That elicited a groan from the crowd, but as soon as the lady stepped to the mike she was loudly cheered as she went through the Styx catalog with an unexpected power. By the time the set was finished, no one remembered she was not scheduled to perform. While Suzanne Reid is an established performer, we may have all witnessed the birth of a new rock star. Great Fun!

Folks, I urge you to check out the great rock and roll being performed at the Bandshell. I have said it before, but it is so true our rock legends are all a bit long in the tooth now and if you want to hear the songs performed live much like the originals, you are better off with a good tribute band.

Still on the schedule for this summer are the Rolling Stones, Elton John, AC/DC, Led Zep and Pink Floyd. I can guarantee you that all those acts will be of the first quality. ering the costs.

Once chosen and thoroughly trained for their position, the sheriff's office will provide the Guardians with firearms, ammunition, holsters and magazine pouches, while the district will provide body armor, polo shirts and web belts.

Under the Senate bill, the state provided a little over \$67.5 million to provide reimbursement cost for training, equipment ... a lot of the items such as background costs, etc.," said Joe Gallagher, VSCO division chief. "So what we have to do right now is submit an application in order to participate in the reimbursement process. What we're up against right now is all the 67 counties

are going to be trying to get into this pot of money."

For VCSO, the costs are nearly \$325,000 for the first year alone. Even if grant money comes through, there are no guarantees next year, said Council Vice Chair Deb Denys.

"This isn't a recurring revenue stream, this is one time. My concern is for us and for (VSCO) going forward next year, is that we don't know whether the legislature is going to re-fund this money," Vice Chair Denys said. "That money was made available for this coming school year, and yet the demand is there, it's still an unfunded mandate that we're going to have to fill and the school board is going to have to fill.

"And somebody thought it was a great idea, so here's your money for this year and good

luck next year," she said. "I think that needs to go on the record, too, that we're doing the right thing at the right time for the right reasons, and thank you for that, but next year, when we look at our budget, unless the legislature chooses to fund this ... here we are."

Council members, the VSCO and Volusia County School Board will all need to work together and stay on top of this at the state level, said Councilwoman Joyce Kusack.

"I think that it's important as we look at our lobbying team that this would be one of the things we put on our priority list, funding for this program," Councilwoman Kusack said.

In addition to the resource officers, or Guardians, the bill allocates about \$99 million for enhancing schools' physical

security; gives an additional \$28.1 million annually to the Department of Children and Families for more proactive community engagement and crisis prevention; mandates schools conduct regular active shooter drills; sets up and funds the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission, a 16-member board that will offer ways to improve the school safety system; creates and funds the "marshal" program, which would train and arm certain school professionals who do not primarily teach; allows certain retired law enforcement officers to become school resource officers; and formally prohibits "a person from making, posting or transmitting a threat to conduct a mass shooting" and sets criminal penalties for such actions.

the center), since he could receive two meals a day and not have to work for his living for a few weeks. Once he was feeling better and able to fly again, we took him back to his old stomping grounds at Boondocks. Everyone was so

excited to have Mitchell back and he was happy to be back at home. I am glad to hear that Mitchell is still doing well under the watchful eye of the restaurant workers and patrons.”
Staff estimates vary as to how many years Mitchell has been coming to Boondocks, but some say as many as 20 years. One staff member stat-

ed he would sometimes be gone for weeks at a time, but would always return.
Ms. Glandorf said staff try to dissuade customers from feeding Mitchell as he can be aggressive seeking food as he feels comfortable around people. But clearly Mitchell loves the food at Boondocks. And staff and customers alike love Mitchell.

Florida Hospital has selected Erik Nason to serve as the athletic trainer to coordinate care for the 5,000 student athletes at Volusia County Schools.

Mr. Nason's new role is part of Florida Hospital's five-year, \$2 million partnership with Volusia County Schools. As part of the agreement, the hospital chain committed to provide a dedicated certified athletic trainer to act as a liaison with the schools to streamline and coordinate care for student athletes, and work with the district to improve concussion protocols.

Also, Mr. Nason will work with athletes off the field to help with conditioning and nutrition, which can prevent injuries.

He has nearly 20 years of athletic training and sport

medicine experience and is the current president of The Athletic Trainers Association of Florida.

Mr. Nason spent 17 years as an athletic trainer at Kennedy Space Center, providing onsite musculoskeletal rehabilitation for employees. He also provided astronaut care during launches and landings as part of the Space Center's health stabilization program. During his career, he treated more than 3,000 employees with more than 50,000 patient appointments.



ECHO process is long, but county helps

In the season of ECHO grant submissions, \$2.5 million is up for grabs, of course, there are requirements.

Anyone applying for a grant has to attend a mandatory workshop. The last one will be at 2 p.m. Friday, Aug. 24, at Lifeguard Headquarters, 515 S. Atlantic Ave., Daytona Beach.

Volusia County voters established the ECHO program through a resolution in November 2000.

Before the first mandatory workshop in DeLand started July 17, Jill M. Marcum, ECHO administrative coordinator, said there are 200 closed projects and 15 to 20 open ones. "It's such a great program," she said.

Ms. Marcum and Carmen Hall, community services operations manager, led the first mandatory workshop at the Volusia County Historic

Courthouse.

Nearly 30 people from county government, municipalities and nonprofits in Volusia County attended. Non-profits must have tax exempt status from the Internal Revenue Service more than two years before the deadline to qualify.

"I want to make sure I give you everything you need to complete the application," Ms. Hall said. "The application goes to the ECHO advisory committee. They make a recommendation and give it a score. The application has to score at least 80 and then on to be approved by the County Council."

For an ECHO grant, a project must be for public use and must be environmental, cultural, historical or outdoor recreation.

"If you don't meet that criteria, talk to Jill or I," she said. "The minimum amount that can be applied for is \$12,500 up to \$400,000."

Ms. Hall said the first thing anyone should do is complete the "Clean Hands" form, which makes sure an applicant doesn't owe anything for property taxes, code enforcement or anything else to the county.

"If you do, you're not going to be eligible for the grants," she said. "We recommend that you submit it. You'd be surprised."

Ms. Hall said she and Ms. Marcum review the applications. She said that applicants should be sure to put relevant information in the application. For example, there's a large recreation complex and the project could be pickle ball courts and then relate it back to one of four criteria (above). "Talk about the recreation complex, more on the pickle ball courts," she said. "We're just reviewing to make sure (the application) is in compliance and complete."

Ms. Hall said the ECHO Advisory Committee is made of people from various walks

of life.

"They tend to look at projects differently," she said. "Don't assume that they understand your project. Make sure you are writing it like the person has no idea what the project is."

Ms. Hall said other parts of the application include drawings, a detailed budget, matching funds, operating forecast details and supporting documents.

The ECHO Advisory Committee will meet from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 23. The Technical Completeness Application deadline is by 5 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 8, and the Final Application Deadline is by 5 p.m. on Thursday, Dec 13.

"Don't wait until the last minute (to upload the application)," Ms. Marcum said. "If you have any kind of problems, call me. We ask people to call us for help. We rarely hear from anyone."

Signs need regulation

And, who will pick them up afterwards?

Beach not up to code

There continues to be property code violation issues that plague unincorporated Bethune Beach.

One continuing issue is property zoned for single-family residential homes being rented as short-term vacation rentals, which is in violation of Volusia County Code (less than one month). Many local real estate firms post signs offering rentals to unsuspecting vacationers, who are not aware of the code violation. Other properties are listed for rent on the various internet sites.

Beyond the short term rentals, there are instances where property owners have converted single-family residential homes into two and even three apartments. These properties are available for both long- and short-term rental, again in violation of the single-family residential property code. Real estate professionals who offer these converted properties have to be well aware such rentals are in violation of code. Far too many short-term renters have little or no regard for our community and beaches.

Property owners who convert single family residences to multi-family residences knowingly do so without proper permitting and inspections. When home construction is not properly inspected for code, it places the occupants and neighboring properties in jeopardy for fires or even hurricane wind driven debris. Adding further distress for neighbors, several of these converted homes are run down and lack enough off-street parking.

Help the homeless you can help

families and fishermen.

However, not everyone agrees with the park regulations and some churches like to paint homelessness with broad strokes and group all park prowlers into one helpless homeless bucket.

I have been homeless and wandering the streets searching for my next drug or drink, which left me unable to hold a job.

By the grace of God and adherence to local laws and a mature approach to my recovery, put me in the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous and back into the workforce.

I have compassion for the homeless, but I also know that in my own backyard almost all the park prowlers and homeless that were cited or arrested were in the park after hours and in possession of cocaine, heroin or conducting prostitution. I say to the community, let's don't paint homelessness with broad strokes, because that can get us into trouble.

Handing out food helps, but also handing out pamphlets on recovery, job wanted ads and having those on site the day you hand out food. Those members of your church who could potentially offer a job to a homeless person will go further than a can of green beans.

Need some noise enforcers

Along with a semi-dedicated beach patrol whose semi-primary job would be to enforce littering laws, perhaps they could also enforce the noise laws. It really is disturbing and dangerous to have vehicles rolling down the beach (or road or parking lot) with the bass in full effect.

I would guess 99 percent of beachgoers are at the beach for peace and quiet. It is rude and presumptuous to think your fellow beachgoers want to hear a monotonous Latin beat or thump of rap. If you can hear it from eight feet away, it is too loud.

Enforce the noise ordinance and issue tickets. This is also a good way to raise public funds to help pay for enforcement without raising taxes.

Looks like the current commissioners were getting rid of a possible contender for one of their seats in the next election. A little "new blood" on the DeLand commission couldn't hurt. Maybe we'd see them spending our money on something other than sports and recreation facilities.

In response to 'There ought to be a law'

Regarding "There ought to be a law" about pounding bass speakers, yes, there was a law; but no more.

After I retired from the New York Police Department, I took a job in 1992 as a law enforcement officer here in Volusia County. At that time, the Florida Motor Vehicle and Traffic Law prohibited loud music emanating from a motor vehicle, if the music or noise could be heard within a distance of about 20 feet from the vehicle. We enforced that law when necessary, writing a uniform traffic citation.

Unfortunately, as a result of a lawsuit claiming the law was unconstitutional in that operators of motor vehicles had a constitutional right to play music as loud as they wanted to, the court hearing the case agreed. That is why loud music from a vehicle is not enforced. (Local noise ordinances may apply if at night.)

Although I am still a law enforcement officer in my 48th year, all I can do now when some individual, who will likely go deaf in 20 years, pulls next to my patrol car with music blaring, is to look at the operator with a serious face. That usually results in the music being turned down.

Can't get with dress code

I've tried for two years to be OK with the "new" Volusia school dress code policy, but I keep running into problems.

I'm livid. My daughter just came home from her first day and in her paperwork is the first time I've been notified that Chisholm Elementary School will no longer be wearing green polos. Five out of eight of her shirts aren't allowed under those terms even though they are perfectly good shirts, just "wrong" color. I feel like this is a big scam to get us to buy more clothes.

I don't have time to find them at thrift stores now. I can't afford a set of new shirts and I don't agree with contributing to the cycle of low wages that clothing manufacturers pay their seamstresses. We need to get rid of the polo shirt dress code. Its too hot in Florida for collared shirts.

I have heard people say that kids need to get used to "having a job" where they may need to wear a "uniform" and I call crap on that . . . we need more jobs, not just more sheep-like workers. To get jobs we need more entrepreneurs. People that make their own jobs and jobs for others. These people do what they want and wear what they want, because they can think for themselves.

Somebody got to be getting by better

The latest report from the state labor department shows unemployment in Volusia County in July at 4 percent, which actually seems high.

The rate was the same as June, but below the July 2017 rate of 4.5 percent.

I know, grumbling about 4 percent unemployment when just five years ago it was double that at 8.2 percent seems kind of lame. But accurate statistics are crucial when you're making decisions that affect people's livelihood.

The report shows there were 10,400 workers unemployed out of a labor force of 258,150, which means 247,750 Volusia residents were employed in some way in July. In June, with the usual seasonal downturn with school letting out, there were 246,683 workers employed out of a labor force of 256,958. In July last year, 241,780 workers were employed out of a labor force of 253,134.

The good news for workers is obvious. Job growth is outpacing the increase in the labor force, which should mean wages are growing, too. Of course, the news isn't so good for employers trying to find workers, as I've mentioned before. But if this keeps up, the bad old days of the Great Recession will be further in the past, and more

people may be enticed to move to the area to find work.

As we head for the Aug. 28 primary, a good question to ask folks campaigning for governor or a legislative position, is whether they support raising the minimum wage in Florida to a much higher rate than the current \$8.25 an hour rate that few employers get to pay, anyway. Over the years, I've grown less attuned to raising the federal minimum wage, because economies vary too much from state to state. While a \$10 an hour rate would be great in some states, in others a \$15 an hour rate may still be too low. So, it's important for each state to examine its economy and decide what would be a fair hourly rate.

Venetian Nail Spa is the latest business to open at One-Daytona and like most of the businesses there, it expects a lot of customers. The salon has 35 pedicure and 15 manicure stations, along with

waxing, skincare and massage services.

Big commercial real estate deals picked up a little bit last week. A Lynn Haven investor bought the Chili's property at 190 Williamson Blvd. in Ormond Beach for about \$1.89 million. Bobby Parker, area franchisee for Freedom Boat Club, bought property the club is using at 177 North Causeway in New Smyrna Beach for \$1.7 million. Ashton Woods Homes of Lake Mary joined the party at Coastal Woods in New Smyrna Beach, buying a bunch of lots for \$1.35 million. The City of DeLand is paying the DeLand Elks Lodge \$875,000 for its property at 150 S. Clara Ave.

A couple of new commercial projects hit the drawing board, both in Port Orange. Apparently Takara Japanese Restaurant isn't big enough. It wants to build a 9,500-square-foot restaurant on another lot at the Pavilion at Port Orange, which appears to be next to the Five Guys burger joint. Plans for an AutoZone have been filed with the St. Johns River Water Management District for the last available commercial lot at Westport in

Port Orange, on the west side of the gas station on Taylor Road, just west of Summer Trees Drive.

Also, a developer has submitted plans to the water management district for a 185-lot subdivision, just east of Sugar Mill County Club in New Smyrna Beach, along Williams Road.

Looks like Walmart likes its new pickup sites for internet orders. It already has one in operation in Deltona and one under construction on Beville Road in Daytona Beach. Now one in DeLand is under construction.

Only one building startup to report with vertical construction set to begin on the 12-story, 84-unit Aruba condo on South Atlantic Avenue in Daytona Beach Shores. Peck Construction just filed a notice of commencement.

Withdrawing and repositioning 401(k) money

Did you know you can take money from your 401(k) before retirement?

The technical term for this withdrawal is an "in-service distribution." When an employee turns 59½, most employer-sponsored retirement plans, like 401(k)s, allow a person to make withdrawals from his or her account while still being employed with, or "in the service" of, the company.

Typically, this is done to roll all, or a part, of the 401(k) balance into an IRA before retirement. A financial move that doesn't trigger income taxes when done properly. So, why would someone want to do a rollover? There are many reasons. For instance, they might want to gain access to:

1. A broader range of investment choices. Sometimes, the offerings of an employer's 401(k) plan can be quite limited. An investment firm managing an IRA, on the other hand, may have access to a very large pool of invest-

ments from which to choose.

2. Professional investment advice. No one says that you can't have an investment adviser guide you on your 401(k) holdings. However, hiring an adviser might not be a benefit to you if there are only a handful of choices. If you are paying for an adviser's time, you may want to get the most bang for your buck.

3. More conservative and fixed investment options. You may be uncomfortable having all of your 401(k) money in stocks and bonds. By rolling the money into an IRA, you could exchange the uncertainty of the market for bank and insurance company products which may be more appropriate for your situation. This is especially important as you get closer to retirement (e.g. within five years).

4. More determinable income alternatives. As we approach retirement, our focus needs to shift from pure accumulation and growth to reliability of income. Rolling part of a 401(k) into a fixed annuity, for example, before you retire could mean you have another source of income waiting for you when you stop working.

5. Ease and speed of distributions. It may take a lot longer to receive a requested distribution from the company that holds your 401(k) funds. There might be lots of "hoops" to jump through to get money quickly. On the other hand, an investment advisory firm, with a nimble and capable customer service department, can usually process a distribution check within two or three days.

Wait! Don't call your plan provider to request your "in-service" distribution just yet! First, before you make any changes to your 401(k), get professional help. Errors in the process of an in-service

distribution or IRA rollover can have very serious tax consequences. Make sure the transfer is carried out properly. And, secondly, don't "gamble" with your retirement funds. Pulling these funds out of your 401(k) and transferring them to overly complicated, speculative or illiquid investments can result in a personal financial disaster!

Don't be in a rush. Get a second opinion on your plans if you are not confident. Be careful, and smart, with your hard-earned retirement dollars!

Hope Place construction finished

"It's done," said Forough Hosseini, one of the top supporters of Hope Place. The former Hurst Elementary School has now been completely transformed by Halifax Urban Ministries and its supporters into a place where homeless families with children and unaccompanied

youth can get temporary shelter and find "hope." Ms. Hosseini was speaking at an event to announce the completion Tuesday, Aug. 14, at the facility at 1340 Wright St. in Daytona Beach. Hope Place has 26 units for an emergency shelter for families with children or unaccompanied youth, and nine units for transitional housing. There is a childcare center on site as

well Hope Place Café. Catholic Charities offers services there, such as parenting classes and in-service training for staff. HUM Executive Director Buck James thanked attendees, including business owners who supplied thousands of dollars of in-kind donations. He also thanked county council members, the school board, the HUM board, the HUM building committee and any-

one that helped move the project along or contribute in any way. "It is an amazing, amazing project," Mr. James said. "It is working just the way it was designed to work. We are making a difference and they (residents) are making a difference."

Hope Place can now be used as a catalyst for doing more to help families in need, he said. "So many people are working together and see the need and want to make a difference. Let's provide an avenue for them to do that and continue to know hope in our community."

Since Hope Place started in May, 15 families have moved into permanent housing with several more nearing that goal. At Hope Place families learn to budget, save money and pay a small amount of rent. A family member in every apartment has a job.

More than \$420,000 in funds and in-kind contributions were donated to Hope Place.

An endowment fund has been established that should put Hope Place in a good position for the future, Ms. Hosseini said. She personally added a check for \$50,000 from ICI Homes.

"The basic essence of human integrity requires us to take care of those down on their luck, empowering them to take the lead in their own lives," said Ms. Hosseini, an ICI senior vice president. "And Hope Place does exactly that."

Chantrell Lassiter, a single-mother with seven children is now a former resident of Hope Place. She is working and is now in her own home. "Everything is going great and I appreciate everything Hope Place has done for me and my family" she said.

Brandy Espinosa, who has four children, has been a resident of Hope Place for six months and is in transitional housing, getting ready to move

into permanent housing.

The staff are "my saving grace," Ms. Espinosa said. "It has been wonderful and very helpful. We will be in permanent housing within the next couple of weeks."

Brian MacMurray, who had been living with his daughter in a car prior to coming to Hope Place, thanked everyone involved with Hope Place. "You have to give grace to God. I never doubted He had a plan for me. I am a full-time student at Daytona State and a full-time father. Everybody, thank you," Mr. MacMurray said.

Lakeisha Pierce is a resident assistant at Hope Place who has overcome her own trials,

losing a son two years ago. Two days after she buried him, she was back in school. She often uses her own experience to motivate parents she works with, although she largely focuses on the children at the shelter. "When you see a person down you don't kick them while they are down, you uplift them and motivate them," Ms. Pierce said.

The Volusia County School District sold the property for Hope Place to the Volusia County Council, which gave it to Halifax Urban Ministries along with \$3.8 million to convert it to a temporary shelter for homeless families with children and unaccompanied youth in school.

Fishing like I was there yesterday!

The morning west of High Bridge dawned pale blue with faint pink high-lights.

Off to the east a bank of clouds stretched up in jagged peaks. Have you ever driven west across the Great Plains and believed you were looking at clouds, only to discover it was actually the Rocky Mountains? That's the kind of clouds that hung over the Atlantic. Anyplace else and you could have imagined distant mountains.

It was hot – God it was hot! Not a breath of wind moving and the water temperature had to be around 85 degrees. By the time I had paddled The Green Peanut to my fishing grounds, my T-shirt was sticking to my skin.

Once out on the flats I would forget the heat immediately. Fish were feeding! Oh, boy, were they feeding. The incoming tide was carrying loads of shrimp, and the spotted sea trout and snook were eating their fill.

Each time they crashed into the bait a shower of shrimp would take to the air not unlike a miniature fireworks display. Big shrimp, little shrimp, all kinds of shrimp.

I had a MirrOlure tied to my only pole and that bait imitates a mullet, not a shrimp. Still it is top water and the fish were hitting the shrimp on the surface. On my first cast, the splash of the lure and the splash of the striking fish coincided. I know there must have been a split-second between the plug splashing down and the fish hitting it, but my eyes and ears could not separate the two. A good fight yielded a 17-inch trout.

I was on a flat where the water was less than two feet and every place I looked I could see the wake of large predatory fish swimming about. Fish hitting and terrified shrimp scattering all over the place. Pop! Pop! Pop!

Off to my right, something big was nailing the bait. The big fish had made the water sudsy in an area about the size of a loveseat. My lure landed

right in the center of the suds and quickly disappeared. I didn't have to wonder long what I had, for right away a 30-inch snook jumped clear of the water. I held on as tightly as I could as the big fish began to tow the kayak with the tide. Finally the hooks pulled free and I was relinquished from having to release the stout snook.

Next, I lost two trout in a row. It always amazes me how a fish can get free from three treble hooks that snag my clothing anytime it gets in the general vicinity. A small snook came to the net after an acrobatic battle. Good fun! After I set it free, I landed a nice 16-inch trout and then another. What action!

Then, just as suddenly as it had begun, it was over. The

bait was gone and the fish stopped feeding. I could no longer see them swimming about. Sure, I switched to the jig and fished for another two hours, but never had another hit. All that fishing had happened in a matter of 30 to 40 minutes. It had been the kind of fishing moment you hear about. "Why, you should have been here yesterday" is the usual sad refrain. This was the kind of action an angler dreams about.

I only left with three trout to take home, but I will never forget that wild and fast fishing. On the ride home, I knew I would have to return and try it once more the very next day. I did and found no action at all. Oh well! I was there yesterday.

homemade dressing, the meal consisted of a hand-breaded chicken breast served with

spaghetti bathed in a homemade marinara sauce that had a little kick to it. Not something for which most sports bars are known.

On the regular menu, one specialty is the sirloin steak sandwich, perfectly cooked to order. The thinly sliced sirloin is grilled and topped with sauteed onion served on a toasted bun. All sandwiches are accompanied by fries or another side dish (bench warmer), such as mac and cheese or a side salad.

Other popular menu items

include boom boom shrimp, which is crispy shrimp tossed in a creamy, sweet Thai chili sauce. Pork belly sliders on toasted Hawaiian slider are also featured as well as toasted ravioli, a variety of burgers, and other unique offerings. All sauces and dressings are made by Mr. Voepel, with secret ingredients he guards closely.

The Doug Out features a full bar and includes an outdoor tiki bar, a stadium bar and a clubhouse bar that accommodates up to 100 people. Sports jerseys, schedules and other

sports paraphernalia line the walls, along with 17 television sets that may include an occasional cooking show besides a variety of sports.

Drink and food specials abound, and with the upcoming football season \$10-dollar buckets of beer will be sold.

"Everything here is from scratch. We don't buy any frozen anything. We don't buy canned products. Everything is fresh," Mr. Voepel said. "We hand bread and cut our own onion rings. We buy the biggest onion available, called a super colossal onion. It is much better to just do it by hand.

"We just got certified for Black Angus beef. That is the only thing I buy for our burgers," he said. "I don't let anyone near the ingredients. I am the only one that does that. I am an extremely hands-on owner.

"I try my very best to talk to every single table," he said. "I really do try to talk to everybody that walks through the door."

The Doug Out is open every day, with a new Sunday all-you-can-eat brunch from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. for \$15. It includes prime rib, shrimp, eggs, bacon, sausage, grits, biscuits and gravy, made to order waffles and fresh fruit.

The Doug Out features karaoke on Thursday nights with plans to expand entertainment options in the fall, including outdoors. There is a corn hole tournament the first Saturday of the month.

Savoring the food of America, however you find it

The National Restaurant Association defines ethnic cuisine as "any cuisine that originated outside the United States or is identified with a particular region within the U.S."

To me, that means all cuisine in the US is ethnic. There is nothing original about our food, unless we look at Native Americans and their food. Our country is a melting pot of cultures from around the world and each culture has

its own food traditions and flavors.

We live in a great country. We can experience foods from around the world and never leave its borders. That's not true in most foreign countries.

We are unique when it comes to the world of foods. Name any culture's cuisine and somewhere in America we serve it.

Now, what about original American cuisine? Yes, we have it. Most of our foods were influenced by European, South American and early English traditions. Local fruits, vegetables, seafood and wild game played a big part. Over the years, great cooks and chefs developed and fused

cuisines together to make them our own. How about Eggs Benedict, Lobster Newburg, hot dogs, hamburgers and deep-dish pizza?

U.S. beef is prized throughout the world. Where would we be without Yankee pot-roast, and what about BBQ? Wait, there is more, lots more. Parker House rolls, cranberry sauce, peanut butter, cream cheese, mayonnaise, doughnuts, Oreos, cookies and the all-time American favorite, apple pie.

Americans have taken the foods of the world and made them their own. We are truly blessed. Here are a few original American recipes.

1 cup panko breading
Option (½ cup mashed potatoes)

Directions
Sauté onions and red peppers in butter until translucent, add to crabmeat in mixing bowl. Add beaten egg and remaining ingredients. Mix lightly. Form the crab cake mixture into the desired size. Bread with panko breadings and place in the refrigerator for an hour prior to frying. Fry in skillet with vegetable oil on medium to high heat (about 1/2-inch of oil in bottom of skillet). Fry on one side until golden brown and turn over on other side to get the same golden brown color.

Pinch of cilantro
Pinch of thyme
Dash of nutmeg
Salt and pepper to taste

Directions
Season tomatoes with salt and pepper; place slices in buttermilk for 1 hour. Mix cornmeal, flour, salt and pepper, Cajun spice seasoning, and spices. Dredge tomato slices in mixture. Heat oil in heavy gauged pan at 275-300° F. Place tomatoes in hot oil for 3-4 minutes on each side, or until golden brown and tender to touch. Place on lined pan to drain. Keep warm.

Blue Cheese Dressing

Ingredients
1/2 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup sour cream
ounces very good blue cheese (or Gorgonzola), crumbled
1 cup good mayonnaise
1 teaspoon hot sauce
Salt and pepper to taste

Directions
Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix well.






