## Vitale Assumes Command Of CNRSE

Rear Adm. Michael Vitale relieved Rear Adm. Mark Boensel as commander, Navy Region Southeast, during an Oct. 12 ceremony aboard NAS Jacksonville. The guest speaker was Vice Adm. Robert Conway Jr., commander, Navy Installations Command, Washington, D.C.

Vitale, a native of Vestal, N.Y., was commissioned an ensign after graduating from the Navy Reserve Officer Training Program at the University of Louisville in 1977. His first tour was aboard USS Reeves (CG 24) where he served as damage control assistant and fire control officer. During this tour, the ship conducted rescue operations off the coast of Vietnam and participated in the attempted rescue of U.S. hostages held in Iran.

Reporting to the Navy Recruiting District Indianapolis in January 1982, Vitale served as an officer recruiter and a trainer on the Navy Mobile Recruiting Team in Orlando. After attending department head school in October 1984, Vitale was assigned as combat systems officer (CSO) on board USS Comte De Grasse (DDG 974) with a follow-on tour as CSO on board USS Bainbridge (CGN 25).

In December 1989, Vitale graduated from the Naval

Postgraduate School with a Master of Arts in National Security Affairs (strategic planning).

His follow-on assignment was as executive officer on board USS Yorktown (CG 48). In 1992, Vitale reported to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, serving as the directorate for plans and

interoperability until July 1994, when he subsequently attended the National War College in Washington, D.C., earning a Master of Science in National Security Strategy.

His next tour took him on board USS John S. McCain (DDG 56) as commanding officer from April 1996 until

December 1997. From January 1998 to August 1999, Vitale served as the director of the Command Training Department at Surface Warfare Officer's School in Newport, R.I. He then took command of Destroyer Squadron 24 at NS Mayport until March 2001.

After completing an assign-

ment as the chief of staff for Carrier Group Four in Norfolk, Va., Vitale transferred to the Office of Legislative Affairs in Washington, D.C., as the director of Navy Senate Liaison in August 2003.

After being promoted to rear admiral, he assumed command of Navy Region Hawaii and Naval Surface Group, Middle Pacific.

Boensel assumed command of Navy Region Southeast in December 2005. During his tour, Boensel guided Navy Region Southeast through the Navy's regionalization process. The addition of five installations and two regions brought Navy Region Southeast to 22 installations with a budget of more than \$850 million. Under his leadership, major enterprises such as the Navy's public private venture housing came to fruition and a strong Lean Six Sigma process improvement program was initiated.

He will take over as commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic.

Navy Region Southeast manages and oversees shore installation management support and execution for each of its 22 installations in the eight southeastern states and parts of the Caribbean, specifically Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico.

Starting at 9:50 a.m. on Nov. 3-4, skydiving teams, the Black Daggers and the Red Devils, will present the American Flag and the British Flag respectively. The national anthem will be sung by Musician 1<sup>st</sup> Class (SW) James Collins. They will be followed at 10 a.m. with the Blue Angels and a host of aeronautic acrobatics and stunt planes. There will be VIP Cabanas from 9:30 a.m.- 4 p.m. at First Street between Fourth and Fifth Avenues North. The VIP

## Starling Is New Skipper Of Groves

USS Stephen W. Groves (FFG 29) held its 15<sup>th</sup> change of command ceremony on Oct. 11, during which Cmdr. Dan Starling relieved Cmdr. Jon Kreitz as commanding officer.

The ceremony was held at sea during the first month of a scheduled six-month Counter Narco-Terrorism (CNT) operations deployment.

Born in Austin, Texas, Starling enlisted into the Naval Nuclear Power Program in 1980 and served as a nuclear power instructor and precommissioning crewmember on USS Helena (SSN 725). In 1987, he was selected for the Enlisted Commissioning Program (ECP). He was commissioned in 1989 after graduating from the University of Texas,

where he earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics. Starling also holds a Master of Science Degree in Astronautical Engineering from the Naval Postgraduate School.

His sea assignments have included USS Gary (FFG 51),

USS John Rodgers (DD 983), command of USS Typhoon (PC 5), and command of USS Osprey (MHC 51). Most recently Starling served as commanding officer of Navy Operational Support Center, Austin, Texas.

Kreitz detached from Stephen W. Groves after completing a highly successful CNT operations deployment in 2006, an accelerated predeployment training cycle in 2007, and the beginning of Stephen W. Groves' current deployment. During his tour, Stephen W. Groves interdicted more than 10.8 metric tons of cocaine and had numerous other achievements including being selected as the runner-up 2006 Commander, Naval Surface Force Atlantic Self-Sufficient Ship of the Year and 2006 Commander, Destroyer Squadron 14 Tactics Award winner. Kreitz has orders as the Chief, Strategy and Alignment Branch, for the Director of Surface Warfare, on the Chief of Naval Operations Staff in

## CREDO Corner

Whether we see it or not, believe it or not, some of us are simply crazy about "getting it right." Some of us like our cars detailed in a certain way, our "stuff" organized in a certain fashion and our relationships dependable and as far as possible, predictable. We look in surprise and sometimes disgust as we behold others who seem to let their lives spiral out of control—who seem make it all up as they go along. "J's" or Judging Types tend to be rather rigid, controlling, and

hyper-organized, while "P's" or Perceiving Types like to live life a little looser, taking things as they come, and making up life as they go along. Myers-Briggs breaks everyone into one of sixteen different personality types. All of this is very important when trying to understand what makes a relationship work.

# Service Members Should Set Up TRICARE Before Deploying

Deployable and TRICARE Remote service members should consider setting up Family Member Accounts enabling their family to access medical, pay and human resource Web sites in their absence.

The Family Member Account is a secure credential issued to sponsors and their family members that allows them to log on to other Department of Defense Web sites even if they don't have a Common Access Card (CAC) or Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) PIN, also known as "myPay."

"The Family Member Account is especially useful to

National Guard and Reserve members who mobilize quickly," said Army Major General Elder Granger, deputy director, TRICARE Management Activity. "It lets the family handle business from home, taking stress off the sponsor during deployment."

To get a Family Member Account, the active duty sponsor can log on to <https://sso.dmdc.osd.mil/famAcctMgr> using his or her CAC or DFAS PIN. Eligibility for an account is based on the family's benefit status in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). Dependent children older than 18 can get their own

account. The sponsor selects which family members are eligible and then creates a separate account and a temporary password for each of them. Once the account is established, the sponsor gives family members their numbers and temporary passwords.

Family Member Account numbers and passwords will be accepted on TRICARE's new Beneficiary Web Enrollment system launching later this Fall. The new system will allow Prime and Prime Remote beneficiaries to easily enroll and manage their health care online.

# USS Doyle Raises Bar In Limbe, Cameroon

USS Doyle (FFG 39) continued to improve the level of Maritime Security in the Gulf of Guinea region through extensive training during its recent visit to Limbe, Cameroon.

On Sept 27, Doyle anchored off the coast of Limbe in preparation for a week full of Theater Security Cooperation (TSC) engagements with the Cameroonian Navy.

Cameroonian Government Delegate, Samuel Lifanda, welcomed Doyle Commanding Officer, Cmdr. Michael Elliott and his ship to the city. Limbe, as Lifanda informed Elliott, is a city which covers roughly 540 square kilometers and is home to 150,000 people who are governed by three separate councils. Lifanda heard of Doyle's eagerness to participate in Community Relations (COMREL) projects, and thanked Elliott in advance for his crew's interest in helping out the city.

Elliott set the stage for the visit by hosting Cameroonian Navy Capt. Roger Temche, Commanding Officer of Limbe Naval Base, and seven of his officers. The luncheon was an overwhelming success and established a strong report between the two navies which would be built upon throughout Doyle's week-long stay in Cameroon. The group was taken on a tour of Doyle and eagerly made purchases from Doyle's ship store before they left.

Doyle wasted no time in sending a group of its Visit, Board, Search, and Seizure (VBSS) team trainers as well as a team of maintenance trainers to hold training at the local Navy base. Greeted at the base by Temche, the team got to work, giving VBSS training which focused on theory, tactical team movements, hand-cuffing, and searching procedures. The training teams returned the following day to give additional classes

on VBSS, as well as Search and Rescue (SAR) coordination, and maintenance. All totaled, forty-eight Cameroonian Sailors were trained at Limbe naval base.

While VBSS training was going on, Chief Hull Maintenance Technician (SW) Richard Fischer focused on another vital training topic.

"I did about four hours of training on two different occasions covering the basic scope and organization of the Navy's Maintenance and Material Management program with the Cameroonian Officers," he explained. "They were very receptive, asked a lot of questions, and were constantly taking notes."

On Sept. 29, Doyle hosted training and tours of the ship. Doyle's Damage Control Assistant (DCA), Lt.j.g. Eric Metcalf, and his division gave extensive training to five Cameroonian navy officers.

The training covered the U.S. Navy's damage control organization and fundamentals, and culminated with an interactive demonstration of a Rescue and Assistance (R&A) drill on Doyle's flight deck. The Cameroonian officers had the opportunity to dress out in fire fighting gear, practice hose-handling techniques, and operate the P-100 pump.

Metcalf was pleased with the success of the training.

"The training we focused on was highly interactive, which allowed each country to learn from each other."

The DCA went on to say, "We did have a significant language barrier, but overall things went very well, and we used Power-point slides to wrap up the training."

A group of Doyle Sailors not directly involved in the training took time out from their work day to help out the Rhema Grace Orphanage. Navy Chaplain, Lt. Cmdr. Edward Tanner took a group of 24 Doyle Sailors, who were joined by 10 submariners from USS Annapolis (SSN 760),

over to the local orphanage.

The crew quickly got to work painting the main building of the orphanage complex, as well as mixing concrete and pouring the foundations for a new kitchen building. Several of the Sailors put their individual skills to work in repairing the orphanages generators.

Between all the training and work going on, Sailors managed to find time to take in the sights that Cameroon offered. The local fish market was a popular dining location, with Sailors being able to select their own fresh fish to be cooked in the method of their choosing.

Mount Cameroon, the nearby active volcano, was popular for sightseeing, with many Sailors braving the climb up the "lava flow." The city also boasted a botanical garden, and the Fine Hotel, which provided free wire-less internet, and reasonably priced meals.

Two days later, Doyle pulled up anchor and headed out to sea, taking along twenty-six Cameroonian Sailors with it. Led by Lt. Cmdr. Tchepaa, the group of Cameroonians was comprised of 16 officers and 10 enlisted, who came on board for two days full of training.

The group received a tour of Doyle, and was given training on VBSS theory, basic first aid, and damage control. Additionally, they had the opportunity to observe helicopter crash and smash drills, an Integrated Training Team (ITT) drill, and a General Quarters (GQ) drill.

The 26 Cameroonian navy personnel represented the largest volume of personnel trained underway onboard Doyle to date on its current deployment.

Boatswain's Mate 3rd Class Tom Garcia assisted in giving training during the Crash and Smash drill.

"For the drill, we did all the things that we would do in the event of a real casualty. It was a

very rewarding experience to be able to pass on my knowledge to a group that was so willing to learn," said Garcia.

Hospital Corpsman 2nd Class (SW) Marcus Garcia headed up the first aid training for the Cameroonian riders.

"The Cameroonians were very enthusiastic about the training I gave, and I had no problem getting volunteers to participate," Garcia explained. "They seemed to really enjoy the education, which made me glad to be a part of their experience onboard the ship."

Doyle's soccer team, "The Mariners," were also busy in Cameroon, being hosted to not one, but two soccer matches with the Cameroonian navy.

The team received a warm welcome as Temche led the Cameroonian team in rendering honors as The Mariners arrived on the field.

Local press was on hand to take video and photos of the game, and to interview several Doyle players. As the match got underway, Doyle drew first blood early in the first half, but was outscored in the second half to finish with a score of 2-1. The second game also saw The Mariners with an early lead, but they ran out of steam in the second half to lose 5-2.

On Oct. 4, Doyle hosted a large group of media personnel from all over Cameroon. Judith Ravin from the U.S. Embassy to Cameroon was accompanied by 18 members from CRTV, The Cameroon Tribune, and various local radio and newspaper representatives. Canal 2, an international news organization, was also present.

The group was treated to a "typical" routine on board the ship, which included a meal on Doyle's mess decks, and a tour of the ship.

Reporters asked numerous questions during the tour, which ended on the ship's fore-castle with a press conference

with Elliott. The press members were eager to know about Doyle's mission, how they were involved with the local Navy, and further opportunities the Navy has planned to work with Cameroon.

The ship's stay in Cameroon ended the next day, as Doyle got underway for a Passive Exercise (PASSEX) with two

Cameroonian patrol craft, CS Jabane and CS Bakassi. To begin the exercise, 11 Cameroonian VBSS team members conducted a compliant boarding of Doyle, via Doyle's Rigid Hull Inflatable Boat (RHIB).

Storekeeper 3rd Class Alvin Leacock was one of Doyle's VBSS team trainers during the

Cameroonian boarding.

"The Cameroonians were a very excited and diligent bunch who couldn't seem to get enough of the training they received," Leacock observed. "One of the boarding team asked me, 'When you guys come to Cameroon again, can a couple of our people ride with you, so they can get more train-

ing and then pass that on to us?' This was a question which was asked by every African Navy we've trained. It goes a long way to letting us know we are getting the job done and that we [Americans] are welcomed by the African community."

After the initial evolution, six Doyle VBSS team members conducted a boarding of

CS Jabane. The team from CS Jabane joined the Doyle crew for lunch, before departing. The day ended with all ships rendering honors as Doyle headed north to continue its deployment.

# CDS 24 Home From Humanitarian Mission


Mayport based Destroyer Squadron 24 returned from a four-month deployment to Central and South America and the Caribbean on Oct. 15. DESRON 24 was embarked on USNS Comfort (T-AH 20) as the command element for Comfort's Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HA/DR) mission.

The deployment was planned as part of U.S. Southern Command Partnership of the Americas. U.S. Southern Command is headed by Adm. Jim Stavridis of Atlantic Beach. The mission was announced by President Bush prior to his trip to Latin America in March 2007 as part of his America's Initiative.

While deployed, USNS Comfort was under operational control of Mayport based U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command (NAVSO) and tactical control of Destroyer Squadron Two Four (DESRON 24).

Though Comfort's deployment was not the first ever of the kind, it was a first for the Atlantic Fleet and for the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility. The Chief of Naval Operations, Adm. Gary Roughead, stated during a visit on board Comfort on Oct. 12 that missions like Comfort's will be an integral part of the Navy's Maritime Strategy in the future.

Comfort broke new ground in successfully incorporating numerous governmental and non-governmental agencies into her mission. Onboard Comfort one could find civilians such as Project Hope and Operation Smile personnel underway and working hand-in-hand with

the Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard personnel assigned to the mission. United States Public Health Service personnel also participated in all facets of the mission, indistinguishable from their active duty Navy counterparts except for their collar devices. The wide range of Navy participants in

the Comfort mission included U.S. Navy SEABEES from Naval Construction Battalion Maintenance Unit 202, Fleet Forces Band, SH-60S helicopter detachment from HSC-28, Fleet Forces Public Affairs Center, a Mobile Security detachment, and civilian mariners from Military Sealift Command.

Comfort also distributed donated items from several organizations. Project Handclasp, an organization partnered with the Navy, distributed over \$100,000 of medical equipment through Comfort. U.S. AID, "Hugs Across America," and the Kiwanis Club also contributed significant materials to the Comfort mission.

"I feel blessed to have the opportunity to be a part of this organization and to donate supplies from the U.S. to people who are in need. It gives you a great feeling and humbles you, making you appreciate what you actually have in the U.S.," said Senior Chief Operations Specialist (SW/AW) Gene Demers after leading a team to make the Project Handclasp donation in Port-Au-Prince, Haiti.

Comfort visited Belize, Guatemala, Panama, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Peru, Ecuador, Colombia, Haiti, Trinidad & Tobago, Guyana, and Suriname. Liberty was not authorized in these working ports, but the ship's crew did enjoy some R&R in Panama City, Panama following the mission stop in Colon, Panama and in Willemstad, Curacao following the ship's stop in Trinidad &

Tobago.

"Comfort's mission is to provide the region a mobile, flexible, and rapidly responsive afloat medical capability for a number of missions and training opportunities in Central America, South America and the Caribbean Sea region." Said U.S. Navy Capt. Robert E. Kapcio, Commander of Destroyer Squadron 24 and mission commander for the numerous and multi-faceted detachments embarked onboard USNS Comfort.

While Comfort certainly accomplished this mission, in the end, all involved would agree that what the Comfort accomplished over the course of her four month deployment was, for many Latin American people, nothing short of miracles. Comfort team treated more than 98,000 patients in the twelve countries visited, performing more than 386,000 procedures. Comfort personnel, partnered with Operation Smile, performed 54 cleft lip and palate repairs. Comfort distributed 24,242 pairs of prescription eyeglasses, performed a total of 1,170 surgeries, conducted 32,322 immunizations, completed 438 technical repairs to medical equipment, completed 7,899 dental fillings and extractions and 25,196 dental exams, distributed 242 assistive devices and splints, treated 1,627 people for internal parasites, and the SEABEES completed 27 improvement projects.

"It was really rewarding to be a part of such a different mission. Walking around the ship

you can see the patients and you know that you are making a real difference in their lives. A big part of this mission is the long term impact our visit will have, but the immediate benefits that we are having on people's lives means the most to me." Said Storekeeper 1st Class (SW/AW) Chiwanna Thomas, Supply officer for DESRON 24.

Comfort's unique mission and her significant and positive impact on the region caught the attention of the highest levels of the Navy and the U.S. Government. Comfort was visited by the Secretary of Defense, Secretary of Health and Human Services, Under Secretary of State for Public Diplomacy and Public Affairs, numerous U.S. Ambassadors, Secretary of the Navy, Chief of Naval Operations and the Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy, Acting Surgeon General of the United States, and many others including dozens of Host Nation Presidents, Vice Presidents, and high ranking Ministers. During the CNO and MCPON's visit to Comfort while the ship was underway enroute to Norfolk, the crew of USNS Comfort was presented with the Meritorious Unit Commendation by the CNO.

The deployment left the people of Central and South America and the Caribbean with a lasting, positive impression of the United States by providing high quality, and, in some cases, life changing care.

Vice President Barillas of Guatemala said "I'd like to express our deepest gratitude to the United States for all the wonderful work that's being done here... The outreach of the staff that went into the Guatemalan cities, and the other Central American countries, is something that will last forever in the minds of those people who were treated."

Comfort's mission was technically a training mission, training American military and civilian personnel to provide humanitarian assistance and disaster relief in a hands-on environment. The host nations were encouraged to take part in the medical treatment and also benefited from the training aspect of the mission.

Comfort gave real-world experience to hundreds of American medical professionals while providing training and care to the people of our partner nations, certain to have a lasting impact on the people and communities involved.

# Mayport Security Is Cracking Down On DUI

In 2006 there were 33 DUIs reported on Mayport. So far this year, there are already 28 DUIs reported, up from the 26 DUIs this time last year.

"It's not a huge rise, but it's enough to make us more aware of those who drink and drive on base," said Lt. Allan Schlegel, Midsection Watch Commander and acting Head of Police Operations at Naval Station Mayport.

So Sailors take warning: Get a designated driver or pay for a cab! And those who think a couple of drinks won't put him or her over the edge, think again.

In Jacksonville the Blood Alcohol Limit, or BAL, is .08.

But at Mayport the BAL is .05 and has been for many years.

"The goal is to keep our personnel alive and out of jail," said Schlegel.

But don't think a BAL below .08 will go unpunished.

"Anything above .05 is considered a DUI at Mayport. If someone shows the signs of driving under the influence of alcohol, they are asked to perform a series of Field Sobriety Tests. If they don't pass the FST, they are asked to submit to a breathalyzer exam. If they blow between .05 and .08, they are returned to their command for the situation to be handled at the command level," said Schlegel.

"In essence, we are trying to

protect our Sailors. The BAL limit on base helps them by preventing a criminal record but it can hurt them by hurting their Navy career," said Schlegel.

"We don't like taking personnel to their commands when they are DUI, we would like them to get a designated driver or a taxi, anything to keep them safe," said Schlegel.

Last year a fatality occurred on Mayport because of drunk driving.

"That is why we do what we do, to prevent the needless loss of life. We want our Sailors to work hard and play hard, but do it safely and come home to their families," said Schlegel.

# New Program Helps Wounded

From TRICARE

The new Warrior Care Support Program in TRICARE's North Region provides wounded Service members with one point of contact; taking stress out of military health care for beneficiaries and their families.

"Programs like this are a great addition to the ongoing efforts within the military health care system to help our families during a challenging time in their lives," said Army Maj. Gen. Elder Granger, deputy director, TRICARE Management Activity.

The program identifies eligible severely ill or injured

Service members to participate through military treatment facility (MTF) referrals, records identification and Service member requests. Criteria are not restricted to service related injury and the program is voluntary.

Upon acceptance in the program, a health care coordinator from a team of nurses, doctors and administrative staff will assist with a timely and seamless transition and coordination of physical and behavioral health care services from the MTF to the civilian sector or the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). In addition to coordinating care, the team assists the

warrior and family members by educating them on health care choices, providing specialized resources and assisting with claims resolutions and authorizations for medical equipment.



# USS McInerney Sailor Is Posthumously Promoted

On a day when family and friends of newly promoted Chief Petty Officers were celebrating, the family of Chief Gas Turbine System Technician Electrical(SW) Marc Cable and the crew of USS McInerney (FFG 8) were torn between celebrating the life of a Sailor, husband and father, and mourning the loss of an incredibly talented, inspirational, and truly courageous shipmate.

While deployed for Counter Narco Terrorism (CNT) Operations, GSE1(SW) Cable fell ill and was diagnosed with Leukemia.

Committed to both fight the disease and bolster his chance

of meeting his lifetime goal in the Navy of following his father's footsteps as a Chief, he relentlessly studied from his hospital bed, persistently requesting more reference materials be delivered from the ship. Inspired by his seemingly endless drive to wear the khakis, the McInerney CPO Mess rallied around him and fought for shifts to proctor his exam bedside.

Cable, father of twin boys, passed away on April 23, 2007. His rapidly declining health left him too weak to take the CPO exam, his dream of wearing the anchors lost. Determined to not let his efforts be in vain, the Chiefs again rallied, forwarding a request to Millington,

petitioning the Navy Personnel Command to make Marc Cable a CPO. From there, the journey led to the office of the Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy. When MCPON heard the story, he immediately recognized Cable epitomized those distinct leadership attributes embodied in his "Mission, Vision, and Guiding Principles."

On Sept. 21, on the flight deck of the ship her devoted husband truly loved, Beverly Cable accepted Marc's certificate of Honorary Promotion to the rank of Chief Petty Officer. She was also presented a Chief's combination cover, encased in glass and wood handcrafted by McInerney Chiefs.


The Free Agents of HSL-44 Detachment Nine recently celebrated the half-way mark of their forward deployment supporting Commander, Fifth Fleet operations.

# NCIS In Driver's Seat

NCIS's new van makes it easier for the service to help Sailors and their families during hardship.

The Naval Criminal Investigative Service takes care of Sailors and their families in times of hardship. The Southeast Region Field Office has gotten a new asset to help make that task easier.

The Major Case Response Team (MCRT) recently acquired a vehicle to handle any situation that may occur in the Southeast Region and Commander, Navy Forces Southern Command (COMNAVSO) area of operation. The MCRT team is on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week to respond to major crimes involving Navy personnel or property.

"The new van can be loaded onto a C-130 and be flown to anywhere a crime takes place in the region," said MCRT Team Leader, Special Agent Charles King.

The five-member team has a six-hour response time to head out to a crime scene. The MCRT van is a self-contained unit that has a generator, communications, food and water to last for several days if needed at a remote location.

The MCRT can handle any crime scenes from deaths to

explosions. The van carries blast equipment which gives the agents the ability to sift through the rubble to find wires, timers, triggers and all components of a bomb to piece it back together.

"When USS Cole was attacked, about 90 percent of the components of the bomb were recovered," said King. "This can then be traced back to certain groups to see who might be responsible for the attack."

Another item the van carries is a variety of alternate light sources (ALS) which can be used to see biological residues at a crime scene.

On board computer systems can recreate crime scenes and in case of biological weapons, the van holds personal protective gear for each agent.

Although the MCRT vehicle is a new addition to the local NCIS capabilities, the team itself, is not.

"Each base had its own team, but with reorganization of the NCIS Field Offices, there is now one team that can be the focal point and standardize the response for the entire region," said King. "There will be the same level of quality for each scene."

Each member of the team has

experience with the local, state, military or federal police force.

Although the main job of the MCRT is to deal with serious events, they are also part of the field office community outreach program. The team works with local child development centers to get each child an identification kit complete with fingerprints and a DNA swab.

"The goal is to get every child on Mayport identified," said King. "We're working under the FBI initiative to have all children identified."

The van is also able to support the Navy's mission down range.

"We can take the van to conduct seminars with host nations and foreign police forces to train those officers on advanced forensic technologies," said King.

# FRC Southeast H-60 Program Surpasses Goal

 Fleet Readiness Center Southeast (FRCSE) recently celebrated a production milestone.

The H-60 Strategic Business Team (SBT) completed its first aircraft with a turn-around-time (TAT) of 60 workdays on Sept. 26, a reduction of 35 days. This milestone brings the total number of aircraft produced for Fiscal Year 2007 to 40, two more than scheduled.

In a ceremony held at the FRCSE Site Mayport, Capt. Tim Matthews, FRCSE commanding officer, congratulated the H-60 personnel on their achievement.

"The celebration is all about the hard work that you all have done producing these fine helicopters to go back to the Fleet, back to the Warfighter," Matthews continued, "A lot of folks said it couldn't be done, but you all got to work, rolled up your sleeves, and made it happen. Whether you're a wrench turner or a PC, E & E, QA, or other support folks, you all had a hand in this achievement and I salute you."

Also in attendance for the occasion were Cmdr. Graham Guiler, H-60 program officer, Luther McCoy, H-60 program manager, and Lt. Dan Reid, HSL-60 squadron lead. Each expressed their gratitude for a job well done.

McCoy said, "I want to thank the team very much for all the work you've done. We couldn't have done it without you. And I ask all of you to continue doing it, because we want to make sure our customers are satisfied and happy with our work."

Matthews challenged the team to continue finding new ways to improve their work processes and shorten the TAT even further.

"We can't rest now, however. This is an area of the Depot workload that is going to continue to be strong. We've got more H-60's coming off the production line now, so this aircraft will need to be supported for many years into the future. We need to keep up the fine performance that you've demonstrated this year."

H-60 SBT is an Integrated Maintenance Program (IMP). The IMP workload is done in the squadron spaces, with the squadron retaining possession of the aircraft. The FRCSE and squadron must coordinate their work schedules and negotiate

any changes to that schedule. This makes their accomplishments even more noteworthy.

In April of 2007, the H-60 SBT introduced the 4 Disciplines of Execution™ to the workforce and it is being used in conjunction with the Command's AIRSpeed Program, which features Lean methodology. Lean methodology cuts out waste in the repair process and the 4 Disciplines of Execution™ enhances that process by requiring the workforce to develop and focus on a few Wildly Important Goals (WIGs). The H-60 SBT decid-

ed that their first WIG would be to sell one aircraft every 10 workdays and reduce the work in process to six aircraft. The second WIG was to reduce the average man-hours per aircraft by 10 percent below the workload standard.

The SBT developed a transition plan to reduce the work in progress from an average of 10 aircraft, to the goal of six. They examined the total workload package and established the TAT that would accomplish their goal. They created six work cells, one for disassembly, four for rework and modifica-

tions, and one for reassembly. They also examined their manpower requirements.

Next, they established start and completion dates for each aircraft. With a consistent timeline, the SBT and squadron can readily schedule other items, such as training and safety standdowns. One of the most crucial aspects was to negotiate with the squadrons when they would release the aircraft. All aircraft have a specific induction date, but that date is not necessarily the date that the SBT can start work. This meant that an aircraft would be sit-

ting idle until the SBT was able to induct it. By working with the squadrons and delaying the induction date, the Fleet was able to utilize the aircraft longer before starting the repair cycle.

One of the biggest challenges was convincing the customer that the completion date would be met. The established TAT was 138 calendars days, with a squadron goal of 133 calendar days. The SBT's goal was to process the H-60 in 84 calendar days. Even with the induction delay added to their projected goal of 84 days, this TAT goal would still allow for completion

well within the 133 day TAT requirement.

Historically, FRCSE required an average of 140 workdays for repair on the H-60 aircraft. FRCSE Site Mayport completed three in 97 workdays on average, with the last aircraft being produced in 60 workdays. Since Lean and The 4 Disciplines of Execution™ are about continuous process improvement, FRCSE doesn't plan on stopping here. The H-60 Fleet is counting on their ability to reliably return these precious assets to operational status on time, every time.

## DoN Objectives For 2008 Released

From the Department of the Navy

The Secretary of the Navy, Chief of Naval Operations and the Commandant of the Marine Corps issued a joint document on Oct. 9 publishing objectives for the Department of the Navy for fiscal year 2008.

As summarized in an ALNAV 071/07 message, the leadership of the Navy and Marine Corps described the strategic value of the 2008 DON objectives and

explained their intent to personally track them. They set a high priority on providing a total naval workforce capable and optimized to support the national defense strategy. This objective includes building active Marine Corps end-strength and providing high quality support services to naval personnel and their families.

The leadership of the Department of the Navy also

highlighted the requirement to utilize the Navy and Marine Corps to aggressively prosecute the global war on terrorism, which includes providing combatant commanders with skilled forces for full spectrum operations; optimizing naval contribution to Special Operations Forces; and supporting Joint IED Defeat Office efforts to field working solutions to IED threats.

The objectives emphasized building the Navy and Marine Corps force for the future to include numerous programs and processes, such as implementing a strategy for Marine Corps modernization and reconstitution; operationalizing theater ballistic missile defense naval capability; and delivering maritime domain awareness capability.

The importance of integrating

safety and risk management into all on and off-duty evolutions was included in the 2008 DON objectives. This emphasis on safety is intended to establish DON as an organization with a world-class record where no mishap is accepted as the cost of doing business.

The need to strengthen ethics as a foundation of exemplary conduct within the Department of the Navy and providing first-

rate facilities to support stationing, training and operations of naval forces was also stressed.

New this year was an objective that set a high priority on providing first rate facilities to support stationing, training, and operations for the Navy and Marine Corps.

## Adm. Roughead Assumes Office As 29th CNO

From the Chief of Naval Operations Public Affairs

Adm. Gary Roughead assumed office as the 29th Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) during a ceremony held at Leutze Park aboard Washington Navy Yard Oct. 11.

Upon Senate confirmation, Roughead relieved Adm. Mike Mullen - who now serves as Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff - as CNO Sept. 29. The ceremony served to formally recognize Roughead's assumption of office.

Secretary of the Navy Donald C. Winter served as the ceremony's guest speaker. During his remarks, he said Roughead takes the Navy's helm during a "very challenging time in our nation's history."

He added that the Navy's number one priority must be maintaining a long-term perspective and building a Navy "capable of meeting 21st century challenges."

"Given the uncertain future path of potential adversaries, the growing concern over nuclear and missile technology proliferation, the increased focus on submarines and naval power by many nations, we simply cannot afford to reduce our historical commitment to supremacy at sea," Winter said. "Our new Chief of Naval Operations shares this point of view."

Winter went on to say that Roughead has a long-term strategic perspective, and a long track record of being an exceptional leader in challenging positions both at sea and ashore.

"He is the right leader to assume command of the Navy during these challenging times, and he takes the helm of an organization of which America is justly proud," he said.

After thanking the President, Secretary of Defense, Secretary of the Navy and Mullen, Roughead said he was excited to be the CNO, and was hon-

ored and humbled, and by the "scope and sweep of the task ahead."

He pointed out that though the Navy has undergone many changes, the one thing that hasn't changed is the "centrality of the American Sailor who remains the face of sea power around the world."

Roughead also took the opportunity to reiterate his top three priorities; maintaining current warfighting readiness, building a Navy for tomorrow and providing for our people.

"People are the key," Roughead emphasized. "All we acquire and all we do is of little worth without the people who give it value."

"Our policies must reflect the diversity of our nation. Our policies and practices must enable us to attract, recruit, and retain the men and women of America," he explained. "Our policies must address the many rewards of service in the United

States Navy, and we must be unwavering in our obligation to take care of those who serve our Navy, military and civilian, and their families."

Roughead took the opportunity to speak about the new maritime strategy -- the first unified maritime strategy signed by all three of the nation's maritime services - which will be released next week at the 18th International Seapower Symposium.

Roughead said he attended the Symposium two years ago, and there were about 60 countries represented.

"Next week we return to Newport for the 18th Seapower Symposium, and this time, there will be over 100 countries represented in Newport," he said.

Roughead believes the

increase is due to more nations understanding the imperative for sea power, and that security and prosperity depend upon the free flow of commerce on the world's oceans.

"They see that one nation does not do it alone," Roughead explained. "They see that cooperation is better than confronta-

tion."

He added that it commits the nation's maritime services to working with partners around the world as a force for peace.

"I'm optimistic about the course that we are steering, and I remain inspired by those who serve in our great Navy."

## Cutting-Edge Media Site Launched by Navy

On the eve of its 232 birthday, the Navy has introduced a new, user-friendly Web site, which will better serve its Sailors, their families and the public. The new www.navy.mil Web site design now has a more appealing and intuitive rich-media focus, rather than an electronic print focus.

The highly interactive site offers a variety of new multimedia capabilities, which means visitors can more easily browse the extensive video, radio, print and multimedia stories produced by and for Navy members.

One of the most noticeable changes to the site is the presentation. The redesign of Navy.mil is now focused on rich media content instead of electronic print media thereby providing equal visibility and access to all products. Clicking

on the media port logo will take the user to a carousel interface of rotating icons. These icons offer all Naval Media Center products including All Hands Radio, All Hands Television, Daily News Update, Podcasts, Photo Gallery, Every Day in the Navy (short multimedia pieces that showcase Navy activities and events) and All Hands Magazine.

One other visible change will be the full integration of Navy NewsStand into Navy.mil. All "Top Stories" and "Headlines" will now be offered on the Navy.mil front page, with the main Navy NewsStand page being phased out. Local stories will still be available on local NewsStand sites as before.

"Our goal in this redesign is to provide the U.S. Navy and its public the type of site they'll not only like but use regularly as a source of reliable informa-

tion," said William Spencer, the Interactive Media Program Manager for Navy.mil. "The feedback we've received in beta testing has been extremely positive and people think the site's high-speed, cutting-edge look and feel better reflects our high-tech Navy."

Those who prefer video-specific media will be pleased to learn all video will be available for download in the Windows Media Video format.

However, viewing will be integrated into the site using flash player.

This new capability makes products more accessible regardless of the user's computer operating system. Additionally, the site will now offer products for download at any time, whether the material is current or archived.

## Navy SEAL To Be Awarded Medal of Honor

The White House announced Oct. 11 that the family of U.S. Navy SEAL, Lt. Michael P. Murphy will be presented the U.S. Navy Medal of Honor, awarded posthumously, during a ceremony at the White House Oct. 22.

The Medal of Honor is the nation's highest military award for valor in action against an enemy force, which can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the Armed Services of the United States.

Murphy's father, Daniel, will accept the award on behalf of his son. Murphy will receive the award for his extraordinary, selfless heroism and steadfast courage while leading a four-man, special reconnaissance mission deep behind enemy lines east of Asadabad in the Hindu Kush of Afghanistan June 27 to 28, 2005.

"We are thrilled by the President's announcement today, especially because there is now a public recognition of what we knew all along about Michael's loyalty, devotion and sacrifice to his friends, family, country, and especially his SEAL teammates," the Murphy family said in a statement. "The honor is not just about Michael, it is about his teammates and

those who lost their lives that same day."

Murphy was the officer-in-charge of the SEAL element, which was tasked with locating a high-level Taliban militia leader to provide intelligence for a follow-on mission to capture or destroy the local leadership and disrupt enemy activity. However local Taliban sympathizers discovered the SEAL unit and immediately revealed their position to Taliban fighters. The element was besieged on a mountaintop by scores of enemy fighters. The firefight that ensued pushed the element farther into enemy territory and left all four SEALs wounded.

The SEALs fought the enemy fearlessly despite being at a tactical disadvantage and outnumbered more than four to one. Understanding the gravity of the situation and his responsibility to his men, Murphy, already wounded, deliberately and unhesitatingly moved from cover into the open where he took and returned fire while transmitting a call for help for his beleaguered teammates.

Shot through the back while radioing for help, Murphy completed his transmission while returning fire. The call ultimately led to the rescue of one severely wounded team member, Hospital Corpsman 2nd Class Marcus Luttrell, and the recovery of the remains of

Murphy and Gunner's Mate 2nd Class (SEAL) Danny Dietz and Sonar Technician 2nd Class (SEAL) Matthew Axelson.

Eight more SEALs and eight Army "Nightstalker" special operations personnel comprising the initial reinforcement also lost their lives when their helicopter was shot down before they could engage the enemy. The entire battle, the culmination of Operation Redwing, resulted in the worst single day loss of life for Naval Special Warfare personnel since World War II.

The sole surviving SEAL, Marcus Luttrell, wrote a book about the battle after he departed the Navy this summer. In his book Luttrell credited all three of his teammates for their heroism, including Murphy's sacrificial act that eventually led to his rescue.

Murphy will be inducted into the Hall of Heroes at the Pentagon during a ceremony scheduled Oct. 23. His name will be engraved beside the names of some 3,400 other service members who have also been awarded the nation's highest honor.






