Plane crash claims life of hospital CEO

Last Thursday evening in Macon, Ga., Allen Golson, CEO of Coliseum Health System, spoke at his company's awards banquet. This was to be his final speech as CEO, since he had accepted a position as CEO of Ocala Health Systems, including Ocala Regional Medical Center and West Marion Community Hospital.

At the dinner, he praised his wife for her support and praised health system workers.

He received a standing ovation from the crowd of about 200.

Friday morning, he and his wife, Carol, boarded his twin-engine six-seat Cessna to fly to Ocala. He told friends they were coming to Ocala "to look at some real estate."

But as his plane circled to the south end of Ocala International Airport and made its final approach, something went terribly wrong.

As it approached 38th Street, the plane, witnesses said, suddenly veered to the left, possibly to avoid hitting the buildings on the north side of the street, and crash-landed in a field, catching fire upon impact.

Allen Golson, 55, was killed. His wife, Carol, 52, was pulled from the wreckage by nearby workers and survived. They were the only people on board.

The crash site is a short distance south of the airport, just southeast of the Ocala Regional Sportsplex, a little over a mile east of West Port High School and just over a mile north-northwest of Fairfield Village and The Centers on 60th Avenue.

The Macon Telegraph reported that investigators found that the landing gear was retracted, or in the "up" position, not

down as you would expect from a plane about to land. The paper also said that the investigation showed that Carol was seated near the rear of the plane, not in the cockpit.

Golson had been in contact with the tower at OIA, indicating that he was on final approach. According to officials, he gave no indication of any trouble on board.

The Golsons had been married for 30 years after meeting at the University of Alabama. They had no children, but other relatives were in Ocala on Saturday to visit the crash site.

The wreckage was taken to Gainesville on Saturday where the investigation will continue.

VA accidentally releases living vets' data

The Department of Veterans Affairs is offering free credit monitoring to more than 2,200 veterans whose personal information, including Social Security numbers, was posted on Ancestry.com following the mistaken release of data through the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

"VA places the highest priority upon safeguarding the personal information of our Veterans," said Jerry L. Davis, VA's chief information security officer. "When lapses occur, we will immediately take prompt remedial action, such as notification."

The family history website, which

provides access to genealogical and historical information, had requested information from VA about deceased veterans. Under FOIA, VA is obligated to release requested records upon written request unless they may be withheld. Therefore, VA provided the website with the data on March 18, 2011.

On Dec. 13, 2011, after the information had been posted on the history website, VA learned that it included data about some living veterans because some of the death reports provided to the website were inaccurate.

"Fortunately, no personal health information was included in this data release," Davis said. "Ancestry.com has worked with us and immediately removed all the information that we had supplied them."

There is no indication personally identifiable information of any veteran has been misused. However, VA is still notifying all potentially affected veterans so they can be vigilant and take steps to protect against identity theft. VA is also offering

Wildland Task Force to meet

The Marion County Multi-Agency Wildland Task Force, composed of representatives from Marion County Fire Rescue, Florida Forest Service, United States Forest Service, Dunnellon Fire Rescue, Ocala Fire Rescue, Marion County Emergency Management, Marion County Parks and Recreation, Florida State Parks, St. Johns Water Land Management and private land management groups, will hold a meeting to ensure that agencies are informed of communication procedures, potential concerns, available resources and organizational structures with regard to the upcoming wildfire season.

The meeting will be Monday, Feb. 6, and 9 a.m. at the Marion County Fire Rescue Headquarters, 2631 S.E. Third St., Ocala. This will be the second meeting this year to plan for the 2012 wildfire season.

At the first meeting on Jan. 10, Marion County's extremely dry conditions were of concern. As such, task force members have encouraged local residents to postpone backyard burning, if possible, and exercise caution with outdoor activities that could lead to wildfires. The group will continue to meet on a regular basis to discuss operational and response levels, as well as educational opportunities.

The Task Force was formed following the 1998 wildfire season and meets frequently during peak wildfire dangers to ensure agencies stay informed to minimize the negative effects wildfires have on our community.



Our Message

The victims are still there

Amid all the tributes pouring in for former Penn State University football coach Joe Paterno, amid all the sorrowful vigils after his death last Sunday, amid all the flowers, etc., left for the family, there is one group of people that we feel must be remembered...the victims.

Paterno was by no means guilty of any physical crimes in the sex abuse scandal which has one of his former assistants charged with abuse of boys, but in Paterno's own words, he should "have done more."

When it was brought to his attention that some sort of improprieties had occurred, he told school superiors, but failed to go any further, especially with the legal reporting of an alleged crime. As a result, the school dismissed the football coach, who had been a part of the college scene for decades.

Just a few months later, lung cancer claimed his life.

There was no doubt that Paterno was a great football coach - his record speaks for itself. But the cloud of the scandal will be over his head as long as the current generation of people lives. Some might disagree, but just look at the record.

Remember Woody Hayes, the legendary Ohio State coach? His career ended after the 1978 Gator Bowl when he hit an opposing player in the neck. Despite the adulation of the fans, his school fired him, and to this day that's one of the major things for which he is remembered.

Some sentimentalists have used the firing of Paterno to say he "died of a broken heart."

But let's not kid ourselves. Lung cancer is a serious, progressive disease, and one can be reasonably sure that it did not develop overnight inside the body of the coach, although it wasn't made public until after he was fired.

So let's take away a couple of things from this awful situation: first, there were boys who were victims in this case, and we doubt that they or their families are forgetting that in the shadow of Paterno's death; second, those who might be susceptible to a disease such as lung cancer should make sure that they get annual tests to try to catch this awful disease early enough to survive; and third, the fact that we lost a great football coach is important to the sports world, but way down the list of priorities.

Questions about fatal wreck

Many years ago when I was younger, I used to love driving at night when taking long trips. I always felt that you could see what was coming from a greater distance, and usually most of the people on the road were commercial drivers, in those days people who knew how to drive better than most.

But I, and everyone else, have to be grateful that I wasn't on the Interstate early Sunday morning in southern Alachua County.

I can't imagine driving down the highway, encountering a virtual blackout of smoke, and realizing too late that there was traffic stopped in front of you.

By now everyone realizes there were 20 vehicles involved in that wreck and that, at this writing, at least 10 people died.

There were two disturbing news items to come from that crash.

First, there is talk that the brush fire in Paynes Prairie that caused all the problems was set by man. There had been no lightning in the area, and, contrary to early reports, there were no controlled burns. It was still to be decided whether it started accidentally or was arson, but either way, the failure to immediately control the blaze resulted in all these fatalities.

It is important that investigators use every resource possible to find out who is responsible for that fire. Those people should face appropriate charges.

Second, it appears that the road was closed because of the smoke, but reopened later when it appeared to clear. Obviously, that was the wrong decision.

The Alachua County sheriff was interviewed on television, and she pointed out how quickly things can change.

Unfortunately, the old cliché "Discretion is the better part of valor" would have

been appropriate in this case. Whoever made the decision to reopen the highway will have to live with that decision forever.

Along with the Interstate, other roads had to be closed. U.S. Highway 441 in southern Alachua County was closed, off and on, because of the smoke.

This meant diverting traffic, and that had an effect in northern Marion County all weekend. Southbound Interstate traffic was detoured off the highway at Williston Road, then directed on State Road 121 all the way to U.S. Highway 27 in Williston, then back toward Ocala. This put a lot of traffic on the road on U.S. 27 west of I-75.

This ripple effect was still being felt Monday morning.

In addition, the message being put out by various websites was confusing. One site was saying the highway was open, another was saying one side was open, another was saying it was closed, all at the same time.

The best thing to do, and it will be in the future when things like this happen, is to avoid the area altogether.

Hopefully, the smoke has cleared and the roads can be back to normal. But for the families of those 10 victims, nothing will be normal again.

We are facing the most important election I have seen in my lifetime, and I began voting for Eisenhower.


We are divided as a nation more than I have ever witnessed and a divided Nation will not survive.





credit monitoring for one year at no charge to every veteran whose name was mistakenly released and posted on the history website.

FOIA requires federal agencies to disclose requested records unless they may be withheld under specific statutory exemptions. Under FOIA, VA was obligated to provide the website with the name, social security number, date of birth, date of death, military branch assignments, and the dates of entry on active duty and release from active duty for deceased veterans.

VA has launched an effort to determine why in-

formation about living veterans was included in a database about deceased veterans. The error did not affect the VA benefits of any veteran. VA is committed to protecting veterans' personal information and to improving information processing to avoid erroneous data.

Veterans who believe they may have been affected by this incident who

have not been notified by VA may verify whether their information was involved by writing to: Department of Veterans Affairs, OIT Privacy Officer (005R1A), 810 Vermont Ave., NW Washington DC 20420, (Attn: Garnett Best).

Affected veterans can request a free credit report for one year from one or more of the three national credit bureaus by calling 1-

877-322-8228 or by visiting <http://www.annualcreditreport.com>.
