No Sulphur Needed

AFTER 22 years of research, British chemists have solved the problem of making synthetic fertilisers without sulphuric acid. The development comes at a time of grave sulphur shortage, and a consequent scarcity of sulphuric acid, much used at present in producing fertilisers.

The new fertiliser is a nitro-phosphate, produced by treating phosphate rock with nitric acid. Now Imperial Chemical Industries are building a pilot plant for this process at Billingham. Many chemists say it will not be long before superphosphate fertilisers (made by treating phosphate rock with sulphuric acid) are ousted altogether.

No one man claims credit for the new fertiliser; it is the product of team-work. The team could not have timed their triumph more happily.

Do not tell a child to go to sleep. That is the surest way of keeping him awake.

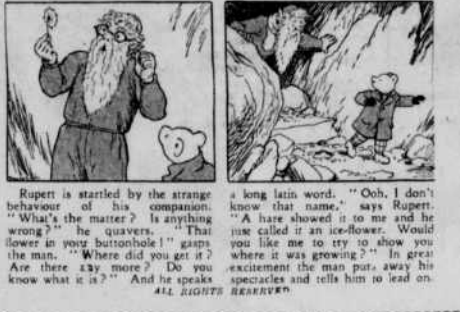
