Election campaigning 101

For candidates breaking into politics, it all starts in this cold room in Sanford

A group of 45 men and women take their seats inside the lobby of the Seminole County Supervisor of Elections Office, converted to a classroom on a cold Wednesday evening. Supervisor of Elections Michael Ertel stands in front a projector screen and grins as he scans the audience, seeing both new and familiar faces.

The group of Seminole County residents represents all walks of life, ethnic backgrounds and viewpoints, but they all have one common goal: getting the most votes.

Seminole County candidates and aspiring politicians came together on the evening of March 26 for a campaign workshop from Ertel – a starting line for

many would-be-elected officials attending that night.

Ertel broke down the process of becoming an official registered candidate, going over advertising restrictions to keep in mind and limits on campaign finances.

"We don't want your cam-

paigns to be defined by a procedural mistake," Ertel said.

"We want your campaign to be defined by the policies you want to set in place and your personality."

Restrictions on ads included everything from the 100-foot,

no-sign buffer outside polling locations to the use of the word 'reelect,' specifically reserved for candidates currently holding the seat they're running for – not a seat they held years ago.

A total of 21 municipal posi-

Shooting suspect insane?

Oviedo mother deemed incompetent to stand trial by two psychologists

An Oviedo mother accused of murdering her 17-year-old daughter in January might be on her way to a Florida hospital instead of behind bars.

State clinical psychologist Daniel Tressler recently deemed Sujatha Guduru mentally incompetent to stand trial for the murder of her daughter Chetana. He's the second of two psychologists to make that observation after Seminole County Judge Kenneth Lester Jr. appointed them to observe Guduru's mental state, defense attorney Brian Bieber said late Tuesday afternoon.

Psychologist Deborah Day declared Guduru's incompe-

tence earlier this month, adding to Bieber's case claiming that the 44-year-old mother was insane at the time of the incident.

"Ms. Guduru being found incompetent by two doctors is frankly no surprise at all," Bieber said. "She was clearly in a psychotic state at the time of this unfortunate and tragic incident. Her present demonstration of psychotic behavior is typical in cases of this nature."

The rulings from both psychologists come four months after police arrived at the Guduru home on Jan. 27 in the Waverlee Woods subdivision in Oviedo, responding to a shooting that took place inside.

Prasad Chittaluru received an email from her sister, Guduru, at 6:30 that morning saying that she wanted to harm herself and her daughter. He arrived at the home of his sister and niece to find them both lying in the master bedroom with a gray revolver nearby, according to an arrest affidavit from the Oviedo Police Department.

Chetana had a gunshot wound to the head while Guduru had what appeared to be a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the chest.

Guduru recovered from her wound while Chetana was pronounced dead at 9:28 a.m.

The Oviedo mother was later charged with first-degree murder.

Bieber told the Orlando Sentinel that Guduru had been hospitalized for a mental illness on three previous occasions and is currently in the middle of a "psychotic break." Meier Clin-

ics, a counseling and mental healthcare service based out of Texas, described the state as "a break with reality, caused by a dopamine imbalance in the brain, resulting in delusions and/or hallucinations, usually auditory."

According to the Meier Clinics website, a psychotic break occurs in one out every 33 people in the world at any given time and are known to result in the death or injury of others.

Bieber said the court will hold a hearing by the end of the month to review the reports of both doctors and decide whether Guduru should be sent to a state hospital.

"We believe Ms. Guduru was legally insane at the time of the offense and are confident that through a psychological evaluation process and the ordinary course of legal proceedings that determination will be crystal clear," Bieber said.

 tions will open up in this year's election, including the position of mayor in Altamonte Springs, Lake Mary, Sanford and Winter Springs.

This year's election includes 15 open seats at the county level as well, with two Commissioner seats and three school board member positions up or grabs.

A spot on the Seminole County Public School Board would only be the beginning for aspiring candidate Walter Osborne, a county resident vying for the empty seat once held by late member Diane Bauer.

The retired applied engineering professor of more than 33 years dreams of someday holding a seat in the State House, allowing him to make a more significant difference.

Ertel took the opportunity to lend the candidates other general tips and insight he's gathered over his nine years in office. The supervisor of elections said that while there's no limit to the number of signs you can have, signs don't win elections.

"You know who's going to tell you that signs win elections?" Ertel said. "The sign vendor."

Most of the information given that night didn't apply to Winter Springs resident David Smith, who had goals beyond the state

and county level. He'd already served his country in the Marine Corps as a helicopter pilot, but now wishes to serve on a different front: the U.S. House of Representatives.

"I was approached by some small business owners and a separate group of veterans to consider public service," Smith said. "That was really the genesis of the campaign."

The combat veteran came out to the event to meet other candidates and glean whatever he could from Ertel.

His approach to his campaign and his 30 years in the Marine Corps are in many ways the same, he said.

"You have to have a servant's heart to do this."

World Cup dream comes true

Star United States soccer player Landon Donovan may be sitting out of the World Cup, held this year in Brazil, but thanks to McDonald's 10-year-old Oviedo resident Emmett Black will be there, along with his dad Chris Black.

McDonald's, the official restaurant of the World Cup, recently held a contest to choose 26 children to attend the games and escort the U.S. team onto the field.

Chris first heard about the contest on the radio while driving and thought it would be fun to enter his soccer-loving son as a lark.

Emmett remembers his dad mentioning the contest, but after agreeing it would be fun to enter, promptly forgot about it, never once considering he would be the winner.

"I didn't think there was a chance in the world that I would win," Emmett said.

That would explain the look of utter surprise and confusion on his face as he arrived at his favorite Oviedo McDonald's on May 21, only to be greeted by cheers, balloons, friends, relatives and camera flashes.

"I thought we were going out to eat or something, I had no idea," said the stunned fourth grader.

Emmett's parents learned about the big surprise more than a week before the big reveal.

"It was tough keeping the secret, but he never caught on," Chris said.

Even having his photo taken for a passport didn't clue Emmett in, although he thought it a little suspicious that his younger sisters weren't getting one.

Emmett, who has been a soccer fan nearly his whole life, will officially return to the sport while he is in Brazil for the first time since suffering an ACL injury last year.

In addition to escorting one of the U.S. players onto the field during their match against Ghana in Rio, Emmett will also get to play in an exhibition game with his fellow contest winners.

Emmett got the soccer bug from his aunt Joanna, who played

soccer for the University of Central Florida six years ago. When he was just a toddler, he got to hang out on the field with her and learned the rudiments of the sport in his backyard under her tutelage.

This year's Father's Day, June 15, will be unforgettable for the father-son duo as they head off together for Brazil's second largest city.

Emmett and his dad will spend six days in Brazil. While there, they will get to enjoy full access to World Cup events as well as have a chance to do a little sight-seeing, said Brian Wright, representative of McDonald's Central Florida Operators Association.

On June 16, two days before



Emmett's 11th birthday, he will escort a member of the U.S. team onto the field for their first match of the event, against Ghana.

During the trip, Emmett and his dad will also check in occasionally with local radio sponsor, Real Radio 104.1, the station that ran the ads for the contest.

Still shaking from the big surprise, Emmett said he was excited to get back to school to tell all his friends. He even made his best

friend Nick swear not to tell anyone before he could.

"I'm really, really excited to have the chance to go to Brazil, I've watched games before, but never a World Cup game," Emmett said.

"This is going to be a big check off my bucket list," he said.

Baseball season is back in Sanford

League filled with MLB prospects gets ready to batter up next week

It's baseball time again as the Florida Collegiate Summer League heads to the plate next week to start the summer season, and the local Sanford River Rats are looking for a comeback compared to last season.

What's the FCSL? It's a special league of major league prospects who could be on an MLB club soon if history is any judge. MLB clubs have drafted close to 250 players from the FCSL, with nine so far making it to the major league level.

The league brings some family fun aspects not seen in other leagues, including mid-inning kids games on the field with a race around the bases, dizzy bat competitions and other sideshow attractions. With \$3 beer and \$2 hotdogs at Winter Park's ballpark, and \$4 20-ounce beer and same price hotdogs at Sanford Stadium, it's a deal the whole family can afford. Sweetening the deal they're offering two-for-one deals, \$1 beer nights and burger and hotdog deals all season. For the family, the Family Friday deal gets four tickets, four hotdogs, four bags of chips and four soft drinks for \$20.

"We're excited about the 11th season," league president Rob Sitz said. "It's affordable entertainment for the whole family and top notch talent on the field."

Sanford has one of the two longest-lived clubs in FCSL history, celebrating their 11th season on the diamond, only matched by long-time rival the Winter Park Diamond Dawgs. You can meet the Rats at 2 p.m. June 1 at Sanford Memorial Stadium at 1201 Mellonville Ave. in Sanford, or the Dawgs at noon June 1 at Alford Stadium at 801 Orange Avenue in Winter Park.

Last season the Dawgs finished at the top of the league with a 27-13 record and went on to win the championship in the postseason. The Rats finished third with a 21-19 record, though they've been perennial contenders. Can they make it back to the top? It all starts next week.

The Rats will take on the Dawgs three times in the first three days of the season, playing at Sanford Memorial Stadium in the season opener 7 p.m. June 3, then 7 p.m. June 4 at Alford Stadium on Orange Avenue in Winter Park, then back to Sanford at 7 p.m. June 5. Next, the Rats face against the Leesburg Lightening at 7 p.m. June 7 at Sanford Memorial Stadium.



Combining garden strategies and teamwork

From the perspective of the innocent bystander, watching a professional make quick work of an onerous task inspires our interest into attempting the same set of skills. Only with the perspective of age do we learn not to tackle yet another hobby after a mere brush with the finished project. Combining as many tasks with one stroke is the winning strategy of a successful craftsman. With gardening, the motivation to grow some of our own food, tempered with the glow of self sufficiency resulting in the esteem gifted by the accolades of peers, sets many of us on a course of plant husbandry. As it turns out, lost perspective can make digging up the lawn for its own sake hard work!

Digging up the lawn should realize more than exposing the soil beneath the grass. Maybe that one area of turf was problematic, requiring so much more attention than the rest of the lawn. The sprinkler system needed to be rezoned, and now with a food garden in the de-

sign, justification for the expense is now in hand. One of the children has been hankering for a garden space but had to be cajoled to mow the rest of the yard. Collaborating these formative ideas will almost have the sod rolled back on its own volition.

Piecemeal tasks combined into a sanctioned project sometimes create enough al-

lure to leave the shadow of procrastination at the backdoor. As I mentioned in my previous column about up-scaling rain barrels to create fertilizer tea, combining irrigation with fertilizing for fertigation results in the motivation to schlepp the hoses to that zone lacking in the automated oversight.

I rarely set an apprentice on the chore of weeding. If the project is midterm mainte-


nance of a burgeoning crop, with weeding as a mere component, my acolytes stick around long enough not only to pull out the transient plants, but prune the crop du jour, side dress the dirt with granular fertilizer, mulch the intervening spaces, irrigate diligently, and claim a bit of joy in the process.

The ultimate combination is working with friends. As the project manager or foreman, I am not trying to lord over my helpers in an undisclosed goal of easing my personal burden of hard work. Busy fingers consummating a stated goal are not only focused from my broader perspective, but from fewer interruptions gathering necessary tools or supplies. As lead man, elbow-to-elbow, stepping and fetching, keeping the troops producing does not make me the boss, but instead, the best helper you will ever have.


