

Okaloosa County tax levy set to rise 6%

The Okaloosa County Commission is scheduled to hold a public hearing next week before setting its final property-tax rates for next year.



In Crestview, unanimously gave preliminary approval to a countywide millage rate of 3.8308, unchanged from this year's rate.

The panel also endorsed a special-district millage rate of 0.2990, also unchanged. This rate is charged only to


owners in unincorporated areas of the county.

Although the proposed millage rates would be unchanged, they would result in higher tax bills for many, if not most owners. The rates would result in an overall increase in property-tax collections of more than 6 percent, due to generally rising taxable values of existing real estate and to new construction.

Niceville increases sewer rates

Tax levy hike eyed

The Niceville City Council tentatively approved a budget of \$33,001,180 for the fiscal year that will begin Oct. 1.

Final approval of the measure, voted Sept. 6, requires two more public hearings, scheduled for 6 p.m. Sept. 18 and 20 at Niceville City Hall.

The council also approved increases in sewer rates and garbage fees.

The budget approved Sept. 6 includes \$15,661,700 for the city's general fund, \$92,850 for Niceville's Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), \$3,183,590 for sanitation, \$9,174,500 for water and sewer, and \$4,888,540 for storm water management.

Also given tentative approval at the meeting was a property tax rate of 3.7 mills, the same as for the current fiscal year.

A millage rate of 3.7 means that Niceville property owners will pay \$3.70 in city property tax for each \$1,000 of appraised, taxable value of their property, after homestead exemptions and other discounts. For example, the owner of a home with a taxable value of \$175,000 would owe the city of Niceville \$647.50 in property tax, in addition to any other property taxes owed to such other taxing entities as Okaloosa County or the county school district.

While the millage rate remains the same from this fiscal year to the next, the amount of tax revenue expected from it will increase due to new construction within the city during the past year, as well as general appreciation in value of homes,

Fire board votes to hike tax levy

Millage rate to remain unchanged

East Niceville Fire District held the first of two public hearings on its proposed budget and tax rate for next year.



tax rate the same as the past two years at 3.0176 mills, which would result in a 6.7 percent increase in the total tax levy because of increasing property values and construction in the East Niceville Fire District.

Three members of the five-member board were present: Chairman Ed Dunbar, Treasurer C. J. McEntire, and Commissioner Tony Evans.

The proposed budget marks an increase of just over \$150,000

from that of the current year. The estimated carryover from this year's budget is \$295,000.

The budget covers necessities such as payroll, utilities, training, and goods and services.

The tax rate, also called the millage rate, refers to the amount levied per \$1,000 of taxable property value. For instance, at the proposed rate, a property valued at \$200,000 after exemptions would end up paying \$603.52. This figure does not make up the entirety of a

given owner's property taxes. Owners are also subject to other taxes with various millage rates outside of the fire district, such as county and school levies.

Other business was discussed during the fire commission meeting, including the need to attain new air bottles for firefighters and the recent replacement of fire truck tires, as well as future raises for firefighters.

The budget and tax rate require final approval before they can be put into effect. Another public hearing is scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 20, at 6 p.m.

Other sources of revenue will include the city's portion of motor-fuels taxes and usage fees on such utilities as electricity, water, sewer, and gas, business taxes, fees and permits, and intergovernmental revenue such as state and federal transfers of tax money to the city.

In Niceville, a discount on property taxes applies to certain senior citizens. According to a city ordinance, Niceville allows "an additional homestead exemption of up to \$50,000 for any person who has the legal or equitable title to real estate and maintains thereon the permanent residence of the owner, who has attained age 65, and whose household income does not exceed the current adjusted income limitation of \$29,454 for 2018."

According to City Clerk Dan Doucet, "As of today, there are 88 Niceville residents who applied for Senior's Exemption. The additional Senior exemption could potentially save a

property owner up to \$185. Thus, it was a good decision by the city council to approve this provision for our lower income seniors."

In addition to the budget and millage rate, city council members also approved an increase in the city's commercial and residential sanitation tipping fees of 29 cents a month, or 2.16 percent. This increase parallels an increase of the same percentage for Okaloosa County landfill charges.

Council members also approved a 2 percent increase in sewage-disposal rates charged to Niceville customers, but did not increase rates for potable water consumption. This is the first time in 11 years that water rates have not increased, while sewer rates have risen each year.

Glenn Stephens, an engineer employed to advise the city council on such things as water and sewer rates, told council members that the sewage rate increase is necessary in order to keep the city's revenue above its expected payments on bond debts used to finance various improvement projects in the city's water and sewer system. Despite the increase, he said, Niceville's rates for water and sewer compare favorably with those of most other communities in Northwest Florida.

Council members also heard a briefing from Bill Fray, a financial consultant, who told them that the city has "a good position with respect to debt" and that the city has not issued any new debt during the past year.

"The city's outstanding debt is minimal," Fray said, "is being retired on schedule and presents certain favorable circumstances. This may result in improvement of the already strong credit structure of the city."

Police Blotter

Arrests



fund government services and operations, while the special district tax, levied only in unincorporated areas, funds county parks and recreation.

The millage rate sets the amount of tax owed Okaloosa County government by property owners for each \$1,000 of appraised, taxable value of their property, after homestead exemptions and other discounts.

For example, the owner of a home within a city, appraised at \$175,000 taxable value, would pay \$670.39 in annual county property tax, in addition to other taxes owed to such other government entities as cities and the Okaloosa County School District.

An owner in an unincorporated area of Okaloosa County, such as Bluewater Bay or Seminole, whose property has a taxable value of \$175,000, would pay \$722.72.

Residents of unincorporated areas may also owe property taxes to the school district, the East Niceville or North Bay fire districts, and such other taxing authorities as Bluewater Bay's Municipal Services Benefit Unit.

The final tax hearing is set for Tuesday, Sept. 18, at 6 p.m., at the county administration building in Shalimar.

Countywide property tax revenue budgeted for the current fiscal year, which ends Sept. 30, was \$60,648,365, but is expected to be \$64,496,382 next year. Revenue budgeted for the parks district for FY 2017-18 is \$2,226,078, and is expected to grow to \$2,360,877 in FY 2018-19.

Next year's county wide "rolled-back" millage (the hypothetical rate that would have resulted in the same revenue as this year) would be 3.7052, not counting the parks tax.

Property tax revenue accounts for only a portion of the total county budget of \$387 million, up 2 percent, with other funding sources including state and federal assistance, assorted fines and fees, and customer service fees charged for such "enterprise fund" services as the county water and sewer system.

Appreciating a great place to live

Small-town charm draws families and retirees alike

The “Twin Cities” of Niceville and Valparaiso live up to their names. It really is nice in Niceville, and Valparaiso, which means “Vale of Paradise,” offers a quality of life as close to paradise as one is likely to find this side of the real thing.

Once the area was known as “Boggy” due to the proximity of Boggy Bayou, an inlet that leads to Choctawhatchee Bay and thence to the Gulf of Mexico. The bayou, however, is not the weedy swamp the name implies. It is a pleasant and popular place for swimming, sailing and fishing.

Along the shores of Boggy Bayou, as well as creek-fed Rocky Bayou and the north shore of Choctawhatchee Bay, nestle Niceville, Valparaiso, and the communities of Bluewater Bay, Seminole and Choctaw Beach. The area attracts people seeking a warm climate, friendly communities, and plenty of activities ranging from hunting, fishing and water sports to art galleries,

concerts and stage plays.

The pleasant climate is a top attraction for new residents as well as vacationers. There is no hard winter, by northern standards. Spring begins soon after the camellias blossom in January. A hot, humid summer starts around mid-June. A colorful, leisurely autumn extends from early October through Christmas.

Outdoor activities abound, with such sports as tennis and golf played year-round. You can drive over the Mid-Bay Bridge to the busy night life of Destin, Fort Walton Beach, and the sugar-white beaches of the Gulf of Mexico. Or you may take the children to calmer waters at beaches in Valparaiso’s Lincoln Park and the military recreation area at White Point, which extends into the bay. In Niceville, you can visit the cool swimming holes of Turkey Creek Park, or explore the park’s mile long boardwalk through the swamp and jungle-like forest of the “true Florida.”

People are also attracted by the friendly, welcoming atmosphere of local communities, where people feel safe walking, jogging, riding bicycles or pushing baby strollers at any hour.

Residents cite the sense of community, the good schools, low crime rate and the variety of outdoor activities. It’s the perfect place to raise a young family.

Economic opportunities abound. Although the area was once a center of fishing, turpentine harvesting, and agriculture, the economic base nowadays is Eglin Air Force Base, one of America’s largest military installations and a focus of research, development and testing of advanced bombs and missiles.

The 720-square-mile military installation is also home to such elite military training and operational units as the 33rd Fighter Wing, which schools pilots and maintainers for the new F-35 Joint Strike Fighter, the Navy Explosive Ordnance Disposal School, the Army Ranger School, and the Army 7th Special Forces Group.

The base attracts many of the nation’s top defense contractors, engaged in advanced weapons research and development programs. In recent years, business and government leaders have been seeking to attract other high-technology industries to the area, in such fields as aerospace, pharmaceuticals, and medical technology—industries that are attracted by the abundance of technically-trained people, as well as by the high quality of life along the north Florida coast.

For many residents, a military career is what initially brought them to the area, but the friendly people and safe community are what kept them. Numerous retired members of the U.S. armed forces have returned to enjoy their golden years.



The bay, bayous, creeks and ponds that embrace Niceville, Valparaiso and Bluewater Bay are the area's most distinctive and inviting features.

Transportation options include the Destin-Fort Walton Beach Airport, five minutes from Valparaiso, served by four airlines flying to and from such air hubs as Atlanta, Dallas, Houston and Charlotte. Traffic arteries include local highways connecting to Interstate 10, some 20 minutes to the north.

Commercial and charter fishing also remain important parts of the local economy, and help to attract tourists and vacationers to the area.

Local history can be studied at the Heritage Museum of Northwest Florida in Valparaiso, the Air Force Armament Museum, and other facilities. Archeological sites can be found in the area, including the remains of early settlers’ cabins and sawmills, and the earthen ceremonial mounds of American Indians.

But it is the here and now that makes the area such a great community with something to do for all ages.

Education is an important part of the community. Local schools from elementary through middle and high school are consistently ranked among the best in Florida.

Advanced middle-school students can attend the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Medical (STEMM) Center in Valparaiso, and other schools offer special programs in fields ranging from auto mechanics to computer technology and aeronautics.

In addition to public education, private schools are also available, such as Rocky Bayou Christian School, Niceville, which teaches students from early grades through high school and is top-rated academically.

For higher education, there is Northwest Florida State College, which offers two- and four-year degrees in such varied fields as nursing, education, medical technology, law enforcement, and business management. The Niceville-based institution also serves as a launching pad for stu-

dents who prefer to complete their first two years of college close to home, then transfer to one of Florida’s big public universities.

Niceville’s Twin Cities Hospital has a state-of-the-art emergency room and 65 beds for in-patient care. It is top-ranked for patient satisfaction. Other nearby medical facilities include the Eglin Air Force Base Regional Medical Center, Fort Walton Beach Medical Center, North Okaloosa Medical Center in Crestview, and Sacred Heart Hospital near Destin. There are also numerous outpatient clinics, and several local assisted-living facilities, nursing homes, and a memory-care facility for people with Alzheimer’s.

The state college campus in Niceville is also home to the Mattie Kelly Fine and Performing Arts Center, where symphony concerts and touring Broadway-caliber shows routinely entertain local audiences. The school also offers one of the state’s best education programs in art, music, and drama.

Getting a car tag or a driver's license

Vehicle registration

All motor vehicles in Florida must be registered and/or titled within 30 days of becoming employed, placing children in public school, or establishing residency in Florida. Trailers 2,000 pounds or more must be registered and titled; trailers under 2,000 pounds need only to be registered. Trailers less than 2,000 pounds will need a bill of sale and certificate of origin for a new purchase. If not a new purchase, a bill of sale along with the most recent registration is required. Sales tax may be applicable. In most cases a certified weight slip is required.

The county tax collector, as an agent for the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, processes registrations and titles and collects the necessary fees.

To obtain a Florida vehicle title and registration, motorists must bring the current original vehicle title, proof of Florida insurance, all owners must be present (or provide an original power of attorney) the vehicle itself (if from out of state) and current state identification to any office of the county tax collector.

Proof of current insurance from a certified Florida agent or broker (binder, policy or card) is required to purchase and renew a license plate in Florida. The vehicle owner must present at a county tax collector's office documentation of Personal Injury Protection (PIP) in the amount of at least

\$10,000 and Property Damage Liability (PDL) insurance in the amount of \$10,000. Motorcycles, mobile homes, vessels and trailers are exempt from Florida insurance requirement.

To transfer a Florida vehicle title, the seller must complete the transfer information on the current title, includ-

ing purchaser's name, the selling price and the odometer reading at the time of the sale. A bill of sale may be submitted as proof of purchase price. Sales tax will be collected if applicable. All transfers must be completed within 30 days of the date the vehicle is assigned by the seller or a late fee is levied at the time of transfer.

Active duty members of the U.S. armed forces, who are stationed in Florida, but maintain their legal residence outside of Florida, are classified as nonresident military and are eligible for reduced registration fees.

To qualify for the lower military nonresident rates, the owner must submit out of state registration in the military member's name, a copy of current military orders, and

provide their driver license or state ID. Proof of Florida insurance is mandatory. Vehicle must be present.

Military personnel who apply for non-resident status on a vehicle will not be eligible to file for homestead exemption in Florida. Call the property appraiser's office, 651-7240, for additional information.

Driver's license

A Florida motor vehicle operator's license is required within 30 days after becoming a permanent resident of the state (i.e., children enrolled in school system, employment established, etc.). Those with a valid license from another state may get a Class E non-commercial Florida license by passing a visual exam and paying an original license fee. No written or driving test is required. The Florida license is valid for six to eight years for immigrants and U.S. citizens and up to four years for non-immigrants.

Documents required, but not limited to, are a current U.S. passport or an original U.S. birth certificate (complete chain of original legal name change documents or certified copies may be required), an out-of-state driver's license and Social Security card. In addition, two proofs of residential address are required. Examples include: a piece of mail with your address, a mortgage statement or a rental lease agreement. Utility bills will also be accepted. Call 651-7300 or visit www.GatherGoGet.com to find out the necessary documents needed.

name or address and learner's tests. Limited driver license services are offered in Niceville, Crestview, Shalimar, Destin, and by appointment at Eglin AFB and Hurlburt Field.

The Okaloosa County Tax Collector's office also offers the issuance of birth certificates for those born in Florida at all locations.

Concealed-weapons carry permit applications are processed in the Crestview and Niceville tax offices, by appointment.

Contact the Okaloosa County Tax Collector's office for a more detailed list of services offered, (850) 651-7300.

Auto insurance

Florida law requires that all automobile operators have no-fault insurance, also known as personal injury protection. Under the no-fault law, a motorist's insurance company pays for treatment of any personal injuries received as a result of an auto accident, no matter who is at fault, up to \$10,000. You must show proof of this insurance, along with property damage liability in the amount of \$10,000, to obtain automobile tags.

Boat registration

When purchasing a boat, Florida residents have 30 days to get their vessel titled and registered. Active duty non-residents

are exempt from changing their out of state vessel registration to Florida, unless the registration expires. Register at any branch of the Okaloosa County Tax Collector's office. For more information, call 651-7300.

Voter registration

Register to vote at either of the Supervisor of Elections offices located at 302 Wilson St. N, Suite 102, Crestview, or 1250 Eglin Pkwy, Ste 103 Shalimar, weekdays, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Call the Crestview office, 689-5600, or the Shalimar office, 651-7272, for additional information.

Forms may also be obtained at and submitted to Niceville Public Library, 206 N. Partin Drive, and at the Valparaiso Community Library, 459 Valparaiso Parkway.

Registration forms can also be completed and printed off the Okaloosa County Supervisor of Elections website, govote-okaloosa.com.

Eligibility to register is defined on the form, and no witnessing or administration of an oath is required. Voters must be registered at least 29 days before an election to cast a ballot.
