## Father charged in baby's death

Man, 29, placed on suicide watch; no bond set

A 29-year-old Silver Springs man was charged Friday with first degree murder and aggravated child

abuse, which resulted in the Jan. 30 death of his 6-week-old daughter, Ember Murray, a Marion County Sheriff's Office arrest report stated. According to officials, Jeremy James Murray told De-

tectives Stacy Skinner and Cliff Whiteside he was in bed with Ember when she began kicking. He said he picked her up and was going to put her in the bassinet when he tripped over a weight bench

and crashed into the bassinet.

The report stated Murray was alone in the home at the time the incident occurred, and didn't call 911 because he was trying to figure out what was wrong with the infant.

According to the report,

Ember's grandmother, Colleen Buelow, called 911 when she arrived home from work. She said she and Murray both performed CPR on the child until the ambulance arrived.

During their investigation,

Each year hundreds of exhibitors of all ages spend countless hours preparing for the Southeastern Youth Fair. Bringing in an upward of 400 hogs every year, it's safe to say that the hog show is the most popular event at the fair.

The hog projects consist of purchasing the hog, accurate record keeping of finances and weight gain, creating that unique bond between human and animal, and ultimately showing off the love and dedication that was put into the project at the fair.

On the closing of the three-day hog event, is the sale, where all of the hard work literally pays off. Each hog is auctioned off for market and the chapter or exhibitor receives the profit.

One exhibitor that has put an extreme amount of hard work into her project is Rebecca Frechette, a Dunnellon High School junior and member of the DHS Senior FFA Chapter.

## Sheriff's officials discover meth lab

Brothers face slew of charges

Two Dunnellon men face multiple drug-related charges stemming from a citizen tip about a possible meth lab in the 2300 block of Southwest 189th Avenue in Rainbow Lakes Estates.

According to a Marion County Sheriff's Office arrest report, Johnathan G. Vyrhof, 27, and Michael A. Vyrhof, 24, were both charged Feb. 10 with one count each of trafficking in methamphetamines, manufacturing methamphetamines, unlawful possession of listed chemicals and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The report stated the Marion County Sheriff's Office received a tip about a possible meth lab. Deputies responded to the location and were confronted by several dogs. Both deputies recognized Michael Vyrhof from previous interactions. Law enforcement officials advised Michael Vyrhof of the reason for their presence.

According to the report, Michael Vyrhof told authorities he was there with his brother, Jonathan, and they were paying rent to keep their camper vans on the property.

The report stated deputies observed a large amount of disassembled electronics in

## TURN BACK TIME: STATE PARK TO HOST CRACKER DAYS

Annual FORS event slated Saturday, Sunday

There was a time when Dunnellon was rustic, pristine, mysterious and beautiful. The Annual Cracker Days celebration in the Rainbow Springs State Park will take you back to that primitive era to see how our ancestors actually lived.

This year will focus on the late 1800's, after the Civil War and be-

fore Dunnellon discovered phosphate and became a boomtown. A fascinating and educating program which recreates what life was like without electricity and all our modern convenience.

The Rainbow Springs State Park will transform itself back to the original Dunnellon Cracker Days on Feb. 23 and Feb. 24 from 9 a.m., until 4 p.m.

"We have about 50 ap-

plicants that will either demonstrate, interpret or exhibit the Cracker time period," said Jo Anne Clutz, this year's event coordinator with her husband Tom.

"There will also be three people selling native plants on the walkway into the park."

The Cracker Weekend is run by a committee under the Friends of Rainbow Springs State Park and the park staff.

# Woman, 24, charged with domestic battery

A 24-year-old Dunnellon woman was charged Feb. 14 with domestic battery, a Dunnellon Police Department arrest report stated.

According to the report, Melissa M. Alexander was charged with domestic battery after a Valentine's Day altercation with a male victim, who alleged Alexander hit him several times in the head with a closed fist in the 19200 block of St. Lawrence Drive.

The report stated Officer Mike Anger responded to the area in reference to a battery call. Upon arrival, Anger made contact with the victim who advised authorities he and Alexander were arguing over their child saying inappropriate words. During the argument, the victim asked Alexander to leave his residence to which she refused.

According to the report, Alexander then got in the victim's face and began to punch the victim multiple times with a closed fist in the face. In his report, Anger noted the victim's face to be swollen and have a contusion to his left eyebrow. The victim advised law enforcement he tried to restrain Alexander

as she continued to strike him, causing both of them to fall to the ground. The victim told Anger his brother was able to separate both he and Alexander, who later left the victim's residence.

The report stated Anger made contact with Alexander and spoke with her at the Dunnellon Police Department. Alexander told authorities she did strike the victim in the head with an open fist. She stated she and the victim began to argue at which time the victim asked her to leave. Alexander stated the victim grabbed her, causing them to fall to the ground causing the injury to his face. Alexander told law enforcement she then left the location and said she did not want to call authorities because of her child.

According to the report, after completing his investigation, Anger found Alexander was the primary aggressor and determined the incident to be a domestic violence issue because of the child's involvement.

Alexander was transported to the Marion County Jail. Her bond was set at \$1,000. She made bail Feb. 15, jail records stated.

the area immediately in front of two camper vans. Michael Vryhof advised authorities a blue camper van had recently caught fire. He then gave consent for deputies to check the two camper vans for an active meth lab.

According to the report, deputies found evidence linking a recent fire to the blue camper van; however, inside the red camper van, authorities observed a blown glass pipe consistent with a meth pipe. Michael Vryhof told deputies both he and his brother had been staying in the red camper since the blue one had caught on fire.

The report stated law enforcement officials observed cables coming from the passenger side of the red camper leading into a metal shed directly adjacent to it. Deputies walked in the area

and could detect an odor of methamphetamines in the cooking process. Inside the open doorway to the metal shed was a power aid container with white powder around the neck.

According to the report, deputies saw four more bottles with a white powder-like substance inside and what appeared to be metal stripes inside. On closer inspection, authorities observed a liquid on top of the powder, and based on training and experience, deputies determined it to be a probable methamphetamines manufacturing process. Michael Vryhof, the report noted, told law enforcement authorities it was the only methamphetamines in the area.

The report stated deputies on scene notified the Drug Enforcement Unit, giving authorities a detailed description of the bottles when they spotted a bag containing drain cleaner and a funnel in the area along with

Coleman camp fuel. At this time, members of the Drug Enforcement Unit were called to the scene.

The owner of the property told authorities he did give the brothers permission to use the shed for working on televisions; however, he had no knowledge of the manufacturing of methamphetamines on the property and wanted any and all items used in the process to be removed. The owner of the property, the report noted, told deputies he never gave the brothers permission to store anything in the shed.

According to the report, when authorities from the Drug Enforcement Unit arrived, they removed the five containers of methamphetamines, which weighed a total of 194 grams.

Both Johnathan and Michael Vryhof were booked into the Marion County Jail. Their bond was set at \$50,500. According to jail records, neither of them have posted bail.

detectives were told the child had suffered massive skull fractures and there were possible signs of past injuries, the report stated. The injuries detected by a medical examiner were consistent with what Murray told detectives, authorities said.

According to the report, Murray was then re-interviewed by the detectives, and they said he changed his initial story, stating when he tripped his daughter was on his right shoulder. He added he fell over the bassinet and into the wall, the report stated. Murray told authorities he then fell into the

bassinet.

Again, the medical examiner was told about the explanation, which the official didn't believe would cause the injuries that Ember had suffered.

After a discussion between the State Attorney's Office, detectives and other officials, a decision was made to charge Murray.

According to Murray's Facebook page, he is engaged to Jordan Whaley, a 2009 graduate of Dunnellon High School and the

mother of the girl.

Murray is currently on suicide watch at the Marion County Jail according

to officials. No bond was set for Murray after a hearing Saturday in front of a Marion County judge.

# Dunnellon woman charged with DUI

A 34-year-old Dunnellon woman faces charges of driving under the influence and possession of drug paraphernalia Friday, Feb. 15, a Marion County Sheriff's Office arrest report stated.

According to the report, Deputy Daniel Pinder was dispatched to the 16000 block of West State Road 40 in reference to a reckless driving complaint.

The report stated Deputy Pinder spotted Rosa Maria Villon driving a maroon four-door vehicle traveling 35 mph in a 55 mph, which matched the reported description.

According to the report, the deputy followed Villon and observed her cross the white fog line at least two times, nearly striking the grass shoulder. The deputy then observed Villon completely cross the center line and for a brief moment, drive in the opposite lane of traffic.

The report stated Pinder initiated a traffic stop and made contact with Villon. Pinder informed Villon she was pulled over due to her driving. Pinder asked Villon if she had been drinking to which she stated yes, advising she'd been drinking somewhere on Pine Street in Ocala.

Pinder, in his report, noted he could smell the odor of alcohol on Villon's breath and observed her eyes to be very watery and red. Pinder asked Villon to exit the vehicle and participate in field sobriety exercise to which she agreed.

According to the re-

port, Villon failed the following exercises: the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus, the Walk and Turn, the One Leg Stand, the Finger to Nose and the Rhomberg Alphabet.

The report stated Villon was charged with driving under the influence in which she blew a .128 percent and .127 percent at the Marion County Jail. The legal limit in Florida is 0.08 percent. Post Miranda, Villon told authorities she had five shots of vodka and two Killian beers at a hotel on Pine Avenue.

According to the report, during a search of her purse, Pinder found a small metal grinder, which contained a green substance, which smelled of marijuana. The report stated Pinder tested the substance, which tested positive as marijuana. Pinder also found a metal marijuana pipe, which contained a burnt substance which smelled strongly of marijuana in the side of the purse. Pinder, the report noted, tested an unburnt area, which came back positive as marijuana.

According to the report, Villon was transported to the Marion County Jail. Post Miranda, Villon told authorities she smoked a "blunt" of marijuana at around 10 p.m. Feb. 14. She also stated the pipe and grinder were hers and she had smoked out of the pipe early Thursday, Feb. 14.

Villon was booked into the Marion County Jail. Her bond was set at \$1,000 and she made bail Feb. 15, according to jail records.

## Ocala man, 25, faces multiple charges

A 25-year-old Ocala man faces charges of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon as well as operating an unregistered motor vehicle and possession of marijuana, less than 20 grams, a Dunnellon Police Department arrest report stated.

According to the report, Carl Bostick was charged with the three counts Feb. 17 after a traffic stop in the 1900 block of County Road 484. The reported stated Officer Aaron German spotted the vehicle while on patrol and ran the vehicle's tag through FCIC/NCIC and observing the tag to be invalid — tag replaced by another tag — as Bostick

traveled eastbound on County Road 484.

The report stated after making contact with Bostick, German detected a strong odor of marijuana emanating from within the vehicle. German also observed a hand rolled cigarette laying in the ash tray of the center console.

According to the report, Bostick was asked to exit the vehicle and consented to a search of the car and himself. During the search of the vehicle, German found a fully-loaded Harrington and Richardson Arms five-shot revolver under the back right passenger seat.

The report stated Ger-

man tested the hand rolled cigarette, which tested positive for the presence of marijuana.

According to the report, German then ran Bostick's personal information through Marion County Sheriff's Office Teletype, which advised Bostick had been previously convicted of a felony — Fleeing and Eluding Law Enforcement.

Post Miranda, Bostick stated he did not know the vehicle needed to be registered so it could be driving and did not claim the weapon and marijuana to be his possession.

Bostick's bond was set at \$11,000 and posted bail the same day.

# Be in the know about Medicare Part B

You may already know that Medicare is a medical insurance program for people who are 65 or older and for people who are disabled at any age. Some people are covered only by one type of Medicare; others opt to pay extra for more coverage. Understanding Medicare can save you money.

If you're eligible for and want to be covered by Medicare Part B medical insurance, now is the time to sign up. The general enrollment period for Medicare Part B runs from Jan. 1 through March 31. Before you make a decision about general enrollment, here is some useful information.

There are four parts to Medicare: Parts A, B, C and D. Part A helps pay for inpatient hospital care, skilled nursing care, hospice care, and other services. Part B helps pay for doctors' fees, outpatient hospital visits, and other medical services and supplies not covered by Part A. Part C allows you to choose to receive all of your health care services through a managed health care organization. These plans, known as Medicare Advantage Plans, may help lower your costs of receiving medical services, or you may get extra benefits for an additional monthly fee. You must have both Parts A and B to enroll in Part C. And Part D is the Medicare Prescription Drug Program.

There is a monthly premium for Medicare Part B. In 2013, the standard premium is \$104.90. Some high-income individuals pay more than the standard

premium. Your Part B premium also can be higher if you do not enroll during your initial enrollment period, or when you first become eligible.

There are exceptions to this rule. For example, you can delay your Medicare Part B enrollment without having to pay higher premiums if you are covered under a group health plan based on your own current employment or the current employment of any family member. If this situation applies to you, you have a "special enrollment period" in which to sign up for Medicare Part B, without paying the premium surcharge for late enrollment. This rule allows you to:

Enroll in Medicare Part B at any time while you are covered under a group health plan based on your own current employment or the current employment of any family member; or

Enroll in Medicare Part B during the eight month period that begins following the last month your group health coverage ends, or following the month employment ends, whichever comes first.


If you receive disability benefits and have coverage from a working family member, the same rules apply.

If you live in one of the 50 states or Washington D.C. and you're already receiving Social Security retirement or disability benefits or railroad retirement payments, you will be enrolled in Medicare Parts A and B automatically. However, because you must pay a pre-

My mother figured it out and told her so far we loved it. Later she explained it all to us.

It's like two different worlds. We soon grew to love Dunnellon and especially the river. So many of my childhood memories were spent there and back in the 70's we had easy access to it. You could pretty much walk in anywhere at anytime. There was a lot — Kinnebrew's Lot — where we used to hang out, swim and picnic. My friend Angie Morrison and I would cook TV dinners, wrap them up and then eat them at the river.

mium for Part B coverage, you have the option of turning it down.

If you don't enroll in Medicare Part B when you first become eligible to apply and you don't fall under the special enrollment period, you'll have to wait until the general enrollment period, which is January 1 through March 31 of each year. At that time, you may have to pay a higher Medicare Part B premium.

**Question:** I'm 65, not ready to retire, but I want to apply for my Medicare coverage. How can I do that?

**Answer:** The easiest and most convenient way is to apply online! Use our online application to sign up for Medicare. It takes less than 10 minutes. In most cases, once your application is submitted electronically, you're done. There are no forms to sign and usually no documentation is required. Social Security will process your application and contact you if we need more information. Other-

**Social Security checks must go electronic by March 1**

The U.S. Department of the Treasury reported there is less than two weeks remaining until the March 1 deadline before electronic payment law goes into effect.

The Treasury Department published a final rule in December 2010 to gradually phase out paper checks for federal benefit payments. Since May 1, 2011, all people newly applying for federal benefits, including Social Security, SSI, Veterans Affairs, Railroad Retirement Board, Office of Personnel Management benefits and other non-tax payments, have had to choose direct deposit or the Direct Express card at the time they sign up for their benefits. March 1, 2013, is the final deadline by which all remaining federal benefit check recipients must receive their money electronically.

Check recipients can sign up for direct deposit or the Direct Express card by calling toll-free 800-333-1795, visiting [www.GoDirect.org](http://www.GoDirect.org), or talking to their local federal paying agency office. The process is fast, easy and free.

There's no need to drive to a local Social Security office or wait for an appointment with a Social Security representative. **Blueberry Biscuit Cookies**

Yield: 14 servings

**Grown-Up Alert:** Supervise younger children when using the oven.

- 2 cups biscuit mix
- 1 cup Florida blueberries
- 1 cup pecans, chopped
- 2 tablespoons low-fat milk
- 1/2 cup honey, divided

Preheat oven to 350°F.

In large mixing bowl, combine biscuit mix, blueberries, pecans and milk. Mix well and add enough honey to make mixture stiff like cookie dough.

Place dough by tablespoonful onto a greased baking sheet about 2 inches apart.

Bake until edges begin to brown, about 15 minutes.

Remove from oven and drizzle remaining honey on each cookie. Bake an additional 5 minutes and serve immediately.

**Strawberry-Yogurt Freezer Pops**

Yield: 10 servings

- 1 pound Florida strawberries, hulled and chopped
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 2 cups low-fat vanilla yogurt
- 10 freezer pop molds and sticks

In blender or food processor add half of the strawberries, sugar and lemon juice. Purée ingredients until sugar is dissolved. Pour mixture into a small pitcher or container and add the rest of the chopped strawberries.

Fill each freezer pop mold by alternating layers of strawberry mixture and yogurt. Insert handle or stick into each freezer pop and freeze at least 5 hours. To serve, run warm water over outside of molds until pops come out easily.

If you don't have freezer pop molds, use small paper cups. Cover tops of cups with plastic wrap and poke the sticks through the plastic to keep them standing upright while in the freezer.

**Strawberry Mascarpone Panini**

Yield: 4 servings

**Grown-Up Alert:** Supervise younger children when using the panini maker or griddle.

- 8 slices fresh bread (1/2 inch thick)
- 1/2 cup mascarpone cheese
- 1/2 pound Florida strawberries, hulled and sliced thin
- Confectioners' sugar for dusting
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

Heat a panini press or griddle over medium heat.

Spread a thin layer of mascarpone on top of each bread slice.

Add an even layer of strawberries to 4 bread slices. Use the other 4 slices of bread to top the sandwiches.

Brush sandwiches with butter and grill or press until golden, about 5 minutes.

Transfer panini to cutting board and dust with confectioners' sugar. Serve warm.

**Berry Snack Bars**

Yield: 20 bars

**Grown-Up Alert:** Supervise younger children when chopping nuts and using the oven.**Crust:**

- 1 cup pecans, chopped, divided
- 3/4 cup whole-wheat flour
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons cold unsalted butter, cut into small pieces
- 1 large egg
- 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
- Pan release cooking spray

**Fruit Filling:**

- 3 cups Florida strawberries, hulled and diced; divided
- 2 1/2 cups Florida blueberries, divided
- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

For crust: Combine 3/4 cup chopped pecans, both flours, sugar and salt in food processor. Pulse together until nuts are finely ground. Add cold butter to mixture and pulse until well incorporated.

In small mixing bowl, whisk egg, oil, vanilla and almond extracts together.

With motor running on food processor, add egg mixture to pecan mixture. Continue to pulse until it begins to clump, 30 to 45 seconds.

Measure out 1/2 cup of mixture and combine in bowl with remaining 1/4 cup chopped pecans; set aside for topping.

Preheat oven to 400°F. Coat 9-by-13-inch baking dish with cooking spray.

Combine 2 cups strawberries, 2 cups blueberries, orange juice, sugar and cornstarch in large saucepan. Bring to a simmer over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture has thickened (about 4 to 5 minutes). Stir in remaining fresh fruit and add vanilla.

Transfer crust mixture to sprayed baking dish. Spread evenly and press firmly into bottom to form crust. Evenly spread fruit filling over crust. Sprinkle top of fruit filling with reserved topping mixture.

Bake bars for 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350°F and bake until crust and topping are lightly brown, 25 to 30 minutes more.

Let bars cool completely before cutting. Serve with fresh fruit.




