hree Months Remand For Accused Drug Traffickers

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday, April 3, 2013:


Three men busted with weed in Benque Viejo, Cayo, have all been remanded to the big jail in Hattieville.

Venturing into the jurisdiction of Benque Viejo police, and acting on information received, a team of policemen from the San Ignacio police detachment rushed into Benque Viejo Town today where at the entrance to George Price Boulevard, they intercepted a white Chevy Malibu car with license plates BZE C-34685 departing Benque Viejo heading eastward to San Ignacio some time around 6:30 pm.

The vehicle was stopped and a thorough search of its interior produced nothing incriminating. The

Belmopan. He was later transferred to the Karl Heusner Memorial Hospital in Belize City where he remains in critical condition.

The incident resulted in the arrest, on Wednesday, April 3, 2013, of Gail Wells, 49, African American; self employed businesswoman who told the police that she is a spiritual healer residing in the Yalbac community near Spanish Lookout. The charges against the accused range from driving a motor vehicle without due care and attention, negligent grievous harm and failure to give way when changing direction.

The accused was taken to court on Wednesday, April 3, 2013, where she

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday, April 3, 2013:

An African American woman is currently on remand at the central prison following a traffic accident involving a motor cycle riding policeman.

The police informs that at around 3:30 pm on Tuesday, April 2, police constable #1213, Andy Tun, currently attached to the police substation in San Antonio Village, Cayo, was riding the police green and black, Kawasaki brand motorcycle on Center Road in Spanish Lookout when he collided in the mid section of a blue Ford F350 pickup truck, with license plates CY-C-27525, driven by Gail Wells, who allegedly drove onto the main road directly into the pathway of the approaching motorcycling cop.

It is reported that the policeman received head and body injuries and was rushed to the emergency ward at the Western Regional Hospital in

Guatemalan Farmer Busted With Gun And Bullets

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday, April 3, 2013:

A Guatemalan farmer alleged to have entered Belize illegally was today stopped at a checkpoint and found in possession of a pistol and seven bullets.

The incident reportedly occurred at around 8:30 am on Wednesday, April 3, 2013 at a check point on the eastern outskirts of the village of San Jose Succtoz, between miles 71 and 72 on the George Price Highway.

Benque Viejo police informed that a taxi cab heading towards San Ignacio, with a single male passenger on board, approached the check point and a search of the passenger resulted in the discovery of a .22 caliber pistol, brand unknown, along with seven live rounds of .25 Aguila brand ammunition.

The male person was identified on the scene as **Juan David Santos Lopez**, 24, Guatemalan farmer from Plan Grande Palencia, Guatemala. Lopez was escorted to the police station in Benque Viejo Town where he was arrested and formally charged

for keeping firearm without a gun license and for keeping ammunition also without a gun license. Police further informed that the accused will likewise be charged, by Immigration officials, for illegal entry into Belize.

Good Neighbors Prevent Burglary

SAN IGNACIO, Cayo, Tuesday, April 2, 2013:

A serial burglar, caught in the act of attempting to break into a house, has been taken off the streets thanks to the assistance of alert neighbors in Santa Elena Town, Cayo.

Dorothy Garbutt, 68, Belizean retired teacher of #2 Melhado Street in Santa Elena, reported to police that on Wednesday, March 27, 2013, at about 5:00 pm while at a bus stop in Santa Elena she was alerted by relatives of the report of a man attempting to break into her house.

Garbutt rushed home where she encountered the police putting the suspect in the back of the pickup truck as alert neighbors prevented from him from breaking into her house and held him until the police arrived.

Prosecutor **George Gomez** objected to bail on the basis of the accused having prior burglary charges before the court. In upholding the prosecution's request, Magistrate Morgan proceeded to remanded Castillo to prison. The case was adjourned to Monday, May 13, 2013.

No motive was given for the planned attack but the men had already confessed, she added.


Intelligence operations had uncovered the plot, adding that the suspects had been followed from an undisclosed location to Mexico City,

Man Accused Of Harming Step-Son

A Santa Elena man is out on a two thousand dollar bail as he stands accused of causing grievous harm to his step-son.


On Thursday, March 28, 2013, Myner Manzanero, 23, Belizean student, residing in the Bradley's Bank area of Santa Elena Town, visited the police station in San Ignacio where he reported that at about 5:30 pm on said date, he was at home when he and his step-father, Orlando Borallos, reportedly got into a heated argument.

The complainant told the police that the step-father punched him to the left side of the face, causing him to stumble out of the house. The complainant further alleged that as he regained composure the step father continued punching him in the face and in the process drawing blood.

The complainant was transported by police to the San Ignacio Community Hospital where the injuries were classified as grievous harm by the attending medical officer.

The police investigation led to the arrest of the accused **Orlando Borallos**, 42, Belizean laborer of a Bradley's Bank address in Santa Elena Town. He was later charged for grievous harm.

Cuban Ballet Dancers Defect While On Tour In Mexico



The Ballet Troupe Is Led By Legendary Prima Ballerina Assoluta Alicia Alonso

Seven members of the National Ballet of Cuba defected during a performing tour of Mexico last month.

A ballet spokesman confirmed the news, saying only that they had not returned at the end of the tour.

The world-renowned troupe, led by legendary ballerina **Alicia Alonso**, has been hit by defections before.

A Cuban exile website based in Miami said six of the defectors were now in the United States, while the seventh was still in Mexico.

The head of Havana's National Ballet School, where some of them had studied, expressed her sadness at the news.

Ramona de Saa said she considered one of the five women among

the defectors as like a daughter to her.

Exile website cafefuerte.com identified the dancers as two men and five women, all in their early 20s. They had now requested asylum in the US, it said.

They are thought to be in Miami, the centre of the US Cuban exile community.

"We were intent on seeking a better artistic life and economic well-being for our families," Cafe Fuerte quoted one of the group, Annie Ruiz Diaz, as saying.

Correspondents say Cuba's National Ballet has suffered from a number of high-profile defections over the years, as performers stay abroad in search of greater creative and economic opportunities.

In March 2011, five members of the company defected after a performance in Canada. In 2005, the National Ballet's principal dancer **Rolando Sarabia** defected to the US via Mexico and has since performed with the Houston Ballet and Miami City Ballet.



The lawyer asks the first question.



Argentina Floods 'Catastrophe' For La Plata, Buenos Aires

Emergency workers in Argentina continue to try to rescue residents stranded by flooding in Buenos Aires and La Plata.

More than 50 people are known to have died after one of the heaviest storms recorded caused flash floods.

Thousands were evacuated from their homes and dozens are still stranded on rooftops, treetops and the roofs of city buses, local media report.

The government has declared three days of national mourning after what it called "an unprecedented catastrophe".

'Death trap'

"We've never seen anything like it," provincial governor Daniel Scioli said.

"People were taken by surprise, and some didn't have time to escape this deadly trap," Mr Scioli said, referring to the speed with which the waters rose.

Provincial officials said 40cm (16in) of rain fell on the city of La Plata in the space of two hours late on Tuesday night.

Earlier, the storm had dumped 15cm of rainfall on the capital, Buenos Aires.

Local officials said at least 48 people were killed in La Plata, six in



Hundreds Of People Took To The Roofs Of Their Houses As The Floodwaters Rose

Buenos Aires and two in its suburbs. The Red Cross said most of the victims had been elderly people who drowned in their homes.

So far, only half of the bodies have been identified and rescue workers fear the number of dead may rise as more bodies are found as the flood waters recede.

Fear of looting

Firefighter Federico Langone said in some areas of La Plata, the flood waters had reached a height of 1.5m (5ft).

More than 3,000 people had to leave their homes and 80,000 still do not have electricity, with two of La Plata's hospitals also affected by the

power cuts.

On Wednesday night, some of La Plata's residents set up roadblocks to "protect their neighbourhoods from looters".

President **Cristina Fernandez** de Kirchner on Wednesday visited Tolosa, the worst affected neighbourhood of La Plata, where she grew up and where her mother still lives

Ms Fernandez acknowledged residents' fears and promised to increase security.

Before her arrival, dozens of people had looted a supermarket. Three police officers were injured in scuffles with people trying to break into two other supermarkets.

Officials said 400 extra police officers and soldiers would be deployed to La Plata.

Clean-up

In Buenos Aires, where the rains had been at their worst overnight Monday to Tuesday, the floods have begun to recede and residents have started the clean-up.

Damp clothes and furniture were piled by roadsides as neighbours assessed the damage to their homes.

Mayor **Mauricio Macri** said about 350,000 people had been affected by the torrents of rain. Hundreds are still in shelters.

Pope Francis, an Argentine, has called on the authorities to step up their assistance to those left homeless by the storm.

The Pope sent a telegram to his newly appointed successor as Buenos Aires Archbishop, Mario Poli, saying he was praying for those who died, their families and survivors of the disaster.

Male Baldness 'Indicates Heart Risk'

Men going thin on top may be more likely to have heart problems than their friends with a full head of hair, according to researchers in Japan.

Their study of nearly 37,000 people, published in the online journal BMJ Open, said balding men were 32% more likely to have coronary heart disease.

However, the researchers said the risks were less than for smoking or obesity.

The British Heart Foundation said men should focus on their waistline, not their hairline.

A shifting hairline is a fact of life for many men. Half have thinning hair by their 50s and 80% have some hair loss by the age of 70.

Researchers at the University of Tokyo sifted through years of previous research into links between hair loss and heart problems.

They showed that hair that went thin on the crown was associated with coronary heart disease. This was



after adjusting for other risk factors such as age and family history.

However, a receding hairline did not seem to affect the risk.

Focus on lifestyle

Dr Tomohide Yamada, of the University of Tokyo, told the BBC: "We found a significant, though modest, link between baldness, at least on the top of the head, and risk for coronary heart disease.

"We thought this is a link, but not

as strong as many other known links such as smoking, obesity, cholesterol levels and blood pressure."

He said younger men losing hair on the top of their head should focus on improving their lifestyle to ensure they keep their heart healthy.

However, he said there was not enough evidence to suggest screening bald men for heart problems.

Any explanation for the link is uncertain.

There are ideas about increased sensitivity to male hormones, insulin resistance and inflammation in blood vessels affecting both the heart and

Doireann Maddock, a cardiac nurse with the British Heart Foundation, said: "Although these findings are interesting, men who've lost their hair should not be alarmed by this analysis.

"Much more research is needed to confirm any link between male pattern baldness and an increased risk of coronary heart disease. In

the meantime, it's more important to pay attention to your waistline than your hairline.

"Hereditary hair loss may be out of your control, but many of the risk factors for coronary heart disease are not. Stopping smoking, maintaining a healthy weight and being as active as possible are all things that you can do to help protect your heart."

Patrick Wolfe, a professor of statistics at University College London, said: "Right now the link that is seemingly responsible for this relative risk increase is not well understood, and so in future we might look forward to a day when understanding more about the various mechanisms underlying heart disease will tell us more about those underlying male pattern baldness, and vice versa.

"In the meantime it's a case of focusing on the things that we can control - our diet, exercise regimens and other risk factors to lower our overall risk for heart disease."

the path to develop vaccines against HIV."

Dr Sarah Joseph, who tests HIV vaccines at the Medical Research Council clinical trials unit, said: "This paper is really interesting. Some people do make antibodies that neutralise a lot of HIV virus, bit it is not of use to them as they produce it way too late."

She said harnessing these antibodies "could be a big deal" and there was "even talk about mass-producing antibodies and infusing people with them".

Vaccine Hopes

The body's own "training manual" for attacking HIV has been recorded by US scientists and it is hoped it can be used to design vaccines.

HIV mutates in order to survive the onslaught of a patient's immune


However, some patients develop highly effective antibodies that can neutralise huge swathes of HIV mutants.

A North Carolina team analysed the arms race between body and virus, published in the journal Nature, and has shown how these antibodies are made.

When someone is infected with HIV, their body produces antibodies to attack it. But the virus mutates and evades the offensive, so the body produces new antibodies that the virus then evades and the war goes

However, after about four years of this struggle some patients hit on to a winner by targeting something the virus finds harder to change - an A chilles heel.

"Even though the virus mutates and there are literally millions of quasi-species of virus because of all these mutations, but there are parts the virus can't change otherwise the virus cannot infect - these are the vulnerable sites," Prof Barton Haynes, of Duke



University, in North Carolina, told the BBC.

At this stage of the infection it is far too late to make a difference for the patient as the virus is hiding in untouchable reservoirs.

However, some researchers believe that vaccines that encourage the body to produce these "broadly neutralising antibodies" may give people immunity to the virus.

Super antibody

The research team's study is based on a patient in Africa who had a rapid diagnosis, about four weeks after being infected with the virus.

They were eventually able to produce an antibody named CH103 that could neutralise 55% of HIV samples.

It was not produced in one easy step. Rather it was the product of the war of the immune system and HIV trying to out-evolve each other.

However, through regular genetic analyses of both the immune system and virus, researchers could piece together each of the steps that culminated in the production of CH103.

It is like a training manual for the immune system.

Prof Haynes said: "What we were able to do was map out the arms race of both virus and antibody, and in doing so we have now a тар.

"This is the first time we've been able to see the actual road map."

He said the challenge now was to see if re-creating those steps could lead to a viable vaccine.

However, he said it would almost certainly need to be a vaccine combining multiple "Achilles heels" - in the same way that HIV therapies are a combination of drug treatments.

Prof Jane Anderson, consultant at Homerton hospital in London and chair of the British HIV Association, said: "The study gives important insights into the ways in which the human immune system responds to HIV infection and increases our understanding about the relationships between the virus and the human host.

"This is another welcome step on

Youths Who Murdered Mexican Activist Chavez Sentenced

A judge in Mexico has sentenced three youths to 15 years in prison for the 2011 murder of Mexican activist **Susana Chavez.**

Ms Chavez was found strangled and with one hand cut off in Ciudad Juarez.

She had been a key figure in the community, drawing attention to the killing of mainly poor women in the northern border town in the 1990s.

She had coined the slogan "Not One More Death", which became popular at protests against the women's killings.

Police found her body dumped in the city centre on 6 January 2011.

Atrail of blood led them to the home of **Sergio Ruben Cardenas**, where they found more blood and the severed hand of Ms Chavez.

Ms Chavez Was A Prominent Poet Who Was Active In Groups Supporting The Families Of Those Killed

Neighbours gave police a description of Cardenas, who was arrested shortly afterwards in Ciudad Juarez.

He confessed immediately and told police the names of his two accomplices.

All three told police they had been drunk on the night of the murder and

had come across Ms Chavez on their way to buy more alcohol.

According to their confession they asked Ms Chavez along to Cardenas's home for drinks.

There, they reportedly got into an argument, with the three youths claiming they were members of a

criminal gang and Ms Chavez telling them she was an undercover policewoman.

The three told police they panicked, thinking she may inform on them.

They said they covered Ms Chavez's face in sticky tape until she suffocated and cut off her hand to make her murder look like a gangland execution.

Ms Chavez was active in an organisation called May Our Daughters Return Home.

The group represents the families and friends of more than 300 women who were murdered in Ciudad Juarez in a wave of violence which started in 1993 and lasted for a decade.

There is no generally accepted motive for the murders.

They have been variously attributed to serial killers, drug cartels and domestic violence. Some of the killings are believed to have been sexually motivated.

Friends for Conservation and Development (FCD) will work to "Develop GIS Capability to monitor land use change" in the Chiquibul National Park. Through this project, FCD will continue to ensure efficient monitoring and enforcement execution along Chiquibul's western border. FCD will also socialize and raise the visibility of agriculture incursions issues.

Programme for Belize (PFB), seeks to provide adequate transportation and equipment to the ranger team for effective patrolling and protection of the Rio Bravo Conservation and Management Area (RBCMA) to prevent, address and control illegal activities in the protected area.



The Southern Environmental Association's (SEA) project focuses on the protected areas in the Southern Barrier Reef Complex (SBRC). The objective of the project is to reduce illegal activities in the SBRC, improve management and train personnel under SEA's protected

areas program in weapon handling and safety, self defense tactics, and basic first aid skills.

The Payne's Creek National Park (PCNP) in the Toledo District will see reduced frequency and severity of illegal extraction and wildfires with the project by the Toledo Institute for Development and the Environment (TIDE). The project also seeks to have 15 or more members of the Southern Belize Fire Working Group and buffer communities apply enhanced capacity to manage fire in and around PCNP. TIDE will work to increase the number of breeding pairs of the endangered yellowheaded parrot within PCNP and put measures in place to reverse the decline in the population of the critically endangered goliath grouper. By the end of the project, approximately 1500 key stakeholders (resource users and youth) within 15 communities in Toledo should have enhanced understanding of Toledo's protected areas.

Ya'axché Conservation Trust will work effortlessly in Bladen Nature Reserve, Golden Stream Corridor Preserve, Columbia River Forest and buffering communities of the Maya Golden Landscape "Promoting Evidence-based Integrated Landscape Management." By the

end of the project, Ya'axché predicts a 30 percent decline in illegal incursions and extraction of timber by effectively managing enforcement in the protected area. Ya'axché will also work to increase environmental awareness of the value of healthy ecosystems (particularly towards bird conservation) for tourism and ecosystem services among farmers and community members.

PACT is confident that these grants will have great impacts on conservation in Belize and thanks all recipients for their hard work and commitment to their respective protected areas. For more information please visit www.pactbelize.org.

Reference report of extortion made by Ms. Anna Mae Nembhard on Thursday 28th March 2013.

On Thursday 4th April 2013, at 4:10 pm police constable #132 Frank McNeal was served with disciplinary charge of Act to the Prejudice of Good Order and Discipline> He was placed on interdiction with effect as of 4th April 2013.

2. Reference report made by Ms. Carol James on Tuesday 2nd April, 2013 that when she arrived home from the United States on Saturday 30th March, 2013, she discovered that some jewelries and money was missing from her house. Our investigation into this matter revealed that on Wednesday 27th March, 2013 when her common-lawhusband was detained, he handed over the keys for their house, boutique and the gate to a neighbor (Elaina Arnold) at the time he was detained. This matter is still under investigation.

3. Reference the report made by Adrian Daniels and Theodore Garcia alleging Police abuse, which occurred in Independence Village on Monday 1st April, 2013, statements were recorded from them in Belize City and those statement have since been forward to both Mr. Robert Mariano the Southern Regional Commander and Mr. Noel Leal the Commander of Professional and Standard Branch in Belmopan City. The Southern Regional Commander is in Independence conducting his investigations into this matter.

4. Reference allegations of Rape in Bullet Tree involving Police Officers that was retracted by the complainant, police constable #654 Eldrid Clinton Thomas has been charged with two counts of Act to the Prejudice of Good Order and Discipline and one count of Drinking Intoxicating Liquor while on duty. He has been placed on immediate interdiction.

Ed. Note: This was certainly not a good week for the police as, apart from the above four items, there is also the report of the killing of a policeman.

There is also the incident this week about PC Andy Tun, the victim of a road traffic incident, who remains in critical condition at the Karl Heusner Memorial Hospital in Belize City.

Robber

UNITEDVILLE VILLAGE, Cayo, Saturday, March 30, 2013:

A near midnight robbery in the village of Unitedville, Cayo, has left a bar owner with a busted forehead, and two male patrons wounded.

Marisol Tobar, 35, Belizean businesswoman from Unitedville, reported to police that at around 11:30 pm on Saturday, March 30, 2013, three short male persons of dark complexion, wearing dark clothing and with their faces covered, stormed into her Hill Top Bar. One of them, armed with a handgun, reportedly pointed it her and demanded money.

Fearing for her life, Tobar immediately handed over a thousand dollars to the gunmen who reportedly stole her gold chain with a diamond medal, valued at fifteen hundred dollars. The gunman then fired two shots into the bar before all three of them rushed out and disappeared into the darkness.

Tobar emerged from the incident with a small cut wound to the left side of the forehead. She was taken to the La Loma Luz hospital in Santa Elena where the injury was classified as wounding by the medical officer on

In subsequent statements to the police, patrons of the bar confirmed the firing of two shots by the gunman resulting in injuries to two patrons of the establishment. Both injured men were rushed to the Western Regional Hospital in Belmopan. They were later

identified as Unitedville resident. Belize Defence Force soldier, Trevor Robateau, 28, who emerged with a cut would to the head which was reportedly inflicted by one of the robbers.

The other injured man was identified as Anthony Caliz, 31, Belizean construction worker from Camalote Village. He was treated for an abrasion to the top of the head allegedly caused by one of the shots fired by the gunman.

Up to press time an arrest is yet to be made as the police embark on a manhunt for the three robbers.


