A Craigslist ad for a house in North Bend, Wash., plays up the home's features, including a greenhouse perfect for growing marijuana. The ad did not provide an address for the house, but described it as "great for running your own business."

Owners asked for \$4,000 a month to rent or \$500,000 to start a short sale. The listing mentioned a greenhouse on the 6.5 acre property several times.

"Green house is set up for specially growing marijuana growing, flowers, veggies," the ad read.

The ad also touted a workshop "with several offices and rooms set up to start plants and wood working" and a kitchen with double ovens. The ad also listed four bedrooms, three and a half baths, a storage outbuilding, RV hookups and central heat among its other features.

The Craigslist post is no longer up. It was flagged for removal.

**From NBCPhiladelphia.com: Burglar steals beers, sleeps on couch**

A 63-year-old Long Neck, Del., woman woke up to find a burglar sleeping on her couch, police said.

The woman woke up at 7 a.m. to find her front door open and a man — who had drunk multiple cans of her beer — snoozing, police said.

The burglar woke up and ran out of the house with a beer still in his hand after the woman told him she was calling the police. Upon arrival, state troopers found the man had cut a screen on the woman's porch to get into the house.

## New owner gets OK to clean up eyesore set for demolition

### Condemned house to be remodeled

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — A burned out house in Vero Lake Estates scheduled for demolition this year will instead be remodeled and prepared for a family to reside in once again.

Terry Schlitt of Vero Beach suc-

cessfully petitioned the Indian River County Board of County Commissioners last week to reverse their decision to demolish a house on a piece of property in Vero Lake Estates that he and his family recently acquired through a county auction.

The house, which is located at 8715 103rd Ave., Vero Beach, caught fire in 2008, destroying the interior of the home and sections of the roof, Mr. Schlitt said.

The three-bedroom, two-bath

home has been vacant since the fire and since no one had stepped forward to fix it and bring it to code standards, county commissioners declared it needed to be demolished and placed a lien on the property for the cost of the demolition.

The demolition contract for the home had already been awarded in a package bid with two other houses in

the county for a total of \$8,500, according to county staff. Commissioners were initially reti-

The not-for-profit organization, Treasure Coast Community Health, opened a new pediatric office in the Village Square area in Sebastian on U.S. 1 and plans to serve children of the uninsured and underinsured in the area.

The décor of the new office space is bright and vivacious with acrylic paintings on canvas made by local fifth-grade class-

rooms adorning the walls.

During last week's open

house events, visitors voted for their favorite painting and the majority of visitors chose "An Apple A Day," made by Summer Maldonado's fifth-grade class at North County Charter School Elementary.

The theme for all of the paintings was "The Best Doctor's Office Ever," and all of the classes interpreted the theme in various ways, from an aquatic waiting room to a garden theme.

The winning class will receive a pizza party, said Vicki Soule, CEO of TCCH.

VERO BEACH — Ruth Moore may be 90 years old, but she still drives to church and out to eat and lives in the same apartment she has lived in for the past 25 years.

Mrs. Moore doesn't worry about the future however, because her home at Indian River Estates East in Vero Beach is a continuous care facility and no matter what her health concerns may be,

whether she can be independent or will need extra care, she is assured all her needs will be met.

Her apartment is decorated from floor to ceiling with her collections of teddy bears and nesting dolls, collections that have grown through the years with gifts given to her by friends she has met during her lifetime, including neighbors at Indian River Estates.

"I have no complaints," Mrs. Moore said about life in the continuous care

facility.

Mrs. Moore is one of 14 remaining "pioneer residents" that still live in the community, which celebrated 25 years of service to the Indian River County community last week.

Wendy Bushong, director of resident services, also celebrated the 25-year anniversary as she continues in the position she has held for that landmark span.

She laughs as she recounts the first few

## System provides phone, e-mail alerts

TREASURE COAST — Dawn Schauman has had nightmares about a day in October 1993 when she was attacked by a bull shark near Vero Beach, she recalled last week.

Then six-months pregnant, she was in the water when the shark slammed into her and spun her around.

Fortunately, she made it back to shore and her baby ended up being OK.

Ever since then, Ms. Schauman has been involved in efforts to make people aware of the dangers of sharks. She's been interviewed by national magazines, such as "Time" and appeared on CNN.

Locally, she started a website that allows people to post messages warning others about the presence of sharks.

With technology having advanced in the ensuing 15 years, she has created a program called My Community Watch that allows police departments, schools, homeowners' associations and others to instantly provide information alerts to those who have signed up for the service.

Treasure Coast Crime Stoppers announced recently that it plans to use the system.

Treasure Coast Crime

Stoppers pays for tips leading to arrests in criminal cases.

"It came about as an outreach effort to expand the eyes and ears of the public," said Ken Wilson, head of Crime Stoppers.

"We want to reach people who are very mobile and who can receive alert messages on their cell phones." Mr. Wilson said it's another way Crime Stoppers can help solve crimes.

One example of an alert would be a description of a vehicle a suspect is driving, he said. They also may alert people of criminal activity in their area, he added.

The system isn't yet up and running for Crime Stoppers, but is expected to be in the next few weeks, he said.

Ms. Schauman said the alert system is available nationwide and that some schools and other organizations in other states are using it, including the Oceanside Police Department in California.

Any organization that needs to notify its members of meetings or other events can use it, she said. They just go on the website, type in the message and those who have signed up receive it instantly, she said.

Those who receive the alerts will sign up for them through a participating

organization.

In some cases, people will be able to register for free to receive the alerts. Other organizations may charge a small monthly fee.

Mr. Wilson said Crime Stoppers was hoping to pay for use of the system through business donations so those who receive the alerts would not be charged.

years on the job and recalls how "green" she was, something the residents didn't have the heart to tell her at the time.

Now when she organizes day trips to the theater or extended trips, such as cruises, the residents lovingly call her "mother" for the care and concern she has for them.

Mrs. Moore moved into the retirement community 25 years ago with her husband, Dick, who is now deceased.

"Dick was 16 years older than me, and he wanted a place where we could be cared for if anything happened, and 25 years ago, he said it's time. He went and did quite a lot of research and saw what he liked here and we moved here from Vista Royale," Mrs. Moore said.

When they first moved in, the apartments were all completed, but the hallways were still uncarpeted and the dining hall wasn't completed, Mrs. Moore said.

Mrs. Moore enjoys spending time in her apartment with her cat, Pepper, a recent adoptee from the Humane Society of Vero Beach and Indian River County. She also serves as volunteer hospitality chairwoman on a rotating basis and volunteers as a "friendly visitor" in the wards of the medical facility on campus, WillowBrooke Court.

While there, she visits with residents being cared for various ailments, including dementia.

While her husband was ill and before he died, he, too, was cared for at WillowBrooke Court and she enjoys giving back to her own community by taking time with the residents there.

"I talk with them, and they talk to me. We also sing songs, hymns and they know all the words," Mrs. Moore said with a smile.

Mrs. Moore attributes her

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — An adult culinary program is being offered on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and all day on Saturday. Class runs from Aug. 18-Dec. 20 and successful students will leave with the skills and certificates needed to work in the food industry.

TCCH location to open in Sebastian, but is the only office to in the county to just address pediatric needs.

Mai Tran will be the physician working out of the office, moving from the Fellsmere office.

TCCH is a federally qualified health center, and the only one in Indian River County, said Colette Heid, public relations and grant development writer.

As such, the organization maintains the highest quality standards required for a health center and compared to the Florida average, TCCH scores very well, she said.

As a federally qualified health center, the organization provides quality healthcare to members of the community regardless of their status with insurance companies and ability to pay. Their target patients are those who are uninsured or underinsured, but that is not a limiting factor on who they will treat, directors said.

"We are not a free clinic and we're not just for poor people," said Ms. Soule, addressing a common misconception among the public.

Uninsured patients are

seen on a sliding payment scale, based on patient income and family size, or federal poverty guidelines.

The organization also accepts insurance from third-party insurance companies, Florida Healthy Kids, Medicare and Medicaid, worker's compensation and various other plans, she said.

The organization relies on subsidies from federal, state and local governments and grants to cover the cost of the uninsured.

About 15,000 patients were served at the TCCH locations last year, and approximately one-third of those patients were children, said Linda Costa, TCCH CFO.

The new office has three exam rooms, a triage room and office space for the doctor and staff.

TCCH also offers a small in-house pharmacy for dispensing the medications prescribed by the physician.

The hours for the new office will be Monday and Thursday, 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.; Tuesday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Wednesday, 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and Friday, 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

## Pay attention to what your mouse tells you

One of the things that I've noticed over the years is that it's real easy to forget to pay attention to what the mouse is doing.

With everything else that happens on a typical computer, it's easy to get distracted by all the other "stuff" that's going around the pointer and you end up missing clues that your mouse is trying to tell you.

A lot of people don't realize just how precise and instrument the mouse really is. The very tip of the pointer, when pointed at objects just so, will often reveal clues that can be used to help you do whatever it is that you are trying to do. The secret is to pause at an object and see if something happens.

Many times, objects on computer screens, such as buttons, icons and such, will respond not just when clicked, but often when the mouse just passes over. These "mouse-overs" can be the source of many a hint to help you on your way.

You may have noticed while browsing the Internet that some things on websites change as you move your mouse around. Sometimes a button will change color or a picture title will appear if the mouse is held over it for long enough. If your mouse passes over a link, the pointer may change from an arrow to a pointing finger.

In Windows programs, buttons, menus and controls often brighten as your mouse passes over them to give you a visual clue you are now pointing at a clickable control. There, again, the secret is to pass your mouse slowly over an object and pay attention in order to see anything.

The reason I keep harping on that is sometimes I work with someone who just can't resist the urge to wiggle that mouse. Every time something's loading or we're trying to work out how to do something, he's moving the mouse all over the screen.

Many times we'll be trying to work out a procedure but with that mouse flying all over, we can't get any thinking done. But, as soon as the mouse stops, and we start pointing at things and pausing and start paying attention to our mouse, we start to make progress.

So what are some of the clues to watch for when your pointer passes over something?

Well, one of the things that you'll likely see is your pointer will turn into a double-sided arrow. If you will notice, when the very tip of your pointer moves over the very edge of certain objects (such as the edge of a window), the pointer will sometimes turn into a double-sided arrow. This is your computer's way of telling you that you can stretch whatever it is that you are currently pointing at. All you have to do is click and hold while it's a double arrow and you should be able to change the size that object just by dragging the mouse.

In many Microsoft programs such as Internet Explorer, Outlook Express and Word, holding your mouse over buttons and controls will often yield a small pop-up window with a short, two- or three-word description of the control. The thing is, many times this little pop-up doesn't appear for a second or so, so if you're all over the place with the mouse, you just may miss it.

In things such as word processors or e-mail programs, you may notice the mouse turns into this oversized capital "I." This pointer is called the "I beam," and its shape is specifically designed to get right between the letters.

When your pointer turns into an I beam, that's your clue that the part of the screen you're pointing at is for typing.

Yeah, there sure is a lot on a computer that can serve to distract you. One of the best ways to stay on track is to pay attention to what your mouse is pointing at, take it easy and follow your mouse. Many times the answers that you are looking for are right under your pointer.

But in this high stakes chess game of the rich and powerful, we are not helpless pawns. We can fight back with the "power of the purchase." I do this whenever I go to the store by reading labels and buying products that proudly proclaim, "Made in the USA." In the process, I have noticed surprising things. For example, why do some stores sell chop meat containing meat from other countries? Why go through all the trouble and expense of importing beef when we have so many cattle right here in the good old USA? The resulting "meat melange" has a stringy texture and an inferior taste. Also, considering the abundance of Florida's orange groves, why do some brands of orange juice contain juice from far-away places, where sanitation standards might not meet ours? Orange juice made only from Florida oranges gets my vote and earns my purchase. Looking down at us from their ivory towers, some politicians and business people spit the word "protectionist" like it is a curse. To me, it is a badge of honor. We protect our loved ones and homes. Protecting our jobs and children is a part of this. Buying one American product at a time, we can rebuild the nation's economy and ensure our children's future.

#### Stop the double talk



cent to give Mr. Schlitt the opportunity to remodel the property because the contract had already been awarded, and for fear that the remodel project would be out another two years, leaving the house vacant, but Mr. Schlitt assured them his plan was to begin the project on or about June 13 and he had ready cash available for it.

He also contacted the demolition company, Red-

mark Construction, and made certain the county's standing and reputation would not be impacted by the county withdrawing the most expensive of the three demolition projects.

Mr. Schlitt said he would use the company to do a partial teardown on his property and the company was OK with that.

Before the commissioners agreed to withhold the demolition, Mr. Schlitt had to prove the exterior walls of the home would be structurally sound and his finances were

sufficient to complete the project in a timely manner.

Mr. Schlitt's presentation to the commissioners showed that he expected to spend about \$80,000 on the project to get the home back in order, which would give him an approximate return on investment of 13.5 percent after it was sold.

By returning the house to livable status, Mr. Schlitt said it would benefit the community and county by enhancing curb appeal, provide a safer environment and be a small step in rebuilding the

economy.

He expects to have the project complete by Oct. 1.

The commissioners agreed with him and were glad to find an alternative to destroying the house.

"Get 'er done," said Commissioner Wesley Davis.

"Come back with a tax bill," Commission Chairman Bob Solari said with a laugh.



# Great homemade salad dressings

Hello, smart shoppers, hope you had a good week.

Before we begin, I'd like to try and answer a reader's question concerning the white goopy stuff that appears when cooking salmon.

I asked my son, Guy, and his answer is you're cooking the fish too long and that stuff is the fat. Stop cooking before it appears or remove it with a brush or paper towel.

Let's face it, it's summertime, time for light, quick meals. Salads with "good for you" dressings is my pick for this week.

Last week I introduced you to great websites that duplicate famous restaurant specialties just check out copy-cat recipes.

This week it's Olive Garden's house dressing.

Have you ever noticed how many people seem to appear to be working real hard at cutting the fat and watching their diet? Do you ever wonder why according to reports, Americans are getting heavier than ever? Why do you suppose that's happening?

Fat soothes the soul and fills the tummy. Because something is low fat doesn't mean you can eat twice as much. Calories count for something and common sense has to play an important part in lifestyles. Didn't we know that?

Many of us are hitting those wonderful salad bars in restaurants. Greens are good for you and fat free, right? That may be so, but when you scoop on globs of that wonderful, creamy

dressing you are many times getting the equivalent in fat of a prime-rib dinner.

A friend of mine, many years ago, ran a diet clinic. She said fill the ladle with dressing, then pour out most of it and just use those last drippings to top your salad.

Doesn't sound too appealing, does it? You have three choices: use an oil and vinegar dressing, make one of my low-fat dressings and bring it with you when you eat out or bring along one of those oddly thick (yuck) bottled, fat-free dressings.

I created my own bleu cheese dressing and recently made it low fat. No way to make it fat free since bleu cheese is high in fat, but by using a small amount of cheese, you can make an allowable dressing.

Thousand Island dressing is another favorite and the original was not a mixture of ketchup, mayonnaise and relish. I found a copy of the original many years ago. The chef on a ship in the area of the Thousand Islands used what he had on hand to create the dressing, thus the name.

The 1,000 Islands are a group of islands in the St. Lawrence River in New York state. They lie in a 40-mile stretch of the St. Lawrence as it leaves Lake Ontario. They are formed when the river flows over the low hills

of the Canadian shield, which extends southeast into New York. Thank you, World Book Encyclopedia!

Enjoy your salads and delicious dressings. See you next week.

## BLEU CHEESE DRESSING Regular and low fat

- 1 cup mayonnaise (regular, low fat or fat free)
- 1 cup sour cream (regular, low fat or fat free)
- 1/2-teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon parsley flakes
- 1/2-teaspoon salt
- 1/4-teaspoon pepper
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice, fresh or bottled
- 1-2 ounces crumbled bleu cheese or more to taste

Place all ingredients, except bleu cheese, in a blender and blend until smooth. Place in container and stir in bleu cheese.

Mixture will be thick. Do not thin at this time. Cover and refrigerate at least two hours. If mixture is still too thick, thin with a little milk. This will keep in refrigerator for at least two weeks.

## THOUSAND ISLAND DRESSING Regular and low fat

- 1 cup mayonnaise (regular, low fat or fat free)
- 3 (or more) tablespoons chili sauce\*
- 1 chopped hard boiled egg
- 1 teaspoon chopped green pepper
- 2 teaspoons chopped

pimento olives  
1 teaspoon chopped fresh chives or 1 teaspoon dried  
1 teaspoon parsley flakes

\*Ketchup may be substituted; for that, add 1 tablespoon lemon juice or white vinegar.

Mix all together, cover and chill for several hours before serving. If dressing is too thick, add a little water.

## OLIVE GARDEN HOUSE DRESSING (NIB)

- 8 ounces Paul Newman's Vinegar and Oil dressing
- 1 clove garlic, peeled and minced
- 1/2-teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2-teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 tablespoon sugar or equivalent amount sugar substitute

Place ingredients into the bottle of dressing; shake well. Refrigerate 24 hours before using.

served on a large, soft roll and can handle lots of meats, toppings and saturation from barbecue sauce if necessary. The end result is a finger-lickin' good sandwich.

His method of preparing the smoked meats is a long process, but worth it for the flavor and texture of the meat when it is done.

Instead of smoking the meat for a while, and then steaming it until it falls off the bone, his smoked meats remain intact, but full of rich flavor, he said.

Serving fresh fish purchased from local business Indian River Seafood is also a big attraction, Mr. Birch said.

The fresh fish comes in daily and he enjoys preparing new dishes with whatever the catch of the day is.

Recently, he added crab cakes to the menu for a limited time and can't make enough of them.

"I really can't keep them in the house. People just love them. I don't use any filler, so it's just the crab, no bread," Mr. Birch said.

"You will feel like you're outside, but you'll really be inside," he said.

"You don't have to drive to Melbourne or to Vero for nice different food at a decent price. Stay right here in Sebastian," Mr. Birch said.



# Which trees are hurricane resistant?

With the forecast of an above-average 2011 hurricane season, planting trees and shrubs that have a high degree of wind resistance is almost crucial.

Also, you need to be sure your existing trees are ready for the onslaught of tropical storm or hurricane force winds.

The first thing to do is to prune any dead or diseased foliage from the plant. You also should prune your tree so it has a lower center of gravity. You can achieve this by pruning some of the branches from the top of the tree.

When you prune trees and make the foliage of the tree less dense, it will not cause as much wind resistance and will give the tree a better chance of surviving high winds.

Another point of concern is a tree's root system. If a plant has a deep, healthy root system, the tree will stand a better chance of surviving the storm without toppling over.

To achieve this, be sure to fertilize on a regular basis and maintain a balanced watering schedule. All the above will help develop a deep, healthy root system.

The best trees to plant in your yard for good wind resistance are trees that are native to our region, such as the foxtail palm, tipochina, bottlebrush, live oak, crepe Myrtle, magnolia and I also have had good luck with traveler's palm.

My traveler's palm survived several hurricanes, although the delicate leaves had a lot of shredding.

Once the tree is pruned

back after a storm, it grows back well in a couple of months.

One of the worst trees to plant is the queen palm because the root systems are so shallow, the tree blows over easily.

If you mow your own lawn, you know some of the challenges you face to get that great, lush, sculptured look.

In order to have your mowing experience a success, your mower itself needs to be in tip-top condition.

The first thing to do is be sure you use fresh gas. If you plan on storing your gas in a large container for an entire season, be sure to use a fuel-stabilizer. This will keep the fuel fresh for six months or more instead of the usual 30 days. Follow the directions on the fuel stabilizer bottle.

Next check the mower deck and the blade. Clean the bottom of your deck on a regular basis and remove any debris that might accumulate. This is especially important if you use your mower to mulch the grass clippings. If you have an old blade, replace it. A new, sharp, well-balanced blade will cut your grass blades with a nice even texture and not rip the grass like a dull blade might. The result will be a beautiful carpet of freshly cut turf.

There are several things you can do to extend the life

of your mower and ensure it starts when you want it to.

Probably the most important is changing the oil. Change your mower oil at least every six months and even more often if you use it for commercially or mow several lawns weekly.

If you buy a new mower, it is important to change the oil the first time after about 10 hours of use. This is to ensure you are not re-circulating any metal chips that may be present in the new engine before it is broken in.

After the initial oil change, you can then follow the regular schedule. This rule also applies to generators, weed wackers and almost any tool that uses a small gasoline engine.

The air filter is another hot spot that is often overlooked. A dirty filter can cause stalling, hard starting and rough idle. If you experience engine problems, this is the first place you should check.

Finally, check your sparkplug. A worn or dirty plug can cause a multitude of problems from hard starting to not starting at all.

A common problem is adding too much oil to the crankcase. Overfilling the oil can lead to smoking, oil clogging the air filter and stalling. Always fill only to the full mark on the dipstick. Some mowers have a relatively foolproof system where you simply fill the oil reservoir until you visually see the oil topping out. Always follow the instructions for your particular mower.

# GPS could improve your game

Most new cars have it. Your cell phone has a chip for it. You can even go down to the local electronics store and pick up a tracking device that has it.

The "it" to which I am referring is a global positioning satellite system or GPS.

In today's high-tech world, people all over the planet are using GPS, whether they realize it or not. The system uses an array of satellites orbiting the Earth to pinpoint locations within a couple of feet and smart golfers are using this same technology to improve their games.

For the recreational golfer, the advent of the GPS system has been a God-send. Since we cannot afford or even find a golf course with caddies, it can be time consuming and tedious work to find out yardages while playing the course. With GPS, golfers get more information than even the best caddie could provide, for a fraction of the cost.

In the past, I had a GPS unit. The unfortunate drawback to some company's products is their "requirement" that you pay a yearly fee to keep the unit up-to-date or to download the course you plan to play. Once my initial year passed, the unit became a paper weight.

Fortunately, one company is changing this. GolfBuddy ([www.golfbuddy-global.com](http://www.golfbuddy-global.com)) is perhaps the best and most economical GPS systems for golf. With five models to choose from and a world-wide course library, anyone can find a GolfBuddy GPS unit to fit his or her needs. In addition to units that

store up to 40,000 golf courses, each GolfBuddy unit comes with no activation or annual fees. Once you purchase the unit, you just turn it on and play.

I few months ago, I put the GolfBuddy World unit through its paces and compared it to my laser that I'd been using. I have been a tough convert from laser to GPS, but I think GolfBuddy may have convinced me that I truly need and can rely on their products to improve my game and make my rounds more enjoyable.

My shock- and water-resistant unit came with courses from across the globe already pre-loaded. In fact, the unit is so smart that when I turn it on as I arrive at the course, it figures out where I am and what course I am about to play. As you play, the unit automatically advances to the next hole and will even keep your score.

One huge advantage of GPS over laser, is the ability to know the distance to objects that you cannot see or that are too flat for a laser to pick up. Fairway bunkers, water hazards and other targets are all programmed in and the yardage to get to or get over them is displayed.

If you want to cut a corner on a sharp dogleg at a course you've never played before, it helps to know if there is a hazard waiting around that corner and how far you need to hit the ball to clear it. Another great feature of

my GolfBuddy is the distance measuring tool. After you select your club, you tell the unit to store a way-point or mark. When you get to where your ball landed, the unit tells you how many yards you are from your initial point. It's a humbling way to find out just how far you hit your driver. Knowing how far you hit each of your clubs is of incredible value and helps your game management tremendously.

The units also feature a bright, high-resolution, color, full-function touch screen. I use a tee to move the marker around to where the flag is or to anywhere I want to know the distance to. You can even zoom in to the green and see just what perils lies between you and the flag.

My game will also benefit from the statistical analysis module. Here I keep track of my fairways hit, greens in regulation, penalty strokes, putts and more. With just a couple taps on the screen, I can see just where my game is struggling or where my round went horribly wrong.

Some units feature multiple languages and all come with a rechargeable lithium ion battery and a holster to clip it in a safe place.

Soon, everyone will have their own GPS for golf. We'll simply turn it on and off we go. We'll get all the information about the course we need without the snickering from a caddie when we hit that bad shot.
