

Peninsula Will Soon Become a Scenic Public Park

The future park is located adjacent to the marina along the shore of Boca Ciega Bay and would include grading and a natural shell-based walking trail, he said.

Increasing public access is the goal for a peninsula of city-owned land that borders the Municipal Marina and Boca Ciega Bay in Gulfport.

Right now, it is behind fences and is visited mostly by shore birds and birds of prey like ospreys. The birds will remain but soon, people will also become a regular part of the mix.

The peninsula is about 40 to 50 feet wide and nearly 450 feet long, said City Manager Jim O'Reilly.

Officer Mills Is Brewing up a Team with Council

Gulfport's Coffee with a Cop community outreach program is teaming up with councilmembers for regular meetings thanks to a new effort that started with Vice Mayor Christine Brown.

In June, Brown contacted Community Policing Officer Zack Mills and suggested that she and other councilmembers join with him during even-numbered months.

"It brings people from the community together so they can talk to Zack and ask questions of a councilmember," said Brown. "If someone is having difficulty, we can see if there is any way that we can help them. We can also get their ideas about things they'd like to do in the community."

Brown suggested the new venue be Scout Hall, 5315 28th Ave. S., which is a city-owned building. "Who does not love Scout Hall?" she said. "It's a beautiful place. It looks and feels like the 50s and it's well maintained. It's a venue that doesn't get used as often as it should."

They also used recyclable coffee cups and wooden stirrer sticks – no plastic straws, said Brown. "We've got the whole set up."

Originally, in about 1954, it was dredged out to form a land break to protect the Boca Ciega Yacht Club (BCYC), said Municipal Marina Director Denis Frain.

On Tuesday, October 2, Gulfport City Council unanimously approved municipal budget monies and directed staff to apply for a Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) grant to fund the initial phases of a new waterfront park.

Known as the BCYC Breakwater Linear Park project in city documentation, it will be developed in up to four phases over time depending on funding. The scope of the project was originally proposed by Mayor Sam Henderson and city council members during the 2018-2019 fiscal year budget sessions based on previous public discussion meetings, said O'Reilly.

Phase One and Phase Two will

take place during this fiscal year with an estimated cost of \$210,532 coming from the city's capital improvement budget.

For Phase One, Cardno Engineering, a national firm with offices in Tampa Bay, will develop, design and permit the project in addition to providing construction-monitoring services at a cost of \$65,000, said O'Reilly. This is expected to take from 90 to 120 days.

"There is lots of time for input" from the council and the public, said Vice Mayor Christine Brown.

Additional input from residents, members of the nearby Lions Club and people who belong to water-based boat clubs that currently utilize the fenced-in area "are important factors," said O'Reilly. "When we did our initial walk through, how to open the access, maintain security for the club and [provide] dry boat storage" were factors.

Dry boat storage is a revenue generator for the city "and we're not going to do anything to harm that," he said. "At the same time,

we want to open up that [peninsula] area."

The beach area used by boaters behind the Lions Club will not to be impacted by this project, said O'Reilly.

According to city documentation and staff, and after the council approves a bid for construction that includes proposed renderings, Phase Two will consist of creating public accessibility to the area and the building of small-scale linear docks and piers for bird watching and sunset observation along its Boca Ciega Bay shoreline similar to those that have already been added in the city's 10-acre Clam Bayou Nature Park south of 29th Avenue South on Miriam Street.

The peninsula park "will be ADA accessible with benches here and there. And, low voltage LED bollard lighting to give it that nice look," said Frain. "There will not be much fishing

because of the shallow water."

In addition, invasive exotic plant species such as Brazilian pepper will be removed from the peninsula and in the adjacent marina area, said Frain. "It would be as passive as possible without removing a lot and there would be nothing but mangroves left."

Henderson agreed and said, "We don't intend to de-tree that peninsula. It's a good birding area."

When funding becomes available, Phase Three could be the construction of a two-story scenic overlook tower with a tin roof including signage identifying the City of Gulfport along with the official name of the new park, when it is determined.

"I would really love to see this opened up for the public," said Councilmember Paul Ray.

In what could become Phase Four with a total estimated cost of \$200,000, councilmembers also directed city staff to seek grant funding from SWFWMD for the possible development of a living shoreline with native coastal grasses and the ability to grow oysters that attract fish. It could be eligible for the agency's Cooperative Funding Initiative (CFI) program.

If approved, the CFI program would match one dollar for every non-federal dollar used in water quality and natural restoration projects. In the past, Gulfport has been successful in securing SWFWMD funding, most recently for the 49th Street Outfall project adjacent to the marina, said O'Reilly.

If the city is successful in obtaining a CFI grant, the council will need to formally accept the funding along with any associated municipal budget amendments for the park's water quality and natural restoration components.





Pinellas Seeks Input on Recycling Programs



Roger has been illustrating "all our married life," said Nancy, who's also been a writer for years. In 2010, the pair self-published two picture books, but their current Saltwater Kids series is a more dedicated venture.

"We get along great," said Nancy. "The best part is bouncing ideas off each other and being honest."

While their other two titles were self published, "The Saltwater Kids on Boca Ciega Bay" was published by Reader Publishing Group, a company close to the Hoffman's hearts. Reader Publishing Group is owned by the Hoffman's cousins, George and Carmela Cunningham, who also inspired characters in the book. While reviewing a contract from another publisher, the Cunninghams said, "Well why don't you just let us publish it?"

"From what I've heard from family and friends, it's been very well received," said Nancy. Two more books are in the works for the Saltwater Kids series, with the second title being "Casting Call." That story will feature Thurgood Marshall Middle School.



Council Approves History Museum Fire Repairs, Restoration

Soon, the Gulfport History Museum will be undergoing architectural repairs and restoration following a September 3 fire thanks to approval of the city's \$115,458 insurance claim by council on Tuesday, October 2.

Firefighters from Gulfport, St. Petersburg and South Pasadena worked together on the morning of Labor Day Monday to save the museum. The majority of the exterior damage occurred on the front porch.

The wooden building, which is about 100 years old, is locally designated as historical. Because of this, the council needed to vote on any proposed changes including repairs and restoration, said City Manager Jim O'Reilly.

Both the structure and contents are covered by the city's insurance that has a \$1,000 deductible, said O'Reilly.

According to city documentation, the total cost for structural repairs by Signal Restoration Services, a national-level corporation,

will not exceed \$93,000 while \$22,458 is earmarked to Art Recovery Technologies of Tampa and Orlando to restore contents that were damaged by smoke or water.

The process begins with design and engineering that includes permitting by the city, said O'Reilly. Work on the building and its contents will begin in about one month depending on the permitting workflow.

The non-profit Gulfport Historical Society runs the museum located at 5301 28th Ave. S. and curates the collection. The city owns the History Museum building and related land, which is leased to the society for \$1 per year.

Strawless Summer Challenge a Success

From July 1 through September 30, a total of 23 Gulfport restaurants, bars and cafes agreed to voluntarily participate in a city-sponsored initiative called the Strawless Summer Challenge that was designed to eliminate the routine use of single-use plastic straws in an effort to protect wildlife

and the environment.

By taking the pledge, the businesses are spotlighted for one year on the following city webpage (visit mygulfport.us/strawless-summer-challenge) and their logos will be featured on an advertising banner that will be located on the north fence line of the beach volleyball courts, said Cultural Facilities Events Supervisor Justin Shea.

Plastic straws were not provided unless requested by a customer, said Shea. Many

businesses switched to paper straws as an alternative.

Though the 90-day challenge has formally ended, businesses are expected to keep the momentum going on a voluntary basis, said O'Reilly.


Some businesses will expand the effort to include using wooden as opposed to plastic drink stirrers along with providing eco-friendly alternatives to plastic utensils, bags and Styrofoam containers for take-out orders, said Shea.

"I would like to thank Terry Foster because she was the head of the plastic-free initiative in the city of Gulfport," said Shea. He also thanked everyone in the city who participated.

New Beach Wifi Will Be Free

Thanks to a unanimous approval of a resolution by council, it will soon be easier to enjoy high-definition video from the internet while at the Casino or beach.

The three-year agreement with Spectrum/Charter will add a new fiber optic connection at the Casino with guaranteed upload and download speeds of 50mbps. The high-speed wifi signal will include the Casino and

extend along the beach area to the Recreation Center, said Gulfport's IT Director Dave Mather.

The new service will be fast enough for people to enjoy high-definition streaming videos like those broadcast during volleyball tournaments, said Councilmember Dan Liedtke.

The monthly cost to the city will be \$599 with a one-time installation fee of \$250. The service will be available free to the public without the need for a password.

Water, Sewer Agreement Approved

Following negotiations at the administration and staff levels, a 10-year agreement for St. Petersburg to supply potable water and waste water services to Gulfport was recently achieved, said O'Reilly.

The current 30-year agreement between the two municipalities, dated October 6, 1988, ends on October 5, 2018.

Council unanimously approved the new interlocal agreement that will begin on October 6, 2018.

At the council's June 19 meeting, Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. presented a Utility Rate Sufficiency Study that projected water and sewer rates over a 10-year period. Their study includes a variety of assumptions and conditions such as estimated annual wholesale rate increases from St. Petersburg at a rate of 3.25 percent over the next nine fiscal years.

For Gulfport consumers with an average monthly water usage volume of 4,000 gallons per month, the rate change will mean an increase of \$1 per month during fiscal year 2019. Afterward, the rate will increase from 2020 through 2028 will range from 2.5 percent to 8 percent depending on the fiscal year.

customers will be changed from chloramine to chlorine disinfection" as part of a "routine maintenance measure designed to optimize water quality."

All residents of Gulfport will be unaffected by this maintenance process because the city contracts with St. Petersburg for tap water, said City Manager Jim O'Reilly.

Documentation from Pinellas County says that "kidney dialysis patients should not be impacted, but [they] should contact their dialysis care provider for more information about chlorine treatment."

Additionally, the county says "fish owners should not be affected if they already have a system in place to remove chloramines, but [they] should contact local pet suppliers with any questions."

October's maintenance is the second of two short-term workflows in 2018. The first occurred in May and June.

"The annual chlorine maintenance process continues to run smoothly every year with increased cooperation and commitment from our customers," said David Porter, public utilities director, in a September 29 Patch article. "We thank our customers in advance for their patience as maintenance procedures begin."

According to county documentation, chlorine was used as the primary disinfectant in the water for more than 50 years prior to 2002. The county switched to chloramine in 2002 "to ensure compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency standards."

The county says that many communities using chloramine routinely convert back to chlorine for short periods of time to maintain system water quality.



YOU — AND THE LAW —

How Should My Business Be Set Up? (Part I)

Our office has had the pleasure of advising and counseling numerous clients concerning how to legally set up a new business venture. As a result, five different choices of the types of business entities that may be utilized will be presented in this article and our next article. The five basic choices which an entrepreneur or new business owner may wish to consider are:

- Sole Proprietorship;
- General Partnership;
- Limited Partnership;
- Corporation; and
- "S" Corporation.

In this article, we will examine the general legal requirements of a sole proprietorship and a general partnership.

Sole Proprietorship

1. A sole proprietorship is an unincorporated business owned by a single individual. A sole proprietorship is not a legal entity separate from its owner.

2. The owner of a sole proprietorship has unlimited liability for the debts and obligations of the business.

The owner, therefore, must rely on personal assets or insurance for protection against creditors.

3. For income tax purposes, income and loss of the sole proprietorship passes directly to the sole proprietor and is reported on his individual income tax return.

4. No special organizational documents are necessary to begin business as a sole proprietorship.

5. The advantage of a sole proprietorship is that it is a simple means of beginning a business.

6. In Florida, an individual who engages in business has a sole proprietorship under a fictitious name must register the fictitious name with the Florida Secretary of State's office in Tallahassee.

B. General Partnership

1. A partnership is an unincorporated association of two or more individuals, corporations, or other entities engaging in business for a profit.

2. Like a sole proprietorship, a general partnership is not a separate legal entity. Each partner in a general partnership is personally liable for the partnership liabilities.

3. A general partnership must file a

separate income tax return for federal income tax purposes. However, this is merely an information return. Generally, all income passes to the general partners and is reported on their individual income tax returns. Losses are also passed through, subject to limitations, which will be made stricter if proposed changes in the tax laws are implemented.

4. Although no written documentation is necessary to form a general partnership, normally the rights and obligations of the various partners (including their shares of income, losses, and cash distributed by the partnership) are specified in a written partnership agreement. The partnership agreement may also specify the manner in which the business is to be operated, and may designate a managing general partner who serves the function of a chief executive officer. Generally, in the absence of contrary provisions in the partnership agreement, the business affairs of the partnership are governed by a majority vote of the partners.

5. Generally, the transfer of a partnership interest is more difficult than a transfer of corporate stock. Restrictions on the transferability of a partnership interest may be specified in the partnership agreement, and transfers normally require the consent of the other partners.

6. In Florida, a general partnership is required to file a fictitious name registration.

7. Generally, the death, insanity, or withdrawal of a general partner from the partnership "dissolves" the partnership, although the remaining partners may elect to continue the partnership business in a new partnership.

8. Generally, each general partner is an agent of the partnership and has the power to bind the partnership.



Local Group Uses Music Therapy to Help Patients

Teg Wagner is no stranger to hospital rooms, where he uses his gifts as a musician to treat children with illnesses and disabilities.

In 2001, Wagner started Music Sweet Music (MSM), a South Pasadena-based nonprofit that uses music therapists and special instruments to neurologically help patients with mental and physical issues.

"I'm a musician by trade, but I wanted to do more with my music," said Wagner. "This is all volunteer for me."

Music Sweet Music most frequently uses a keyboard-like instrument called a QChord, the guitar and singing voices to soothe and re-focus patients.

"Neurologically, if there is a damaged part of the brain, the music will help," said Wagner.

At Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital, doctors team up with music therapists to assist children with disabilities. Children with physical limitations, autism, speech impediments and trauma-related disorders all benefit from the music sessions.

"The doctor will call us in for procedures, like they might have us work with a child while he's getting a spinal tap," said Wagner.

Currently the organization has four board-certified music therapists that travel to hospitals and homes to treat patients. According to Wagner, Music Sweet Music treats about 15,000 people annually.

Their studio, decorated with stuffed bears and colorful toys, is being sound-proofed while the team travels to patients.

While MSM focuses mainly on children, some clients have aged with the organization and are now 20 to 30 years old.

"We would never turn anybody away," said Wagner.

One of MSM's clients is a rape survivor that was attacked and left to die outside a library when she was only 18. The brutal assault left her unable to walk or speak on her own.

The woman began receiving

treatment from Music Sweet Music among other types of therapy.

Another patient's mother told Wagner that the last time she saw her terminally ill child smile was when he was given a donated QChord.

The organization frequently donates instruments to children in need and has given free treatment to families in financial need.

"This has really opened my eyes," said May Graci, MSM's public

relations manager and assistant to Wagner. "You and I can complain all the time but when you see someone who needs help, it's different."

The organization is funded solely through donations and fundraisers. Each QChord is about \$400, and an average, used guitar is anywhere from \$300 to 600.


