Using a combination of Facebook, pet microchipping and the Gulfport community, a small lost dog found her way home again on October 2.

Several local groups, along with the *Gabber*, posted a notice from HomeAgain, a pet microchip company, that Lily had gone missing. When Tony Fields, who works at the Gulfport Municipal Marina, noticed a dog around the marina, he was able to contain it. Kurt Zuelsdorf, who owns a marina-based

kayak tour company, posted the photo on his Facebook page. Within minutes Facebook users had directed Zuelsdorf to the *Gabber's* post. Fields kept the Chinese Crested safe until her owner arrived to take her home. Within an hour Lily and her owner had been safely reunited.

"Remember how long it used to take to find a lost dog," Zuelsdorf commented, "[with] the procedures of printing and posting paper on telephone poles?"

Library Bid Awarded

Later this year the Gulfport Public Library will get its first renovation in two decades. Gulfport City Council has awarded the bid to manage the construction to Hennessy Construction. Hennessy faced three other bidders: Biltmore, Certus and LEMA.

The renovation, funded in part with a \$180,000 grant from the Pinellas County Library Cooperative, will "make the library adaptable for years to come," according to Director of Library and Information Technology Director David Mather. Renovations include new flooring, an enhanced youth area and other changes to the inside of the library.

Ward Friszolowski, the architect who designed and developed the current library as part of the firm Harvard Jolly and Associates, completed the redesign of the library for the upcoming

Marking History

Two new historic markers will soon grace Gulfport. Two years ago the Historic Preservation Committee – a committee that, by law, exists to create criteria for and nominate properties for historic designation – began working on finding places to designate as historic. At Tuesday night's council meeting, the Community Development Department presented two such markers: one for Osgood Park by the Clam Bayou kayak launch and another that will get installed near Tomlinson Park to commemorate "Rattlesnake Curve" where the northbound trolley made a sharp right turn to the east.



The city designed the new historic markers with a blue to match the street signs, called "Gulfport Blue."

New Program to Aid Visually Impaired

Pasadena Community Church has launched an initiative to aid blind and vision impaired residents in south Pinellas County.

The group will meet at 4:30 p.m. Wednesdays at Pasadena Community Church, 227 70th St. S. in LEC Conf C. All area residents affected by blindness or vision impairment are welcome to attend.

"One of the greatest challenges facing the vision impaired is social

isolation," explains Jack B. Olsen. "The church is offering a solution to a major need."

Olsen, a former Gulfport city councilman, has been legally blind since 2004 due to macular degeneration. He currently serves as a board member of Lighthouse of Pinellas in Largo which serves the blind and vision impaired.

Olsen approached Pasadena Community Church with the idea of providing a place to meet in South Pinellas that would be more easily accessible to people in this area with

vision problems.

Barbara Posey, Director of Congregational Care at the church, has been working with Olsen for several weeks to develop the new service.

"We hope the group will provide emotional and informational support and allow the vision impaired to share their experiences with others facing the same problems," says Posey.

Dealing With Ebola

No, I don't think we should panic about the Ebola virus or its cousin Marburg. I don't think we're going to have a West African-type epidemic here. However, having written that, it doesn't mean we shouldn't be concerned.

As already indicated, the virus is here in Dallas, Texas and maybe elsewhere. It was not chased off by the rhetoric that it is "unlikely to get here." Airplanes and open borders beat rhetoric every day. Plus, we're importing it via Americans who get infected fighting it in Africa. In addition, we're sending over 3,000 soldiers to Liberia to help deal with it and it won't end with that few boots on the ground. Then there's the World Health Organization, too slow to act initially, that is organizing a world-wide effort to keep the epidemic in Western Africa – Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Nigeria – if it hasn't already spread. Europe is expected to be infected, too, of course.

What western and developed countries have going for them is their basic infrastructure, their cleanliness, and their health care

and immunization systems, more highly educated and self-sufficient populace, and more modern culture. These help contain diseases. On the other hand, our freedom of movement, politically and economically, works against that. As I noted, we should be concerned.

Besides, not everything our government says is accurate nor without political overtones. Note that the administration first said it was unlikely it would get here and when it did said that only a handful of people had been exposed. That number is now at 100 which is an estimate at that. The Center for Disease Control is, overall, a good and effective organization. However, personal and collective common sense will serve us all well.

As also noted before, Ebola, Marburg and other viruses such as polio, eradicated in this country, and almost (critical word) world-wide, are only a plane ride away. Our nationwide vaccine program against transmittable diseases have been effective, but the unvaccinated can bring them back to our shores. That is why it is important to get the available vaccines. The current anti-vaccine movement is directly responsible for the sudden upswing

in whooping cough and measles. So, this country is vulnerable to imported diseases.

At the moment there is no vaccine to prevent Ebola. Some are being developed but haven't been tested in humans. One report I read stated that a vaccine is expected in late 2014 or 2015. Expecting it and getting it are two different things. First, it has to be safe, then it has to be distributed and obviously would be distributed first in the areas most affected. Experimental anti-viral drugs are now being used to treat the sick even though not thoroughly tested and some are only somewhat effective. In other words, patients still die.

That's the scenario we face at the moment. It is unlikely that the US will cut off all flights to and from West Africa. It is not politically feasible on the one hand and may not be able to be economically doable on the other. We do have a global economy. Control is all we can rely on and that, too, is tenuous. We don't really control our southern border where, from last report, people from 143 different countries got here before being detained. Most were released for later hearings. Those included Middle Easterners of questionable intentions. None of the illegals come in with medical records that can be validated. Unfortunately, the internal political agenda of the present administration appears to favor an open border.

So, use your common sense. Get vaccinated when you can and with what's available. Use the sanitary tools available. Pay attention to what's going on: read, watch and fetch the news. Unless you're going to be one of the volunteers, don't go to Western Africa. Support efforts to contain the disease. That might be costly, but less expensive than letting it spread.



It gives people living in the state of Florida support as they seek to break their tobacco addiction. 



Check Out the Ink

For almost fifteen years, the Gulfport Police Department has maintained a policy forbidding officers from having exposed tattoos while in uniform. Starting today, that policy will change.

Under the new rules, tattoos are not allowed on the hands, neck or face, and any other exposed tattoos

must be able to fit under a 3-inch by 5-inch card. Of course, inappropriate or offensive tattoos will be prohibited no matter where they are located or how small they are. Any questionable material will be reviewed by a panel that will include at least one Gulfport resident who is not a member of the police department.

Why the change? Why now? Quite simply, the community standards are changing, and we have to keep up. Tattoos are much more common than they were two decades ago,

and their appearance in professional workplaces has become routine. A Tampa Tribune report published last year profiled tattoos among local law enforcement agencies. The report made it clear that the Gulfport policy was just not the norm for this time and location.

Gulfport officers with tattoos on forearms have been concealing them for years with all manner of coverups, which actually look more unprofessional than the tattoo. All the while, their colleagues working in neighboring agencies are working the same job without the additional restrictions. That sort of arrangement certainly does nothing to enhance morale.

We have also turned down plenty other otherwise-qualified candidates simply because they couldn't meet our tattoo standard. I'm talking people with military experience and college education, turned away because of the ink on their arm. The pool of applicants is already small enough; we don't need to help make it smaller.

As the personal appearance policy came up for routine review, I decided to take another look at tattoos, and after a thorough staff review, the new policy will go into effect this week. So, be on the lookout for the new ink out there. My guess is that our diverse community known for its live-and-let-live lifestyle will have no objections to the change. In fact, I'm betting we get some compliments. After all, tattoos are art.

Q: I would like to know if there is a timeline for the containers. I am on 17th Avenue South. No alley. Cans I do have, have seen their better days, but before I get new ones, if containers are in the works I'll make do. – Kevin Moore.

A: The city has a timeline but not every home will get a new container. Out of the city's 4,806 residential sanitation accounts, the public works department has already converted 1,950 to automated pickup, and some more areas of the city will receive the new cans.

"There are seven more areas in the city that can be converted because they have curbside pickup and wider alleys. The area from 11th Avenue South to 7th Avenue South from 49th to 54th Street (that includes [Moore's] address) is in an area that will be automated in the next two years," Public Works Director Don Sopak says. "We are testing different types of new automated garbage trucks on the market to come up with a way to collect in the areas in the city that have alley pickup and narrow alleys with low-hanging trees."





What is a Living Trust?

A Living Trust is created while you are alive. The use of Living Trusts has been effective for maintaining personal privacy and control outside of the court system. A Living Trust is also very useful for reducing estate taxes and for probate avoidance.

LIVING TRUST BASICS

A separate legal entity is created upon the formation of a Living Trust. This entity can own and hold both real estate and personal property. Every Living Trust has a Settlor or Grantor, a Trustee and Beneficiaries. A basic understanding of what these terms mean is important to understanding how Living Trusts work and how they are different from other types of trusts.

WHO IS THE SETTLOR OF THE TRUST?

The Settlor of a Living Trust

establishes the Living Trust and signs the document creating the Living Trust. The Settlor controls what the Living Trust says and does. Living Trusts are revocable, that is, the Settlor can change or cancel a Living Trust at any time in her/his discretion. A Settlor is sometimes also referred to as the Grantor of the Living Trust. When you set up a Living Trust, you are considered to be the Settlor or Grantor.

WHO IS THE TRUSTEE OF THE TRUST?

A Trustee of a Living Trust manages the trust assets. When a Living Trust is created, assets should then be transferred into the trust. Decisions concerning what property to buy, sell, mortgage, transfer or lease are made by a Trustee. The Trustee has a special duty to beneficiaries of a Living Trust which is called a fiduciary duty. What this means is that the Trustee has a legal obligation to perform her/his duties properly and in accordance with the law while keeping the best interests of the beneficiaries in mind. In a Living Trust, you act as your own Trustee as long as you are able to or desire to act in this capacity. Upon your death or disability, a Successor Trustee will take over management of the trust assets.

WHO IS THE BENEFICIARY OF THE TRUST?

A Beneficiary of a Living Trust is someone who benefits from the assets in the trust. Income and earnings are used for the benefit of the Beneficiaries. Trust assets cannot be used for any other purpose. You will initially be the Beneficiary of your Living Trust. Upon your death, the people you have named (normally family members) will become the Beneficiaries.

Wellness Workshop: Stay Healthy and Passionate Like an Italian

Carmella Sebastian, M.D., M.S., Senior Medical Director of Clinical Client Solutions at Florida Blue, spoke on the importance of sex, sleep and sanity for women's wellness on September 24 with My Hope Chest at the Pinellas Park Florida Blue Center.

"Let's talk a little about this deviled egg," said "Dr. Carm," who opened the talk with her secret recipe – adding bacon and chipotle mayo for "a little kick" – for the deviled eggs offered at the event. "Slash the carbohydrates, embrace the protein," she said.

Growing up, Dr. Cam said she tried every possible weight loss plan. Her current passion, however, is the Mediterranean diet, inspired by her old-world Italian mother who employed traditional, simple methods of healthy living, calling "laughter is the best medicine."

The Sex, Sleep and Sanity Wellness Whisperer workshop focused on three essentials of health that every person should know, according to Dr. Carm.

The first among health essentials, she said, is sleep. "Lack of sleep affects every tissue in our body," she said, and may cause, among other issues, weight gain, diabetes, ADHD symptoms, cognitive decline and a weaker immune system.

Sanity, the second essential, is the opposite of stress, said Dr. Carm, adding that stress causes 75 percent of doctor visits. Chronic stress, she said, may result in, among other issues, increased blood pressure, body

toxicity, sleep deprivation and heart disease. Stress may be reduced by focusing on breathing and filtering the stress level, according to Dr. Carm.

Sex, the third essential, is the best exercise, according to Dr. Carm. "Instead of doing the elliptical for 30 minutes, do a striptease and sex and lose the same amount of calories," she said. Sex elevates mood and raises self-esteem, improves skin, calms and facilitates sleep, said Dr. Carm, adding that it may also reduce the risk of breast and prostate cancers.

Sex, Sleep and Sanity: Three Essentials for Women's Wellness was hosted by My Hope Chest and led by Alisa Savoretti, founder of the national organization funding



reconstruction surgery for uninsured survivors of breast cancer. My Hope Chest is dedicated to "helping women that feel disfigured and need reconstruction surgery" and "taking a woman from despair to a beautiful body," said Savoretti. 

All Hail the King

Charlie Williams, Gulfport's inaugural Mullet King, has had a good reign, but it's time for him to hand over his crown, cloak and oar.

Saturday at 11 a.m., the Mullet King will crown a successor to the throne.

When asked who Williams will name, neither Williams nor the board of the Gulfport Historical Society, who host the annual birthday bash, are talking.

"The next king will be crowned at 11 a.m. Saturday," Christine Brown, the Gulfport Historical Society treasurer and the town's vice mayor, said. "That's when everyone gets to know."

While the birthday bash will have its share of fun and games – more than usual, as the Gulfport Historical Society retooled the celebration this year – the fun of it all never loses sight of Gulfport's History, as evidenced by the Mullet King's oar, donated by Williams.

"A poling oar is an essential part of commercial net fishing on the Gulf Coast," Williams says. "You can pole your net around the fish quietly and when your motor breaks down it will get you home."

Once upon a time, net boats lined the coast, and "every

net boat on the coast had one," Williams said. When the Gulfport Historical Society named Williams Mullet King last year, he shortened the oar and gave it to the Society with an engraved plaque.

The inscription reads: "Dedicated to Gulfport's Commercial Fishermen. Past, Present, Future. Donated by Orville Trudell and Capt. Charlie Williams, Mullet King I 2013."



If fishing is part of Gulfport's history, the pole has one of its own.

"It was cut from a cedar tree on Jewfish Key in Sarasota Bay and hand carved by a fisherman from Cortez as a present to Gulfport Captain Rob White, who used it for over 30 years on the FV Wimpy until his death," Williams says. "Then it was given to Orville Trudell, another

old time Gulfporter, who had it on his boat for years and died last month of cancer. When he got sick about two years ago, he gave it to me, so it's not just any pole. It is now 'The Golden Polin' Oar' an integral part of every Mullet King to come."

Saturday, Williams will pass the pole to the new king, a slice of history found amid the vintage-style kids games, fishermen feats of strength for adults, hot dogs and cake. changes. The city paid \$42,000 for this redesign.

In addition to the grant, Gulfport has \$69,000 in a special fund dedicated to the library and has pledged to use \$101,000 from the capital improvement budget, bringing the project total to \$350,000.

Hennessy will charge a percentage of the cost for its services. The percentage amount varies from 6 to 11 percent, depending on the type of work.



Flying Mullets Bring New Type of History to Town

History means old newspapers, sepia-toned photographs, musty charts... and now, in Gulfport, a road race.

The Gulfport Historical Society, whose board makeup has changed over the past year, launched a month-long celebration of Gulfport History Month last week with a "Gulfport: Then and Now" photo show in the Catherine Hickman Theatre. This Friday night, the month-long celebration continues with the Society's first-ever Flying Mullet 5K and One Mile Doggie Dash. The race will start at the museum and end at Veterans Park.

"We wanted to do something different, draw in people from outside the city to downtown," board member Christine Brown said. When the board discussed a road race, she pointed out that mullets have gizzards, which means "technically, they are birds," she joked.

The Flying Mullet 5K was born.

"It's different, no doubt," Nicole Spence, a first-year board member, says. "But it's a way to show people Gulfport. The board wanted to do something to show people that our history is what sets us apart from other Florida towns. This race shows runners some of our history on their terms."

While Saturday's birthday bash includes trolley tours past notable Gulfport places, the run offers a close-up view of some of the same homes on the tour.

The race wends through the Art Village, although the course keeps runners off Beach Boulevard out of consideration for the businesses, Brown says.

"The point is to bring people downtown, not choke off access to downtown," she says. Instead, the board opted to end the

race at Veteran's Park, which lets runners, walkers and dogs explore downtown on their way back to their cars.

The one-mile doggie dash, Spence says, welcomes racing and non-competitive dogs alike. While there will be prizes for the winning dog, every dog receives a goodie bag.

"The doggie dash is meant to be more of a fun, social thing for locals," she says. She'll be bringing Dougal, an almost-two Australian Shepherd/Springer Spaniel mix to the dash but says she will not even attempt to win. "We wanted a easygoing event for locals, because dogs are clearly such a big part of our lives as Gulfportians. We don't own them; they own us."

That dog-friendly vibe reaches to include the after-party. Instead of a beer truck used at other runs, the Society opted to partner with O'Maddy's,

Salty's and Neptune to offer a post-race drink to participants. All three establishments welcome dogs.

"We want people to feel history, not just read about it," Brown says. "And Gulfport is really a town where you can get a sense of history just by walking around."

Charlie Williams, one of the area's last few mullet fishermen and the current mullet king (Williams Pier is named after his relatives), will have smoked mullet outside his house and be waving to runners as they pass by. He told the *Gabber* he planned to wear his full mullet king regalia.

The race starts at 5:30 this Friday night. 54th Street between 27th and 23rd Avenues South will be closed for no more than 45 minutes. Runners and walkers can register for either race, with or without a dog, at active.com. Search for "Flying Mullet."





Local Artist Explores Themes of Horror, Death

Come see the Gallery of Death, Dean Wick's three-dimensional recreation of Poe's short stories, at the City of Imagination. Dean says the City of Imagination has offered him just the right place "to bring a touch of horror to Gulfport."

Last year, one of the best things I did at Halloween was visit the City of Imagination, which hosted something called Poe's House of Horrors. Dean Wick, the artist, enchanted me with the way he made scenes from Edgar Allen Poe's short stories spring to life, although perhaps it's more appropriate to say he made them "spring to death."

One thing concerned me: Not many people seemed to know about this intense, well-designed, theatrical interpretation of death as explored by the master of the horror genre. Fortunately for everyone, Dean is reviving the experience at City of Imagination and expanding it into the Studio@620, so this year brings new hope and new horror. He's renamed the exhibit – which will include short, live performances at the Studio@620 – the "Gallery of Mortality." In both venues it will feature three-dimensional illustrations, vignettes of horror sliced out of Poe's macabre short story collections.

How to describe this if you haven't seen it? This is no haunted house; don't expect things to jump out at you. What Dean's created is a mood of horror, subtle and not-so-subtle psychological horrors. At City of Imagination you stroll through the different exhibits; at the Studio@620 you'll have a similar experience but with live theatre added to maximize your immersion in Poe's world.

"If you were to open a book and see a picture, imagine that in three dimensions," Dean says. "It's an exploration of the mysteries and our fears of death. We surround ourselves with artificial death," he says, using cop and forensic dramas as examples, "but in real life, we want our distance from it. When you go back to Poe's age, death surrounded them. You got sick or injured, you could die. They didn't really know why illness caused death; the first man who proposed the idea of germ theory was laughed out of society."

Dean's thought a lot about the mood he wants to evoke.

"The difference between fear, terror and horror and why we refer to the genre as horror? Horror, as best as we can understand it, is something we feel when we watch something else happening to someone else, and we empathize with that. We understand that to be a very undesirable situation. We're not the ones in jeopardy, but we sympathize on a primal level. We experience that adrenaline rush," Dean says.

The entire experience plays on what Dean calls the mortality aspect. Each vignette emphasizes a different aspect of death, and Dean notes that every person will react to each diorama of death differently. Like last year, they're all based on Poe's works, but this year, in addition to seeing the gallery of three-dimensional mortality portraits at City of Imagination, you can see performances along with the gallery at the Studio@620. Rachel Harrison, currently an American Stage stage manager, is directing the performances. She also worked on Theatre Walk in Gulfport. The performances will draw on Poe as well, with a twist toward his lesser-known humor and satire genre.

Come see the Gallery of Mortality at the City of Imagination, 2726 54th Street South, Gulfport, October 16 through 25 (except Monday). The Gallery opens at 7 p.m. and closes at 9 p.m.; admission is \$9. From October 29 through November 1, from 6:30 p.m. until 9:30 p.m., you can see the Gallery and the performances at the Studio@620, 620 1st Avenue South, St. Petersburg, for \$15.
