ST. LUCIE COUNTY — Even working within the highest echelons of law enforcement doesn't mean a person will avoid being the victim of domestic abuse.

Such was the case with Rose Smith, who said last week, that when she was the victim of abuse, she was

also secretary to former Fort Pierce Police Chief Eugene Savage and currently holds that position with Police Chief Sean Baldwin.

Ms. Smith recalled the traumatic period during her life at a seminar at Indian River State College last week to bring awareness about the continuing problem of domestic violence. It was sponsored by the 19th Judicial Circuit Victims' Rights Coalition.

Speaking during Domestic Violence Awareness Month, Ms. Smith said her former husband became "more controlling and more physically abusive," toward the end.

But unlike a woman featured in a film called "Telling Amy's Story," shown during the event, Ms. Smith lived to begin a new life.

Group uses science to sort fact, fiction

ST. LUCIE COUNTY — As Halloween approaches, people embrace the spooky, people explain the unexplained and things that go bump in the night.

But there's a group based in St. Lucie County that does that all year long.

The G.R.I.M. Society is a small team of researchers who scientifically explore claims of the paranormal.

"G.R.I.M. stands for Ghostly Research and Investigation into the Metaphysical," said founder and lead investigator James Dourney. He and his wife, Tamara, head up a team of 11 others who investigate unexplained claims.

The group has done research all over the Treasure Coast, and has even traveled to Georgia and Indiana on investigations. What sets them apart is their use of science to separate fact from fiction.

"We, as a community, have handed down tales, personal experiences or urban legends

staff change the older bandages layer by layer.

"Part of what we do is constantly re-evaluate and change the wound treatment as needed," said Sarah Anderson, a nurse practitioner who has been with the health system for years. She found herself drawn to the field of wound care shortly after its introduction into the local health care system.

"I thought it was very interesting and science-based," she said. "I enjoy it."

For most people, wound healing is a natural process. But for some, it becomes difficult for a variety of reasons, such as age or other health conditions such as diabetes or vascular disease.

The wound care center has specially trained staff accredited in wound care to diagnose, treat and educate patients about the entire healing process.

In the examination room, Ms. Commette's files are brought up digitally on the computer as the team takes measurements of her injury. The measurements will be compared to the data taken at her last visit.

"That's how we tell the



treatment is working," said Ms. Anderson. "If the swelling is decreasing, she is responding to the treatment."

Ms. Commette smiled and laughed with staff throughout the procedure.

"The staff is so knowledgeable here, and so nice," said her daughter, Sue Berry. "They all know her by name, and they all stop to talk to her."

Now that the bandages

were off and the measurements done, the staff began to clean the affected area.

As they worked, Scott Parratto, a podiatrist with 15 years at Martin Memorial Health Systems, stopped in to check on his patient.

"We're better able to take care of the patients here," he said of the new wound center, as he looked closely at Ms. Commette's wounds.

After a thorough examination, Ms. Commette was sent

to the onsite physical therapist to be massaged, and she waved to the group as she left.

"Having the center means the community has the knowledge base available to best help the patients," he said.

The wound care center is located at 1095 N.W. St. Lucie West Blvd. in Port St. Lucie.

beginning of the school year to greet students as they enter the school campus. Adults, including teachers, parents, and community leaders are on hand with encouraging words and high fives for the students.

"It really brings a connection between the adults and the children," said Traci Wilke, Windmill Point Elementary principal, as she watched the group got high fives and an occasional hug from the students.

The Kids at Hope program

trains adults, such as parents and others associated with schools, in the belief that "all children are capable of success, no exception."

These people, from bus drivers to cafeteria staff to teachers are then given the title "Treasure Hunter." They see children as treasures and help them reach their goals.

The program first began when 2 square miles were chosen by the community for the initiative to begin, one in Port St. Lucie, the other in Fort Pierce.

In Port St. Lucie, the square mile included Windmill Point Elementary.

Ms. Wilke has been princi-

pal of the school for the past four years, and flew to Phoenix, Ariz., for training in the program. She came back a changed person.

"We teach they need to believe in themselves, because we believe in them," she said. "The best part of being here is being with the kids."

Community leaders were also on hand to greet the Kids at Hope members.

"This is an exciting back to basics that I've been proud to be a part of," said Linda Bartz, councilwoman with the city of Port St. Lucie.

"It's a whole new way to look at our children and

make them successful."

County Commissioner Tod Mowery agreed.

"I love this environment," he said. "They're not creating just a program, they're creating a culture."

Currently, 15 schools are designated as Kids at Hope schools.

At the luncheon held at the school, St. Lucie County Superintendent Michael Lannon told the group the school district was "about the hope factors, not the risk factors."

"We take risks and turn them into hope," he said. "It's become positive for our kids and our future, and that's where we've got to go."





Hinds County deputies said a 61-year-old Pearl woman is accused of accidentally calling a detective to make a drug deal.

The Sheriff's Department said Judy Weible accidentally called the cell phone of a detective on their Street Crimes Task Force. At first,

"In initial calls, she wanted to sell some pills. He blew her off, and evidently she didn't like being ignored, so she started sending a series of text messages," Lt. Jeffrey Scott said. "That's when we kind of took it seriously."

Deputies said they were able to set up a time to meet her and make an arrest.

The Sheriff's Department said Weible was carrying 30 hydrocodone tablets. Weible has been charged with

from one generation to the next, with each generation adding its own version and variety," he said. "In order to determine the truth within the stories, the only possible approach is through science."

The group not only uses recording equipment, such as cameras, video devices and audio recorders, they also use environmental-data collection equipment, such as temperature and barometric pressure gauges.

"During our more scientific experiments, we have used generators and xylophones," Mr. Dourney said. "We follow the scientific process to analyze reports and generate theories."

He told of one investigation that took place at a cabin in

the woods, where there were reports of footsteps at night. After spending a few hours investigating, the group discovered the ambient temperature, along with the construction design of the porch, was causing the wooden planks to expand and contract.

"Together, these noises really did sound like footsteps," he said.

They have currently completed one investigation and are actively collecting data on four more. Locally, the group has gathered data at the St. Lucie County Historical Museum, the Platts-Backus House, the Governor's House and Old Fort Park.

"Because history plays such a prominent role in many of the tales and legends we encounter, it is imperative that we have factual information or events surrounding a

location or an individual," he said.

"Naturally, we are strong proponents of historic preservation and of education and outreach within the community."

Currently, the group is part of a two-year study of battery drainage at reportedly haunted locations.

"Working with scientists across the country, we have become part of a larger group dedicated to finding a cause for the mysterious depletion of power in electronic devices when exposed to these locations," he said.

But while the group takes its work seriously, they understand why people question their sanity.

"Our group works in an area that is colored by the perceptions established over time by television and movies," Mr. Dourney said.

"But while we believe that tales of hauntings or paranormal activity are too numerous to be dismissed, we do not believe that a viable explanation can be found without turning to the standards of science."

Newspaper defends dumb law

I've written two blog articles on the subject of Florida's dumb law allowing any person to anonymously report you or me as an "impaired driver." Perhaps the worst part of this dumb law is that even if it can be proven the report was unfounded and had malicious intent, the informer is indemnified from all civil or criminal liability.

Why am I writing a third column on this subject? It's because the Fort Lauderdale *Sun Sentinel* published a headline article in its Oct. 23 edition supporting this law and the AP picked up the story, a release of which was published in the Oct. 24 edition of the *Palm Beach Post* and many other newspapers nationwide. I suspect these articles were the result of press releases by the Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicle department, FHSMV, who enforces this dumb law. I'm asking you to sign an electronic petition to change this law to remove the anonymity and "hold harmless" sections. Please click on www.DumbLaw.org. Below, I've addressed various omissions, misunderstandings, and distortions of the article from the *Sun Sentinel*. I'm sure that when you've read both the article and my comments you will agree this law

needs to be changed. It acknowledges that "most of the drivers lost their privileges because they didn't submit detailed medical information requested by the state to show they are still able to drive."

What they don't do is drill down and ask the question why didn't drivers submit their medical information?

Is it always because they know for certain the medical information would have resulted in a license suspension? Or is it often because they are simply afraid and unsure?

My personal situation is a good example. When I first got the letter from the FHSMV, I was concerned that I might fail a hearing test.

I'm a former hunter and have high-frequency hearing loss in my left ear. It wasn't until I read the Florida driver's handbook that I discovered a driver license cannot be revoked for being hard of hearing or even deaf. Supposing I had been too afraid to take a hearing test and chose not to respond to the letter with the following reasoning: if I drive carefully, the odds are 99.9 percent that I will never be stopped by a policeman and asked to show my driver license? I can probably keep quiet about the letter, keep on driving and nobody will ever be the wiser.

The worst case scenario is I get stopped sometime in the future, and they cite me for driving with a suspended license. I claim that I never got the letter asking me to take the test, which was sent by regular mail, not certified. I've had the benefit of years of driving that I would otherwise have lost and I can, even then, agree to

Doctor offers 'whole-body' approach to health

take the test and hope I pass it. The alternative is to respond immediately and risk taking the test and losing my driver license. Think for a minute about how terrifying it is to lose your right to drive a car in Florida.

During this Great Recession it was shown that many people choose to have their home foreclosed on rather than their car repossessed. Keeping their car allows them to get to work, the doctor, the pharmacy, the grocery store, etc. and continue with their lives. They can sleep and live in their car which is a hardship, but at least they can still have a life.

The article acknowledges that this is a "little-known law." But this front-page article and other recent media attention will soon make this a "well-known

law."

Up until now, only 11 percent of anonymous informants have been non-professionals (regular people, not doctors and police). What will happen when every "person," which is the other category specified in the law, who can make an anonymous report learns of this law? What happens when angry neighbors, divorce litigants, estranged spouses, political opponents, jilted lovers, disgruntled and fired employees, business competitors, pranksters and sociopaths (psychologists say that 1 percent of the population are born sociopaths and 10 percent more become so because of their environment) learn about this perfect tool for revenge on somebody they don't like?

The article points out that 42 percent of anonymous informants are cops.

Several questions occur to me that the media has left unanswered.

Why would a policeman waste the time of filing a report to the FHSMV instead of taking immediate action to remove an impaired driver from the roads? Police take drunk drivers off the road immediately, why not legally blind drivers?

Why does a cop want to remain anonymous and immune from civil or criminal liability? The answer to this question might be frightening. A cop isn't afraid to "look you in the eye" when he gives you a speeding ticket, makes you take a breathalyzer or blood alcohol test and cites you for DUI. He's not anonymous and he faces civil and criminal liability if he carelessly and/or maliciously does any of these things.

Unfortunately in our society, instances of police brutality, sexual harassment and other police abuses of power are not uncommon. Some police forces are requiring video

cameras be placed on squad cars and even then, we're discovering cops who take advantage of civilians because they have the power to do so. Is it so farfetched to think that a cop who has been "smarted off to" by a traffic offender might get even with him by reporting him as impaired driver, especially since he remains anonymous and is immunized from all civil or criminal liability?

When a cop or doctor makes the anonymous complaint, there is no investigation of the complaint as there is if a non-professional is the informant. The person reported is ordered to immediately take driving, written, eye and hearing tests.

In my personal situation, I suspect a policeman as being the anonymous informant. Of course I can't prove it and, if I could, I could take no action against him. My

reasons for my suspicion are that I was ticketed for speeding while driving in the right-hand (slow) lane, while cars passed me on the left. The cop was annoyed at me because I didn't pull over right away. I didn't pull over immediately because there was no safe place to pull over and I was driving with the windows up and while conversing on my cell phone and simply didn't notice him at first.

I got the letter from the FHSMV in the mail a couple of weeks after I was ticketed. At this time, I learned this policeman was married to an ex-employee of mine who I fired and who subsequently sued me for firing her.

I'm not just a good driver; I'm an excellent driver with 20-20 vision, adequate hearing, fast reflexes and a sharp mind. I've never had a traffic accident, but I admit that I do drive slightly over the speed limit, as do most

drivers. Whoever reported me clearly did it for malicious reasons.

The AARP in the past has opposed age-based additional road testing for drivers, according to this article. I have some contacts in Tallahassee who spoke to me off the record, legislators who tried to get age-based testing into the law but AARP stopped this dead in its tracks.

However, the FHSMV is proceeding to do this in spite of it not being in the law. They have taken it upon themselves to send letters to all seniors who have reached 70 who have also not renewed their license in person in the past five years. They have renewed by mail or online.

In my opinion, if this is true, it is a serious violation of the law by a state agency.

Early Age Spay and Neutering

Spaying and neutering dogs and cats is the most common elective surgery we veterinarians perform every day. Most pet owners choose this procedure because they do not want unwanted litters of puppies and kittens. This is a very real and responsible benefit, but we usually address neutering and spaying as a significant health benefit.

Studies have shown for over 25 years that female dogs and cats that are spayed before their first heat have a 0.05% risk of developing breast cancer later in their lives. If the surgery is done after their first heat, the risk jumps to 8%, and if it is done after the second heat the risk jumps to 26%. Spaying performed after 2 years or 4 heat cycles has no sparing effect on the incidence of breast cancer, but if the pet is presented with mammary tumors and is unspayed, we recommend it to stop the estrogen source to the tumors.

Another risk to unspayed pets are pyometras, or uterine infections. These normally occur 30-60 days post heat. Uterine infections can be life threatening especially if the y are with a closed cervix, because the purulent material cannot drain and the pet becomes septic, or the uterus could rupture.

Dogs that are unneutered increase the risk of prostate issues, including cancer. The prostate has receptors for the male hormone, testosterone and grows with age. As a prostate cancer survivor myself, it is a subject that is very near and dear to my heart.

The behavioral benefits of sterilization are well documented. Males do not roam as much, or mark their territory. Males that are neutered, tend to be less aggressive. This does not mean that they will not defend their owners or their families. Females do not bleed and attract males when they come into heat. A common misconception is that pets become overweight when they are sterilized. Sterilization does slow down the metabolism somewhat, so if a pet starts gaining weight, the solution is simple, feed less, exercise more.

One of my favorite sayings is "My crystal ball is in the shop, and I would never say your pet WILL develop these conditions if they are not sterilized, but their chances definitely go up. Spaying or neutering is just one good proactive thing to do for your pet, to minimize the risks of future health issues!"

ary 2010. The resident, John Portik, said last week, almost two years later, the problem with the scenario was that he never made such a threat and that no one could provide independent proof that he did. "I flatly denied it then and I have denied it ever since," Mr. Portik said. Mr. Portik has filed a lawsuit in the 19th Judicial District Circuit Court against American Home Mortgage Servicing Corp., and one of its employees, Samara Mal-

oney, for defamation, abuse of process and intentional infliction of emotional distress. He contends American Home fabricated the allegation against him because he threatened to file a complaint against the corporation. Through a spokeswoman, American Home Mortgaging declined comment. Ms. Maloney could not be reached for comment. Mr. Portik, who was charged with making an attempted threat to a project, place or discharge a destructive device, said he ended up pleading "no contest," to a charge of attempt

to commit threat to project a destructive device, because he didn't want to risk a much worse penalty than what he received and to end the matter. He said as a result of the plea, he was placed on probation for four years and ordered to pay \$30,000 to help American Home Mortgage increase its security. Before that he was required to live nine months essentially under home arrest, he said. It all started, Mr. Portik said, when a friend who faced eviction from his house, asked for his help because he had 24 years experience in the collection business. Mr. Portik said he made several calls before reaching Ms. Maloney, who worked at American Home Mortgage's Jacksonville office. Within three hours of that conversation, he was con-

tacted by American Home Mortgage, which agreed to modify the mortgage for his friend, giving him a 30-year mortgage at a 3 percent interest rate. Figuring the whole matter was resolved, he said, he was surprised when police showed up at his house. According to an arrest affidavit for Mr. Portik, 58, a Jacksonville detective told the St. Lucie County Sher-

iff's Office it was reported Mr. Portik "had been calling the mortgage offices in Jacksonville, Fla., and Irving, Texas, and was threatening the staff with coming and bombing the building and also threatening to shoot individuals and also finding information for the employees and taking care of their children." But Mr. Portik said he never made such threats and that with more than 20 years experience in bill collections he knows the legal line. He said no tape recording has been produced of his telephone conversation with Ms. Maloney. He also noted the evidence showed the alleged threat to Ms. Maloney was not reported for more than an hour. "I think it is very strange that every other conversation I had with AHMSI was recorded except for the one in which I supposedly made

the threat (that led to his arrest)," he said. However, the arrest affidavit said recordings of other conversations stated Mr. Maloney told an operator in India that "he would hire someone to put a bullet in her head," and that he would shoot a mortgage negotiator in Texas. His attorney in the civil lawsuit, Alex Barak, said people often get frustrated in dealing with people in call centers in other countries. It was unrealistic to think that Mr. Portik had the means to carry out such a threat, he said. As a result of the whole situation, Mr. Portik said he lost his civil liberties for almost a year and he also believes the stress resulted in him needing open heart surgery. "I was just trying to help my friend get a fair shake," he said.

their annual boot drive. The ordinance states those distributing materials or goods to, or soliciting business or charitable contributions from, motor vehicle occupants is hazardous to public safety and impedes the normal flow of traffic. But those in opposition to the ordinance, mainly the Muscular Dystrophy Association and newspaper street hawkers, spoke on how the ban could not only impact

charitable contributions to the county, but also cause people to lose their jobs. "I don't think anyone wants to hurt employment," said Vice Mayor Linda Bartz. Mayor JoAnn Faiella said there was no factual proof the solicitations were causing accidents, and also said that as far as giving to a charity, "residents should educate themselves on whom to donate to." "I don't feel the government should be interfering with that," she said. Councilwomen Michelle Berger and Shannon Martin agreed. "When it comes to polic-

ing people on the street, people have to make their own decision on who to give their money to," Councilwoman Martin said. "There's a lot of information out there about what charitable organizations are good or not." The St. Lucie County Commission is also looking at a similar ban on roadside solicitations, and tabled the issue until a November meeting. Initial discussion showed the county officials were looking at the option of banning solicitations every day except for Sunday. But the city council did not want to discuss that, cit-

ing safety to residents. "If it's for safety, that's safety seven day a week, not six days a week," Mayor Faiella said. If the ordinance had passed both readings, it would have been illegal for anyone to solicit from or distribute anything to motor vehicle occupants on Port St. Lucie roads. The council directed Port St. Lucie Police Chief Brain Reuther to keep an eye on the activity. "I prefer the chief monitor this, and if there's a problem, bring it back before council," Mayor Faiella said.

The movie featured a case in 2001 where a husband killed his wife after years of an abusive relationship when she tried to leave him.

A police investigator in the case noted that the city where it happened, State College, Pa., is an area that doesn't have a lot of crime.

But for the murder victim, that didn't matter, she said.

"If you can't be safe in your own home, does it make a difference if the community in which you live is safe?" she asked.

In the Pennsylvania case, the husband constantly called his wife at work, insisted on taking her to work, picking her up and required that she report her every movement to him.

Ms. Smith recalled her ex-husband would constantly call the Fort Pierce Police Department and check up on her. She also said he would deflate her vehicle's tires, so she would have to ride with him.

When he lost his business, all of those things intensified, she said.

She said her husband sent numerous false letters to the media that she was having an affair with Chief Savage.

Her ex-husband was charged with battery against her, but was acquitted of the charge, she said.

Although domestic violence remains a problem, participants in a panel discussion said they believe law enforcement response has improved over the years. They also said there's an increasing recognition that it's not just a private problem, but a community concern.

Brian Rhodes, a detective with the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office, said providing training to law enforcement on how to respond to domestic violence is crucial.

Law enforcement officers must know the psychology of the situation and just because a victim wants to drop charges doesn't mean the abuse didn't occur, he said.

Tom Bakkedahl, chief assistant state attorney, said in the past, when victims wanted to drop charges the response of the criminal justice system was often to oblige.

The mindset was that it's one less case to deal with, he said.

But to provide the necessary response, he said, law enforcement needs to be creative in gathering evidence in cases where victims might not cooperate.

That can include getting photos of victim's injuries before they heal, which documents the abuse, he said.

Margaret Scoboria, a counselor, said victims often don't want to pursue prosecution because the abuser has taken away their sense of self-worth.

"In order to get a person to feel good about themselves you have to get the person away from the abuser," she said.





You can cut the cholesterol in this recipe by using canola oil in place of the shortening and egg substitute for the eggs. This is a family favorite and unbeatable served with cream cheese.

- 2-1/2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2-teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs or equivalent amount of egg substitute
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2-cup melted butter, butter substitute or canola oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1-1/3 cups mashed bananas (about 3

- medium bananas)
- 3/4-cup chopped walnuts or pecans (optional)

Sift dry ingredients together, set aside.

Using a strong electric mixer (batter is very stiff), beat eggs with sugar and butter.

Slowly add flour mixture, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla and bananas, mix well. Stir in chopped nuts.

Treat a loaf pan with cooking spray. Pour in batter.

Bake in a 325-degree, preheated oven for about 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

By dusting the nuts with flour first, they won't sink to the bottom.

CRANBERRY BREAD NIB

I have not tried the low-fat alternatives but I'm sure they will work.

- 1-1/2 cups cranberries, washed
- 1 cup sugar or 1/2-cup sugar and 1/2-cup Splenda
- 1 large egg
- 1 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoons butter or butter substitute, melted





others like intraocular pressure, certain medications, vascular disease, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, migraines, and sleep apnea to name a few are!

Glaucoma... The Sneak Thief of Sight!

Every year, glaucoma causes 80,000 Americans to become blind, and another 900,000 people to lose partial vision. It is the second leading cause of blindness worldwide. It affects 1 in 200 people aged fifty and older and 1 in 10 aged eighty and older. It is the leading cause of blindness for African-Americans. Glaucoma is a usually painless condition without any signs or symptoms until it's too late! What is this horrible disease and how can you protect yourself from it?

Eye care professionals refer to Glaucoma as "The Sneak Thief of Sight" because the damage from glaucoma is very slowly progressive. Vision loss results gradually over a very long period of time. A patient will not notice damage from glaucoma until it has progressed to a very advanced stage. Once vision is lost to Glaucoma it can't be recovered. Fortunately, many of the risk factors for Glaucoma are causal and changeable allowing for intervention by an eye care professional. However, many other factors can't be modified. Things like age, race, and family history are not subject to change but

So what can you and your eye doctor do to check for this condition? The most important thing is routine annual dilated eye examinations with intraocular pressure measurement and review of your systemic health conditions. This will allow your eye care professional to actually look in the eye and check for damage, measure the pressure, and review your risk factors. This type of examination will allow your doctor to assess your risk each year and check for development of Glaucoma. If you are found to be a suspect for Glaucoma your doctor will order more advanced testing. This testing will include corneal thickness evaluation called pachymetry, gonioscopy evaluation of the drainage system of the eye, visual field analysis with multiple types of equipment, ocular coherence tomography of the nerve fiber layer of the retina, optic nerve analysis, and measurement of the blood flow to the optic nerve. A complete evaluation of all these tests combined with your comprehensive examination and review of your systemic health will allow your doctor to properly diagnosis you.

If you do have Glaucoma how is it treated? Fortunately, there are many treatment options for Glaucoma! First, your

eye care professional will make sure all of your systemic health problems are under control and being treated by your primary care physician. Next, the most common form of treatment for Glaucoma is medicine. Usually but not always in the form of eye drops. There are several different classes of glaucoma medicines with multiple types of medicine within each class. This allows your doctor to mix and match medical treatments to find a combination that will work for you. In some cases medical therapy is not enough or is contraindicated so your doctor may recommend surgery. There are several forms of surgery available for Glaucoma. The most common is to have a Selective Laser Trabeculoplasty (SLT). This laser procedure will open the drainage system of the eye and cause lower pressure. An alternative is to consider Endo-Cyclo-Photocoagulation (ECP). This procedure lasers the internal structures of the eye trying to reduce the pressure. Lastly for uncontrollable Glaucoma your doctor may recommend physical surgery in the form of a trabeculectomy, trabeculotomy, or Shunt procedures. These much more advanced surgeries are for someone with advanced glaucoma that is nonresponsive to medicine or laser therapy.

So, the best advice I can give is to have routine annual examination with your eye care provider and be checked. Don't let this sneak thief steal your vision!

The Titans piled up 267 rushing yards, including 121 yards and two touchdowns from Shadrach Alexander and 78 yards from James Millen.

Treasure Coast (4-3) struck early when Travares Copeland lobbed a 35-yard touchdown pass to a leaping Kurt Kimes down the left sideline to put Treasure Coast on top just 98 seconds into the game.

Despite the quick start and controlling much of the first half with hard nose running, Treasure Coast did not add any more points on the scoreboard for the rest of the first half after several drives were derailed due to

penalties. Eleven Titans' penalties, including two which negated touchdowns, slowed their offensive attack and after a 14-play, 77-yard drive ended with a 30-yard touchdown pass from OB Kedric Bostic to Isaiah Nelson late in the second period, the Eagles (6-2) and Titans were knotted up at 7 entering halftime.

As the second half got underway, the Titans' offensive line began to create bigger holes against a Jupiter Christian defense starting to show signs of fatigue.

Treasure Coast took advantage with 4:16 left of the third period, when Alexander, on fourth down, took the handoff up the weak side, found daylight and rumbled 16 yards for the score.

"My o-line was working real hard" said Alexander, who also gave credit to his fullback. "My fullback, Matthew Coore, he opened the holes up real big and we were able to go from there."

On what would turn out to be their last serious threat, a fourth-and-7 pass

from Jupiter Christian QB Kedric Bostic was thrown too high and fell incomplete well within enemy territory early in the fourth quarter.

Treasure Coast kept Bostic at bay for most of the game, holding him to just 61 yards passing and one touchdown. Bostic entered the contest with 11 TD passes and nearly 1,100 passing yards through seven games.

On back-to-back Titans possessions, Treasure Coast would get scores to put the game out of reach.

Alexander would add his second rushing touchdown with a romp from 15 yards out, while Copeland would get his passing touchdown of the evening after Devin Ferguson turned a short completion toward the sideline into a 22-yard touchdown reception thanks to elusive running and several broken tackles.

Titans' head coach Irvin Jones was pleased with his team's performance.

"These kids, they could've folded the tent" said Jones. "A lot of calls weren't going our way but man, they kept

fighting."

As for the rest of the season, Jones understands there is still work left to be done but is happy with where his team stands.

"We're just now starting to figure out who can play where and who can't play

TREASURE COAST — The air was full of sadness and anticipation at the Citrus Bowl last Friday evening.

The hope was that the Vero Beach High School Indians could stay undefeated, playing in the stadium named after a legendary coach who recently died.

The St. Lucie West Centennial High School Eagles wanted their first district title since 2002.

After a moving ceremony for Mr. Livings, who died Oct. 17, the Indians and Eagles began their battle.

"We knew this game was going to be ugly," said Centennial head coach Ron Parker.

The Indians got first possession in the game, scoring a touchdown at 10:42 in the first quarter by Charlie Miller and an extra point by Karson Dietrich.

This brought the score to

7-0, a score that was challenged in the next drive by Jonathan Poma, who rushed 35 times during the game, more than any Eagles offensive player. At 5:17 in the first quarter, Poma with Devin Clements, tied the score at 7-7.

"I got hit a lot in this game but it was amazing," said Poma. "Every time I got the ball I got at least 5 yards."

For the last score before the half, quarterback Nick Madden took matters into his own hands, running in a touchdown, bringing the score to 14-7 with a good extra point by Dietrich.

The end of the half was in favor of the Indians but the Eagles were still hot on their heels.

With 3:05 left in the third quarter, the Eagles returned to tie up the game with a 40-yard run by Edwin Thomas and tying game at 14-14.

The Indians fought hard to come back after that touchdown, but the Eagles

defense kept the Indians drives short, shutting down their offense and allowing the Eagles to dominate the field.

The Indians defense stopped the Eagles from putting another touchdown on the board.

At 5:30 left in the fourth quarter, the Eagles, on fourth down, put Clements into position for a successful field goal attempt. The Eagles pulled ahead, 17-14.

Tempers flared toward the end of the game, and the Indians were flagged for unsportsmanlike conduct.

"This game was hard fought on both sides," said Parker. "This game wasn't about us against the world, it was about us doing our best."

Madden struggled to get the ball down into the in end zone, and did not connect for the rest of the game.

The final score 17-14, made the Eagles (5-2, 2-0) District 8-8A championship

winners. "I really have to hand it to Centennial. They caught better than us, ran better than us, they just did better," said Indians' head coach Lenny Jankowski. "They were great defensively and we didn't play as well. We need to improve in all places."

The Eagles play Fort Pierce Central High School (5-1) at Lawnwood Stadium. The Indians play Wellington High School at home.

"We have to go and get better, that's what good teams do," said Parker.

The Indians took the game hard, their first loss of the season, but for some it was just another challenge ahead of them.

"This is just motivation," said Charles Ivory, an Indian's defensive back. "This just makes me want to go out and push my teammates to go out and win every game we have left."

unlike any other in Florida. Nicklaus' masterpiece, built in the midst of a rolling, open meadow, is a tribute to the Old Course at St. Andrews. Complete with double greens, stone bridges and walls, gorse mounds, burns, and those pesky pot bunkers, some as deep as 12 feet, it is a creation in the spirit of the Scottish original.

Very little water comes into play on the course, but it may be found. The interior of the course offers few trees, creating huge fairways and plenty of room to miss your target and still have a shot. Of course your wayward shots may find one of those deep pot bunkers, or another fairway, or even a mound covered in gorse. You may even face a putt from more than 100 feet if you find the wrong side of a double green.

Like all links courses, The New Course's defense is not in its length. Without trees, but with devilish bunkers and swirling winds, the course is well defended. Mother Nature decides just how difficult your round

will be.

In addition to a few long par-fours, there is one that tempts you to drive the green and yet another where trying such foolishness will likely introduce you to the burn.

Three of the four par-fives tempt you to get home in two with a hybrid or long iron. However, that decision could be made for you should you find a bunker off the tee. Doing so can turn any hole into a par-six or worse. I quickly learned to take my medicine and make certain that I hit my next shot out of the bunker, even if it meant going backwards.

At the New Course, you need not be afraid of spraying the ball a bit. I actually hit the same fairway from three different tees during one round. The greens are huge with subtle undulations and are kept at a respectable speed. In true Scottish links fashion, you can choose many ways to play any shot. There are times when you should bump and run the ball, and others where you'll need to hit it high and land it softly. You'll use every club and every shot in your bag here.

As you step to the 18th tee to conclude your round, you

can picture in your mind's eye the final and first holes surrounded by bleachers filled with fans. You can feel the spirit of the game and all those who have played on a links course before. The New Course doesn't have the history of the Old Course, but it has the "feel." Best of all, it's just a short drive from the house.

After our round we dropped by The Club, a restaurant and sports bar right in the clubhouse, for a great meal, while catching up on the day's sports news and enjoying a cold beverage. For more elegant

dining, the Nine 18 offers fine steaks, seafood and more.

When it came time to relax, our villa had the most comfortable beds, a big television and even a fireplace. My kids were thrilled when the temperature dropped enough to make a fire and enjoy its relaxing warmth.
