## Bauder, businesses surprise student battling cancer

SEMINOLE – Third-grader Joshua Steijger has always loved playing on the swings.

Trips to Largo's Central Park playground rank high among the 10-year-old's favorite pastimes. Some days it even rivals his love of wrestling and WWE star John Cena.

But the trips to the park have stopped since Joshua began chemotherapy in December. In November, doctors discovered a tumor on an optical nerve. They began treatment within weeks, before the holidays were even over, in hopes of shrinking the mass and saving his vision.

Though the rocking sensation of the swings soothes him when he isn't feeling well, the drive to

the park, and crowds of children can be overwhelming for him, said his grandmother and legal guardian Maria Vanderham.

So last month a team of volunteers from Bauder Elementary School, where Joshua goes to school, reached out to local businesses for donations to build him his own backyard play set with swings, monkey bars, a slide and a sandbox.

"It's hard when he's on the playground and doesn't feel well," Vanderham said. "But the swinging calms him. Now he can go right out the back door. If it's hot out when he's playing and he feels sick, he can just run inside."

## SPC forum takes on transit

SEMINOLE – On Nov. 4, registered voters throughout Pinellas will go to the polls to decide on a change in funding for local transportation.

Supporters say the additional funding from a 1 percent sales tax compared to the amount available through ad valorem taxes is necessary to improve transportation to provide sustainable economic growth into the future. Opponents say the current funding method would be sufficient with better use of the money.

On April 3, the Institute for Strategic Policy Solutions at St. Petersburg College, based on the Seminole campus, hosted a two-hour public forum – Dealing with Gridlock: Is There a Light Rail in Pinellas County's Future? Representatives from both sides were invited to present their case.

SPC Seminole Provost James Olliver moderated the event inside the college's Digitarium. Don

Ewing, co-chair of Yes for Greenlight, provided information in support of the Greenlight Pinellas initiative. Barbara Haselden, campaign manager and spokesperson for No Tax for Tracks, presented information for the opposition.

SPC plans to use the forum process to cover all the referendums on the November ballot to provide the public an objective and nonpartisan view, Olliver said. A test of the forum's ability to help the public make up its mind was used for the first time ever that Thursday night when instant polling via cellphone texting was introduced to the audience.

"This is probably the first time you've been in an auditorium and you have been told to keep the cell phone on," said David Klement, executive director of the Institute for Strategic Policy Solutions.

## LaSala fired

### County Commission terminates administrator's contract

CLEARWATER – The first clue that something was awry came from media reports about less-than-satisfactory results of an annual performance review.

Then Commission Chair Karen Seel removed the review of the Pinellas County's administrator from the April 15 meeting agenda and later replaced it.

The first item of business at that meeting was unanimous approval of Bob LaSala's termination. Commissioner Norm Roche was not present for the vote.

Seel began by asking if a commissioner would make a motion to terminate LaSala's contract without cause. She said the contract called for a 90-day notice provision. She said during those 90 days, LaSala would report to her or her designee for assigned duties.

Commissioner Ken Welch made the motion. Commissioner Janet Long seconded it.

Welch thanked LaSala for his service.

"But I think this is an appropriate step forward," he said.

"It is with mixed emotions I leave my position as Pinellas County Administrator," LaSala said after the vote. "Please know that it has been an honor to serve this community."

He thanked the commission for "recognition of my financial management acumen, and I am particularly gratified that I leave Pinellas County in far better economic condition than when I arrived," he said.

"As you know, I am not one to shy away from our biggest, most important community issues," he continued. "And while I believe we have made progress on the very tough issues related to emergency medical services and health and community services, I recognize that those incremental accomplishments have not been without controversy."

"That said, they are incredibly important matters to our community, and I wish you all the success in resolving them and moving forward positively as I hand the baton to your next leader. Of course, I will always be available to help you in any way I can."

### Hired during a time of controversy

Perhaps the most-respected administrator in the county's recent history passed the baton to LaSala in 2008. Fred Marquis served Pinellas County as its administrator from 1979 to 2000. He returned in an interim capacity in 2007 after former administrator Steve Spratt resigned in the aftermath of a grand jury investigation of a land deal between former property appraiser Jim Smith and the county.

Marquis strongly endorsed LaSala for the job, in part due to his prior experience. LaSala worked as the county's chief assistant administrator and assistant administrator from 1979 to 1989.

He returned to Pinellas from California, where he managed cities for 10 years. He now has served counties and cities for more than 40 years, including more than 23 years in Florida. His governmental career started in New York and New Jersey.

During a meeting on Sept. 9, 2008, when the commission approved his initial contract, he vowed to provide a "proactive commitment to professional management."

"Being a good leader means you have to have followers," LaSala said.

At the time, Seel asked him to describe what he thought were some of the county's opportunities for improvement.

"I believe you don't have to be sick to get better," LaSala said.

He said while Pinellas was "pretty healthy," that condition "would be tested in the coming months in terms of resources." He said some of the continuing challenges would be setting priorities for services and the ability to respond to changes.

"My job for the next few months will be to do a lot of listening," he said.

After only two months on the job, LaSala told members of the Rotary Club of Seminole Lake that the county would be faced with major decisions about its EMS system and budget. He was right.

In the end, one of those issues garnered him praise, the second, the EMS controversy, may have helped cost him his job.

### Falling review scores

In 2012, LaSala received a composite score of almost 81 percent on his annual review. His high score was for preparation and administering of the budget, 3.64 out of 4. His next highest grades were for integrity, getting 3.5 for his overall integrity and 3.57 for his personal integrity. His low score was 2.71 for facilitative leadership and facilitating county board effectiveness.

In 2013, his composite score was down to 74 percent, representing the highs and lows in seven categories. His high score was for organization, planning and management with an average rating of 3.29 out of 3.5. He scored 3.25 for strategic leadership, 3.17 for integrity, 3.02 for service delivery management, 2.83 for responsiveness, 2.70 for communication. His lowest score, 2.52, was for policy facilitation.

Waked, born in Panama, relo-



office clerk, and Cheron Panakhyo, Joshua's teacher, organized the project. Capitani served as the community liaison for the project and reached out to area businesses for assistance.

Seminole Home Depot donated most of the building materials; West Coast Fence Corporation and PlayNation of Tampa provided additional swing parts. Home Depot also sent over a team of volunteers to help build the playset, and lunch was donated by Mike's Pizza of Largo.

The swingset was a complete surprise for Joshua, who arrived home just as finishing touches were being made to the structure.

"His reaction was priceless," Capitani said. "The glowing smile, large eyes ... and the outburst of such joy when he asked, 'Is that for me?' Joshua was in such awe ... What joy to be able to help make the life of a child with such unfortunate circumstances more enjoyable."

Life hasn't been easy for Joshua or his siblings, said Vanderham. Their parents aren't in the picture. So in addition to caring for Joshua since November, she has also adopted his younger brother, Jordan Steijger, 4. Their sisters, 9-year-old twins, live with their maternal grandmother.

But Joshua's had it the worst, Vanderham said. "The child has been through heck ever since he was

born."

He's hopped from home to home for years – between Vanderham's house, his parents' and foster care, where he was sometimes mistreated because of his developmental disabilities.

He also has neurofibromatosis type I, a lifelong tumor disorder caused by a genetic mutation. It causes tumors to grow throughout the body, she said, and also can result in learning disabilities and vision disorders. The tumors are only worrisome if they affect the nervous system, she said, like this most recent mass growing on an optical nerve.

Joshua has already lost sight in his right eye. She's hoping the chemo will be able to save his vision in his left one. An MRI after the first round of treatments – he has a year-and-a-half of chemotherapy sessions ahead of him – shows the tumor has shrunk a bit, she said.

She's grateful to Bauder for all of its support throughout his treatment.

"The school has done a lot for him," she said, "or for us, I should say."

Vanderham also plans to sign Joshua up for the Children's Dream Fund.

"It might be nice to take him to Disney," she said. "We went to the zoo recently and they had rides there, and that was all he wanted to do."

She added, "I just want to do something nice for him. I feel awful. These children haven't had anything. Nothing. No company. No parents. Nothing. It's awful."



Klement said the instant poll, used as a "straw poll," should provide an indication of what participants think about an issue before and after the presentations.

Before the presentations, 24 people indicated support for Greenlight Pinellas, 11 were against and five were undecided. After, 30 people were in favor, 21 against and only two undecided.

### In support of Greenlight

Each speaker was given 15 minutes to make his or her case. Ewing went first. He took the audience back to the mid-1960s when Disney began its plans to build the City of Tomorrow in Orlando. The goal was to create a pedestrian-friendly and car-free environment.

He said while Greenlight Pinellas wasn't intended to turn the county into a Disneyworld, the plan did include the idea of providing walkable communities with improved transit and reduced use of vehicles. Projections show, without change, Pinellas' future is one of more congestion on local roads and longer commute times. Ewing said continual widening of existing roads is getting more difficult due to lack of space and safety concerns.

"That can't be our only approach," he said.

He advocates Greenlight Pinellas with plans for improved bus service and a future light rail system, running for Clearwater to St. Petersburg with the potential for a connection to Tampa and points beyond to provide regional connectivity.

Supporters of Greenlight say it is more than just light rail. They say that better transportation system will create jobs and encourage economic development, enhance quality of life, as well as support the environment.

Adding nighttime hours to the bus schedule will allow workers on the late shift to use public transit to get home – something they can't do now. Students taking classes at SPC's different campuses will find it easier to use the bus system with decreased wait times of 15 minutes at stops. Tourists will be able to get from the airport to the beach using public transportation.

He encouraged the public to visit [pinellasontack.com](http://pinellasontack.com) for complete information.

"It's a real life look at what enhanced bus service and rail can do," he said.

Ewing said the plan – "40 years in the making" – was well vetted and had been analyzed by two third party experts – Ernst and Young, financial auditors, and HTNB, a national engineering and transportation consulting firm.

He explained the different routes that make up a variety of proposed enhanced bus services, running throughout the county. Light rail doesn't appear for 10 years, he said; however, the route is already mapped out. The majority of rail lines are on public land, meaning fewer problems with right of way.

Once the Greenlight Pinellas plan is complete, 80 percent of the population will live within 1/4 mile of a bus rapid transit station and 86 percent will work within 1/4 mile of a station, he said.

Greenlight Pinellas plan relies on an increased level of funding that would come from a 1 percent sales tax as opposed to collection of ad valorem taxes. Ewing said for some, taxes would go down. For example, a taxpayer of an owner-occupied home with a median value of \$161,600 would pay \$81.52 less with a sales tax, per estimates from IRS studies.

He pointed out that the sales tax would not be levied on groceries or medical items and would be limited to the first \$5,000 of any purchase. He said a person could buy a car for \$20,000 and not pay more than \$50 in transit tax. He added that tourists were expected to pay about 1/3 of the tax money generated.

He said if the tax were approved, an oversight committee of citizens would monitor how the money is spent, as would County Commissioners. He said Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority – the receiver of the proposed transit tax money – was fiscally responsible, receiving consistently clean audits of its finances.

He urged the public to vote yes for Greenlight.

### Against Greenlight

Haselden then presented the case against Greenlight. She pointed out that it cost a family of four about \$100 a day to go to Disney. She said if they stayed at a hotel there, ate at the restaurants and paid other expenses, the cost would be \$4,500 to \$5,000 – an amount not affordable for everyone.

"Disney was an entrepreneur and a private business," she said.

She told the audience that public transportation was stagnant. She showed a chart that showed 50 percent of the U.S. used public transportation post World War II. Since then, the number has dropped to 2 percent. According to the 2010 U.S. Census, about 1.6 percent use public transportation in Pinellas. Her source was Heritage Foundation: Public Transit: A Bad Product at a Bad Price.

She showed a photo of a new PSTA bus that she said cost \$650,000. Currently there are 200 in the PSTA fleet, she said, with plans for more. She argued that PSTA doesn't pay for itself, and said about 75 percent of its operations were subsidized.

About 22 percent of PSTA's \$63 million operating budget comes from federal or state grants, another 22 percent from passenger fares and about 53 percent from ad valorem taxes. The capital budget includes another \$28 million. Haselden said her numbers come from PSTA.

She said it costs about \$7 a ride with riders paying an average of 91 cents, meaning in total PSTA is subsidized by 87 percent. She showed a chart of the county's property values and pointed to the decrease after 2007 when the recession hit.

She said the amount of money PSTA collected dropped from \$38 million to \$26 million due to the decline in property values. She said a check of past years' budgets shows the agency spending money in

2002 and continuing to spend until 2007 when it began to slow down. Budget cuts followed including staff layoffs. Then, the agency raised its millage rate, and spending increased again, including hiring of staff, Haselden said.

"They outspend their income," she said.

She talked about a statement made by PSTA CEO Brad Miller, who said if no new sustainable funding source is found, PSTA would have to cut 30 percent in 2016.

"PSTA is at a crossroads," she said.

She talked about the negative aspects of light rail, including the difference between high-speed and light rail, which causes congestion at intersections.

She is opposed to increasing the sales tax from 7 percent to 8 percent. PSTA currently receives \$32 million from ad valorem taxes and would receive \$148 million from a 1 percent sales tax, she said.

She objects to Greenlight supporters calling it a tax swap. She said unless it was revenue neutral it was no swap. She said if an additional 1 percent sales tax was approved, Pinellas would have the highest in the state, which cannot be good for business.

She said with more potential revenue, PSTA could increase its credit limit and debt to the taxpayer. She talked about "false premises" and claims by Greenlight that there would be more than 200,000 new people in Pinellas by 2040.

"That's not true," she said. "The population is not growing."

She disputed claims of record ridership being touted almost every month by PSTA. She said the numbers are inflated by how they count rides. She gave an example of a single trip with multiple bus transfers. She said each time a passenger boards a bus, it is counted as a ride, so a single person taking the bus to the mall could be counted as six rides.

"The (ridership) numbers haven't changed in eight years," she said.

She talked about empty buses and buses running with only two to three people. She said PSTA paid \$700,000 for a study that showed the top five routes were so busy they were almost dangerous and other routes not performing.

She said the entire Greenlight Plan was "just a promise."

"There is no guarantee in writing," she said.

She said people don't want to give up roadway lanes to dedicated use by light rail or buses. She showed a chart of costs and fares for several metro areas using light rail, pointing out that none of them came close to breaking even.

"In Pinellas, there's just no need," she said.

U.S. 19 is almost finished. I-275 corridor is going to connect to U.S. 19. The roadway will have no stoplights, she said.

Haselden believes public transportation should be bid out to the private sector if PSTA can't "provide safe reliable service to 1.6 percent of our neighbors, for those who want a ride that doesn't take all day to get to their destination."

She pointed out that PSTA would continue to receive grant money and fare money on top of the projected increase from the sales tax – a considerable increase in overall funding.

### Questions and answers

The presenters also fielded questions from the audience. One led to a lengthy discussion on population density.

"The biggest problem is that we don't have the density needed (for rail)," Haselden said. "You go from a low density area to another low density area."

She compared Pinellas County's population to that of New York City, which has enough people to support enhanced systems. She also said light rail wasn't needed to stimulate the economy, she said it could be done using Bus Rapid Transit.

Ewing disputed the statement that the proposed light rail route connects two low-density areas, stating that Pinellas County has the highest density of any county in the state. He said the rail line would travel between the county's two most dense areas, traveling through Pinellas Park and Largo on its way.

"Over time, this will force people to live around rail lines and in high rises increasing density ... narrowing our territory," Haselden said. "We're used to a large territory."

Another question led to a discussion on economic development. Ewing said the 16 rail stations would be located away from current developed areas onto land not currently developed, which would be good for the local economy. Haselden said the Federal Transit Administration described development around rail lines as redistributed growth, not new growth. She gave the example of the effect malls had on downtown areas in the recent past.

"This will drive people to shop near rail lines," she said.

One man, who identified himself as a veteran, asked if the steel for the tracks, trains and other components would come from America or overseas. Brad Miller, PSTA CEO, said federal law requires it all to be made in America.

Ewing answered another's concern by saying Greenlight Pinellas would provide options and alternatives.

"Some would use (public transportation) every day and some on occasion," he said.

He gave an example of a trip to the airport, thus saving money on parking.

"It's about getting people off the roads to not have to expand the roads," he said. "We can only expand the roads a certain amount. We're running out of land. We need to educate people that they can do something else."

Haselden said it was more important to work on the roads.

"Ninety-eight percent of us use the roads," she said.

# Mayors update county on Gulf Boulevard projects

CLEARWATER – Clearwater Mayor George Cretekos and Redington Beach Mayor Nick Simons presented Pinellas County Commissioners with an overview of what's going on with the Gulf Boulevard beautification project April 15.

The county signed an inter-local agreement with the Barrier Islands Government Council on July 10, 2012 for Penny for Pinellas funding to pay for undergrounding of utilities, streetscape enhancements and pedestrian safety improvements.

Plans called for creating a uniform corridor for all 11 beach communities through common amenities and streetscaping. The project focuses on elimination of "visual blight" caused by overhead utilities, development of an "attractive roadway experience" to encourage tourism and economic development, and pedestrian safety improvements.

"Unfortunately, it has taken an awful long time," Cretekos said. "We started talking about this in 2000 – 14 years ago."

In 2007, officials found that initial plans approved in 2001 were not feasible, he said. They weren't economically possible, so they had to be changed. The project also was delayed due to the economic downturn that resulted in less money coming in to the Penny for Pinellas fund.

Finally, in 2012, all parties agreed to a new funding formula that split \$35 million between the municipalities over

time. The money would be doled out at \$3.5 million a year during fiscal years 2013 to 2016. Additional money would be allocated at a rate of \$7 million a year during fiscal years 2017 to 2019. Shares would be determined by how much area each city has of Gulf Boulevard frontage.

The BIG-C was given the responsibility for determining if a project is eligible for funding and verifying that the work was done as approved. The cities are responsible for project design, implementation and ongoing maintenance. Cities can apply for reimbursement of costs up to the amount of their share for work done after March 13, 2007.

Cretekos is the current BIG-C president. Simons heads up the BIG-C committee in charge of project approvals.

Cretekos said some of the smaller cities are waiting to begin projects until the amount of their share grows to a larger sum.

"Small communities with low budgets don't have the money to pay for projects and then apply for reimbursements," he said. "Plans are for them to accumulate enough money to do the work."

He showed several slides of work done since money became available. He said Clearwater had been reimbursed \$6.7 million for work done on

its Beach Walk project on Clearwater Beach. Indian Shores received \$4 million to help pay for a new city hall, bike lanes and moving of utility poles along Gulf Boulevard. The city installed a new bus shelter and new aesthetically pleasing trashcan covers were added. Redington Beach also used beautification money to pay for moving utility lines underground.

Simons assured commissioners that all \$35 million would be spent according to approved project plans. He estimated that more "substantial projects" would begin in year four of the allocations.

"Smaller communities can't wait for reimbursements, they don't have the money," he said, echoing Cretekos earlier statements.

He said Treasure Island was in the planning stage for a \$3 million project that the city would fund and then request reimbursement.

Commissioner John Morroni brought up the subject of recent pedestrian deaths along Gulf Boulevard. He wanted assurances that projects were focusing on pedestrian safety.

The mayors asked if it were possible to allocate additional money sooner than scheduled. "We would appreciate it," Cretekos said.

"It doesn't hurt to ask," said Commissioner Ken Welch.

At that time, the piece will remain nameless, but



Welch, who was chair at the time, gave LaSala a low score – needs attention – in the area of facilitative leadership. And he marked needs attention to satisfactory on LaSala's mediation and negotiation skills. The rest of his evaluation showed good to excellent scores.

Commissioner Susan Latvala gave LaSala good or excellent scores in nearly every category. Commissioner John Morrioni was the only commissioner to give the administrator a perfect score – excellent in every area. Long mostly gave the administrator satisfactory scores. She circled needs attention in the areas of responsiveness advocacy, media relations and interpersonal communication. She marked good for budgeting, financial analysis, strategic planning and presentation skills.

Commissioner Charlie Justice scored LaSala as satisfactory to excellent in every category, with excellent marks for function/operational expertise, operational planning, initiative and risk taking, budgeting and integrity.

Seel gave the administrator the most points for satisfactory performance, marking excellent for his technological literacy only.

Roche found nothing excellent about LaSala's work in 2013, nor did he mark anything as needing attention, although he did create a new spot between needs attention, the bottom of the scale, and satisfactory, for several of his answers.

In 2014, LaSala's composite score fell to 70 percent. Seel marked needs attention, the lowest grade, on nearly every area except vision, presentation skills and media relations, which she marked as satisfactory. She marked good for technological literacy, budgeting and financial analysis.

Susan Latvala was more generous in her scores, giving LaSala an excellent or good in every category. She did remark under the vision category that LaSala "does an excellent job within the organization – not as well with community." She also said he needed "to practice presenting at a level that everyone can understand."

While Morrioni did not give LaSala a perfect score, he gave him more excellent marks than other commissioners. He marked good for facilitative leadership, remarking that the outcome of the EMS debate would be an indicator. He also marked good for mediation/negotiation, commenting, "Sometimes it doesn't come out as 'neutral' all the time." He also marked good for citizen service.

He thanked LaSala for his hard work and dedication.

"It seems we are finally tackling some tough issues with the support of the majority of the board," he wrote.

Justice scored LaSala as satisfactory, good or excellent in his responses. He included written comments stating that the "administrator has done an outstanding job maintaining the machinations of the county functions during a time of slow economic recovery and structural transition."

"There are some areas of concern; challenges that exist," he wrote. "The administrator needs to improve communication. Communication to the external communities that show respect for the validity of others' opinions; communication with staff that shows that change is made with purpose and intent and not for the sake of change; and communication with the Board to better align the goals and plans both short term and long term."

"Recent circumstances with the EMS issue, the strategic planning and the healthy communities discussions exposed areas in need of greater attention in order for greater successes."

Long scored LaSala between satisfactory and excellent and included comments on most pages. She said he could do a "better job of building partnerships and/or meeting with community groups in order to continue relationships the county has taken decades to develop."

"Bob has a stubborn streak that interferes with his good judgment," she wrote. "Bob must work on his demeanor during public meetings to ensure respect and civility toward our citizens, as well as the elected officials."

She praised him for his work in organizational planning and management.

"Bob does an outstanding job with strategic short and long range planning," she wrote. "His commitment and dedication to financial stability is outstanding."

Welch scored LaSala as satisfactory, good or excellent in every area except organizational integrity, which he marked between needs attention and satisfactory.

"I'm concerned with the loss of key personnel and the impact of personnel decisions on internal and external relationships and collaboration," Welch wrote. "I am also increasingly concerned with the number of ongoing conflicts and/or disputes with key community partners ... collaboration with our partners is a priority."

He praised the administrator for his strategic planning, the county's website and the use of eTownHall meetings for citizen interaction.

"Budget and forecasting are excellent," he wrote. "Strategic planning implementation depends on collaboration, staff retention and communication."

Roche had little good to say about LaSala. His scores mirrored Seel's with most coming in somewhere between needs attention and satisfactory. He did mark good for function/operational expertise, and a spot between good and excellent for technological literacy.

Roche's typed comments were among the most scathing. He listed a number of problems with how the administrator has performed his job and his understanding of the county's citizens. He said LaSala "appears to favor a conspiratorial 'us versus them' environment, frustrates easily when questioned, often rejects and rebuts opposing or differing viewpoints and/or alternative approaches, and tends to dismiss or obfuscate rather than consider and incorporate."

He listed several issues, including downtown Palm Harbor, the Pinellas County Library Cooperative, EMS, fire services, indigent care contracts, animal services, stormwater and citizen interactions, as having been handled in a spirit of "divide and conquer rather than coalesce and achieve."

He also expressed concern about "a pattern of discarding the value of institutional experience and knowledge, in favor of outside hiring and promotion."

Seel said she would begin work immediately to appoint a designee for LaSala to report to and make plans for beginning a search for a new administrator. She did not share any additional information. Assistant County Administrator Mark Woodard served in the administrator's role during the Tuesday meeting.

The commission is expected to appoint an interim administrator at the April 22 work session.

Before leaving the April 15 meeting, LaSala said he was proud of the county's employees.

"This is a terrific group of employees who try to do their very best each and every day, and I sincerely thank them," he said. "Further, I would also be remiss if I did not personally acknowledge my executive staff, and I include those who have been reassigned as well. Each of those individuals brought very real talent and a true commitment to public service. I thank them as well."

"Again, it has been my privilege to serve as your administrator."

Police beat

**Good Samaritan helps in truck crash**

TARPON SPRINGS – A Holiday man suffered serious injuries after losing control of his vehicle about 7:35 p.m. Saturday, April 19, on Keystone Road east of Lora Lane.

Florida Highway Patrol reports that Richard J. Fenton, 52, was traveling westbound on Keystone Road at a high rate of speed when he lost control of his 2008 Ford F150. The vehicle began to rotate, then left the highway and traveled onto the north shoulder. The truck overturned several times before coming to rest on the driver's side partially submerged in a pond.

Fenton was trapped inside the vehicle below the water line. Witnesses and a Good Samaritan, Richard Glenn, 52, of Oldsmar stopped to help. Troopers said Glenn was able to keep Fenton above the water line until fire rescue units arrived.

Emergency personnel extricated Fenton from the truck and transported him to St. Joseph's Hospital with serious injuries. Fenton was ticketed for careless driving.

**Michigan man drowns during triathlon**

TIERRA VERDE – A 64-year-old Michigan man died at a local hospital Saturday morning after he was pulled from the waters offshore Fort De Soto Park, 3500 Pinellas Bayway S., St. Petersburg.

According to the Pinellas County Sheriff's report, the victim, Donald Bautel, was participating in the "Escape for Fort De Soto" triathlon. Witnesses said that during the swimming portion, he appeared to be drowning. Swimmers in the area pulled him from the water, began CPR and called 911.

Deputies and emergency medical service personnel responded to the call for help about 8:16

a.m. April 19. Bautel was transported to a local hospital where he died. Deputies said the drowning appears to be accidental and may be health related.

**Man arrested for strong-arm robbery**

PALM HARBOR – Pinellas County Sheriff's detectives arrested a Clearwater man April 18 wanted in connection with an April 8 robbery that occurred in front of the Trust Pharmacy, 36515 U.S. 19 in Palm Harbor.

Anthony James Henderson, 37, was charged with one count of strong-arm robbery and one count of failure to appear in a petit theft case. Bond was set at \$10,515.

According to the sheriff's report, detectives arrested Henderson at his home in Clearwater on Friday. During an interview with detectives, Henderson "admitted to the allegations," the report said.

The sheriff's office released a video showing a white male with white hair pacing on the sidewalk outside the pharmacy. As the victim exited, the video shows the suspect grabbing the victim and then throwing her to the ground. He reportedly made threatening statements before taking her medication and fleeing the scene on foot.

The video also shows several people rushing to help the victim, but they were unable to stop the suspect.

**Dunedin firefighters report sinkhole**

DUNEDIN – A 10-foot by 10-foot hole about 10

feet deep opened up in the roadway at 1311 Powderpuff Drive in Dunedin Thursday afternoon.

The Dunedin Fire Department responded to the scene about 1:30 p.m. April 17 and reported that the hole did not seem to be increasing in size.

"No homes evacuated and no injuries," firefighters said.

City crews investigated the underground storm drainage and sewer pipes in the area. Dunedin Firefighters reported at 3:45 p.m. that all underground pipes were checked and intact.

"Opening is now believed to be a sinkhole," the report said. "City crews are going to fill in the hole shortly. No evacuations or injuries."

**Detectives seek Clearwater burglary suspect**

CLEARWATER – Detectives with Pinellas County Sheriff's Burglary & Pawn Unit are asking the public for help to locate a man wanted in connection with a burglary at a Clearwater air conditioning and heating business.

The burglary occurred "during the midnight hours" between Wednesday, April 9, and Thursday, April 10, at Cox Air Conditioning & Heating, 2198 Calumet St. in unincorporated, Clearwater, according to the sheriff's report.

Detectives said the suspect gained access to the property by cutting the chain link fence that surrounds the business. The suspect broke into two company vehicles stored inside of the fenced in area and then began to fill a 30-gallon rubber garbage can with air conditioning and heating related parts.

The suspect is described as a middle-aged white or Hispanic male with a thin build and short dark hair. He was last seen wearing a dark blue T-shirt, khaki cargo shorts and dark colored shoes.

ST. PETERSBURG – A Largo man died at the scene of a one-vehicle crash about 9:25 a.m. Wednesday, April 16.

According to the Florida Highway Patrol, Jose Quinones, 35, was traveling southbound on I-275 when he exited onto the ramp to 118th Avenue. As

he was traversing a right curve on the ramp, he lost control of his 2002 Ford Explorer and traveled onto the inside shoulder.

Troopers say he then overcorrected to the right, traveled back across the single-lane ramp and onto the grassy shoulder on the north side of the road. The vehicle overturned multiple times. Quinones, who was not wearing a seat belt, was ejected from the vehicle. He died at the scene.

His passenger, Melissa Lopez, 31, of Largo, was wearing a seat belt. She suffered serious injuries and was transported to Bayfront Medical Care.

**Magazine thief nabbed**

CLEARWATER – Clearwater police arrested Richard Lintzenich, 47, of Clearwater after an officer saw him enter an enclosed loading area at Publix at 1555 S. Highland Ave. The suspect began removing containers of magazines that had been delivered overnight, the report said, and he allegedly planned to sell the magazines, valued at \$1,176, at flea markets in the area.

He was charged with burglary of an unoccupied structure and grant theft greater than \$300 but less than \$5,000. He was released from the Pinellas County Jail on a \$7,000 bond.

Recently, my husband commented that I seem to be able to get things done at our daughters' school and in the community that most people wouldn't know they could do. I thought about what he said and decided that maybe I could share a little inspiration about how to make a difference. It's all too often we see things and complain, but don't take action to try and do something about it.

Like most of you, I am your every day citizen. I try to be active in my kids' school and in the community. I volunteer at the school and am on the PTA. I am also involved in the chamber of commerce for my work and recently have taken part in the city's citizen academy. I want our schools and community to be a great place to live, work and play for my family and me.

My instinct is when I see something that I think can be improved or needs to be fixed, I call whoever is in charge and try to get something done. Maybe it's the reporter in me or because I worked for city government and know basically how things work. I know that, usually, I can at least get a response.

I'll give you a few examples. When I moved to my house several years ago, there weren't sidewalks on one of the main roads that I would take my kids for a wagon ride. It was very dangerous because part of the road had sidewalks and part of it didn't. I decided to take some pictures and write our city officials about why I thought there needed to be sidewalks. The city looked at what I showed them and said they had money in their sidewalk improvement fund and put in the sidewalks. I was delighted.

Recently there was a lot of rain water on the fields where my daughters play their softball games and they were covered with mosquitoes. After playing two games and having the kids eaten by mosquitoes, I looked up mosquito control and emailed them about the problem. The officials emailed me back and had the fields sprayed within a day. Thank you, mosquito control!

Another example is my girls' school. Like most schools in Pinellas County, there are lots of portables that are used as classrooms. Last year, my daughter, who was in third grade at the time, lost

almost a month of learning because her class was in a portable. When it rains, the kids are doubled up with classes in the regular buildings. When this happens, teachers can't teach and the children aren't learning. It's a big problem especially when your school goes down a letter grade because of lower test scores. I was able to bring this to the attention of our school superintendent at an education forum and now school officials are looking into this.

I think sometimes we just need to take action and find out whom to ask so we can get things done. A

lot of times people don't know there's a problem unless we bring it to their attention.

Don't be afraid to call your city, county and school officials to help you. I am not saying that every time I try and do something, it gets done. There are times when things don't get done. To me it's important to at least try, so you can feel at least you've done your part.

# Don't let bed bugs infest your home

Remember the old saying, "Sleep tight and don't let the bed bugs bite"? It wasn't always a cute bedtime rhyme. In the not too distant past, the tiny, nocturnal bloodsuckers were a serious problem in Florida, across the country and throughout the world.

Thanks to DDT and Malathion, they were largely eradicated in most of the developed countries by the 1940s, but if recent reports are any indication, lots of people aren't sleeping too tight these days. Bed bug cases have been on the rise since the mid-1990s – up almost 500 percent just in the last few years. They have been finding their way back into hotels (upscale and otherwise), cruise ships, dormitories, movie theaters, nursing homes, hospitals ... and homes. Regarding the latter, mansions can be as vulnerable as their more modest neighbors. The common denominator is usually people, though they also feed on the blood of birds, bats and rodents.

Bed bugs and their eggs "hitchhike" on such things as clothes, backpacks, used furniture, bedding and in the luggage of travelers. They love heat and darkness. And they love sleeping humans.

Unless you know what to look for, you might not know you have these uninvited guests until you have a heavy infestation or an allergic reaction to the bed bug saliva that can cause itchy and inflamed welts hours or days later.

While you sleep, hungry bed bugs will come out of their hiding places, suck your blood, then scurry back under cover, commonly on or near beds and couches. They inject a fluid into the bites to keep the blood flowing and this fluid, like mosquito bites, is what causes the skin to itch and become swollen.

Usually a bed bug "hitchhiker" is an egg or a pregnant female capable of starting a new infestation upon her arrival at your home. She can produce 200 to 500 eggs in her lifetime, laying 10 to 50 eggs at a time.

The eggs, which hatch in one to three weeks, are the size of the tip of a pen, very hard to see without a magnifying glass. When fully

grown, bed bugs can be about 1/4-inch long. Adults can live for six months or more without a blood meal.

Because bed bugs are usually nocturnal and so good at hiding, they are difficult to spot, especially when an infestation is small. For early detection, which makes control cheaper and more successful, set up a catch trap. Google "How to Make a Bed Bug Interceptor Trap out of Common Household Items." Encase your mattress and box springs to make it easier to inspect for bugs. There are other monitoring devices, such as sticky traps, which can be placed around beds and sofas, as well as carbon dioxide and heat attractants. Aside from bite symptoms, you also can look for fecal droppings and blood spots on bedding or on walls around baseboards. Some pest control companies use bed bug-sniffing dogs, but a number of false positives and false negatives have been reported.

If bed bugs are found there are several ways to control them, with the best results achieved by using a combination of methods. There are many steps that can be taken by homeowners to optimize the possibility for successful control. First, vacuum the carpets, furniture and any visible bed bugs. Secure the vacuum bag in a zip lock baggy and put it in the freezer for at least a week. Place bed legs in plastic catch traps to thwart bed bug mobility, and encase your mattress and box springs. All bedding should be laundered with soap and a borax additive and dried at a high temperature. Any clothing, pillows and drapery that can't be cleaned in this manner should be dry-cleaned. Dresser drawers should be emptied out so insecticides can be sprayed under the drawers.

# Better fishing conditions expected

With a tough week of weather behind us, we are all looking forward to better fishing conditions that should be in store for this week and through the weekend.

With water temperatures still hanging below 70 degrees it's safe to think that the best fishing of the season is still ahead.

Light winds should clean our nearshore waters up for this weekend's fishing. Kingfish remain high on the list of target species. When conditions have been right for kingfish, the majority of the fish have been somewhere in the 3 to 5 mile range. Purely speculation at this point especially considering the amount of wind we had last weekend, but it would probably be a good idea to start in these depths. Blue runners, large pilchards and threadfin herring have been the ticket for these 10 to 20 pound fish. The larger fish will most likely be found out deeper, say 80 feet and out, or shallower in spots like the shipping channel.

Inshore, redfish remain the one constant. Improving moon tides will give anglers the opportunity to target these fish at both the high and low tidal stages. Entry points along the outer edges of the flats are potential low tide hotspots. Lightly weighted soft plastic jigs in darker colors have been working well in this scenario. When the tide peaks later in the morning, it's time to start working those oyster mounds for pockets of fish. Corking a live shrimp and casting it around the edges of the oyster mound is one of my favorite ways to fish.

Periods of stable weather have allowed for the bait to congregate around many of the local bridges at night. Working the shadow lines with a fast sinking cast net has yielded a variety of bait that can be used both inshore and offshore. Pilchards, the preferred live bait for trout, redfish and snook have been a bit scarce thus far this spring. Being resourceful however and utilizing what bait is available can still produce good catches of quality fish.

## Caterpillar gathering



Tussock moth caterpillars crawl along a chain link fence under oak trees on the property of Walsingham Elementary School in Largo, April 13. According to the University of Florida Entomology and Nematology Department, tussock moth caterpillars emerge from eggs most often laid in shade trees, especially oaks, the previous spring by adult moths. It is not uncommon for them to fall out of trees onto unsuspecting people below. They also may hang from a silk string to reach the ground. After two to four weeks of growth, the caterpillars spin their cocoons. They emerge from the pupal stage as adult moths about two weeks later. The male moths fly to the flightless females to mate, and the females lay their eggs on the cocoons recently vacated. The cycle repeats the following spring when the caterpillars emerge from the eggs.






remember the key points made by your doctor. If you're not sure you understand what is happening, ask questions until you feel comfortable.

Is there a medically-recognized ailment known as magazine addiction? If not, perhaps there should be. Victims of this ailment can be easily recognized, usually by the postal workers who must lug the magazines to the addressee's doorstep and try to somehow fit the periodicals into the mailbox.

Magazine addiction has several causes, although an average addict may not manifest every symptom. Loneliness and a sense of isolation can be a trigger. To help create or feed our addiction, many publishers lower their yearly subscription rates to basement levels. Each week I receive magazine offers so low in price I almost feel guilty not to subscribe. For 10 bucks or less I can get a year's worth of "The Duck Hunter's Gazette" or the beautifully illustrated "Slim Butt," telling women (and men, I suppose) 80 ways to make their fannies ap-

pear slender. The publishers don't survive on the money we send them for our subscriptions; they get most of their profits from advertising. And that depends on how high they can boost their circulation.

When it comes to spying on the habits of Americans, the CIA and National Security Agency are pikers compared to the publishing Mafia. Although a magazine may assure you that it will not give out your address, don't believe it. Let's say that in January you subscribe to "Mortuary Monthly." Within weeks you'll be getting subscription offers from "Modern Gravestones" and "Funeral Wear." Soon will come notices from "Cremation World" magazine.

A year ago I made the mistake of subscribing to a publication of the Harvard medical school. Today I'm on the subscription target list for the Mayo Clinic, the Hebrew Colonic Digest, Prevention magazine, Fitness, Women's Health, Men's Health, Diet Tips for Astronauts and a new book, "How I Survived a Month of Lithuanian Cuisine." If I followed all the advice in these publications, I'd be the healthiest man in my psychiatric ward.

Some magazines can be worth subscribing to just for the gifts they offer. I have a closet half-filled with jackets, duffel bags and overnight cases, all of them bearing the logos of the publications I signed up for.



## Fla.: A mecca for Medicare tricksters

After being sued by the Wall Street Journal, the government finally released its Medicare reimbursement data last week. It included the less-than-stunning revelation that 28 of the 100 doctors who received the largest payments in 2012 were from Florida.

No other state came close. And no physician in the country billed Medicare for bigger bucks than Dr. Salomon E. Melgen, a West Palm Beach ophthalmologist who operates several clinics and is tight with a powerful Democratic senator.

Melgen got almost \$21 million from Medicare in 2012. (No, you don't need your vision checked - \$20,827,341 is the actual number, for one year.)

Records show Melgen filed claims for 894 patients and 92,000 procedures, meaning Medicare paid him approximately \$11,700 for every eyeball that was eyeballed by him and his staff.

Even in Florida, the mecca for Medicare tricksters, Melgen's billing habits drew notice. The government had already forced him to give back \$8.9 million from 2007 and 2008, alleging he overbilled for injectable Lucentis, an expensive medication that combats macular degeneration.

The disorder is common in the elderly, and nationwide the treatment costs Medicare \$1 billion a year. In 2012, Melgen reported administering more than 37,000 doses of Lucentis in South Florida.

Currently he's under investigation for possible fraud, and twice FBI agents have swarmed his offices in search of evidence. His attorney says he's done nothing wrong, and has taken action to recover the nearly \$9 million that Melgen repaid the agency in charge of Medicare and Medicaid.

The doctor has an important ally in Sen. Robert Menendez, the New Jersey Democrat, who has traveled on Melgen's private jet and

hung out at his posh spread in the Dominican Republic.

When Melgen first got in trouble, Menendez called the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to defend his pal's prolific billing. Another time the senator argued in favor of a company owned by Melgen in a dispute over a seaport contract in the Dominican Republic.

For his part, the doctor donated \$700,000 to a Democratic political action committee that gave \$582,000 to Menendez's re-election efforts. So far, Melgen's friendship with Menendez has failed to deflect the FBI's interest.

Second on the national scoreboard of Medicare's top billers is Dr. Asad Qamar, an Ocala cardiologist who was paid \$18.2 million in 2012. He told the New York Times that his charges are fair, and that the sum is so large partly because he works in an outpatient facility for which the government pays added fees.

Like Melgen, Qamar is an enthusiastic donor to Democrats, including President Obama. He gave more than \$100,000 to the Democratic National Committee, and distributed other contributions to congressional candidates in five states, including Florida.

After federal auditors began examining Qamar's bills, the doctor hired lobbyists to contact more than a dozen U.S. lawmakers, seeking relief from the scrutiny. "The auditors put an astronomical burden on us, in terms of manpower," he told the Times.

An astronomic burden caused by astronomical billing.

Any physician who rakes in \$18 million from Medicare in 12 months deserves special attention, because such a massive volume of medical claims definitely isn't business as usual.

In fact, according to a Times analysis, only about 2 percent of doctors collected almost 25 percent of the country's Medicare payouts in 2012. Expanding that graph, just 25 percent of doctors accounted for 75 percent of Medicare's total spending, which reached \$77 billion that year.

It's hardly a shocker that Florida leads the way. No place in the nation hosts more Medicare fraud prosecutions, a grim distinction.

The good news is that the conviction rate is high; the bad news is that we could quadruple the number of prosecutors, and they'd still be overworked.

Meanwhile, soaring Medicare costs cut deeper and deeper into federal tax revenues. The program is so huge that it practically defies effective auditing, but certainly a much better job of that could be done.

Publicizing the payment database is a start. Some medical practices are more complex than others, and the numbers only tell part of the story for each physician on the list.

However, it's more than a statistical blip when two doctors collect a total of \$39 million, more than hundreds of other practitioners in those same specialties added together.

California, which has twice the population of Florida, had only 10 doctors in the top 100 Medicare billers, compared to our stellar 28.

It's not that Florida has more sick and elderly people than California, because we don't. We just happen to attract more opportunists.

**BayCare Hospitals introduce new endoscopy equipment**

CLEARWATER – Patients in the Tampa Bay area needing advanced diagnostic endoscopic ultrasounds now may benefit from new technology which can mean less time in a procedure and a more detailed diagnosis thanks to a new endoscopy processor at three BayCare hospitals that offers the latest, most precise imaging technology.

Located at Morton Plant, St. Anthony's and St. Joseph's hospitals, the new endoscopy processor, also called an EUS or Endoscopic Ultrasound, is used if a standard endoscopy exam has determined the need for further investigation.

EUS may be used to evaluate stages of cancer, chronic pancreatitis or other disorders of the pancreas. It is used to study: abnormalities or tumors in organs, including the gallbladder and liver; bumps in the intestinal wall; or the muscles of the lower rectum and anal canal. EUS also is used in diagnosis and staging of tumors of the esophagus, and in the diagnosis and staging of certain tumors of the chest cavity.

The EUS technology offers radial and linear scanning. The 360 degree scanning offers the advantage of a full panoramic view and a Doppler functionality to display blood flow dynamics inside the blood vessels. This adds valuable information to the examination, simplifying the orientation within the gastrointestinal tract and therefore speeding up the examination time.

The linear scanning technology provides a scanning range of 180 degrees. Linear scanning technology is designed to continuously visualize the progression of needle insertion into the tissue when performing a

EUS-Fine Needle Aspiration (FNA) procedure to collect tissue samples or other therapeutic procedures.

**NIH awards Eckerd College \$747,000 for cancer-fighting study**

ST. PETERSBURG – The National Institutes of Health recently awarded \$747,000 to Eckerd College to fund computational modeling of how certain cancer-fighting drugs interact in the human body.

It is the first NIH grant ever awarded to Eckerd College. Assistant Professor of Chemistry Joseph Larkin, Ph.D., will use the grant to develop methods to study boron-based pharmaceuticals that fight resistant cancers, such as pancreatic and ovarian cancers. The NIH National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute K22 Career Development Award will fund three years of study, beginning this summer.

Eckerd College students will work with Larkin on the project, along with graduate students and faculty from the University of South Florida.

The research will focus not only on how the body interacts with boron-based drugs but how they work, with the goal to develop methods of early cancer detection.

Larkin received his Ph.D. is from the University of Georgia with a concentration in quantum chemistry. His post-doctoral training was at the NIH, where he worked on computational methods for studying biochemical systems over different time and length scales. Application of these new methods focused on therapies containing boron and how they react with enzymes in the body.



**Tampa Bay Times wins 2014 Pulitzer Prize**

ST. PETERSBURG – The Tampa Bay Times recently won journalism's most prestigious award, the Pulitzer Prize, for local reporting.

The 2014 Pulitzer Prize in Local Reporting was awarded to Will Hobson and Michael LaForgia for their exposure of the unsafe housing conditions provided to the homeless by the Hillsborough County's Homeless Recovery program. Their work, which also exposed the problems in the management of the program, led to significant reform of the county's program.

This is the 10th Pulitzer Prize for the Times and the first in local reporting category.

"We have won a Pulitzer for investigative reporting in Pasco County and last year for an editorial campaign that had a huge political impact in Pinellas County. This year's Pulitzer shows the breadth and depth of the Times' commitment to journalistic excellence in all of Tampa Bay," said Times Editor Neil Brown.

This is the fourth Pulitzer Prize since 2009 and the second under the new banner, Tampa Bay Times. In 2012, the Times changed the name of the paper from the St. Petersburg Times to better reflect the community it already had been serving.

The Times is the only Florida newspaper to win a 2014 Pulitzer Prize.

ever, the line between justice and revenge is razor thin. For Damien, every day is a fight against corruption and although it isn't apparent at first, he finds an unlikely ally in one of the last good souls of Brick Mansions, Lino, played by David Belle. Stuck in the unpredictable and dangerous concrete jungle of Brick Mansions, Lino battles every day to live an honest life. A vigilante in his own right, he fights for a better overall community.

Ralph Steadman is the last of the original Gonzo visionaries. Made over the course of 15 years, "For No Good Reason" explores the connection between life and art through the eyes of seminal British artist, Ralph Steadman. Insightful, humorous, and visually stunning,

this is a study in honesty, friendship and the ambition that drives an artist.

Ralph's rise to prominence began in the early 1970s during the fallout from the love and hope that had swept the western world during the 1960s. This legendary time for music, literature, art and philosophy was the catalyst, along with his developing relationship with writer Hunter S. Thompson, for Ralph to express and chart the wreckage that followed; a large-scale disintegration of a demoralized counter-culture. His art gained recognition in the press and popular-culture publications, both in the U.K. and U.S., for its bold comment on his fiercely heart-felt politics.

The film is a richly creative, visual feast about the power and importance of art to achieve Steadman's aim "I learnt to draw...to try to change the world". Director Charlie Paul spent 15 years meticulously amassing the footage and creating the remarkable animations for the film to match the same anarchic energy, anger and free spirit of Steadman's pictures.

Through Johnny Depp's lead in this intimate portrait, we are able to reach to the heart of what make this artist tick, his friendships and fallings out, his love for art and his passion for civil liberties.

"For No Good Reason" is riot of stories and images as we take a trip through the wild and dark days of Steadman's time with 'Fear & Loathing in Las Vegas' writer Hunter S. Thompson, the Rumble in the Jungle; gun fights with literary giant William S. Burroughs and his fiercely heart-felt politics.

At the same time, Israeli agents are desperately looking to bring the German doctor to justice.

Based on filmmaker Lucia Puenzo's fifth novel, the story follows Josef Mengele, the "Angel of Death," a German SS officer and a physician at the Auschwitz concentration camp, in the years he spent "hiding", along with many other Nazis, in South America following his escape from Germany. 


