

Granny Flat Tax Ordinance Set For Hearing On June 17

The public hearing on the so-called Granny Flat Tax Ordinance has been rescheduled for Tuesday evening, June 17. The measure is more formally called the Elderly Living Quarters Temporary Assessment Abeyance Ordinance. The hearing on the ordinance, originally set for May 20, had to be rescheduled because it was incorrectly advertised in the newspaper.

If adopted on June 17, as expected, the ordinance would go into effect on Jan. 1, 2015; and it would grant a tax exemption to any county resident who remodels or makes an addition to his or her home in order to accommodate an elderly parent or grandparent.

Have You Changed Your Passwords?

A security flaw shook the Internet community recently with everyone rushing to change passwords on numerous websites.

The Heartbleed Bug is a vulnerability in the popular OpenSSL, an open-source encryption technology. According to the Heartbleed website, this vulnerability allows the theft of protected information.

In other words, Heartbleed Bug allows anyone on the Internet who knows what he or she are looking for to read the memory of a system protected by the vulnerable version of the OpenSSL software. The Heartbleed Bug could access usernames, passwords and steal data di-

rectly from the services and users.

The most common suggestion for Internet users is to change all passwords, including Facebook, Yahoo, Pinterest and Amazon. However, there is no way to know how many websites have been affected so if you shared any financial or personal information on a website, you may want to update those passwords as well.



A Google researcher and an independent Finnish security firm called Codenomicon, are the ones who discover this flaw. The flaw has existed for at least two years. They have set up a website to help explain the threat and how it happened. The website is www.heartbleed.com.

Honey Lake Plantation Changing Image, Focus

Dayton said Honey Lake was positioning itself as a proper and authentic Southern plantation and hospitality destination, with the focus on the land's natural beauty, the facility's lodging amenities and many sporting opportunities, and its other activities specifically developed to appeal to a targeted clientele.

"We're a proper Southern plantation,"

Dayton said. "We're not an antebellum or a neck plantation. We are a contemporary Southern gentlemen's location."

Dayton talked of the plantation's different lodging facilities, which he said combined could accommodate a large number of people, depending on the make-up of the particular groups.

Among the plantation's lodging offerings, Dayton mentioned the 24-room Equestrian Lodge, akin to a small hotel; the Pansy Poe Cottage, reputed to have served as a retreat for Jackie Kennedy after the 1963 assassination of President John F. Kennedy; and the Trophy Lodge, reportedly the most in demand for wedding receptions and now additionally functioning as a five-bedroom bed-and-breakfast facility whose rooms can be booked separately.

As for the target audiences, Dayton cited several groups in order of priority.

The first he called the wing-shooting wannabees, a group he described as hardworking and affluent individuals from Atlanta to Canada who had the wherewithal to indulge their desires, especially for a hunting experience in the South, the caveat being that they lacked hunting expertise.

"They have more money than hunting experience," Dayton said. "They're high in businesses and love to think of themselves as hunters. They want an escape and a guaranteed hunting experience. They work hard and they take three or four trips a year to reward themselves."

They also tended to be repeat customers who would come back year after year, he said.

Dayton called the second group the "Over and Unders," likewise affluent individuals considered movers and shakers in their particular fields. The distinction here was members of this group had hunting expertise and were looking for a quality hunt to validate or enhance their hunting credentials. Such indi-

viduals traveled the world in search of defining hunting experiences and tended to visit a place only once, he said.

"We focus on the first group, the Disney crowd," Dayton said. "We're hoping they come back year after year."

The third group he called lifelong sportsmen. These were individuals who lived within 60 miles of the plantation and looked on hunting as a heritage. For these individuals, the plantation's summer constituency, the plan was to offer shooting sports and other activities designed to help maintain and sharpen shooting skills.

More pertinent to Monticello, Dayton said, was the plantation's bridal business, the benefits of which were more likely to spill into the surrounding communities' lodging and eating establishments.

Dayton identified the two main bridal groups as plantation princesses and southern belles. The former went for destination weddings, he said. These were brides from all over the Northeast and Mid West who came looking for a plantation wedding for reasons of "pictorial bragging rights."

These brides tended to come with large crowds of families and friends whose accommodations frequently exceeded the plantation's lodging capacity.

The southern belles he described as coming from the South and generally bringing crowds that didn't necessarily stay overnight or for multiple days. These brides simply wanted to be the center of attention for a day

and have their egos stroked, he said.

"We take in the first audience and layer the second group in-between," Dayton said, relating that the stacked scheduling of weddings allowed for optimum use of the facility. "One of our greatest assets is our southern theme."

He identified corporate associations as another group the plantation was pursuing. Rather than pitching the plantation's meeting amenities to this group, which all facilities that catered to such associations could boast, "We focus on setting, the outdoors venue and our team-building activities," Dayton said, naming several games and activities that the plantation has specifically designed and developed for team building. Among the activities he cited were 3D archery, fishing contests and chef/culinary competitions.

Other groups Dayton said the plantation was courting to one degree or another were spiritual retreat planners, upscale leisure seekers, birdwatchers and nature photographers.

And for the summer months and targeted specifically at area residents, he said, the plantation was offering night skeet shooting, which he likened to "southern dinner theatre"; a golf-like sporting game called "hot shot" that the plantation had developed; and the redesigned spas, now being pitched as a destination point for ladies in Tallahassee, Thomasville and the surrounding areas.

Although the exemption can't be applied retroactively to earlier renovations or additions undertaken to accommodate elderly relatives, it can be applied to such projects going forward. According to Property Appraiser Angela Gray, renovations and remodeling going back as far as Jan. 7, 2003 are eligible for the exemption, if they were done for the prescribed reason.

Homeowners who qualify for the exemption can be entitled to tax reduction equal to the amount of the new construction or up to 20% of the homestead value.

To be eligible for the exemption, a property owner must have a homestead exemption on the house where the parent or grandparent quarters are con-

structed. The remodeling or addition must also be properly permitted and comply with all local land development regulations. And copies of all permits, certificate of occupancy and plans must be submitted to the Property Appraisers Office.

Additionally, the remodeling or addition must be completed before Jan. 1 of the year in which the exemption is requested, and each year thereafter, the application must be filed with the Property Appraisers office by March 1.

Others of the requirements: the occupants of the added or remodeled quarters must be a parent or grandparent; the occupant must be at least 62 years of age by Jan. 1 of the year in which the re-

duction is requested; and the occupant must permanently reside on the property on or before Jan. 1 of the year in which application is made.

The exemption ceases as soon as the parent or grandparent dies.

Based on statistics from other counties of similar assessed valuations as Jefferson County, Gray estimates that the annual impact of the exemption here would be between \$1,800 and \$11,000 in lost tax revenues, should 10 people qualify for the exemption.

The ordinance would apply to all taxing jurisdictions within Jefferson County, including the City of Monticello, the Jefferson County School District and the Suwannee and Northwest Florida water management districts.






