Hello all:

In February, the CREC ILLiad account was deactivated. I have been informed that the Library Circulation Department will no longer issue or support institutional library accounts. As a result, I won't be able to make general requests on behalf of everyone here at the Center. All of the outstanding requests were transferred to my personal account and from everything I've checked so far, no requests were lost. There are a couple of available alternatives. You can place the requests yourself or I can place requests for you using your ILLiad account. Either way, if you

want to make requests through ILL, the first step is to create an ILLiad account. The ILL department folks have a Web page with information about "First Time User Registration" at http://illiad.uflib.ufl.edu/illiad/firsttime.html. In your ILLiad account, our campus P.O. Box is POB 111563, and please be sure to make "Status: Distance IFAS" and "Department: Distance IFAS-Lake Alfred." When placing ILL requests for articles or books, be sure to provide all of the required information including full-titles – no abbreviations. The more information you can provide, the faster the ILL folks will be able to provide your requested material. If the information is not complete, the request may be returned to you. Some of the citations include some cryptic journal title abbreviations, so if you need help deciphering anything, please let me know and I can verify the title(s) for you. If you have any problems with you requests, please let me know as soon as possible so I can help resolve them quickly. If you are interested in learning more about ILLiad, please let me know and I will be glad to help you create your account and/or place your requests.


