# Mayport Hurricanes Win SEMAC, March Maddness

The tournament consisted of seven Air Force teams and one Navy team. Eglin AFB, Keesler AFB, Hurlburt Field, Robins AFB, Maxwell AFB, Moody AFB and Tyndall AFB were among the Air Force teams in the SEMAC league. Mayport's bracket put them head to head against Keesler AFB, Robins AFB, and Hurlburt Field AFB with the Hurricanes winning in overtime against Hurlburt Field AFB 101-95 taking the SEMAC Championship title.

This weekend the Mayport Hurricanes again showed their stuff during Mayport's version of March Maddness. Naval Station Mayport, NAS JAX, Subase Kings Bay, Seymour Johnson AFB, Fort Bragg, USS Underwood and Moody AFB came to Mayport for the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual March Maddness Basketball tournament.

The double elimination tournament began on Friday with a tip off between USS Underwood and Subase Kings Bay. USS Underwood held on until halftime but Subase Kings Bay pulled away in the second

# NPC Aligns Applications To Navy Standard

More than 40 applications on BUPERS OnLine (BOL), the Electronic Military Personnel Record System (EMPRS) and others will be offline from 6 p.m. CDT March 25 to 5 a.m. CDT March 28 as the applications are moved from the Millington Data Center to Navy/Marine Corps Intranet (NMCI) servers.

"The move is taking place due to requirements from the Navy's information technology and security directorates," said Doug Burgess, director, Information Technology Division, Navy Personnel Command (NPC). "The applications aren't changing, and other than the downtime, users shouldn't notice a difference."

This action is being taken primarily to place the applications behind increased levels of security. Additionally, once the migration to the NMCI servers is complete, there will be more

bandwidth available for the BOL and EMPRS applications.

The increase in bandwidth may provide some users an upgrade in performance within these specific applications, said Burgess. The move will not affect other NMCI programs, such as Outlook and share drives. Currently, applications are being tested prior to the move.

"After the migration, users may experience intermittent outages as remaining bugs are worked out," said Burgess.

## Coastal Magnet Programs Open At Mayport Schools

Thanks to grants totaling over \$1 million, Mayport Elementary School and Mayport Middle School will each have magnet programs focusing on the coastal sciences.

## KNOW THE ROPES

The locations of these two schools could not be more perfect for these programs. With the St. Johns River, Sherman Creek, the Intercoastal, and the Atlantic Ocean in their backyards, students will be afforded a hands-on approach to science. While Mayport Middle has focused on marine science for the past two years, this grant according to Dr. Sally Hague, Executive Director of School Choice/Pupil Assignment Operations for Duval County Public Schools, "elevates it to 'official' magnet status - bringing with it \$1.4 million."

Mayport Elementary's \$1.3 million will allow the two schools to collaborate on creating complimentary programs. The three-year grant will provide more hands-on experiences for the students which will enhance their classroom experience. Kathy Malz, Mayport Elementary's science resource teacher, reports that the "grant will help ensure that every child has a more interactive experience." Additionally, both schools will be able to invest in state-of-the-art science equipment for the classroom, but

will also have funds to explore the coastal areas around their schools. Exploration of coastal areas will be enhanced by working with local organizations, post-secondary institutions, and area military installations. Cheryl Mitchell, Environmental Director, and Art Burt, Security and Wildlife Officer, at NS Mayport are collaborating with the schools to develop activities for exploring the wetlands, the creeks, and area beaches. JU's Marine Science Research Institute, the St. Johns River Management District, and the St. Johns Riverkeeper have also joined with the schools to create field trips and to assist with curriculum development. Are you interested in having your child attend one of

these schools to participate in its magnet program? You can go online to [www.magnetprograms.com](http://www.magnetprograms.com) to download an application to submit to the School Choice Office of Duval County Public Schools. While the deadline for most magnet programs was Feb. 28, you can still apply for these two magnets if you are active duty military. Active duty military will get first choice for the magnet selection at **these two schools** since they are the only middle and elementary schools with this program. Questions? ## Korean War Veteran Supports Military Children

Some people call the Korean War America's "forgotten war." Overshadowed by World War II and the Vietnam War the Korean War is often relegated to a few sentences in today's text books. But the veterans of the Korean War, many who also served in WWII, is an important study for many reasons.

But today's column is not a study on the Korean War. Rather it is the story of a Korean War veteran who proudly served then and is still serving today through bringing a unique comfort to today's military children.

John Stoeffler is a graduate of the Pennsylvania Military College (now Widener University), where he upon graduation he was commissioned in United States Army and shortly thereafter deployed to Korea. He proudly served in Korea and an Infantry officer. While the military was not his career his pride, patriotism and support of those who served remained as he pursued a civilian career first with GE then launching his own business in 1981. He is also a columnist for the St. Louis Dispatch.

As a well-known columnist, Mr. Stoeffler was asked to speak at a Memorial Day event in 2008. In his remarks he made two main points; the casualties of war are not limited to the battlefield alone and it is those no longer with us that we remember on Memorial Day and perhaps the way to do that is to care for and support those left behind with whatever

resources we have.

Shortly after that event Mr. Stoeffler awoke with those points on his mind and the children of the fallen. His thoughts turned to his own children and grandchildren. He reflected on how their 'Lamby' and 'blankies' brought such comfort to his young ones. Then, he mused, "What if...what if we could make small pillows; soft, fleece backed pillows with an imprinted photo of a deployed mom or dad on it...what if we could make them and give them for free to the children of deployed service members?"

With that 'crazy idea' the Pillow Project was born. John and his lovely wife, Linda, embarked upon this new venture - to provide pillows to children whose parents are deployed for at least three months. Linda and a few of her friends do the sewing and John takes care of converting submitted photos of service members into the soft, durable pillow tops for their child.

Since that time John and Linda, their partners and friends have distributed over 3,000 free pillows to children of deployed. John speaks of the day they had to shut down the website, "We were swamped! The USS Dwight D Eisenhower was deploying. Someone showed one of our pillows to the FRG and within 3 days we had over

500 orders for pillows. We shut down the website till we could catch up. It was a great problem to face."

# USS Robert G. Bradley, APS Visit Sierra Leone

USS Robert G. Bradley (FFG 49) arrived in Freetown, Sierra Leone, as part of Africa Partnership Station (APS) West, March 7.

The ship will embark African partners in order to conduct professional exchanges that build maritime safety and security in Africa.

"Training events will focus on a broad range of areas, including maritime domain awareness, leadership, search and rescue," said Capt. Susan Dunlap, U.S. Naval Forces Africa director, Africa regional engagement group.

Cmdr. Darryl Brown, USS Robert G. Bradley commanding officer, said the Bradley is functioning as a mobile university, moving from port-to-port to provide training and long-term collaboration between the U.S. and international partners.

"Because of that, we are able to offer tailored training and achieve common goals through working together," said Brown.


APS 2011 started Feb. 1, in Lome, Togo, and will consist of seven U.S. ships, will engage 22 African partners and involve more than 7,000 maritime professionals.

"APS is an active symbol of the strong relationship between our two nations," said Michael S. Owen, U.S. ambassador to Sierra Leone. "It's an opportunity to share resources and create learning opportunities that will build skills, bolster regional security and promote future cooperation."



# Service Members Assist After Japanese Quake

Japan's earthquake and tsunami are tragedies on an epic scale, Pentagon Press Secretary Geoff Morrell said March 14, and the U.S. military will do all it can to help.

The United States has about 50,000 military personnel in Japan and already has responded to some immediate needs for the people of northern Japan.

"We've got about ... a dozen ships that are either there or en route, a lot of aircraft associated with those ships," Morrell said in an MSNBC interview this morning. "They have been doing search-and-rescue operations, and they have been providing relief supplies as well."

The situation is further complicated by the conditions of Japanese nuclear plants affected by the quakes. Some Navy airmen and sailors participating in relief missions off the USS Ronald Reagan have been exposed to radiation that leaked from these plants. The exposure was at such low levels that they washed it off with soap and water, Morrell said.

"They've since moved the Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group [from the] downwind area of that Fukushima plant," Morrell said.

U.S. servicemembers are standing by to deliver what aid the Japanese need, and the number of U.S. personnel involved in aid efforts will rise

and fall, depending on Japanese needs, he added.

The USS Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group continues operations off the east coast of Honshu, Pentagon spokesman Marine Corps Col. Dave Lapan said today. The United States has eight ships east of Honshu with five more on the way.

"In the upcoming days, the Ronald Reagan will serve as an afloat platform for helicopters from the Japan Self-defense Force, the Japanese coast guard and other civilian authorities," Lapan said.

"We conducted air operations today with 10 helicopters from the Naval Station in Atsugi and the USS Reagan flying relief missions identifying people in need of assistance in the region of Minato, and delivered food and blankets," he continued. The choppers also flew surveys of the at-sea debris field and flew search-and-rescue missions along the coast.

The USS Tortuga, with heavy-lift MH-53 helicopters, is steaming toward the eastern coast. "They will on-load 300 Japanese Ground Self-Defense Force personnel and 90 vehicles and deliver them to the northern tip of Honshu," Lapan said. Other U.S. ships are expected to arrive in the area March 17.

The Navy has P-3 Orion aircraft flying to help in area surveying efforts.

Lapan said no U.S. bases are in the danger zone for radioactivity, and that there are no plans to evacuate any U.S. personnel or their families.

## Misawa Sailors Assist Cleanup At Fishing Port

Approximately 92 Sailors from Naval Air Facility Misawa (NAFM) and its tenant commands, volunteered with a clean up-relief effort at the Misawa Fishing Port, March 14.

The clean up comes only days following an 8.9-magnitude earthquake, which triggered a tsunami along Japan's eastern coastline, resulting in severe damage to many Japanese coastal cities.

"We are very grateful for the participation today by the U.S. Navy," he said. "At City Hall, we are committed to solidarity with the base community and I believe the Sailors presence here today is a great symbol of that commitment and the alliance between the U.S. and Japan."

Demonstrating their appreciation, the city of Misawa provided lunch for the volunteers. NAFM Sailors said they were

more than happy to spend their day cleaning up the port.

"After seeing everything on the news about the recent tragedy in Japan, many do not realize the path of destruction the earthquake made, we are very lucky," said Chief Construction Mechanic Michael Robb. "Today we are more than happy to be of service right in our own backyard. While the logistics were handled primarily by senior leadership, our junior guys are out here in full force and making a huge difference out here."

Operations Specialist 2nd Class Eric Tan said when the opportunity to assist in a relief effort arose, there was no question in mind to volunteer after experiencing the recent earthquake first-hand.

"I am very glad I got this chance," he added. "I am sure I am like many people around the world who want to help Japan in anyway possible. I hope to do more."

# A New Way To Buy Ice At Naval Station Mayport

The Navy Exchange has a new on-base vendor, and Naval Station Mayport personnel have a great new way to buy ice.

Located next to the Autoport on Massey Avenue is the new Ice House America ice vending house. Owned and operated by East Coast Ice, a local Jacksonville company, this machine presents a great way to offer ice to Mayport Sailors.

"Operating the machine is easy," says Matt Tuohy, a retired naval officer formally stationed aboard USS John F. Kennedy at Mayport, the East Coast Ice Executive Vice President. "You have the option of buying a 16-pound bag of ice, or delivering 20 pounds of ice directly into your cooler, both for \$1.50. Generally, bagged ice comes in 10 pound bags, which makes this a great value," said Tuohy. "It is an especially good deal for those people working outside who buy ice every day."

Manufactured from food grade stainless steel, the unit is topped with an electric ice maker that takes the filtered water, makes and dumps 35 pounds of ice into a bin at the rear of the unit

every eight minutes. An auger then moves the ice toward a scale at the front of the unit, which weighs the ice before sliding it into a bag that slides down a chute leading outside to the customer. Unbagged ice in 20-pound quantities goes to another chute that's released when the customer pulls a handle.

"The first person to touch the ice is the customer," said Tuohy.

East Coast Ice is the largest owner/ operator of Ice House America machines in the country with over 100 machines in service throughout the State of Florida. ECI has a number of employees that are Navy Veterans with multiple tours at Mayport.

"It is a natural partnership, bringing a new product to the Mayport community," said Jim Tuttle, Navy Exchange Regional Vending Manager. "The more ice we sell, the greater the benefit to the Mayport Community," said Tuttle.

As the weather gets warmer and the days get longer, and the need for ice increases, remember that the Navy Exchange and Ice House America has changed the way you buy ice at Naval Station Mayport.

# Admiral Farragut Returns To Mobile Bay

For the second time in history, a U.S. naval officer on a U.S. warship entering Mobile Bay, Alabama uttered the words, "Damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead." While the first words were directed to a ship's captain from Adm. David Farragut during the Civil War on Friday August 5, 1864, these repeat words came from Cmdr. Bill Daly, commanding officer of USS Farragut (DDG 99) on Friday March 4, 2011.

The command to enter battle was part of a re-enactment ceremony as Farragut's crew watched a cannon fire from Fort Morgan in Mobile Bay. The re-enactment also involved a U.S. Coast Guard C-130 fly-by and local re-enactors deploying a wreath from Farragut as she passed Fort Morgan. The event also honored the crew of the Federal ironclad Tecumseh, which struck a Confederate mine and sunk during the 1864

battle.

Farragut's four-day port visit to Mobile was conducted in conjunction with Mobile's Mardi Gras celebration, which is the oldest Mardi Gras ceremony in the United States.

Mobile is known for its enduring support of the Navy, and this year's visit was no exception.

Upon arrival the city hosted a wonderful pier-side welcoming ceremony that included an

NJROTC marching unit, welcome gifts and words from numerous Mobile organizations, including the Mayor's office, the Azalea Trail Maids, the USS Alabama crewmates, the Junior Chamber of Commerce, the Navy League and various Mardi Gras associations. 

If you've never cooked this dish before, don't worry, there's almost nothing easier. Just follow the easy cooking instructions on the package. If you're looking for a lower sodium version, though, use one of the corned beef recipes featured in Kay's Kitchen at <http://www.commissaries.com>.

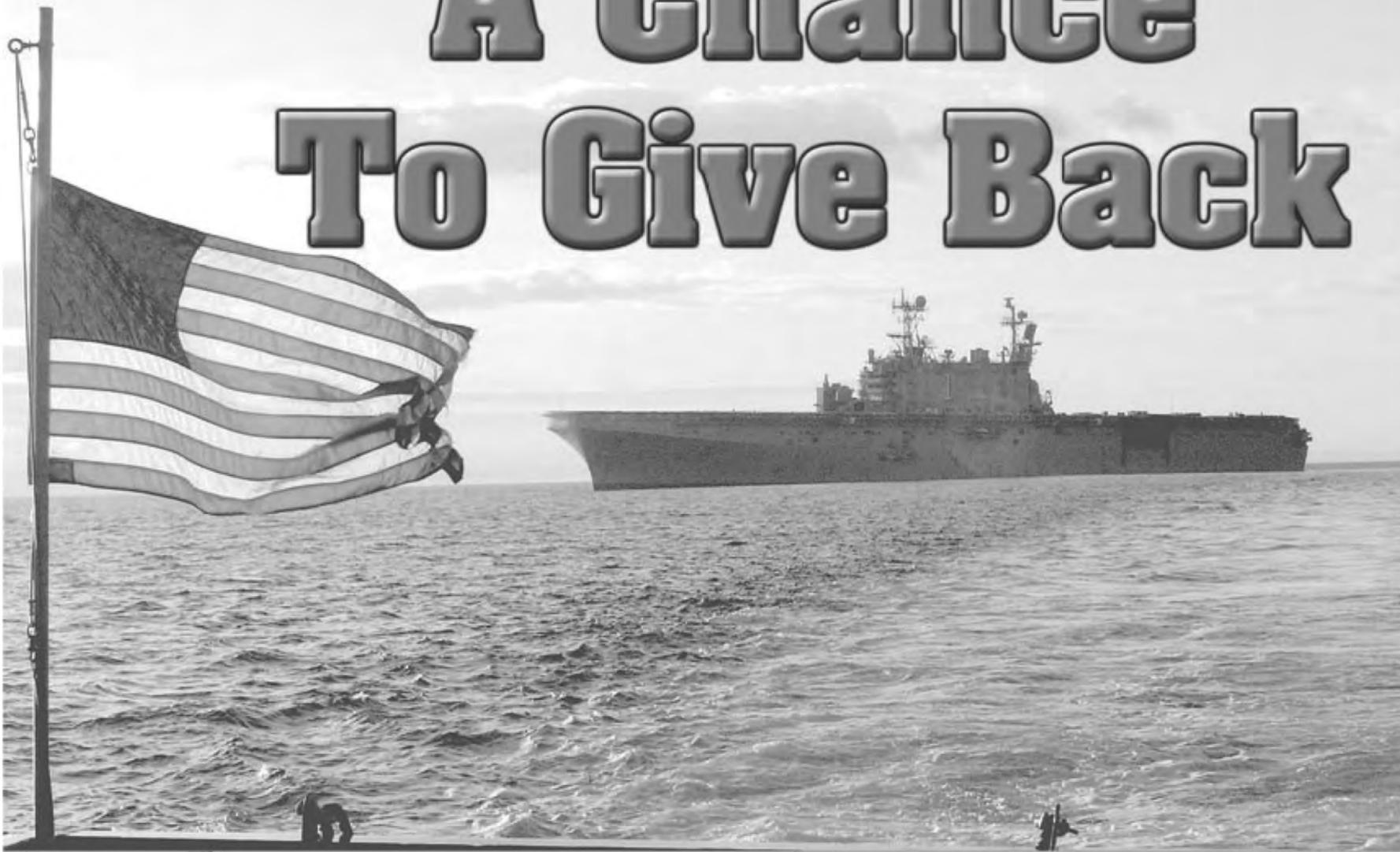
Add wedges of fresh green cabbage to the pot during the last 15 to 20 minutes of cooking and serve with boiled new potatoes, cooked separately.
