St. Pete Councilman Blames Gulfportians for Crime on 49th Street

In a response to a resident's concerns that the city of St. Petersburg too quickly pointed fingers at Gulfport police officers in a recent pursuit, St. Petersburg councilman Wengay Newton called Gulfport residents "customers" in the drug trade on 49th Street.

"Speaking of crime along 49th Street and Child's Park Neighborhood," Vice Chair Newton wrote, "Gulfportians are customers not victims[...] Supply and demand."

"He's likely referring to the position that law enforcement should target demand rather than supply. It's probably true that the demand comes from somewhere other than that neighborhood, but to say that it comes from Gulfport? I haven't seen any evidence of that," Gulfport Chief of Police Rob Vincent said.

Last week's pursuit of a stolen vehicle, which started when Gulfport Officer Jessie Kellington tried to stop a Toyota and the Toyota's driver opted to flee, ended when the alleged car thief

Gulfport Applies For Floating Docks Grant

If Gulfport wins a federal grant, it will replace the five fixed docks in front of the Casino with 10 floating docks.

The docks, which Harbormaster Denis Frain says should cost no more than \$288,000, will offer boaters a friendlier option than the current fixed docks.

"They'll be the same level as the boat itself, so no matter what tide you're experiencing, the docks will be the same level as the boat. If you approach the fixed docks at a low tide, you have to crawl up a ladder to get to the dock," Harbormaster Frain explained.

The Boating Infrastructure Grant will pay up to 75% of the cost. The terms of the city's submerged land lease with the state doesn't allow the city to make money at the dock, so boaters will not pay to use the docks.

"It's focus is to bring revenue to the downtown," Harbormaster Frain said.

State Law Forces City's Hand in Gun Laws

A 2011 state law about guns means that Gulfport has to loosen its gun laws. The city cannot have laws that restrict people more than the state statutes, so Gulfport council changed its law Tuesday night.

People can now fire a gun in their yard as long as they don't fire it over an occupied structure and the ordinance never leaves the property. The gunfire also cannot hit another person or structure.

Council voted to change the laws to comply with state law, but state law compelled the council to do so to

the art walks.

"Everything has to be hand made now," Pach, who's chairing the newly-formed events committee, said. That means that anything people buy at a Gulfport Art Walk – with a few exceptions, namely a handful of long-term vendors – will be made by local artists.

The Saturday Art Walk – which takes place on the third Saturday of every month – will have buskers. The strolling performers will vary month to month.

Pach, who maintains a studio in the Alley of the Arts just north of the Industrial Arts Center, says the Merchant's Association recognized the need to upgrade the events.

"[We wanted to] shift them at the core. We'd become a little lax. We were the first Art Walk in the region; now everybody's got them. We're trying to step it up.

It's not just one thing, it's a combination of things," he said. He thinks, come November, people will notice the change.

"We want people to say, 'My god, have you been to the Art Walk lately? It's really an Art Walk!'" he said.





crashed into a bus in the Jordan Park neighborhood. The alleged felon led Gulfport police out of Gulfport, onto the interstate, and into St. Petersburg. Speeds reached 90 miles per hour, according to Gulfport Police.

St. Petersburg's mayor, Bill Foster, criticized the Gulfport police, saying St. Petersburg would not have pursued the vehicle, according to an article in the daily paper. Mr. Foster, an attorney specializing in real estate, probate and corporate law,

lists no law enforcement experience on his resume.

Mr. Newton, the council's vice chair, also lists no law enforcement expertise on his resume, although he said in his e-mail to the Gulfport resident he was "totally against any law enforcement chasing stolen cars."

The driver and alleged car thief – who, as of publication, still resided in the Pinellas County jail – Derrick Mims has a record peppered with prior offenses, including one arrest for fleeing and eluding the St. Petersburg Police Department in

2010. In addition, the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office arrested Mims for fleeing and eluding deputies in 2011.

Public records show Mims' first arrest six weeks after his 19th birthday, for domestic battery and false imprisonment. Two days officers arrested Mims again, this time for violating an injunction to protect his domestic violence victim. Two months after that, St. Petersburg officers arrested him again for domestic battery, violating an injunction related to his domestic battery, and fleeing and eluding police officers. Mims' last brush with the law in 2011 was when officers arrested him again in July, for violating his probation and the injunction relating to his domestic violence charges. In each arrest, Mims listed a St. Petersburg address.

In 2011, Pinellas Sheriff's deputies arrested him for a mixed bag of crimes, including but not limited to, possession of crack cocaine, criminal mischief, failure to appear for his scheduled court date, battery, fleeing and eluding police, and trespassing. St. Petersburg police also arrested him in 2011 for similar offenses. Sheriff's deputies arrested Mims on the morning of his 21st birthday for possession of crack cocaine; the day after Christmas that same year, St. Petersburg police arrested him for having crack cocaine as well. They also charged him with battery and aggravated assault on a law enforcement officer. Throughout 2011, arrest records show Mims lived in St. Petersburg.

Last week Gulfport police arrested Mims after he led them on a high speed chase that ended when he crashed a stolen car in St. Petersburg's Jordan Park. He had a child in the car. Officers charged him with child neglect, fleeing and eluding an officer at high speeds, grand theft auto, and driving with a suspended license.

Mims listed a St. Petersburg address.

"If they stop crossing 49th street to support the drug and criminal trade," Vice Chair Newt also said in his e-mail, "then WE wouldn't have this problem."







Representatives from FEMA, the state's Emergency Management

team, Access Florida, the U.S. Small Business Administration, American Red Cross, Area Agency on Aging, Workforce Pinellas and the Crisis Center of Tampa Bay will be on hand to provide assistance. No appointment is necessary, but claimants are urged to preregister their claims with FEMA by calling the FEMA toll-free number at 800-621-FEMA (3362)/TTY 800-462-7585. Telephone lines are answered from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. seven days a week.

Claimants may also register online at www.disasterassistance.gov or via smart phone or tablet using the

FEMA app or by going to m.fema.gov.

"B.B. guns are not firearms." – Gulfport Chief of Police Rob Vincent, about the city's adopting state firearm laws.

"As unhappy as I am to have to do this, [...] they [the state] have done a good job of tying our hands." – Vice Mayor Sam Henderson, seconding a firearm motion.

"Excellent second." – Councilwoman Jennifer Salmon, to the vice mayor. She voted in favor of the change with an "OK" and Councilwoman Barbara Banno added a "Reluctantly, yes" to the vote.

"Courts have decided we can't criminalize something that is essential to being homeless." – Gulfport Police Chief Rob Vincent, about the city's laws regarding sleeping in public.

"I compliment our police department and our chief. I did speak with Mayor Foster. He apologized..." – Mayor Mike Yakes, about the St. Petersburg Mayor's criticism of the Gulfport Police Department's handling of a pursuit that started in Gulfport and ended in Jordan Park.

"I think Officer McLaughlin get a lot of the credit [for the work along 49th Street]." – Councilwoman Jennifer Salmon

"It may be easy to look at things on the replay... but you guys have to make decisions on the spot, and that's something I absolutely trust y'all to do." – Vice Mayor Sam Henderson, to the Gulfport Chief of Police

Somethin' on my mind

A Chance to Start Over

"Just got back from Alaska," I wrote a friend of mine last week. "If you want independence and an annual check from an oil company, this is the place. A bit chilly and not much sunshine for eight months but an opportunity to do your thing - that is if you don't need or care about electricity and paved roads."

I could have added that there are lots of bears and moose, wolves and caribou, and gobs of fish in the rivers and lakes (no snakes) and majestic scenery to go with with your out-of-doors activities. I might have added that parts of Alaska appear to be tiny bits of land surrounded by water and swamps, kind of a northern Everglade. He wrote back, not unexpectedly, that he preferred the Ritz-Carlton and could have added "the warmth and sunshine of Florida". However, Alaska is not for those seeking physical comfort, but it does have an intriguing lifestyle.

As tourists (we went as a part of a 40 person Tauck company group) you go for the scenery, the hard-luck, rough time history, the animals and to see the native tribes. Alaska is the biggest of states, the number one of number one; it extends the furthest east and west; it takes more than a couple of Texas's to fill it; it has the tallest mountain - Mt. McKinley, known there as the native name Denali; it has the coldest of the cold, 80 below zero; and on and on.

However, what piqued my interest was the way people lived and their integration and phase-in with nature and their surroundings. It's nothing you step back from. You may not surrender, but you must adapt. It is our last frontier and there's plenty of room, depending upon the kind of room you like. As big as it is there are only an estimated (2012) 730,000 people and nearly 300,000 live in the relative comfort of Anchorage. The capital, Juneau, accessible only by water or air, or as another friend wrote, "birth canal", has 31,000 people. Fairbanks to the north of Anchorage is a biggie with nearly

100,000 people. The rest are scattered over vast and sometimes frozen over landscape. Huge mountain ranges dominate from the southern coastal regions to Pt. Barrow in the tip top north.

"You can't get there more here" has meaning in Alaska. There are relatively few roads: a nice road from Anchorage to Fairbanks and from Anchorage down into the Kenai peninsula and the trans American-Canada roadway from the lower 48. There's also the Denali highway, a 100 mile dirt, washboard road, that takes you from Denali National Park into the Copper River Valley and a paved road from there down to Valdez and Whittier. The Denali road closes in the winter.

Most people fly - big plane, little plane, land plane, float plane or float/land plane, helicopter, or boat - big boat, little boat. One in 16 have a pilot's license. There are lakes to land on and some people have cut landing strips in the wayback although I'm still wondering how they got "wayback" when you can't, from the air, spot any roads reaching their houses.

We met a family of homesteaders from 1962, a farm family up from South Dakota, who hacked their way into the wilderness near a town called Talkeena whose main paved road today is the one running through it to Fairbanks. A few roads run hither and to the more rural areas to feed the schools and the commerce. These people came, settled, without just about everything, built a house over the years, raised the four children they brought with them and now live in a moderately modern and electricity supplied home. One child, no longer a child, of course, still lives without amenities, and makes part of a living giving tours of her mother's home. One of her sons is at a university. Another lives so far back that he walks three miles to his car. He says he likes it that way.

For younger kids walking either to school or to the bus stop carry guns in case of meeting a moose

or bear. Moose, by the way, are far more dangerous than bear. Moose challenge cars and even houses. They're like the mountains. They dominate. Anyway, the kids aren't allowed to bring the guns into the schools any longer so they have to stash them in the bushes so they can pick them up on the way back home.

Summers - four months - are for getting ready for winter. Lots of sunshine - up to 18 hours a day in midsummer - allows you to work lots of hours so you can hoard up on food and supplies for the winter, or get enough money to escape to the lower 48. Not much loafing. Tourism is big and tourists are really appreciated. The well mixed and integrated society makes do with what they got and when they can get it.

When fishing and hunting seasons pass there is mountain climbing (not an amateur thing), and mushing. That's dogsledding which, in addition to being a competitive sport, is another way to travel. Big deal is the Iditerod, the dog/sled race from Anchorage to Nome, 800 miles of brutal travel in brutal weather. However, mushing is a general sport and it's for men and women. Women, by the way, are real women. That means using a chain saw, an axe, a gun and fishing rod, and being able to fix vehicles or whatever has to be fixed or worked. While we were there I read a story about two Washington, D.C. female reporters who were heading to Alaska because men are scarce in D.C. I never finished the story, but I doubt that cute and sophisticated worked too well in Alaska.

Anyway, more on that next week. In the meantime, when you hear Sarah Palin hyperventilate about Alaska and its rough and ready ways, know that it is not an exaggeration. By the way, Alaska's population is growing at about 10,000 a year. As I wrote, there's plenty of room.

Healthcare Deficiencies

Dear Editor: Re: *Hard Candy* "The Uninsured Breast" (July 12, 2012 edition). I'm all for socialized medicine. You know, like veterans, the elderly, and the super-poor get. I'm in the first two categories and almost in the third, since the market crash, and I can tell you that those systems are not socialized medicine. I wish they were.

I would like to make two comments about your conclusions:

The exact same troubles you had are rife in the medical community associated with those veterans' hospitals and Medicare and Medicaid and we have similar restrictions and have to pay a lot. Well, it makes sense because for the most part, it is the same medical community that these organizations work with. Paying a lot: that is why the elderly, poor, and veterans go without the care they need. Part of the problem, of course, is in the limitations of the coverage, as in your coverage but one of the factors that caused most of the runaround you suffered are the lack of coordination among our corporate-based healthcare providers, and as you probably know, we have a corpocracy so it's obvious that the government is controlled by the medical community and not visa-versa.

What we need first is an operational system that works smoothly such as the one in France or the better one in Japan—at the moment I cannot remember the name of the country with the greatest system (there was a television special about it). They work quickly, smoothly, and at low cost because all of them have access to the same records on you (and you do, too, as it should be) via a card—the same as a credit card—that you carry with you. They slide the card and there it appears instantly on their computer screens. While you are in the office or clinic or any other medical facility everything done for you is entered immediately, including doctor's notes and medical test results, including the actual scans, for example. If you needed a note, the provider would not make it your responsibility to run around like a chicken with your head cut off, they would simply enter the request and it would be produced by your provider instantly. The fact is that you wouldn't need a special note because your doctor's request would be there and it would be honored.

What you described has another dimension and cause; it is part of the absurdity common to a point-the-fingers-in-both-directions society that we have become. All of us suffer that, the same manner as you experienced, no matter what medical plan you have or don't have. No one takes responsibility or initiative or makes decisions that are intuitive and obvious any longer because they

aren't allowed to take responsibility. They must follow the circuitous rules! The real decision-makers have shielded themselves with layer upon layer of minions, the most effective being phone centers which are separated completely from the decision-makers and can solve only the most minor issues and then throw up their hands. That is the mandate of the corporation big-wigs.

Well, I could go on and on about these failures of society but I think I have said enough for you to get the idea.

I just want to make one more statement. I know it's stating the obvious but I just...can't...resist: nobody with power in any organization has problems getting anything he needs out of that organization, and from many other organizations, as well. Comparing the plight of the hospital administrator to yours was nothing more than inane drivel! What is horrifying is that they are trained to use those kinds of senseless comments and, unfortunately, they are effective with unsophisticated folks; which happens to include most of our population. What's wrong with that kind of comment, along with the other unhelpful advice and demands, is that they are not focused on solving the problem but on avoiding it.

It's the same scenario when these people are presented with any mistake or any problem occurs; instead of focusing on a solution, everybody's energy is focused on blaming everybody else and passing the buck.

What is a Living Trust?

A Living Trust is created while you are alive. The use of Living Trusts has been effective for maintaining personal privacy and control outside

of the court system. A Living Trust is also very useful for reducing estate taxes and for probate avoidance.

LIVING TRUST BASICS

A separate legal entity is created upon the formation of a Living Trust. This entity can own and hold both real estate and personal property. Every Living Trust has a Settlor or Grantor, a Trustee and Beneficiaries. A basic understanding of what these terms mean is important to understanding how Living Trusts work and how they are different from other types of trusts.

WHO IS THE SETTLOR OF THE TRUST?

The Settlor of a Living Trust establishes the Living Trust and signs the document creating the Living Trust. The Settlor controls what the Living Trust says and does. Living Trusts are revocable, that is, the Settlor can change or cancel a Living Trust at any time in her/his discretion. A Settlor is sometimes also referred to as the Grantor of the Living Trust. When you set up a Living Trust, you are considered to be the Settlor or Grantor.

WHO IS THE TRUSTEE OF THE TRUST?

A Trustee of a Living Trust manages the trust assets. When a Living Trust is created, assets should then be transferred into the trust. Decisions concerning what property to buy, sell, mortgage, transfer or lease are made by a Trustee. The Trustee has a special duty to beneficiaries of a Living Trust which is called a fiduciary duty. What this means is that the Trustee has a legal obligation to perform her/his duties properly and in accordance with the law while keeping the best interests of the beneficiaries in mind. In a Living Trust, you act as your own Trustee as long as you are able to or desire to act in this capacity. Upon your death or disability, a Successor Trustee will take over management of the trust assets.

WHO IS THE BENEFICIARY OF THE TRUST?

A Beneficiary of a Living Trust is someone who benefits from the assets in the trust. Income and earnings are used for the benefit of the Beneficiaries. Trust assets cannot be used for any other purpose. You will initially be the Beneficiary of your Living Trust. Upon your death, the people you have named (normally family members) will become the Beneficiaries.



Hard Candy

The Truth

Wengay Newton, you, sir, are a courageous man, and I commend you heartily. It takes a big man to tell the truth about south St. Petersburg's drug problem, and I'm glad to see that didn't stop you. You responded swiftly and without reserve to a recent plea for help with the cracktown lining St. Petersburg's side of 49th Street. While other politicians dance around the subject and mumble about economics, enforcement and education, you wasted no time letting everyone know you have found the root of the problem: Gulfport.

It's just so... brave... of you, sir. The way you laid the blame for the hollowed out souls who wander Child's, Jordan, Campbell and Bartlett Parks at Gulfport's very feet. Now, I know some might meet that suggestion with outrage, but I will say right now you are clearly being abused for your candor, clear-sightedness, and forward thinking ways.

I'm glad to see you've come to your senses. You see, I've known you for years and I was always a little disappointed in you, the way you blamed the crack dealers and the indifferent neighbors. Thank heavens you realized the folly in that, my good man. I mean, I didn't want to say so at the time, but we all know that Gulfport is nothing more than a flophouse for meth heads and crack addicts. That's why Gulfportians are so displeased with their local government that they elect a new mayor every three years and St. Petersburg has the longest-seated mayor in the state. It's probably why the councilman who represents the area along 49th Street can't field all the complaints he gets about those Gulfportians crossing through his

ward to get to your city's burgeoning drug trade.

You know, Vice Chair, now that I think of it, I can't believe you had the wisdom to stand up like that. It must have been so hard for you to finally point out that Gulfport's own crime statistics are clearly made up, that the real crime problem lies not at the feet of the men who patronize the "beauty shop" on 49th Street (with what your opponents would likely call suspicious regularity) but with the Gulfportians who have repeatedly asked for help dealing with those drug dealers.

I'm glad you said it, Mr. Newton, sir. You are absolutely right: Gulfportians clearly provide the economic engine that drives the drug trade on your city's side of 49th Street. And how clever they are, acting like they're scared to walk on the St. Petersburg side of the street, calling in drug activity when they see it, and demanding Gulfport make St. Petersburg do something about it. Why, if you hadn't pointed out how Gulfportians could simply stop buying the drugs from the dealers in your city, I'd probably still be living under the (clearly false) notion that the crime I see outside our newspaper's very window could simply be stopped by St. Petersburg stepping up its commitment to a drug free city.

I wish I'd had the benefit of your insight before I abandoned my home in Bartlett Park. I'm sure if I'd had you to help me see the light I would have realized the people buying crack from the guy in the duplex down the street from my home were all wearing their super-secret Gulfportian ID badges. Maybe St. Petersburg should think about naming the City of Gulfport in a lawsuit for punitive damages, because you're right, our drug habit in Gulfport really is destroying Child's Park and other fine neighborhoods.

I really am relieved that you spoke up about this whole crime on 49th Street thing. I'll be honest, in my more ignorant days (before you told it like it is), I didn't much care for the man in charge of St. Petersburg's community

enrichment, Goliath Davis. He seemed to be a gatekeeper, a black man who said he stood for what was going to help the black community but instead kept them oppressed and distanced from government. Maybe I was wrong, but I'm glad to see you've stepped in to take care of the poor black communities that – last I heard – were crying for help. I'm glad you're there and instead of talking about getting better role models in front of fatherless black children or helping single moms in Childs Park find safe places for their children to congregate, you're talking about how it's Gulfport's fault. I'm especially grateful you're not supporting any initiatives that would give stiffer penalties to landlords who rent to convicted drug dealers, and I'm so damn happy that you aren't looking at using some of that extra tax money to create programs for young black kids to break the cycle that makes them feel like dealing is the only option.

I thought for so long the problem belonged to St. Petersburg. But now I see the error of my ways: Gulfport is clearly to blame for the poor choices St. Petersburg makes. It's obvious to me, too, that you're going to stand behind your residents. The people on your side of 49th Street need you. I'm so happy you can be there for them.

Just damn thrilled.


