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


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CHIKUNGUNYA: 19 POSSIBLE CASES AWAIT CONFIRMATION IN SAINT BARTH

The epidemic of chikungunya that started in Saint Martin eleven weeks ago has continued with 65 cases confirmed or considered probable as of this week. The virus has reached Martinique where two cases were identified. And in Guyana, where there is one case as well. In Saint-Barth, 19 possible cases await confirmation from the laboratory in Marseille by the end of the week.

The chikungunya virus continues to propagate—and rapidly—in St Martin, where it has been present for the past eleven weeks. Heavy rains that hit the Northern Islands this past week did not help the matter as they encourage mosquitoes to proliferate. In Saint Martin, where the first two cases were confirmed on December 5, the count rose to 65 confirmed or highly possible cases as of Monday, December 23.

At the same time 115 out of 145 cases were considered suspect. Patrice Richard, director the Regional Health Agency (ARS) in Guadeloupe, provided these figures. He also participated in a meeting of the committee to control epidemics—such as chikungunya and dengue—that was held last Monday in Saint Barthélemy. Also present were the president of the Collectivity, Bruno Magras, and Jacques Montazeau, representative of the prefecture in Saint-Barth. While the virus has already impacted Martinique, where two cases have been confirmed, and Guyana where there is one case, Saint Barth has not been affected in the past eleven weeks.



Yet 19 possible cases await analysis in Saint Barth, as indicated by Richard on Monday. But those who are sick complain of the typical symptoms of the virus: joint pain localized in the wrists or ankles. “This pain could also be a severe form of dengue, but we are reacting from experience,” adds Richard. Chikungunya is not a serious disease, no more serious than dengue, points out the ARS, even if the local pain is strong enough to require taking off from work.

The ARS points out certain measures to take: “The same as for dengue since the carrier of the virus, the *Aedes Aegypti* mosquito, is the same,” notes Richard. One should do the maximum to eliminate all stagnant water around the house, clean out the gutters, and cover anything where water can accumulate, even flowerpots. Add screens to cistern openings as well as any reservoirs of water where cisterns might overflow.

During the meeting, advice was also given to builders, hotels, and mechanics to do what is needed. As president of St Barth Commuter, Bruno Magras notes that their planes between Saint Barth

and Saint Martin have been disinfected. Jean-Claude Latournerie, director of the Voyager ferry, the principal maritime company for the Northern Islands, confirms that the same has been done to their boats.

The Symptoms Of Chikungunya

The ARS points out that the disease appears on an average of four to seven days after being bitten by an infected mosquito, with a sudden fever (higher than 101°F), then headaches and major muscular pain especially in the extremities of arms and legs (wrists, ankles, phalanges). There is no specific treatment, and no vaccine. In case of a suspected case, the ARS recommends calling your doctor immediately. “There is no point in going to the hospital, points out Patrice Richard, director of the ARS in Guadeloupe. “Only your doctor can decide if it is necessary to go to the emergency room,” he adds. The management plan for the epidemic also provides for information given to doctors and pharmacists so that they can help their patients.

Pulverization Campaign

To stop the proliferation of the *Aedes Aegypti* mosquito, carrier of the chikungunya virus as well as dengue, the Collectivity and the ARS sprayed the island earlier this week using insecticides containing Deltamethrin. The final spraying is in Toiny, Grand and Petit Cul de Sac, Marigot, Vitet, and Camaruche on Friday, December 27 at dawn and in the late afternoon.

THE CSG & CRDS NOT DUE ON SALE OF A PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE

Even the fiscal residents of Saint Barth have to keep an eye on the general tax collectors in France, as they are keeping an eye on the island. The Conseil d'Etat in fact called upon the general tax code—not the code specific to Saint Barthélemy—in giving its opinion of the following question: are the CSG and CRDS (French social taxes) due on the capital gains on the sale of a primary residence in Saint-Barth? The Conseil d'Etat was called upon for an opinion by the administrative tribunal of Saint Barthélemy—in order to mediate a question between the fiscal administration in Guadeloupe and a couple that resides in

Saint Barth. This case started in June 2009, when the couple signed an agreement to sell their home, and expected to pay the capital gains tax as called for in the tax code for Saint Barthélemy. But not in addition, the CSG, the CRDS, and other French taxes on their capital gains. Yet these taxes were requested when the sales agreement was signed. The DRFIP (regional tax office) of Guadeloupe required 12.3% in additional taxes if the owners wanted to see their sale properly registered. The couple could not believe their ears and took the matter to court, thus the Conseil d'Etat for their opinion. That opinion came through a few weeks

ago and is good news for the couple, as well as other fiscal residents. The highest administrative jurisdiction has declared that the CSG and CRDS are not payable as long as the capital gains on the sale of a primary residence were not taxable in France, in compliance with the general tax code. So it would be logical that the couple in question was exonerated, as the administrative tribunal of Saint Barthélemy must follow the opinion of the Conseil d'Etat. And request that the 12.3% tax be repaid with interest. The final judgment of tribunal had not been made public as of Monday, December 23, 2013.




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Raise Your Sails for the New Year



Organized by Mark Del Giudice, marina manager at Forty 1° North in Newport, RI, who comes to the island every year to organize the race, as he has done since its inception 18 years ago, alongside the St Barth Yacht Club and the Port of Gustavia, this informal parade of sailboats of all sizes follows an around-the-island course, with staggered starts as of 10am. “The past few years have seen fewer boats participating as the weather has been rough

with winds over 25 knots, and owners don’t want to risk any damage to their boats,” he says. Lots of local boats join in the parade giving the island’s sailors an end-of-the-year outing alongside some pretty big boats.

Will last year’s winner, the beautiful Baltic 147, Visione, a Reichel/Pugh design, will back in the race? Visione holds the winning time for the New Year’s Eve Regatta, having set the record of 1 hour, 32 minutes, and 7 seconds in 2004.

It’s an annual tradition, but the size of the regatta depends on who’s on the island and the weather. Dubbed The New Year’s Eve Regatta, this sailboat race is held annually on December 31, signaling the end of one year and the beginning of the next in Saint Barth.



The record is still anyone’s to beat! Expected on the starting line this year is Ira Epstein’s Lone Fox, the handsome 65’ ocean-racing ketch built in 1957 for the famous sponsor of the original Round the World Race, Col. William Whitbread. Crafted to Lloyd’s 100 A+ in Sandbank, Scotland by Alexander Robertson and Sons, to a Robert Clark custom design, of solid teak with an English oak interior, this is one of the world’s finest classic sailing yachts.

Also expected to race is Abbott Brown’s Symmetry, which came in third in this race in 2011. “We love Saint Barth,” said Symmetry’s owner Abbott Brown, “it’s the best

place to sail.” Although he has participated six or seven times in the Saint Barth Bucket, this was the first time Symmetry had sailed in the New Year’s Eve event.

“It was fantastic, we had a blast,” noted Symmetry’s Australian Captain Ross Kleiman at the time. “Sixteen to seventeen knots of wind are ideal for us, but you can never have too much. We’ve wanted to do this race for a long time, and it was perfect.”

Awards for the New Year’s Eve Regatta are presented on the dock at 5pm, after the race, with a glass of champagne to kick off the New Year’s Eve festivities. Check with the port office if you want to enter the race.

Yes, I am from Guadeloupe. And this is the first international competition of the year, with an impressive roster. It will give me a chance to test myself against the tops riders and to evaluate the work done over the winter. I can hardly wait to participate and to visit your beautiful island.”

ALEXANDRE COUSIN

Champion of Europe Youth Formula and world vice champion Formula in 2008. Number 7 French and number 23 worldwide in slalom 2013. Alexandre Cousin participated in the 2012 Fun Cup.

“I participated in the first edition, and have some wonderful memories: on the water in the bay of Saint Jean and a superb ambiance on shore. My competitive instinct of course forces me to give the best I can. But I saw that with the level there will be on the water, it would be difficult to win. 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Les Voiles de Saint-Barth: 40 Boats Already On The Horizon

Five months before the 2014 edition of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth, which sets sail April 14-19, 2014, there are already 40 boats registered among the five different classes.

In less than five years, the organizers of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth have created a regatta of major proportions on the international sailing calendar. The next edition rolls around on April 14-19, 2014, and as proof of its success, 40 boats are already signed up five months before the first race. They are spread across the five classes of

the regatta: Maxis, Spinnakers, Non Spinnakers, IRC 52, and Multi-hulls. "We have progressed. Usually at this time we would have but 30 boats pre-registered. As a result we think there will be more than 70 boats on the starting line," says François Tolède, one of the organizers of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth, along with Luc Poupon. This means that



close to one thousand sailors will be in St Barth this spring, to enjoy the conditions out on the water.

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

An Island Refuge In Saint Barth

Jeanne is a woman of exception, and every home she has created in Saint Barth has embraced her unique style and sensibility

First came *Le Manoir*, an imposing 17th-century manor house from Normandy that she brought to Saint Barth and reassembled in Lorient.

Next was the fascinating dacha that had belonged to the famous Russian dancer, Rudolph Nureyev, with its wooden decks for dancing overlooking the sea on the "côté sauvage" of the island.

Both of these houses reflected the personal flair that Jeanne demonstrates in decorating her homes, which is no surprise as she holds an honorary PhD in interior architecture and design from the University of Miami in Florida. This flair for creating warm, personal spaces is once again illustrated in Jeanne's latest residence, which comprises two houses nestled into the hillside.

Her new home is not far from the Nureyev house she loved so much, but sold to contribute generously to the purchase of an MRI machine for the local hospital, and to buy a boat aboard which she will cross the Atlantic Ocean from Spain to Saint Barth this winter, with her son Jean-Martial as captain.

Jeanne's new complex is a double-decker combination of two houses, the larger *La Domaine de la Côté Sauvage*, and her very private residence, *Le Refuge de la Côté Sauvage*.

One can navigate from one house to the other via a network of stone steps and wooden walkways, and along the way discover the tiny cottage that Jeanne has called *La Case de Ramiro*, just large enough for a single bed and a chair, creating a tiny cocoon for one person to enjoy.

Le Refuge is a small house that Jeanne purchased and transformed with élan, covering the outer walls in stone, and accenting the pool with stone as well, confirming her penchant for natural materials, and creating a space in which she feels at ease.

Both houses are decorated with warm woods, from the floors and a vaulted ceiling to armoires, bookcases, countertops, and even a piano that echoes a piano in the Nureyev house. In counterpoint to the wood is a myriad of white fabric, on the sofas, bedspreads, pillows, and netting about the beds.



The occasional shot of color comes from oriental rugs or a pile of bright green towels on a chair by the pool. Another of her signature accents is the collection of Teddy Bears found perched on beds and chairs.

There are also numerous painted messages, such as warning that water is scarce or a list all of the names of the talented workmen and artisans that worked on the houses and are immortalized on the gate to the property.


And the message on a small wooden table points your way to "a magic cave," or a small grotto decorated with hanging lanterns, stones, and seashells, and which could serve as a personal spot for meditation and reflection.

The undeniable charm of these homes is enhanced by enticing views of the sea, seen from various vantage points, and helping to create a perfect island refuge for the lucky few who are able to stay there and share the universe that Jeanne calls home.

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

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Dennis Hopper: Images From The 60s

In an ongoing partnership with the Eden Rock Hotel, Larry Gagosian presents an exhibit of photographs by Dennis Hopper at the Eden Rock Gallery. An icon of American counter-culture who passed away in 2010, Hopper was the director and acted in the cult film, Easy

Rider. He was also an art collector and accomplished photographer.

Riding alongside Peter Fonda on a motorcycle trip across America in Easy Rider, which Dennis Hopper directed in 1969, he immortalized the role of a rebel. He was an icon of American

counter-culture and a symbol of the hippy generation and the lost idealism of the 60s, yet he suffered from drug abuse and was considered an outcast in Hollywood despite the success of some of his films, including Easy Rider. Living in New York, Hopper entered into an intense artistic period, trying his hand at painting and poetry, and starting an art collection that would be considered one of the best in the United States. He then discovered photography and armed with a Nikon began to shoot for Vogue, and created an album cover for Ike and Tina Turner. He took millions of shots during the 60s, and a selection comprising 400 of his

images was shown in Fort Worth, Texas in 1970. That was before his photos were more or less forgotten.

It was not until after the death of Hopper in 2010 that his photography was rediscovered, thus the name of the exhibit seen earlier this year at the Gagosian Gallery in New York: The Lost Album. Larry Gagosian has brought a selection of these images to the Eden Rock Gallery, as part of the ongoing partnership between the Eden Rock Hotel and the contemporary art tycoon. The exhibit runs from Saturday, December 28 (opening reception on December 27) through January 31, with 30 black and white images that evoke memories of a past era that recalls The Hells Angels and Martin Luther King. And the photos serve as Hopper's personal diary with images of his friends such as Jane Fonda, Robert Rauschenberg, or Paul Newman, to cite just a few of the famous faces found in his work.

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



Inca "Pearls" From South America

Yoga teacher and wellness specialist Diana Bourel (who has roots in the United States and Ecuador) has brought a touch of South American culture to Saint Barth by way of beautiful beads she refers to as Inca "Pearls." These beads represent the culture of the Quechua Indians and the beautiful handiwork of the families who still work these beads as their ancestors did. "I received my first spirit beads as a child, but it was only during my last trip to the Andes, traveling with my husband Yves, that these beads came back into my life," says Bourel. "We have been delving into the indigenous medicine and healing of South America for years and feel committed to preserving the indigenous arts and crafts traditions that are so interlaced with an understanding and creative expression of the cosmos."

Bourel points out that the families that create these beads are becoming fewer and fewer. "Originating



from the Ecuadorean highlands, these necklaces, called huascas, wascas, or walcas, offer protection, status, femininity and beauty. They are also considered to be a manifestation of vital prosperity and wealth. The sun god, energy, vitality, and divinity are represented in these gold-dipped glass beads originating from Europe that are then individually strung by an indigenous highland family that has been

stringing for generations," she explains. "The round glass beads represent the female principle, the sun is the male principle so that the male and female principle is elegantly reunited by the string, or thread, which in the yoga tradition, is called a sutra."

When stacked, these Inca Pearls make a fantastic contemporary fashion statement. The necklaces are easy to wear, light, travel friendly and able to add a sacred touch to a simple wardrobe: they look as good with jeans and a simple t-shirt as with a dress or an evening look. "I love wearing these beads in layers, stacking them to provide textural and visual interest," says Bourel. "I start with small-

er beads, which I wear closest to the neck, then I add length, thickness or color. My fingers like to touch the beads, not unlike the yoga mala beads. They make you feel feminine and dressed up, and especially with tanned skin as in Saint Barth... the Indians wear a white ruffled shirt and the beads they finish off their outfit."

The red beads offer not only a shot of color, but are used as the talisman of color and spiritual protection, the color of blood, of vitality, of life. "It's where the human spirit meets the gods," explains Bourel. "These are gifted to the Indian children to keep them safe."

Dance This Way: Photos At Space Sbh Gallery

Space SBH Gallery in Gustavia has a wonderful exhibit of photographs taken by the legendary dancer, Mikhail Baryshnikov, who has captured dance in motion through his lens. The show, "Dance This Way," which runs through January 4, comprises eight large fine-art prints.

Baryshnikov, who once owned homes in Saint Barth, is considered one of the best male dancers of all time. Born in the Soviet Union, he defected to the West in 1974 and danced with major companies worldwide, including New York City Ballet and American Ballet Theatre, where he was artistic director for a decade

beginning in 1980. From 1990-2002, he was part of the White Oak Dance Project, which he co-founded with Mark Morris. Today, he is the director of the Baryshnikov Arts Center, a performance space in New York City, and he has explored the art of photographing dancers, asking them to "Dance This Way," or toward his camera.

Baryshnikov's photography features kinetic images of classical ballet, Brazilian hip-hop, and modern dancers, literally caught in the act of dancing. From flamenco in Madrid to the bachata in the Dominican Republic, his photos display the body's rhythmic flow and his own incredible sense

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
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ST BARTH XL: Panoramic Photos By Edmund Gudenas



Edmund Gudenas has published a handsome book of his photographs titled “St Barth XL,” featuring large, panoramic shots of the island. Arriving just in time for Christmas, the book is sure to find its way under many a tree, and will serve as a souvenir of the island anytime of the year.

Marius Stakelborough inspired Gudenas, a frequent visitor to Saint Barth, to start documenting what he experienced in St. Barth. “We have become good friends and I am the unofficial official photographer for Marius and Le Select,” notes Gudenas, who has dedicated this book to his friend.

Gudenas points out that one of his favorite images in the book is a night image of the large crowd by the bonfire celebrating Vaval on Shell Beach. Another is fol-

lowing a plane just before landing next to the St. Jean Beach. “The plane moves, but the people somehow do not. That one I could not duplicate again,” he admits. “I do not plan most of the images I create, and I use only the smallest camera possible that I keep with me just in case something special comes into view. One such image in the book was seen as I drove to Saline and saw the reflection of the hill in the salt pond. The sun had to be in the position it was just at that moment to make the panoramic

scene work.”

The book is available in St. Barth at five different shops for 65 euros: Les Artisans in Gustavia (which also has selected prints on canvas of other images not seen in the book); Hotel LeVillage St. Barth; Le Select gift shop; and two bookstores in Gustavia, La Case Aux Livres and Barnes, along with Cargo Art Gallery in St. Jean. The book will also be available on Amazon.com by the end of December.





