## Mental Health Association director to retire

VERO BEACH — Dr. Robert Brugnoli, Executive Director of the Mental Health Association in Indian River County, has announced that he will retire from the organization at the end of 2018. A search for Dr. Brugnoli's replacement is underway.

Dr. Brugnoli has been the MHA Executive

Director since 2013. He received a Ph.D. and an M.A. from Hofstra University in New York.

The MHA is a non-profit that provides mental health services including screening, ongoing therapy, case

## It is illegal to fertilize your lawn in the summer

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — From June 1-Sept. 30, it is illegal to fertilize your lawn in Indian River County. While there are some exemptions for specific businesses like golf courses and farms, and there are a few fertilizers that are safe to use during the summer, the general rule is to simply avoid fertilizing for a few months.

The purpose of the ban is to protect the Indian River Lagoon from the harmful excess nutrients that get washed from your lawn during the rainy season. The law also regulates what types of fertilizer can be used the rest of the year.

The county's ban, which took effect in 2013, largely mirrors local ordinances adopted earlier in Fellsmere (2011), Vero Beach (2012), Sebastian (2012), Indian River Shores (2012), and Orchid (2013).

While the various ordinances contain some differences regarding exemptions, licensing, and specific fertilizer content, the general principles are the same.

Through the end of September, do not fertilize with any product containing nitrogen or phosphorous. Both of these nutrients are illegal during the rainy season for both turf grass and landscape plants.



# Riverside Hobbies may be the most fun store in town

SEBASTIAN — There's nothing like an old-fashioned hobby store to bring out the youngster in everyone. Riverside Hobbies in Sebastian is just that, and every aisle of the large, 3,000 square foot store is filled with fun ideas from floor to ceiling.

As I strolled the store with owner Hoge Woolwine, I couldn't help but think that childhood was more exciting and creative before smart phones, when everybody participated in activities that involved our hands and brains. Building models and rockets and assembling train sets allowed us to exercise our minds in much more active ways than today's passive endeavors.

"I've always been a hobby-type person, ever since I was 10 years old," Mr. Woolwine told Hometown News. "My cousin and I would sit out on the back porch in New Jersey and build model cars. We would save our money and go into town on Saturday and go to Woolworth's and get a car model, a can of paint, and some glue. We did that for a long time."

Hoge Woolwine had a similar store in Princeton, N.J., for 35 years before moving to Sebastian. "This is the same as what we had in our store in New Jersey years ago. We were right across from Princeton University, and a lot of our customers were university students looking for something fun and interesting to do."

Riverside Hobbies opened up in 2002, and a loyal clientele from Melbourne to Port St. Lucie and all points in between has kept

business steady. The store sells everything for the hobby industry, such as airplanes, cars, trains, plastic models, crafts, paint-by-numbers, and rockets.

"We're an all-around, old-style hobby shop," Mr. Woolwine said. "We appeal to all ages, but these days many of our customers are older. In fact it's more than half adults now. We have a big population here of retirees or people in their 30s and 40s who love to build things like this."

"A lot of customers come in and say 'I used to build these as a kid.'" The store is a great way to relive your childhood.

Parents who want their children to stop being passive, sitting in front of a screen, and to actually do something that uses their brain will find many exciting options at Riverside Hobbies.

"We're seeing a lot of that, parents trying to get their kids into stuff where they use their hands and minds instead of just watch-

ing things," Mr. Woolwine said. "Parents will bring their kids in and they get excited about things, which is good."

Indeed, the store seems a fascinating place to bring your children or grandchildren and let them just look around and see what they get excited about.

"Screw-together easy-build kits for kids to start out with are very popular now," Mr. Woolwine said. "I start a lot of kids on these because they are easy to do and reasonably priced. They get a sense of accomplishment by putting something together, and it gets them interested in working with their hands."

Microscopes and other science kits are big sellers around Christmas. For children and older folks who have an interest in science projects, Riverside Hobbies has many options to choose from.

Year-round, the biggest sellers now are airplanes and airplane parts, such as transmitters and receivers for remote-controlled airplanes, propellers, and wings.

"We're very airplane-oriented," Mr. Woolwine said. "We sell planes for people on a consignment basis. If someone has a plane they're looking to sell, I'll take it on consignment. We take only a 10 percent commission, which is lower than elsewhere."

Riverside Hobbies has a very big selection of planes from under \$200 to about \$500. A beginner can get into radio-controlled planes for less than \$200. "We have one for \$120 that is entry level, easy to fly," Mr. Woolwine said. "We have gliders for around \$229." Riverside Hobbies also carries drones, mostly upper-end drones with cameras.

"We have a lot of parts for every hobby. Construction material, parts for cars, trains, die-cast metal kits. We have modeling tools, saws, drills, Dremels, knives, file sets."

Other fun hobby items include sci-fi kits related to Star Wars, Star Trek, and fighting robots. For budding artists, Riverside Hobbies has a huge selection of paint-by-numbers. One of the big sellers now is paint-by-numbers kits to create paintings of animals.

There's also a large paint department with anything you'd want to spruce up models.

"We're an old fashioned hobby store," Mr. Woolwine said. "We have everything you remember from hobby stores as a kid."

Other big sellers include wooden model kits for civil war cannons, submarines, and ships. "I sold two ship kits this morning to an older guy who couldn't sleep at night and just needed something to do!"

Riverside Hobbies buys and sells used and new train sets, including Lionel trains "from olden days" and newer, smaller trains.

The store is filled with a huge inventory of things older folks will remember from their childhood. Parts for assembling balsa wood airplanes brought this reporter right back to a simpler time, when one could spend an entire weekend figuring out how to tilt the wooden wing so that a balsa glider would make a big loop and return right back to where you stood.

management, psychological testing, and psychiatric services. The MHA operates a Walk-In and Counseling Center in Vero Beach that treats both children and adults, and three peer-run Drop-In Centers in Vero Beach, Stuart and Okeechobee.

The MHA is the only agency in Indian River County that does not require an appointment for a mental health screening. The agency says on its website that staff "understands you can't wait for an appointment and we don't expect you to have to."

"It is important to understand early symptoms of mental illness and know when certain behaviors are potentially signs of something more," Dr. Brugnoli said last year after the MHA opened its newest drop-in center. "We need to speak up early and educate people about risky behavior and its connection to mental illness - and do so in a compassionate, judgment-free way."

"Prevention, early identification and intervention, and integrated services work," said Dr. Brugnoli. "When we engage in prevention and early identification, we can help reduce the burden of mental illness by identifying symptoms and warning signs early, and provide effective treatment."

"Dr. Bob has worked tirelessly to identify and meet both the emerging and unmet needs of our community," said Dr. Karen Mersky, MHA board chair. "He has done so with an eye for fiscal responsibility and has worked passionately to develop clear policies and procedures to ensure the MHA's ongoing success."

Under Dr. Brugnoli's leadership, the MHA in 2017 provided about 10,000 professional services to 1,300 clients, including nearly 900 mental health screenings, 4,000 psychotherapy visits, 900 psychiatry visits, and 4,000 group services. The three drop-in centers in Indian River, Martin, and Okeechobee counties are open every day and recorded 24,000 visits in 2017.

"I'm really happy with what we have been able to build at the MHA," says Dr. Brugnoli. "I'm proud that we have become a leader in providing quality mental health services to those at risk regardless of their ability to pay."

Board Vice Chairman Ross Cotherman is leading a search committee to find the organization's next leader. Dr. Brugnoli will remain through the end of the year to help with the transition.

The MHA Walk-In and Counseling Center opened in Vero Beach in 2007. It offers immediate mental health care for children and adults on a walk-in basis.

MHA services include mental health screening, crisis intervention, diagnostic assessments, individual and family therapy, psychiatric evaluation, medication management, and psychological testing.

Conditions treated include depression and other mood disorders, anxiety, panic disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, substance abuse, relationship problems, parenting concerns, grief and loss, and adjustment disorders.

The MHA Walk-In and Counseling Center is located at 820 37th Place, Vero Beach. It is open Mon.-Fri., 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m., with no appointment necessary.



# The pitfalls of wireless printing

Wireless printers seem to be all the rage these days and why not? The convenience of being able to place your printer anywhere in the room, even in another room altogether and still be able to print, makes them very appealing indeed. And with just about everyone equipped with a wireless router today, picking a printer that is WiFi enabled makes sense. To top it off, the technology has gotten so common that it can be hard to find a printer that is not wireless capable.

On the surface wireless printing looks like a great idea but, like most things computer related, it comes with a price; in this case, the price is a combination of reliability and complexity.

I say reliability because wireless printers are notorious for dropping off line for no apparent reason. Usually right when something important needs to be printed, like an airline boarding pass or court document, you go to print and... nothing. Worked fine yesterday but today, not so much.

Now I know that some of you are reading this and thinking “what? I’ve been using a wireless printer for years and have never had a problem!” and to you I say “Great job!” but keep in mind, people don’t call me when it’s working, they call me when it stops and I hear it from different people all the time. And it’s typically the same story every time – wireless printer, working fine yesterday, something really important needs to be printed today and now, nothing... Or a message pops up telling you the computer can’t communicate with the printer but it doesn’t matter, the end result is the same – nothing comes out of the printer. That’s when I get the call.

I mentioned complexity as being the second trade off and here’s where that comes in. When you connect a printer to your computer with a wire (a USB printer cable with one end plugged into the back of the printer and the other end plugged into a USB port on the computer) that’s often all there is to it. Unless something goes wrong, your computer should automatically detect the printer and set it up, most often without

having to click a thing.

On the other hand, when you set up a wireless printer, you have all the added complexity of having to connect the printer to your WiFi router first and that, depending on the make and model of the printer, can involve anything from having to type in your wifi password on a little control panel on the front of the printer to needing to plug the printer into the computer with a printer cable anyway and then use the computer to program the printer for wifi access. Then you have to go to the computer and try to find and connect to the printer over the network. And when it does go offline for no apparent reason, you may find yourself reconnecting it to your WiFi router all over again.

There are so many things that can knock a wireless device off line I couldn’t possibly list them all here. Some of the more common reasons are power fluctuations that cause the equipment to restart, some cordless phones can cause a sort of “jamming” that can cause a printer to drop off line and even microwave interference can suddenly cause a device to drop offline.

The cause doesn’t really matter the point that I’m trying to make is that the wireless connection is way more fragile and easily broken than the traditional printer cable jammed into the back of the computer. Sure there are times when a wired printer drops off line but when that happens, resetting the device usually just means unplugging it and plugging it back in. With a wireless device, you often find yourself back at square one trying to re join the printer to the wireless network.

I have a rule of thumb when it comes to printers; Even if the printer is capable of running wirelessly, if it’s going to be in the See COMPUTE, page 9

products containing iron and other micronutrients that you can use, and you can compost. To be in compliance, the fertilizer must contain no phosphorous. The fertilizer content is listed on each label as three numbers. This corresponds to the percentage of nitrogen, phosphorous, and potash, respectively, or N-P-K. Visit [www.ircstormwater.com](http://www.ircstormwater.com) for details and a list of approved products.

Another general rule is that fertilizer should never be applied within ten feet of any wetland or water body, or from the top of a seawall. Spreader deflector shields are required when fertilizing using rotary spreaders.

Fertilizer may not be applied, spilled, or otherwise deposited on any impervious surfaces. Fertilizer must be kept out of stormwater drains, ditches, and all water bodies. Grass clippings, vegetative material or debris must also be kept out of stormwater drains, ditches, water bodies, wetlands, side-

walks and roadways.

Commercial fertilizer applicators are required to carry in their possession evidence that they have completed a training program in the “Florida-friendly Best Management Practices for Protection of Water Resources by the Green Industries” offered by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection through the University of Florida Extension “Florida-Friendly Landscapes” program, or an approved equivalent.

Even outside the ban period, you should never fertilize before a rain. Rain does not set in fertilizer, it just washes it away. And you should only use fertilizers that contain at least 50 percent slow release nitrogen and that contain no phosphorous. Florida soils are naturally rich in phosphorous.

The county Stormwater Division recommends fertilizing only twice a year, in October near the end of the growing season, and in April at the start of the growing season. Better yet, replace grass and exotic plants with Florida native plants that require little or no fertilizing.

VERO BEACH — Fans of traditional ballet agree on one thing: you can't get enough Tchaikovsky. On June 16, Tchaikovsky's *The Sleeping Beauty* will be performed by Vero Classical Ballet students and professional guest artists at the Vero Beach High School Performing Arts Center.

Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky composed only three ballets: *Swan Lake* (1876), *The Sleeping Beauty* (1889), and *The Nutcracker* (1892). First performed in 1890 at the Mariinsky Theatre in St. Petersburg, Russia, *The Sleeping Beauty* has become one of the most famous classical ballets.

"We follow the traditional production as closely as possible," Vero Classical Ballet Director Barry Trammell told Hometown News. "We first performed our production in 2015. This is our second production of *The Sleeping Beauty*."

Vero Classical Ballet is a dance school based at Leisure Square, estab-

# Traveling with golf in mind

With my writing job, I get to travel quite a bit. I know how expensive golf travel can be. Fortunately, over the years I have learned a few tricks to keep costs down without sacrificing fun. Probably the best way to save money is to travel with a group. Get as many of your golf buddies to join you on your trip. Larger groups will find that they have leverage when it comes to negotiating lower prices for rooms, food, and golf.

If you have hotel or credit card points check to see what benefits they give you. Some credit card companies offer free room upgrades, or discounted greens fees at many resorts. If more than one in your group has a free or discounted night coming at a hotel, you could combine these to get several nights out of your stay for free or greatly reduced.

Check with your home club. Many these days are managed by a company that has many courses in its portfolio. See if you get discounted golf at other courses owned or managed by the same company.

Ask about unlimited golf packages. Many resorts offer these in off-peak seasons to

entice business. There are also packages that include lunch, drinks, and discounted replays.

If you really want to avoid the big money greens fees, steer away from the resorts advertised on television or that tout their "Home of the Blah Blah Championship" layout. While it may be fun to say that you played these courses, you will almost always pay a premium to do so. National advertising is expensive, as is maintaining the course in those fantastic conditions. In the end it all gets passed down to the customer.

If you haven't played in a while, avoid playing your first round on an expensive, plush course. Take advantage of the municipal courses and use that round to knock off the rust from not picking up a club for so long.

While it's nice to be prepared and have most everything planned and thought-out, it's to your benefit to leave some time open

for a last-minute round. Once an empty tee time is gone, it is gone. Many courses offer deep discounts if you call to fill one of those spots at just the right time. There are also several apps that allow you to find tee times at the very last moment and book them on your phone while your buddy drives to the course.

Plan your trip for mid-week. Prices on travel, hotels and golf are always higher on the weekends. Besides, it will get you away from the office for a couple extra days.

Make sure that everyone is comfortable with everything that is planned. There are times when the guys with the deepest pockets want everyone to eat at a more expensive restaurant, stay at a fancier place, play the more expensive courses. Just remember to show your appreciation to the host and be as accommodating when it becomes your turn.

Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix well.


