### A Birthday to Remember

Lynn University continues the celebration of its 50th anniversary year; a year that turned out to be one of the most eventful to date as it was kicked off with a history making event, the third and final presidential debate on its campus.

# Tying a Lot of Knots

While hundreds of people filed into the South County Courthouse to answer to their traffic infractions or address other legal matters, in a quiet room in the Self Services Center, Fausto Vladimir Florentino and Cindy Antonia Camacho started the first day of their married lives on Valentine's Day.

"I thought I was going to be a wreck but surprisingly not, I don't have any regrets," Florentino, 31, said. "If you would have asked me a year ago, 'Am I going to be nervous when I get married?' I would have said, 'Oh, sure. I'm going to be sweating bullets.' But I know she is the one, I'm sure and I'm actually calmer than I've been a in a long time."

The Florentinos of Boca Raton were among 38 couples - 11 in Delray Beach - who said their vows to one another at one of the four courthouses, a popular Valentine's Day destination for people desiring to tie the knot. The clerk performed a group wedding for another 31 lovebirds at the National Croquet Center in what's become a tradition for the county clerk's office.

The marriage court sees an average of 7.5 couples on an average day, spokeswoman Kathy Burstein said, but days such as Valentine's and sequential dates (as Dec. 12, 2012) tend to be popular.

About 7,500 brides got hitched in America - a 1,446 percent increase from the less significant 12/12/11, according to a survey conducted by US-based David's Bridal.

"We see a pretty sizeable increase on special occasions," Burstein said. "Last Valentine's Day, we had 38 couples married in the courthouse and in 2011, we had 47 ceremonies that day."

Burstein said there has been more interest in group weddings.

"We just had an email from someone wanting to know how they can sign up for next year and we even haven't gotten over this year yet," she said.

A courthouse wedding cost 93.50 and couples can save \$32.50 by taking a premarital course.

The Florentinos are planning a bigger wedding next year, but getting married before that celebration takes some of the pressure off a single day, Florentino said.

The pair met in a video store four years ago in Lynn, Mass.

Florentino, who had relocated from New York with his company, saw her in an aisle, mustered the courage and approached her.

"It gets even better because I gave him pointers on the movie and tips to watch, and I said nice talking to you, Cindy, 32, said, "Then I went to the other side of the store."

But Florentino grabbed another movie and found her.

"What do you think of this one? Is it good?" she recalled him asking.

"And I said, 'Yes, it was good, I saw it.'"

Again she walked to the other side to see if he really wanted her opinions or in fact, her.

"So the third time, I knew that he really wanted to talk to me," said Cindy, who does quality control for a Lake Worth firm.

They exchanged emails and the rest became history.

"As they say, it pays to be persistent sometimes," Florentino said. "If I wasn't persistent, if I had said twice is enough, we wouldn't be here today."

At 2, little Malachi enjoyed playing drums. He would tap on the drums at his church after service on Sundays and at home, he often improvised - whether on the table or on whatever he found.

So much was his love for drums that his dad bought him a drum set.

"My baby enjoyed music. He loved to sing, play the drums, the piano, and the guitar," Montre Bennett shared with me recently. "He was very active at school and he loved to make people happy."

So it was only appropriate that Mr. Bennett give him a home-going on Saturday befitting of an aspiring drum-major. - with a drum line -. Master Malachi was tragically struck and killed last week as he rushed into the street to greet his father.

Upon learning that, I reached out to my contacts and called a few musicians who once played in bands. Some said they were too rusty or too old to walk from the church to the cemetery but offered to help me search for participants.

Delray Beach Police assistant Chief Jeffrey Goldman said they would be happy to provide officers as traffic escorts.

But it was Village Academy's principal Guarn Sims and Ms. Shirley Bryant from the Achievement Center for Children who saved the day.

Just when I thought we were about to strike out in finding a drum corps, Mr. Sims said although his band was in the infancy stage, some members would participate.

"We would love to be a part of this," Ms. Bryant said. "Let me make some calls ... our kids would love to do this."

I am not surprised by the level of support from the residents of Delray Beach. I am however moved by their

compassion.

The last time I say anything like this was some 12 years ago at a Jazz funeral in New Orleans. Jazz funerals are traditional funerals with music. They typically begin with a march of family, friends and a brass band. The music is normally somber at the beginning of the march and once the ending is near and friends say their final goodbyes, the music becomes more upbeat.

While Saturday may not rise to the level of a Jazz funeral, I am sure Malachi would be proud of his final procession from this earthly life.

Thanks to Samaritans like Ms. Bryant, Mr. Sims and Chief Goldman, Saturday's will be as Mr. Bennett wanted: a celebration of Malachi's life, not a time of mourning.

Kudos to four budding actors who did a stellar performance in a Black History Month play at Mt. Olive Baptist Church recently. Their acting skills and passion spoke volumes about their commitment to the craft and discipline. The directors Christine "LeShay" Ferguson, who also wrote the play, "What you Don't Know, Won't Hurt You," and Fredrina Combs also deserve special recognition. Congrats on a job well done.

### How Good Are you at Worrying?

One of the great wonders of the workplace is the variety of talents and abilities we observe. Some people are natural leaders, others find it easier to follow and support those who lead. Some are especially gifted in administration, directing and delegating tasks, while others are adept at personally handling a multitude of details. Some have natural skills at sales and marketing – they could sell ice to polar bears in northern Canada. Others are talented speakers, while some do their best communicating through writing.

But if there is one “skill” most of us possess in equal measure, it is the capacity for worrying. If we own a business or hold top executive responsibilities, we worry about matters ranging from how to plan for future uncertainties to how to meet next week’s payroll. We worry about deadlines, job promotions, finding a new job, or whether we will receive well-deserved (we believe) pay increases.

If our business relies on a small

number of key clients, we worry about losing them. We worry about how to find new customers. We worry about our competition making changes that could have a detrimental impact on our business. We worry about the weather; the local, national and world economy; the costs of fuel; or how to keep pace with ever-changing technology and market trends.

We are so accomplished at worrying that we even worry when there is absolutely nothing to worry about. We start worrying that soon there will be something to worry about. Maybe this helps us to feel we will be better prepared for when (and if) it happens.

One of the reasons we worry is because it makes us feel like we are doing something when there is nothing else we can do. We feel good to be concerned about a situation – even if we are helpless to do anything about it. But what does worrying accomplish? Experts say at least 90% of the things that worry us never occur, so we have wasted considerable mental and emotional energy on nothing.

Including myself among those that find it easy to worry, I find it comforting and reassuring to regularly remind myself what the Bible has to say about worry:

Instead of worrying, pray. Worrying deprives us of sleep, saps our energy, and disrupts all sense of inner peace. What if you could simply transfer those concerns to someone else with the unshakable assurance that they will be properly addressed? “Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:6-7).

Let God do the worrying. Have you ever tried to lift something heavy and felt relief when someone stronger than you volunteered to carry the weight? That is exactly what God offers to do for us when we commit our worries to Him. “Cast all your anxiety on him (God) because he cares for you” (1 Peter 5:7).

God wants to carry the burden. Has anyone ever told you, “Do not worry. I have it under control”? This is exactly what God is telling us. We worry about things outside of our control, or things that probably will not happen. God tells us, “Relax. I will take care of it. Take a load off yourself.” Jesus said, “Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11:28).

Their natural condition should not be the basis for any discrimination, for any reason, by any organization or religion or any government or part of government in the United States.

The time has come for all people or all races, faiths, and gender to throw away the chains of prejudice that have bound us away from one another because of our ancestors, ancient or recent were afraid of the "others", whoever they might be at any time in our occasionally benighted history.

As a Boy Scout in my youth, Troop 37 of York, Pennsylvania, I earned my Eagle Rank without a thought of any of my friends who might have been turned away for any racial or gender issue.

As an adult, observing the organization's narrow minded, last bastion attitude, I passed over opportunities to contribute or otherwise support the Scouts, although I had learned so much by my scouting experience.

I was happy to see that the organizations was about to change its ways. But then I read that its leaders had forgotten many of the tenants in "Scout Law" by trumpeting to us all that their retreat from prejudice was but a Kabuki dance. Those in scouting who wanted to remain prejudiced and unenlightened would be allowed to retain their discrimination in the proposed "new" order.

Having put one toe in the Rubicon I suggest to the national leadership of the Boy Scouts of America pull out the stops, admit that the time had long since come

to ban any and all discrimination among all boys and men associated with Scouting.

## "West of Memphis" a Backwoods Horror Story of Injustice

"West of Memphis," directed by Amy J. Berg and produced by Peter Jackson and Damien Echols, is a deeply disturbing documentary film at many levels. If you ever fancied yourself an outsider or a bit of a rebel in high school, you will be especially chilled by this miscarriage of justice.

West Memphis is a poor suburb of Memphis, Tennessee, across the river in Arkansas. On June 4, 1993 a triple murder rocked the small town of Blytheville, Arkansas. Three 8-year-old boys were viciously murdered and mutilated. Circumstantial evidence pointed to three high school boys: Damien Echols, Jason Baldwin and Jessie Miskelly.

Damien was portrayed as ringleader of the gang. The fact he had a "death book" and Satanic symbols and skulls and bones in his art work did not help his cause.

The film goes into gruesome detail as to how the boys were murdered: hogtied, mutilated in horrific ways

and thrown into a drainage ditch.

This was a time when conservative Southerners were getting whipped into a frenzy over Satanic cults and blood rituals. All three of the accused were "bottom of the barrel poor white trash." Jessie Miskelly was doing poorly in school and came from a troubled home. Jason Baldwin was borderline retarded. The eight-woman, four-man jury found the boys guilty of murder in 1994. Damien was sentenced to death as the alleged leader.

"I know he's guilty," said one of the jurors grimly after the trial. Jessie and Jason got life in prison.

The first ray of hope for the boys came in 1996 when crusading filmmakers Joe Berlinger and Bruce Sinovsky aired the first of three HBO documentaries: "Paradise Lost: The Child Murders at Robin Hood Hills."

It wasn't hard for the filmmakers to find contradictory and downright false testimony and evidence. I won't

go into the gory details, but there was a reason the dead boys were so mutilated, but it had nothing to do with Satan, or even humans for that matter.

As the years dragged on the imprisoned "West Memphis 3" gained supporters. A very intelligent and dedicated San Francisco lawyer named Lorri Davis began a correspondence with Damien in prison. In 1999 the couple married in prison and Lori dedicated the rest of her life to clearing the name of her husband and the other two "conspirators."

An even bigger boost came when New Zealand filmmaker Peter Jackson and his wife Fran Walsh became interested in the cause. The couple had plenty of resources from Jackson's "Lord of the Rings" films, but even more important was their righteous indignation and their clout



in the film community.

American rock musician and poet Henry Rollins took up the Memphis Three as a personal cause. He was later joined by celebrities like Johnny Depp, Eddie Vedder, Patti Smith, Natalie Maines and others.

Soon top legal experts joined the fight, pro bono. The more they learned, the weaker the state's case looked.

But all is not fair in the legal system; particularly in the rural South. This documentary is quite long- nearly three hours- and it is damning in its proof of misconduct, false witness, superstition, innuendo and hypocritical piety. You may shake your head in disbelief as to what ultimately happened to the West Memphis 3. It is beyond outrageous and a travesty of all that the US legal system is supposed to stand for. Regardless of how you feel about the case, these three young men lost nearly 20 years of their lives. Nothing can bring that back, but worse: the real killer has not been brought to justice.

# Food Review

## Ferraro's Ristorante Italiano

Open for a year or so, this bistro is still trying to become a well-rounded, well run establishment. Service is spotty at best, as is the food.

We started with a taste of the soup of the day, a lobster bisque - creamy, hot and tasty then the Caesar salad consisting of greens and a few croutons; cheese shavings and a discernible Caesar dressing were absent - we then sampled the outsourced dressing and found it just ok - no credit to Caesar. The house salad - Insalata di Angelo was a nice dish in contrast, another salad.. Insalata di Eugenio... is also on the menu.

Appetizers included a smooth and mild eggplant pate, a small crab cake with only faint crab taste but adorned with a nice corn relish it badly needed. Clams casino were small and very breaded, the clams in brodo had a gentle taste in their white wine sauce. Happy to say the bacon wrap scallops (3 in number) were served over polenta and were delicious.

There are nine pasta dishes listed covering a wide variety or types with various accompaniments - we elected to test the pastas with our entrees.

Under the meat-poultry heading, we chose a too-well breaded veal parmigiana with nice sautéed spinach. We then sampled a very fine

osso buco on a bed of saffron risotto - quite delicious, but quite a tiny meat portion.

As for fish - the Diver scallops were perfectly prepared with sun dried tomato and basil over tasty linguini. A portion of pan-seared salmon with apricot and roasted poblano was a nice portion of excellent fish.

We note 16 additional listings as meat...poultry and 4 additional listings under the fish category. There are 4 sides available - sautéed spinach, mushroom sauté, broccoli rabe and roasted beets. Note; not all are necessarily available at one's sitting.

Chef has his choice of making 2 special desserts each evening - they may or may not include panna cotta, lemoncello cake, chocolate fudge cake, tiramisu(this creamy and wonderful). A half dozen other desserts are available.

Serving only wine and beer, this bistro seats 60 inside and up to 30 outside. Open from 5PM to 10PM Monday through Saturday, there is an early bird menu plus Chef's specials daily. Entertainment in the form of an international duo-singer, pianist and violinist - play on Saturday from 7PM to 11PM. Call Ferraro's at 561 -477-2750 for details -visit the bistro at 8208 Glades Road in Boca Raton to try their Northern Italian menu.





# SONNY TURNER

From the moment Sonny Turner steps on stage, it becomes instantly apparent that you are seeing and hearing a show business legend. Since 1959, when Sonny first began touring the world as the lead singer of The Platters, he has carried the legacy of such hits as "Only You", "Twilight Time", "The Great Pretender", "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" and many others.

Sonny breathed new life into the group's catalog of hits when he topped the charts again in the late 60's with songs like "I Love You 1000 Times" and "With This Ring." Sonny remained with The Platters from late 1959 until 1970 when he left to pursue a solo career. You can hear Sonny's voice in various movies such as "The Nutty Professor II" starring Eddie Murphy, "Hearts in Atlantis" starring Anthony Hopkins, and "Prince of the City" starring Robert DeNiro.

In 2005, Mr. Turner received The Lifetime Excellence in Entertainment award presented to him by the Entertainment Consumers' Exchange. In 2009 at Wildwood New Jersey, Sonny Turner was inducted to the Pacific Avenue of the Stars and in 2008, he received the Gateway Classic

Lifetime Achievement Award. He received the Black Music Award in 2007. In addition, Sonny has been inducted into the Beach Music Hall of Fame and Vocal Group Hall of Fame.

Sonny and his group were a smash when they appeared on a recent PBS-TV doo wopp special and remain one of the most popular acts on the international circuit. Sonny frequently travels to Japan, England and South America for the legions of fans following his success story into its sixth decade.

A documentary film on Sonny's life and career is currently in pre-production with Desert Hotel Films. # CHIFFONS

From the Bronx came The Chiffons, making their mark with a string of hits including several produced by none other than Jay Siegel & The Tokens. "He's So Fine", "One Fine Day" and "I Have a Boyfriend" became paragons of the "girl group" sound, topping the charts and leading to appearances on TV's American Bandstand, Hullabaloo and Shindig, as well as Murray the K's live shows at the Brooklyn Fox and shows at the Brooklyn Paramount. By 1964, the group's star had risen so high that they were chosen to open for both The Beatles on their first U.S. appearance and the Rolling Stones on their first U.S. tour. In 1966, with the British Invasion consuming the U.S. charts, The Chiffons accomplished what had been impossible for almost every other American group formed in the early 60's. They had one of the biggest hits of their career that year with "Sweet Talkin' Guy", a record so strong that it would chart again 6 years later, in the U.K. Just 14 years old when she first fronted the group, original lead singer Judy Craig still leads the group today. Their music has been heard in countless movies, TV shows and commercials but there's nothing like seeing The Chiffons live on stage!

# DANNY & THE JUNIORS


FEATURING JOE TERRY

Danny & The Juniors really shine in front of a live audience, but they are no strangers to the screen - both small and large - as well. The group is well known for starring in 3 major motion pictures and making close to 50 appearances on American Bandstand. A personal favorite of Dick Clark, the group owes a debt of gratitude to the Bandstand host for suggesting they change their song "Do the Bop" to "At the Hop."

The rest, as they say, is history. According to Billboard magazine, their 1957 smash "At the Hop" is the #23 biggest-selling record of all time. Teenage lovers flipped the hit record over to find the beautiful back-seat ballad "Sometimes (When We're All Alone)." That B-side found longevity of its own as a favorite of acappella groups and cover bands over the next 50-plus years. The Juniors' follow-up, "Rock & Roll is Here to Stay", remains an anthem for teenagers of the 1950's to this day. Their stage show is embellished with comedy, impressions and audience participation and is regarded as one of the best in the business. They're flying in from their long-time home base of Philadelphia, PA to perform just for you.

# CHARLIE THOMAS' DRIFTERS

Charlie Thomas has been singing professionally since 1952 and he seems to have gotten better with age. His energy and youthful smile belie the 60 years of experience that include a series of ups and downs culminating in a recent resurgence of the Drifters' hits. While The Drifters launched the solo careers of Clyde McPhatter and Ben E. King, Charlie is one of the only members to have stayed with the group long enough to have sang on all of the group's major hits, including "There Goes My Baby", "Up On the Roof", "On Broadway", "This Magic Moment", "Under the Boardwalk" and "Save the Last Dance for Me". In fact, Charlie is the longest-standing member of the group's tenure with Atlantic Records.

The Drifters have seen massive chart success around the world with over 114 million albums sold and a whopping 214 million singles sold. The group is held in the highest regard by fans and fellow artists alike, their recordings often highlighted by the unique use of baion beats and string ensembles. They are credited with providing the link between 1950's rhythm & blues and the soul of the 1960's. The Drifters successfully blended the New York street sound with gospel influences and latin rhythms. Their songs have been covered by everyone from Dolly Parton to Jay & The Americans and Diana Ross to Michael Buble.

The Drifters were one of the first vocal groups to be inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, the same year as the Beatles and the Beach Boys, and the group is listed on Rolling Stone magazine's 100 Greatest Artists of All Time. In addition to the Rock & Roll

Hall of Fame, Charlie has been recognized by every major music organization in existence including the Rhythm & Blues Foundation and the Grammy Hall of Fame.

Unfortunately, like The Platters and The Coasters, The Drifters' name has been hijacked by phony groups and unscrupulous promoters who trick audiences into thinking they're seeing the legendary entertainers who created the recordings they love. Recently, Charlie has played an important role in getting "Truth in Music" legislation passed so that individual states' Attorney Generals would be able to stop and fine imposters. (The act has become law in over 30 states.) Charlie was even featured on the TV program 20/20 in a segment called "Enough" with John Stossel. Today, Charlie Thomas is the only member of the original Drifters still performing with a group. Charlie makes his home just outside of Washington, DC. He and his group are flying in just to be with us for "Pop, Rock & Doo Wopp Live!"

# THE PASSIONS

The street corners of Bensonhurst, Brooklyn were home to many harmonizing quartets and quintets in the 1950's, but few can claim the popularity or success of The Passions. The Passions' recording carer was launched when their manager played them a demo of a beautiful ballad written by a bright new songwriter. (In an interesting footnote, the songwriter, Marv Kalfin, had the demo recorded by his then-unknown-songwriter friends Carole King and Paul Simon.) Arguably no better marriage of song and artist hit the charts in 1959; "Just to Be With You" was the perfect showcase for the sweet tenor lead of Jimmy Gallagher and lush harmonies of The Passions. The group appeared on the TV shows of Dick Clark, Clay Cole and Alan Freed and graced countless stages across the country, touring alongside Chubby Checker and Dion & The Belmonts. Following their debut single, The Passions released the two-sided fan favorite "I Only Want You" b/w "This is My Love". A great rendition of The Cadillacs' classic "Gloria" also charted and remains a highlight of their show to this day. For many years following their break-up, Albee Galione and Lou Rotondo sang with Emil Stucchio, performing and recording as The Classics. Jimmy moved to Florida, where he still lives today. Luckily for us, a few years ago, the three life-long friends reunited and have been touring the country ever since. With the group's already-stellar reputation bolstered by a couple of PBS television appearances, The Passions' fan-base is stronger than ever. The group recently returned from a stint in California and is excited to play the big stage at FAU.

# THE CASCADES' ORIGINAL LEAD SINGER JOHN CLAUDE GUMMOE

November of 1962 gave us one of the most-played records of 20th Century and on Friday, March 8th, we're bringing the singer-songwriter who created it to Boca Raton. The song was "Rhythm of the Rain", the group was The Cascades and their lead singer is John Claude Gummoe. One of the most instantly-recognizable records of the 1960's, "Rhythm of the Rain" went to #1 in almost every country in the world and was recorded in almost any language you can think of. (Ironically, here in the U.S., it peaked at #2, being kept out of the top slot by The Four Seasons' "Walk Like a Man.") Born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio, John formed the group while in the Navy, aboard the U.S.S. Jason AR-8 at port in San Diego. The Cascades became international stars due to the worldwide success of "Rain." The group's single was the incredibly lovely song, "The Last Leaf", but it never came close to measuring up to their debut's success. The group stayed together until about 1975.

"Rhythm of the Rain" has been covered by innumerable artists around the world, and John has recently found a huge following for his music in the Philippines and Japan, and he travels there frequently for sold-out concerts. ## New Traffic Patterns on Palmetto Pk. Rd. in effect on March 5th

On Palmetto Park Rd., just west of Boca Raton Blvd. a traffic sign states, "New Traffic Patterns, Starts 3/5". It has been placed to inform citizens from 9:00PM-6:00AM the west bound lanes will be closed.

For 2 or 3 nights FPL trucks will occupy the closed west bound lane between 4th and 5th Avenues, according to Mike Woika, Assistant City Manager.

Woika said, "Driver's safety was important in scheduling the times FPL will be working on the electric poles aligning the street. The eastbound lanes will serve as both east and west directions during the westbound lane closure."

Similar modifications were done in the same area on the east side of Palmetto Park Rd. 2 weeks ago, but no lane closures were necessary.

"Since the lane changes are set late at night we do not expect there to be problems with traffic, but the sign informs citizens and residents to be aware of the change," said Woika.

John Reilly, a transportation analyst for Boca Raton said, "FPL will be removing and replacing electric poles in compliance with a federal organization the Nuclear Regulatory Commission."

Woika said that the changes to the poles are not a city requirement but one that is implemented by FPL.

Next Tuesday, FPL will work through the nights to update the electric poles to their functioning capacity.

## House Fire in West Boca Raton Affects over Four Homes

A handful of units were damaged by smoke and fire in Boca West Monday.

Firefighters were called to 19389 Waters Reach Trail just before noon and discovered two roofs filled with flames.

They began fighting the fire from the inside but were forced to pull back when the flames raced above them, according to Palm Beach County Fire Rescue

One person was at home at the time but was able to escape without injuries, according to Palm Beach County Fire Rescue Capt. Albert Borroto.

Investigators say 4-to-6 units in the complex were damaged.

Smoke could easily be seen from nearby Yamato Road.

A cause has not yet been determined.

## Boca Raton detectives charge doctor with trafficking

On Thursday, February 21, 2013 a two-year investigation culminated in the arrest of a psychiatrist for trafficking and writing a prescription without a medical need.

The investigation began in February 2011, when Crime Stoppers received an anonymous tip that Dr. James Cocores was prescribing large amounts of oxycodone, or other requested drugs, with little or no questioning or examination. Dr. Cocores is a psychiatrist who specializes in drug abuse treatment and opiate addiction at his practice, Southcoast Psychotherapy & Education Associates, Inc., 5301 North Federal Highway, Boca Raton.

Detectives established an undercover (UC) officer as a prospective patient who was seeking grief counseling/treatment for a traumatic event. During the initial visit, the UC filled out a questionnaire and provided a list of prescribed medications, which included oxycodone, alprazolam, and ibuprophen. Dr. Cocores spoke with the UC about the psychological issues she was experiencing then shifted the topic to a recent physical exam. The UC told Dr. Cocores she was seeing a chiropractor and another doctor for pain management. Dr. Cocores provided suggestions on pain alleviation related to eating habits, walking, lifting and sitting positions, but he did not conduct a physical exam, nor did he take any vital statistics.

During the second visit, the UC stated she was unable to obtain medical records office because law enforcement had shut down the office and seized all patient files. Over several months, Dr. Cocores prescribed multiple medications to the UC, including Xanax, Vicodin, Percocet and Oxycodone. At no time during any of the office

visits did Dr. Cocores conduct any physical exams or diagnostic workups.

On March 6, 2012, detectives ascertained that Dr. Cocores never accessed the State of Florida's Electronic Florida Online Report of Controlled Substances Evaluation program (E-FORCSE), which is Florida's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP), to see if any of his patients were obtaining controlled substances from other practitioners.

On May 23, 2012, detectives met Dr. Cocores's at his office. Detectives requested and received copies of the UC's complete patient file. In August, the UC's patient file and all audio/video evidence were given to a recognized medical expert and a Department of Health (DOH) official for review.

In October 2012, the DOH expert opined that Dr. Cocores failed to meet the standard of care as stipulated by the Florida Board of Medicine in four areas:

1. Dr. Cocores failed to conduct a physical exam and no diagnostic was ever completed.
2. Dr. Cocores failed to establish a treatment plan.
3. Dr. Cocores failed to explore alternate methods of treatment.
4. Dr. Cocores failed in preventing drug abuse and diversion.

The medical expert confirmed the DOH official's opinions.

On February 21, 2013, detectives arrested Dr. James Cocores and charged him with trafficking oxycodone and writing a prescription without a medical need.

## FAU Baseball Hits Its Way Past No. 23 FGCU

Florida Atlantic University's baseball team tallied 12 hits in a 9-8 victory over No. 23 Florida Gulf Coast University. Senior Hugh Adams became FAU's all-time career saves leader.

The Owls scored two in the bottom of the first. Nathan Pittman led-off the game with a single. Levi Meyer followed with a hit and run to put runners on first and second. Pittman would steal third before Tyler Rocklein drew a walk. Senior catcher Mike Spano, 2-for-4 with two RBI, then dropped a hit into center to put the Owls up 2-0. FGCU grabbed one in the third and four in the fifth by capitalizing on an FAU error, three hits and two walks to take a 5-3 lead.

The Owls would return the favor in the bottom of the sixth with five two-out runs. Corey Keller led-off the sixth with a single. Rocklein then reached first on an error by the FGCU third baseman. With two outs, Mitch Morales hit a double down the right field line to score Keller. Two more were added via a double to left by Sean Murrell. Nathan Pittman, who was 3-for-4 with two runs scored and two stolen bases on the night, drove in the fifth run of the inning.

FAU would hold the Eagles scoreless through the next two frames while adding a run in the seventh and eighth. Keller lead-off

the seventh with a double down the left line. He moved to third on a bunt single by Rocklein, who was 1-for-3 with an RBI. Rocklein would steal second and Keller would score on a wild pitch. The run in the eighth proved pivotal at game's end. Billy Endris drew a pinch hit walk to start the inning. He was sacrificed to second by Pittman and stole third one the next pitch putting himself in position to score on a sac fly to right. Holding a 9-5 lead the Owls went to the pen in the ninth only to give up three before closing out the game with the potential winning run on base.

The Owls pitching staff, which has not allowed an extra base hit in the last 38 innings, used five pitchers in the victory. Brandon Rhodes, who drew his second start and third appearance, held FGCU to two runs, one earned after 4.3 innings of work. He was relieved in the fifth by senior Kevin Alexander (1-0), who inherited a runner on second that later scored on a sacrifice bunt to even the score at two. Alexander pitched 2.6 innings and was credited with the victory. Michael Sylvestri pitched a scoreless eighth while Bo Logan started the ninth before he was relieved after three earned runs on two hits. He gave way to Hugh Adams who struck out one along the way to his third save of the season and 17th of his career to become FAU's all-time career saves leader.

## Lynn's Women's Golf Finishes Runner-Up at Lady Moc Classic

Lakeland, Fla. — Lynn University's third-ranked women's golf team powered through the rain and windy conditions to take second place at the Lady Moc Golf Classic on Tuesday afternoon. Jessica Bradley and Samantha Smolen each claimed top-10 finishes while the Fighting Knights 898 team score is the fourth-lowest in 15-year history of the tournament.

Posting the third-lowest score of the day at 302, LU was able to hold off a furious charge from No. 2 Rollins (901) in third place but lost ground on top-ranked Nova Southeastern (880), who won for the third time in the last four years. West Florida (922) remained fourth and Armstrong Atlantic (924) broke a three-way tie to claim fifth at The Club at Eaglebrooke.

Bradley had her best showing of the season with a 221 total in tying for third individually. The Bishops Nympton, England, native was second in the field with 10 birdies, tied for third in par four scoring (+4) and tied for seventh in par five scoring (-1).

Sitting outside the top-10 heading into the final day,

Smolen snuck into a tie for seventh with a final round 74 for a 223 score. This is her team-leading fourth top-10 finish of the season. Irene Calvo, unfortunately, slipped outside the top-10 after carding an 81 to close out competition with a 227.

Louise Manalo and Ellen Chambers maintained their consistency throughout the 54-hole event, as Manalo shot 77 for the second consecutive round and Chambers posted a 76. Rounding out the Fighting Knights contingent was Estefania Buritica. The junior from Pereira, Colombia, logged her two-lowest rounds of the season on the opening day and finished with a 234 total, respectively.
