The meeting, one of Councilman Henderson's regularly scheduled town hall meetings, allowed residents a forum to express concerns or ask questions about their ward or the city.

New RV Rules for Gulfport

RV owners will have to navigate new rules about recreational vehicles. Ordinance 2010-08 amends Chapter 21 of the city's code of ordinances. Recreational vehicles must have a permit if someone will reside in the vehicle. People now may stay in an RV on private property for no more than five days up to two times a year.

To have someone stay in a recreational vehicle on private property in Gulfport, they must apply for a free permit.

The city opted not to require a permit for unoccupied recreational vehicles. Changes include a limit of one recreational vehicle per land parcel (generally one per address). Furthermore, the city exempted Class B recreational vehicles.

If a landowner does not have enough property to park the recreational vehicle as far back from right of ways as city law dictates, he may store the RV at the marina or the municipal marina. The city will charge a fee.

Henderson, from front page Resident Phil Reed said that he had attended an Economic Development Advisory Council (EDAC) meeting and that EDAC seemed to have no contact with So49, the 49th Street South business association.

"I think they're working towards a goal," Mr. Reed said, but added that the group seemed to lack focus or even an awareness that So49 existed.

Mr. Reed and his wife, Jeri, also told Councilman Henderson that they felt the misconception that the 49th Street area had inordinate crime needed correction. The Reeds, who run a nursing school on 49th Street, reported that on the whole they felt safe in the district.

"I don't have the perception that there's a lot of crime here," Mr. Reed

said, referencing a comment made at the EDAC meeting. Mr. Reed said that the EDAC said they didn't want to make any recommendations until they "could clean up 49th Street."

No representatives from EDAC attended the town hall meeting to address these claims.

Councilman Henderson has regularly scheduled town hall meetings; check the Gabber for the next scheduled meeting.

Bay Scallop Season to Open Early

Gov. Charlie Crist has announced that the recreational harvest season for bay scallops in Florida will open 12 days earlier than usual this year. The governor is taking this action to help relieve possible economic hardships on Florida fishing communities that may occur due to the BP Deepwater Horizon oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

"Several people and businesses in Northwest Florida and Big Bend coastal regions asked us to please open the popular bay scallop season early this year," Gov. Crist said. "These folks depend upon the influx of visitors that come to their communities to scallop each summer, and they need a boost right now to help them recover from the mistaken perception that fishing throughout Florida has been affected by the oil spill, which is not the case."

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has issued an order which states that the recreational bay scallop harvest season in specified areas in Florida shall open on June 19 instead of July 1 this year. The order also says that all other provisions governing the harvest of bay scallops shall remain in effect for the duration of the order.

The FWC order, which can be viewed online at MyFWC.com/OilSpill, takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on June 19 and will expire at 12:01 a.m. on July 1.

The regular recreational bay scallop harvesting season in Florida occurs from July 1 through September 10 each year.

Bay Area Legal Services provides free legal assistance to low-income people residing in its service area. There is no charge for legal services. The type of legal assistance Bay Area provides depends on the type of legal problem facing the client. Most clients receive information about what they can do to resolve their legal problem on their own.

Some clients receive written materials which provide more detailed information on common legal problems and solutions. Other clients are referred to an agency or service that specializes in resolving certain legal matters. Some clients receive representation by Bay Area staff attorneys or private attorneys who donate their legal services.

Keep Pinellas Beautiful Needs Volunteers

Although there is no imminent threat of oil from the Deepwater Horizon spill making landfall in Pinellas County, volunteers are needed to register for a pre-oil beach cleanup, if necessary. There is no date or time for the event; it will be scheduled only if a notification is received from the U.S. Coast Guard that oil residue threatens the Pinellas County shoreline. To register for the Special Beach Cleanup, visit www.pinvol.org. Those who register will be notified by e-mail if oil landfall is expected within 48 hours. Removing litter ahead of time would speed oil cleanup by reducing the amount of potentially contaminated material, remediation time, cost, and human exposure to harmful materials. Only trained contractors, not volunteers, would be utilized to clean up oil impacted shorelines or any activities involving direct contact with oil.

Keep Pinellas Beautiful (local anti-litter organization) is coordinating the countywide event in cooperation with the U.S. Coast Guard and local beach managers. According to Bill Sanders, executive director of Keep Pinellas Beautiful, "Our goal is to clean up every inch of the Pinellas County coastline, including the outer islands." Each area will have a designated site captain to organize the volunteers and ensure that no harm comes to nesting birds or turtles. Anyone interested in fighting litter and safeguarding local beaches is encouraged to register, including

individuals, families, or community groups. At least 2,000 volunteers are needed. For more information, call Keep Pinellas Beautiful at 727-533-0402.



Q: Does Gulfport have an ordinance that prohibits panhandling on its streets and corners and rights of ways? – submitted by Margarete Tober via Facebook

A: Gulfport Police Chief Rob Vincent says that the city ordinance prohibiting loitering also covers panhandling.

“One of the elements of loitering is: ‘accosts, approaches, or solicits from other persons in any public place or in any place open to the public for the purpose of begging, soliciting alms, or soliciting for immoral purposes,’” Chief Vincent explained.

The courts support this ordinance; they recently convicted a man who police arrested after he repeatedly approached people in the area of Gulfport Boulevard and 49th Street and asked for money. Although police warned him to stop and gave him a ticket, he continued to beg, getting himself a trip to jail, Vincent said.

Gulfport police officers prefer not take that route, though, Chief Vincent said.

“Our officers are usually able to resolve problems with warnings and appropriate social service referrals,” the Chief explained.

Is Panhandling the Problem?

Is the City of St. Petersburg's ordinance against panhandling also restrictive of free speech and a violation of the First Amendment? It is, I say, and thereby side with that leader of liberalism, the St. Pete Times, which is taking the City to court over the issue.

That a conservative would support a liberal might seem strange except that real conservatives are real liberals. They espouse more freedom and that means less government intrusion. The bigger the government, the smaller and less powerful the individual. The Bill of Rights is about individual freedoms and freedom from government. Government is the boogeyman.

This local fight is not about big government, but it is about individuals. Some argue that the St. Pete Times is not interested in free speech, but interested in the money that comes from the 7,000 copies sold on the street corners every Sunday (some are sold by the homeless). They might be interested in the money, but more likely in the numbers of papers sold which boosts its circulation and hopefully, for them, their advertising. Newspapers cost money to print (the paper alone might be worth a buck) and it costs money to distribute and sell. So, money's not the issue.

The issue is that citizens now don't have the right to distribute ideas on the streets, paid for or otherwise. You can't distribute a flier under the ordinance, or solicit money for any purpose or cause on public streets. The Times is now being picketed. Those citizens, I think, have the right to do that. They also have the right to have signs, and to speak, and, of course, distribute (or sell) literature about the issue. Is this in violation of the ordinance?

The problem is that the City has equated selling goods and distributing information with panhandling. And, I believe, there is a significant difference between panhandling and

raising money for a charity. Of course, one could argue that panhandling is collecting for charity, just a tad more selfish. The legal argument is made that any exemption will invalidate the entire ordinance. I'm not sure about that, but the arguments will undoubtedly center around that issue.

Of course, the real problem is not just panhandling. Panhandling is just an activity that's been identified with the homeless. The problem is curtailing the intrusive, often rude, often crude and disgusting behavior of the homeless. They do, in fact, urinate and defecate on the streets. They do, in fact, trash areas they attempt to live in. Some harass other citizens. It is quite all right to curtail and punish such behavior as that, and it is within the City's purview to keep its streets and sidewalks clean and safe for pedestrians and motorists.

However, I question whether government can control what people say. Asking for money, for whatever cause, is speech. What about citizens who tell the panhandlers to "bug off" or even curse at them, or hand a religious pamphlet to them? Or, to reverse the situation, what about people who get hired to distribute or sell on the street?

It may be unsafe to step into the street, or even to stand on the island dividers to sell or solicit or distribute, but can selling, soliciting, or distributing be prohibited everywhere? I'm all for curtailing the intrusive activities of the so-called homeless. Some are lazy, some are crazy, some are addicts scamming the system, and some are simply professional scammers. That St. Pete is known as a "mean" city doesn't bother me a bit. I'm all for helping individuals, but not for creating welfare for a class of people.

The ordinance may slow-down panhandling, but it will not solve the overall problems with the panhandlers. However, realistically, it will curtail legal and proper activities that are good for the community.

Dear Editor: As a member of the Get Rescued...In Gulfport team, I find it impossible not to thank the generous citizens of Gulfport for their act of kindness last Saturday evening. Last week I received two detailed emails concerning a dog hoarding and puppy mill raid out of Polk County. This raid encompassed over 250 starving and sick dogs. Saturday morning I wrote on Facebook how disgusted I was of hearing, over and over again, about these animal abuse situations. To make matters worse, we discovered that due to budget cuts, Polk County Animal Control had dog food to feed for only one more day. This meant that by Monday, many dogs that had been surrendered would have been destroyed to make room for the confiscated dogs.

Although all the major pet stores were approached, none of them were willing to give even one bag of food. Volunteers walked up and down Beach Blvd., visited several local restaurants asking anyone who would listen for help, just one dollar. Sunday morning our \$1,000 turned into 2,000 - two thousand pounds of dog food! We were on our way to Polk County. Decisions, Decisions, Decisions

This week, let's take a look at how legal transfers of control and decision-making work.

Guardianship

This is a legal process in which the court places an individual or agency in control of someone else's affairs. Since establishing a guardianship requires action by the Court system, it can be expensive and cumbersome. In addition, guardianship reduces an individual's legal rights to those of a minor.

Conservatorship

This is a type of guardianship that applies only to a person's property and not his or her personal matters. As such, its scope is less restrictive, and the individual involved retains many of his or her legal rights.

Durable Power of Attorney

By establishing a power of attorney, you authorize someone else to act in your behalf. You can give very limited powers, such as authorizing someone to sell property for you, or very broad powers, such as paying

bills, making investment decisions, or making all decisions for you.

A durable power of attorney remains in force even if the person who establishes it becomes incompetent. While a power of attorney is generally established to ensure that your affairs will be handled for you, it must be durable to be effective in the event of your incapacity. Any power of attorney, including a durable one, becomes null and void when either the person granting it or the person to whom it is granted dies.

You should be sure to specify exactly what functions are to be covered by the durable power of attorney. For example, medical decisions, investment choices and property care can be named specifically.

Of course, a durable power of attorney should be given only to someone you trust implicitly to act in your best interest. You should consult an attorney for the specific requirement of a durable power of attorney.






United States Senator Barbara Mikulski of Maryland attended as guest speaker. The U.S. Navy Ceremonial Band provided musical support.

Lynda Shehan and Gulfport Feed Shelter Dogs



Lynda Shehan cuddles Lucy, her Chihuahua. Lucy passed away almost four years ago. Lynda adopts older dogs that most cast aside. "The seem to know that you're helping them, and they always seem to appreciate the attention," Lynda says. "They just know."

Gulfport resident Lynda Shehan is known around town for her rescue of mistreated and abandoned animals. Each year her charity event Get Rescued fills the boulevard with hopeful eyes and wagging tails that pull at your heartstrings and make you wish for a bigger back yard. Lynda has been in the rescue business for over 25 years and is affiliated with a staggering 60 charities involving animals and rescue. So it should come as no surprise that when the recent news about two Polk County rescue missions suddenly overwhelmed the Polk Animal Control, Lynda didn't blink, she didn't pass GO. She blogged on her Facebook.

"I was sitting there writing my daily observation on my Facebook page and I made a comment about how absolutely awful it must be for those poor dogs. Animal Control has seized dogs from a puppy mill as well as a hoarding situation. Over 270 dogs were brought into their shelter, in addition to the

many they already had from strays and drop-offs. The total was close to 800; they were running out of food and would be forced to euthanize some of the drop-off dogs just to make room."

Someone made a comment to her online query; why not try and raise some money for the food those starving dogs so desperately needed and deliver it to Polk County themselves. The course was set and she was on the phone in a heartbeat, calling her friends.

Bill DeBusk is a very good friend of Lynda's; he's also the manager of Pet Angel, a pet loss memorial service. Bill is compassionate by nature and he was also moved to do something for these dogs that nobody wanted. His company donated \$100. His partner Jim Galardy works at Pincha-Penny pool services; they donated \$500 and with that, Lynda was on a roll.

Lynda is a mobilizer; give her a cause that involves dogs or animals in general and she turns into a whirlwind. The telephone is her office; she is the one who knows someone who knows someone else that

can help. She thought at first to call the local pet stores. She thought the bigger chains like PetSmart would surely want to help.

"They declined," she says with a bit of irony in her voice. "Petco gave us some samples, but samples won't feed 800 animals, no matter how far you stretch them."

Of course, after all those big corporate pet stores refused to help, local business owner Mary O'Malley at Reef Dog stepped up to the plate and donated 200 pounds of dog food. She and Lynda are close friends.

Lynda put the word out; Janice from Domain set a jar out and collected over \$140. Lynda and her friends walked up and down the boulevard, asking for donations from people on the street.

"We decided then and there to just go out on the street and collect some money for these dogs so we could buy them food," Lynda said.

Lynda got up at the launch party for Gulfport Magazine and pleaded on the mic for people to open their hearts and their pocketbooks for the cause.

"We raised over \$1000 that night alone, just walking the boulevard, stopping at the bars and asking at the Casino. It was incredible to see when two little boys walked up, each with a dollar in their hands. I mean, can you imagine what a dollar means to a child? And to have them give it to a cause? I said, "you gotta be kidding me," she said laughing. "It was so awesome! The people of Gulfport are the real heroes in this one; they just stepped up and helped as a community. They showed such compassion and kindness. I am so grateful to everyone who donated."

Meanwhile, Bill and Jim had persuaded Petfood Warehouse to give them a discount on giant bags of dog food. They were able to buy 2000 pounds of dog food for about \$1000. Whatever other donations came in afterwards,

Petfood Warehouse agreed to match the money with food. It was a win-win.

Next job was to get it to Polk County. Bill and Jim have a large RV. With the help of several friends, including Elaine Barclay and Mary O'Malley, the team loaded that puppy up.

"You should have seen it," Lynda laughs. "All you could see was bags and bags of dog food..."

Lynda's soft spot is older dogs and she has several. She said she likes to adopt the older ones; they're the ones that are mostly drop-offs, meaning that the family person knows they won't be back. In all probability, older dogs are put to sleep because most deem them unadoptable. But Lynda doesn't see them that way. That's how she found her Lucy, a half-blind little Chihuahua she adopted. Lucy was 10 years old; Lynda had her almost four more years. She still keeps pictures of her on her camera.

"I like to just scroll through the pictures sometimes," she says wistfully. "It makes it almost seem like she's still here."

She looks away for a moment and it is here that you realize what an extraordinary woman she is. She uses her vast knowledge and resources to help pair dogs with people, charities with causes. Hers is a kind and compassionate soul that can still weep for an old, blind, much loved dog. She doesn't take much credit; she graciously spreads the love around.

"I feel so blessed that I have the contacts so that when people ask me, I can make things happen," she says. "I'm not a hero; I'm just someone who can help make things happen."

But to some hungry, neglected and abused puppy dogs in Polk County, she's an angel.

The Dogs of Clam Bayou

“Come down to Clam Bayou,” Kayak Kurt said, and I groaned. What now? A protest against the restoration? A protest favoring the restoration? A councilperson kayaking at low tide? Did the police find a body under the mud? With my morning coffee as of yet unfinished, I lacked the strength for another Clam Bayou story.

As Kurt spoke, I reconsidered. Animal Services was en route to collect a wild dog trapped in a humane cage. Trapping a wild dog’s good, right?

When I arrived at the Bayou, the Animal Services officer explained the difference between wild (like wolves)

and feral (like these dogs.) The dogs of Clam Bayou started their lives as cuddly little fluffballs in somebody’s home, but once they got too large or too much to handle, their owners found them guilty of “not cute enough anymore” and left the pups to fend for themselves, either abandoning them at Clam Bayou or abandoning them, period. Somehow, these not-cute-enough almost-grown dogs found each other and banded together and formed a pack to survive.

While the city’s enjoyed its share of debate about Clam Bayou’s mud, no one’s found Alpo in the tidal flats yet, so the pack must hunt for food. The dogs of Clam Bayou subsist on marsh hare, baby birds, and other wildlife.

People can’t approach these dogs, and the dogs of Clam Bayou will defend the pack, which rumor now says includes puppies, if they feel threatened.

As I write this, Calypso is curled up on the chair next to me, her cold leathery nose huffing dachshund breath on my knee. She just turned three, and on her birthday she had a steak and a bone and some ice cream. Her biggest worry is conning me out of part of my dinner.

Those dogs in Clam Bayou? They want the same things as Calypso: a warm bed, protection from predators, and some of whatever the rest of their pack is eating. The difference that Calypso sleeps on a Tempurpedic mattress dressed in 600-thread count sheets and they sleep in a den of dead leaves and sandspurs in a park that the city closes early because of drug deals and “romantic” interludes.

Calypso’s best friend is Scuppers, a Maine Coon who dwarfs her with his fur. When Calypso and I go for a walk, Scuppers waits in the window and cries for her. When he hears my key in the lock, he runs to the door and brushes up against Calypso, which, as we all know, is cat for “you belong to me.”

When people found the trapped dog Monday morning, another feral dog outside the cage wouldn’t leave her side. Even after Animal Services got

the trapped dog in the van, this dog lingered.

Calypso eats fresh meat every morning; the dogs of Clam Bayou subsist on whatever they can catch without getting caught themselves. Calypso is protected by humans and she charms those she meets by fluttering her tiny eyelashes, cocking her ridiculously furry ears, and rolling over on her back and pawing at the air. The world, to Calypso, is just one great big adventure.

The dogs of Clam Bayou rely on each other. The rest of the world has not treated them well. The people who enforce laws to protect Calypso and us humans will also be the ones to kill the dogs of Clam Bayou if they trap them. The dogs of Clam Bayou view the world as a mean, scary, and dangerous place.

I can imagine what happened: the female, hungry, possibly from nursing, wandered into the trap for the food and got caught. Her pack mate probably tried to find a way to tunnel under the cage or get her out, and when he could not, he waited by her side, even as the sun rose and every instinct he had told him to hide himself. Even as humans showed up, he waited. Only when they approached did he retreat and watch from a distance as the officer dragged his packmate to the back of the van.

This captured dog will never roll over on her back to paw at the air to impress a human with her powers of cute. She will not lick a face, not without a lot of patience and love. With so many strays waiting for homes, no agency has space or staff to work with these “unadoptable” dogs. Their loyalty to one another means nothing; that humans created this situation is insignificant. These dogs will die five days after they wander into a trap needing food.

I don’t advocate allowing the dogs of Clam Bayou to remain in the park, but every time I close my eyes, I picture that dog, waiting by his trapped companion. I see him staring at the Animal Services van as I speak with the officer. And I may have imagined it, but somewhere in his dark, sad eyes, I saw a little bit of Calypso in there.



New Hours at Pinellas County Animal Services

Pinellas County Animal Services is implementing new hours of operation. Effective June 1, Animal Services will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, with the adoption center closing at 4:30 p.m. On Saturday, it is open for lost and found pets only, from 9 a.m. to noon. The adoption center is closed

on Saturdays. The facility is also closed on Sundays and holidays.

The public is invited to view the animals up for adoption during shelter hours, no appointment is necessary. The outside animal drop-off is open on days that the shelter is closed to the public.

The change in hours is being implemented to adjust to changes in the department. The retirement of Dr. Welch Agnew is effective June 1. Dr. Agnew has served the people and

pets of Pinellas County for the last 12 years and was the director of Animal Services for the last two years. Dr. Dwayne Taylor will assume his role as director and will oversee the mission of Animal Services but will be the only veterinarian on staff.

A Greener View

Prepare for the Spring Landscape by Observing Your Yard Now

Summer is here. It is time to analyze how your landscape looked this spring. By doing the analysis now, you can plan for a better spring landscape next year. Walk through your landscape and ask questions like these: How did your bulbs bloom? Did you have weed problems? Did your lawn come out of the winter in good shape? Take more pictures as you do your analysis and add them to your photo album. Use note cards to make notes and do small drawings of the things you like and dislike.

As your spring-blooming perennials stop blooming, it is a good time to remove the seed heads that developed. This is the process called "dead heading." Removing the seeds before they can mature is beneficial to the plant, because the plant does not waste energy on unwanted seeds. The plant can use the same energy to develop more stems and make the leaves look fuller. More leaves means more food production, which means more food will be stored in the roots -- for better survival over the winter and for a healthier and prettier plant next spring. Sometimes, deadheaded plants produce more flowers later in the season, giving the plant a double season of bloom.

Removing the seeds may seem like too much work, but besides being beneficial to the plant, it is often beneficial to you, because many perennials freely seed themselves around the garden. It is easier to cut off some seed heads that are sticking up in the air than it is to pull a bunch of plants sprouting up at ground level in all the wrong places. Cutting off the heads and leaving some of the stalk is safer for the plant than pulling the heads off many perennials, since some perennials might be pulled out of the ground with a sharp tug on the seed stalk.

Q: My iris plants seemed to be wilted all of last summer and I had a hard time keeping them watered. This spring, they have mostly died out and there are only a few flower stems and leaf fans coming up. What was the cause of this problem?

A: Iris borers are the caterpillars of a night-flying moth. The first symptom you will see is ragged holes along the edge of the leaf or small pinholes in the middle of the leaf. Then the tiny caterpillars work their way into the center of the leaf where they tunnel down into the roots. The weakened leaf will hang over as if it is wilted, when it really has an insect problem. The roots of the iris can then get bacterial diseases that kill the plant. As the root system dies, the leaves look wilted again, but this time it is a combination of fewer roots and the diseases.

The few stems that you have left are in for a lot of trouble this season, because you have new caterpillars and fewer leaves to attack them. Look for small holes in iris leaves. Run your fingers down both sides of the leaf toward the ground. You can smash the tiny caterpillar within the leaf if you do this early enough. Later in the summer, the top of the leaf will turn brown and start wilting.

Follow that leaf down and see if it has any soft mushy areas near the base. If a light tug pulls the leaf off, look inside it by holding it up to the light or opening it up. If the caterpillar is inside, just step on it. If it is not, check down at the leaf base to see if it has made it into the roots. Pry it out with a stick and step on it. If you cannot find the larvae, you may want to apply a borer killer insecticide.

The borer spends the winter as an egg on old iris leaves and plant debris at the base of iris stalks. This fall, you will need to remove all the dead leaves and do a good job of cleaning up around the iris plants.


