

FEMA flood zones topic at Rotary



On Wednesday, Oct. 10, Rotarian Tim Nance spoke with members about the new FEMA designated flood zones and provided maps showing how much of Collier County is now within the federal identifiable flood zone, and explained some of the future problems we face. As most of you are already aware, FEMA has spent almost ten years working on these new guidelines, Nance said. As a result, virtually 90 percent of mainland America is now in a flood zone.

Immokalee Health Day, held at the Collier County Health Department - Immokalee Center from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. on Oct. 13, was a tremendous success, reports Nancy Frees, Immokalee Health Center administrator, Collier County Health Department.

Nearly 400 people attended, most who took advantage of the free screenings. Participants were able to obtain eye screening for diabetics, blood pressure and blood sugar testing, as well as receive food and education and information about community resources.

and you can see that even Immokalee, one of the highest points in Collier, is almost totally in the new flood zone designation. The Flood Zone Classification map shows how FEMA plans on designating what falls into a flood zone.”

Continuing, he told the club members that the Collier County map shows how much of the Immokalee area comes under the new FEMA guidelines as to what now becomes 'flood zone' property.

“As you can see, the greater part of our

community is considered to be below FEMA's new guideline, and means more of our citizens will now be required to purchase flood insurance. We need to speak out in a very loud voice. To help us in this, each of us needs to contact our insurance agent and ask them for a declaration of status for our properties. Don't wait for your mortgage holder to do this! It will cost you about six or seven times the actual cost if, in fact, you even need the extra coverage. Hopefully, many of you will be in the 'yellow' areas,” he said.

“And, if you haven't already signed the petitions being circulated in the community, please see Fred Thomas as soon as possible,” stated Mr. Nance.

Approximately 200 children benefited from dental screening complimentary of the Ronald McDonald Van. The Naples Lions's Club performed eye exams on over 300 attendees. Many received blood pressure checks.

“This Health Day event was invaluable toward raising awareness about one's health. Illnesses such as hypertension and diabetes can be silent. Through screening, we identified six individuals who had significantly high blood sugars. All of these folks are now receiving appropriate medical care which will help them avoid complications and improve the quality of their health,” explains Ms. Frees.

During the event, 380 boxes of food were given out by the Harry Chapin Food Bank.

Health Dept. offers HIV/STD testing

With Season and the traditional influx of part-time residents and visitors upon us, the Collier County Health Department is promoting its preventive efforts to optimally protect our population from sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV.

- 1 in 4 Americans has an STD.
- Almost half of the STDs occur in individuals between 15 and 24 years old.
- Every 9½ minutes, someone in the United States is infected with HIV.
- An estimated 56,300 Americans each year are newly infected with HIV, the virus that causes AIDS.
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) data indicates that there are now over 1.7 million Americans living with HIV, approximately 100,000 people living with HIV in Florida and at least 25 percent of those individuals do not even know that they are HIV-positive.
- In Florida 1 in 202 Floridians are HIV infected: specifically 1 in 64 Blacks, 1 in 224 Hispanics and 1 in 400 Whites.
- In Collier County, nearly 1000 people are living with HIV. For the past 5 years, Collier has seen an average of 50 new HIV infections annually.

Because of these alarming statistics, for the coming three months, from October 13th

through December 16th, the Collier County Health Department Clinic in Immokalee (419 North 1st Street, Immokalee), will offer free HIV, and STD testing during weekend outreach as follows:

- Sunday, October 21st from 10 – 4 pm
- Sunday, October 28th from 10 - 4 pm
- Sunday, November 4th from 10 – 4 pm
- Sunday, November 18th from 10 – 4 pm
- Sunday, December 2nd from 10 – 4 pm
- Sunday, December 9th from 10 – 4 pm
- Sunday, December 16th from 10 – 4 pm

We encourage everyone to take a FREE HIV and STD test. We will offer rapid HIV test, results in 20 minutes, and traditional HIV and STD tests, with results in two to three weeks. The decision to take the test is the first step in taking responsibility for your health and the health of others with whom you may be intimately involved.



IHS athlete looks to premier bowl game debut

So many little boys share a dream – a dream to play sports in the pros. And in Immokalee, one of those little boy’s dreams started to come true last week. Well, he’s actually not so little anymore. He’s actually a senior at Immokalee High School and a defensive back for the school’s football team. Mackensie Alexander is his name and he’s actually now the first in Immokalee High’s history to be selected to the U.S. Army All-American Bowl – the premier high school football game in the country. A game that has helped launch the careers of football pros such as Tim Tebow, Mark Sanchez, Andrew Luck, and so many other college and NFL stars. The U.S. Army All-American Bowl, set to be played on January 5, 2013, in San Antonio, Texas, features the nation’s finest high school football players in an east versus west gridiron showdown. The Tour is made up of five teams of Bowl and U.S. Army representatives travelling across the country from late September to mid-December announcing all 90 players and 125 marching band musicians to the U.S. Army All-American Bowl. Mackensie was surrounded by his teammates, his family and friends, and Immokalee High School staff, as he reached a goal he made back when he was a sophomore – to become a U.S. Army All-American. His goal was met and his dream began to come true as he was presented with his #13 U.S.

Program helps educators improve student reading skills

Highlands Elementary hosted a reciprocal teaching professional development opportunity with literacy coach and author Lori Oczkus.

Highlands and Village Oaks Elementary schools along with Collier County reading coaches and district personnel gathered at Highlands on Wednesday, Aug. 15, to learn more about reciprocal teaching. Many teachers previously read Oczkus' text *Reciprocal Teaching at Work, Powerful Strategies for Improving Reading Comprehension* through a book study organized by Highlands Elementary reading coach Mary Charles. Lori Oczkus, author and literacy coach facilitated the professional development opportunity. I suppose one of the many reasons families relocate to Southwest Florida is a passion for the game of golf. After our sessions with Lori I shared with mine, "It was like the time you met Arnold Palmer and shook his hand. You just don't want to wash it for a while."

According to Palinscar and Brown (1986) as cited in Oczkus (2010) when reciprocal teaching was used with a group of students for 15-20 days the students' reading on a comprehension assessment increased from 30 percent to 70-80 percent. Reciprocal teaching is most beneficial when implemented as an intervention for struggling readers (Cooper et al., 2000) and when used with low-performing students in urban areas (Carter, 1997) as cited in Oczkus (2010).

As a follow up training Mrs. Oczkus returned to Highlands on Tuesday, Sept. 25 and Wednesday, Sept. 26. Instructional and administrative staff members observed the expert teach students in primary and intermediate classrooms. In first grade, we selected a nonfiction text about properties from our National Geographic science curriculum. She engaged students by using puppets including: Paula the Powerful Predictor, Quincy the Questioner, Clara the Clarifier and Sammy the Summarizer as we read the text. Afterwards, students role played with different types of hand bags Lori had brought in to represent purchasing at the local market. Around the guided reading table, it was extremely effective and powerful to watch Lori implement the strategies of looking up at the ceiling and grabbing a word and karate chopping unknown words to help our students clarify. I returned to our classroom two minutes after the opportunity and began implementing instruction with students.

Highlands Elementary third grade teacher Will Staros shared, "Lori began her lesson with an introduction to the Fab Four and worked it in as a review of the four components. As each student named one of the four she created a graphic organizer on chart paper. This then led into the text, which was slightly difficult, but the topic was bears. She modeled the strategies with her costumes and taught the class the hand motions and how to draw pictures to go with her prediction phase. The class created a four door foldable that they recorded their responses in."

Highlands Elementary fifth grade teacher Joanne Sewell stated, "High level professional development during school work hours! Yes, you heard that right. Author and teacher Lori Oczkus taught an engaging demonstration lesson to my fifth graders on the Water Cycle using a powerful comprehension strategy she calls the Fab Four. Students enjoyed the cooperative and dramatic activities which helped solidify their understanding and use higher level thinking skills.


