## City paves way for VGTI sale

**Unanimous Council decision clears way for city to sell Florida Center for Bio Sciences in September**

PORT ST. LUCIE -- The five members of the City Council voted unanimously Aug. 27 to approve the second reading of the ordinance enabling them to put another piece of failed economic development behind them once and for all.

For the most part, Council members have expressed an urgency to rid themselves of the heavy millstone of the Florida Center for Bio Sciences from around the city's neck. The \$65 million structure formerly housing the Vaccine & Gene Therapy Institute has sat empty since October of 2015 and costs the city about \$1.5 million annually in upkeep.

The city's special counsel overseeing the disposition of the property, former assistant city attorney Azlina Goldstein Siegel, provided a brief history of the property before explaining that the ordinance at hand would fulfill a city charter requirement and facilitate the sale later this month.

"It's the second reading of the adoption of the ordinance that will authorize the city to actually convey title to the VGTI property to an intended purchaser," she said. "It is really the mechanism that's needed in order for the city to proceed entering into a binding purchase and sale agreement to convey title to the real estate. In addition, I wanted to bring to your attention that a finalized purchase and sale agreement has been negotiated with RER Ventures LLC that will be coming to you Sept. 10 based on discussions."

After Ms. Goldstein Siegel's presentation, both Mayor Gregory Oravec and

## County primary results

**Incumbents, familiar faces ruled during the 2018 primary election**

St. Lucie County -- The 2018 primary election held Aug. 28 settled the political uncertainty of some candidates who faced no opponents in November while setting the stage for more intense political rivalries this coming fall.

The St. Lucie County School Board took center stage in this year's primary, with three of its five members successfully routing off challengers last month for their respective seats during the non-partisan race.

District 1 incumbent Debbie Johnson Hawley easily defeated Steven Allen, winning 60.5 percent, or 28,695, of the total 47,414 cast, while her opponent earned 39.4 percent. Campaign finance



reports show theirs to be the most expensive School Board race this year: Ms. Hawley spent nearly \$14,000 to secure her third term on the Board, while Mr. Allen of Port St. Lucie spent more than \$16,000 on his bid for the seat.

In the District 3 School Board race, incumbent Donna Mills also secured her third term on the Board, easily defeating challenger Mark Young by

capturing 66.9 percent, or 32,078 of the total 47,950 votes cast. For his part, unincorporated county resident Mark Young received 15,872 votes. Finance records show that Ms. Mills spent more to retain her seat -- slightly more than half of the \$16,000 she raised -- to the \$3,000 raised by her opponent.

The closest School Board race by far, though, was the heated competition for the District 5 seat between two ordained ministers. Incumbent Troy Ingersoll, the pastor of Westside Baptist Church, narrowly fended off a challenge by Fort Pierce resident and ordained interfaith minister and educator Felicia Bruce, winning his fourth term on the Board by a 2.8 point lead over his challenger. For her part, Ms. Bruce received 48.5 percent -- or 23,266 votes -- of the 47,885 votes cast for the seat. Both candidates raised more than \$16,000 and spent more than \$13,000 each according to campaign finance records.

Also on the county stage, District 2 County Commissioner Anthony Louis Bonna easily won over the broad field of challengers in the Republic primary race, capturing 36.1 percent of the 20,984 votes cast. His closest rival and four-year member of the St. Lucie County Planning & Zoning Board Bobby Hopkins won 27.3 percent, or 5,737 votes. The rest were divided among Port St. Lucie residents Dan Kurek and James Taylor, who won 2,257 and 5,401 votes, respectively. Campaign records show the two top vote-getters raised the most money, with Commissioner Bonna reporting \$38,000 to Mr. Hopkins' \$28,000. Mr. Bonna, who Gov. Rick Scott appointed to the seat vacated by former commissioner Tod Mowery amid a marital infidelity scandal, will now face Port St. Lucie Democrat Sean Mitchell this Nov. 6.

For the County Court Judge Group 1 seat, the majority of voters chose incumbent and sitting Judge Daryl "Ike" Isenhower over Fort Pierce challenger Fran Ross. Judge Isenhower received 57.5 percent of the 48,427 cast, while Ms. Ross won 20,562 votes. Campaign reports show both contributed significantly to the donations raised for their respective campaigns. Judge Isenhower added \$40,000 of his own funds to the more than \$30,000 he received in donations, while Ms. Ross chipped in \$10,000 of her own money to match the more than \$10,000 she received.

For the City of Fort Pierce District 1 City Commission seat, the majority of voters chose experience over younger challengers and easily reelected incumbent Rufus "Butch" Alexander III, 69, to his fifth term on the Board. Commissioner Alexander garnered 59.9 percent, or 1,377 of the total 2,299 votes cast, while Henry Duhart, 24, and Alonza Watkins, 39, earned 735 and 187 votes, respectively. Both of the opponents chose a door-to-door campaign strategy, basing much of their campaign rhetoric on being able to reach the younger generations but raising very little money compared to the incumbent according to campaign records. Mr. Duhart reported just over \$2,000 in contributions, and Watkins reported \$50, while Commissioner Alexander raised \$7,000.

In the race for the District 3 seat of the Port St. Lucie City Council, incumbent and Vice-Mayor Shannon Martin captured 64.6 percent of the 28,372 votes cast, with the rest divided between the dual challenge of Fritz Alexandre and Andriana Chris Riera, who received 5,149 and 4,887 votes, respectively. Vice-Mayor Martin also out-financed

the competition with her superior campaign war chest of \$30,000, while Mr. Alexandre reported \$2,000 and Ms. Riera, \$2,200.

On the state level, District 83 Rep. Gayle Harrell claimed a significant victory in her bid for the last two years of retiring Sen. Joe Negron's District 25 seat over challenger Belinda Keiser, winning 57 percent of the 23,240 votes cast in the Republican primary. Campaign records show Ms. Keiser spent more than \$500,000 to earn 9,897 votes to the 13,343 cast for Rep. Harrell, who spent about \$232,000. Ms. Harrell carried more name recognition in the battle, along with the endorsement of Senate President Ken Pruitt and Sen. Negron himself. For her part, Ms. Keiser had the backing of the Florida Chamber of Commerce, Florida's Police Benevolent Association and the National Rifle Association. Rep. Harrell will now face Democratic opponent and Stuart physician Dr. Rob Levy in the general election this fall.

For the District 83 seat Ms. Harrell is vacating, Palm City environmental engineer and businessman Toby Overdorf won over Port St. Lucie victim's right advocate and small business owner Sasha Dadan, with 57 percent of the 9,668 votes cast to Ms. Dadan's 42 percent in the Republican primary race. Mr. Overdorf will now go up against Jensen Beach teacher and Democratic candidate Matt Theobald for the seat in the general election this November.

In the Democratic primary race for the District 55 seat in the State House, the majority of voters chose Sebring realtor Audrey Ascitutto over teacher Nicholas Mrozowski, who received 180 and 81 votes, respectively. Campaign finance records show Ms. Ascitutto raised more than \$9,000, while Mr. Mrozowski raised less than \$3,000. Ms. Ascitutto will now challenge incumbent Rep. Cary Pigman for the seat on Nov. 6.

The field was crowded in the Democratic primary race for the State House District 84 seat, with four candidates vying for the position being vacated by retiring state Rep. Larry Lee. Fort Pierce resident Delores Hogan Johnson won 44.4 percent of the 13,140 votes cast, followed by a close second from Kim Johnson with 37.7 percent of the vote. The remaining 17.8 percent was divided between Robert Joseph (1,253 votes) and Forest Blanton (1,089 votes). Ms. Hogan Johnson will now face Port St. Lucie Republican Mark Gotz for the seat this fall, who won the Republican primary for the same seat over Theresa "Teri" Pinney. Mr. Gotz captured 51.1 percent, or 5,792 of the 11,320 votes cast, while Ms. Pinney won 48.8 percent.

In the race for circuit judge seat of the 19th Judicial Circuit Group, nonpartisan candidates Robert "Bob" Meadows and Nirlaine Smartt will now advance to the Nov. 6 general election, having won 35.2 and 42.5 percent, respectively, of the 47,979 votes cast for the seat, which also included candidate Louis Larsen who captured 22.2 percent of the vote.

In this primary's Democratic race for the District 18 seat of the U.S. House of Representatives, Palm Beach Gardens attorney Lauren Baer had a landslide victory over former U.S. Navy JAG officer and corporate attorney Pam Keith, also of Palm Beach Gardens, with 64.3 percent of the 10,663 votes cast to Ms. Keith's 35.6 percent. Ms. Baer will now face the winner of the Republican primary for the same seat, incumbent Rep. Brian Mast, who won 80 percent of the 24,555 votes. The other 20 percent was divided between Stuart resident Mark Freeman and Dave Cummings of Port St. Lucie, who won 2,492 and 2,387 votes, respectively.

ON CARS  
EARL STEWART

Back in 1968 when I first went into the retail car business with my father, I can remember asking him, “What is holdback?” I was learning the business and had been studying the invoices on new Pontiacs that General Motors sent us when they shipped a new car that we had ordered. We had to pay the invoice immediately when it was issued, sometimes even before the car arrived at our dealership. In most cases, it was our bank or GMAC who paid GM and we borrowed the money from them to pay for the car.

My father’s answer to my question about holdback was that it was an increase in the amount of the invoice that we paid General Motors which was not really part of the price of the car. It was just an extra amount

added to the real price of the car and included in the invoice. At that time, it was 2% of the MSRP (manufacturer’s suggested retail), so if a new Pontiac Bonneville had an MSRP of \$10,000 and a true cost of \$9,000, the factory invoice would be \$9,200. I asked my father, “When do we get the \$200 back?” He said, “At the end of the year.” I asked him if they paid us interest on our money and I can remember him laughing loudly and saying no.

Of course my next question was why they do that. He told me that the reason they gave him was to “help dealers sell their cars for more money” so that they didn’t go broke. He said that because they didn’t get their holdback money for such a long period of time, they began to think of their

invoice as being the actual cost of the car. General Motors felt that many dealers were such poor businessmen that they might sell their cars so cheaply that they would go out of business. Now, because GM was kind enough to hold back hundreds of thousands of dollars of the dealers’ money (and pay them no interest on it) but return the money to them once a year, they could help the dealers make a bigger profit and maintain adequate working capital.

At that time, I thought this was the biggest bunch of boloney I had ever heard and I was sure that this was a scheme by the manufacturers to keep a free float of millions of dollars of their dealers’ money under the guise of helping the dealers. I asked my father why the dealers didn’t strongly object to this and he said that most dealers actually “liked” the idea of holdback. When I heard that, I thought that maybe GM and the manufacturers were right about the dealers not being smart enough to sell their cars for a reasonable profit.

It took me a few more years in the business before I understood what was really going on with holdback. It was a “no brainer” as to why the manufacturers liked it, but at last I understood its attraction to us dealers. Because we had to pay an extra amount over the true price of the car and not see that money for up to a year, we began to think of the invoice as the true price, even though it was inflated by hundreds of dollars. Because all manufacturers added holdback to all dealers’ invoices, the net effect was to raise the price

of all cars to all buyers by the amount of this holdback. I know this is a dirty word, but it’s price fixing on the grandest scale. This might have been something that Henry Ford, Alfred Sloan, and Walter Chrysler concocted while playing golf at Bloomfield Hills Country Club outside of Detroit.

Another neat thing about holdback for us dealers is being able to tell our customers that we are only charging them “X dollars” over invoice; or we can tell them that we will sell them this car at invoice with no profit to us at all! (There’s a sucker born every minute) Dealers often have “invoice sales” with copies of the invoice pasted on the car windows. Who doesn’t believe that an invoice is the cost of the car? The truth is in the semantic skullduggery ...” Mr. Customer, I solemnly swear to you that this is the exact price that I paid the factory for this car. In fact, here’s a copy of the invoice.” That’s what the dealer “paid” the factory all right, but it’s not what he paid the factory after he got his holdback check in the mail...or, let’s call a spade a spade, his KICK-BACK.

You might be thinking, so we’re talking about \$200 more or less on a \$10,000 car. Who cares? Don’t forget, that was almost 50 years ago. Holdbacks have expanded considerably and now instead of several hundred dollars we’re talking several thousand. Also, dealers no longer must wait a year to get their hold back money back. Now they get it back monthly. Manufacturers even changed the names



Vice-Mayor Shannon Martin asked City Council Manager Russ Blackburn if any additional offers on the property had come in since the first reading of the ordinance held Aug. 13. During both that meeting and the meeting held June 27 when the Council authorized Mr. Blackburn to draw up a purchase and sale agreement for the \$14.5 million offer from RER Ventures, Hometown News owner Vernon Smith had accused the Council of rushing the decision and underselling the property by relying on a 2016 appraisal on the building. Ms. Martin took it one step further during the recent meeting, wanting to know if the second \$14.5 million offer by RTT Molecular DX had been updated to change any of its terms. The majority of the Council had viewed that offer as financially unstable although it offered a \$11.5 million lump sum initially, significantly larger than the RER Ventures' \$2.9

million down payment.

"Mr. Manager, have you received any other offers or any proof of funds with regard to any other offers as of this time right now?" she asked.

"No Vice-Mayor," he responded.

Ms. Martin has consistently urged her fellow Council members to proceed with the current offer on the table due to the financial burden the high-tech building has continually placed on the city's budget. Mr. Smith insisted the city would still owe too much money on the building after the sale, making it a poor business decision. The city is currently paying the annual debt payment on \$57 million in non-taxable bonds for the structure.

"I'm still begging you to be a little slow," he said Aug. 13. "I think the market's changing, and I'd just ask you to do that. I certainly know that you're probably not going to get all the money that you have outstanding on the bonds, and that certainly is a concern of everybody."

Port St. Lucie Communications Manager

Sarah Prohaska explained after that meeting that the city would reissue the current bonds it's holding on the building as taxable ones once it discounts the \$2.9 million down payment and \$4.1 million the city is kicking in from its reserve funds.

"If the City accepts the RER Ventures Inc. offer of \$14.5 million, we will issue approximately \$52 million in taxable bonds," she wrote in an email. "In addition the city intends to use the interest payments and the final payment to reduce further the outstanding bonds of approximately \$13.3 million. The net present value savings on this refunding will be approximately \$4.6 million."

Vice-Mayor Martin asked Mr. Blackburn to describe how much money the building was draining from the city's coffers on a monthly basis.

"Mr. Manager, can you also remind me and the public of how much money we're spending a month on this building in operating costs?" she asked.

"About \$130,000 or so a month," he

replied.

Councilman John Carvelli also asked the city manager about the amount of taxes Port St. Lucie had to pay on the building when it came out of the court-appointed receivership slightly more than a year ago. Mr. Blackburn's answer confirmed his suspicions.

"So we had to absorb \$400,000 in taxes when we took ownership because we didn't have the exemptions put in place in January so we absorbed that amount as well," he said. "We're working to basically fix this problem at this point."

No member of the public spoke during the recent hearing, although Mayor Oravec noticed the newspaper publisher in the audience and called him out.

"Mr. Smith are you just going to sit out there tonight?" he asked.

"I wish I had some buyers but I don't," he responded from a distance.

"Well you have until Sept. 10," Mayor Oravec said, referring to the next meeting when the City Council would make its final determination on the RER Ventures offer.

The objective of the Florida Master Naturalist Program is to create a citizenry knowledgeable about natural systems and how they work, thereby creating environmental stewards within local communities. The course also prepares participants to share their knowledge with others and help them feel a greater connection to the land. The program is highly recommended for nature center staff and volunteers, eco-tour providers, fishing guides, scout leaders and educators.

of these monies they hold back. These are innocuous names so that, if you see them on the invoice, you will have no suspicion... names like floorplan assistance, advertising, PDI, Administrative or DAP. Of course, there are also cash rebates to dealers that don't even show on the invoice. I estimate the average car invoice today includes \$3,000 to \$4,000 in hidden holdbacks to the dealer. Holdbacks are also applied to factory

or distributor accessories like "protection packages" [wax, undercoat, window etch, roadside assistance], floor mats, window tint, etc. The bottom line is that you should never rely on the dealer's factory invoice to determine the price you are willing to pay for a car. And be especially suspicious when the dealer quotes you a price of "X dollars over invoice" or shows you the invoice. You've heard the old joke, "How can you tell when a politician is lying?" Answer: When his lips are moving. "How can you tell when a car dealer is lying?" Answer: When he shows you the invoice.

# Tablets make it seem as if we're living in the future

I mean carrying tools around is always part of a “road warrior’s” lifestyle; at least this thing had wheels! No, the big problem was how long the damn thing took to turn on.

You see with my Day Runner, all I had to do is open the book to today’s date and start writing. It even had a little plastic book mark thingy so I could open it to today’s date without looking. The only issue I had with the Day Runner is every couple of months I would run out of calendar pages and have to go get new ones.

With my laptop it was downright embarrassing! You think it takes computers a long time to boot up today? You wouldn’t believe how long the wait was 20 years ago.

I can clearly remember trying to get into my machine to look someone’s information up and waiting and waiting and waiting. And don’t get me started on the battery life!

I learned a valuable lesson in those days and it was to always keep my power cable handy and be aware of the location of the nearest outlet. (I even had a \$30 inverter in my car so I could plug in when I needed to). The battery would always look like it had enough power but, if I wasn’t near an outlet then Murphy’s law would kick in and the battery would die right when I was in the middle of some important task.

No, the whole “using my laptop instead of a Day Runner” experiment was a dismal failure. I found myself carrying my Day Runner and lugging my laptop behind me.

## Corleone by Chef Luca : A visit to a real cucina Italiana

PORT ST. LUCIE -- If you're like my wife and I, you prefer a tranquil spot to dine where you don't have to try and talk over the blaring TV monitors. So, walking into the new establishment known as Corleone by Chef Luca proved to be a delightful experience where we almost felt as if we'd been invited into an Italian family's home to dine (and indeed we heard them pounding the veal at one point in the kitchen).

I almost immediately developed a kinship with Chef and owner Luca Fontanarosa, who like myself, made a significant mid-life career change that produced a 180-degree shift in his lifestyle and location. While I gave up a successful business many years ago to become a journalist and subsequently a school teacher as well, Mr. Fontanarosa swapped his suit and tie as a chief information officer with Blue Cross in Pennsylvania for a chef hat and apron in Syracuse. Thus began his journey into his new passion where working is no longer a chore.

"One day I just went home and told my wife I was quitting my job to become a chef," he said. "I went back to college and got a double degree in hotel and restaurant management and the culinary arts from Penn State in 2014."

His wife Stefania who occasionally helps

out in the restaurant and makes the best tiramisu this side of her native Treviso -- the Italian city that gave birth to the famous dessert -- took the news sitting down of course.

"I thought he was crazy," she said.

Even so, she ultimately supported his decision and following him to upstate New York where Mr. Fontanarosa cut his culinary teeth at the Syracuse Convention Center as well as in a bistro downtown. After

their daughter's family relocated to Florida, the chef saw an opportunity to create his own niche in the rapidly growing city of Port St. Lucie, opening Corleone by Chef Luca on July 16. Snowbirds away for the summer might do a double-take as it would seem there was just a name change on the former Italian restaurant in the same spot, but there's definitely a new-found passion in the cucina (kitchen) not seen in this

# Sept. 7 is International Manatee Day

TREASURE COAST — International Manatee Day is Sept. 7. The date was first observed in Mexico, where the species has been protected since 1921.

Save the Manatee Club is using the event to educate about all the dangers facing Florida manatees, from boat collisions to red tide.

“In addition to Save the Manatee Club’s manatee conservation efforts in the U.S., we also assist scientists and educators in the Wider Caribbean, South America, and West Africa with their conservation efforts,” said Patrick Rose, Save the Manatee Club’s Executive Director and Aquatic Biologist. “Funds contributed to the Club’s International Rescue Fund assist our growing global partners.”

“With record watercraft mortality this year along with more than 100 manatees already lost to red tide, we want to ensure that manatees are receiving the help they so desperately require,” said Mr. Rose. “As in past desperate situations, help is needed from the general public and boaters to assist in reporting sick and injured manatees.”

“As of August 18, there have been 554 manatee mortalities in Florida, which exceeds the total for all of 2017, and 81 of those mortalities were from watercraft collisions,” added Janice Nearing, the club’s Director of Public Relations.

Slowing down in manatee habitat and obeying posted speed regulations is the best

way to reduce the risk of manatee injury and death.

Save the Manatee Club distributes free yellow banners that say “Please Slow, Manatees Below.” Boaters hold the banners up high when they spot a manatee to warn other boaters that manatees are present.

“There must be a way for Floridians to enjoy boating and recreating on our waterways without hurting or killing manatees,” said Dr. Katie Tripp, Save the Manatee’s Director of Science and Conservation. “No one spends more time on Florida’s waters or better understands the factors that lead to manatee strikes.”

Dr. Tripp thinks that boaters themselves, by becoming more proactive for manatees, can head off the need for increased law enforcement. “Anyone who’s getting behind the wheel or handlebars of a vessel needs to be responsible and know what they’re doing.”

“We don’t know anyone who intentionally aims to injure manatees during a day of boating,” said Dr. Tripp. “But terrible injuries and suffering occur nonetheless, and we can do better.”

Red tide is also a deadly danger to manatees.

“Martin County adopted the term ‘Lost Summer’ in 2013 to describe the disaster caused by discharges from Lake Okeechobee into coastal communities,” said Dr. Tripp. “Posted signs warned against swimming, fishing, or otherwise coming in contact with the water that was covered in ‘guacamole-thick’ algae. The moniker was unfortunately applicable again in 2016 and now

again in 2018.”

“On Florida’s west coast, red tide has killed nearly 1,100 manatees over the last 23 years, and because blooms now occur so frequently, they are no longer characterized as unusual mortality events,” said Dr. Tripp. “The organism that causes red tide is naturally-occurring. The input of human-generated pollution into our coastal waters, which causes that organism to bloom and wreak havoc, is far from natural. The same is true for the various algae blooms that have occurred in the Indian River Lagoon in recent years, resulting in the deaths of manatees, dolphins, fish, and sea birds, and the loss of tens of thousands of acres of vitally-important seagrass.”

Red tide acts as a neurotoxin, giving manatees seizures that can result in drowning. Sick, injured, or orphaned manatees should be reported to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation, because they can often be



saved if rescued in time.

“If manatees exposed to red tide can be moved out of the affected area by trained biologists and stabilized at a critical care facility, their prognosis is often very good,” said Dr. Tripp.

To report such animals or to alert the FWC to any other hazardous conditions or incidents affecting marine wildlife, call 1-888-404-FWCC (3992). small strip-mall previously.

“Everything I cook, I cook to order,” Chef Fontanarosa said. “Nothing is frozen except the meatballs, and I make them fresh every two or three days. I use only organic produce, grass-fed meats and free-range, chicken free of antibiotics.”

As soon as Gloria and I entered the charming spot, we noticed almost everyone was drinking wine.

“Of course we have wine,” quipped Ms. Fontanarosa. “We’re Italian.”

Gloria and I instantly hit it off with the chef’s better half and thoroughly enjoyed her sense of humor and charming Italian accent. It was she that told us we simply couldn’t end our meal without trying her homemade tiramisu (more on that later).

We began our dining experience with an old tried-and-true favorite of mine and something entirely new for both of us. For an aperitivo (appetizer), we ordered Arancini al Piatto, rice balls stuffed with Bolognese sauce and mozzarella cheese. Although I’d savored this delicacy before, I don’t think I’d had them topped with this particularly yummy sauce of ground beef, bacon, mushrooms, carrots, celery, tomatoes, and Italian seasoning (okay I admit vegetarians would have to slide on this dish or ask for a different topping, but we’ll talk veggie options later). For those new to this dish, rice balls are tender morsels that are then passed through the broiler to give them a unique fusion of textures: soft on the inside and deliciously crunchy on the outside.

We then ordered a soup that I don’t recall ever seeing on an Italian menu before, Tor-

tellini en Brodo (Meat filled tortellini in chicken broth), although this simple English description does nothing for the explosion of flavor we both experienced for the first time. In fact the word broth does no justice to the savory liquid in which the huge number of tortellini were floating. Towards the end of the soup, I even began noticing yummy bits of melted parmesan cheese. When I asked Ms. Fontanarosa about it because it didn’t appear in the list of ingredients on the menu, she looked at me sort of shocked.

“Of course it has parmesan cheese,” she exclaimed. “We’re Italian -- we put parmesan on everything!”

While we were still savoring the soup, she came by carrying a platter of Crostini Caprese (Garlic crostini with Prosciutto di Parma, Mozzarella, Tomatoes and Basil) so beautiful I had to ask what they were.

“Crostini Caprese,” she responded. “The Flower of Italy.”

Truly they resembled little flowers colored like the Italian flag and have the same basic ingredients of a caprese salad, minus the prosciutto but juxtaposing the textures of the soft mozzarella and juicy tomatoes with the crunch of the crostini. You’ll notice here the menu items for the most part are written in Italian, so if your grasp of the language is like mine -- either very weak or non-existent -- not to worry. All the descriptions that follow on the ample but not overwhelming list of entrees are in English. Chef Luca also creates a few daily specials that he lists on a whiteboard outside near the entrance.

For our entrees, I ordered Risotto ai Frutti di Mare (mussels, shrimp, scallops and clams) while Gloria opted for the Scaloppine di Pollo al Limone (a chicken breast topped

with a lemon-butter sauce), which was really lemony! My main dish option (an Italian take on Cajun jambalaya) showed you can take the boy out of Louisiana but you can’t take the Louisiana out of the boy. Chef Fontanarosa emphasized diners will need patience for this particular dish as he never prepares anything ahead of time other than his meatballs.

“I make my risotto fresh to order,” he said. “It takes 25 minutes.”

While my plate piled high with shellfish failed to disappoint, I did have questions about the name of Gloria’s dish as it reminded me of a similar dish at other restaurants known as chicken fransese.

“That’s not an Italian name, and I don’t know where it came from,” he grimaced. “This is the real name of the dish.”

Chef Fontanarosa also laughed when he told us how many people come in asking if he makes Alfredo sauce.

“It only exists in one place in Italy [Rome],” he said, where it was created by a man for his pregnant wife who was tired of eating simple fettuccini and pasta with no sauce due to her weak stomach. “And I don’t make it.”

Anybody who likes history, should Google the history of Alfredo sauce, since most Italians relate it to not being well enough to eat anything with more flavor, and only Americans ask for it in Italy. While it may seem like most Italians, like Greeks, are carnivores (remember the Big, Fat Greek Wedding movie), vegetarians will definitely find some suitable choices here as well. While I didn’t try the Caponata Alla Catanese, the sound of fried eggplant, caramelized onions, carrots and celery and pine nuts in a sweet and sour tomato confit tantalized my taste buds. The Risotto al Funghi Porcini also

sounds yummy (Arborio Risotto with Porcini Mushrooms) and the Gnocchi al Pesto and the Penne all’ Arrabbiata (penne pasta with tomato sauce and red chili peppers) are other potential vegetarian options.

For those new to Tiramisu, it’s a good thing after such a meal that the Savoiardi layers (ladyfingers) soaked in espresso and filled with Ms. Fontanarosa’s homemade Mascarpone cream are so light and airy. It’s almost like eating a mousse but with much more flavor and texture. She insists, however, that she adds a special, essential touch.

“I make the Tiramisu with love and passion,” she explained. “If you don’t make it with love and passion, it doesn’t work.”

If you like this Italian dessert as much as we do, you’ll be glad to know something: Hers works.



# Get a grip on your game

In golf, the only connection that we have with our equipment comes through the grip. We depend on the grips on our clubs to control the club and to transmit to the ball where it is to go. Grips also send back to our brains information about how well we struck the ball.

A few years ago I played with what had to be the worst set of rental clubs ever. Only a couple of clubs out of the 14 in the bag had a grip that wasn't as hard as a rock and as slippery as a fish. It made for a strange round to say the least.

I constantly was afraid the club would fly out of my hands. To prevent that, I gripped the club too tightly, putting far too much tension into my arms and body. I eventually, just tried to hit different shots with the two or three clubs that had a grip slightly younger than I.

Today's grip market is huge. The number of choices we golfers have to perfect our connection with our tools is amazing. Grips come in more colors and combinations than Crayola can put in a box, as well as different weights and different sizes.

We didn't always have all these choices.

In fact, there are few written records regarding the history of golf grips. We can assume that the shepherds who invented the game, likely did not turn their crooks upside down and wrap the bottom with anything before hitting stones around the hillsides of Scotland.

It is unclear when grip first appeared on clubs, but we do know that a wool listing was used in the 18th century. In to the 19th century, this would be covered with

sheepskin before leather and then rubber would take over in the 20th century.

Some golfers would apply chalk to their grips to help them stay dry. Additionally, olive oil, wax, pitch and varnish would be used to help golfers better grip their clubs.

While grips last much longer today than they did back when they were simple wool listings or leather, they should still be replaced about every 40 rounds. More often if your hands sweat a lot or they are constructed of a material that starts to break down. Your grips should feel tacky in your hand and should never get to the point where they are hard or cracked. It's always good to replace your entire set, keeping the same "feel" with every club in your bag.

Many people do not know the importance of getting the proper grip size or being fit for your grip. When custom fitting your clubs for shaft, shaft flex, loft, lie and more, it is equally important to have the right grip size. There are many grip sizes available and you can even alter the thickness of the grip during the installation process.

A grip that is too small may cause overactive hands, while one that is too large

may prevent you from releasing the club through impact. One good measure is that when gripping your club, your middle and ring finger should just about touch the palm pad of your hand.

Between grip changes, you should wash your grips frequently. Anyone who has watched Fred Couples play, will notice that he not only plays without a glove, but wipes his grips clean with a moist towel before every shot.

As you play, sweat and oils from your hands are transferred onto your grips. If you fail to clean them, your grips will become slippery and difficult to hold onto during your swing. Using just a towel dipped in a soapy water solution will do the trick. Dawn dish soap is great for cutting through the hand oil and sweat that accumulate on your grips.

In 1925 golf's original grip manufactured was established by Elver Lamkin out of his garage in suburban Chicago. His hand-crafted, premium leather grips quickly became the rage among golfers looking for a consistent, comfortable, and tacky grip.

In the 1960s, under the direction of Elvers son Rovbert Lamkin, the company began manufacturing leather and rubber hybrid grips. Eventually the company would move on to synthetic rubber, providing a more affordable grip.

There is only one thing more affordable than an affordable grip, and that would happen to be a "free" grip.


