

SEBASTIAN — The City of Sebastian is seeking applicants to fill volunteer positions on the Natural Resources Board and the Construction Board.

The Natural Resources Board holds the city's annual Earth Day event and advises City Council on environmental issues, with a focus on preservation, regulatory programs and asset management. The NRB seeks to improve the quality of

life in Sebastian by nurturing the beneficial relationship between citizens and our environment by protecting, preserving and promoting our natural resources.

County's income gap among highest in nation

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — A new economic study by the Economic Policy Institute concludes that Indian River County has the 10th largest income inequality of all counties nationwide.

When looked at by the slightly different "metropolitan area" metric, the results look even more alarming. The Sebastian-Vero Beach metropolitan area had the fourth largest gap in the country between the top 1 percent and the bottom 99 percent.

The study found that income inequality in the U.S. is the largest it has been since the 1928 peak that preceded the Great Depression.

Most large scale economic studies use data that is several years old in order to guarantee that the data is accurate and complete, and this report follows that pattern. This exhaustive study reviewed data through 2015, the last year for which the study authors had comprehensive and reliable information from across the country. It is expected that it will take a few more years before adequate data exists to analyze post-2015 changes.

In other words, the study should not be seen as an analysis of policies or trends from the last few years. Rather, it studies trends from 2009-15.

The report, titled "The New Gilded Age," finds that income inequality has

Candidate profiles: County Court Judge, Group 2

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — Each candidate was asked to provide a bio of up to 100 words, and a summary of the biggest issue facing the community that they could address as a County Court Judge. Their answers follow:



Nicole P. Menz:

Bio: 49 years old, practicing law in Indian River County for 23 years. My career began as an Assistant State Attorney in Vero Beach in 1995. I served nearly 9 years as a prosecutor representing the people of the Florida and Indian River County. I prosecuted thousands of cases from DUI to First Degree Murder.



Menz

I have spent 14 years in private civil practice with the law firm of Menz & Battista. I have been Board Certified in Criminal Trial Law since 2005.

For the last 1-1/2 years, I have presided over traffic court as a Civil Traffic Infraction Hearing Officer.

Q: What is the biggest issue concerning your community right now that you can affect in the office you seek and, if elected, how do you plan on solving that issue?

A: One of the biggest issues is the amount of taxpayer dollars spent for cases that are appropriate for diversion. There is a Drug Court Program available to individuals charged with felony possession of drugs (cocaine, hydrocodone) that have no prior record where the evidence indicates the individual is a user and not a seller. However, there is no such program for someone charged with possession of marijuana in County Court under those same circumstances. Diversion programs not only save taxpayer dollars but they also reduce recidivism rates. It is time for diversion programs in County Court. I will seek to implement those programs.

Kiernan Patrick Moylan:

Bio: Practicing law for more than nineteen years, eleven in public service. For about three years I worked as a Florida Assistant State Attorney General handling constitutional questions at a trial level, defending the State in civil rights and other matters. For seven years I have been an Assistant Public Defender handling all types of criminal matters, particularly for the past five years assigned to all cases of the Office in Indian River County Courts. I started my legal career as in-house counsel in a large Florida company, where I became a Senior

Vice President. My wife and I live in Indian River Shores with our three children.

Q: What is the biggest issue concerning your community right now that you can affect in the office you seek and, if elected, how do you plan on solving that issue?



Moylan

A: My goal for my service as a county judge is to carry forward the current successful system in our Indian River County Court System. I hope to work with Court Administration, Office of the State Attorney and the Office of the Public Defender to create more diversion court opportunities as allowed by the current statutes. I also believe we need to address the driving while license suspended issue currently facing Indian River County and I will work within the bounds of the law to facilitate.

Robyn Stone:

Bio: I was born and raised in Vero Beach.

I am a third-generation attorney in Indian River County. My father, Robert Stone, has been a lawyer here for fifty years. I graduated from St. Edward's School in 1997, Davidson College in 2001, and the University of Tennessee College of Law in 2006. I work for State Attorney Bruce Colton as an Assistant State Attorney. I have prosecuted thousands of cases over the last 12 years. Currently, I am a county court supervisor and I work in our Mental Health Court, Veterans' Court, and Drug Court. I live in Vero Beach.

Q: What is the biggest issue concerning your community right now that you can affect in the office you seek and, if elected, how do you plan on solving that issue?

A: According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, more than 115 people in the United States die every day after overdosing on opioids. I know from my experience as an Assistant State Attorney and a drug court team member that the opioid crisis affects us here in Indian River County. Opioid addition often leads to other crime such as thefts and burglaries. In county court, I would strive to address drug addictions by doing what I could do to identify entry level drug users and connect them with the many services and treatment centers our county has to offer.

VERO BEACH — Moore Motors of Vero Beach has been selling and servicing outdoor power equipment like lawnmowers for 32 years. If, like this writer, you've driven by the U.S. 1 location hundreds of times without ever going in, you need to have a look, especially if you're in the market for a lawnmower.

Until I visited with owner Dennis Moore recently, I had no idea how deep and well-stocked the showroom is. Just driving by, you have no idea how huge it is.

"We're probably the biggest independent dealer on the coast, as far as size and amount of inventory," Mr. Moore told Hometown News. "There's nobody on the Treasure Coast that's got an inventory like this."

Before you buy a lawnmower, you need to visit Moore Motors. If you want to go someplace where you're not going to see just a handful of models, this is your place.

"You can look at a hundred lawnmowers, that's for sure," Mr. Moore said.

"At any given time there's probably 200 lawnmowers here. And we've got a warehouse in the back that's full. We have lines you won't find at the box stores. We have mowers for everyone from the entry level homeowner all the way up to professionals. We've got lawnmowers that start at less than \$2,000, up to \$15,000. We've got something for everybody. We sell not only to home-

owners, but also landscaping companies. Whatever the application is, we have the tool for the job."

And Moore Motors has more than just mowers. As Mr. Moore explained, they have "all the equipment you need for maintaining your outdoor property." That includes Stihl chainsaws, blowers, hedge-trimmers and weed-wackers, and "anything and everything that involves making tall grass short."

Moore Motors only sells top-of-the-line equipment like Cub Cadet, Bobcat, and Hustler. They used to sell John Deere, but don't anymore because that company wanted to move the independent dealers to sell only their product. Dennis Moore was a John Deere dealer for 20 years, but he wanted to continue selling a full line of other manufacturers.

"When John Deere left us, it gave us an opportunity to stock more of the other manufacturers. For people looking for John Deere, we invite them to compare that to what we have, and they may find a superior product," Mr. Moore said. "Cub Cadet is a major player. Bobcat is a major player. Hustler is a real old company. These manufacturers don't build disposable equipment. They build premium products that are designed to last and give you more than your money's worth. We don't sell throw-away products that in five years you'll be looking to replace."

Moore Motors does still service and maintain John Deere products, as well as

almost every other brand.

"What separates us from the box stores is that we have parts and we have service. If you buy it here, we service it here. You don't have to call an 800 number and get directed to go someplace for service. You bring it back here and we take care of it. We're a one-stop shop."

"There are very few things that we can't work on. We stock belts and blades and filters for almost every lawnmower in existence, not just the ones we sell. Because we work on everything, so we have to have the parts."

While the new equipment inventory is enormous, service and parts are the mainstay of Moore Motors.

"We built this business on service and parts," said Mr. Moore. "There's nothing that we sell here that we cannot provide parts and service for. If you buy a lawnmower from a box store and you have a problem with it, you can't take it back there. They're going to send you someplace."

"Everything I've got here on the floor is made in the U.S. The Bobcats, Cub Cadets, Hustlers are all made right here in the U.S. And we have some of the best warranties in the industry."

"We're always running good financing specials. We can offer zero percent interest on most lines. We can provide good financing programs right here, through the manufacturers. That gives us a tool to offer an incentive to the customer. If you don't want to reach into your pocket for the money right now, I can offer you 48 months at zero percent. And if you've got a five year warranty, the warranty will run a year longer than the payments. That doesn't happen most places."

Moore Motors sells mostly new equipment, but they also sell some used, because they take trade-ins. If you have a mower

that's still got some life left in it, you can trade it in on a new one, which they'll recondition and sell as a used mower.

"Cub Cadet makes a line of utility vehicles, and we also sell those," said Mr. Moore. "If you've got 10 acres of property, not only do we have everything it takes to maintain it, but we've got vehicles so you can roam around on it."

So if you're looking for lawnmowers, trimmers, chainsaws, weed-wackers, or any other yard care products, be sure to visit Moore Motors. And if you see something on the website of one of the manufacturers they carry like Bobcat or Cub Cadet, let Dennis Moore or Parts Manager Richard Davis know, and they can order it for you if they don't already have it.

"We don't stock every single thing you'll see on their websites, but we can get anything you see on our dealers' websites."



Louis "Lou" Larsen:

Bio: I've worked as an attorney over 26 years. I am a board certified civil trial lawyer among only 7 percent of all Florida attorneys. I've worked most of my career on the Treasure Coast representing individuals and businesses in many different matters including personal injury, criminal defense, general civil litigation and marital law. My non-litigation practice areas include wills and trusts, probate, trademarks, copyrights, liens and business transactions. I am of counsel with the Treasure Coast Legal law firm with offices in Stuart, Port St. Lucie and Ft. Pierce. I am admitted in six states and also the federal court for the southern district of Florida.

Q: What is the biggest issue concerning your community right now that you can affect in the office you seek and, if elected, how do you plan on solving that issue?

A: Circuit judges are responsible for many different matters in addition to criminal law. Currently, 14 of the 29 judges in our

risen in every state since the 1970s, and has accelerated in most states since the Great Recession.

From 2009-15, incomes of the top one percent grew faster than the incomes of the bottom 99 percent in 43 states and Washington D.C. The top one percent received at least half of all income growth in nine states.

Overall, the top one percent in the U.S. received 22.03 percent of all income in 2015. That is only 1.9 percent below the pre-Depression peak of 23.9 percent in 1928.

Florida was one of only five states where the top one percent had a greater income share than that 1928 benchmark. To be in the top one percent nationally, a family

needs an annual income of \$421,926.

In Florida, the top one percent took home 28.5 percent of all income in 2015, second behind New York's 31 percent. The report concluded that this makes Florida and New York the two "most unequal" states.

Thirty metropolitan areas had top one percent shares of income above 23.9 percent in 2015. Shares were highest in Jackson, Wyoming, (57.1 percent); Naples-Immokalee-Marco Island, (47.6 percent); Key West, (45.1 percent); and Sebastian-Vero Beach, (40.4 percent). In the Sebastian-Vero Beach metro area, the bottom 99 percent took home 29.4 percent of the income.

Seventy-eight counties had top one percent shares above 23.9 percent. Shares were highest in Teton County, Wyoming, (59 percent). Indian River County was 10th at 40.4 percent, followed closely by Martin County

at 40.3 percent.

In Indian River County, the average income of the top one percent was \$2,921,375, versus \$43,473 for the bottom 99 percent.

The study authors blamed the disparity to a large degree on the decline of unions, resulting in a loss of worker bargaining power.

"While the degree of income inequality differs across the country, the underlying forces are clear," said study co-author Mark Price, an economist at the Keystone Research Center in Harrisburg, Penn. "It's the result of intentional policy decisions to shift bargaining power away from working people and towards the top one percent. To reverse this, we should enact policies that boost workers' ability to bargain for higher wages, rein in the salaries of CEOs and the

financial sector, and implement a progressive tax system."

"Rising inequality affects virtually every part of the country, not just large urban areas or financial centers," said co-author Estelle Sommeiller, a socio-economist at the Institute for Research in Economic and Social Sciences in France. "It's a persistent problem throughout the country - in big cities and small towns, in all 50 states. While the economy continues to recover, policymakers should make it a top priority to grow the incomes of working people while reigning in corporate profits."

Search continues for Quilted Giraffe owner Susy Tomassi

VERO BEACH — On Aug. 7, the Indian River County Sheriff's Office held a news conference to remind residents that the search for Susy Tomassi continues, and a reward remains in effect.

On March 16, at approximately 5 p.m., Assunta "Susy" Tomassi was sitting outside the Quilted Giraffe restaurant she owns with her husband, Patrick Tomassi. Ms. Tomassi is known to sit outside the restaurant and read a book or smoke, and that is where she told her husband she would be.

"On the evening of Friday, March 16, Ms. Tomassi walked away from the Quilted Giraffe restaurant and simply vanished," Indian River County Sheriff Deryl Loar said. "We have been actively looking for anybody that is involved in her disappearance. We have chased down nearly 100 leads, up and down the east coast of the U.S., as well as throughout Indian River County. Detective (Mike) Dilks has worked tirelessly chasing down every lead possible, as well as our entire criminal investigative division. Today, we're making another plea for anyone that has seen anything, heard anything, knows anything to come forward."

Ms. Tomassi frequently walked to the South Vero Square plaza to visit the Family Dollar store. Ms. Tomassi had been known to wander off before, but Mr. Tomassi had always been able to locate her. At approximately 6 p.m., Mr. Tomassi realized Ms. Tomassi was missing, and began looking for her. Surveillance video obtained from Wildwood Antique Mall in South Vero Square shows Ms. Tomassi walking in front of the business.

"Based on surveillance video obtained from businesses in South Vero Square, we know that at 5:41 p.m., Mrs. Tomassi was walking south through the South Vero Square Plaza," Sheriff Loar said. "We also believe that she did not enter the Family Dollar store or walk past Publix. It is possible that she may have accepted a ride or exited the plaza another way."

"Time has stopped since she went missing," daughter in law Cary Baker said at the news conference. Choking back tears, Mr. Tomassi added "It doesn't get easier. That's why we're pleading to anybody that knows something."

Lead Detective Mike Dilks said that the case has never gone cold, and he focused on the reluctance of witnesses who might know something to come forward.

"We here at the Sheriff's Office will protect anybody that comes forward with information," Det. Dilks said. "We need help. It was a daytime incident. Somebody had to have seen something. The case is active. It's not in any way cold, it's being investigated daily. This in no way is a cold case, it is not a case on the back burner, this is front and center."

Asked if he had any ideas what could have happened, Det. Dilks said "I do not. I can only speculate. I am confident (after our search that night) that she got to a vehicle of some sort. It was the day before St. Patrick's Day, an easy day to remember. If anybody has any information about what car she got into, or who she left the area with, we need to know, and we need to know it soon."

"We'd like to thank the community as well for all of the support over almost five months," Ms. Baker said. "The support of everyone, and the love shown us. We just

beg anyone.

Our mother-in-law went missing during the day in the plaza at the Publix. We know someone had to have seen something. They don't have to be afraid – just come forward, for us, for her, to bring her peace, and to bring my family peace."

Det. Dilks said that the \$15,000 reward the family offered in March was still available.

"We do have people coming forward with tips, but they're very reluctant," Det. Dilks said. "Some of these I'm getting, people have known this information for a month or two and were just scared to come forward. The fear of retaliation from somebody who may have caused harm is now superseding the right thing."

Det. Dilks said the leads had led them to contact agencies in New Jersey, Georgia, North Carolina, and the west coast of Florida.

When Ms. Tomassi was originally report-

ed missing, family and friends conducted an extensive search. Police and sheriff's units canvassed the area and the surroundings, including the path to their home in Fort Pierce.

The Indian River County Sheriff's Office helicopter provided support from the air. Ground searches continued throughout the night and a full search and rescue team was convened to search the wooded area of the Oslo Preserve. Special operations units including the Special Weapons and Tactics Team and Agriculture and Marine deputies assisted in the ground search. All Terrain Vehicles were used to search Old Dixie Highway south to her home, as well as U.S. Highway 1 south. K-9 Units were also called in to assist with the search.






