

Master Plan vote delayed yet again

Collier County commissioners kicked the Immokalee Master Plan can down the road one more time at their September 11 meeting. After four hours of talking, listening and quick attempts at reevaluating the plan, in the end the board voted 3-2 to continue the final vote until their September 25 meeting. The deadline to adopt the plan is September 27. The motion was made by Commissioner Jim Colet-

ta and seconded by Commissioner Donna Fiala.

Tempers flared a little and frustration showed as the session went on. An attempt by Commissioner Tom Henning to pass a stripped down version of the plan died for lack of a second as did one by Commissioner Georgia Hiller to

The marathon discussion concentrated on density and intensity issues for residential and commercial zoning, airport expansion, proposed changes to SR 29, the migrant housing and the accep-

tance of established older mobile homes and the proposed by-pass.

Speakers differed on how to interpret the straw ballot that passed 279 to 137 (67 percent in favor), keeping the proposal on life support.

If the board does not pass the Master Plan in some form, Immokalee's future growth guide will revert to the old plan.

The original plan was first implemented ten years ago and has governed how and where growth appears in Immokalee. The new

plan has been the subject of many meetings and discussions over the past year, but only in recent months did it become so controversial. The part of the Lake Trafford Camp Keais Strand System in the Immokalee Urban Area would be treated as neutral lands for vegetation retention.

The new plan was the subject of numerous community meetings throughout the year and received input from the commu-

nity to rework the old Master Plan, including amendments to Immokalee Master Plan and Immokalee Area Master Plan Future Land Use Map.

Changes called for would increase commercial acreage, industrial acreage and residential density. It would eliminate some existing designations, create new ones for Immokalee Regional Airport and redesignate about 103 acres to Immokalee Urban Area from agricultural/rural.

The proposed plan is endorsed by the CRA.

E-permitting cuts time and costs

Florida's Building Code requires permits for numerous construction tasks. The requirements are standard and stringent to ensure public health, safety and welfare throughout the building industry.

To expedite permitting for customers, Collier County staff developed the first phase of an electronic permitting system that saves citizens' time and cuts costs.

At colliergov.net/permits, contractors and property owners have access to the newly-created electronic program where they can submit permit requests in 10 areas: residential demolitions; air conditioning replacement; reroofs; shutters, doors and windows; fences; minor electric; solar panel install; gas install; minor plumbing; and well installs.

E-permitting services are part of the GMD's goal to improve customer service

According to planners, the Master Plan "promotes and facilitates the revitalization of the downtown area." It would also put Immokalee's density policies more in line with the rest of the county, they say.

Commissioner Coletta urged the community to let the CRA "work it out." He said he'd love to see the community come to a favorable conclusion, not see "one or two people dictate" the outcome.

Commissioner Fred Coyle said "I keep waiting for the people of Immokalee to turn-out en force." however, he said he has not seen an overwhelming majority of the community involved, only a "few fighters." He added that Commissioner Coletta "led the fight" and it "cost him dearly."

Last year, an estimated 15,000 people attended the three-day festival.

"Our inaugural success showed that Southwest Florida was hungry for barbecue," said Jim Gibson, director of marketing at Seminole Casino Immokalee. "We look forward to bringing even more great-tasting food, legendary performers and unique attractions for the community and area visitors to enjoy."

Attention Hunters...Hog Hunt permits to be issued

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission would like to announce that they will be issuing permits for two wild hog hunts on Fisheating Creek Wildlife Management Area, west of U.S. 27. The two hog control hunts will be on Oct. 20-21 and Oct. 27-28. Twenty-five permits will be issued for each hunt. Permits will be available on a first-come, first-served basis to individuals 16 years of age or older. Permit distribution will take place at the Fisheating Creek WMA check-station at the FEC Campground in Palmdale on Saturday, Oct. 13, beginning at 10 a.m. Individuals must be present to receive a permit. Permittees will be allowed to take wild hogs with no size or bag limit. The use of dogs is prohibited. Firearms will be limited to a shotgun with #1 buckshot or larger. 



Take a loved one to the doctor day recognized

Sept. 18 is Take a Loved One to the Doctor Day. Floridians are encouraged to empower their family and friends to make an appointment to see a healthcare provider, attend a health event in the community, or TAKE their friend, neighbor or family member to the doctor on this day. The Florida Department of Health urges all Floridians to focus on prevention and early detection.

According to the Summary of Health Statistics for US Adults: National Health Interview Survey 2010 (http://www.cdc.gov/nchs/data/series/sr_10/sr10_252.pdf) gender, ethnicity, education, income and age all play a role in the likelihood someone will visit a medical or dental provider.

•73% of women and 59% of men last contacted a doctor or other health professional in the previous six months. Men were

less likely to have contacted a doctor within the last year or more. In addition, men were more likely to have never contacted a doctor.

•46% of women last contacted a dental health professional within the previous 6 months compared with 40% of men.

•Hispanic adults were more than 3x less likely to have had contact with a health professional as non-Hispanic black adults and 4 ½ times less likely to have had contact with a health professional as non-Hispanic white adults.

•Non-Hispanic white adults were more likely to have contacted a dental professional within the previous 6 months (48%) than either non-Hispanic black adults (31%) or Hispanic adults (30%).

Overall, 20% of adults aged 18 years and over had not made an office visit to a health provider in the past 12 months. Take a Loved One to the Doctor Day encourages individuals to take charge of their health by visiting a healthcare professional (a doctor, a nurse, a dentist, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant or another health provider) and participating in health screenings. "Identifying an acute or chronic condition in a medical provider's office early can often significantly reduce the emotional, physical and financial toll on an individual and his family, suggests, Dr. Joan Colfer, Director of the Collier County Health Department.

West Nile special considerations made for homeless populations

West Nile virus (WNV) illness and other mosquito-borne viral diseases pose a significant risk to homeless populations due to their extensive outdoor exposure and their limited access to preventive measures, which puts them at increased risk for mosquito bites. It is important for people who provide support and care of homeless persons to take action to prevent mosquito bites, especially for individuals over the age of 50, or persons with underlying health conditions who are most likely to develop severe infections. Special considerations include:

Cost:

•Access to insect repellents among all persons with limited financial resources is problematic.

•Community partners, such as mosquito control districts, businesses and not-for-profits may be able to assist with repellent supplies or may have recommendations for lower cost products.

Personal Hygiene:

•Repellents must be applied according to label.

•If repellants are supplied the need to follow label requirements must be emphasized in a way that will be understood by the population being served.

•Bathing is recommended when returning indoors after using repellants such as DEET that may be applied directly to the skin.

•Homeless populations have limited opportunities to bathe between repellent applications.

Mosquito Bite Prevention:

•Although mosquito-borne illnesses can occur year-round in Florida, highest risk is during summer and fall; mosquito

bite prevention is most critical during these seasons

•Applying repellents to clothing may be useful for homeless populations.

Protection from one application of the repellent permethrin can last as long as six weeks. Permethrin should not be applied directly on the skin.

•Providing comfortable clothing that covers skin such as socks, long-sleeve shirts and pants can further prevent mosquito bites.

•Shelters should maintain intact screens over doors and windows, and encourage staff and residents to not prop open doors and windows unless covered with intact screens.

•The homeless should be encouraged to seek indoor shelter at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes that transmit WNV are most active.

•Targeted mosquito control efforts in areas the homeless congregate may be beneficial including:

Maintaining vegetation and picking up debris that can harbor mosquitoes.

Regular adulticide and larvicide treatments by mosquito control in areas that the homeless congregate, including near parks and shelters.
