The German submarine U. 53 which after paying a brief visit to Newport sunk several British and neutral steamers off the American coast, is reported to have reached a German port in safety.

Six American lives were lost in the sinking of the British s eamer Marina, the American Consul at Queens town is in formed, according to an official despatch. Of the 51 Americans reported rescued at leaset two were injured. It is reported that the Marina was attacked by two submarines and that she sank within ten minutes. A heavy sea was running and the number of lives lost is in doubt.
