A suburban Phoenix man is recovering after police said he accidentally shot himself in the penis while putting his girlfriend's gun in the waistband of his pants.

Chandler Police said 27-year-old Joshua Seto and his fiancée, Cara Christopher, were walking toward a grocery store when the shooting happened. The gun fired, striking Seto's penis and continuing through his left thigh.

The Arizona Republic reports a 911 operator told Christopher to apply direct pressure to the wound with a dry towel or T-shirt.

Chandler Police Detective Seth Tyler was unsure of the type of gun or whether it had a safety that was off. He also said it's unclear if Seto has been released from the hospital or suffered any permanent damage.

Tyler warned residents to use holsters, not waistbands, if they're going to carry a handgun.

Federal officials get update on biofuels plant in Vero Beach

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — The Indian River BioEnergy Center received some attention from the federal department of agriculture last week and will soon receive a \$75 million loan guarantee.

U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack visited the biofuel facility on Aug. 11 and received a private update from company execu-

tives and directors on the status of the project construction and ultimate goals.

The USDA loan will provide the project the financial backing it needs to get started and is a promise to assume the debt obligation if the borrower defaults.

The facility, which is being built on the site of the former Ocean Spray factory and is designed to use the same footprint as the factory, is expected to be fully constructed by April 2012, and com-

Soccer program receives state recognition

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — What's black and white and green all over? A well-used soccer ball between the feet of players in the Indian River Soccer Association.

As many as 1,100 children per year experience soccer through the Indian River Soccer Associa-

tion's many competitive and recreational teams, including nearly 50 developmentally disadvantaged children and teens.

The Outreach Program for Soccer, TOPSoccer or TOPS, is geared toward giving young people with disabilities an opportunity to play soccer, said program coordinator Joe Duffy.

"It's a non-competitive, exercise-based league with an emphasis on fun," Mr. Duffy said.

Two weeks ago, the Florida Youth Soccer Association named the IRSA's TOPS program the best in the state.

"This year, we got the label of best club in the state, but I think that's a little bit much," Mr. Duffy said.

Mr. Duffy was also named Coach of the Year by the organization earlier this year.

He believes the accolades are due to the work he has done to bring attention to the program at a statewide level, including creating a category for TOPS players in a regional tournament


MICCO — A well-decorated local female softball player has now been entered into the history books.

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — When money is tight, families try to make do with less, but when it comes to healthcare, that may not always be the best option.

Bob Boob and John Merchant, members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3918, have collected hand-capped equipment that people no longer use, such as canes, walkers, crutches and wheelchairs, and made them available to other veterans in the area at no cost.

That small project, designed to alleviate some of the cost of recovering from surgery or an injury, or merely to improve quality of life, has blossomed into a program open to the entire community.

"It really just sort of happened," said Mr. Boob.

"People wouldn't need things anymore and they would ask if we knew of anyone who did," he said.

The items given away by the VFW Post 3918 are

donated, cleaned up and repaired, if needed, before being given to others. Many times, the items are barely used, but cannot be returned to the retailer and hospice can't accept them and give them out due to liability, Mr. Boob said.

But as a nonprofit, the post can help the community in that way, he said.

"Nowadays, a lot of things are not covered by insurance companies. If people have needs for when they are recovering or going to physi-

cal therapy and they don't have insurance coverage, they can call us and we'll see if we have what they need," Mr. Boob said.

The post has a small storage area holds the donated items until they are needed. Items they accept include portable commodes, canes, walkers, both with and without wheels, crutches and other small equipment to help disabled people get around and comfortable, said Mr. Merchant.

Beds are not accepted due to their large size, he said.

Mr. Boob says he enjoys loading up his trusty pickup truck to deliver the needed

equipment to people around the county.

"One lady had broken her leg and had it in a soft cast and couldn't get around real well and she got a wheelchair from us. She said she didn't know what she'd do without it," Mr. Boob said.

"They're real happy to know that there is some help out there," Mr. Merchant said.

sponsored by Kohl's Department Store.

He said watching the children gain confidence in their skills on the field is quite exciting and makes the job of directing the program completely worth it.

Mr. Duffy is also on track to bring another tournament to the area that will include games for the TOPS players.

"I'm not about the accolades. I'm happy we got the two awards, but it's really about the kids. That's my joy and it's my passion," Mr. Duffy said.

Mr. Duffy and his family have been involved with TOPS for many years, including before they moved to Indian River County from Boca Raton,

where he first became involved with coaching and leading soccer teams for children and teens with developmental disabilities.

"My No. 1 partner is my wife, Michelle. I couldn't do it without her," Mr. Duffy said.

The league attempts to be self-supporting through fundraisers, sponsors and grant funding to keep costs low for parents.

"The unemployment here in Vero Beach is high and funds are hard to come by for IRSA families just like it is anywhere else," Mr. Duffy said.

He said he expects 20 to 30 new kids to join in this new soccer season, which means more new equipment will need to be acquired, so donations and sponsorships are a big need.

Sponsors will get their

names on banners, on uniforms and on volunteer T-shirts, as well as a whole lot of gratitude from the families of the players, Mr. Duffy said.

The IRSA is celebrating 25 years of providing an avenue for local children, youth and adults to play recreational and competitive soccer. The nonprofit association is not county subsidized and is funded through corporate sponsorships and player fees.

Recreational soccer teams are being currently being assembled and registration is open for children ages 4 to 15. Registration fees paid before Sept. 5 are \$139 for the year, or \$99 for a single season.

missioned in the second quarter of 2012, said Peter Williams, chairman of the joint venture project known as INEOS New Planet BioEnergy and CEO of INEOS Bio.

Secretary Vilsack said the bioenergy center is the perfect example of companies rising to the challenge put forth by President Barack Obama to decrease American dependence on oil by creating alternative fuels.

By committing the \$75 million loan from the biorefinery assistance program, he hopes the company will be able to jumpstart their development of bioenergy feedstock fuels and influence others to do the same.

"I look forward to the work being done here in the future," Secretary Vilsack said.

He also announced a series of smaller grants, totaling \$12 million that will be given to various organizations to start research to improve current biofuel and bioenergy techniques in efficiency and cost-effectiveness.

The University of Florida will receive about \$1.07 million of the grant funds, department officials said.

The Indian River BioEnergy

Center is designed to produce 8 million gallons of advanced bioethanol per year from renewable biomass including yard, wood and vegetative wastes, and generate clean renewable power for export to the local market, according to a press release.

Penny Chandler, president of Indian River County Chamber of Commerce,

attended the press conference open to the media and local officials and said she was extremely pleased with the construction progress.

"They could be anywhere in the world and they chose here," Ms. Chandler said.

As a result of the company moving to the county and information about their progress being documented

in trade magazines, other renewable energy, or "green," companies have taken notice and have expressed initial interest in bringing some of their product to Indian River County, but the process is long and slow, she said.

"It's very exciting," Ms. Chandler said.



rated above average for open-heart surgery results based on data provided by a national cardiac surgery database, according to a press release.

"We are very proud of our very talented team of cardiovascular surgeons, cardiac anesthesiologists, nurses, technicians and ancillary staff, who together are pro-

ducing world-class cardiovascular surgery right here on the Treasure Coast," said Jeffrey L. Susi, president and CEO of Indian River Medical Center, in a press release.

"We congratulate them on this great accomplishment," he said.

The September issue will feature ratings for 323 surgical groups across the country that perform heart-bypass surgery, allowing heart-bypass patients to compare surgical groups on

survival, complications and other measures.

Only 81 groups in the nation received an above-average rating, and only five of them were in Florida, hospital officials said.

The other Florida hospitals to receive the rating were Memorial Regional Hospital in Hollywood, Monroe Medical Regional Center in Ocala, Morton Plant Hospital in Clearwater and Winter Haven Hospital in Winter Haven.

"We are the only one on the east coast to receive the rating," said Jason Nance, director of cardiovascular services for the hospital, in an interview.

The rating is based on data submitted to the Society of Thoracic Surgeons Adult Cardiac Surgery database by actual open-heart patient outcomes.

Mr. Nance said the recognition for the heart center

sion with other seniors from the Florida area, who are 70 to 75 years old and as such, has qualified in the hall of fame as a pioneer hall of famer.

Mrs. Boyd was nominated for the hall of fame by friends on the team who believe her skills, knowledge and dedication to the sport set her apart from other players.

Her humble spirit was honored by the nomination, but it almost stopped her from submitting a formal application. But her friends convinced her to go through with it.

"It was a lot of work to put the book (application) together. There are a lot of things I didn't even remember I've played so long," Mrs. Boyd said.

When she is at home, she occasionally likes to head to the fields and play with the

Sebastian senior men's team, the Sebastian Old Boys.

"One time I played with them and it was against Vero Beach for the Senior Games, a qualifier for the Senior Olympics. I pitched and it was tied up after the seven innings, so when that happens, we put a runner on second for the extra innings.

"I got up to bat and I hit a grass cutter right down the first base line. It ended up being a home run and we won," Mrs. Boyd said.

"The old Vero Beach guys, well, they weren't so happy," she said with a delighted grin.

The National Senior Softball Hall of Fame is organized by the Softball Players Association, an organization established in 1992 as the third senior softball organization in the country.

Mrs. Boyd has played softball since she was a young girl, and recalls playing catch when she was very small and playing on her high-school

fast-pitch team.

"We play slow-pitch softball now, well, because that's the way we all move," she said with a smile.

Over her softball career, Mrs. Boyd has played many positions, from the outfield to a lively shortstop with a cannonball arm.

Her consistency in pitching was mentioned many times by teammates in letters of recommendation.

"She has the gift of pitching to the inside corner to get opposing batters to hit to our strong left or left center fielders," wrote teammate Ethel Lehmann, who was a co-founder of the Freedom Spirit of Florida and 2008 inductee into the hall of fame.

Mrs. Boyd was the leadoff hitter and driving force behind establishing a 40 and older recreational league in Montgomery County, Md., an action that earned her an induction into the Washington Metropolitan Senior

Softball Hall of Fame in 1998.

"And that league is still in existence today," Ms. Boyd said.

Her venture into playing senior softball herself began 18 years ago when she was 56 and played with the Golden Girls of Vienna, Va. She played with them until she and her husband, now deceased, moved to Florida, where she was recruited by the Freedom Spirit of Florida.

Although the team is based in Clearwater, Mrs. Boyd is a loyal teammate and travels to practices during the busy part of the softball season, and plays in tournaments with a good-natured, yet competitive spirit.

She continues playing the sport for the genuine love of the game and the camaraderie, even through injury and illness.

Mrs. Boyd has been in remission from cancer for five years and is very grateful to have the health she does so embraces all the physical

activity she can.

"Staying active is very important to me. I've got a pedometer and my goal is to walk 10,000 steps a day," Mrs. Boyd said.

"I use the Wii, I play tennis, walk; even today I was carrying boxes of food for the food pantry at my church," she said.

Just five weeks after surgery to remove cancerous tissue five years ago, Mrs. Boyd pitched in a softball tournament in St. Petersburg.

"We won that tournament," she said with a laugh. Playing senior softball for so long has given Mrs. Boyd many dear friends who are like a support group.

The teammates often send encouraging notes to one another and often pray for each other when there are needs and concerns and even share favorite books through the mail.

"It's really like a family," Mrs. Boyd said.

Where were you on Sept. 11, 2001?

UNDER ATTACK

Tuesday, Sept. 11, 2001, I had just gotten my coffee and settled into my desk at The Jupiter Courier, ready to tackle a normal Tuesday deadline day. The small TV in the newsroom was droning on as it usually did — at that moment, the Today Show was on — and I was doing what I usually do, keeping half an ear tuned in for anything interesting.

When the plane crashed into the World Trade Center, Tower 1, I turned around from my computer screen and watched for a scant second. Wow. Someone just flew a plane into the World Trade Center. How does that happen? How can you miss a hundred-something story building?

Strange, but OK. It's New York. Strange things happen there. Nothing worth deviating from the deadline task in front of me, putting together the pages of the twice-weekly paper that covered the local community, a quiet northern Palm Beach County town many miles away from New York skyscrapers. I went back to work.

The TV droned on. At approximately 9:03 a.m., a second plane hit the second tower. I knew, in that instant, as did the rest of the world, that the first crash was no accident. The words "WE ARE UNDER ATTACK" floated in front of my eyes.

I blinked, and in a split second, I was transported back to my Army basic training days, garbed in camouflage, waiting in line to pick up my weapon and my orders to fight.

I blinked again, and was back in front of my computer screen. My managing editor was barking orders to scrap the day's lineup of city council meeting stories and school news while she rushed back to her own computer to write something pertinent and timely related to the days' events, still unfolding amid the hushed tones of the national news anchors, who themselves were watching the twin towers crumble in front of their eyes in real time, just like we were.

A year later, the shock and awe still hadn't subsided. We

had just launched the first editions of *Hometown News*, and were putting together the edition commemorating the first anniversary of the Sept. 11 attacks. The events that changed the world as we knew it were still fresh in the minds of readers, many of whom were personally touched in some way and shared their stories with us.

There was the crane operator who had just retired to south Stuart, who happened to be in New York the day of the attacks and didn't leave until three weeks later, volunteering his time to help move debris and clear paths for rescue workers. There was a woman who lost her daughter in the attacks but still refused to believe her little girl was gone. There were numerous law enforcement and fire rescue personnel who traveled to ground zero to help, from cataloging remains to arranging for food delivery.

For the first time in my life, I understood what the words "indelibly etched" in one's mind meant. For the people we talked to, the memories, the pictures, will never go away. The memories of those interviews are indelibly etched in my mind.

On Friday, Sept. 9, 2011, we will publish an edition dedicated to the 10th anniversary of Sept. 11, 2001. *Hometown News* isn't unique; media outlets all over the world will be commemorating this milestone.

What we hope will be unique is your voice, in addition to our reporting. For our Sept. 9 edition, we are opening up our Viewpoint pages for your stories and thoughts: Where were you on Sept. 11, 2001? How did the attacks affect you personally?

How has the world changed in 10 years? How has your view of the world changed?

We would like to share your thoughts and memories with our readers. Ten years later, we want to hear what you

Mr. Nance said since the heart center opened in 2006 900 patients have

used the center, with about 180 patients this year.

The heart center is affiliated with the Duke University Health System, and offers a comprehensive cardiac program from advanced diagnostics, to cardiac catheterization through the wrist, said Betsy Whisman, director of marketing and public relations.

Traditionally, cardiac catheterization is done through groin access, but

'Melt' veggies for traditional spaghetti sauce

Hello smart shoppers. Every couple of years I find it necessary to repeat my family's superb spaghetti sauce recipe, so here it is. Why no company can make a great sauce is beyond me, but I've yet to find anything comparable.

The recipe is from my mother and my father's mother; together it's the best. I was told to use an Italian brand of tomatoes since they're made with plum tomatoes, which are sweeter.

A basic tomato sauce, one to which you will add meat if you choose, does not contain oregano. Oregano is used in a marinara sauce that does not contain meat. Marinara sauce is served plain or with seafood. Disagree? That's fine, that's what it's all about, but try my sauce and you be the judge.

The secret to great tomato sauce is in the

ingredients and in the method of cooking. One thing you really need is a large heavy pot, so if you don't have one now is the time.

Gone are the days when I used lard or bacon drippings. After learning my cholesterol was too high I changed many of my recipes to eliminate, if possible, high-fat and high-cholesterol ingredients. Today, my sauce is virtually fat free. But amazingly, it's still delicious. Adding grated Romano cheese to the sauce as it cooks adds a little fat but so much flavor. See you next week!

SPAGHETTI SAUCE Serves 6 or more

- 1 large (28-ounce) can tomato puree
- 1 large (28-ounce) can crushed tomatoes with added puree
- 2 small (6-ounce) cans tomato paste
- 2 large onions
- 2 medium carrots
- 2 large cloves garlic
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 5 or 6 large fresh basil leaves, whole, or 1 tablespoon dried basil
- Pinch of dried rosemary, crushed between fingers

Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley (chopped) or 1 tablespoon dried parsley
1 handful grated Romano cheese
1-1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon pepper
Few shakes crushed red pepper (optional)
Water or chicken broth

Peel onions and garlic; trim and scrub carrots. Carrots contain a natural sugar, which usually eliminates the need for added sugar.

Chop vegetables very fine (a food processor is great for this). Sauté in a large pot in the oil or water if you want a completely fat-free sauce. As Mama used to say, "You must cook the vegetables until they almost melt."

Since you are using a very small amount of oil you must keep adding water, about a cup at a time, as it cooks down. This is the longest preparation process for the sauce and can take about 30 minutes. When I decide to make sauce I double or triple the recipe and freeze it in suitable size containers for future meals.

Add tomato paste and cook a few minutes, stirring constantly. Add remaining ingredients and liquid until thinned to desired consistency. Stir well; bring to a boil. Lower heat to just a simmer, cover and let cook for 2 hours, stirring occasionally.

Remember, a burnt sauce is bitter and cannot be

fixed.

ANY FRUIT COBBLER (NIB) Regular and low cholesterol Serves 6

- 1/2 stick butter or 1/4-cup butter substitute such as Smart Balance
- 4 cups peeled and sliced peaches, nectarines or apples
- 1/2-cup sugar or 1/4-cup Splenda
- 1 tablespoon plus 2/3-cup biscuit mix, regular or low-fat
- 1/2-teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 tablespoons firmly packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons milk*

*If using skim milk add 1 teaspoon more Smart Balance.

In 1-quart shallow casserole combine fruit, sugar, 1 tablespoon biscuit mix and cinnamon.

In medium bowl mix remaining 2/3-cup biscuit mix with brown sugar. Using an electric mixer cut in butter or substitute until mixture is the size of small peas. Stir in milk until moistened. Drop batter by spoonfuls onto fruit.

Bake at 400-degrees for 30 minutes until toothpick inserted into crust comes out clean. Let stand 5 minutes.

MICROWAVE FUDGE

This quick fudge is high fat because of the butter, but what fudge isn't?

- One (1 pound) box confectioner's sugar
- 1/2-cup cocoa
- 1 stick butter
- 1/4-cup milk
- 1/2-cup chopped nuts
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift sugar and cocoa into ungreased 9-inch square microwave-safe glass pan. Cut butter into five pieces on top. Pour in milk; DO NOT STIR.

Cook on high in microwave two to three minutes until bubbling. Remove from microwave; stir thoroughly; blend in nuts and vanilla; spread evenly.

Refrigerate one hour, cut into squares.

You'll be treated like a president at President Country Club

The best way to get the best service and treatment is to be the president. Because the chance of that happening for nearly every one of us is nil, the best way to get the service you'd enjoy if you were president is to play at the facility that carries the name, The President Country Club.

Just one course wouldn't be enough for a president to enjoy, so here you get 36 beautiful holes tucked into an oasis just off Palm Beach Lakes Boulevard right in the heart of West Palm Beach.

The club recently changed hands, with Ray Finch, owner of Hammock Creek in Palm City, closing on the course just days before I played. What drew him to the course is the downtown location.

The club is just minutes from the airport, the turnpike, Interstate-95 and U.S. 1. Golfers who work in the downtown area can see their first shot land in the fairway just minutes after finishing a long day at work. The 40-year-old club also features a mammoth clubhouse, perfect for weddings, banquets, reunions and more.

I found the conditions to be very good, but Finch plans to ramp them up even more. Feeling that the course has slipped in the past few years, Finch stated, "We are making a significant effort to get playing conditions back by the fall."

A couple of weeks ago, Finch invited some of my colleagues and me out to play his new track. Not

only were we treated with the friendliness we have come to expect from the staff at his courses, but also I was shocked that such a great course was so close to me and I'd yet to discover it.

We teed it up on the Eagle Golf Course. Designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr., this signature course features six sets of tees measuring between 5,000 and 6,900 yards. Framing those yards are beautiful landscaping, perfect sand bunkers and coquina-lined fairways. With many mature trees

guarding the fairways, you cannot just grip and rip your tee shots. The ability to shape shots and play to the proper side of fairways is rewarded here.

The course plays to a par of 71 and features five of the best par-3s you may ever play in one round. Each is different and requires smart club selection. I hit a different club on each of these and both of my colleagues remarked at how much they liked the par-3s.

The short par-4 12th is a hole that can make or break your round. The hole tempts you to hit driver from the tee and knock the ball on or close for a good chance at birdie or better. With water guarding the entire left side of the hole and sneaking in just in front of

the green, the risk may outweigh the reward.

For me, it broke my round but not because I tried to be greedy. I hit a duck hook and splashed my tee shot. I'd rather not relive the rest of that hole, thank you.

In addition to the great greens and their rolling contours, you have to pay attention to the wind. Thanks to the surrounding tall condos, the wind tends to swirl or seem to not even be blowing. Check the trees and the flagstick before picking your club.

If you need birdies late, be prepared to hit some solid shots. The closing holes feature the longest pair of par-4s and the longest par-3 and par-5 on the course.

The second course at the club is the Patriot Course.

This course is a more traditional Florida course with oak-lined fairways, well-placed bunkers and subtle doglegs.

With five sets of tees, golfers can play the course from nearly 4,900 yards to more than 6,100. All of the par-5s play to less than 500 yards, allowing us mortal golfers to feel like pros with a good chance at reaching most of them in two with a pair of good shots.
