# Ending the Decade on a Good Note

The new year arrived at U.S. Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba as residents enjoyed performances from alternative bands Bridge of Sighs and State of Man at the Tiki Bar and country singer Mary White and her band at the Goat Locker.

According to the U.S. Navy Safety Center, only four Sailors died throughout the 2009 holiday season, three of which died in motor vehicle accidents.

The over all number pales in comparison to the more than 330,000 active-duty Sailors in the Navy as of January 2010, but 75 percent of the holiday deaths were the result of motor vehicle accidents. This makes the Navy's campaign for motor vehicle

safety and Guantanamo Bay's security forces' campaign for safe and sober driving essential to saving a Sailor's life.

The naval station staff judge advocate office reported no DUIs in Guantanamo Bay on New Year's Eve or New Year's Day.





# Memories of the Past

56 years in GTMO

Fifty-six years ago, thousands of military and civilian personnel streamed through Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba's Northeast gate in the evening to go home or to dine at their favorite Cuban restaurants. On the weekends, a Navy ship ferried base residents to Santiago de Cuba, Cuba's second largest city, located west of Guantanamo Bay.

For Cuban-native Harry Sharpe, these are some of the memories he has collected over his 56 years working and living at the U.S. base.

Sharpe was one of a few thousand Cubans who were allowed to live aboard the base shortly after Fidel Castro took over the country in a 1959 coup. Today, he and 39 other Cubans remain.

Twenty-two year-old Sharpe began working on the base in March 1953 shining the brass on building doors for 24 cents per hour. More than 2,000 Cubans worked on the base at that time.

Sharpe worked for Special Services, now called Morale, Welfare and Recreation, until his transfer to the base's Chief Petty Officer club in 1957. Thirty-six years later, Sharpe transferred to the officer's club and worked there until his retirement in March 2008.

After the coup, Castro allowed Sharpe and approximately 3,000 of his fellow Cubans to continue their commute back and forth through the Northeast gate to work on the base. However, no additional Cuban citizens could be hired.

As tension between the U.S. and Cuba increased, the Cuban militia built a gate opposite of the Northeast gate. When passing through the Cuban side of the gate, commuters were required to walk through cattle chutes.

"Working here at the base and living (in Cuba), they looked at you as the enemy," Sharpe said. "They would search you every morning when you come in

and search you every evening when you go out."

The Cuban police arrested Sharpe three times.

One day in July 1963, Sharpe left his home and went to work at 10 a.m., but never returned until 1980...as a tourist.

"Things were getting bad for those who worked over here," he said. "So a lot of Cubans stayed onboard here and I was one of them."

After going through an interview, the Cuban commuters were allowed to stay on the base.

"The first year when I stayed here, I said I would only be here for six months," he said. "But it's been 56 years since that happened, feels like yesterday."

Sharpe had the opportunity to meet many famous people.

"I met Jacques Cousteau," he said. "I took a picture and spoke to him for awhile."

Cousteau, a famous undersea explorer and environmentalist visited the Naval Station in 1985 and interviewed the commanding officer.

He also remembers meeting Fulgencio Batista, the Cuban leader ousted by Castro. Batista and Sharpe were from the same hometown and their fathers were good friends.

"I sat down at the table and had lunch with President Batista at the officer's club," Sharpe said. "I have a good memory of him; he wore my Rolex watch for about two hours."

Some of the other people he met were Bob Hope and Johnny Cash.

Sharpe remembers Bob Hope, Johnny Cash, and Adm. John D. Bulkeley, Commander of the Naval Base from Dec. 1963 - June 1966. Bulkeley cut the water pipe that connected the base to Cuba in 1964 after Castro falsely claimed the base was stealing water.

Sharpe said the Cubans began calling Bulkeley "the water maker" when he ordered a water desalination plant and the base eventually began producing its own.

"I saw him in Bethesda hospital before he died," Sharpe said.

Bulkeley passed away in April 1996.

In 1972, Sharpe was recognized by then Secretary of the Navy John W. Warner with a signed honorary chief certificate.

During the late 60's to early 70's, Jan Chilson, Naval Station GTMO's Emergency Manager, witnessed many of the events occurring in Sharpe's life.

Chilson was a 12-year-old child living at the Naval Station when he first met Sharpe.

"When he was a little boy, his father and I got along real good," Sharpe said. "Mr. Chilson was a nice person."

Chilson's father worked as the CPO club manager.

"Harry was always a friendly individual," Chilson said. "I remember cookouts at his house and his stories and experiences in Cuba."

Today, Chilson still enjoys listening to the stories Sharpe tells.

"My dad is no longer with us," Chilson said. "I deeply appreciate the good working memories that Harry shares with me concerning my dad."

Sharpe still waits for the day that he will be able to once again call the Cuba outside the base - home.

"I would like to see better relations between Cuba and America," Sharpe said. "I think it will happen. I might not see it probably, but I think it will eventually happen."

Sharpe said that if it should happen in his lifetime, he may go back to Cuba to live.

"If things get good again, I would go back, but not right away, I would wait a few years," he said. "It takes awhile to build up again like before, because now things are real bad over there."

The Post-9/11 G.I. Bill is a new education benefit program for individuals who served on active duty on or after Sept. 11, 2001.

### WHEN CAN I RECEIVE BENEFITS UNDER THE POST-9/11 GI BILL?

Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits are payable for education pursued on or after Aug. 1, 2009.

### ELIGIBILITY

Any servicemember who served 90 aggregate days on active duty after Sept. 10, 2001 and is still on active duty or was honorably-discharged from the active duty; or -released from active duty and placed on the retired list or temporary disability retired list; or -released from active duty and transferred to the Fleet Reserve or Fleet Marine Corps Reserve; or -released from the active duty for further service in a reserve component of the Armed Forces.

You may also be eligible if you were honorably discharged from active duty for a service-connected disability and you served 30 continuous days after Sept. 10, 2001.

### IF I AM ELIGIBLE FOR THE MONTGOMERY GI BILL, MONTGOMERY GI BILL-SELECTED RESERVE, OR THE RESERVE EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, AM I ELIGIBLE FOR POST-9/11 GI BILL?

If, on Aug. 1, 2009, you are eligible for one of these programs and you qualify for the Post-9/11 GI Bill, you may make an irrevocable election to receive benefits under the Post-9/11 GI Bill. Note: *Once you elect to receive benefits under the Post-9/11 GI Bill, you will no longer be eligible to receive benefits under the program from which you elected the Post-9/11 GI Bill.*

### HOW MUCH WILL I RECEIVE?

Based on your length of active duty service, you are entitled to a percentage of the following:

- Cost of tuition and fees, not to exceed the most expensive in-state undergraduate tuition at a public institution of higher education (paid to school);
- Monthly housing allowance\* equal to the basic allowance for housing payable to a military E-5 with dependents, in the same zip code as your school (paid to you);
- Yearly books and supplies stipend of up to \$1000 per year (paid to you); and
- A one-time payment of \$500 paid to certain individuals relocating from

highly rural areas.

\*Note: *The housing allowance and books and supplies stipend are not payable to individuals on active duty. The housing allowance is not payable to those pursuing training at half time or less or to individuals enrolled in distance learning.*

### HOW MANY MONTHS OF ASSISTANCE CAN I RECEIVE?

Generally, you may receive up to 36 months of entitlement under the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill.

### HOW LONG AM I ELIGIBLE?

You will be eligible for benefits for 15 years from your last period of active duty of at least 90 consecutive days. If you were released for a service-connected disability after at least 30 days of continuous service, you will also be eligible for benefits for 15 years.

Example: Tuition and fees for full time enrollment: \$6700. Highest in-state tuition and fees: \$7000.

**SCENARIO 1:** If you separated following three years on active duty and are going to school full-time, you would receive \$6700 for tuition and fees, \$1000 for books and supplies, and the monthly housing allowance.

**SCENARIO 2:** If you have an aggregate of 12 months of active duty in the guard or reserves and are going to school full-time, you would receive \$4020 (60% of \$6700) for tuition and fees, \$600 (60% of \$1000) for books and supplies, and 60% of the monthly housing allowance.

### WHAT DOES THE POST-9/11 GI BILL COVER?

You may receive benefits for any approved program offered by a school in the United States that is authorized to grant an associate (or higher) degree. You may also receive benefits for tutorial assistance or up to \$2,000 for the reimbursement of one licensing or certification test.

### CAN I TRANSFER MY ENTITLEMENT TO MY DEPENDENTS?

If you are a member of the Armed Forces on Aug. 1, 2009, the Department of Defense (DoD) may offer you the opportunity to transfer benefits to your spouse or dependent children. DoD and the military services will issue policy on entitlement to transferability in the coming months.
