## Marvin Ruble joins Collier Honor Flight

The Honor Flight Network is a non-profit organization creating solely to honor America's veterans for all their sacrifices. They fly veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit and reflect at their memorials to honor the service and sacrifices of themselves and their friends. Marvin Ruble, a Vietnam Veteran, the Commander of the VFW in LaBelle and the 1st Vice of the American Legion in LaBelle was honored by being selected to be on the Collier Honor Flight, Saturday, October 20. Together with 75 other Veterans, Marvin Ruble flew to Washington to visit the monuments.

"It was a good, solemn thing for me," Marvin says, "at first I was a little reluctant because I don't feel like a hero, my brothers that gave their lives are the real heroes. The heroes are on that wall in Washington, those are the real ones. I even got to see the White House and the changing of the guards at the Tomb of the Unknown soldier, that was very impressive," Marvin explains.

"I was stationed in Germany first but asked for a transfer to Vietnam. My older brothers had been there and I didn't want

## Guadalupe Center's pre-college summer experience program creates bridge between high school and college

For many teenagers in Immokalee, their only experience with college is what they've seen on TV or in movies – monotonous professors lecturing from a crowded auditorium, students packing football stadiums on game day, and fraternity or sorority parties that get out of control.

That's not the reality, but how would students know otherwise?

Since 2007, students in Guadalupe Center's Tutor Corps Program have been granted opportunities to attend pre-college summer experiences to help bridge the gap between high school and college. In 2017, thanks to

generous supporters Charles and Bunny Salisbury, this program was expanded to include an increased number of students and was formally named the E.G. Salisbury Tutor Corps Summer Academy. This summer, the program sent 25 Immokalee High School students on expense-paid, pre-college summer experiences where they lived on campus and participated in academic programs ranging from one to six weeks in duration.

Students recently gathered with their mentors and Guadalupe Center staff and board members to share their first college experiences through PowerPoint presentations. The evening began with the students popping up out of their seats to declare their many "firsts" – first time on an airplane, first

time on a college campus, first time doing their own laundry, first time away from home.

Junior Christal Hidalgo took her first flight to reach the University of Missouri, and emerged from a second session at the University of Florida certified in CPR. Senior Karen Reyes Santos spent three weeks at Brown University, getting an exclusive look at new software programs being developed in the field of neuroscience. She joked with the audience that she could now read MRIs and perform the card tricks she had learned.

"This experience is one that I'll treasure forever and never forget," Santos said. "The

them to outdo me," Ruble says jokingly. "I spent thirteen months in Vietnam as a combat engineer and a year in Korea after that."

"When we came home from visiting the monuments in Washington we received such a warm welcome I couldn't believe it. Especially seeing my three little grandbabies after a day like that.

I didn't really know people liked us, because when we came back from Vietnam, we did not receive such a warm welcome. We got spit on and called all sorts of names. This Honor Flight really helped me get closure. Of course in a way, you never get closure from something like that, but the way they treated us that day really made me feel like I actually was a hero."

friendships I made I will always remember, and the kindness I was shown by both Brown and the Guadalupe Center is one that I hope to reflect every day."

Students visited Brown University, University of Missouri, Syracuse University, Florida Gulf Coast University, Marquette University and other prestigious institutions to study business, medicine, leadership, engineering, forensic science and other potential college majors. Summer sessions also gave students lessons in the basics of college life, time management and stepping out of one's comfort zone.

"Exposing our Tutor Corps students to higher education can be a life-changing moment for them," said Dawn Montecalvo, Guadalupe Center president. Senior Christian Sorianno-Reyes thought he would enjoy a career in forensic science, and his stay at Syracuse firmly cemented that belief.

"I left my comfort zone and set off on a journey of a lifetime," he said. "I now know that this is exactly what I want to do in college and in life."

Gisselle Hernandez, a junior, attended the University of Florida for two weeks. Although her studies focused on the College of Medicine, students also learned to be careful online because potential employers will Google job applicants and review their social media posts. Hernandez, who also attended University of Missouri, shared the most valuable lesson she learned on her college visits.

"During one of our daily discussion sessions, we heard from a man who had grown up in poverty and had a rough life, but he took his chances and got to the top, and now he is a professor at the University of Missouri," Hernandez said. "I know now that I could do the same."

# 24 year old Immokalee man arrested for beating child

Manuel Hernandez-Jimenez, 24, was arrested for whipping a child with a cord.

The arrest report shows detectives observed lash marks and a small bump on the top of the child's head and a large one on the back of her head. Hernandez-Jimenez's landlord reported hearing Hernandez-Jimenez hitting the girl.

CCSO said, based on the evidence, that Hernandez-Jimenez punished the child for

wetting her pants and may have caused serious injuries to her skull.

Hernandez-Jimenez told deputies he and the child came to the United States six months ago from Guatemala. He said the mother could not come with them because he did not have enough money to pay for the illegal travel.

Hernandez-Jimenez is currently being held in the Collier County jail on a \$100,000 bond.

## Collier County Road Watch

**I-75/Alligator Alley Southbound Rest Area (mile marker 63):** Construction project: Motorists should expect the southbound rest area closed from Wednesday, October 17 through Friday, November 9 while crews resurface the roadway and upgrade the water system at the rest area. The contractor is West Construction, Inc.

**US 41 from Golden Gate Parkway to Orchid Drive:** Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, while crews replace a driveway, weather permitting. **US 41 from Pine Ridge Road to Sandpine Drive: Construction project:** Crews will be placing sidewalk, drainage structures and lighting on the east side of US 41.
