

HSL-46 Completes Haiti Ops

USS Normandy (CG 60) and its embarked helicopter detachment completed operations off the coast of Haiti as part of Operation Unified Response Feb. 6.

Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, South released Normandy of its responsibilities to the humanitarian efforts in Haiti, but a significant number of navy ships remain in the area, including the Bataan and Nassau Amphibious Ready Groups, as well as Military Sealift Command, U.S. Maritime Administration (MARAD), and international maritime partner ships.

On station for a total of 21 days, Normandy and its crew delivered 125,000 meals of special dehydrated food mix donated by the not-for-profit organization "Kids Against Hunger, over 1,000 gallons of water, plus other food stuffs including peanut butter, bread, and Meal-Ready-to-Eat's (MRE), during a series of assessment and assistance visits to the towns on the Haitian island of La Gonave.

The ship's embarked helicopter detachment, Helicopter Anti-submarine Squadron Light (HSL) 46 Detachment 3, which launched from Normandy daily, delivered 75,142 pounds of food and water, 3,000 pounds of medical supplies throughout the Port-au-Prince area,

what was essentially the ground zero of the earthquake. The detachment also conducted medical evacuations of 107 injured Haitians to medical treatment facilities throughout the area.

"I'm very proud of the crew; they were they flexible from the get go, the way they adapted to the mission, and the way they gave their hearts to helping the people of Haiti," said Normandy Commanding Officer, Capt. Jeffrey T. Griffin. "Much credit also deserved to HSL-46 Detachment 3 - the pilots, the aircrewmembers, the maintainers - for what they were able to do help victims get vital necessities and transport to the medical facilities that could help treat them."

Normandy received a 'no-notice' deployment order very early in the morning Jan. 13, at 2:30 a.m., and was underway 15 hours later. The ship embarked her helicopter detachment in Mayport and continued at high speed to Haiti. Normandy arrived to Canal Du Sud, the main body of water bordering Haiti, the night of Jan. 16.

Throughout its efforts of Operation Unified Response, Normandy performed duties in air surveillance and managing the military data-link, as well as being a ready deck for incoming helicopters that needed fuel. Normandy began the assessment and assistance

New Detailing Rules Improve Fleet Manning

February marks the fifth month since the Navy implemented new rules for detailing Sailors using Career Management System Interactive Detailing (CMS/ID), the Web-based program Sailors use to review and apply for permanent change of station orders (PCS).

"We have been through four complete cycles of the new CMS/ID process and we like what we are seeing," said Rear Adm. Mike Shoemaker, assistant commander of Navy Personnel Command (NPC), which issued more than 88,000 sets of PCS orders last year.

NAVADMIN 249/09, announced enhancements to the CMS/ID system including increasing Sailor choice, adjusting the orders negotiation window and a requirement to fill all red zone requisitions each cycle.

CMS/ID uses color coding to identify jobs. The majority are displayed in the green zone and are considered open requisitions. Global Support Assignments are displayed in the purple zone. Immediate requisitions - the most critical fills that could directly degrade mission capability if unfilled - are displayed in the red zone. Under the new detailing rules there are fewer of these red zone billets displayed, but all will be filled each cycle. All Sailors in the negotiating window are considered eligible for assignment to a red zone requisition.

"We are seeing our most critical billets filled," said Vicky Fabian, assigned to United States Fleet Forces Command, Manning Control Authority Fleet, which controls more than 200,000 billets including all sea duty billets in the Navy and some shore assignments. Under the new detailing rules, MCAF can place two billets in the red zone for each rating at each pay grade.

"Our goal is to make CMS/ID more agile, and responsive to new and changing fleet requirements," said Shoemaker. "These initiatives bring advantages to both our Sailors and to the commands they serve, improving odds for success in naval operations worldwide."

Another change was the modification of the orders negotiation window. The detailing window is now seven-to-nine months before a Sailor's projected rotation date. This allows for a three-month window to negotiate for orders before a Sailor is considered to be eligible for an involuntary "needs of the Navy" assignment.

"This change encourages more aggressive participation by Sailors in negotiating orders. It also allows NPC better responsiveness to fleet demands and current Global War on Terror Support Assignment deadlines," said Shoemaker.

One benefit is that Sailors placed into "needs of the Navy" assignments will know at the seven-month window where they are going instead of the five-month window. For more information read NAVADMIN 249/09.

Navy Phases Out Enlisted FSR

Like wash khakis and dunnage, the old brown-folder enlisted field service record (FSR) will soon become a thing of the past as the Navy eliminates the paper record in 2010.

NAVADMIN 040/10, released Feb. 3, outlines the Navy's plan to close-out the FSR by Sept. 30. Service record information will now be generated and maintained

electronically through a secure Internet connection to the Navy Standard Integrated Personnel System (NSIPS) Electronic Service Record (ESR). Officer field service records have already been eliminated.

The Navy first implemented ESRs in 2006. Accessible through a secure Internet connection, the ESR provides access to personnel, training and awards data for individu-

al Sailors, Personnel Support Detachments (PSDs), personnel offices holding service records, Navy Operational Support Centers and customer commands of PSDs. A shipboard version is available through NSIPS Afloat for Sailors at sea with limited bandwidth. PSD Memphis began closing out records for Sailors at Navy Personnel Command (NPC) last year as part of a field test.

"It went pretty well. There are a lot of tools online that can help you locate things you need from your electronic service record," said Personnel Specialist 2nd Class Kelvin Turner, assigned to PSD Memphis. "We have not noticed much of a hiccup."

All active duty and drilling Reserve Sailors can access their ESR by signing up for a

Last week we welcomed USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) for a three-day port visit. The carrier had just returned from their vital mission rendering humanitarian assistance to the victims of the 7.0 earthquake that struck the Caribbean nation Jan 12. Arriving on station less than 72 hours after the quake, the ship immediately rendered

assistance and over the next two weeks, flew more than 2,200 sorties, delivering more than 166 tons of food, 89,000 gallons of water and 38,700 lbs. of medical supplies to earthquake victims. Additionally, Vinson's helicopters conducted 476 medical evacuations (MEDEVACs) and the ship's doctors and corpsmen treated 60 patients in its medical ward.

This week, we also welcomed back our pilots and air crew from Helicopter Anti Submarine Light (HSL) 46 Detachment 3; HSL-60 and USS Underwood (FFG 36).

The HSL-46 crew just returned from Haiti where they have been embarked on the

Norfolk-based guided missile cruiser USS Normandy (CG 60) conducting humanitarian air operations.

Underwood and HSL-60 provided critical medical assistance since their arrival Jan. 16.

As of this writing, more than 18,000 U.S. military personnel, 19 ships and more than 120 aircraft are supporting operations to provide relief and care to more than three million Haitians who were affected by the Jan 12 earthquake. As of Feb. 3, U.S. military forces have delivered more than 2.2 million bottles of water, 2.1 million food rations, 3.3 million pounds of bulk food and 108,000 pounds of medical sup-

plies into Haiti.

Thanks to everyone who had a hand in orchestrating a great visit by our VCNO, Adm. Jonathan W. Greenert this week. He not only had a chance to welcome back our IA folks, but he spoke at length to them and their spouses and listened to concerns and comments about the IA program. He turned some "ceremonial dirt" at our future off base CDC expansion project. He also attended a round table discussion with many of our Fleet and Family Support Center folks and listened and commented on several programs we have in place to support our Sailors and families.

Please remember that our top leadership gives utmost priority to these programs, and each and every one of you need to know we have these programs in place for you to utilize. No

problem or issue cannot be addressed or fixed. Help is just a phone call or a short walk to our FFSC. We are standing by to help.

It's that time of year very soon for the Navy and Marine Corps Relief Fund Drive. Last year, we helped 91,418 worldwide. Please contribute and know that every cent will go to make a difference to your shipmates. You never know when you might need a helping hand.

From the safety side of the house...a new instruction will be on the street soon that will mandate all motorcycle riders to wear those brightly colored vests during the day and night. "LOVE." It sold millions. But the words leave you in an ocean of ambiguity and ultimately beg the question: "What is love?"

In the mid 1970's the nation was spell-bound and teary-eyed by the classic movie "Love Story." Its most memorable line was "Love means never having to say you're sorry" (sure...). And of course, we have Tina Turner's famous rendering of the cynical side of human emotions and relations in her hit song "What's Love Got To Do With It?" Although fatalistic in tone, Tina's interpretation of the song brings us the closest to dealing with the question. That

question needs to be addressed, most especially as we prepare to celebrate Valentine's Day

The guest speaker will be Operations Specialist Master Chief Christopher Thompson, Philippine Sea's previous Command Master Chief.

King enlisted into the Navy on Dec. 17, 1983. After com-

pleting basic training, he reported to Gunner's Mate "A" School in April of 1984 and "C" School in July of 1985.

He served his first of five sea tours onboard USS Fox as a MK10 Guided Missile Launching System Technician from July 1985 to April 1988. Also while on board Fox, the young seaman advanced to second-class petty officer.

After transferring to USS Gridley as a part of his split-tour, he earned his Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist qual-

ification and advanced to the rate of GMM1 in January, 1990.

King went on to serve proudly aboard USS Worden, Port Hueneme, CA from December 1992 to October 1993 where he was advanced and initiated as a Chief Petty Officer (GMC).

In October, he transferred to USS Carl Vinson, Bremerton, Washington, where he advanced to Senior Chief Petty Officer.

Finally, he finishes out his career onboard USS Philippine Sea, where he has served as Weapons Department Leading

Chief Petty Officer since November 2006.

Ashore, King has honorably served at NSWSES Port Hueneme, Calif., as a technical representative for missile launching systems and command career counselor from 1990 to November 1992, and Weapons Officer/Explosive Safety Officer from June 1997 to April 1999 in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

Additionally, he served at Enlisted Personnel Management Accounting

Command, New Orleans, LA from September 2002 to November 2003 and was later reassigned to Navy Personnel Command, Millington, Tenn., as the Leading Gunner's Mate Detailer until December 2006.

While in Millington, King attended Senior Enlisted Academy and graduated Class 126 (Purple) in September 2006.

King, his wife Maria and their son Jimmy will reside in Jacksonville.

Farragut Ready To Battle

USS Farragut (DDG 99), set sail on her second major deployment since commissioning in January.

Farragut's maiden deployment took place April to October 2008 as part of The Partnership of Americas, which was an effort to strengthen ties with South America and surrounding Caribbean nations. Now Farragut is assigned to the Dwight D. Eisenhower Carrier Strike Group, and is operating in the Fifth and Sixth Fleets.

Farragut's Captain, Cmdr. Philip Sobeck, during a recent Captain's Call, made it very clear to his crew, that they were headed towards "harms' way" and being ready is an absolute must.

Chief Gunner's Mate Horacio Maldonado, who is the Senior Enlisted Boarding Officer for Farragut's VBSS, concurs with the comments made by Sobeck.

Maldonado said that over the last year, "piracy around the Horn of Africa has been a hot topic and is a major concern for the United States."

In preparing for this type of mission, Farragut's VBSS team constantly trained to improve techniques and precision. Maldonado also stated that "training is the key to his team's success and it

negates complacency.”

Farragut is also primed for Force Protection requirements. Chief Fire Controlman William Caraway is responsible for Farragut’s Anti-Terrorism Force Protection (ATFP) planning, training, and execution.

Caraway said that ATFP has become a huge part of a ship’s training regiment. The reason for constant training in this area is similar to that of Farragut’s VBSS team: to be prepared and not become complacent.

Caraway mentioned that he is always searching for new tactics and weaponry to help aid in improvements to how Farragut conducts ATFP operations.

Finally, on Jan. 25, Farragut embarked Commander, Task Force 151 and is now the flagship for CTF-151. This coalition task force is focused on the scourge of piracy in the Horn of Africa and Somali Basin areas.

Farragut’s teams and crew are ready for all of these missions as was so aptly captured by Engineman Petty Officer 3rd Class Ericsson Soares when he stated that, “Farragut is always prepared for battle.”

Freedom Prepares for Maiden Deployment

USS Freedom (LCS 1) Public Affairs

USS Freedom (LCS 1), the Navy's first littoral combat ship, is underway off the coast of Florida for final training and certification prior to its maiden deployment to the U.S. Southern Command (SOUTHCOM) region.

Counter-illicit trafficking (CIT), damage control, and systems training began soon after Freedom's arrival at Naval Station Mayport, Fla., on Jan. 25.

"This training is extremely important for Freedom and will help us prepare for the CIT mission we expect to perform while in the 4th Fleet area of operations," said Lt. Cmdr. Mark West of Imperial Beach, Calif., operations officer for the Gold Crew, one of Freedom's two rotational crews. "Freedom can be an extremely formidable weapon in the war on drugs."

Freedom's crew is part of an innovative manning construct that reduces crew size, demanding each Sailor maintain high

levels of proficiency in multiple fields, and optimizes ship operability with multiple crews. The ship is manned by two rotational crews, "Blue" and "Gold", of 40 Sailors each. Prior to deployment, each crew member must prove his or her competency

across a wide range of skills. Sailors attended counter-illicit trafficking/airborne use of force (CIT/AUF) instruction ashore, led by Afloat Training Group (ATG) Mayport, Destroyer Squadron 14 and Coast Guard Law Enforcement Detachment

(LEDET) 407. LEDET 407 will embark the ship during deployment.

Freedom welcomed the Coast Guard detachment aboard for nearly three days of CIT/AUF exercises at sea. LEDET 407 worked with Freedom's core crew and its aviation detachment to certify the ship for CIT operations.

"The Coast Guard was extremely professional and knowledgeable, and I look forward to working with them in the future," West said.

While Coast Guard observers evaluated the aviation detachment - Norfolk, Va.-based Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 22, Detachment 2 - in tracking go-fast boats, a Coast Guard coxswain was learning how to operate Freedom's 11-meter rigid-hulled inflatable boats (RHIBs).

"The Coast Guard does not operate our 11-meter RHIB, so this was important training for them as well," said Gold Crew navigator Lt. John Hill, a native

of Auckland, New Zealand.

The LEDET soon gave way to an integrated training team from the San Diego-based Littoral Combat Ship Class Squadron, which put Freedom's crew through its paces in a series of damage control and firefighting drills. The exercises tested the crew's response to a variety of shipboard emergencies, from a simulated helicopter crash landing to casualty triage.

"The training provided a good refresher for us - it's a good opportunity to keep our skills up," said Chief Hospital Corpsman (SW/FMF) Joseph Dennis of Bridgeport, Texas, the Gold Crew's independent duty corpsman (IDC). "As an IDC, exercises like this give me confidence in my crew's ability to operate in any emergency."

Freedom's crew also engaged in combat systems testing, running through a series of live-fire and tracking tests using the ship's Mk 110 57mm gun, as well as the 30mm guns of the ship's tailored Surface Warfare

Mission Package.

While the testing schedule has been a rigorous one, Freedom's Sailors are confident that the ship will be ready for its upcoming journey.

"I really believe the training provided will make our senior crew ready for the challenges ahead and pay dividends while Freedom is on deployment," said West.

Freedom is the first ship of the revolutionary Littoral Combat Ship program, a fast, agile, mission-focused ship that demonstrates the latest in naval warfighting technology. The ship is specifically designed to defeat "anti-access" threats in shallow, coastal water regions, including fast surface craft, quiet diesel submarines, and mines.

Freedom's deployment will conclude later this year with a transit to her new homeport of San Diego.

Haitian Mother, Child Reunited Aboard USS Nassau

A newborn baby girl delivered to USS Nassau (LHA 4) in a box from Haiti's University Hospital was reunited with her mother aboard the ship Jan. 31.

Nassau has been providing support to Operation Unified Response, the humanitarian aid and disaster relief mission to Haiti launched in the aftermath of the country's Jan. 12 earthquake. The child was brought aboard Nassau Jan. 23 in the box with a note stating that she was two days old.

"When we got the call that day, we were told there would be two adults and two children, so I was looking for

four stretchers," said Aviation Boatswain's Mate (Handling) 1st Class (AW/SW) Jorge Ramirez, a flight deck leading petty officer aboard Nassau who was working flight deck triage when the baby came aboard. "Only three stretchers came in, and on the third stretcher was a little boy and a box. I just thought the box had some personal items in it until I noticed that someone had written on its side: 'BABY IN BOX-DO NOT THROW AWAY.'"

The infant was treated by Nassau's medical personnel, who found the child was healthy. The crew of the ship cared for the baby for several days, unsure where her parents

were. Later that week, a Haitian woman came aboard USNS Comfort (T AH 20) looking for her newborn baby girl, who fit the baby's description aboard Nassau.

"My main concern was whether or not this was the baby's mother, but to have a mom come from the same place who delivered on the same day with a diagnosis that matches the baby aboard means it's

pretty likely that we found the mother," said Lt. Cmdr. Brian Norwood, senior medical officer aboard Nassau.

After careful investigation, medical personnel aboard both ships verified that the woman was indeed the child's biological mother. The mother and child had a tearful reunion in the medical unit aboard Nassau. This reunion was bittersweet for the crew who

had all grown very attached to the little girl dubbed "baby Nassau."

"I know she has to leave, but I'm going to be sad to see her go," said Hospital Corpsman 3rd Class Laketta Thomas, one of the corpsman responsible for taking care of the infant while she was in Nassau's care. "She's been just wonderful."

Nassau is deployed as part of the Nassau Amphibious

Ready Group/24th Marine Expeditionary Unit (NAS ARG/24 MEU) as part of Operation Unified Response, the humanitarian aid and disaster relief mission in Haiti. The NAS ARG/24 MEU is comprised of embarked Marines from 24 MEU, USS Nassau, the amphibious dock landing ship USS Ashland (LSD 48), and the amphibious transport dock ship USS Mesa Verde (LPD 19).





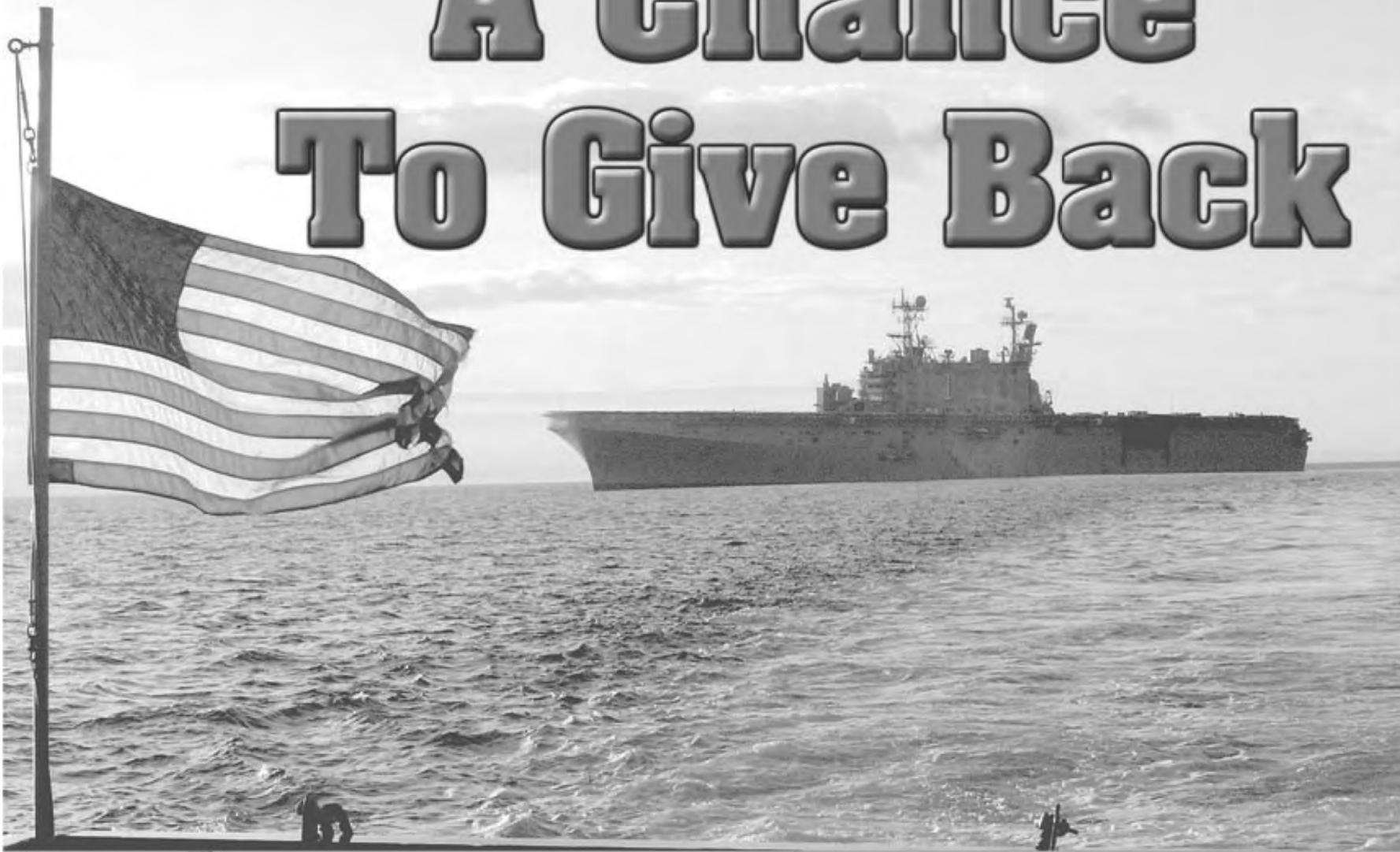
