## Sebastian approves zoning for about 500 new homes

SEBASTIAN — In February, the Sebastian City Council approved a developer's request to annex nearly 183 acres from unincorporated Indian River County. At the May 23 City Council meeting, the city took the next step, approving the zoning changes required to permit roughly 500 new homes.

Though approved 4-0 by the Council, the plan is not without opposition. During public comment, numerous residents objected. Resident Maureen Murphy said she would not have spent her retirement money on her Del Monte Road home if she knew this development was coming.

As City Manager Paul Carlisle and Community Development Director Lisa Frasier noted, what was approved was the zoning, not the conceptual plan. Council Member Ed Dodd said that the next step, the preliminary plan, would define the schedule and produce environment/public facility/waste/traffic flow/school studies that must still be approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council. Site plans would then be developed after that.

## Thirteen state constitution amendments in next election

TREASURE COAST — Voters in the 2018 Florida General Election will face the most confusing ballot in a generation, especially regarding the proposed constitutional amendments. Understanding the proposals and figuring out how you wish to vote on each will take some time and independent research.

The Florida Constitution can be changed in four ways. The legislature can propose a change by joint resolution. Citizens and nonprofits can

follow an initiative process including the gathering of large numbers of signatures. The Constitutional Revision Commission can propose changes, and the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission can propose changes.

Proposed amendments require 60 percent approval from voters to pass, per Florida Constitution, Article XI, Section 5(e).

For the November, 2018 general election, 13 proposed amendments will be on the ballot. Of these, eight were submitted by the CRC, three by the legislature, and two by citizen petition initiative. See **AMENDMENTS**, page 9

More than 46,000 students on the Treasure Coast are eligible for free and reduced price meals at school, and once schools close for summer, families who don't always have enough food to eat can struggle to provide

the additional meals.

The Summer Meals program is open to all youth 18 years and younger at no cost to them. Treasure Coast Food Bank partners with sites throughout the region, including churches, community centers, youth development organizations and other agencies that can offer a place to feed the kids. Each site offers two of three food options among breakfast, lunch, or a healthy snack. Meal times vary by site.

Treasure Coast Food Bank prepares the meals daily. The meals typically include fresh-made sandwiches and wraps, hand-made salads, and fresh cut fruits and vegetables. Summer Meals will run every week day through August 10. Director said the proposal was consistent with the city's comprehensive plan and compatible with surrounding land uses, and staff recommended approval.

The property, to be called Spirit of Sebastian, is just under 183 acres, located west of the FEC Railroad and Old Dixie Highway.

During public input, resident John Norris said the development would not allow access to the south walkway for the Greenway Trail. He also said the density would be excessive.

Resident Renne Hamblin said that there were many gopher tortoises, hogs, and scrub jays on the property.

When the annexation was approved, a letter from Carter Associates Consulting Engineers and Land Surveyors on behalf of developer Ridgewood Sebastian said that an environmental survey would be conducted for the presence of wetlands and endangered species.

The letter also noted that mining operations were previously performed on the property that created four large ponds that would have to be incorporated into the stormwater management system.

“There also appears to be an environmentally sensitive area in the southwest corner adjacent and contiguous to the Indian River County owned preserve property,” the surveyor's letter said.

“Wetlands are protected by state and federal regulations and the master plan will be designed to avoid impacts to this area. Gopher tortoise habitat may also exist due to the site's location on the coastal sand ridge; however, provisions will be made during development to protect or relocate tortoises.”

Mayor Jim Hill expressed that he understood the residents' concerns, as when he moved to Sebastian in 1999, there were 6,000 people, and today there are 26,000 residents. Mayor Hill said that it was a plus for the city to maintain control over the development, and trusted that city council control would require the development to be something that would not conflict with Sebastian.

Vice Mayor Linda Kinchen promised that all of the speakers' concerns would be addressed when the site plan is submitted, before the development is begun.

The developers, Ridgewood Sebastian LLC, were represented by Chuck Mechling. Mr. Mechling said that concerns raised by current residents would be taken into account, and that the internal road system would include a green belt. He added that the community would contain over 50 percent of open space.

The vote to approve the zoning changes was 4-0, with Council Member Iovino absent. In coming months, Mr. Mechling said, environmental and traffic studies will be completed, and his group will bring a more detailed plan back to City Council.

# Annual fishing tournament deemed a success

SEBASTIAN — The 25th Annual Sebastian Exchange Club Foundation's Blue Water Open Charity Offshore Fishing Tournament was held on June 2 with tournament headquarters at Capt. Hiram's Resort in Sebastian. They caught a beautiful weekend, amid all the rain and wind we've experienced for the past month or two. The tournament saw 145 boats register and fish this Silver Anniversary tournament, although only 38 boats weighed in fish. It was reported as being a slow day of fishing for East Central Florida.

The event included dolphin, kingfish, wahoo and grouper on the main board and bonus board, with additional payouts in each position in celebration of the Silver Anniversary. The total purse was a guaranteed \$19,000, which included \$1,000 each for the biggest AJ and Cobia caught, as well as \$2,500 for Top Boat.

The catch was dominated by dolphin and kingfish, however the biggest dolphin was only 23.55 pounds, caught on Skeleton Crew. To round out the board for dolphin was 2nd place 22.65 pounder caught on Down Time, 3rd place 18.35 caught on Wide Open and 4th place 15.65 caught on Team Shootout. The kingfish catch were larger fish, but still below the norm. First place king weighed in at 36.45 pounds, followed by

a 27.80 for second place, 26.80 in third and 25.9 in fourth place.

Top Grouper was a whopping 57.85 pounder caught on III Jiggers, Captain Todd Thompson. Second place grouper was 37.80, and 3rd place was 15.35. These were the only grouper that met the 10 pound minimum at the event. Only two wahoo were weighed in, but the first place fish was a nice 51.15 pounder caught aboard Reely, Caption Mark Headley. Second place weighed 15.20 pounds.

Top Boat went to Easy Drinkin', Captain Joel McKenney. The Top Boat award is based on an aggregate weight of three fish in at least two of the main board fish categories. Although Easy Drinkin's only board fish was the 2nd place kingfish at 27.80 pounds, they also weighed in another king at 23.35 pounds and a dolphin at 12.4 pounds, for a total weight of 63.55 pounds.

The \$1,000 Amberjack award went to Ken Keaton aboard Salty Cracker with a 45.40 pounder. No cobia made the weight minimum for the tournament.



### A comment on store discounts

### Wild in the streets

Incredible! A person with a diagnosed mental health disorder Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is allowed to possess a firearm and a Florida Concealed Weapon or Firearm License. Even more mind boggling is the new version of the Florida Stand your Ground Law that lets them get away with murder.

The recent determination by an Assistant States Attorney in Indian River County that a self-professed victim of a purported threat by an unarmed citizen in a supposed road rage incident cannot be charged with any crime defies the common sense thinking of most people.

PTSD requires a medical diagnosis and symptoms may include nightmares or unwanted memories of the trauma, avoidance of situations that bring back memories of the trauma, heightened reactions, anxiety, or depressed mood.

People with PTSD may experience one or more of the following symptoms:

Behavioral: agitation, irritability, hostility, hypervigilance, self-destructive behavior, or social isolation

Psychological: flashback, fear, severe anxiety, or mistrust

Mood: loss of interest or pleasure in activ-

ities, guilt, or loneliness

Sleep: insomnia or nightmares

Also common: emotional detachment or unwanted thoughts

# Mental health forum to address needs of children

VERO BEACH — The Gifford Youth Achievement Center will present a Children's Mental Health Forum on Thursday, June 28, 6-7:30 p.m., at GYAC.

The forum is a response to school shootings, and will address the relationship of shootings to mental health issues. There will be a discussion on identifying signs of childhood mental health issues, including related issues of bullying, abuse, social media, and addiction.

A question and answer session will follow the panel, which will include Jeffrey Shearer from Tykes & Teens, Major Eric Flowers from the Indian River Sheriff's Dept., and other speakers to be announced.

GYAC Guidance Counselor Carrie Williams will act as moderator. A light dinner, snacks and refreshments will be served, sponsored by Scot Wilke of 14 Bones BBQ.

There is no cost to attend the forum.

Mr. Shearer earned a Master of Social Work degree from Florida State University in 1992, and his Licensed Clinical Social Worker certification in 1994. He is an adjunct faculty member at Florida Atlantic University.

Mr. Shearer co-founded Tykes & Teens in 1996 to provide mental health services to children in need on a sliding scale, regardless of financial status. Tykes & Teens provides approximately \$700,000 in free counseling each year.

Tykes & Teens has provided services to more than 30,000 families in Martin, St. Lucie, Indian River, and Okeechobee counties, seeing approximately 2,000 clients

annually. The group also advocates for increased awareness of mental health, with the goal of removing the stigma and shame often associated with seeking mental health treatment.

In Indian River County, Tykes & Teens collaborates with the Healthy Families program. In addition to counseling, Tykes & Teens provides programs to help families deal with sexual abuse, domestic violence, bullying, and school suspensions.

Major Eric Flowers will talk about signs to watch for that might be factors in children becoming violent. He will also address how to keep children safe in an active shooter situation.

GYAC Guidance Counselor Carrie Williams has a Bachelor's degree from UCF and a Master's from Webster University in counseling. She is also a licensed mental health counselor and certified addictions professional.

# Choosing between a laptop and a desktop

People are often surprised when they find out that I prefer laptops over desktop (or tower) computers. For the average computer user, laptops have everything a person needs to get up and running right out of the box. It's usually not necessary to have to shop around for parts – the typical laptop comes equipped with all the hardware needed so there are no surprises. For example, you don't have to worry about getting it home and finding you still need to get a webcam to get online and talk with Skype. Laptops, by default, generally come with everything one needs to do the basic computing tasks that the typical user is trying to do.

"But aren't desktops more powerful than laptops?" people will often ask and to that I reply with mostly "no" and I say mostly because remember, we are talking about the "typical" computer user here, not a "super user" or "gamer" with needs beyond what I listed earlier. Now if you were to tell me you were setting up some type of file server or that you were planning on editing video or maybe doing computer aided design (CAD) then maybe a tower or desktop model is more appropriate. A tower does typically have more space inside so you can add

multiple hard drives and the cooling on a desktop or tower is often better than you get with laptop simply because things aren't crammed together as tightly. And cooling is important when pushing your machine hard like you do when gaming, video editing or CAD but again, these aren't things that the "typical" computer is doing. No for the basic tasks, a laptop is just fine, with power to spare for the basics.

"But Sean, I never take my computer anywhere and I just hate to try to type on that tiny keyboard" is an objection that I hear often and here's where laptops really shine. Did you know that you can plug in a standard keyboard, mouse and monitor into a laptop and use it just like you would a desktop? In fact, many people who get rid of their old desktop and start using a laptop are surprised to find they can plug their old computer's keyboard, mouse and monitor into the new laptop and it's indistinguish-

able from their old desktop! Actually, there is one distinction, with the old desktop they only had one monitor. When they plugged their old monitor into their new laptop they now have two screens! The mouse zips from one screen to the next and they're delighted to find they can drag icons and windows from one screen to another. All this right out of the box.

So what that means is that if you're replacing an old desktop or tower and you decide to get a laptop, don't throw away the old machine's keyboard, mouse or monitor! Find a place on your desk for the laptop and you still have the benefit of a full size keyboard, a regular mouse and a second screen. On top of that, the laptop battery makes for a fine UPS (uninterruptible power supply). If you had your old machine plugged into the wall and the power dropped out, your old machine would reboot if it wasn't plugged into a UPS. With a laptop, the battery kicks in and lets you continue right through the power outage giving you enough time to close and save whatever you were doing which, of course, is much better than having the rug yanked out from under you like in a power outage.

"But what if I'm not upgrading from a

desktop, what if I'm just buying a new machine or replacing an older laptop?

Shouldn't I get a desktop

since I don't have a full size keyboard, mouse and monitor? Again, I'm not going to take it anywhere and I do hate using that touch pad and tiny keyboard."

To that I answer save yourself some aggravation and pick up a twelve dollar keyboard and a ten dollar mouse. You can also find used, flat panel monitors for dirt cheap at thrift stores or Goodwill if you look hard enough.

The point is your laptop doesn't have to be limiting and irritating to use. Setting one up to take advantage of a full size keyboard, mouse and monitor is super easy and cheap. And once it's all set up on your desk, you'll have a hard time telling the difference between it and a desktop.

tive.

The CRC meets once every 20 years. Florida is the only state with a constitutional amendment commission.

The CRC, created by Article XI, Section 2 of the Florida Constitution, has 37 members. The constitution sets the Attorney General as the only automatic member. The Governor appoints 15 commissioners including the commission chair. The President of the Senate appoints nine, the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoints nine, and the Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court appoints three commissioners.

The Treasure Coast was represented on the CRC by Bob Solari of Vero Beach and Jacqui Thurlow-Lippisch of Sewall's Point. Both were appointed by the President of the Senate, Joe Negron.

The CRC held 15 public meetings across the state and reviewed thousands of public comments, before rejecting some proposals and combining others into its eight proposed amendments.

Making this year's process especially challenging is that the CRC "bundled" different issues into the same amendment. Of the amendments proposed by the CRC, only two, No. 12 (Lobbying and Abuse of office by Public Officers,) and No. 13 (Ends Dog Racing) deal with one clear-cut issue. Each of the other six from the CRC combined different proposals.

These will be the most difficult decisions for voters, as there are many people who agree with part of an amendment and disagree with the other parts, but you must vote either in favor or against the whole bundle. For example, No. 9 prohibits offshore oil and gas drilling and prohibits vaping in enclosed indoor workplaces.

Listed below are brief summaries of the amendments on the ballot. Each is excerpted from the state website, and in some cases there have been disputes regarding whether

the state's summary accurately reflects the proposed amendment. Voters are urged to do research and review the pros and cons. Search the internet for the title and number of the amendment and you will find a variety of viewpoints for each.

(1) Increased Homestead Property Tax Exemption, proposed by the Florida legislature. Increases the homestead exemption by exempting the assessed valuation of homestead property greater than \$100,000 and up to \$125,000 for all levies other than school district levies.

(2) Limitations on Property Tax Assessments, proposed by the legislature. Permanently retain provisions currently in effect that limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year.

(3) Voter Control of Gambling in Florida, proposed by a citizen initiative group called Voters In Charge. Ensures that voters shall have the exclusive right to decide whether to authorize casino gambling by requiring that all casino gambling must be approved by voters. Defines casino gambling and clarifies that this amendment does not conflict with federal law regarding state/tribal compacts.

(4) Voting Restoration Amendment, citizens' initiative proposed by Floridians for a Fair Democracy, Inc. Restores voting rights of Floridians with felony convictions after they complete all terms of their sentence including parole or probation. The amendment would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses, who would continue to be permanently barred from voting unless the Governor and Cabinet vote to restore their voting rights on a case by case basis.

(5) Supermajority Vote Required to Impose, Authorize, or Raise State Taxes or Fees, proposed by the legislature. Prohibits the legislature from imposing, authorizing, or raising a state tax or fee except by a two-thirds vote of each house. This proposal does not authorize a state tax or fee otherwise prohibited by the Constitution and

does not apply to fees or taxes imposed or authorized to be imposed by a county, municipality, school board, or special district.

Proposed amendments 6-13 are all from the Constitutional Revision Commission.

(6) Rights of Crime Victims; Judges. Creates constitutional rights for victims of crime; requires courts to facilitate victims' rights; authorizes victims to enforce their rights throughout criminal and juvenile justice processes. Requires judges and hearing officers to independently interpret statutes and rules rather than deferring to government agency's interpretation. Raises mandatory retirement age of state judges from seventy to seventy-five years; deletes authorization for judges to complete term if one-half of term has been served by retirement age.

(7) First Responder and Military Member Survivor Benefits; Public Colleges and Universities. Creates mandatory payment of education and compensation benefits to qualifying survivors of first responders and military members who die performing official duties. Requires supermajority votes by university trustees and state university system board of governors to raise or impose legislatively authorized fees. Establishes existing state college system as constitutional entity; provides governance structure.

(8) School Board Term Limits and Duties; Public Schools. Creates a term limit of eight consecutive years for school board members and requires the legislature to provide for the promotion of civic literacy in public schools. Currently, district school boards operate, control, and supervise all public schools. The amendment permits the state to operate, control, and supervise public schools not established by the school board.

(9) Prohibits Offshore Oil and Gas Drilling; Prohibits Vaping in Enclosed Indoor Workplaces. Prohibits drilling for oil and natural gas beneath all state-owned waters between the mean high water line and the state's outermost territorial boundaries. Adds use of vapor-generating devices to prohibition of tobacco smoking in enclosed

indoor workplaces with exceptions.

(10) State and Local Government Structure and Operation. Requires legislature to retain department of veterans' affairs. Ensures election of sheriffs, property appraisers, supervisors of elections, tax collectors, and clerks of court in all counties; removes county charters' ability to abolish, change term, transfer duties, or eliminate election of these offices. Changes annual legislative session commencement date in even-numbered years from March to January; removes legislature's authorization to fix another date. Creates office of domestic security and counterterrorism within department of law enforcement.

(11) Property Rights; Removal of Obsolete Provision; Criminal Statutes. Removes discriminatory language related to real property rights. Removes obsolete language repealed by voters. Deletes provision that amendment of a criminal statute will not affect prosecution or penalties for a crime committed before the amendment; retains current provision allowing prosecution of a crime committed before the repeal of a criminal statute.

(12) Lobbying and Abuse of Office by Public Officers. Expands current restrictions on lobbying for compensation by former public officers; creates restrictions on lobbying for compensation by serving public officers; provides exceptions; prohibits certain abuses of public office for personal benefit.

(13) Ends Dog Racing. Prohibits gaming or pari-mutuel entities from racing dogs in connection with wagering; eligibility of such entities to conduct other authorized pari-mutuel and gaming activities is not affected; prohibits wagering on outcome of in-state live dog races.

## Spectacular astronomy photos on display at VBMA

VERO BEACH — The new exhibit at the Vero Beach Museum of Art is an exciting collection of 50 photographs of celestial spectacle. Each was chosen from entries to the photography competition Astronomy Photographer of the Year, conducted by the Royal Observatory Greenwich in London, England.


Each year since 2009, the Royal Observatory has invited entries in categories such as aurorae, galaxies, moon, sun, people and space, planets, comets and asteroids, skylscapes, and stars and nebulae.

A judging panel comprised of curators, astronomers, and artists chose from 3,800 entries taken by astrophotographers from 90 countries, providing a worldwide selection in each category.

Russian photographer Artem Mironov beat thousands of amateur and professional photographers to win the title Astronomy Photographer of the Year 2017. His image is one of the many astonishing photographs displayed in the VBMA exhibition.

Mr. Mironov's image depicts the vibrant blues and pinks of the swirling dust and gas clouds in the Rho Ophiuchi Cloud Complex, approximately 400 light years away from Earth. Taken over three nights from a farm in Namibia, Mr. Mironov captured the

sprawling stellar nursery that recent x-ray and infrared studies have revealed to be a home to a cluster of more than 300 proto-stars.

Competition judge and Royal Observatory Public Astronomer Dr Marek Kukula said "There's an astonishing richness of color and structure in this gorgeous image. It's a popular part of the sky for astrophotographers but this image shows it to us in a fresh light and there's a sense of mystery in the churning clouds of gas and dust which reminds us that there's still so much to discover out there. A dazzling corner of our galaxy captured perfectly."

The museum is also offering a series of

interpretative space-inspired activities including a summer film series starting June 19, a Star Party for children and families on July 20, and a lecture from Professor Jon Bell of Indian River State College called Pictures From Space: Art and Astronomy on August 8.

Regular museum admission fees apply: \$10 adults, \$9 seniors, students with ID, youth 17 and under, museum members, and active military with ID and their families receive free admission.

Museum hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m., and Sunday from 1-4:30 p.m. The galleries are closed on Mondays during the summer.

by the way, as far as a gift for Dad, make it simple. A call from family far away or not so far away is great and personal. A card always touches my heart with a hand written note inside. Don't just buy something to give as a gift, try to share your emotions with dad. He will love that.

Now how about a recipe for baby back ribs. Come on, it's Father's Day and we love them. Or, if it must be a salmon filet, you can use the same seasoning ... almost.

## BABY BACK RIBS

Serves 4-6

### Ingredients

Two 2-1/2 to 3 pound racks baby back

pork ribs  
Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper  
1/2-cup Teriyaki sauce  
1/2-cup orange juice  
1 cup sweet barbecue sauce  
2 tablespoons paprika  
2 tablespoons melted butter

### Directions

Pre-heat oven to 325F. Salt and pepper the ribs on both sides and place on a sheet pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 45 minutes and remove from oven.

In a bowl, mix all ingredients except the salt and pepper to make the sauce. Coat ribs with sauce on the top and bottom and return to oven an additional 15-20 minutes or until the meat pulls away from the bone. Let the ribs rest 5 minutes then cut and serve.

1-1/4 inches thick, pin bones removed  
1 teaspoon vegetable oil  
1 teaspoon butter  
1/4 teaspoon kosher salt  
freshly ground black pepper  
1/4 cup teriyaki sauce  
1/4 cup fresh orange juice

### Directions

Mix teriyaki sauce and orange juice in a zip lock bag and add salmon filets; marinate for an hour.

Set a 10-inch nonstick sauté pan on medium heat and melt butter and oil together. Place the fillets in the pan, flesh side down. Cook for 2 minutes or until golden brown. Turn each fillet over and continue to cook for another 2 minutes. Take off heat, cover and set aside for 2 minutes before serving.


