Zalak coasts to county victory; Kelly King unseats Crawford

Incumbent County Commissioner Carl Zalak survived a hard-fought campaign to defeat Glen Fiorello in the Republican primary on Tuesday, Aug. 26.

Zalak received 11,704 votes, or 58.68 percent, to Fiorello's 8,240 votes, or 41.32 percent in the two-man GOP-only election.

Zalak still must face write-in candidate Christopher Turner, whose entry into the race closed the primary to Democratic voters.

No write-in candidate has ever won in modern-day Florida elections.

That was the end of the good news for Marion County's incumbents.

In the School Board District 5 race, Hammett Bowen teacher Kelly King pulled off probably the biggest upset of the day by soundly beating incumbent Ron Crawford, getting more than 57 percent of the vote. With only two people in the race, she is the winner of the election.

"A sincere and heartfelt thank you for

electing me to be your representative for Marion County School Board," she wrote on her Facebook account.

Two other School Board incumbents will face runoffs in the Nov. 4 general election. In District 3, incumbent Bobby James was the leader but fell far short of the 50 percent plus one vote needed to win in the four-candidate race. He'll face Jane Moerlie in November.

In District 4, incumbent Angie Boynton has a much bigger hill to climb, as she trailed newcomer Chase Basinger after Tuesday's vote. They'll go at each other in the November runoff as well.

In a multi-county race, incumbent Circuit Judge Sandy Kautz finished last in the four-person race that saw Mary Hatcher coast to a large lead, but she received only 46 percent of the vote and will face Denise Dymond Lyn in November.

In the governor's race, Marion voters went overwhelmingly in favor of the two leading candidates, Rick Scott on the Republican side and Charlie Crist for the Democrats. That will be the big statewide battle in November.

In 2013, 536 CF students received Veterans Administration benefits. Veterans who are no longer receiving benefits also can benefit from services offered at the center.

CF was designated as a Military Friendly institution in 2013 by Victory Media. The designation ranks CF as among the top 20 percent of schools nationwide that deliver the best experience for military students.

It's peak time for hurricane formation

Do primaries spell doom for school ad valorem tax?

One School Board incumbent went down to a resounding defeat. Two others face runoffs in November. Does the dismal showing by incumbents provide insight into the fate of the School Board's one mill property tax referendum in two months?

And what is to be made of the fact that only 16.5 percent of registered voters took part in the primary?

I vote in a busy precinct, and didn't get there until about 2 p.m. I was the only one there when I walked up to the precinct workers, but there were a couple of people who came in after me. When I left, they told me I was No. 131. The polls had been open for seven hours at that point, so that's fewer than 20 voters per hour.

We elected a School Board member and, for the most part, re-elected a county commissioner. So as time goes on, if you didn't vote, don't let me hear you complain.

Probably the most shocking result was the resounding defeat of the four-term incumbent and former Board Chairman Ron Crawford.

It wasn't close. Kelly King, a 12-year teaching veteran from Hammett Bowen Elementary, never trailed from the time the early votes and absentee ballots were posted.

Just the fact that an incumbent, who has never been linked to any wrongdoing, could lose so badly, has to provide fodder for those who will analyze, over the next couple of months, the possibility of passage of the one-mill levy.

Two other incumbents advanced to runoffs, but one of them, Angie Boynton, finished second, narrowly missing being eliminated by third-place Diane

Schrier. She'll be facing Chase Basinger.

Bobby James led in his race, but he'll have to face Jane Moerlie in November.

Meanwhile, County Commission Chairman Carl Zalak was virtually assured of re-election by defeating Glen Fiorello, who waged a tough battle in the Republican primary.

Florida's dumb election law interpretation, which thwarts the will of the voters, allowed a write-in candidate to close the primary, shutting out Democrats, who can all write in the opponent's

name in November ...which has never happened. However, Zalak will be on the ballot, all by himself, in the general election.

But back to the school tax plan. Some of the candidates waffled a little when they were asked if they favored the tax by Marions United for Education. Interestingly, those who were most adamant against the tax were Jane Moerlie, Chase Basinger and, after changing her position, Kelly King. Two of the three led their races, with King winning outright, and Moerlie is in a runoff with James.

That may be a hint as to what will happen in November.

Backers of the tax have two months to get their point across. It may be an uphill battle, but we'll find out how well they did on Nov. 4.

Reading Pals program comes to Stone Creek

If you are looking to recruit volunteers, what better place than a 55+ community. Even better, if you are looking to recruit reading volunteers is a book group. Recently, Jan Hathaway from United Way came to the Stone Creek Book Club to entice members to volunteer for an outstanding program.

Reading Pals is a program that was started in May of 2012 with a grant from the Barnett Family. It was an Early Literacy Grant awarded to 10 Florida United Ways. The funding was for three years. It was funded \$75,000 the first year and \$85,000 for the second and an undetermined amount for year three. The program is now in its third year.

The Reading Pals Program was created in conjunction with the Women's Leadership Council to have volunteers read to kindergarten students. This program in Marion County is in 15 schools all of which had 40 percent or more students on free or reduced lunch. The students whose test scores were in the range of the lowest 25 percent that met specific criteria were selected for The Academy Kindergarten class.

In year two of the program, there were 303 students in The Academy program with 221 students with a Reading Pal. The goal for year three is to have a reading pal for each student enrolled in the program.

Each volunteer is asked to give two 30 minutes per week to read the same book in session one and two. Some volunteers share the week with another volunteer. Last week, I shared the week with Karen Chapman, a Stone Creek resident and member of the book club. We would help each other out when one of us was away because of va-

cation or other reasons. Reading to a child, one on one, is a great job for both you and the child. For many children, these are the only books that are in the home. They get a total of 25 books as part of the program, two books for the winter break with a incentive to read over the break, one book for the spring break and eight books for the summer with promotional materials from TD Bank for \$10 if they read all ten books.

Barnes and Noble will give the student a book if they read 10 books and an application for a library card for both an adult and the child.

As I told members of the Stone Creek Book Club about my experiences of working one on one with a child, many members decided that this was a program for them. Fifteen volunteers decided to take on the challenge and some members even signed up their spouses. Jan Hathaway has decided to come back to Stone Creek to do the training for those that have signed up. It doesn't take make to change a life — in this instance, it is 1/2 hour or an hour a week for 25 weeks. What joy you will bring to the life of a child and your own!



