Immokalee Redesign Plan wins top Florida award

The plan to redesign Immokalee's central business district has been recognized for its foresight and vision by Florida's top urban planners.

The Florida Planning & Zoning Association gave its top award Friday in Sarasota to the Immokalee Community Redevelopment Agency's (CRA) Public Realm Plan and Central Business District Form-

Based Design Guidelines.

The award was given at a special luncheon during the FZPA's annual convention.

The prestigious award is the first recognition of Immokalee's ambition plan to redesign the community, enhance its quality of life, diversify its economy and reflect its true nature and character as "Florida in the 21st Century."

The Immokalee CRA Public Realm Plan - and the full Immokalee Master Plan - are the products of intense community planning and visioning efforts that, from the outset, were intended to acknowledge and celebrate the diverse

cultural heritage of Immokalee's residents," said Immokalee CRA Director Penny Phillippi.

By following the design and plan, Immokalee's downtown will be transformed into a fiesta of business - shops & restaurants - colorfully and architecturally pleasing to the eye and friendly to pedestrian and bicycle traffic with public plazas at both ends of Main Street and

a shopping district extending to the Seminole Immokalee Casino and future hotel/entertainment complex.

The plan was developed in cooperation with Land Design Innovations, Inc., of Orlando and RWA consulting engineers led by Naples planner Bob Mulhere.




Mosaic art repaired after lightning strike

To this day, muralist Carlos Alves doesn't know what to make of the lightning bolt that plunged from the sky and ripped into the mosaic he had crafted on the wall of Immokalee Community School.

"Think about it," marvels the Miami artist. "What does it take to pull tile off a wall? It was a new

thing in my world, and I've worked on four continents."

Maria Jimenez still remembers that summer day in 2008. Jimenez is director of the school and another charter school south of Tampa, both of which are operated by Redlands Christian Migrant Association. School was out for the summer, so only a handful of adults were in RCMA's three-story school building at 123 N Fourth St. in Immokalee.

When the lightning struck, Jimenez said, "The whole building shook."

Alves' colorful tiles and ceramic shards broke free from the bottom third of Immokalee Morning, and pelted the sidewalk. The central third also was damaged and required repairs.

Recently, after the school obtained a

\$1,000 donation to cover the costs, Alves put his mural back together.

Bystanders theorized that the mosaic became a magnet for the lightning because Alves uses colorful glazes containing metals such as cobalt and chrome.

"Who knows?" he asked. "Thank God I'm still around to Humpty Dumpty that one."

Volunteers reach out to community

The people of Immokalee continue to be blessed by caring groups who "beat the heat" and come out to assist I HOPE in its collaborative efforts to improve living conditions throughout the community. A group of nearly twenty youth and their adult sponsors arrived in Immokalee late Sunday evening and are spending the week on a number of projects to assist I HOPE in their ministry of rehabbing homes.

World Vision is one of our partnering organizations who arranged for this missions group to come to our community. These folks are from Palm Beach Community Church (UMC), and decided they wanted to stay in state and help out with our projects. The Community Foundation of Collier County, Immokalee Initiative has provided funding to purchase materials for the projects through the Chase grant that they obtained. Bethel Assembly of God Church is providing housing facilities for the group at the "former Johnson Ranch" just north of town.

Part of the group is working on repairing, replacing the roof on some mobile homes in Tara Park, and are redoing some ceilings and doing other needed repairs to their homes. Another part of their team is in Naples, helping I HOPE staff strip out homes

that are soon to be demolished to make way for the expansion of Vanderbilt Beach Parkway. The County Department of Transportation has kindly selected I HOPE to go in and strip out doors, windows, cabinets, air conditioning units, water systems, and some appliances and use them either to sell or to fix up homes that are in need of repairs. Being a faith-based operation, all of I HOPE's work is done at no cost to the homeowners, thanks to the partners who are working with them. Another partner that has been of great help is Home Depot who has listed I HOPE as their "Charity of Choice" and have provided truckloads of goods that are able to be used in the projects. First Baptist Church in Immokalee also is an active partner, allowing I HOPE to work out of their church facility at the corner of Lake Trafford Road and Rte. 29.





Over 50 students at Immokalee High School will be traveling to Louisville, Kentucky to compete in the National Beta Convention June 29 – July 3, thanks in large part, to the generosity of Suncoast for Kids Foundation, funded by Suncoast Schools Federal Credit Union (Suncoast Schools FCU), a major partner to The Education Foundation of Collier County.

The Immokalee High Beta Club has been serving and leading in the community for almost fifty-five years. Students First

Summer begins - See you in August!

This will be the last time we'll visit for now, but we'll resume our weekly Students First columns in August, right before the new school year begins on Aug. 23. Last week we shared some tips to help keep your kids engaged in education during the 10-week summer break. We've got more to share this week. The concern is that some elementary school students can lose about three months worth of reading skills in the summer and the same can apply to math. So while we shared reading tips last week, here are some ways to help keep our kids sharp when it comes to doing their math. Going grocery shopping gives you the chance to practice basic math facts. Have your child keep a running tally of how much you're spending. This can be simple counting and then adding as you put things in the shopping cart. Teaching kids how to read labels on the shelves underneath the products is good. These are the ones showing the cost per unit. Your child can make comparisons and then help you decide which one is the best buy. And those 2-for-1 or "BOGO" items – the buy-one, get-one-free deals – give kids the chance to apply basic math facts. How much are you saving? In the car, you can talk about the number of miles driven, or check elapsed



time between stops. Practicing the counting of money and then giving change would be a good thing to do. It's a lost art, but as a lesson, it would be very helpful.

Have your child tell you the time. In the kitchen, have your child help you do the measuring, and reading recipes would be good as both a math and reading lesson. Just keeping numbers in front of the kids, doing the reading things we talked about last week, and introducing new vocabulary words from time to time will do a lot to keep learning alive over the summer months. A new word each day would be cool. Now older kids can lose ground with their education as well. If you travel, by air or car, have an older child do some research in advance of the trip to learn about the cities and states that you'll be passing through, and have him or her research your actual vacation destination as well. Along the way in the car, have them look for interesting things and make notes about them, or write about them in a journal or diary. Best part, this might save you from hearing the dreaded "are we there yet?" And try to make sure the older kids read books during the summer as well. Whatever you do, make it all fun. Summer is supposed to be fun! We hope you have a great summer!

The Collier County Sheriff's Office has created printable Father's Day cards that offer dads the gift they value above all others - their child's safety.

Two cards are available. One is designed for children and adolescents and the other is geared toward older teens. Both are free and contain a safety pledge for children to sign and present to dad as a Father's Day gift.

Children and adolescents promise to follow several rules for Internet safety and bi-

cycle safety.

For older teens, the pledge is all about safe driving. Teens who sign the Father's Day card promise dad that they will not text message or talk on the phone while driving. They also pledge to not to get in a car with someone who has been drinking and to call for a ride home. Both cards are free and available at www.colliersheriff.org/fathers-day or at your local Sheriff's substation.

CCSO warns against ATM fraud

There have been recent reports of scanning/skimmer devices found on local ATMs. Skimmers could be at a bank, store, gas station or any ATM location.

Skimmers allow criminals to capture debit or credit card data so that the information can be placed on white cards (Blank cards). Additionally, there are often cameras covertly hidden to capture personal identification numbers (PINs). To reduce the likelihood that your card and/or PIN are compromised consider doing the following:

- Cover the pad with your free hand when entering your PIN number.
- Use the same ATM machine each time

so that if there is a change in the machine (such as an added slot cover) you will be more likely to recognize the potential problem.

Notify bank officials or local law enforcement if you notice anything suspicious when conducting transactions at ATMs.

Be sure to get your card back and clear the screen when finished with your transaction.

Check your bank statements regularly.

Local activist and community volunteer, Marcus Hepburn dies

Marcus Hepburn, a devout Catholic who spent a career helping the less fortunate, died Tuesday, June 8. Hepburn, 63, after a fall in a home accident on May 30. He was hospitalized and died from complications.

He was the emergency manager for the Florida Catholic Conference, charged with coordinating natural disaster response among the state's seven Catholic dioceses. Marcus spent time in Immokalee after Hurricane Wilma working with I HOPE and other local organizations to be certain that migrant farm workers and their families

were included in the 'system' of warning and preparation for future disasters. He was very a vocal and active advocate for the underprivileged serving the past two years as the president of Florida VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster), and last month hosted the National VOAD's annual meeting in Orlando. He was also a former Florida Department of Community Affairs official. He was a president of the Tallahassee Homeless Coalition and member of Tallahassee Equality Action Ministry, which works on social justice issues. He was the Florida chair of the national Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster.

Hepburn is survived by his wife and a daughter.


