A Stuart woman was arrested Aug. 25 and charged with driving under the influence and possession of 20 grams or less of marijuana.

But what made the arrest unusual was what she told the officer.

"She began to cry and told me that this couldn't happen to her because she was a substance abuse counselor," the arrest affidavit said.

## New forum created for veterans' issues, concerns

SEBASTIAN — For the first time in Sebastian's history, the city will have an advisory board to hear specifically from veterans.

The Sebastian veteran's advisory board is made up of representatives of the two larger veterans organizations in the north county, the American Legion, Post 189 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10210. The

two posts combined have about 1,200 members.

Sebastian city councilwoman Andrea Coy spearheaded the effort to create the board. A veteran herself, she hears the needs and desires of the veteran community regularly, and believed an advisory board would be a good place for them to speak up and be heard all together, she said.

"I think it's great to bring everyone to the table together to discuss

all the veterans issues," Ms. Coy said.

Board members include Chairman Jerry Piper, commander of the VFW Post 10210 and Vice Chairman Ed Irons, commander of the American Legion 189. Other members include Butch Dawson, Donna Goff and Ed Kilbane.

The board will act as other ad-

## Area food bank CEO to lead state group

TREASURE COAST — In her latest venture to help end hunger Judith Cruz, CEO of Treasure Coast Food Bank, has been named president of the Florida Association of Food Banks.

Under Ms. Cruz's leadership, the FAFB's role in getting fresh produce on the tables of hungry people throughout Florida will be expanded using resources such as the Farmers Feeding Florida program.

"I knew we could do a better job of filling the gap of people who are going hungry, especially on the Treasure Coast," Ms. Cruz said.

The FAFB is the statewide organization that oversees the efforts of Florida's 24 food banks.

They are collecting produce from vendors such as Publix, Wal-Mart and Winn Dixie. Ms. Cruz said there is nothing wrong with the food that gets donated other than cosmetics.

"A normal consumer might not like a beautiful oversize green, bell pepper See **CEO, A2**

## Drug summit to bring together organizations, law enforcement

TREASURE COAST — In what is being touted as the first of its kind, a drug summit next month will bring together federal, state and local officials with private organizations to discuss the ongoing drug abuse problem.

The Hanley Center, which has facilities in West Palm Beach and Vero Beach to help people with drug and alcohol addictions, is organ-

izing the event.

Rachel Docekal, CEO of the Hanley Center Foundation, said the summit represents a departure from past practice, where oftentimes each community deals with the problem on its own.

"Over the past number of years, we have seen different communities look at the policies on drug problems and put together strategies to combat it," she said.

But Ms. Docekal said she believes a regional

# Businesses show concern about seagrass

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — Due to the recent environmental shift in the Indian River Lagoon, nearly all of the seagrass that grew between just north of Sebastian and the 17th Street Bridge in Vero Beach has disappeared.

Businesses along the lagoon are concerned that because of this depleting source, their customers might start to disappear as well.

Kristen Beck, director of the nonprofit organization The Florida Outdoor Center, said that although her business has not yet been affected by the almost nonexistent seagrass, it definitely will be.

"Eventually, the manatees are going to leave, the fish will leave and if they leave the dolphin will leave too,"

Ms. Beck said. "We'll have very little to show on our tours."

The Florida Outdoor Center gives educational tours, hosts a summer camp and shows people the wildlife along the lagoon.

The seven types of seagrass in the waterway serve as the foundation of the Indian River Lagoon's ecology. When it starts to deplete, the lagoon quickly begins to see a decrease in the amount of wildlife.

"Fishermen are probably going to feel the effects of this first," Ms. Beck said. "There won't be much for them to catch."

Overall, businesses along the lagoon and Vero Beach citizens agree that this has become a major issue and that it may be time for the government to step in and work with the scientists to restore the lagoon to what it once was.

simply because it is larger than normal," Ms. Cruz said. "But that doesn't mean there is anything

wrong with it."

Last fiscal year the FAFB accessed about 25 million pounds of produce through the program. The association supplies more than 3,000 community and faith-based non-profits, feeding more than 3 mil-

lion people each year.

Florida serves as the perfect location for a program like this because of the 10-month growing season and the partnership the FAFB has already created with the state's farmers.

Ms. Cruz said that Flori-

da as a whole has been hit particularly hard by the downturned economy and that anyone could help.

"It's our job to make sure people have food on the table, whether it's a donation or just volunteering," Ms. Cruz said.

mation and bringing recommendations to the city council. The board will be subject to Sunshine Law, as are the other boards, and their agendas and meetings will be open to the public.

"I think the veterans deserve a board and to be heard. It doesn't mean their

posts can't discuss things, but this may give them a reason to be proud and say 'I live in Sebastian,'" Ms. Coy said.

Mr. Irons said one major area the board will likely focus on at first are the veteran's memorials near Riverview Park.

The memorial area is the location of many special events, which are growing in popularity, but there is very little seating and shade. Maintenance of the small park will also be important, Mr. Irons said.

Mr. Piper said a long-term vision he has for the board is to find some way to help under- and unemployed veterans, whether it's with shelter, transportation or even employment.

Both men said the board has the opportunity to bring the veterans together, even ones that are not affiliated with either post.

"I think this is an excellent opportunity for veterans in Sebastian," Mr. Irons said.

The board will meet at 3 p.m. in the Sebastian city council chambers on the first Monday of every other month.

approach of bringing together people from a larger area may come up with new solutions.

The Drug Abuse Summit of the Treasure Coast, which primarily involves Indian River and St. Lucie counties,

will be held from 7:40 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Sept. 28 at Indian River State College’s Public Safety Training Center in Fort Pierce.

She said the summit will involve discussions of the problems of addiction and how law enforcement can deal with people who have drug problems.

The summit involves how addiction can be recognized

and the resources that are necessary to deal with it, she said.

Prevention of drug abuse is also part of the discussion, she said.

Wayne Creelman, who is with the University of Florida, school of psychiatry, said a main purpose of the summit is to educate people on the front lines of dealing with drug abuse. the signs of

addiction and the resources available to help those suffering from it.

Speakers will include Steven J. Levin, chief judge of the 19th Judicial Circuit Court, Diamond R. Litty, public defender for the 19th Judicial District and St. Lucie County Sheriff Ken Mascara.

Other participants will include State Rep. Gayle

Harrell, Tom Bakkedahl, chief assistant state attorney, Indian River County Sheriff Deryl Loar and David Currey, police chief of Vero Beach.

discovered the box springs did not fit his bed and wanted to return them. But the seller only wanted the money.

The two men work at the same restaurant in Jensen Beach. The buyer discovered one day that his tires were slashed and suspected the seller. However, he did not report the incident to police.

He got the tires fixed and went home. The next morning his tires were slashed again.

A witness told Port St. Lucie police he saw the man fitting the description of the seller go up to the buyer’s car at the residence.

The seller ended up going to jail. As a result, the tires of cars in Port St. Lucie and Jensen Beach may be safer.

## The last laugh

On one level, the call

seemed serious to emergency responders. The caller said he had been doing drugs and drinking, planned to kill himself and had a gun.

But the emergency response operator also could hear people laughing in the background.

The call went to Rochester, N.Y., responders because the cell phone had a number from that area.

Emergency responders, despite having doubts, got the call to Port St. Lucie police where the cell phone was at the time.

Port St. Lucie police spent considerable time tracking down the residence where the phone was located. They called the number, but the person who answered wouldn’t give them information.

When they finally tracked down the residence, a 20-year-old man admitted to making the call to impress some other people. He said he wasn’t suicidal, had not used drugs or alcohol and did not own a gun.

Authorities got the last laugh when they arrested him and charged him with misusing the emergency system.

## Too impatient

Everyone gets frustrated when they call an office and can’t reach the person with whom they want to talk.

But authorities say a Port St. Lucie woman took her frustrations too far when she couldn’t get an attorney to return her call immediately, even though she had apparently never had any dealings with him previously.

An arrest affidavit for the woman detailed a series of bizarre calls she is accused of making to the law office.

The woman called once and the secretary told her the attorney was on the other line.

But the woman insisted the attorney wanted to talk to her.

After being told again he

# Safety check list prepared for seniors

TREASURE COAST — Older adults may be among the most vulnerable victims when hurricanes strike. That's why Home Instead Senior Care has issued a disaster safety preparation checklist to help prepare seniors for the possibility of weather emergencies.

"We know that a disaster can be deadly for some seniors because of physical and other limitations," said Patricia Strickland, owner of the Home Instead Senior Care office serving St. Lucie and Martin counties. "That's why we need to take every precaution possible to help them when something like Isaac comes up. Consider this checklist as you help older adults get ready."

•Tune in. Stay abreast of what's going on through your local radio or television.

•Take stock. Decide what your senior can or can't do in the event of a natural disaster. Make a list of what he or she might need to prepare. For example, if your loved one is wheelchair-bound, determine how he or she is going to be

evacuated if necessary.

•To go or to stay? When deciding to evacuate, older adults should go sooner rather than later. By waiting too long, they may be unable to leave if they require assistance.

•Make a plan. Call a family meeting to develop a plan of action. Include in your plan key people such as neighbors, friends, relatives and professional caregivers who could help.

•More than one way out. Seniors should develop at least two escape routes: one to evacuate their home and one to evacuate their community. The local emergency management office can tell you escape routes out of the community.

•Meet up. Designate a place to meet relatives or key support network people outside the house, as well as a second location outside the neighborhood, such as a school or church.

•Get up and "Go Kit." Have an easy-to-carry backpack including three days non-perishable food and water with an additional four days of food and water readily accessible at home. Have at least one gallon of bottled water per person per day. Refresh

and replace your supplies at least twice a year. And don't forget the blanket and paper products such as toilet paper.

•Pack extras and copies. If your senior is evacuating, he or she should bring at least a one-month supply of medication. Make ready other important documents in a waterproof protector including copies of prescriptions, car title registration and driver's license, insurance documents and bank account numbers, and spare checkbook. Also take extra eyeglasses and hearing-aid batteries. Label every piece of important equipment or personal item in case they are lost.

•Your contact list. Compile a contact list and include people on a senior's support network as well as doctors and other important health-care professionals.

•If you can't be there. If you're not living close by to help your loved one, enlist the help of family or friends, or contact a professional caregiving company.

## Make sure to back up everything

Once upon a time there was this guy who was so enamored with "cloud" computing that he stuck all of his digital eggs in one basket and in the blink of an eye lost it all. The end.

Alright, OK, I'm sure there are enough of you reading this wondering what in the world I'm going on about this week so I suppose I ought to take a few words to explain. You see, I recently read an article online (an "open letter" to Google actually) written by a very distraught fellow who wanted Google to know just how badly they messed up when they locked him out of all of his data.

The poor guy goes on to explain that he spent months switching all of his email over to Gmail, all of his photos over to Google's photo service (Picasa) all of his docs to Google Docs etc. After painstakingly moving all of his data to Google's servers (wherever they are) he woke up one day to find out his account had been closed due to a "terms of service violation" which he swears up and down he didn't commit.

The bottom line is he spent a considerable amount of time moving his entire digital inventory up to Google's "cloud," didn't make any provisions to back any of it up and then (just as Murphy's law demands) found himself completely locked out.

Now, this column isn't about whether Google had a right to lock him out of his account or not, nor is it some type of cry out to the powers that be to change the way our data is safeguarded when we hand it over to "the cloud." It's more of a cautionary tale to remind us what which we already know: back up everything! Even when entrusting your data to the cloud, back it to a local drive, as well. To not do so is just asking for it.

OK, let's look at this a little closer, shall we? First the decision to use a "cloud" service may be a decision that many are not even aware that they are making. Let me try to clarify a

couple things. Take email, for example. If you are accessing your email through your web browser by going to [www.gmail.com](http://www.gmail.com), [www.yahoo.com](http://www.yahoo.com) or any of the other email services that offer "web-based" mail service, then guess what? Your email is being stored and managed "in the cloud" and if you should find yourself in violation of the "terms of service" you too could find yourself locked out. (Just how well did you read those "terms" when you signed up? You know, the terms you have to click the "accept" button for in order to set up your account?)

Most email services allow the downloading of email to a local email client which is present on each and every machine out there Windows, Mac or Linux. You can set up your computer's email program (Windows Live Mail, Outlook, Outlook Express for Windows, "Mail" on Macs) by configuring the "POP" or "IMAP" settings. Look it up in your email service's help settings, and if your email service doesn't provide for it, then you may want to consider an alternative.

Next, let's look at the folly of uploading all of your digital pictures to a service such as Google's Picasa web albums and then deleting the local copies after you upload all of your pictures. Why on earth would anyone do that? "Well Sean, we don't want all these "duplicates," now do we?" Well, actually, you do.

Sure, uploading all of your photos to a web-based service is great, but don't get rid of the originals. Did you know that you can get 8-gigabyte thumb drive from just about any drugstore, nowadays, for about \$10?

## Foundation names area company as one to watch

### eMindful shows innovation, growth

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — An Indian River County business on the rise was recognized as a company to watch.

eMindful is a mind-body wellness company providing innovative online classes to employers to help their employees reduce stress, smoking, overeating and other behaviors that can be detrimental to a person's health and decrease their productivity.

The company, which was

created nearly six years ago by Kelly McCabe, was recognized the Edward Lowe Foundation's companies to watch program. They are among the top 50 Florida companies to watch.

The foundation recognizes second-stage companies, or companies that are growing, not just surviving. They are significant job creators and are bringing money into their communities, Ms. McCabe said.

Helene Caseltine, economic development director for the Indian River County Chamber of Commerce, nominated the company for the award. When word came that eMindful made the top 50 in the state, Ms. McCabe

was very pleased.

Penny Chandler, executive director of the chamber, said whenever a business in the community receives accolades, the whole community benefits.

eMindful, located in Vero Beach, has grown quickly over the past three years, and serves thousands of clients, including Florida Power & Light and Kaiser Permanente.

Another big client of eMindful is Aetna, a national health care provider with about 32,000 employees.

eMindful's services include virtual classroom time with highly trained instructors in the various wellness areas. The classes are real-time and partici-

pants can interact with both the instructors and other class participants.

"You can do pretty much everything except shake someone's hand," Ms. McCabe said.

Studies on eMindful's techniques and methods have measured the productivity of employees pre- and post-online wellness classes, she said.

After classes from eMindful, employees show 95 minutes of increased productivity per week. During a 48-week period, the return on the employer's investment on the classes was 15 times higher than what they paid, Ms. McCabe said.

In addition to carrying out daily services, the company is also proud of

its partnerships with Harvard Medical School and Duke Integrative Medicine for research projects, she said.

eMindful was approved for a local jobs grant of up to \$500,000 by county commissioners in December 2009, but never reported job creation and has not received any payments from the jobs grant program, said Bill Schutt, Indian River County economic development senior planner.

Ms. McCabe said her company withdrew from the program when it became apparent that the economy was not going to permit them to make their projected employment levels for the grant, and instead pursued and

received private funding.

"Now we are starting to see the growth that was projected in 2008. Before, all our targets were off," she said.

According to a report, the combined impact of the 50 companies is \$355 million in total annual revenue and 1,576 full time equivalent employees. In 2012, the companies combined saw an overall 35 percent annual revenue growth and 37 percent annual growth in employees.

eMindful and the other companies will be recognized at a special ceremony on Oct. 19 in Orlando.

## Health officials warn against mosquito-borne diseases

TREASURE COAST —

Due to recent floodwaters, Florida Department of Health officials are emphasizing the importance of residents and visitors protecting themselves against mosquito-borne diseases.

To prevent mosquitoes from living and multiplying around homes or businesses:

- Drain water from garbage cans, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flowerpots or any other containers where sprinkler or rainwater has collected.

- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.

- Empty and clean bird-baths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.

- Protect boats and vehi-

cles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

- Clothing — Those who must be outside when mosquitoes are active should cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants and long sleeves.

- Repellent — Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with 10-30 percent DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than two months old.

- Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios. Symptoms of West Nile

virus infection may include headache, fever, fatigue, dizziness, weakness and confusion.


DOH continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquito-borne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, malaria and dengue.



## New gallery to feature pop art

VERO BEACH — The first exhibition in the Vero Beach Museum of Art's Titelman Gallery will be an art explosion of color and culture. "Pop Art Revisited: A 21st Century Perspective," will be on display in the new gallery from Sept. 29 to Jan. 2. The exhibition is made of various private and public collections and was organized by the museum.

Visitors will be able to see examples of the art movement that swept across the U.S. and Great Britain in the 1950s. Cultural icons, advertisements, comic books and other objects from popu-

lar culture shaped the art of that era, said Jay Williams, curator of exhibitions and collections for the museum. The museum's galleries were closed for the summer during construction, which included installing a new heating and cooling system, renovating storage space and adding a new gallery space, he said. Thirty two works of art will be in the collection, including some from a recent bequest to the museum. In her will, museum patron Hilde Babin bequeathed a piece by one of the "godfathers" of pop art, Jasper Johns, and two examples of Andy

Warhol's work, Mr. Williams said.

"We are delighted to include these three works in the show," he said.

Other prominent artists in the pop art era whose art will be included in the exhibition include Roy Lichtenstein, Robert Rauschenberg, Claes Oldenburg and James Rosenquist.

"There's going to be a lot to see," Mr. Williams said.

The history of the art movement is quite intriguing and putting together the collection is one way to educate the public on how art has changed over the past 50 years.

In the time of Andy Warhol, Jasper Johns and the others, people, even art crit-

ics expected art, even modern art, to look a certain way. Immediately before to the pop art movement, the Avant garde art movement was abstract impressionism, with artist such as Jackson Pollock taking central stage, Mr. Williams said.

Pop artists took inspiration from common things, such as, soup cans and billboards, which confused many people.

"It's very interesting to look back today, because we just accept that a source of inspiration can come from anywhere. It shows you how far we've come in the past 50 years," Mr. Williams said.

# Improvements to a classic local course

If there is one thing I despise, it's a golf course over-run with homes. When it comes to golf courses and the homes and development that go along with many new courses, the wounds are usually permanent scars.

When Lost Lake Golf Club opened in 1993, it was cut through the pristine wetlands in Hobe Sound. The Jim and Tom Fazio-designed course featured tons of nature. No two holes ran side-by-side, making each stand apart. One of the problems with today's new courses is that they are an amenities for developers, meaning that along the fairways and greens come roads and homes.

I first played Lost Lake in 1995 and fell in love with the course. Over the years, as the development matured, homes and roads went up where many trees

once stood. As the homes went up, the fairways felt narrower. The greens lost some of the framing they had to aid your approach shots. I fell out of love with the course.

A few weeks ago, I traveled back to Lost Lake to see how time had treated her. Many of the scars I remembered from my last time out have disappeared. As the course has matured, the trees and landscaping that were put up when the homes were completed have grown in and taken hold. The holes where I remember feeling like I was playing from someone's backyard no longer feel that way. I enjoyed playing the course once again.

Lost Lake Golf Club is a semi-private club with five sets of tees to challenge golfers of any ability. From the back tees the course measures a shortish 6,850 yards. Not long by today's

standards, but you need to remember this is a Fazio masterpiece that carries a slope rating of 135. The landing areas are tight and there are several forced carries with water coming into play on 13 holes. You simply cannot miss fairways if you hope to conquer this layout. The greens are filled with bumps and hills forcing you to be on your game with the flat stick as well. The tournament tees play to 6,481 yards, followed by the club, senior and forward tees which play to 6,045, 5,574 and 5,106 yards respectively.

One thing I always like to see on a course is a drivable par-4 and a

reachable par-5. Well, reachable for golfers of most abilities, that is. The fourth hole measures 340 from the back tees, and considerably less as you move forward. It practically begs you to drive the green. Temptation does come with a price, should you miss right where water runs the length of the hole.

The seventh hole is a very reachable par-5, playing a mere 485 yards from the tips. After a solid drive, golfers have to ignore the beautiful rock waterfall short and left of the elevated green and thread their approach between that and a large oak behind and right if they hope to make an easy birdie or perhaps an eagle.

The front-nine closes with one of the best par-4s on the course. The 413-yard hole demands an exacting tee shot. From there, it's an approach to a green framed by a large

hill with the beautiful clubhouse sitting behind.

The back-nine begins with a twisty par-5. To reach the 10th hole in two, golfers must hit a long drive and then dare to carry a large lake to a small, narrow green perched atop a sizable hill. Even laying up takes serious concentration, as you must aim well away from the green and hit a precise shot to a narrowing fairway.

Lost Lake's closing holes are some of the best in the area. The par-3 16th looks easy from the tee, but miss this small green and you will pay dearly. Seventeen isn't long, but its green is deep and severely sloped. Golfers need to make sure they hit their approach shots to the proper level or risk three-putting.

At 441 yards from the tips, the 18th is a monster. Wayward drives wind up in the marshlands or deep

rough. Just like the ninth hole, number eighteen has its green tucked into a hillside with several bunkers protecting it. After putting out, it's a short walk to a well-deserved beverage at the clubhouse.

I had a great time playing Lost Lake for the first time in many years. I'm pleased to see that the course has matured nicely. The staff is as friendly as ever, and the conditioning of the course was superb.

# Health officials warn against mosquito-borne diseases

**TREASURE COAST** — Due to recent floodwaters, Florida Department of Health officials are emphasizing the importance of residents and visitors protecting themselves against mosquito-borne diseases.

To prevent mosquitoes from living and multiplying around homes or businesses:

- Drain water from garbage cans, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flowerpots or any other containers where sprinkler or rainwater has collected.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.
- Empty and clean bird-baths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.
- Clothing. Those who must be outside when mosquitoes are active should

cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants and long sleeves.

- Repellent. Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with 10-30 percent DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.
- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than two months old.
- Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

Symptoms of West Nile virus infection may include headache, fever, fatigue, dizziness, weakness and confusion.

DOH continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquito-borne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, malaria and dengue.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission maintains a Web site for reporting wild bird die offs related to West Nile virus. 
