Mayport Ships Break Mold In 2nd Fleet Protection Exercise

From USS Vicksburg

USS Vicksburg (CG 69), along with four additional FFG CLASSRON ships USS Simpson (FFG 56), USS Doyle (FFG 39), USS Halyburton (FFG 40), and USS Hawes (FFG 53) completed the Second Fleet Force Protection Exercise (FPEX 08-6) on May 21. The overall unit score for all participants was 94.6 percent, the highest composite score to date.

The exercise is a grueling 36 hour test of the ships anti-terrorism measures and training. Ships are required to certify every two years in order to deploy or enter ports overseas. The exercise is designed to be extremely realistic, testing the different onboard watchteams over fifteen drills ranging from identifying a fake ID card to countering a small boat attack. Individual drills can commence at any point during the 36 hours, requiring the ship to be vigilant for the duration of the exercise. In addition, many of the events are run simultaneously adding to the realism and complexity that might be encountered by the ship's force. The simulations test command and control along with the watchstander's

proficiency with the ships anti-terrorism pre-planned responses. These drills require endurance, as the drills intensify during the late night hours with small boat and swimmer attacks.

In preparation for the exercise, Vicksburg entered an intense training program to hone the crew's already high state of readiness. Due to operational requirements, Vicksburg was unable to run drills consistently until after returning from the last deployment. In addition, several new personnel have joined the crew since the last training cycle. In order to ensure success under these circumstances, training was conducted three times each week for three hours. In addition to the daily drills, training and debriefs incorporated classroom teaching from the Force Protection Officer and the Force Protection Training Team (FPTT) members on proper watch practices and use of deadly force.

This training plan required FPTT members and watchstanders to work extra hours thus ensuring maximum readiness for the FPEX. STG3 (SW)

USS Gettysburg Preps For BALTOPS

Sailors from around the world and throughout the Baltic region will arrive in Gdynia, June 9, to kick off the 36th annual maritime exercise Baltic Operations (BALTOPS) 2008.

BALTOPS 2008 is an individual combined maritime and land exercise in the Baltic Sea, conducted in the spirit of "Partnership For Peace" (PFP). The operation includes NATO and non-NATO participants.

The mission of BALTOPS 2008 is to promote mutual understanding, confidence, cooperation, and interoperability among forces and personnel of participating nations and support national unit and staff training objectives through a series of robust exercises.

Thirteen nations will participate in this year's exercise, including ships, submarines, aircraft, and ground force elements from NATO and PFP nations, including Denmark, Estonia,

Finland, France, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Poland, Russia, Sweden, the United Kingdom and the United States.

BALTOPS 2008 is intended to improve interoperability with NATO and PFP nations by conducting peace support operations at sea, including gunnery exercises, replenishment-at-sea, undersea warfare, radar tracking, mine countermeasures, seamanship, search and rescue, maritime interdiction opera-

tions and scenarios dealing with potential real world crises and maritime security.

U.S. Navy Rear Adm. Daniel P. Holloway, commander, Carrier Strike Group 12, based in Norfolk, will supervise the exercise from the flagship USS Gettysburg (CG 64). Other U.S. Navy units participating include USS Cole (DDG 67), and USNS Patuxent (TAO 201).

"We are a planet of oceans and exercises like BALTOPS build partnerships and strength-

en alliances with navies from around the world," said Holloway. "Fostering relationships with our allies enhances global security and prepares us for potential crisis."

Carrier Strike Group 12 returned from their six month deployment to the Persian Gulf in December, and recently presided over Port Everglades Fleet Week in May.

Service Dress Khaki Wear Test Commences

Wear testing for the proposed Service Dress Khaki uniform has commenced in six major Navy communities as per NAVADMIN 070/06.

The wear test encompasses commands in Washington, D.C.; Norfolk; Millington, Tenn.; Newport, R.I.; Yokosuka, Japan; and Pearl Harbor.

Wear testing of the new uni-

forms for chiefs and officers was officially authorized in October 2007, and is just now in progress.

The style of the Service Dress Khaki is reminiscent of the uniform worn during World War II and Vietnam, according to Robert Carroll, head of Navy Uniform Matters Office.

One of the key points stressed was the versatility of the proposed uniform.

"With the service dress khaki,

the wearer could easily go from service to dress just by donning a tie and a jacket," said Carroll. "Right now, we're evaluating not just the type of fabric, but the effect it has on the uniform's appearance, durability, comfort, and maintenance. We're also out to gauge the desire of the fleet to actually wear the uniform."

Carroll is optimistic that the proposed uniform could lighten

Get Health Info At BHC Mayport

Occasionally we need to speak with our healthcare provider to discuss a routine medical issue such as an unpleasant side effect from a newly prescribed medication or to learn the results of a recent laboratory test. Not only is it our goal to make your attempts to contact your provider as simple as possible, we also want to ensure you have access to other means of medical resources.

Help with getting a message to your doctor to answer non-urgent medical questions at Branch Health Clinic Mayport is only a phone call away to the Central Appointments office or the Chief of the Day. Many patients enrolled at Branch Health Clinic Mayport are unaware that for routine medical concerns they may call Central Appointments at (904) 542-4677 from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday-Friday and on weekends 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. to leave a message for their primary care manager (PCM).

Of course this method doesn't work well for urgent medical concerns. In that case, the best way to speak with your healthcare provider is to make an acute care appointment. If the urgent care need is outside of routine working hours, patients may call the duty Chief of the Day. Though the Chief of the Day will not be able to provide

healthcare advice, they will provide you with immediate resources where you can obtain medical care and, upon your request, they will have your PCM call you back within 72 hours. For life- or sight-threatening medical emergencies such as loss of vision, possible stroke or heart attack, do not delay, dial 9-1-1.

General facts about Branch Health Clinic Mayport and its parent command Naval Hospital Jacksonville available services, hours of operation and locations are available in the hospital's Patient Guide. To view the Patient Guide, visit the hospital web site at navalhospitaljax.med.navy.mil. With the disestablishment of the hospital's Nurse Call Center (NCC) on June 1st, this site will serve as a valuable resource of information anytime from your laptop or personal computer.

To learn more about health-related topics, diseases and staying healthy, visit www.medlineplus.gov to find free reliable information. The site also has drug information about your prescription and over-the-counter medicines, herbs and supplements.

Branch Health Clinic Mayport and its parent command, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, are committed to providing outstanding health care for active duty and

Homefront in Focus

Scott and I have moved seven times in five years. This summer, however, we are NOT moving. Yippee! However, this is the beginning of that crazy time of year when it can feel like the Department of the Navy calls for a massive Chinese-fire-drill; "On your mark, get set, SWAP BASES!" All joking aside, it is the time of the year many military families make their PCS (Permanent Change of Station) move. If this is your first PCS this column is to help you get started on the way to a successful, smooth (is there such a thing?) move. If you're a seasoned spouse with a move or two (or seven) under your belt this column may serve as a refresher. The first stop after receiving your orders is the Fleet and Family Service Center (FFSC). Most installations offer a 'smooth move' class or workshop. This class can prepare you for the paperwork and processes involved in scheduling your move, preparing your children and family, financial planning and more. It is worth the time. In addition to this class for you, many bases offer a class for children called, "It's my move, too!" This class serves to prepare children for changing homes and cities, leaving friends and making new ones. They are often presented with a 'move kit' to take on their trav-

els with them. If your move is an overseas relocation your FFSC offers specific classes to prepare you for the physical relocation as well as the cultural challenges of an OCONUS (outside the continental US) move. The next five stops are on the internet. Check out www.militaryhomefront.dod.mil. This site contains valuable information for military families (all branches). Click on the "Plan My Move" link for useful tools for planning your move. There are articles, checklists, instructions and more on this site. One of the most useful portions of this site is the "Installation Overviews". Want to know about your new duty station? This is the place to look for base and community information, maps, directions and much more. The next internet stop for Navy is https://www.smartwebmove.navy.mil. This is the first step in setting up your move. This official Navy site enables you to begin your move process, obtain instructions, information and eliminates that trip to the personal property office. Once you initiate your move on this site you will be assigned a move representative to coordinate the rest of your physical move. Next internet site is Military One Source (www.militaryonesource.com). The website contains additional relocation information and, of course, another

set of checklists. But what I found most helpful is the relocation packet you can order. Call (800-342-9647) or order online a relocation/information package for your new duty station. MOS will assemble a customized package with information on real estate, schools, communities, employment, base information and more. This package is as extensive as you request it. My last internet recommendation is the Automated Housing Referral Network at www.ahrn.com. This site sponsored by the Department of Defense to assist military members and their families in securing available housing, both rental properties, real estate for sale and even temporary lodging. This free site is a versatile tool in your relocation process. We've only started to cover the process of moving. In the next two columns we'll look at preparing for moving day, the BIG DAY (packout), the journey and setting up your new home. Navy Admiral Pilling Dies

Adm. Donald Lee Pilling, a retired Navy four-star admiral revered for his leadership, mathematical genius and easy sense of humor, died May 26, at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Md. The Bayside, N.Y. native was 64 years old and lived in Vienna, Va. Pilling was best known in the Navy for his vast intellect. Having graduated fourth in his Naval Academy class of 1965 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics, he further distinguished himself as one of the school's first Trident Scholars. Pilling's research dealt with the abstractions of partially ordered systems, where he studied under his mentor and lifelong friend, Professor "Prof" James Abbott. He later earned a Ph.D. in mathematics from the University of Cambridge with a dissertation entitled, "The Algebra of Operators for Regular Events." Pilling was also a prolific writer, publishing articles in both mathematical and professional journals throughout his life. A running joke in Navy circles was that when he dropped his briefcase, math journals and technical manuals were far more

likely than routine paperwork to spill out of it. Pilling spent most of his sea duty in small warships, rising to command the destroyer USS Dahlgren (DDG-43), and later, Destroyer Squadron 26. He was a firm believer in holding himself and others to a high standard of responsibility and accountability, telling a Senate committee once that, "Accountability can be, must be, a severe standard. Without accountability, command loses credibility and authority. Without authority, command at sea becomes impossible." As a flag officer, he commanded Cruiser Group 12/US Saratoga Battle Group and later the United States 6th Fleet/Naval Striking and Support Forces Southern Europe, based in Naples, Italy. Ashore, Pilling excelled at a variety of defense resources and planning billets, including stints in the Office of the Secretary of Defense and four tours on the Navy Staff. His last such assignment -- before becoming the Navy's 30th Vice Chief of Naval Operations in November 1997 -- was as Deputy Chief of Naval Operations, Resources, Warfare Requirements and

Assessments (N8). In this capacity, he was responsible for planning and preparing the Navy's annual programs and budget. It was often said of Pilling that he never forgot the needs of the warfighter. His primary concern while in Washington was "what the Navy really needs not just today, but for decades to come," noted a colleague. "This is a man who has been there; he knows what it means to be a warrior, and what it is that we need." He retired from the Navy in October 2000 and became President and CEO of LMI in 2002. During his tenure, LMI grew from \$100 to \$160 million. Pilling is survived by his wife of 42 years, Barbara Orbon Pilling of Vienna, Va.; two daughters, Kathleen Pilling Posivak of Hopewell Junction, NY, and Jennifer Pilling Stopkey, of Richmond, Va; four grandsons: Michael Posivak, Christopher Posivak, Matthew Stopkey, Alexander Donald Stopkey; a sister, Betsy Pilling and a brother, Brian Pilling, both of Bayside, N.Y.

Smart shopping Makes Sense With Commissary

When trying to lose weight, lower cholesterol, manage diabetes, manage blood pressure, or just make healthy choices, shopping for food can be a real challenge. Pick up almost any food in the commissary, read the label and you are likely to see one or more symbols on the label promoting health benefits related to the food. Each symbol indicates that the food may be a healthful choice, yet each symbol has different nutrient requirements. Information overload on food packages can make it tough for shoppers to decide what to buy and eat, with up to 70 percent of them making quick choices as they cruise the aisles. The American Heart Association heart-check mark is one reliable symbol that shoppers can look for on foods. The association has two certifications available. One is a whole grains certification available for bread, breakfast foods, pasta and grains and another is the standard certification available for other foods. Foods that have the heart-check mark have to meet food criteria for saturated fat and cholesterol for healthy people over age 2. There are also nutrition levels for sodium of no more than 480 milligrams

per serving. To qualify for the grains certification, foods can have no more than one-half gram trans fat per serving, and must contain whole grains, along with fiber. The heart-check mark is promoted as helping to save time when shopping while identifying heart-healthy foods that are available in the commissary. You may create and print your own shopping list of certified heart-healthy foods on the American Heart Association Web site to help with shopping. While in the commissary, you will also find many other foods that do not have the heart-check mark that can be part of a balanced diet. Don't forget to add some of these other foods to your list. Planning what to eat and making a list helps to lessen some of the information overload and confusion that can occur while shopping. Sticking to a grocery list can also help your budget, along with the significant savings you get of up to 30 percent by shopping at your commissary. Farragut's TSC port visit, held from the 25th through 29th of May, had great impact for the Sailors of both countries, and further solidified their ongoing partnership.

Farragut's TSC mission was threefold, and included a military-to-military Subject Matter Expert Exchange (SMEE), community relations (COMREL) projects, and a reception in which Farragut hosted foreign guests.

"This port visit could not have been better. It has truly been an honor to once again work with the Chilean Navy," said Cmdr. Scott Dugan, Farragut's commanding officer. "They are a highly professional and skilled force, and we are delighted to have another opportunity to further enhance our relationship between our great nations."

Dugan commenced TSC activities by paying visits to Rear Adm. Eduardo Junge Pumpin, Commander of Chile's Second Naval Zone, Vice Adm. Ellis Berg Pearce, Commander of Chile's Submarine Force, and to the Office of the Mayor of Talcahuano, Abel Contreras Bustos.

Farragut's wardroom hosted a cocktail reception for local civilian and military leaders at the beautiful Talcahuano Officer's Club on May 27. Here the crew was able to interact with some of the Chilean Second Naval Zone's top leadership, as well as several Junior Officers stationed at the Talcahuano Naval Base.

Dugan and several Farragut Sailors participated in a solemn wreath laying ceremony with Capt. Fernando Contreras Acuña, Chief of Staff of Chile's Second Naval Zone, on May 28. This ceremony commemorated

ated the valor that Arturo Prat, a Chilean Naval hero, demonstrated in defense of his country. During the War of the Pacific in 1879, Prat fearlessly led his men into the Battle of Iquique, where he gave his own life. His courage under fire rallied not only the military, but the Chilean population itself. With the added support of its country behind it, the Chilean Navy eventually turned the tide of war and emerged victorious.

Dugan, who had participated with Farragut Sailors in a Chilean National Holiday to commemorate Prat's actions just a week before in Punta Arenas, said he understood the impact that one man can have on the course of history, and called upon those present to follow his example.

"It is a pleasure to honor the memory of Capitán Prat this afternoon by laying this wreath at his statue. May we all remember and pass on his courage, fearlessness, and esprit de corps as we answer the call to duty of our two countries' Navies today, and for the rest of our lives," he remarked following the ceremony.

Twenty-five Farragut Sailors also participated in a COMREL project at the Caleta Chome

Elementary School on May 27-28. Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) 40 Chaplain, Lt. Cmdr. Luis Perez, who lead the COMREL effort, said he believed this project to be "an absolute success."

To refurbish a classroom that will become the school's computing center, the Sailors painted classrooms, made roof repairs to avoid significant water leakage, conducted some minor electrical work in preparation for computer installations, and donated more than 50-square-meters of new carpeting. Afterwards, Perez hosted the children, two teachers, and several parents for a tour of Farragut.

After the COMREL project and the tour onboard, Perez said that he "saw in every child the joy that comes from having been blessed, in some small way, not by strangers but by amigos."

For their military to military exchange, several Farragut Gunners Mates toured the Talcahuano Weapons Facility, a visit which allowed them to view Chilean armament and war fighting assets. Chief Gunner's Mate (SW) Horatio Maldonado, one of the visiting crew members, said that the trip was "a great opportunity to share our

thoughts and ideas with our foreign counterparts."

Additionally, Farragut's maintenance experts toured the ASMAR Shipyard located in Talcahuano, where facility staff presented their repair capabilities. Main Propulsion Assistant Lieutenant Todd Ronek said, "The tour was very informative and provided valuable insight into the ASMAR shipyard's production capabilities. The pride and professionalism displayed by tradesmen, technicians, managers and naval personnel was obvious in their presentation of their shops and offices."

However, it was not Farragut's presence ashore alone which distinguished this visit. Over seventy personnel toured Farragut on Wednesday, arriving by boats to view Farragut's Engineering and Combat systems, as well as the crew's accommodations and work spaces. Several Farragut crew

members, including Chief Gas Turbine Specialist Electric (SW) Daniel Flores, Gunner's Mate 1st Class (SW) Juan Gallegos, and Interior Communications Electrician 3rd Class Joshua Sheprow, were selected as tour guides based on their Spanish-speaking abilities and assisted their guests around the ship.

"I love to give tours to foreign Navies and show off our mighty warship," Gallegos said. "By giving tours of the ship not only do I get to educate people and illustrate how the US Navy's most powerful and most advanced destroyer works, but I also get to learn a little bit more everyday about how my own ship works as well."

Dugan said he believed the experiences which he and his crew experienced during this TSC port visit were truly valuable.

"Training and bilateral exchanges address key aspects

of multinational and combined operations, such as technology standardization and common operating procedures, that are vital to improving interoperability throughout the region. Consequently, our continuing partnership with Chile is essential towards supporting the Maritime strategy and maintaining regional stability," he said.

This TSC event was conducted during Farragut's deployment for Partnership of the Americas (POA) 2008, an ongoing commitment sponsored by U.S. Southern Command (SOUTHCOM) to strengthen partnerships with the Navies and partner nations in the southern hemisphere. While a series of military exercises associated with POA strengthen military interoperability among partner Navies, TSC operations link foreign nations together by emphasizing cultural exchanges and professional interoperability.

Bradley Sailor Becomes New American Citizen

Becoming an Engineering Officer of the Watch? Receiving a Navy Achievement Medal? Advancing to First Class Petty Officer? None of these career milestones can compare to what EM1(SW) Phil Rahim feels is his greatest achievement: On May 6, 2008 he became a United States citizen.

Born and raised in San Fernando, Trinidad, Petty Officer Rahim moved to the United States in 1993. He remembers that day well. "It was the happiest day of my life. I flew aboard British West Indies Airlines flight 492. That is something that I will never

all service members who meet the criteria, he applied. On May 6, his dream came true when he was officially sworn in as a United States citizen.

Petty Officer Rahim is married to Devina Rahim, who was sworn in as a U.S. Citizen one month prior to him, and has two children, Kayla and Aeden.

"After 13 years, I can now say that I sacrifice my life for this country as a United States Citizen. I encourage all non-citizens serving in the military to pursue their citizenship." In order to help bring this goal to his shipmates, Rahim has gladly assumed the collateral duty of Command Immigration and Naturalization Liaison Officer.

Mayport Sailors Stay S.A.F.E With 'Street Smart'

In preparation for the long Memorial Day weekend, Naval Station Mayport Sailors attended an eye-opening safety stand-down program at the base gym, May 22.

The 'Street Smart' program was presented by two state certified firefighter paramedics, Ronny Garcia and Greg McCarty, from the Stay Alive From Education (S.A.F.E) non-profit organization based out of Key Largo, Florida.

The program illustrates the consequences of bad-decision making while driving, such as not wearing a seatbelt or driving while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, with a photo slide show featuring real-life trauma accidents that had many Sailors closing their eyes or turning away.

"There is no hiding our number one message, 'wear a seatbelt', but I also want to emphasize making good choices all the time," Ronny Garcia, member of the S.A.F.E program since 1999. "That includes wearing a seatbelt, not driving after drinking and just thinking everything through."

The non-lecturing format allowed Sailors to get involved with the presentation, portraying party-goers or even victims of accidents.

"I used to wear my seatbelt every once in a while," said Boatswain's Mate 2nd Class James Bradley, who volunteered to be a 'victim' during the presentation. "I'm going to use this information everyday and not think twice about putting on my seatbelt."

Bradley took part in a mock trauma scene where he played the drunk driver in a car accident where he didn't wear his seatbelt.

Garcia and McCarty dem-

onstrated to Sailors what steps paramedics and doctors would take on a victim of a car accident. Such medical procedures such as a tracheostomy and catheterization made most cringe in their seat.

"It's not always the other guy that this stuff happens to," said McCarty. "No one wakes up thinking I'm going to die in a car accident today."

After the presentation, many Sailors stayed around to ask the presenters questions and thank them for the effectiveness of the presentation.

"We want to save the young people, that's what this is about," said McCarty. "If we reach one, we've done our job, if we reach more, that's even better."






