26th Anniversary Of USS Stark Attack

Mayport Keeps Promise To 'Never Forget'

NS Mayport will host a memorial ceremony on May 17 at Mayport's Memorial Park. The ceremony will be at 10 a.m. and guest speaker for this year's event is retired Rear Adm. George A. Huchting.

Huchting retired from the United States Navy in January of 1999 after 36 years of service.

From 1999 until early 2006, he was employed with

Cypress International, Inc. in Alexandria, Virginia as Vice-President of Navy Programs, consulting with Defense firms.

While with Cypress International, and subsequently, he participated in various panels supporting the Missile Defense Agency focus areas. Most recently Adm. Huchting led the Operational Viability Assessment (OVA) for SBX-1 prior to the successful initial

deployment of the SBX and XBR to the northern Pacific and Bering Sea for winter operations and participated in other SBX and BMDS Joint Training studies. He remains a Defense consultant.

On May 17, 1987, while on patrol in the Arabian Gulf, 37 Sailors died when two Iraqi missiles struck USS Stark. Despite the severe damage inflicted, the heroic efforts of

Stark's crew saved the ship. Stark was decommissioned at Mayport in 1999.

In order to preserve the tradition once the ship was retired, the Naval Order of the United States, North Florida Commandery, assumed sponsorship for the memorial service.

Several members of the 1987 crew of Stark will attend the service. The service will feature

accounts of some of the events that occurred following the attack, both aboard ship and here in Mayport, from crew and volunteers who worked to provide information and support services to the families of crew members.

Mayport's Memorial Park was established Aug. 1, 1987, with the dedication of the Stark monument.

USS Farragut Holds Change Of Command

to the ship while undergoing maintenance in her homeport of Mayport, Florida.

During Jones' tour, he led the ship through intermediate and advanced phase training and an eight-month deployment to the Fifth and Sixth Fleet Areas of Responsibility.

Don't Forget Spiritual Fitness For Overall Health

In the Navy, we often focus on taking care of our physical fitness, but we can sometimes neglect our spiritual fitness, which is very important for our overall health and well being. What is spiritual fitness? Spiritual fitness refers to one's spiritual health and reflects how spirituality can help us to cope with challenges and to experience joy.

Spirituality can be used in a general way to refer to what gives us meaning and purpose in life; this

term can also be used more specifically to refer to how we practice our religion, philosophy, or way of life. Spirituality can be expressed by seeking to strengthen ourselves and build healthy relationships with others; it can also be expressed by seeking to exercise faith and to develop a relationship with God through religious practices such as worship and prayer.

Our spiritual fitness will become healthier as we practice our beliefs and participate in activities that support our spirituality. On the other hand, our spiritual fitness can become less healthy when we neglect our faith and spirituality. We all recognize the importance of physical exercise for our physical fitness, but we

may not all understand the importance of spiritual exercise for our spiritual fitness.

So how can we check our spiritual fitness to see how we are doing? We are all familiar with having a Physical Fitness Assessment, but is there a way to assess our spiritual fitness? The Navy Chaplain Corps has developed a Spiritual Fitness Guide to help; it is a self-assessment tool each of us can use to consider our own spiritual condi-

tion. (You can search for "Navy Spiritual Fitness Guide" to see it online.) The Spiritual Fitness Guide can help us as individuals see how we are doing spiritually. We can identify areas of spiritual strength as well as areas where we have spiritual concerns and may need help and support.

The main indicators that we are spiritually fit and healthy are: 1) we are engaged in life's meaning and purpose, 2) we are hopeful about life and the future, 3) we make sound moral decisions, 4) we are fully engaged with our family, friends, and community, 5) we are able to

forgive ourselves and others, 6) we are respectful of others, and 7) we are engaged in our core values and beliefs.

Even though we may be doing well overall spiritually, all of us have spiritual concerns sometimes and may experience spiritual stress. This can occur when our beliefs or values are disrupted and when our relationship with others or our relationship with God is threatened or challenged.

If you have spiritual concerns and are spiritually stressed, it can be helpful to talk with your chaplain. He or she can assist you in exploring

your spiritual concerns and issues, provide mentoring about relationships and spiritual practices, and work with you to renew hope, faith, and purpose in your life. Please know that your chaplain cares and is devoted to helping you with your spiritual fitness and health. And remember that when you talk to a Navy chaplain, there is complete confidentiality. I pray that we all will take the opportunity to check how we are doing spiritually and that we will reach out for the help and support we need.

NS Mayport, NAVSEA Host 5th Annual International Frigate Working Group

Naval Station Mayport and Naval Sea Systems Command hosted the fifth meeting of the International Frigate Working Group (IFWG) May 6-10, bringing together the current users of the Oliver Hazard Perry (FFG 7) class frigates.

The navies currently operating the class meet annually to assess lessons learned and to discuss opportunities to improve capabilities, maintenance and support of these ships.

The U.S. Navy currently operates 18 Perry-class frigates, all of which are slated for decommissioning in the next several years. A total of 34 Perry-class frigates are in use by partner navies, including Australia, Bahrain, Egypt, Turkey, Poland, Spain, Taiwan and Pakistan. Hosting responsibility for these yearly meetings rotates among IFWG membership.

"The International Frigate Working Group continues to provide an open and collaborative forum for the U.S. Navy and its international partners to exchange vital

information to ensure these ships remain combat ready," said Rear Adm. Jim Shannon, NAVSEA's deputy commander for surface warfare. "Fostering communication and sustaining cooperative relationships with our international

partners is a cornerstone of the U.S. Navy's global maritime strategy. These meetings provide a unique opportunity to share success stories, address challenges and establish initiatives to ensure these ships remain supportable throughout their service lives."

The International Frigate Working group is an opportunity to promote communication between U.S. and allied partners in an effort to identify maintenance, obsolescence and logistics issues impacting the class, and to also present alternatives for sustain-

ment and modernization programs.

IFWG members recognize that U.S. Navy support of the FFG 7 platform will become increasingly challenging as it decommissions the remaining 19 ships. IFWG provides an opportunity for improved cooperation between the

U.S. and partner navies to improve communications, logistics support, gain efficiencies, and enhance long term readiness.

"Our collaborative approach to sharing knowledge and experiences has proven to be immensely successful and informative in years past," said Shannon. "We are looking forward to another opportunity to share the trials and successes of this ship class with our partner navies to continue to make strides with some of the modernization challenges."

NAVSEA's Surface Warfare Directorate is responsible for the maintenance and modernization of non-nuclear surface ships currently operating in the fleet. Through planned modernization and upgrade programs, the directorate equips today's surface ships with the latest technologies and systems to keep them in the fleet through their service lives.



Vietnam Wall Travels To Jacksonville Area

More than 500 people attended a ceremony at Green Cove Springs Junior High School May 11 to honor service members who lost their lives during the Vietnam Conflict.

The ceremony, hosted by the Green Cove Springs Junior High School Beta Club students, used the 300-foot long, six-foot tall Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall as a backdrop for the ceremony.

"I can stand here and tell you that the wall is six feet at the apex, I can tell you that the east wing is 144 feet but that's not what this wall is about," said Greg Welsh, Vietnam Traveling Wall manager.

"This wall is about a young child; a boy or girl coming out for the first time seeing the name of an uncle or a grandfather that they only heard about at family events," Welsh added.

"Or maybe its Gold Star parents coming out and sharing some time with their son or daughter who life was taken so many years ago."

One highlight of the ceremony was when guest speaker, Rear Adm. Jack Scorby, commander, Navy Region Southeast, presented retired Warrant Officer Ernesto Serna with the Purple Heart for his bravery and efforts during the Vietnam War.

"I am incredibly honored to present a Purple Heart to Warrant Officer Serna, who earned 34 Air Medals throughout his distinguished career," said Scorby.

"I'm especially honored to be here with the heroes who witnessed some of the defining moments of our nation's history," he said. "I want to thank all

of our Vietnam veterans for their amazing service to our country."

As the ceremony ended, the crowd that included many Vietnam veterans and family members of those lost during the Vietnam War scrolled the wall and found and traced the name of their loved ones.

"It's kind of touching to come out here and actually get to touch the wall and see them in some

form, it's very moving," said Lynn Burgess, friend of William Stalnecker. "The boys who didn't come back and the ones that did, deserve a lot more than what they got when they returned. So this is a good reminder of what the Vietnam War really was."

The Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall was brought to the school after a student traveled to Washington, D.C. where

he walked along the actual wall and was moved by the many names of those who never came home.

When he returned to school, he mentioned that he wanted everyone to have the experience he had and a plan was hatched by the Beta Club members to bring the wall to Green Cove Springs.

"This is great for our community. It truly has been a community effort to bring the wall here.

We raised nearly \$10,000 through various fundraisers and speaking engagements."

"And, many of the businesses here pitched in by donating goods and their time to make this happen," said Rachel Thompson, an eighth grader at the school and member of the Beta Club.

Also helping out were members of VP-62 at NAS Jacksonville who spend hours landscaping the

football field grounds, painting the stadium and participating in the ceremony.

"It truly has been a collaboration of many, many people over many, many hours to make this all happen. But what a great experience for our community and these students," said AECs Jeannette Wright of VP-62, who coordinated the community service events for the Sailors.

Career Intermission Program Revisions Open Positions, Change Leave Policy

New guidance for the Career Intermission Pilot Program (CIPP), released with the update of OPNAVINST 1330.2B, includes a provision that now permits Full Time Support (FTS) personnel to apply for CIPP.

Announced in NAVADMIN 125/13, the revised instruction authorizes FTS personnel the option to participate in CIPP, which was previously closed to all Navy Reserve Sailors.

"These changes were in direct response to feedback we received from the fleet," said Vice Admiral Scott Van Buskirk, Chief of Naval Personnel. "CIPP allows us to meet the short-term needs of our Sailors, while ensuring they stay Navy for the long term. These important changes will now allow us take that mission further, providing more Sailors the opportunity to utilize this valuable program."

The revised instruction also authorizes up to 60 days of accrued unused leave to be carried over through a CIPP participant's intermission. It also clarifies authorization for disability processing, allowing participants that are critically injured or ill to be treated under the same provisions as a member serving on active duty.

CIPP presents a unique opportunity for Sailors to take a career intermission from the Navy, without penalty, and return to active duty to complete a successful Navy career.

During their time in CIPP, participants retain their full medical and dental benefits for themselves and their dependents, as well as exchange and commissary benefits. Participants also

receive a small monthly stipend equal to 1/15th of their basic pay. Members may also choose a Navy-funded permanent change of station move to anywhere in the continental United States when entering the program.


Upon returning to Active Duty, the CIPP participant's date of rank/service is adjusted day for day to account for their intermission, ensuring participants compete in promotion boards with people at the same experience level.

Twenty officer applications and twenty enlisted applications are accepted for the program each year. Interested applicants must first submit an electronic package to Navy Office of Diversity and Inclusion (OPNAV N134) program manager for consideration. Packages are then reviewed for eligibility and routed to the member's detailer community managers before final approval by the Commander of Navy Personnel Command.

All program participants will return to active duty at the end of the period prescribed and will incur a two-to-one service obligation for every month in the program. This obligation is in addition to any previously existing obligation. Time spent in the IRR will not count towards retirement, computation of total years of commissioned service, or high year tenure limitations.

Controls On Thermostat Help Save Big On Energy

Members of the Naval Station Mayport's Installation Energy Conservation Board gathered outside of Building One on May 7 for a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the integration of a \$3.3 million energy project that will keep Mayports thermostats on the same dial.

Direct Digital Controls (DDC) are currently being installed in buildings throughout the naval station to directly link to the an Energy Management Controls System (EMCS). Once fully online, the system will manage the heating and air conditioning units (HVAC) of 56 buildings in one central location.

Mayport Public Works is currently working with Energy Systems Group to install the DDC and eliminate zoned thermostats within the buildings.

According to NS Mayport Energy Manager, Lt. Shawn Talley, the new system can customize temperature settings based on building occupancy times; align workspace temperatures with recommended energy efficient settings; and provide real-time tracking to help identify problems faster.

"Initial energy savings are showing an average of 20-25 percent reduction in the buildings' energy consumption," Talley said. "The system will enable centralized controls of the temperature setpoints according to CNIC guidance. Additionally, it will provide improved response to any problems with the buildings' mechanical [HVAC] systems to help Public Works better serve the naval station."

So far approximately 58 percent of the project has been completed with around 15 of the 56 buildings fully online with the EMCS, including Building One.

The energy savings will make significant contributions toward the mandated requirements of the Energy Independence Security Act of 2007 which requires specific reductions in energy in federal facilities of at least 30 percent by fiscal year 2015.

Mayport has worked diligently to lower its energy consumption, already receiving the FY12 Energy Water Management Award Gold Level of Achievement.

NS Mayport Conducts HURREX/Citadel Gale 2013 Exercise

Naval Station Mayport is currently participating in the U.S. Fleet Forces Command (USFF) and Commander Navy Installations Command (CNIC) led hurricane preparedness exercise, HURREX/Citadel Gale 2013, May 13-24.

The purpose of this annual exercise is to prepare the Navy to respond to weather threats to U.S. coastal regions, and to maintain the ability to deploy forces even under the most adverse weather conditions.

HURREX/CITADEL GALE 13 will involve three simulated storm systems developing and intensifying to hurricane strength, threatening the Caribbean Islands, East Coast and Gulf Coast regions.

All Navy commands with personnel in these regions will participate, to include reviewing and exercising heavy weather instructions and procedures and accounting for Sailors and Navy families in the affected regions through the Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System (NFAAS).

There will be no U.S. Navy ship movements associated with this exercise.

An order to set tropical cyclone condition of readiness (COR) 5 for all NS Mayport departments and tenant commands has been released. Mayport will remain in COR 5 throughout the hurricane season to ensure a state of readiness is maintained. Certain preparatory

actions are required within each COR in order to properly secure the installation and prepare personnel. The level of preparation increases with the progression of each COR level (i.e. from picking up loose gear in COR 5, to removing awnings in COR 3, to reporting to shelters in COR 1).

To ensure readiness, Sailors, civilian employees, and their families should make hurricane preparations now and review those preparations periodically throughout the year. When a hurricane approaches, ships may be ordered to sortie and aircraft may evacuate. Any final hurricane preparations will fall onto family members who must be prepared to assume the burden of self-protection and survival in the absence of their spouse. Making preparations now, to include developing an evacuation plan and assembling a survival kit, is the best way to avoid problems and confusion associated with last minute storm preparations.

Actions to be taken before the storm.

- Prepare an evacuation plan. Having a plan will allow for timely evacuation should military or local authorities order an evacuation. In many cases, voluntary evacuation may be prudent even if authorities don't order a mandatory evacuation. If possible, plan to stay at the home of a family member or friend outside the reach of the hurricane. If your plan is to stay at a hotel/motel, call well in advance to ensure

vacancy because rooms fill quickly. Plan multiple routes as traffic congestion is likely. If possible, travel with family, neighbors or friends. Ensure your vehicle is properly maintained and has a full tank of gas. Obtain a re-entry pass from your local municipality if you reside east of the inter-coastal waterway.

- All commands should have comprehensive coop plans that have been exercised. Mission critical and mission essential personnel should be identified and re-entry passes obtained.

- Have emergency supplies on hand and a survival kit ready, regardless of your evacuation decision. Some recommended items to have in your survival kit include, but are certainly not limited to: change of clothing, personal hygiene items, sleeping bags/blankets, first aid kit with essential prescription medications, battery operated radio, flashlights, extra batteries and chargers, eyeglasses, games or toys for children, important papers, bottled drinking water, canned food, can opener.

- Make arrangements for pets. Most shelters and hotels will not allow pets. Ensure pets have identification tags, current license and shots are up to date.

- Check your house and yard.

- Know the difference between a hurricane watch and hurricane warning. Review your insurance policy. Now is the time to get hurricane smart.



Jax Vets awarded Congressional Gold Medal

Two Jacksonville area Veterans were awarded the Congressional Gold medal during a ceremony at City Hall May 2 in downtown Jacksonville.

The award recipients Vincent Calhoun, and Leroy Jones, Jr both attended Marine Corps boot camp at Camp Motford Point in North Carolina at a time when African Americans were segregated and forced to train separately. After the completion of boot camp both went on to serve in World War II.

Jones discussed his desire to serve his country and in the Marines.

"I was excited when I found out I had the opportunity to serve my country, I knew it would be a challenge but it is something I am glad I was able to do then and now."

In 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed Executive Order 8802 allowing African Americans to be recruited

in the Marine Corps. African American recruits received basic training at Montford Point. Between 1942 and 1949 there were 19,168 African American

recruits trained at Montford Point. Of those Marines over 13,000 served overseas during the war. Most were assigned to ammunition and depot companies and brought ammunition and supplies to the front lines and returned wounded and dead to the transport ships. At the end of the war, all but 1500 were discharged at the convenience of the government.

In July of 1948, President Harry S. Truman issued Executive Order 9981 negating segregation and in September 1949, Montford Point was deactivated ending seven years of segregation. The camp was renamed Camp Johnson after Sgt. Maj. Gilbert "Hashmark" Johnson, one of the first African Americans to join the Marine Corps.

The Congressional Gold Medal is the highest civilian honor bestowed by Congress for distinguished achievement. President Barrack Obama signed into law the legislation to

award the Congressional Gold Medal to the Montford Point Marines on November 23, 2011.

The presenting official for the ceremony was Marine Brig. Gen. W. "Blake" Crowe, Commander, United States Marine Corps Forces, South.

"From the Commandant of the Marine Corps, I say thank you for your service, this recognition is long overdue."

Crowe went on this discuss not only the importance of recognizing Jones and Calhoun, but making sure all Montford Point Marines were recognized.

"Get the word out, go to your neighborhoods, talk to your family, so that all of these Marines can be recognized."
