 10 different finishes. My favorite look is the Kuro Kaminari, a deep, rich black finish. His Seattle Mud finish has a beautiful patina look that many wait years for their putter to become.

Byron Design (920-915-4320 www.byronputters.com) is located in Huntington Beach, Calif. Byron Morgan wants to help golfers obtain the putter of their dreams.

As a kid, he learned to use his father's machine shop to create mini-bikes and go-carts. From there he started his own custom surfboard business. Then he discovered golf and soon found his passion in designing and building putters to fit the dreams and desires of his

customers.

Byron putters can take anywhere from an hour or so to nearly a week, depending on the amount of customization and finish requested. The final product will turn heads and drop putts.

Edel Golf (512-355-3415 www.edelgolf.com) is headquartered in Liberty Hill, Texas. Edel's studies have shown that a high percentage of players don't consistently aim their putters at their target. With that in mind, the company will have you go to a certified fitter before starting your process.

Everyone sees differently and head shape dramatically changes your ocular focus. Edel gives you six heads as well as five hosel designs to choose from. There are 35 different combinations of lines and their placement to optimize your aim. Lastly, they weigh and balance the putter to control your stroke and increase consistency.

Machine Putters from Dogleg Right Golf (877-835-9652 www.dogletright.com) is headquartered in Plano, Texas. These putters were conceived and developed with the goal of providing the ultimate in quality,

Taking a line out of our natural environment

Last summer, while I was rolling along in that great flounder season, there came a time when I needed a piece of discarded fishing line.

That morning I had neglected to bring along my rusty old chain clip stringer that always accompanies me as I wade the Halifax River.

With a couple nice fish caught, I needed something to make it a bit easier to carry them. As I began to pick through the dead sea grass on the shore, I didn't think it would be any problem at all to find a suitable length of old line to use. Much to my surprise I searched for about a half mile without finding a scrap of line or twine of any kind. That caused me to stop and consider I had not seen any old mono in that area for years.

Mentally I congratulated the fishermen who ply the area north of Granada Bridge. Good work!

A couple weeks ago, I received a call from Lisa Mickey of the Marine Discovery Center in New Smyrna Beach.

Ms. Mickey did not have such a stellar report to offer on the state of waste fishing line in her area. She was calling to tell me of the many birds she is forced to rescue as she does her kayak eco tours out of the center. As a part of her trip she leads guests to a pair of island rookeries in the Indian River. There she discusses the nesting and mating seabirds. Too often she finds birds in distress from old fishing line.

Lisa told me that recently she had a family of tourists with her and when they arrived at the islands they found a snowy egret hanging upside down from a tree limb.

The poor bird was alive, but just barely, and when a young man in their group climbed up to cut it down they found the egret also had a fish hook in its broken wing.

Lisa always brings along a sheet to cover the traumatized birds she rescues, but this time the poor creature did not make it back to the Discovery Center. She told me that was not an unusual happening at all.

Folks this is just inexcusable.

We as fishermen must do a better job of getting rid of old line. Every one of us occasionally suffers a tangled mess in our reels

that just cannot be resolved without cutting away a portion of the line. Please do not toss that line into the water.

Also, never leave it lying about in your boat for as soon as you power up it will surely blow overboard. As we fish, we often snag the bottom. When that happens



These days most boat ramps have a big PVC pipe installed to accept old fishing line. That is about the only proper way to get rid of it. Don't bring it home and put it into your garbage. That will make its way to the landfill where the many birds there may become entangled. Tying it up in a plastic bag does not work either for the heavy machinery working at the landfill may open it.
