




# HOMECOMING



## Scholarship, Leadership, Character, Service








As Junior Class President, this year was difficult as far as interruptions were concerned. We got off to a good start, but as the problems increased, our money-raising decreased.







# TIGER FOOTBALL


## *A Competitive Season*



## *A New, Yet Successful Sport*






Soldiers, which lived in the school, now await for their next order. Meanwhile, they sit in the shade, some keep to themselves while others talk to their fellow servicemen.




