Tensions rise on housing authority board, Berner removed

Deerfield Beach - Housing Authority Commissioner Caryl Berner was removed from her post Tuesday at the request of Mayor Peggy Noland.

Noland said, "When one board member has antagonized staff and caused six colleagues to ask for her removal, clearly this is misconduct, negligence and inefficiency of the highest order."

In letters to the mayor, three other housing authority board members accused Berner of disrupting their meetings with irreverent matters and of interfering with the staff. She was reprimanded at the April 18 meeting by Deerfield Beach Housing Authority, or DBHA, Chair Keith Emery in

Wilton Manors - When Janet Conklin's two-week temporary sign permit expired, so did the surge in customers.

Officials ask for 'visionaries' to suggest ideas to enhance bridge, safety and area at Hillsboro Inlet

Hillsboro Beach - Pompano Beach city officials are reaching out to this town and Lighthouse Point in their attempts to beautify the Hillsboro Inlet Bridge.

Lewis Friend, construction manager for Pompano Beach, told commissioners this week that his city wants to "establish A1A as a scenic corridor" and asked for "vision" when it comes to improving the appearance of the Inlet span. Friend said the improvements

could be done when the state undertakes \$5 million in maintenance work late in 2013. "There is some benefit to working concurrently," Friend said.

Although, planning now is just conceptual, under consideration could be entryway features, the draw bridge itself, the safety of pedestrians and cyclists, sidewalks on the Hillsboro Beach side. The bridge might even be widened," he said.

"It could be just an enhancement or something more sophisticated," Friend said. "We can only go forward if we have a shared vision," Friend said. He

has already approached Mayor Fred Schorr and City Administrator John Lavisky in LHP and said he got a good reception. Next on his list may be the Hillsboro Inlet Improvement District Board.

Friend said the bridge offers spectacular "vistas of the ocean," the historical Hillsboro Lighthouse and is a "great focal point." Right now, he said, "it is quite drab. It would be nice to create something better than we have."

Pompano commissioners want out of two parts of county ethics code

Pompano Beach - Voters here will be asked on Aug. 14 if they want to exempt their city commissioners from two aspects of the new county eth-

ics code.

The code, approved by the county October 2011, went into effect January, 2012. The code adds restrictions beyond the state ethics code.

If voters agree, commissioners would be exempt from the

part of the code that requires them to report their personal incomes. The second exemption would allow commissioners, in particular attorneys, to lobby on behalf of their clients in cities other than in Pompano Beach.

According to City Attorney Gordon Linn, the ordinance, if approved, will supersede the county's ordinance that establishes the ethics code.

The commission was unanimous in its support of the measure which will be discussed again on Tuesday, May 7.

In discussing the code, Vice Mayor George Brummer said the League of Cities tried to convey the belief that city officials should not be held to the same income reporting standards as county officials.

Commissioner Charlotte Burrie said she could understand reporting her income if

all of it came from politics, but she said, "I am an estate, probate and real estate attorney. I have absolutely nothing to do with government work. I don't lobby. I don't go before other agencies. My personal income is between me and the IRS."

Commissioner Rex Hardin, who owns a printing company, said the ethics provision came up because county commissioners were lobbying in local venues and presumably could wield influence because of their higher political positions. "I don't know who we would lobby down to," Hardin said.

Commissioner Barry Docks-well, a proponent of stringent ethics laws, said he did not want the Pompano vote to be taken "as a statement that we are ducking ethics requirements... This is an appropriate modification of the ethics

law," he said.

Commissioner Woody Poitier, owner of a funeral parlor, said he felt the same way.

Earlier this year, three municipalities, Wilton Manors, Hillsboro Beach and Sea Ranch Lakes, put similar amendments on their ballots. The measures passed and have been unchallenged.

Move is on to lift Sunday ban of alcohol sales in Deerfield Beach

Deerfield Beach - City commissioners agreed Tuesday to draft an ordinance removing the ban on the

Sunday morning sale of alcohol. Passage of the ordinance requires two separate votes and a public hearing.

Commissioner Joe Miller, who at first opposed the change, said he has heard

from many constituents and to date only one supported the restriction on alcohol sales. He said he would vote to rescind the ban.

Vice Mayor Ben Preston remained against the change saying if people have to drink before noon, they "may have a problem."

Commissioner Bill Ganz said the ban stems from old Blue Laws which were put in place strictly for religious reasons and indicated he would vote to rescind the ban.

Earlier in the meeting resident David Cohen rose to

point out that many religions don't worship on Sunday and that the ban was discriminatory. "How can you speak to their religion [Christianity] and not to others?" Cohen asked.

Residents say sports grill noise is an "abuse"

Deerfield Beach - The patio music at Bru's Room Sports Grill has become "noise pollution" resident Rodger Morelli told the commission this week. The live band that plays Saturdays and Sundays, sometimes until 11 p.m., is

"outrageous" and getting worse, Morelli said, terming it an "abuse of a business license."

Morelli lives on Northeast 2 Street adjacent to the A1A restaurant and said this week's complaint is his "first step in pursuing this." He promised to attend meetings every two weeks to continue his protest.

A woman who said she is a part time resident of the neighborhood also complained of the noise saying that she lost two sales on a nearby home because of the disturbance. She waved a sheaf of paperwork saying it was a record of calls Bru's Rooms neighbors have made to police since 2005.

In response, one of Bru's Room's owners, Bob Brudzinski, noted that a soundwall was installed when the outside patio was built, but admitted the band "is a mistake." Brudzinski said he will meet with local managers of the popular sports bar and that "the music will be turned down."



Without enough information, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea commissioners stall plans for northern, southern beach nourishment project

- Town commissioners want answers before deciding on whether to involve the town in a proposed county beach nourishment project from the Hillsboro Inlet to Port Everglades.

Two fill areas are proposed for nourishment: northern Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, or LBTS, and Pompano Beach and southern LBTS and Fort Lauderdale. Areas most in need of restoration are the southern end of Pompano Beach, Galt Ocean Mile and central Fort Lauderdale, Eric Myers, county natural resources administrator, wrote in a report to commissioners.

LBTS's role in the project is to provide the gradual transition between the fill area and adjacent areas which improves the overall performance of the project. "Elimination of beach fill tapers proposed for the LBTS shoreline would significantly diminish the performance of beach fill along the adjacent shorelines," Myers said.

The project is estimated at

\$45.6 million with the town's share estimated at \$442,000. The cost share formula is 50 percent federal and 25 percent state with county and cities splitting the remaining 25 percent.

After presenting information on the project to the commission in March, Myers fielded questions from commissioners last week.

"I really, really want to support this project, but you are making it very difficult on me," Commissioner Mark Brown said.

Brown said he still had a number of questions including, "How much sand will be required on the beach in LBTS? How many truckloads need to come into town, and how many days will we be disrupted?"

Brown said the timing

makes a big difference. "If we're talking two to three weeks of trucks dumping sand on the beach, it's worth it. It's our only opportunity to get sand. I look at sand like money. You can never have too much of either," he said.

"But if the timing is four months or two years, that's a critical component in whether you have my support."

Brown questioned the costs and the town's share in it, concerned that LBTS is bearing a disproportionate share of the cost and a disproportionate share of the disruption as the staging area is now expected to be at Palm Avenue.

On the north end, Myers said 130,000 cubic yards or 175,000 tons of sand will be needed. At a hauling rate of 2,500 tons a day, it will take about 70 work days to

complete and would be done in one season. He estimated about half that sand would go to LBTS.

Myers said he would be prepared to recommend to county commissioners "that we polish the formula used to consider the situation the town is in. You have a dimin-

ished need compared to your neighbors to the north and south. You have a wider beach because you set the development line back."

Commissioner Stuart Dodd said LBTS should only pay for "every grain" of sand they

Pompano Beach officials may start charging annual fee for dog park

Pompano Beach - Hoping to recoup some of the \$15,000 per month the city spends maintaining its dog park, city officials are deliberating whether or not to levy a fee on those who use the facility.

On Wednesday, residents, city staff and parks and recreation advisory board members met to discuss the possibility of charging a fee for an annual pass.

Currently, the city does not charge for use of the park.

If implemented, it would

cost residents \$60 per year for one dog and \$20 for each additional dog. Non-residents would pay \$120 and \$40 per additional dog.

For a monthly pass, \$40 for residents and \$20 for each additional dog. For non-residents, \$80 and \$40 per extra dog. Day passes would be \$5 for residents and \$10 for non-residents.

City staff presented three options for overseeing the system if implemented:
1. Hiring a staff member, \$30,000 per year, to monitor the park during its hours of operation. 2. Purchasing a

computer system that requires park users to swipe their pass to gain entry. 3. Letting users police the park themselves and ensure only those with passes use it.

Scott Moore, parks and recreation department staff member, said city staff is recommending option two.

Residents who attended the Wednesday meeting and spoke out seemed about evenly split, with some calling for fees and others wanting to keep the status quo. One resident suggested getting sponsorships to help pay for maintenance.

"I don't think \$60 is unreasonable," said resident Doug Mathis, who rattled off a list of other parks and public facilities where people have to pay fees.

Donna Torrey, advisory board member, said she's not opposed to a fee but thinks \$60 is too high. She also suggested that instead of charging per additional dog the city should only allow each person to bring in a maximum of three dogs.

"As a rule, I hate the idea of charging for parks," said Rafael Katz, advisory board member. "I'm not terribly

opposed to having a nominal pass fee. Overall I just would prefer to have no fees for the dog park."

Katz said that the area, with its abandoned restaurants and car dealerships, needs as much of an economic boost as possible. "If you got people [coming into the area] it stimulates the local economy," he said.

David Aycock, Animal Control officer, said he's seen many instances of uncontrolled dogs attacking and injuring other dogs.

He estimates that, based on the attacks he's seen, the combined cost of medical bills for dogs that have been attacked by other dogs is over \$20,000. "Many people don't follow the rules. Regardless of whether there's a fee, we need to get some control," he said.

Hurricane preparedness: then and now - doors

The doors of your home are meant to welcome guests and keep out intruders. Well, this time of the year, the bad guys you need to keep out will be named Alberto, Beryl, Chris, Debby, Ernesto, Florence, Gordon, and so on – storms of the 2012 hurricane season. Let's look at how to keep those blow-hards out of your house.

Prior to the 1990's, very little was said about the need to secure doors in a hurricane. People who lived through Hurricane Cleo tell horror stories of trying to hold pressure against sliding glass doors, some using dining room tables, some using their own bodies to keep the doors from being blown in. For hours, people watched the doors bow and shimmy in their tracks. Some doors gave way, cutting people badly. Hopefully, we have learned lessons from what those survivors went through.

In the 1990's, people were urged not only to board or shutter those large areas of glass but also to use strong bracing for doors. In the year 2000, in a television special, a meteorologist demonstrated how to brace sliding glass doors by placing one 2x4 in the lower track to keep the door from bouncing out of the track, another 2x4 in the top track, and one in the middle of the glass door.

During Hurricane Andrew, many people lost garage doors. After an opening that large is compromised, the roof is often lost.

Obviously, no one should ever underestimate the importance of preparing the doors of a home for hurricane force winds.

Until May 22, City of Fort Lauderdale chlorinating its water system

a discussion that ended with that board voting 6-1 to ask for her removal.

Under state statute, the mayor appoints and can remove DBHA commissioners with approval of the city commission.

Noland announced in April that she wanted to remove Berner after receiving letters of complaint from housing authority commissioners Joan Maurice, Sally Potter and Michael Weiss.

"I have considered it carefully and find I must act," the mayor told the commission Tuesday. "I believe her removal is required so the board can work in a functional manner."

The mayor read a long statement outlining her reasons for seeking Berner's removal from a position she has held since 2009.

Included were Emery's remarks at a March 21 Authority meeting that if things did not improve he would resign from the board after 25 years of service and he suspected other board members would go with him leading to a "total collapse" of the agency.

A large part the board concern was Berner's conduct before the city commission.

Berner had addressed the city commission about the Authority's health insurance using her title as housing commissioner despite the fact

the Authority has a policy that its board members not use their position when advocating for or against issues. Her remarks, according to Emery, jeopardized the Authority's relationship with the city.

At the Apr. 17 city commission meeting, Berner used her DBHA title again at the podium to explain the workings of the housing authority to the commission. The next day, the DBHA board took its 6-1 vote, Berner herself dissenting.

In her defense Tuesday, Berner presented a list of her accomplishments as a housing authority commissioner saying she worked at the job while others on the board

did not. She said she advocated that Stanley Terrace be painted colors that would not make it look like low income housing and that she got BSO to step up patrols there.

"I did a ride along [with the sheriff]...I did the work," Berner said.

She also went to authority events at the housing complexes and interacted with the residents, while others on her board did not.

Berner said the city commission's failure to prevent blogger Chaz Steven's verbal attacks on the DBHA's former executive director Pam Davis caused Davis to resign. "I put that onus squarely on you," she told the commission.

DBHA Commissioner Joan Maurice spoke in favor of Berner's dismissal saying that Davis had complained to her about Berner in October, November and December as did interim director Rinaldo Bennett in February.

Davis left Deerfield in Jan. 31 to become executive director of the Gainesville Housing Authority. Bennett left two weeks ago to join her staff at twice his current salary, according to Maurice.

Commissioners voted 5-1 for Berner's dismissal, Commissioner Ben Preston dissenting.

Later Preston said, "I don't know that we had all the information available to us

unless we had witnessed the accusations. I have received calls on other disruptive board members... Why were we dealing with just one?"





The phrase, 'Like father, Like son' certainly fits the case of Samuel S. Goren, who says, "I think my Dad and I may be the only father and son ever inducted into the Broward County Senior Hall of Fame. My father, who died in 2008, was the director for media relations and marketing for Broward Health."

After he retired from his job, he continued to be their consultant. He sat on the board and did a lot of volunteer work with Meals on Wheels, Alzheimer Association and many other non-profit agencies."

Goren, now 61, followed in his father's footsteps. But she's hoping the city will soon approve a waiver of the current ban on temporary signs and banners.

On May 7 at 7 p.m. at city hall, 2020 Wilton Drive, the city's planning and zoning board will make a recommendation to city commissioners on whether or not the city should temporarily waive the

ban.

Heidi Shafran, community development services director, said she is hoping the issue will go before commissioners by early June.

Shafran, who said she was approached by local business owners, including Conklin, about the issue, is recommending that the ban be lifted during the summer until Oct. 1.

Conklin said she would prefer the restrictions be lifted

permanently.

"We'll take what we can get but we wanted the whole year," said Conklin.

Along with temporary signs, the city also bans strings of lights, roof signs, streamers, inflatable signs, banners, vehicle signs, portable signs, changeable copy signs, flashing signs and neon signs, except if they are part of a building's architecture.

If the waiver is granted, Shafran says there will still be

restrictions: only one sign per business, each sign must be on private property, must not obstruct sidewalks or other public rights-of-way and can only be displayed during business hours.

Celeste Ellich, Wilton Manors Business Association president, said when she was on the planning and zoning board a few years ago the city had a lot of issues with temporary signs. "That's why we were re-writing the sign code ordinance," said Ellich.

One business owner, she said, would place a sandwich board sign in the middle of the sidewalk. "As long as the temporary signs are not impeding the view of cars or pedestrians, than I don't see anything wrong with it," said Ellich.

Krishan Manners, president and CEO of Wilton Manors

Main Street, said he supports lifting the ban and will probably speak on the issue at the planning and zoning meeting.

"The economy's improving and we're seeing that and feeling that here," said Manners, who added that businesses during the end of tourist season need ways to stand out and be more visible to customers.

"We're a small city and we have limited tools in our tool box. I think that's just one that we can add."




DEP settles for fine

Hillsboro Beach - The city has agreed to pay a "remarkably reasonable" fine of \$2,500 to the Department of Environmental Protection, or DEP, for impacts to a coral reef that occurred during the last beach nourishment project.

Penny Cutt with Coastal Systems International said an accidental release of sand caused no harm to the corals and DEP was willing to settle for the low penalty. Great Lake Dredge and Dock, the company that pumped sand to the beach, is willing to absorb the expense, Cutt said.

Cutt is still talking with the Army Corps of Engineers about the sand dump. Her firm has found that the dump had a "very temporary impact in an environment that is used to this."

The penalty the Corps may impose is pending.

Repair of bridge still in dispute

Hillsboro Beach - Commissioners are giving officials at Island House one last chance to come to the table to discuss the cost of repairing the bridge that connects the 63-unit condo to A1A. Their premise: it will cost the taxpayers much more money than it would cost the condo residents to make the repairs due to the expensive processes government is forced to follow.

There is no indecision over who is responsible for the bridge, just how the repairs will be paid for. In 1966 the bridge was dedicated by the developer to the town which accepted it, thereby accepting maintenance costs as well. Commissioners have been trying to persuade the condo board to handle the repairs.

So far there is no estimate of the cost. A survey done for the Florida Department of

Transportation, or FDOT, in 2010 estimated replacing the span would cost \$500,000 but other reports say the bridge can be repaired.

Island House resident Joan Hughes has done enough research on the matter to fill a thick file. She reminded commissioners that the town gets FDOT reports on the bridge every two years and should have a maintenance fund. "If you had a maintenance fund, you would be ahead of the game," she said.

Commissioner Javier Garcia replied, "It is in the best interest of all for Island House to take on this venture," and Mayor Dan Dodge urged that the condo owners "reconsider

your position... come back and work this out."

The commission took no further action on the matter, but if agreement is not reached with the condo board, it will have to hire a consulting engineer to produce design drawings.

The town anticipates \$40,000 in gas tax revenues in 2012 that can be spent on repairs. Finance Commissioner Dick Maggiore said that amount in past years may have been dumped into the town's general fund. Officials have referred to a \$107,000 fund designated for road repairs that is no longer a line item in the town budget.

Beloved wrestling coach cheats death with a lot of help from his friends

Deerfield Beach - Wrestling Coach Bob Burns went to the edge March 28 at 4 p.m. He was yanked back by some remarkable people: young wrestlers in the PAL program, a school resource officer, the "best fire/rescue crew in the county," the expertise of his medical team and the prayers

of a community.

Tuesday, some of those people instrumental in Burns' recovery from full cardiac arrest, were recognized for their achievement.

Throughout the tribute which drew at least half-a-dozen standing ovations from the audience, Police Chief Pete Sudler described Burns, 54, as "a beloved mentor and coach who has made such

an impact on our youth." On March 28, the chief said, Burns was doing what he does – coaching wrestling to Police Athletic League kids at Deerfield Beach High School – when he experienced chest pain and went into full cardiac arrest.

The kids called 911 and went in search of adult help. On the soccer field, they found BSO Dep. Kevin Cole-

man who came in and administered CPR.

BSO paramedics, headed by Battalion Chiefs Scott Holloway and John Williamson, responded with their crews who went to work giving Burns advanced emergency care. He was taken to North Broward Medical Center where he was in a coma for several days and later underwent surgery.

Butch Santy, Deerfield Beach PAL director, and Burn's wife Lisa never left his side. "If I had to have one friend in this world, it would be Butch Santy," the Chief said. "He never left Bob's side, reading him the Bible and singing."

In his remarks Santy said, "Everyone here feels like Bob's friend because Bob is like that. And his wife Lisa is the toughest person I know. She never gave up."


Fire Chief Chad Brocata said Burns survived, in part, because all the critical pieces of a rescue were in place. "When it works correctly, what you see is a miracle," Brocata said. "Team Burns came to play that day at 4 p.m.," Brocata said as he singled out his men for recognition.

Amazingly, Burns has



Snowbird Paul Davitt says the "terrible conditions" of the Pompano Beach Municipal Golf Course caused him to cancel his membership this year.

But now that golf legend Greg Norman is redesigning the Pines course, Davitt plans to tee-off again on the city links. "All it needed was some work. I can't wait until next year," he said.

With an estimated 90,000 rounds of golf played each year on the course, city officials are hoping Norman's efforts bring back more golfers like Davitt and increase economic activity in the area and at the course itself.

"Build it and they will come," said Commissioner Charlotte Burrie.

On April 26, Norman, city commissioners and

officials, Broward County Commissioner Chip LaMarca and Lighthouse House Point Commissioner Sandy Johnson broke ground on the 18-hole Pines course. The other course, Palms, also 18

holes, will stay open during construction.

Mayor Lamar Fisher said that the \$3-million project will be finished in November. "We can't wait for that ribbon cutting," he said.

While Norman said the redesign won't move any

major piles of dirt his company, Greg Norman Golf Course Design, based in West Palm Beach, is looking to make the course maintenance friendly. "I don't want anyone calling me up and abusing me for your bad shots," he joked.

Founded in 1987, Norman's company has built and rebuilt 70 private and public golf courses but this is the first municipal one.

Asked if he would play a round on the course once it's finished, Norman said he would. "My golf career started on a public golf course," said Norman. "Golf can only grow through public courses."



Oakland Park land appraisals don't match purchase prices, city staff negotiating

Oakland Park - City commissioners agreed to table until Thursday, May 10, voting on the purchase of properties in the area targeted for redevelopment.

The continuation was necessary because appraisals on the properties are coming in significantly lower than the asking prices, City Manager John Stunson told commissioners Wednesday in asking for the continuance.

The city is applying to amend an interlocal agreement with Broward County so Redevelopment Capital Program funds can be reallocated for purchase of the properties.

In terms of the agreement, the city and county commission must approve a purchase price that is no more than 10 percent higher than the lower of two appraisals.

Tabling the vote on the ordinances gives staff more time to meet with the property owners and negotiate the price.

A balance of \$10.2 million remains of an original \$13 million provided under the RCP program.

"This is a loan to grant program. It's not free money. The only way the loan is forgiven is if development comes in to equal \$10 million," Commissioner Suzanne Boisvenue said. "This is not a must-do situation or the city will

perish."

Resident Mitchell Stollberg questioned whether the city could afford any of the properties. "This is not a field of dreams. Just because we buy it doesn't mean someone will come and buy it (from the city)," he said.

Man Con awarded contract for Garden Acres improvements

In other business, commissioners awarded a \$2.959 million contract for the Garden Acres Neighborhood Improvement Project to Man Con Inc. for water, sewer, drainage and landscaping improvements in the neighborhood.

The vote was 3-1, Commissioner Boisvenue abstaining and Commissioner John Adornato absent.

The funding is included in the FY12 Capital Improvement Plan. The Garden Acres neighborhood is the last residential area in the city without sewers. The project area is bounded by Commercial Boulevard on the north, NE 46 Court on the south, Dixie Highway on the east and NE 6 Avenue on the west.

Commissioners also approved hiring Craven Thompson & Associates for \$194,796 to provide construction engineering inspection services for the project.

With the right plants and a little water any yard can be a true Naturescape

Deerfield Beach - Linda Marshall and her husband Frank McKey have one year to entice 200 homeowners here to have their yards certified as Naturescapes. Marshall has completed all the requirements of registering Deerfield with the National Wildlife Federation and now just needs residents to be aware that certification is easy.

"What they need is water - a bird bath, lake, pond - and plants that provide food, cover and shelter," Franklin said. She will come out and survey the situation, but anyone with an abundance of native trees and bushes and a water source will qualify.

There is a \$20 fee which goes to the Federation, although for a few weeks

more, Marshall can certify yards for just \$15.

Broward County has the most certified cities of any in the U.S., Marshall said which makes Deerfield's participation even more important.

South Florida is important to the migration flyway because birds stop here and eat enough to make the long flight over water, the next leg of their journey to Central and South America.

Marshall and McKey had a Naturescape exhibit at Earth Day on Saturday to explain the certification program. Anyone interested, can contact her at 954-464-7444.

Among others exhibiting Earth-friendly wares was Jason Andreotta who brought both plain and wildly colorful rain barrels to the event. A standard blue barrel, sanded and primed for painting, is



Pompano Beach - When an angler normally catches the "big one" it usually only brings a sense of pride and accomplishment.

But with the arrival of May in Pompano Beach, catching the "big one" means possibly catching some big cash prizes

as well. The Pompano Beach Fishing Rodeo, May 16 through 19, and the Saltwater Shootout, May 10 through 13, gives anglers the chance to haul in thousands of dollars in prize money.

Brennan Robertson, site manager at Best Boat Club in the Pompano Marina, who has seen his fair share of tournaments, said he loves

fishing for the pure fun of it. But, for him, competition makes an already thrilling pursuit even better.

"It's a way to take things up another level. [There's] nothing like watching that fish coming in, putting it in the boat and knowing it's going to be good enough to weigh," Robertson said.

The Fishing Rodeo, now in its 47th year, will be held here at Alsdorf Park, 2843 NE 14 St. In years past, over \$65,000 in prizes have been awarded during the Fishing Rodeo.

Two years ago, the crew of the *Native Son* took home that tournament's \$6,500 grand prize for a total purse of \$15,600.

"It was pretty good to us yesterday and, god, did it love us today," said Art Sapp in 2010, captain of the *Native Son*. That was *Native Son*'s third win; 2003 and 2005 were also championship years for the crew. *High Gear* took home the top honors in 2011 and similar winnings as *Native Son*.

But May isn't the end of the chance to win big money.

The first of three tournaments known as the Saltwater Circuit, the

Jamie Bunn, director of Saltwater Circuit, says at least \$250,000 in prize money is up for grabs during the Shootout and \$500,000 total during the life of this year's Circuit.

Bunn said this year there will be some new prize categories, including the "Greenhorn" prize for anglers who have never fished in the Saltwater Shootout before.

Perhaps the most sought-after single prize, the KDW, goes to the crew who catches a kingfish, dolphin and wahoo during a single day. This year's KDW jackpot is so far up to \$7,500. But two years ago, it was at a record \$81,715 and went to the crew of the *Rebound*, which won a grand total of \$99,025.




