

NAVSTA Mayport Hosts Canadian Artifact Ceremony

Naval Station (NAVSTA) Mayport hosted a ceremony to transfer artifacts uncovered from a 1958 jet crash to the Canadian armed forces, Feb. 26.

On Feb. 25, 1958, Royal Canadian Navy Lt. William Thomas “Barry” Troy was flying an F2H-3 Banshee during a joint exercise with the U.S. Navy when he vanished into dense fog off the coast of NAVSTA Mayport.

In the aftermath of Hurricanes Irma and Maria, a few of Troy’s items washed ashore on the beach of neighboring Hannah Park. Among the items uncovered were a stenciled float coat, a life vest with “USN” printed on it and a parachute harness with “LT (P) TROY” stenciled on.

Along with representatives from the park service, who recovered the items, and the Jacksonville Sheriff’s Office, who maintained them, Troy’s younger

brother William Richard Troy and his wife were present for the ceremony.

The younger Troy was grateful to be in the presence of the gear used by his late brother, particu-

larly the parachute harness. “Knowing that my brother [wore it],” he said. “There’s a connec-

tion there.”

The Troy family had not previously received much closure.

“Sixty years ago yesterday, the navy had called

USS Little Rock Helps Homeless in Montreal

A group of Sailors from the littoral combat ship USS Little Rock (LCS 9) participated in a community outreach event in Montreal, Quebec, Feb. 23.

Sailors volunteered at the Welcome Hall Mission where they assisted with daily operations by bagging groceries, building chairs and packaging food for the homeless, single parents and at-risk youth.

One of the volunteers, Operations Specialist First Class Petty Officer Aaron Huckabaa said, “It was nice to give back to the community. Especially since

the people of Montreal have been so welcoming and kind, as a visiting American it was nice to give back to the community.”

Throughout the day, Sailors were able to interact with local citizens both on the side of people receiving the food and those who manage and operate the program.

“All of the people running this program were so passionate about serving the community and helping as many people as possible,” said Operations Specialist Senior Chief Petty Officer Tarius Williams. “It was shocking to see how many people they feed and support here every week.”

According to managers, Welcome Hall Mission was established in 1892 and offers support for the homeless, young single mothers, and at-risk youth in the Montreal urban community. The free grocery store provides basic food and living supplies for those in need.

USS Little Rock is visiting Montreal following its commissioning in Buffalo last December. Sailors continue to focus on training, readiness, and certifications, while also giving back to the local community through volunteer service.

Increased Incentives, Assignments Changes For Some Overseas Sailors

Navy announced Feb. 21, that Sailors serving on sea duty in Japan, Guam and Spain now have an increased set of incentives available to them, in NAVADMIN 042/18.

According to the NAVADMIN, Sailors who voluntarily extend their sea duty at the listed locations to a minimum of 48 months, will have any remaining sea time left on their prescribed sea tour waived and be allowed to rotate to shore duty for their next assigned tour.

Those who extend their tours by 12 months or more will be given preferential consideration

for announced billets in Career Management System/Interactive Detailing (CMS/ID).

Eligible Sailors who extend their sea tours for at least 12 months still have the option of Sea Duty Incentive Pay. The Overseas Tour Extension Incentive Program also remains an option for eligible Sailors.

Additionally, with the release of this NAVADMIN, first-term Sailors in grades E-3 and below are now authorized accompanied orders to overseas locations where dependents are authorized.

“Our goal is to reward those Sailors who volunteer to extend to meet the demands from the fleet,” said Rear Adm.

John Meier, director, Career Management Department, Navy Personnel Command (NPC). “In addition to the incentives already in place, which remain options for Sailors who meet extension criteria, these additional incentives should make it easier for Sailors who make the decision to extend.”

Sailors interested in taking advantage of these incentives must request an extension by submitting an Enlisted Personnel Action Request (NAVPERS 1070/7 Rev. 1/03) 18-14 months prior to their Projected Rotation Date. For assistance, Sailors should contact their command career counselor.

NEX AOK Awards Good Grades

From NEXCOM

The Navy Exchange Service Command’s (NEXCOM) A-OK Student Reward Program offers all qualified students to participate in a quarterly drawing for monetary awards of \$2,500, \$1,500, \$1,000 or \$500 for a total of \$5,500 per quarter. The next drawing will be at the end of March 2018.

Any eligible full-time student that has a B-grade point average equivalent or better, as determined by their school system, may enter the drawing. Homeschooled students can also qualify with acknowledgement that the student has a “B” average or equivalent record of accomplishment.

Eligible students include dependent children of active duty members, reservists and military retirees as well as U.S. civilian Department of Defense employees stationed outside the continental United States and U.S. civilian employees of firms under contract to the Department of Defense outside the continental United States. Students must be enrolled in 1st through 12th grade. Dependent children without an individual Dependent Identification Card must be accompanied by their sponsor to submit their entry. Each student may enter only once each grading period and must re-enter with each qualifying report card.

To enter the drawing, stop by any NEX with a current report card or progress report and have a NEX associate verify the eligibility. Then fill out an entry card and obtain an A-OK ID which entitles the student to discount coupons for NEX products and services.

NEXCOM has been offering students a chance to help pay for college through its A-OK Student Reward Program since 1997. Since the program’s inception, NEXCOM has awarded \$722,000 in savings bonds and monetary awards to students with the help of its generous vendor partners.

Ideas for Spring Break:

The Jacksonville Arboretum & Gardens is a 120-acre urban woodland full of trails for you to explore and enjoy. From the trailhead next to the parking lot, a stabilized walkway encircles a beautiful two-acre lake. This trail gently descends about 25 feet from to the foot of the lake and then returns up a gentle slope on the opposite side to the trailhead. Interpretive signs and over 100 labeled

plants enhance the loop. In addition, over three miles of rustic hiking trails wind quietly through a series of distinct ecological habitats. Along the trails, benches invite you either to pause and enjoy the view or to get in a good stretch during a vigorous walk. Open to the public 7 days a week from 8 AM to 5 PM. Dutton Island Preserve

The Dutton Island Park and Preserve is located just east of the Intracoastal Waterway, in the Atlantic Beach area of Jacksonville. Formerly known as Pine Island, it was renamed for a former owner, Walter Dutton. The City of Atlantic Beach purchased the island from Dutton's estate in 1998, and developed the property in three phases between early 2000 and the summer of 2003. There are walking trails

throughout the island's 42 acres. University of North Florida Hiking Trails

For the outdoorsy, fitness-lover in all of us, the UNF's Robert W. Loftin Nature Trails are a must. Located on the outskirts of UNF's campus, the trails extend over five-hundred acres of natural and protected habitats. There are five different designated paths, each varying in length and landscape.

The trails also include the "Sawmill Slough Preserve," a three-hundred acre wetland habitat. Not only can you walk, workout, fish, and sight-see, but UNF also has equipment rental services where you can check-out paddle boards and kayaks, and they also have a zip-lining course. The plantation house itself may also be viewed, but is not included in the regular weekly tour, due to structural maintenance.

The Kingsley Plantation grounds are is opened year-round, with the exception of major holidays, operating Monday through Sunday, 9 AM to 5 PM. So as you read over these facts, resolve to thank a Vietnam veteran for their service and sacrifice the next time you have opportunity. Let's honor these heroes who served.

There are 58,267 names now listed on that polished black wall, including those added in 2010.

The first known casualty was Richard B. Fitzgibbon, of North Weymouth, Mass. Listed by the U.S. Department of Defense as having been killed on June 8, 1956. His name is listed on the Wall with that of his son, Marine Corps Lance Cpl. Richard B. Fitzgibbon III, who was killed on Sept. 7, 1965.

There are 3 sets of fathers and sons on the Wall.

39,996 on the Wall were just 22 or younger.

8,283 were just 19 years old.

THE LARGEST AGE GROUP, 33,103 WERE 18 YEARS OLD.

12 soldiers on the Wall

were 17 years old.

5 soldiers on the Wall were 16 years old.

One soldier, PFC Dan Bullock was 15 years old.

997 soldiers were killed on their first day in Vietnam ...

1,448 soldiers were killed on their last day in Vietnam ...

31 sets of brothers are on the Wall.

31 sets of parents lost two sons.

54 soldiers attended Thomas Edison High School in Philadelphia.

8 Women are on the Wall.

244 soldiers were awarded the Medal of Honor during the Vietnam War; 153 of

them are on the Wall.

Beallsville, Ohio with a population of 475 lost 6 of her sons.

West Virginia had the highest casualty rate per capita in the nation.

There are 711 West Virginians on the Wall.

The most casualty deaths for a single day was on January 31, 1968 - 245 deaths.

The most casualty deaths for a single month was May 1968 - 2,415 casualties were incurred.

There was a post-script at the end of the "Wall" facts by an unknown author who wrote:

"To those of us who lived through and survived the war, and to the families of those who did not, we see not the numbers of the dead, but their faces. They were our friends, fathers, husbands, wives, sons and daughters. There are no noble wars, just noble warriors."

Navy Ready For Warrior Games

The top 40 athletes have earned their spot in Team Navy and will now make their way to this year's DoD Warrior Games, an adaptive sports competition for wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans.

The 2018 Team Navy trials, which were hosted by Commander, Navy Installations Command's Navy Wounded Warrior – Safe Harbor program, came to a close Feb. 24 at Naval Station Mayport.

"The Navy's adaptive sports program provides a critical pathway to recovery for these resilient warriors," said Vice Adm. Mary Jackson, commander of Navy Installations Command, who oversees the 11 regions and 71 installations worldwide that are foundational to fleet and warfighter readiness. "Watching these athletes compete provides many with a renewed appreciation for life. The teamwork and the camaraderie that exist within and between these athletes are indescribably power-

ful and inspirational."

Approximately 70 athletes competed in various paralympic-style events, including track and field, swimming, shooting, archery, sitting volleyball, cycling and wheelchair basketball. Those who made

the Navy roster will face off with athletes from the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, and U.S. Special Operations Command as well as the Australian Defence Force and the United Kingdom Armed Forces June 2-9 at the

Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colo.

"It's more than just a sport," said Kile Putman, one of the Team Navy's adaptive field coaches. "It's about coming together with a common thread of 'our body is just not what it once

was.' Sports allow service members to set specific goals to obtain. That technique can be applied to daily lives in the recovery process. It gives a chance to set a standard for their lives that they wish to obtain." Along with the physical

recovery and rehabilitation benefits, the Team Navy trials and the DoD Warrior Games help build new relationships with other competitors who have like-minded drives and experiences while supporting strong social networks and a sense of community they can rely on during their path to recovery.

"We're all here to compete, every one wants to make the team and go to the Warrior Games," said Cryptologic Technician 1st Class Tyson Schmidt, 2018 Team Navy Trials participant. "Our competitiveness is equally matched by support. Whether you're the first person to finish a race or the last one to finish a swim, the volume of cheers and support doesn't change."

Navy Wounded Warrior – Safe Harbor provides Sailors and Coast Guardsmen as well as their families with non-medical care while they are recovering from serious illness or injury. There are approximately 4,000 Sailors and Coast Guardsmen currently enrolled in the program. To learn more, log onto www.navywounded-warrior.com.

HST Strike Group Goes Live

The Harry S. Truman Carrier Strike Group (HSTCSG) executed an integrated live-fire exercise while underway conducting their composite training unit exercise (COMPTUEX), Feb. 21-22.

"This was an opportunity for us to train with the tactics and actual live ordnance we would utilize if a fast moving boat was to attack the strike group," said Capt. Kevin Kennedy, commodore, Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) 28. "We brought everything together in a live-fire situation where we had to layer the defense of our forces."

The exercise tested the communication and execution of individual units as they worked together to defend the strike group, including USS Arleigh Burke (DDG 51), USS Forrest Sherman (DDG 98), USS Bulkeley (DDG 84) and aircraft from Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 1.

"It was impressive to see the execution of the integrated fire from surface ships, fixed wing and rotary assets from the [strike group]," said Cmdr. William Harkin, commanding officer of USS Bulkeley. "Our ability to find, fix and target multiple threats and effectively deploy a significant amount of ord-

nance should concern any adversary we face."

Individual units have been training for the exercise over the last couple months, while the planning for the event itself has been in progress for almost a year.

"It has been about a year long process establishing the criteria, training objectives and safeties that needed to be in place," added Kennedy. "The last three to four months, the ships and aircraft that were going to be participating used synthetic trainers going through the scenarios, so we could see it synthetically before we did it live and safe."

While the exercise was completed in a matter of hours, the results of it will have a lasting impact on future tactics and similar evolutions.

"There are few and far-between exercises, like this one, we get to do that we are able to get a lot of great lessons out of," added Kennedy. "These lessons are going to go right back into developing future tactics for the fleet."

COMPTUEX is the final stage of pre-deployment workups for the strike group. For USS Harry S. Truman, the evolution caps off more than seven months of training to ensure the ship and crew are ready to deploy.

New App Aids Aviation Corrosion Training

The "Aviation Corrosion Challenge" app, offering Sailors and Marines an interactive, score-based gaming scenario for identifying corrosion, became available in app stores in February.

Center for Naval Aviation Technical Training (CNATT) and the U.S. Navy Sea Warrior Program (PMW 240) partnered to launch the app through the Navy AppLocker; Google Play for Android users; and iTunes for iOS users.

"CNATT and PMW 240 have been efforting this for six months, and to see this come to fruition represents a move toward the technology-based learning we're embracing," said Mark Tinetti, CNATT instructional systems specialist. "Students today have information at their fingertips and putting out material in a format to which they're accustomed is keeping in line with CNATT's modernized learning model."

The app will not replace or substitute existing corrosion training, according to Tinetti, but is designed to augment it through visual identification of corrosion; methods for removing and treating corrosion; and materials used in corrosion prevention. Using photographs and text, the game randomly generates elements associated with corrosion control, including types, effects on alloys, aircraft cleaning, preventative compounds and sealants. Game users answer questions within a set amount of time while earning points.

"The game format of this app is something we felt could be more appealing to users," said Tinetti. "Individuals spend a lot of time on their phones and having

a resource such as this immediately accessible is something we felt could effectively complement required training."

Tinetti added that the game allows a review of questions at the end of each challenge and includes an achievement section, which unlocks trophies for points and levels earned.

Senior Chief Aviation Structural Mechanic Roger Nelson, a subject matter expert at CNATT, oversaw the content portion of the app's development and said the game-based training aid is something supervisors can employ as part of regularly scheduled training.

"Corrosion is one of the biggest challenges service members at squadrons, fleet readiness centers and other facilities face on a daily basis," said Nelson. "Incorporating this visual aid as something to augment training is something we're hop-

ing division officers and chiefs can stress to Sailors and Marines who deal with corrosion."

The app offers public content and does not require authentication or authorization to access.



The final stop was near Hemming Plaza where the teens handed out the remain-

ing sack lunches and waters.

"This experience was truly one to remember," commented Brandy Wolfe, Teen Coordinator. "We sometimes take for granted the things we use every day, such as soap and shampoo, when there are people right in our town who don't have access to these necessities."

The event was so successful that the MWR Teen Center is planning to do similar community service projects in the future. The MWR Teen Center offers an array of special events, field trips and clubs on a monthly basis which provides a sense of community and a social outlet for the teens involved.
