

Teen drivers learn hard lessons the safe way

Two men turn tragedies into positives and save lives in the process.

PALMETTO — Bruce Murakami spent three years working to ensure the young man who killed his wife and 11-year-old child was punished. He hired a private investigator and crime scene reconstruction experts. He relentlessly pursued prosecutors to bring charges against the 19-year-old who, while street racing in Tampa, slammed into the minivan his wife was driving. He wanted justice.

Standing on the verge of success, with the young man Jason Cabezas pleading guilty to two counts of manslaughter, Murakami chose a different course. He asked the judge to withhold the guilty plea. He had forgiven Cabezas and, instead of a possible 30-year prison sentence, he asked the judge to allow both him and Cabezas to work together to educate teenagers about safe driving.

"Once the idea of forgiveness flowed into my mind and heart, I started thinking how I could turn something so negative into something positive," Murakami said.

His change of heart came after meeting Cabezas alone and he realized that Jason was in as much pain as he was. The result was a nonprofit organization known as Safe Teen Driver, dedicated to teaching young people about the dangers of reckless driving and working towards helping victims and families of all vehicular crimes.

Together Murakami and Cabezas have spoken to students at high schools across Hillsborough County and they have appeared on NBC's Dateline

Fishing for answers

RUSKIN — Groundbreaking research is taking place on a quiet Ruskin street that could affect the rest of the world.

What would happen if non-native species of fish got loose in rivers and lakes? How would they interact with the natural inhabitants? How would the habitat change? Would the species intermingle, or would one overtake the other until none were left?

This is only one of the areas being explored at the University of Florida's Tropical Aquaculture Laboratory on 24th Street.

Following federal budget cuts of \$300,000, the lab's director Craig Watson has had to find funding elsewhere to keep answering these questions and diagnosing the diseases of commercially-sold edible and tropical fish.

Substantial changes may be in Sun City Center's future

SUN CITY CENTER — As this community continues celebration of its 50th anniversary, consideration of major alterations that could change its face also is on the horizon.

A series of three town hall meetings focusing on different but related aspects of possible capital improvements across the community has been scheduled by the SCC Community Association board, according to Ed Barnes, its president.

The first session is slated for Wednesday, November 16, to sketch out for CA members "the big picture, the what and how and why" of a new multi-million dollar enhancement and expansion program aimed at upgrading the community's famed amenities as it embarks on its next half century, Barnes said.

The second town hall is set for Thursday, December 15, to explore with residents the details of a potential master plan layout. A third meeting is on tap for January 19, 2012, to review the evolving "full blown plan" and to look at the financing options available, he added.

Each session is to be held in Community Hall on South Pebble Beach Boulevard.

The multi-faceted improvements project got underway earlier this year when the CA board proposed a slate of 10 potential additions and



and the Oprah Winfrey show. In his wife Cindy's and daughter Chelsea's memory, the mission continues.

Barry Marcone is a different kind of victim of vehicular crime. In 2007, his son, Chris, drove while drunk and killed a 13-year-old girl. Chris was sentenced to 13 years in prison — one year for each year of his victim's life.

He saw the suffering and the grief of the young victim's family. He saw his son agonize over what he had done and the realization that there was no way for him to take it back or to make things right. Barry could not condone what his son had done, but he was still Chris's father.

Like Bruce Murakami, Barry looked for something, anything, positive that could result from the devastation. Today Chris is in prison. On Monday morning, Barry

stood before students at East Bay High School to tell his story, to help young people understand that drinking and driving can not only destroy their lives, but also the lives of their families and of innocent victims. It has been four years since his son took the life of a young girl — not enough time to heal the wounds. The pain remains in his eyes and in his words.

On Sunday, Bruce Murakami and Barry Marcone met with teenagers and their parents at Andersen RacePark on U.S. Highway 41 in Palmetto as part of Murakami's Safe Teen Driver program known as TRACK — Teaching Road Awareness and Consequences to Kids. TRACK is designed to give teenagers the opportunity to experience and practice driving skills and to learn from experience how alcohol or drugs can impair their driving abilities.

The program is designed to be not

only eye-opening and educational, but also to allow the young people to have some fun on the racetrack. For the young people who take part, Murakami insists that at least one parent or guardian be on hand for the entire program.

"Parents need to understand they play a far more important role than they may realize in educating their children," he said.

Standing next to the racetrack, Mike Shirley, along with Sean Washington, of East Bay High School's Driver Education department, gave the teens the bottom line. Drinking or using drugs while driving will end their lives as they know it. If celebrities and sports stars aren't cool enough to talk their way out of such situations, they shouldn't fool themselves into thinking they'll have the ability. He handed one girl a large pair of goggles, known as Fatal Vision Goggles, designed to simulate what a drug or alcohol impaired person might see. He asked her to walk over to a nearby golf cart and drive a course of orange cones. She staggered to the cart, slowly sat down and took off, running over cones as she went. In a real-world situation, those cones could have been street signs, or an innocent bicyclist, or a 13-year-old girl.

As part of the course, the young people also gained firsthand knowledge of the real dangers of distracted driving, such as what happens when using a cell phone while driving.

Barry Marcone created driving-sober.net, a website filled with the stories of victims and with resources for young people to help guide them away from becoming the next statistic.

"Car crashes are the leading cause of death among teens," Marcone said. "Together we can change that."

Four years ago, Barry Marcone's son was sent to prison for killing a 13-year-old girl while driving drunk. Today Marcone has dedicated himself to educating young people about the dangers of driving while impaired. For Marcone, the pain is still visible in his eyes and heard in his voice.



Also on the website is a letter his son wrote from prison.

My name is Christopher S. Marcone and I am an inmate of the Florida Department of Corrections. I am serving [a] 13-year prison sentence for D.U.I. manslaughter. On April 12, 2007, I made a fatal mistake of getting behind a wheel drunk. Because of my intoxication I ended up running a stop sign and hit an oncoming car. A thirteen year old girl lost her life and three others were critically injured as a result of this accident that I caused. After I serve my time and my sentence is up I will once again be able to reunite with my family and friends. That will never happen for the family and friends of the young girl that was killed due to my reckless actions. Although I will eventually be released and sent home to be with my loved ones, I will live with this accident for the rest of my life.

Chris will be 37-years-old at the end of his sentence.

Marcone's nonprofit organization doesn't earn or seek revenue or donations of any kind, so he continues to work for a paycheck to keep it going, to do what he can to ensure that no other parent will lose a child to a drunk or drug-impaired driver — or to the bars of a state prison. But



most of all, he wants to protect young people.

"This is for the kids. That's what it's all about," he said. "It's hard sometimes, but you have to follow your heart."

On Monday morning at East Bay High School standing before a group of students telling a very difficult story, he did just that.

The next TRACK event will take place on Nov. 6, 2011, from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and is open to young people from 14 to 18 years old. One parent or guardian must be on hand for the entire program. To register, visit www.safeteendriver.org.

South County says farewell to long-time volunteer

Kenneth "Mac" McComb retires from "retirement"

RUSKIN - Sept. 29 wasn't a run-of-the-mill afternoon at the South County Regional Service Center on Ruskin's 30th Street.

Men, women and children, many in various types of uniforms, toted food from their vehicles into the building for a party given in honor of one of South County's busiest volunteers, Kenneth "Mac" McComb.

Joan Noble of the SouthShore Community Justice Center, Eileen Burke and Mary Valesano from the school system, and Vanessa Ortiz of Florida Home Partnership, had joined forces to throw a bash for McComb as he retires from the jobs he has done during his 15 years of "retirement" while living in Sun City Center.

Later this month McComb is moving to Maryland to be near his daughter Pam and son-in-law Joe who were present at the party.

The trio enlisted help from the various organizations for which Mac has volunteered, including the YES program in Wimauma (Youth Environmental Service), the sheriff's office, several schools

at which he has tutored, mentored and otherwise offered his services, and members of the many boards on which he has served.

In the 15 years since he retired and moved from Maryland to Sun City Center, he has held many positions at both the hands-on and advisory levels that have helped hundreds of South County's residents.

People he has known and helped, including children he has tutored, showed up in force.

"I'll never forget him. He greeted me on my first day," said Roy Moral, who is now principal at Cypress Creek Elementary School. That was in 2007 when Moral was assigned to Wimauma Elementary, where McComb spent a great deal of time.

McComb's friend Dorothy Cuttle and her daughter, Carolyn Robinson were among the guests who said they were glad McComb would be with family but were sorry to see him go.

"He's a wonderful person," Cuttle said.

A large projection screen in the front of the room flashed photographs of McComb's volunteer activities over the years; with groups

of children; laughing with friends; and at the speaker's podium at events bringing attention to those less fortunate who needed assistance of some kind.

His daughter Pam talked about family things in his past that his South County friends didn't know about, like how he had proposed to their mother seven times.

"He met our mother in church on Easter Sunday, June 29, 1949. When they were courting, he kept asking her if he could see her apartment. She said no over and over. Then one day she said, all right, you can see it. Dad took a look around, and then said, fine, now he had seen it, and left. I think he just wanted to see if she was a good housekeeper," his daughter said.

Many heartwarming stories later, often accompanied by tears, Pam turned the microphone over to her father.

He said he had greatly enjoyed his time in South County.

"I live in Ruskin and Wimauma and sleep in Sun City Center," he said, referring to his volunteerism.

"I've been all over the world and from what I've experienced, the people here have a real heart for the down-and-out," he said. "People here contribute more in this area than I've seen anywhere else in the world. There's a real spirit of community here. I think it's life as it should be lived." And McComb has truly seen the world.

"I talked my mother into lying about my age so I could go into the Marine Corps. Then when the war was over I got out and got my degree in sociology on the GI Bill," he said.

Since then he has worked with children and youth, mostly delinquent youth, before moving to Florida.

He and his friend Dorothy Cuttle, said it was a bittersweet event for them as he will be joining his family in Maryland and she will continue to reside in Sun City Center.

While with the Department of Welfare stationed in Washington, D.C., he was a senior counselor for delinquent and dependent youth. He also served as a personnel officer and assistant to the director for the Department of Corrections.

Here in South County, the father of two, now 83, has served as president of the Wimauma Area Improvement Authority, chairman of Youth Environmental Services Inc., and been a member of the sheriff's office Wimauma Community Council.

He's also on the advisory board

and is a certified community mediator for the SouthShore Community Justice Center; is a member of the Community Foundation of Greater Sun City Center and the Balm-Wimauma Area Housing Partnership; and is an active substitute teacher at Wimauma, Cypress Creek, Ruskin and Gibsonton elementary schools.

"Volunteers get more out of volunteering than those receiving the help," McComb told the crowd gathered in his honor. "I have enjoyed every minute of helping people turn their lives around."

POSITIVE TALK

Taking the fear out of the phone

Technology is changing the world and it is not hard to understand why many of us develop a fear of some new piece of equipment, especially in the era of the smart phone. If it's something we don't have to deal with regularly, then we can overlook it. But if it is something with which we often come into contact, we have to do everything possible to overcome the fear. Believe it or not, one of the phobias (or fears) that many people have today is telephone phobia—the fear of using the telephone. The Encyclopedia of Phobias—Fears and Anxieties gives this problem a rather large write up and it deserves to be treated seriously.

You may not be a person who doesn't fear using the telephone, but I bet you know someone who does. Show this column to them. If you happen to be afflicted with this malady, here are some ideas to make you feel more comfortable while using the telephone. If you're not uncomfortable with the telephone, these ideas may make your use of the telephone more efficient.

1. Know to whom you wish to speak. If you don't know, ask the party who answers, "Who has the authority and knowledge to help me attain my goal?"

2. Be assertive in your tone and manner. The best book on assertiveness is called, When I Say No, I feel Guilty. Maintain control of the conversation from the beginning by staying on the subject—which brings us to number three.

3. Make notes on what you want

to cover and have them available. When you have covered all the items, close out the conversation—especially in a conflict situation. Staying on the line too long can be a serious mistake. Again, say what you have to say and get off the line as quickly as possible.

4. When the person with whom you must talk to resolve your problem is out, use the call to find when he or she will be in and the best time for you to call back. (If you are in sales, and you are calling a customer, the general rule is NEVER ask a customer to call you back.)

5. Be sure to write down the name and extension number of each person with whom you speak. Make notes about each conversation. Never forget that "the faintest pencil is better than the sharpest of memories."

6. Group your calls so as to maximize your time at the phone. If a line is busy, you can go to the next number on your list but make a note of the time you tried to get through; it might be important later.

7. Always be prepared to leave a succinct message on an answering machine. Your message should include your name, phone number, date and time of call, the subject of your call, and whether you should be called back. In today's world, answering machines are a reality. Be prepared to cope with them.

8. Lastly, if you happen to have one of the new smart phones, spend some time with a person who knows how to use it and learn its functions. During a call is not the time to add stress by pushing

the wrong buttons.

Fear can be debilitating and fear of the telephone is as bad as any other fear. The more you understand about the fear, and the better prepared you are, the more likely you are to overcome it. Now go ahead—reach out and touch someone with confidence.

Making it happen

This city is ridiculously huge. By "city", I mean the Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater Metropolitan Statistical Area. Living in the relative peace and tranquility of South Hillsborough, it's easy to forget that our inhabitance here is part of more than 4.2 million fellow inhabitants in the 19th largest metropolitan area in the United States. But those numbers tell only part of the story — this city is huge.

I was recently reminded of the sheer size of the place because I wanted to buy something from a person in Holiday. If you don't know where Holiday is, I can tell you: it's almost to Mars. Seriously. In driving to Holiday, my wife and I never left an urban area but we drove for more than an hour and a half. The trip took so long we ended up stopping for dinner along the way, lest we would have starved to death among our own fellow inhabitants in this poster child for urban sprawl known as the Tampa Bay area.

What could possibly have been worth driving to Holiday for? A road case — a wooden box, covered in heavy-duty material with big ol' casters and industrial-strength fold-down handles. It is designed to carry the various odds and ends of musical equipment,

usually to venues for live performances. Of course, I told myself that I needed the road case in order to flee should our choice of a new-to-us home near the river turns disastrous, with a storm causing the river to join us in our living room. But the real reason wasn't so sensible. The truth is, I harbor a fantasy of sorts that I'll actually perform somewhere someday and that fantasy stretches to the point where I don't horrifically embarrass myself in the process.

I love my wife. I have a job that I love, working for people I respect. I live in a beautiful place and have wonderful friends. Why on earth would I harbor a secret desire to potentially humiliate myself in front of groups of people for no real gain whatsoever? The answer to that is: I haven't a clue.

The weather this past weekend was beautiful. It was, borrowing a word from singer Jimmy Buffet, a perfect example of Floridays. It seemed that festivals sprang up everywhere in response to the first cooler days of the season. At an art and music festival at Valencia Lakes near Sun City Center, Michelle was particularly struck by one artist named Stanly R. Acosta. At the festival, this young man was putting himself out there for

all to see without a hint of embarrassment and rightly so. He had talent — lots of it.

I'm not so sure the same could be said of me and my music. It was only weeks ago that Michelle came home with an electric guitar, inspiring my return to music after 26 years. It's one thing to impress her from the second-bedroom-turned-music-room of our small house; she is accustomed to dealing with my ego already made somewhat fragile and uncertain by simply writing to 100,000 people each week. It's one thing to write and not see the outcome as newspapers land on driveways, but it's another thing to actually put yourself out there — in person — to stand before the harsh and unfor-

giving gaze of a potentially indifferent public, such as Mr. Acosta and all of the other artists did at that festival last weekend.

For Mr. Acosta, I have no doubt that it is a calling. In my mind, music now joins writing, photography and sailing in what I've convinced myself is a calling that I can hear with my mind's ear. My concern is whether my calling is less the voice of God or nature or whatever and more the voice of a schizophrenic lunatic living inside my head.

As we journeyed to Holiday-lying-just-short-of-Mars, I noticed the people in the cars that surrounded us. Some of them looked unhappy, some looked downright miserable. Perhaps it was the nightmarish traffic, but I

wondered to myself if, in trying to live, they have ignored their calling, and their hearts and souls have paid the price for the money in their wallets. Yes, admittedly that's a stretch to take away from a scowling man or woman sitting behind the wheel of a BMW in a traffic jam on U.S. Highway 19, but maybe not so much. While certainly some of us were meant to be accountants or attorneys, I think many more of us were meant to be something we are currently not. We all have a calling, I think. For the most part, we feel we have to ignore it in order to be sensible or just to survive.

Writing the book that is inside of you or drawing out the images your mind can see aren't things that have to cost money. If we can just get past the naysayer that lives in our own heads, I believe we can live our dreams — or at least take steps towards fulfilling them. What do we have to lose in trying? I can survive a little public humiliation if it comes to that. After all, I have a dream (along with my day job) to fall back on, God willing.

This is a big city and potential opportunities are on every street corner and down every avenue or, perhaps, even in your own backyard. What is your dream? What are you going to do to make it happen? You don't have to be miserable in a traffic jam, you can be who you are supposed to be. Just let yourself do it. And then make it happen.



How to pick the best Medicare Prescription Drug Plan for you

Dear Savvy Senior,

I recently received a letter from my Medicare "Part D" prescription drug plan provider notifying me that my premiums and co-pays will be increasing next year; and they are dropping coverage on one of the drugs that I take. How can I find a better drug plan?

Dear Frustrated,

Because Medicare's prescription drug plans can change their costs and benefits from year-to-year, comparing Part D plans every year during the open enrollment season (which is now Oct. 15-Dec. 7) is always a smart idea. Here are some tips and resources to help you find the best drug coverage at the lowest price.

Do It Yourself

If you have a home computer and Internet access, comparing your current Medicare drug plan with the many other plans that are available, and enrolling in one, is something you can do yourself.

Just go to Medicare's online Plan Finder Tool at www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan, and type in your zip code or your personal information, the drugs you take and their dosages, and select the pharmacies you use and you'll get a cost

comparison breakdown for each plan available in your area. This tool also provides a five-star rating system that evaluates each plan based on past customer service records, and suggests generics or older brand name drugs that can reduce your costs.

When comparing drug plans don't judge a plan strictly by its monthly premium cost. Low-premium plans are often associated with higher prescription copayments and may end up being more expensive. So take a look at the whole pricing package, including premiums, deductibles and co-pays. Also, be sure the plan you're considering covers all of the drugs you take with no restrictions. Some plans may require you to get permission or try a number of cheaper drugs before they will cover certain prescriptions.

Need Help

If you need some help with this or if you don't have Internet access to compare drug plans, you can call Medicare at 800-633-4227 and they will do the comparing for you over the phone for free, and enroll you in a new plan when you're ready.

Some other great resources that can help you are the Medicare Rights Center (medicarerights.org), a nonprofit consumer service organization that maintains a hotline at 800-333-4114 to help answer your Medicare questions. And, your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP), which provides free one-on-one Medicare counseling in person or over the phone. To find a local SHIP counselor visit shiptalk.org, or call 800-677-1116.

If you want even more help,

consider Allsup Inc. (866-521-7655, medicare.allsup.com). This is a national fee-based company that offers a Medicare Advisor Part D plan selection service that takes your information over the phone or online and does the comparing and analyzing for you, and then helps you choose and enroll in a plan that best meets your needs and budget.

The fee for this service is \$75. Consider Allsup Inc. (866-521-7655, medicare.allsup.com). This is a national fee-based company that offers a Medicare Advisor Part D plan selection service that takes your information over the phone or online and does the comparing and analyzing for you, and then helps you choose and enroll in a plan that best meets your needs and budget.

For 2012, the coverage gap begins if your total drug cost exceeds \$2,930 (that includes your share and the insurer's share of the costs) and ends when your total costs reach \$6,657.50. After that, your Part D plan usually covers around 95 percent of your remaining drug costs for the year.

Savvy Tip: If your income is under \$16,335 a year (or \$22,065 for married couples) and your assets are below \$12,640 (or \$25,260 for married couples), may be eligible for "Extra Help" in paying for their Medicare prescription drug coverage. Hillsborough County Code Enforcement to meet today



They have lots of experience, an old fashioned work ethic, and they don't want to be relegated to being a greeter at a big box store.

Can mature workers get hired in our current environment? Absolutely! But there are ways they can sabotage their job-seeking efforts by using "aging" phrases that take them from "mature executive" to "crabby old dude."

If you're interviewing, you might want to rethink saying such things as: "Been there, done that" or "Back when I was doing that kind of work..." Other aging phrases include "I think that was in..." and "Things are so different nowadays."

Mature job seekers can also run afoul with the "tell me about" questions. If you are asked "Tell me about a situation when you..." make it something that happened in the 2000s, not something from 1983. And please, leave the cell phone in the car. No texting allowed in the interview room!

And you don't need to list your job as a pizza delivery person in college on your resume. Only the most recent experience is relevant to today's managers.

But he is finding the dollars to keep the important research and fish diagnostics going.

Another critical study concerns raising Bala sharks, he said.

"Bala sharks are an aquarium fish we import from Thailand," said Watson. "They're very delicate and hard to handle. We (people in the U.S.) probably spend half a

million a year bringing them into this country."

Another issue now being studied is finding a better way to aerate ponds because the technology now being used by fish farmers is more than 40 years old. Researchers at the center are also currently looking at how to produce the anthias in captivity. The anthias is an ornamental

marine species from Christmas Island in the Pacific that no one has so far been able to commercially produce anywhere in the world.

"This fish is called a harem spawner," said Carlos Martinez, extension faculty at the lab. Watson explained that this is because one male stays with a large tank of females, and then when he gets old, he turns into a female. The center is studying how this strange event can happen.

"The anthias represents a whole group of salt water fish," Watson explained. "This is one area where we have secured both government and private funding."

Some research funds are also coming from Busch Gardens, Seaworld and the Shedd Aquarium in Chicago, making some projects a combination of private and government funding, he said. The Association of Zoos and Aquariums is also involved in the marine side of the research.

"Hillsborough County funds the office manager position and we build hatcheries through a block grant," he added.

The laboratory is also involved with local farmers and education and it has a veterinary program which has attracted students from all over the world.

There is an internship which can last from two weeks to a year and a longer program for graduated veterinarians as well.

Natalie Steckler, a graduate student of veterinary medicine from Miami is there on an internship, as is Mark Flint.

Flint, who also already has his veterinary license, has come from Australia to do an internship and earn his PhD.

"I am happy to be in the growing field of veterinary medicine and am working on a long-term goal of specializing in fish health," Steckler said.

Flint has spent one year in Florida and says he has learned much he will take back to the laboratory he mans in Australia.

But the lab isn't all about research, study and education.

Local fish farmers may call with their questions and bring samples in for tests as well. This is not a service for hobbyists, who are urged to call the county extension service, and the service is not free.

Farmers may bring in samples

from their ponds either singularly or in a group of fish to determine the cause of a symptom or treat a disease.

The laboratory also has its own outdoor ponds.

The lab occupies six-and-a-half acres and has 50 ponds on land that was once a fish farm, Watson explained. And there are also various indoor buildings, each housing tanks for research and disease control.

There are many educational opportunities being provided at the lab as well. Students in aquaculture programs may come to learn, look, listen and study.

Locally there are several opportunities for learning in the aquaculture field.

Martinez gives classes to private citizens (not commercial users) on the use of pesticides so they can obtain the certification to use the restricted materials.

There is a two-year aquaculture program at East Bay High School and an associate degree program at Hillsborough Community College's Brandon campus led by Craig Casper.

There are also opportunities for college and veterinary students to work with the facilities both on and off site and also with the county's extension service.

But not all the things that go on at the lab are directly involved with study and diagnostics.

The sister industry of aquatic plants is also studied as well as health issues of anything that could impact fish and waterways, and researchers are working with farmers to help control problems connected with their work, like how to rid their farms of animals that eat their fish, including raccoons, certain species of birds and alligators.

"We just got a program in Sun City Center to control feral hogs," Watson said.

When asked about future jobs in the industry Watson said it is hard to compete in a world market because a farmer in Indonesia may get 2¢ a fish and a U.S. farmer 25¢ for the same fish.

But there are many new opportunities opening up in marine ornamentals because there are thousands of fish traded that are not in production in the United States now. In the future there will be jobs in hatcheries and with the larvae as that demand increases.

The best way to prepare for these jobs is to earn a bachelors or masters degree but graduates of HCC have been employed with a two-year associate's degree, Watson said.

Gibsonton's First Baptist celebrates eight decades plus

GIBSONTON —There is a lot to be said for longevity.

It so often is the foundation of stability, the source of useful knowledge found nowhere else, the springboard for achievements in the future. It offers the comforts of familiarity, the confidence derived from meeting challenges, the security of the known in an uncertain world.

On Sunday at First Baptist Church here, they'll be honoring it all, observing it, celebrating it. It's homecoming and they have much to cherish.

This community's missionary Baptist church this year claims 81 years of history, almost half of those years led by the same pastor who has served no other congregation for 36 of his 68 years.

Out of those years together have come a striking sanctuary building that is a local landmark as well as a church home, a school graduating outstanding student achievers, a thrift shop that helps untold numbers of area residents, a growing

network of missionaries circling the globe, a portfolio of property surrounding the church buildings ready for future expansion, a firm financial footing.

It's the result of longevity, of staying put, in one place, doing what could be done. Yet, it is not the course Pastor Mac Clements and his wife, Patty, first charted for themselves.

Malcom, "Mac" Clements, the son of Fred and Bernice Clements who once operated a Gibsonton feed store, was born as World War II raged across Europe and the Pacific. He grew up in a home a short distance from the church where his family was well known. His maternal grandparents, Malcom and Ruby Sweat, were charter members of the little church organized in 1930 as the nation plunged into a great economic depression.

He swam in Bullfrog Creek and romped on the white sands of Gardenville Beach, both the swimming hole and the beach now only memories. He rode horses on Gibsonton roads that were more

like trails and took in baseball games with neighbor Cliff Prevatt. In 1961, he was graduated from East Bay High School, number 24 on the championship East Bay football team in the '60-61 season.

Young Clements, a South County country boy fond of mullet, smoked or fried, and of fishing, followed his dad to U.S. Phosphoric, the phosphate processing plant at the mouth of the Alafia River, just over the bridge. There his life was altered; he met Patty Sumner, not knowing what the future held for them, but with full knowledge, he says today, that somehow he would marry her.

Patty, born in Tifton, Georgia, but probably related a generation or two back to the pioneering South Hillsborough Sumners, also was an East Bay graduate, before Mac, and already was working in the processing plant office when he arrived. He wasted no time; they were married in the old First Baptist sanctuary in 1962. Come 2012, it will be 50 years, side by side.


Mac left Phosphoric, went to work



for Reynolds Aluminum in Tampa and quickly came to question whether it was a good move. Lucking into an extraordinary 10-week paid vacation due to company policy changes, Mac and Patty opted to try running a tracting business. And then along came the opportunity to own and operate an ornamental fish farm. It was a full time commitment, a venture into the unknown, and they did it for 10 years.

At this point, with two young daughters, a wealth of new business savvy and a successful fish farm, Mac Clements experienced an unanticipated stirring; a calling to pastor a church and not just any church, but the one that was historically his family's. First Baptist's leader was leaving for another assignment. Mac offered

himself. What the church got was a package deal.

Mac and Patty Clements sold the fish farm and began devoting themselves full time to the Gibsonton congregation. It was 1975.

During the ensuing years, they both would earn bachelor degrees, hers in childhood education, his in bible studies. He would perform the full range of pastoral duties – Sunday and Wednesday services, sick and homebound visits, marriages, funerals, counseling – as she managed the church office, keeping a handle on its myriad details, maintaining financial records, cataloguing and scheduling and communicating.

Seeing his role also as giving a voice to Gibsonton, he ran for public office twice, once for the state house, later for the state senate. Those were among the few

times that Mac Clements did not attain the original objectives.

Yet, the lessons learned, the contacts made, the friendships formed as a result of those defeats have been highly beneficial to the church, he notes today. They played a role, for example, in the acquisition of property east of the church at a price it could afford, thereby adding to its present and future value.

In 1985, the church opened the First Baptist Christian School, kindergarten through 12th grade. Of its 140 graduates, most have obtained college degrees. One has become a CIA agent, another bought into and built a fast food empire, another has been awarded a full scholarship to St. Leo College in San Antonio, yet another now is headed to medical internship in Miami, Patty recalls.

In the same timeframe, the church of today was built, an airy, two-story structure designed by Clements to encompass part of the old building and enclosing the new red, grey and mahogany sanctuary within a walkway that permits entrance to it from inside the building and from several sides.

The new church building, though, was targeted by Hurricane Jeanne in 2004 and an estimated \$350,000 in damage was done when wind gusts collapsed the Plexiglas west wall and water cascaded into the entrance hall. The situation then was complicated by an incompetent insurance agent. The Gibsonton country boy, however, knew how to protect his church and, going around the agent to the insurance carrier management, resolved the difficulties. The cost to the carrier doubled. First Baptist was repaired satisfactorily.

During the last decade, the

church also has opened a thrift store on its grounds which is kept stocked with clothing for the entire family, household goods and baby accessories by church members as well as others, the Clements say. The store has been especially helpful recently as unemployment has lingered, offering useful merchandise at bargain prices.

Gibsonton's First Baptist, in addition, was one of the first churches to join with HELP Ministries (Help Evangelize Lost People) which now consists of more than 1,000 churches supporting missionary work around the world, Mac emphasizes, proud that his church can focus particularly on

the efforts of native missionaries in far flung nations.

It is this work, and its fruits, that several hundred congregants and invited guests are expected to commemorate during the homecoming service at 10 a.m. Sunday. Then, they will sit down together to a full barbecue dinner, sharing memories of early church history, enjoying the continuum that succeeding generations always represent, reflecting on that longevity that gives them the stability for further progress.

"The brightest, the best days," their pastor said this week, "are still ahead of us."

Senator Mike Fasano responds to ruling

State Senator Mike Fasano applauds the decision by Circuit Judge Jackie Fulford declaring Florida's attempt to privatize a portion of the state's prison system unconstitutional. The provision, placed into the state budget via proviso language, authorized the privatization of 30 prisons. Senator Fasano was a vocal opponent of this effort and spoke against the attempt during the 2011 session of the Florida Legislature.

"I applaud the judge for her wise decision to declare the attempt at privatizing these prisons unconstitutional," Senator Fasano states. "The Florida Legislature should not be making major policy decisions by inserting last minute proviso language into the budget, thus circumventing the committee process. An issue as important as prison privatization should have been given the chance for thoughtful debate in the substantive committees that oversee this issue."

"I congratulate the hard working correctional officers who have scored a major victory with this ruling," Senator Fasano continues. "These fine individuals, who put their lives at stake each day as they run Florida's prisons, deserve the ruling that has been handed down today."

Start a new hobby

You are so lucky to live in this area with all of our great waterways. We have both fresh and saltwater fish and we can fish in all seasons.

It seems odd that those who come ashore without fish, after spending a day on the water, always have a excuse of why they didn't make the catch.

Overheard at the boat ramp, "Hi buddy, you sure got some nice ones there, I really didn't go fishing, I was just trying out my boat."

Another: We did get giants, but we lost them trying to get them in the boat."

A big 'Fish Tale' by four anglers was that all of them caught huge fish, a cobia, a tarpon, and so on, but they released them.

A true angler will rise at an unearthly hour, travel in the most miserable weather, risk sunburn or a sunstroke, drowning, or exhaustion all for a fish!

If you can't go fishing, go to garage and estate sales or the flea market to look for old fishing gear. I have a lure from Eagle Bait who covered their lures with real snake and frog skins.

The antiques and the unusual are out there, so go searching, sell them, or start a new hobby. If you are from Ohio, you might remember a lure shaped like a mermaid. If you find one or have one in your old tackle box, you're in the money.

If you are from Chicago you might have one that looks like a frog, or if you are from Tampa you could remember or have a lure made by Kinney Bait Co. who made wooden

birds and each had a real glass eye. Some may be in your grandfather's tackle box.

Start a collection of fishing gear. Work on it when you can't go fishing. You could make a lot of money selling to collectors.

The weather is perfect for fishing. I saw more catches coming in on boats at Williams Park than I have seen all summer.

Many boats were launched there over the weekend. Anglers come off the interstate and put their boats in at the mouth of the Alafia River and go out to the bay waters for a great day of fishing. They have a vast area there to park a trailer.

There is good fishing at Cockroach Bay, but your car isn't safe when parking along that narrow road to the bay. I have heard of many being vandalized.

The usual sheepshead catches were made this week. A few redfish of good size came ashore on a sailboat.

Good size flounder were among most all catches. This is a great table fare fish.

Freshwater catfish were popular this week as were largemouth bass.

The redfish tournament at Doug Fox's Bait Shop is in full swing. Stop by and get in this "Count the Spots" Tournament which goes on each month.

Need food? Get a line and a pole and go to your favorite fishing hole.

Huntin' season is crankin' up!

Football season is in full swing, and the 2011-12 hunting season is cranking up. Heck, in Zone A, they're already into general gun season. But for the rest of us, I'd like to cover the rules and regulations regarding two hunting seasons that are just around the corner: muzzleloading gun and the first phase of dove.

Immediately following the close of crossbow season in each zone, the muzzleloading gun season begins. Season dates run Nov. 19 - Dec. 2 in Zone B, Oct. 22 - Nov. 4 in Zone C and Dec. 3-9 in Zone D.

During muzzleloading gun season, bows and crossbows are also legal methods of taking game on private lands, in addition to muzzleloaders. But on wildlife management areas (WMAs), only muzzleloaders may be used.

The most common types of game to take during muzzleloader season are deer and wild hog. Only bucks may be taken, and one antler must be at least 5 inches long above the hairline. The daily bag limit on antlered deer is two. You can hunt wild hogs year-round on private lands, and there are no bag or size limits.

It's also legal to shoot gobblers and bearded turkeys during muzzleloading gun season. You may take only one per day, and there's a two-bird fall-season limit. But you can't hunt turkeys in Holmes County during the fall and winter. On WMAs, bag limits and antler/size restrictions can differ, so check the specifics of the area before you hunt.

Legal shooting hours are a half-

hour before sunrise to a half-hour after sunset. Except for turkeys, hunters may take resident game over feed such as corn on private lands. No baiting is allowed on WMAs, however.

For hunting deer, muzzleloaders firing single bullets must be at least .40-caliber. Guns firing two or more balls must be 20-gauge or larger. You may not use muzzleloaders that take smokeless powder, ones that can be loaded from the breech or those with self-contained cartridge ammunition capabilities during muzzleloading gun season.

The first phase of the mourning and white-winged dove season begins Oct. 1 and ends Oct. 24 statewide. Shooting hours during this first phase are noon to sunset, and there's a 15-bird daily bag limit.

The only firearm you're allowed to use for hunting doves is a shotgun, but you can't use one larger than a 10-gauge. Shotguns must be plugged to a three-shell capacity (magazine and chamber combined).

You may hunt doves over an agricultural field, as long as the crop has been planted and manipulated under normal agricultural practices. However, it's against the law to scatter agricultural products over an area for the purpose of baiting.

Some things you can't do while dove hunting include using rifles, pistols or crossbows; shooting from


a moving vehicle; and herding or driving doves with a vehicle.

In addition to a Florida hunting license, you'll need a \$5 muzzleloading gun permit to hunt during muzzleloader season. To hunt deer, you need a \$5 deer permit, and if you'd like to take a fall turkey, you'll need a \$10

turkey permit (\$125 for nonresidents). If you're going to hunt doves, you'll need a no-cost migratory bird permit, and if you hunt on a WMA, you also must have a management area permit, which costs \$26.50.

All are available at your local county tax collector's office, through license agents, by calling 888-HUNT-FLORIDA or by going online to www.fl.wildlifelicense.com.

So if you're going after that monster buck during the muzzleloading gun season or dove hunting with friends and family, I hope I've helped explain some of Florida's rules and regulations.







renovations designed to enhance or enlarge many aspects of the community's amenities that residents use frequently or rate as high on their attractions list.

In March, residents were provided a paper ballot and asked to prioritize the list, to add any other amenities improvements they deemed worthy of investment and to express opinions as to financing potentials. Hundreds of SCC homeowners responded. And, in May, Martin Hurwitz, one of the board directors most involved with capital improvements planning, reported that another 35 suggestions for changes to current facilities or construction of new ones had been pinpointed. Hurwitz also said at the time that a residents' preference in financing mechanisms was taking shape.

Barnes declined this week to describe exactly which among the 45 or so possible improvement projects seem to have surfaced as most likely from the standpoints of desirability and feasibility. Ultimately, he indicated, the number, size and type could be driven by available and projected funding, in turn, influenced by economic conditions and CA membership commitment.

While not yet precisely ranked publicly, the board's originally proposed 10 projects have been detailed. Two of them – a café located in the Atrium complex as well as a lobby and ticket booth for the Rollins Theater on the Central Campus – would continue the projects proposed and approved in a 2004 community-wide referendum. Both would affect current golf cart parking space. The café, possibly in combination with a recreational retreat for Wii users, proved a popular choice among the 2011 survey responders, Hurwitz has said.

Among the board's eight other suggestions are several dealing with creation of new space. These include new construction to produce medium and larger sized meeting accommodations

for a number of community users – homeowner associations, clubs, discussion groups, social organizations, CA committees and task forces – in order to relieve an ongoing shortage.

Such construction also could include facilities for the community library, the SCC Security Patrol and the CA offices, some of which functions now are shoehorned into an increasingly inadequate building on the Central Campus.

Additionally, in terms of more space, the board noted the possibility of a new and larger theater-style structure designed with a rising floor levels for better viewing of live performances, motion pictures, lectures and visitor presentations. If this design were to be constructed, the existing small theater would be converted to another use.

Another project might be adding pull-out style graduated seating in the Community Hall building in order to produce better viewing options during large community sessions there, but pushed back against the walls for banquets or dances.

Other possibilities are acquisition of more land for outdoor recreational features such as picnic areas, walking trails, bicycling and for additional parking adjacent to the Atrium.

As for financing these or other amenities features, the foundation has to be the \$1,200 per dwelling transfer fee accruing when a home is sold to a new owner, Barnes said. A pay-as-it-goes scenario would begin with a substantial portion of the \$800,000 in currently accrued transfer fees but limit what could be accomplished, while a loan secured by pledging future transfer fee monies could set in motion a number of projects but add the expense of interest on the debt. Hurwitz has stated survey responders favored the latter approach by two to one.

Regardless of the improvements wrapped into the ultimate master plan or the funding method

finally accepted, CA directors generally agree that expanding the community's superior number and

grade of amenities made available to all SCC residents for nominal annual membership dues is crucial




