Ponce Inlet settles all lawsuits with Pacetta

After 12 years of multiple lawsuits and roughly \$5.4 million in attorney fees and court costs, the Ponce Inlet Town Council voted unanimously to end the feud with Lyder and Simone Johnson over the rights to develop their riverfront property.

Although the Johnsons, who filed their lawsuit under the name Pacetta LLC, never filed an actual application seeking to develop their property, the lawsuits stemmed from their claims there were understandings between the town and the land owners as to what would ultimately be built on the

property.

Town Attorney Cliff Shepard said the Johnsons' attorney contacted him about a month ago and said his clients were willing to resolve all litigation with the town. Mr. Shepard emphasized the settlement agreement before them for consideration had already been signed by the Johnsons and all other parties involved. He said if the town council approved it, the agreement would resolve all 16 different court proceedings between the town and opposing parties, including the appeal of the state case and the federal case that were still in process in the courts.

"By signing the document, all parties acknowl-

edge that this settlement doesn't speak to the merits of the various lawsuits, but rather avoids the risk, expense and uncertainty associated with further litigation and seeks to compromise and resolve their disputes," Mr. See PACETTA, page A11

Animal abuse registry approved

Animal abusers beware. Your crimes will be much more public now thanks to the approval of a Volusia County online database set to go into effect June 1. The online registry will include the name of the convicted offender, their picture, date of birth and a description of what occurred.

Just as she was a driving force behind Ponce's Law, Debbie Darino of Port Orange rallied support for the registry. Ponce's Law, named after a puppy that was reportedly beaten to death in Ponce Inlet, allows judges to ban people convicted of animal cruelty from owning pets. It also increases the severity ranking for animal abuse cases.

The animal abuse registry

would include people who have been convicted of felony animal cruelty and misdemeanor animal cruelty, and would include the court documents. The database would be housed on the county animal control website. Marion, Osceola, Hillsborough and Leon counties already have animal abuse registries.

"As you know Ponce's Law was my bill," Ms. Darino said. "In it I put that judges have the discretion to ban abusers from owning or contact with animals. I thought since there's no real way to keep track of these abusers that are banned, the only solution would be an animal abuse registry."

She met with County Councilwoman Billie Wheeler and Ponce Inlet Councilwoman Lois Paritsky to present a proposal for the County See ABUSE, page A2

But seriously folks, it's sort of yoga

Laughter yoga is based on the idea that anyone can laugh without relying on humor, jokes and comedy.

Alice Palmateer, 77, has been helping people her whole life, but has been leading laughter yoga sessions since July.

"I just love this. It's playing games and having people laugh and it's good for your health," said Ms. Palmateer, a Daytona Beach resident and certified laughter yoga leader. "It's not real strenuous and people can do it in wheelchairs. You can even do it by yourself if you've got the discipline to do it by yourself."

The discipline, or lack

thereof, is based on the fact the human body cannot tell the difference between fake and real laughter. Although not yoga in the traditional sense, breathing and stretching exercises are done along with instructions for different laughter scenarios as well as clapping, childlike playfulness and affirmations.

Ms. Palmateer, a New Smyrna Beach High School graduate, was a late bloomer, earning a bachelor's degree in liberal studies from the

University of Central Florida when she was 64.

She leads laughter yoga sessions for corporations, yoga and fitness centers, schools, and senior centers, and presents public seminars. She is teaching a monthly class at Port Orange Presbyterian Church and visits local nursing facilities.

Seriously, Ms. Palmateer retired from the federal government in 1997 and went to Thailand in 2004 to teach English in a Buddhist mon-

astery. She has also taught in China.

Less seriously, she became interested in laughter yoga when someone taught it at her church. She admits the only real yoga component is the breathing. She met Dr. Madan Kataria, who is the founder and originator of the worldwide laughter yoga movement that began in India in 1995. She was trained in Atlanta, Ga.

It's another ordinary day for Ponce Inlet resident Lois Butterfield.

She may have risen in the early hours to go rowing, or she might be working on balance and strength training with a coach in a master class at CrossFit in Port Orange. Occasionally she might run a half marathon, or maybe she is at home today knitting another beautiful afghan. But Lois Butterfield is no ordinary woman.

therapy. We do meditate at the end," Ms. Palmateer said. "Fifteen minutes of laughter is equivalent to mild aerobics. It's for stress release, pain. You can't have pain and laugh at the same time. We put a positive slant on problems and make fun of problems. Laughter becomes contagious once you start laughing."

Seriously, she emphasized health benefits include lower blood pressure, less stress and enhanced mental ability. Laughter yoga strengthens the immune system and elevates pain thresholds. She said it also elevates your mood, energy and self-esteem. And it's fun.

"Things that irritate you, we laugh at," Ms. Palmateer

said.

There is laughter yoga in more than 106 countries and more than 5,000 laughter yoga clubs that meet at least monthly. April is Laughter Yoga Month.

The class starts with warm up exercises like clapping and chanting followed by different laughter exercises where people are encouraged to laugh louder and heartily from the belly. These exercises are interspersed with deep breathing. Childlike playfulness and eye contact are encouraged.

Nothing is off limits to laugh about, whether it is pretending you won the lottery or pretending you have bills you can't pay. Participants can also move about the room pretending to be different animals or musical instruments, all while laugh-

ing.

Barbara Kincade of Holly Hill, a former certified laughter leader (no yoga involved), practices traditional yoga and took Ms. Palmateer's class, thoroughly enjoying it. "We taught that it is internal jogging. It's a place where you can just be silly and just laugh," Ms. Kincade said.

Dorothy Minor of Daytona Beach has taken the class before. She came back, because "laughter is really good medicine, it's good to laugh."

Barbara Deshong of Port Orange took the class for the first time. "It was really energizing, it was definitely positive. I have never done anything like it. I enjoyed it," Ms. Deshong said.

Council.

"I felt it was the best way to monitor abusers and that it would easy for the public as well as LEO, AC officers, shelters, rescues, veterinarians and your average citizen, who may just want to rehome a pet for whatever reason," Ms. Darino said.

"I am ecstatic about it and from here we will be present-

ing this idea to the Florida Association of Counties in hopes to get all counties in Florida to implement a registry," she said. "The reason I wanted to do it this way is to set the groundwork for trying to get a statewide registry for Florida in the 2020 session. I felt this would be so easy to do if the counties were already onboard. I am always thinking about what I can do to help stop animal cruelty."

Ms. Darino recently received a national award from

the Animal Legal Defense Fund for being one of "America's Top Ten Animal Defenders 2019."

The Volusia County council unanimously passed the registry March 19.

"It's hopefully something we can get all the other cities involved in and all the counties that are not listed (as having the registry)," County Chair Ed Kelley said. "I think we are at a great place with the help of everyone."

The Museum of Tragedy History

Back in the late 1960's when I first arrived, Florida was still littered with the remnants of hundreds of tourists traps that were built to fleece the thousands of southbound pilgrims.

They ranged from the simple, such as a gas station with a lone alligator in a pit, to the sublime, such as Ripley's Believe It or Not.

When Lana and I bought our first house on old Ridgewood Avenue in Ormond Beach, I soon discovered a pair of monkeys were living in the large oak trees on the property. Neighbors told me that when a nearby citrus and souvenir shop on U. S. 1 closed, the owners opened their cages before they left and released the monkeys. Hmmm, I thought. Do I own those two furry fellows?

In those days, our area still had all sorts of places designed to get the northerners to stop. Sea aquariums, free orange juice, stuffed alligators and even a museum of speed adorned the highway.

Some years back I became the proud owner of an original sign from the Museum of Tragedy History of St. Augustine. I had never been to that fine establishment, but I couldn't see the interesting sign be destroyed. (A pick?) Recently I rediscovered it in my garage and decided to look up some of the history.

As it turns out Buddy Hough and his wife, Debra, opened the place around 1985. Well, at least they tried to. The city of St. Augustine did everything they could to stop them from running their

kitschey museum. It would eventually go all the way to the Florida Supreme Court where the Houghs won.

Once open, St. Augustine would not recognize the place on any travel brochures and the tourist tram would never go by. I had to wonder how a place like St. Augustine could not include the Tragedy Museum in their attempts to lure tourists to their city? After all, they already had the aforementioned Ripley freak show, a ghost tour, The Potter Wax Museum, an alligator farm, and assorted other schlocky stops. Not to mention the "authentic" fountain of youth.



OK, I realize Buddy was a bit of a con man (show-man?). The Jayne Mansfield death car he displayed was a Buick Electra when the actual car in the wreck was a Cadillac and the rifle that shot President Kennedy was

only a replica.

Still, I am sure he had film of the assassination of JFK and some of the artifacts left behind in Lee Harvey Oswald's home. OK, the Kennedy car was only one that the president had once ridden in and not the death car.

The whistle from the wreck of the old 97 train was probably authentic. The Bonnie and Clyde death car was actually a prop from the movie starring Warren Beatty and Faye Dunaway. Come on, after all, this was a tourist trap. No need to get too picky.

The film of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. during the St. Augustine civil rights crusade was probably the real thing. If the ambulance that was used to haul Oswald to the hospital after Ruby shot him was not the actual one, it was at least one of the same era. Sadly Mr. Hough died in 1996 and Debra closed the museum in 1998.

Anyway, I know one thing for sure, I do own one of the original signs from the Museum of Tragedy History and I am proud of it. To me it is a valuable piece of Florida history. Heck, we can't forget where we came from.

blind since the age of two when she suffered a rare eye cancer that robbed her of sight. She greets this writer with an easy smile at the bottom floor of Harbor Village, accompanied by Kelly, her black Labrador Retriever service dog, and leads the way up to her condo. Once in her condo, her husband of 21 years, John Butterfield, and their two cats, Cinderella and Sunshine, join us at the table while we talk.

Ms. Butterfield started running in 2016 and has since run several half marathons and one marathon. She runs with a partner, who holds one end of a short tether while Ms. Butterfield holds the other end. The running partner helps guide her, letting her know if there is a curve in the road or an obstacle, for example.

"I trust the people I'm running with," Ms. Butterfield said. "You have to trust people or it would be a scary life."

The first 5K she ran was with a breast cancer survivor, running as part of a team in a fundraiser for cancer. The team took turns running and walking with her.

"You always talk when you run," she said, "So, I got to know a lot of people."

She also rows with the Halifax Rowing Association in competitions locally as well as around the state and out of state. She rows with eight people, or in a quad (four rowers), in a double or sometimes in a rowing shell by herself, with someone in a nearby boat guiding her. The association competes in eight to 10 regattas a year.

"The tricky part (of rowing in a shell with others) is keeping time with the other rowers," she said.

A year ago, Ms. Butterfield started a CrossFit training program in Port Orange.

"They advertised a get fit, lose weight for seniors, and I thought it sounded like fun," she said.

She listened to the coach telling participants what to do, she added, and having previous experience weight lifting, she knew the terminology. She said CrossFit training in a master's program has helped her get stronger, and also helped her with balance.

The other participants in the class realize she can do almost everything they do, she said, "And they tell me I'm an inspiration."

"People are afraid of me," Ms. Butterfield said. "It's easier (for them) to ignore someone with a disability."

She was shy and quiet, but now is more outgoing. "I just

grew up," she said with a smile. "My self confidence is better as I have done more things."

Mr. Butterfield is her biggest fan. "She was an A student in school," he beamed. "She can do so many things. She's smart, but not full of herself. She knows how to depend on her other senses."

The couple has taken ice dancing and ballroom dancing lessons together. Mr. Butterfield is quick to admit she is better on the computer than he is. But she admits she cannot decorate, and doesn't know anything about today's fashions.

Mr. Butterfield proudly brought out some of her knitting. In addition to afghans, she knits sweaters and slippers. The intricate designs in the afghans makes this writer wonder how on earth she does this.

"Sometimes, to this day, I forget she's blind," Mr. Butterfield said, looking fondly at his wife. "I'd leave a room and leave a light on for her."

He also said sometimes he has to ask her how to use her smartphone.

"In a restaurant, someone may come up and say 'you're so nice to take care of her,'" he adds. "I tell them, no, she takes care of me. I don't think I could make it without her."

The city police department considered this a civil not criminal matter. The dollar value of the damage would not justify a small claim, which meant expensive attorney fees and court costs.

An attempt to meet with my state representative to change the law was met with the response "she is too busy in committee meetings."

Don't be fooled as a consumer or homeowner you are protected by Florida law or local ordinance from less than honest pool contractors. Buyer beware.

Tipping point hit on affordable housing

Well, it's become apparent we've reached that tipping point where too much of the Volusia County housing market has exceeded the affordability level.

Sales of existing houses by Realtors in Volusia/Flagler area continued to decline in February at 787, down 5.7 percent from February 2018. The median price, where half sold for more and half for less, was at \$217,750 in February, up 6.2 percent from last year.

The decline in sales can only mean that Realtors aren't able to reach all of the market, especially the low end. However, the existing supply is a continuing problem.

You can't blame builders for not contributing to the supply as they continue to surpass last year's output of houses. With 70 percent of area reporting, the U.S. Census Bureau report shows 146 permits issued for new houses in February in Volusia/Flagler, up from 127 last February. Permits issued for multi-family units were dead even at 16.

However, if you watch the deed recordings, the builders aren't putting up a lot of lower priced houses. You'd expect a townhouse development like the new Cornerstone Grove at Yorktowne Boulevard and Hidden Lake Drive in Port Orange would be less expensive, but no. Every unit there has sold for more than \$200,000.

But then why would builders put lower-priced houses on the market when they're doing so well with higher priced ones. For example, ICI Homes has sold 17 houses in Browns Landing on Taylor Road in Port Orange since it started in spring 2017. Most of those houses have sold for more than \$600,000.

But maybe that's changing as Minto Communities plans to start building more attached "cottages" in Latitude Margaritaville. Nope, those start at \$253,000.

Just to give you the breakdown. Say a young couple is trying to buy a house for \$200,000. They've scrimped and saved, and talked their parents out of a few bucks, and have come up with \$20,000. That's still just 10 percent, but hopefully enough to talk a lender into giving them a 30-year loan at, oh, maybe 5 percent. Since they can't pay down 20 percent and avoid private mortgage insurance, for the first 78 months, their payment would be \$1,364.21. Then the PMI would go away and their payments would drop to \$1,249.61.

Throw in insurance and

taxes and they're still looking at about \$1,500 a month. How many young couples do you know that can afford \$1,500 a month for a house?

Apparently there's a mystery about whether VanTrust is building a distribution center for Amazon Direct in Daytona Beach. I stand by what I saw on a brief description on the building permits listing of the office/warehouse VanTrust is building at Dunn and Mason Avenue Extension that it was for an Amazon Direct distribution center. Apparently someone later deleted the description.

But then it gets more confusing with the Kansas City Business Journal reporting VanTrust was going to build a 300,000 distribution center in Daytona Beach for Amazon. The one at 2400 Mason Avenue is just 68,000 square feet. So, maybe whoever obtained the building permit was confused or VanTrust is building so much it can't keep up with what's what. I guess we'll just have to wait and see.

Not a lot of commercial real estate deals to report. A Fremont, Calif., investor has acquired the Davita Labs property at Volusia Medical Park at Dunn Avenue and

Clyde Morris Boulevard in Daytona Beach for \$2.21 million. An entity named Lake Sunset Ranch has bought pastureland from Deep Creek Ranch at DeLeon Springs for \$1.5 million.

I don't know if you'd consider it a good thing or not, but the area continues to get some of the trendy new restaurants. Fast-growing chicken restaurant chain Huey Magoo's is going in next to new the Tire Kingdom and O'Reilly's Auto Parts at 1250 Beville Road in Daytona Beach. Also the signs are going up for Smashburger on West ISB in Daytona, so it should be opening soon.

On a final note, Southern Stone Communications is moving out of downtown Daytona Beach. The owner of six radio channels is setting up a station at Jimmy Ann Drive and LPGA Boulevard, which is actually where the transmission tower is for a couple of the channels.

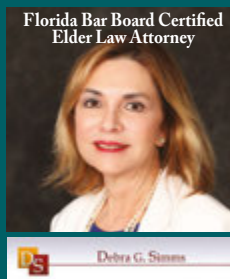

New environmental group tackles single-use plastics

Dream Green Volusia was born March 3, providing the area with a grass roots group of environmental and civic organizations working together.

The group is the brainchild of Ormond Beach resident Suzanne Scheiber.

"I love living in Ormond Beach and Volusia County," Ms. Scheiber said. "We are a special place on the coast because of the beauty of our natural environment."

The clearing of land for Granada Pointe in Ormond Beach upset her, she said. "I live directly behind the proj-

ect. "When attending environmental and civic meetings, I would hear of many environmental problems countywide and became more and more concerned," Ms. Scheiber said. "I started to see a bigger picture that more needed to be done and why not try working together to achieve a common goal."

She hosted meetings of environmental and civic leaders Jan. 26 and March 3 in east Volusia County. About 25 people attended each meeting.

Each group is successful in their own right, but, she said. "Looking around Volusia County what we are doing isn't enough. Who wants to think

what they are doing isn't enough when they are putting in so many hours and so much effort? At the first meeting, we talked about our successes and failures. It became apparent there was much more work that needed to be done. We all agreed that it was not from a lack of caring or trying.

"After going around the room and having everyone pitch their ideas, we voted on one idea that we could work on countywide," Ms. Scheiber said. "Single-use plastics almost unanimously received the most votes. The idea is to think out of the box more engage the public and inform them of issues we all care about."

The groups are working on

replacing single-use plastics, specifically straws, bags and Styrofoam.

"We have to start somewhere and refuse to be overwhelmed by the size and scope of the problem," she said.

Single-use plastics are used once and thrown away. Ms. Scheiber noted how many common items in grocery stores come in plastic containers. Plastics do not bio-degrade and end up in landfills, waterways, oceans and the environment. They slowly break down into microplastics over a long period of time and end up contaminating soil and water. The toxic chemicals ultimately end up in the food chain and are bad for our health. They also wreak havoc on wildlife.

"This is a worldwide problem, not just a Volusia County problem" she said.

Dream Green Volusia will raise awareness of what environmental and civic groups are doing.

The first official project, the "State of the River" boat tour in New Smyrna Beach, was

March 30 on the Litter Gitter boat, owned by the nonprofit North Florida Coastal Caretakers of St. Augustine.

The boat's captain and environmental educator Adam Morley said "I am really impressed with (Ms. Scheiber's) efforts. She has done something that I have not been able to see anybody else do and that is get (environmental and civic groups) all in the same room, talking about issues and where they would like to go as one large collective. I am really excited to see the progress she has made and the initiative she has taken to get us where we are."

The next project is going to be a photography challenge.

Dream Green Volusia's short-term goal is to bring about public awareness of the problem and to engage public participation. The long-term goal is to help businesses and other entities transfer from single-use plastic to a bio-degradable alternative in a financially sustainable way.

Ms. Scheiber believes in recycling, but also wants to see

there be less things needing to be recycled, as recycling itself is becoming too costly and without recycling those items will end up in landfills and waterways contributing to problems.

The list of groups participating is growing and now includes Volusia-Flagler Sierra Club, New Smyrna Resident's Coalition, Southeast Volusia Audubon, CANDO 2 Ormond, Friends of Gamble Rogers State Park- Flagler, New Smyrna History Museum, New Smyrna Singing Raging Grannies, Volusia Soil and Water Conservation, Halifax River Audubon and Beaches Go Green from the Jacksonville area. Green Dream Team members besides Ms. Scheiber, include Lark Shields, David Buono and Weegie Kuendig.

"We all want the best for Volusia County, the place we call home" Ms. Scheiber said. "We want businesses and the public to join the team."

Shepard explained.

He said the settlement agreement was standard in that each party would remain responsible for their own attorney fees and other costs and there was no admission of fault by anyone.

The town has accrued \$5.4 million in legal fees and court-related costs, including those for court reporters, transcripts and expert witnesses. Although Mr. Shepard said he felt confident the town could recover some of that if it prevailed in the state case, collecting on the fees would be a process in itself as he lacked confidence the businesses involved would have the necessary assets.

"Because of all the uncertainties and potential further

expense, I think this is a deal that should be strongly considered," Mr. Shepard said.

The residents at the meeting agreed. Only about a half dozen of them spoke during the public comments portion of the meeting, but all of them encouraged the council to sign the document and move on.

Councilwoman Lois Paritsky said the overwhelming sentiment among the residents who contacted her about the agreement was relief at the possibility of putting an end to it all.

Councilman Joseph Perrone said he was ready to put this to bed. "We just don't know what may come out of the courts. We've been surprised in the past with the state case," Mr. Perrone reminded everyone.

In that case, the initial ruling was in favor of the land owners and they were awarded a \$30 million judgement.

However, that ruling and award was dismissed on appeal. The Johnsons then appealed that decision and the court has yet to rule on it.

Mayor Gary Smith agreed. "It is hard to believe we did lose that first trial. I think it was because of the press. Every article seemed to say we were picking on the property owners," he said.

The mayor emphasized the town had done nothing to stand in the way of development. "Every rule that was in place 12 years ago is in place today. We just didn't change the rules to what the property owner wanted," he explained. "We have prevailed. It is time to move on."

With that, the council voted and there was applause from those in attendance. The Town Council took a recess to allow for signing the paperwork to make it official.





Surviving an aerial attack at High Bridge

The sun came up slowly, filtered by a cloud bank hanging low over the Atlantic Ocean.

The resulting light sent a warm, golden glow over the mud flats south of High Bridge. High atop the skeleton of a dead tree sat a beautiful osprey fish hawk picking at its breakfast. I am an early fisherman, but not as early as that big bird of prey.

The tide was nearing the incoming stage and just where a stream narrowed were a pair of large wading birds. A great egret and a blue heron stood sentinel only a couple feet apart to fish the last bit of current.

On the dying tide, my expectations were low, but on the second cast something hit the jig and ate it in half. I soon had two more light hits and two more soft tail shrimp jig tails were destroyed. That had to mean a school of small bluefish were in the area and that sent me paddling. No need to lose more lures to those aggressive feeders. Blues will hit anything that moves and usually with a vengeance.

I allowed the kayak to drift to a stop at a downed tree and changed my jig tail to a root beer color in hopes of discouraging the bluefish. That seemed to work and pretty quickly I was on with a sturdy 21-inch red drum. That

battler managed to pull my kayak into the center of the stream before heading for cover beneath the downed cedar. I tightened the drag and somehow managed to stop it. The red came to the boat seemingly tired out, but when it saw the dip net, off it went again.

Once back at the boat, the drum decided to dive and when I applied maximum pressure I heard something pop. The eye on the end of my rod could take it no more and broke. Finally I was able to put the red in the boat and cover it with a cloth to keep it from jumping out of the Peanut as they often will.

I spent a few minutes trying to repair my rod but with no luck. Now fishing from the rod's second eye, I began a drift toward the Halifax River. A flight of gulls took to the air to screech their anger at my coming too close to their sandbar. About 50 sea gulls were swirling overhead and a few showered me with droppings to accentuate their displeasure. Luckily, I

remembered to keep my mouth closed.

Just then something took the chartreuse jig and streaked off. It was a fat 19-inch sea trout and the fight totaled 10 minutes. The first five was on the starboard side of my kayak and then the trout came close and made a mighty leap soaring over the boat and right in front of my face. I sat stunned admiring the pretty, iridescent, silver fish as it sailed past.

When it splashed down on the port side the fight was renewed. This contest was taking much too long and with a damaged rod my chances were growing slim. I have to tell you when I did put the net under the fish I breathed an involuntary sigh of relief.

Fishing that day had turned out to be slow but I had managed to land a pair of pretty nice fish on the only two decent hits that came my way. I had also avoided an aerial attack. Not bad, not bad at all.

realities within and beyond our borders."

"In a way, I don't choose what I write about — my subjects kind of choose me," he explained in 1993. "It's a healing thing, a way of confronting what's important in my life at the time."

He was born on an army base in Germany in 1948, but has lived in Southern California virtually all his life. He was only 23 when he released the

auspicious debut album, Jackson Browne (later Saturate Before Using).

In 1967 he ventured to New York, brushing against Andy Warhol's scene and befriending Leonard Cohen and Lou Reed. A publishing deal with Elektra Records led to demo recordings of 30 original songs. During this period, other performers discovered his material.

Most famously was one he wrote with Glen Frey that led to a statue on a corner in Winslow, Ariz.

"With such songs as 'Run-

ning On Empty' and 'Somebody's Baby,' Mr. Browne achieved his greatest commercial success in the late '70s and early '80, despite his music starting to reflect his growing involvement with political and social causes," Rolling Stone's website states. "By the Reagan era, he was as renowned for his vocal opposition to nuclear energy as he was for his chart-scaling hits."

In June, Mr. Browne will present full-band concerts in the Northeast.

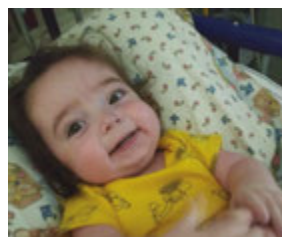

Eat your greens for a healthy life

At your greens, they're good for you. I bet we all heard that before. It made me just want to gobble my greens down – ugh! Even when you're parents tried to get you to eat canned spinach by saying, "Don't you want to be strong like Popeye?" "NO! It tastes yucky."

Actually I was lucky being raised in a Greek family. Like many of you with ethnic families, fresh greens were served often. The key here is fresh greens that taste good and don't forget the fact greens are healthy.

Think about grass-fed cattle, which you probably don't. Cattle eat grass, grow healthy, strong and taste great. When ranchers take cattle off grass and feed them grain, the cattle usually get sick and have to be given antibiotics. Fifty percent of all antibiotics produced go to cattle feeding. So, greens for humans may be a pretty good idea.

Kale, chard, lettuce, mustard, collard, spinach and beet greens (one of my favorites) are all great options. Don't forget arugula and endive. These greens contain magnesium, calcium, potassium, manganese and folate.

So, what does that all mean? It means the greens are healthy for you and greens complement all foods, plus eating greens can help reduce caloric intake, OK? So, big whoop for greens.

Now, I know there won't be a big rush of people going out to buy fresh greens, but you should consider the idea. Please. Many of us think of greens as tasteless and that's

because when you were served greens as a youngster, they were probably boiled with little seasoning. Let's see, greens or a baked potato with sour cream, butter. Hmmm ... no competition there!

Look, try something different. For me they taste great by themselves or with any food. That's the secret, how they are cooked and the foods you pair with them.

I was raised on dandelion greens. Talk about bitter, but my mother always cooked them in olive oil, lemon and sometimes garlic, and served it with fresh lamb. I can remember my father and me driving around town looking for wild dandelion greens growing in the parks or empty lots. Now I find them in the farmers market, but you have to go early, because they sell out fast. Just thinking about it reminds me to go shopping this weekend. I want some right now!

We should all try to eat fresh greens two or three times a week. You will notice a difference in your health and you will feel better. Try this recipe for a start. Enjoy.

Italian Beans and Greens

Ingredients
2 tablespoons olive oil

- 4 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 1 pinch red pepper flakes
- 2 (15 ounce) cans cannellini (white) beans, drained
- 2 teaspoons chopped fresh oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1 head escarole, chopped
- Salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 1 pinch red pepper flakes, or to taste * Optional
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

Directions

Heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Add garlic; cook, stirring, until bubbling and sizzling, about 20 seconds. Pour in chicken broth. Bring to a boil and cook until liquid is reduced by half, 6 to 8 minutes.

Stir in red pepper flakes. Stir in beans; bring to a boil and cook until you can see the tops of the beans just below the surface of the liquid, 6 to 8 minutes. Stir in oregano and lemon zest. Simmer for 3 minutes.

Place escarole in bean mixture; reduce heat to low and stir until escarole wilts, about 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper to taste; garnish with extra virgin olive oil.

Option: add one pinch pepper flakes to garnish.

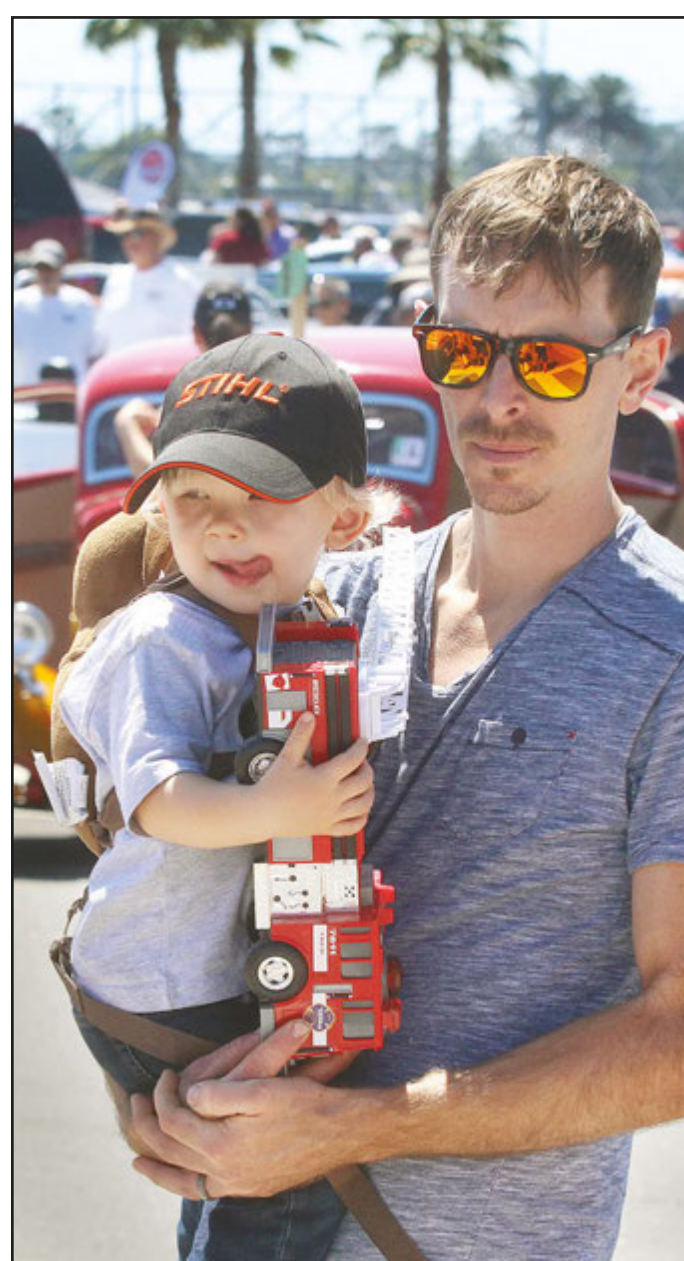
