

Election 2018: Five Big Questions

Many Floridians will be relieved to see Election 2018 come to an end—no more negative TV ads, no more flashy mailers, and no more robo-calls or texts begging us to vote. But, after

the polls close, many of us will want to know the answers to these five intriguing questions:

Were the polls right in Florida? They were not in predicting the outcome of the 2016 presidential contest between Democrat Hillary Clinton and Republican Donald Trump. Nor did they predict that Andrew Gillum would capture the Democratic nomination for governor in the August 2018 primary. A lesson learned from these earlier miscues is that poll results

should not deter you from voting because they cannot predict turnout or capture last-minute surges of support.

Were this year's races for the U.S. Senate and Governor as close as previous races? The margin-of-victory for the winner of the last four major elections (the 2010 and 2014 gubernatorial races and the 2012 and 2016 presidential elections) has been 1 percent. But, will it be as close this

Frightening sights at 'Haunted House on 41'

Early numbers reveal voters are engaged for midterms

Early numbers reveal that Pasco County voters are enthusiastic about midterm elections, said Pasco County Supervisor of Elections Brian Corley.

"Voters are definitely more engaged this time, for a midterm, than we've seen in some time," he said.

"As we approach the general (election), it's a very, very long ballot, with a lot of amendments on it, but so far, I've got to tell you, the turnout has been phenomenal," Corley said in an Oct. 29 interview.

While Election Day is Nov. 6, many voters are choosing to vote early, he said.

Pasco has already surpassed the total Vote By Mail ballots cast in the 2014 general, which was slightly more than 46,000, and it is already over 52,480. "We're not done, obviously. So, that's going to be up substantially," he said.

Corley also noted that early voting has been expanded in Pasco County because there was an obvious need.

"With early voting, we're right now, as I'm talking to you, at a little more than 26,000 and the total early votes cast in the 2014 general

Proposed Constitutional amendments

There are 12 proposed amendments to Florida's Constitution on the 2018 ballot. There were 13, but one was removed by the Florida Supreme Court.

HERE'S WHAT VOTERS WILL BE DECIDING:

Number 1: Increased Homestead Property Tax Exemption

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to increase the homestead exemption by exempting the assessed valuation of homestead property greater than \$100,000 and up to \$125,000 for all levies other than school district levies. The amendment shall take effect Jan. 1, 2019.

Number 2: Limitations on Property Tax Assessments

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to permanently retain provisions currently in effect, which limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year. If approved, the amendment removes the scheduled repeal of such provisions in 2019 and shall take effect Jan. 1, 2019.

Number 3: Voter Control of Gambling in Florida

This amendment ensures that Florida voters

shall have the exclusive right to decide whether to authorize casino gambling by requiring that in order for casino gambling to be authorized under Florida law, it must be approved by Florida voters pursuant to Article XI, Section 3 of the Florida Constitution. Affects articles X and XI. Defines casino gambling and clarifies that this amendment does not conflict with federal law regarding state/tribal compacts.

Number 4: Voting Restoration Amendment

This amendment restores the voting rights of Floridians with felony convictions after they complete all terms of their sentence, including parole or probation. The amendment would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses, who would continue to be permanently barred from voting, unless the Governor and Cabinet vote to restore their voting rights on a case-by-case basis.

Number 5: Supermajority Vote Required to Impose, Authorize or Raise State Taxes or Fees

Prohibits the legislature from imposing, authorizing or raising a state tax or fee, except through legislation approved by a two-thirds vote of each house of the legislature in a bill containing no other subject. This proposal does not authorize a

Hillsborough to cast votes on road, school taxes

Hillsborough County voters have the option of raising sales taxes to help pay for transportation, and for school air-conditioning and capital improvements.

The transportation improvements would be made by voting to amend the County Charter to enact a 1-cent sales surtax that would be levied for 30 years and deposited in an audited trust fund with an independent oversight.

That tax would be in addition to the current 7 percent sales tax and is estimated to raise \$278 million annual, and \$552 million in the first two revenue years. The revenues would be shared by the Hillsborough Regional Transit Authority, the Metropolitan Planning Organization, and using a population-based formula by the Hillsborough

County Commission, the City of Tampa, Plan City and the City of Temple Terrace.

The money would be used for road and bridge improvements; expanded public transit options; to fix potholes; enhance bus services; relieve rush hour bottlenecks; improve intersections; and, make walking and biking safer.

Hillsborough voters also have the option of authorizing a ½-cent sales surtax for 10 years to fund air conditioning replacements and repairs, capital improvements and construction of other schools, building enhancements for school security and other maintenance needs.

The new ½-cent tax is in addition to the current 7 percent sales tax. It is estimated to raise \$138 million annually. Expenditures will be governed by the Aug. 24, 2018 Hillsborough County School Board resolution.

Wesley Chapel Episcopal Church makes 'house calls'

When the Rev. Adrienne Hymes was considering ways to reach out into the community surrounding the new Wesley Chapel Episcopal Church, she hit upon an idea that literally involves making house calls.

She has made herself available, by appointment, to visit a house or apartment — or business or other gathering space, for that matter, to lead a ceremony to bless the space.

Recently, she visited the home of Pete and Sharon Soto, of Wesley Chapel, and read from scriptural text, as she and those gathered took part in a rite aimed at welcoming and acknowledging God's presence, and asking for blessing and protection.

The couple, their daughter, and some friends and neighbors joined in reading passages, at certain points in the rite.

Hymes used salt and a blessing, seeking to turn ordinary tap water into holy water — used to bless every room in the home.

Salt is used for purification, she explained.

And, near the home's front door, Hymes recited a pray, which said in part: "Almighty and everlasting God, grant to this home, the grace of your presence, that you may be known to be the inhabitant of this dwelling and a defender of this household."

As she and the others made their way throughout the home, she sought blessings for each room.

In the bedroom, for instance, Hymes prayed: "Guide us, waking, O Lord, and guard us sleeping, that awake we may watch with Christ and asleep, we may rest in peace."

Others attending the ceremony were Jeri Jeffries, Maggie Thomas, Christine O'Donnell, Karen Bauer and Michelle Flemming, the Sotos' daughter.

"As we go on our spiritual journey, and our deeper relationship with God, we started to realize that we need extra protection," Sharon Soto said.

"We lived 30 years in the other house and we didn't get it done, so when the opportunity came up for this house, we couldn't pass it up," Pete Soto said. "That was just like a God-sent message."

The Sotos moved to Wesley Chapel a couple of years ago.

"We were ready to downsize to a smaller home, and we have a daughter, a son-in-law and two grandsons that live in Wesley Chapel.

"It's not that we don't feel the presence of God here, we already do. It just is kind of an affirmation, I guess," Sharon Soto said.

Hymes said besides blessing homes, she's available — by appointment — to bless other spaces, too.

"More and more, as people are pushed into very determined sacred and secular spaces, I think it's important to remind people that showing up where they live, work and play, and saying, 'You know what, all of it is sacred,' she said.

"Ritual is so important for us to memorialize different milestones in our lives. One of those would be that now, we have a new home, or we have a home that we now want to make sure that is adequately blessed, particularly if you're a religious person," Hymes said.

"It's one way for the church to say, 'We're new here,' but we also want to be able to bless you in whatever way that we can. Interacting with people, not just on the street corner, or the place where we're shopping — but to be able to go into their home, is a very intimate space. And, I think that connects with people on a very different level."

General Obligation Bond Issues

The Laker/Lutz News Staff Report

Pasco County is asking voters to approve four general obligation bond issues during the Nov. 6 general election.

The bonds would be repaid over a 30-year period through additional charges on tax bills. The charge will appear on the bills as "voter approved debt service."

These are the four different bonds, and the estimated annual charge on a home assessed at \$100,000.

JAIL EXPANSION

Bond: \$132,150,000

Average annual impact on taxpayer: \$16.75

Details: Currently, taxpayers pay \$2 million to house inmates outside of Pasco County because the county's jail has reached capacity. The bond issue would pay for a jail expansion.

FIRE SERVICE

Bond: \$70,200,000

Average annual impact on taxpayer: \$8.89

Details: The county would build four new fire stations in areas that don't have any fire

stations and replace five outdated stations. It also would add 10 new emergency vehicles and would construct a new Fire Rescue Training Facility.

PARKS

Bond: \$20,200,000

Average annual impact on taxpayer: \$2.55

Details: Projects would be done at all district, wilderness and neighborhood parks. Existing athletic facilities would be improved. Recreational complexes, community centers and aquatic centers would be renovated.

LIBRARIES

Bond: \$18,600,000

Average annual impact on taxpayer: \$2.35

Details: The county's libraries were built in or before the 1980s. The bond issue would be used to upgrade and remodel library branches.

If all four bond issues pass, the total average annual impact on taxpayers owning a home assessed at \$100,000 would be \$30.54.





was 32,000," he said.

Corley also offered assurances that there are plans in place to address any security issues — cyber or physical — that could arise.

"We have worked very closely with Sheriff (Chris) Nocco and his people, along with the county's emergency management folks," he said.

He told voters: "Make sure your address is up to date. Study the amendments ahead of time, so you'll know ahead of time, yes or no."

Whatever method voters choose — whether voting early or on Election Day, they have plenty of decisions to make.

They'll be deciding on races and issues, ranging from who will be Florida's representatives in Congress, to who will occupy the state's governor's mansion, to who will make local decisions affecting everything from job

creation, to road congestion, to the quality of local schools.

Pasco and Hillsborough voters also will decide the outcome of 12 constitutional amendments or revisions.

In Pasco, voters also will decide the fate of four general obligation issues to pay for a jail expansion, additional fire protection, enhanced libraries and enhanced parks. The bonds would be repaid through increased property taxes.

In Hillsborough, voters will vote on a referendum to raise the local sales tax to support transportation improvements; and, another referendum to raise the local sales tax to support air conditioning and other capital improvements in public schools.

WHAT VOTERS SHOULD BRING

Florida law requires voters to present both signature and photo identification. This can be achieved with one form of identification, such as a Florida driver license or U.S. Passport, or two separate forms of identification, such as a membership card with your photo and second form of identification with your signature. If you don't bring your ID, you may vote a provisional ballot.

state tax or fee otherwise prohibited by the Constitution and does not apply to fees or taxes imposed or authorized to be imposed by a county, municipality, school board or special district.

Number 6: Rights of Crime Victims; Judges

Creates constitutional rights for victims of crime; requires courts to facilitate victims' rights; authorizes victims to enforce their rights throughout criminal and juvenile justice processes. Requires judges and hearing officers to independently interpret statutes and rules rather than deferring to government agency's interpretation. Raises mandatory retirement age of state justices and judges from seventy to seventy-five years; deletes authorization to complete judicial term if one-half of term has been served by retirement age.

Number 7: First Responder and Military Member Survivor Benefits; Public Colleges and Universities

Grants mandatory payment of death benefits and waiver of certain educational expenses to qualifying survivors of certain first responders and military members who die performing official duties. Requires supermajority votes by university trustees and state university system board of governors to raise or impose all legislatively authorized fees if law requires approval by those bodies. Establishes existing state college system as constitutional entity; provides governance structure.

Number 8: By order of the Florida Supreme Court of Florida, Revision 8 was removed from the ballot.

Number 9: Prohibits Offshore Oil and Gas Drilling; Prohibits Vaping in Enclosed Indoor Workplaces

Prohibits drilling for the exploration or extraction of oil and natural gas beneath all state-owned waters between the mean high water line and the state's outermost territorial boundaries. Adds use of vapor-generating electronic devices to current

prohibition of tobacco smoking in enclosed indoor workplaces with exceptions; permits more restrictive local vapor ordinances.

Number 10: State and Local Government Structure and Operation

Requires legislature to retain department of veterans' affairs. Ensures election of sheriffs, property appraisers, supervisors of elections, tax collectors and clerks of court in all counties; removes county charters' ability to abolish, change term, transfer duties or eliminate election of these offices. Changes annual legislative session commencement date in even-numbered years from March to January; removes legislature's authorization to fix another date. Creates office of domestic security and counterterrorism within department of law enforcement.

Number 11: Property Rights; Removal of Obsolete Provision; Criminal Statutes

Removes discriminatory language related to real property rights. Removes obsolete language repealed by voters. Deletes provision that amendment of a criminal statute will not affect prosecution or penalties for a crime committed before the amendment; retains current provision allowing prosecution of a crime committed before the repeal of a criminal statute.

Number 12: Lobbying and Abuse of Office by Public Officers.

Expands current restrictions on lobbying for compensation by former public officers; creates restrictions on lobbying for compensation by serving public officers and former justices and judges; provides exceptions; prohibits abuse of a public position by public officers and employees to obtain a personal benefit.

Number 13: Ends Dog Racing

Phases out commercial dog racing in connection with wagering by 2020. Other gaming activities are not affected.

year considering the state's changing demographic makeup, particularly an increase in younger voters and Hispanics? These two groups lean more Democratic in their voting patterns, but traditionally have lower turnout rates in midterm elections.

Did Florida voters vote a straight party line for the five statewide races (U.S. Senator, Governor, Attorney General, Chief Financial Officer, Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services) or split their votes between Democrats and Republicans? Of greatest interest is whether the winners in the contests for the U.S. Senate and Governor will be from different political parties. Heading into this election, Democrats hold the U.S. Senate seat and Republicans the Governor's Mansion. Some who believe there will be a big blue wave (Democrats winning a lot more offices) predict a majority of Florida voters will vote a straight party line. Others believe that a party split is more likely due to the growing number of Floridians registered as No Party Affiliation (NPA) who tend to vote for the candidate rather than the party.

Did the turnout rate go up, especially among younger voters? The turnout rate in the 2014 midterm general election was 51 percent. Many are projecting it may be higher this year based on an uptick in turnout in the August primary (18 percent to 27 percent) and surveys showing greater voter interest this year, particularly in the governor's race. The two gubernatorial candidates (Democrat Andrew Gillum and Republican Ron DeSantis) sharply differ in

their ideologies and policy preferences. The state's changing age demographics have led some analysts to project that younger voters may determine the winner. The three youngest generations (Generation X, the Millennials, and Generation Z) now make up 52 percent of the state's registered voters. Traditionally, however, the turnout rate of younger voters lags far behind that of older voters, especially in midterm elections.

How many of the 12 amendments passed? This is one of the longest ballots Floridians will have to wade through in many years, and these 12 amendments come at the end of the ballot. For an amendment to be adopted, 60 percent of those voting on it must vote "Yes." Many of this year's proposed amendments are confusing. Some have three or four parts (bundled amendments placed on the ballot by the Constitutional Revision Commission). Voters have been bombarded with TV ads and mailers, often presenting conflicting messages about the content and impact of an amendment, especially Amendment 3 (gambling). The big question is, how many voters will vote "No" on those that are confusing or seem like they should not be in the constitution (vaping)? Also, how many voters will simply skip them—an action known as "roll-off"?

The bottom line is this: This year's midterm election is one of the most interesting in years not only to Floridians but to the nation.

Pasco schools receive Special Olympics honor

Land O' Lakes High School's Unified Special Olympics program received international attention more than three years ago, when its coed soccer team won the bronze medal at the 2015 Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles.

Now, the school's Unified program has earned another prestigious honor — 2018 Special Olympics National Banner Unified Champion School.

The designation, based on the 2017-2018 school year, means Land O' Lakes met 10 standards of excellence set forth by Special Olympics International. These standards focus on four key areas: Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership, Whole School Engagement and sustainability for the program.

Land O' Lakes was one of just 13 schools in Florida — and 132 schools nationally — to receive the designation. New Port Richey's Longleaf Elementary School and Seven Springs Middle School also were named Unified Champion Schools.

The Unified Special Olympics sports program pairs special needs athletes with nondisabled peers, called partners. Together, these athletes and partners compete year-round against other unified programs in sports, such as basketball, soccer, swimming, golf, and others.

According to Special Olympics Florida's website, the Unified program enables Special Olympics athletes to not only learn and play new sports, but also experience meaningful inclusion. Each athlete is ensured of playing a valued role on the team. The teams also provide a forum for positive social interaction.

All participants are of similar age and ability, and unified teams are designed to provide training and competition opportunities that meaningfully challenge and involve all athletes.

Special Olympics sports rules, moreover, make sure that everyone has "a fair and enjoyable competitive experience."

The national honor brings satisfaction to Vicky King, who's coached Special Olympics programming at Land O' Lakes for more than 30 years.

"It means that we've done a lot," King said, "and, we have a student body and community that is very involved, because it's all about inclusion and acceptance everywhere, not just in athletics, but just as a school and a community."

According to King, the Land O' Lakes Unified program last year featured more than 20 coed athletes and nearly 40 partners, representing a solid participation rate based on the school's ESE (Exceptional Student Education) population.

For the 2018-2019 academic school year, the Pasco County school district relocated its special education unit — and Unified program — to Sunlake High School.

Before the transfer, King estimates the Unified program was installed at Land O' Lakes sometime in the early 2000s, after the school had a traditional Special Olympics sports program.

King noted the Unified program did

wonders for involvement between the school's students with special needs and the rest of the student body. "If you look at some Special Olympics athletes in some places, they're singled out, they're not included; but when our athletes were here, they were just other kids," King said.

CLUB KEEPS STUDENTS INVOLVED WITH SPECIAL OLYMPICS

While Land O' Lakes no longer has its own Unified teams, the school still remains active in Unified sports programming. The school has an organization called the Student Council for Exceptional Children (CEC), which numbers about 90 students who volunteer at local Special Olympics events and/or become Unified partners.

Through the club, Land O' Lakes sophomore Courtney Eckel became a Unified partner. She also volunteers with other Unified sports, as a scorekeeper in flag football and a lane assistant in bowling.

Courtney wanted to follow in the footsteps of her older sister, Haley Eckel, who's volunteered for Special Olympics for several years and was a Unified partner on the Land O' Lakes soccer team that went to the World Games. (Haley is also a former standout varsity soccer player at Land O' Lakes and now a sophomore midfielder at Florida Southern College.)

The involvement has proven rewarding for Courtney.

"It's really great," she said of being a partner. "It's so nice to see (the athletes) when they can do something good and score, and see the excitement on their face and know that they can do whatever they want to, and, it's nice to play with them and help them achieve their goals."

Courtney, too, believes Unified programming has been beneficial for promoting acceptance among all students.

"I think it's really important because it keeps everyone included," she said. "It teaches people how to be inclusive, even if someone's not special needs. Just teaching how to include everyone and almost be like more understanding and respectful to everyone and their needs."

King noted many Unified partners and volunteers develop bonds and tight-knit relationships with the athletes, adding that many continue as Special Olympics volunteers and participants through adulthood.

"It becomes just like a way of life," said King, who still remains in touch with many of the athletes even after they've graduated from Land O' Lakes.

In addition to the bonds they form, King noted that many local Unified athletes excel in their sport — regardless of intellectual or developmental disabilities.

King put it this way: "Sometimes the developmental delay is only academic. It has nothing to do with your physical capabilities, so a lot of our athletes are awesome athletes, so that's why a lot of times on the field we'll get called for player domination, rather than partner domination. Everything's supposed to be equal, but we have some really good athletic partners and good athletes, so it makes a great combination."

In all her years working in Special Olympics, King's favorite memory comes as no surprise — the 2015 trip to Los Angeles.

"World Games was the best event — opening ceremonies and just the whole experience," King said. "When we were out there, everyone just wanted to take pictures with us."

MAKING PASCO PROUD

Pasco County has about 1,100 athletes and 500 Unified volunteers participating in more than a dozen sports, according to Special Olympics-Pasco co-director Val Lundin.

Having a trio of Pasco schools earn national recognition for their Unified programs is a testament to the commitment of those athletes, volunteers and coaches, she said.

"We're very proud. We're proud of all our athletes and our coaches," said Lundin, who's been involved with Special Olympics for more than 35 years, oversees the county's Unified programs.

"It amazes me — Pasco County's pretty small in comparison to many of the counties around the state, yet when we take our

National Banner Unified Champion School standards

A National Banner School must meet 10 standards of excellence among four categories, including unified sports, inclusive youth leadership, whole-school engagement and sustainability.

- Unified Sports is offered in at least two seasons throughout the school year.
- Unified Sports participation occurs regularly over the course of each sport season or school term and includes competition.
- An adult coach for each sport has received training on Special Olympics Unified Sports.
- Unified Sports is officially recognized by the school in a similar style as other athletics and activities.
- A Unified Club or student group offers leadership opportunities and training for students with and without intellectual disabilities.
- The inclusive club meets at least once per month throughout the school year.
- The inclusive club has an adult liaison and is officially recognized by the school in a similar style as other clubs.
- At least two whole-school engagement activities are implemented per school year.
- Students with and without disabilities are involved with planning and leading the awareness activities.
- The school is currently self-sustainable or has a plan in place to sustain the three components into the future.

These 10 standards of excellence were developed by a national panel of leaders in education and Special Olympics. A school meeting the standards is eligible to receive national banner recognition.

(state games) delegations, we're always in the top five, as far as the amount of athletes, so we're up there competing with the Orange and Miami-Dade (counties), which I think reflects well upon our program here. We're obviously doing something right."

Lundin also heaped plenty of praise towards King, who she said helps set the standard for many other Unified school programs in the county.

King was named Special Olympics Florida Coach of the Year in 2015.

In addition to dedicating her time toward Special Olympics, King is one of the state's top varsity girls soccer coaches — guiding Land O' Lakes to the state semifinals the last three years and winning a state title in 2003.

"There's not enough you can say about Vicky," Lundin said. "She's just an amazing coach. She's an amazing person. She just has a way about her that can bring the best out in her athletes and her partners. It's just a reflection upon her and her club — the CEC club is one of the largest in the county. It takes a lot of time and work, and on top of it, she's one of the top varsity soccer coaches in the county. She's tireless, and she works hard. She believes in the program and her students, and it shows every day."

Keeping a piece of Dade City history alive

When Jo and Bob Larkin bought the R.D. Sistrunk House at the corner of 14th Street and Church Avenue, they knew they were buying a property with a rich history — that required a lot of work.

“We renovated the house completely,” said Jo Larkin, who has a title company and previously owned an antiques shop.

Her husband, Bob, who is a builder, said it was the most extensive renovation project he’s ever tackled.

“It had plaster walls inside, and so we gutted all of the walls and ceilings.

“The only thing that was left from before we started remodeling was the frame walls, the siding and the flooring.

“We took out all of the electrical and all of the plumbing, anything in there except, for the structure,” Bob said.

The couple purchased the Sistrunk House in 2004 from Earl McKinney, a man they’d known all of their lives.

“Earl was not well,” Jo said. “One of the reasons that we got the house, truly, is because Earl had been over to see me, when I had the bed and breakfast (The Lark Inn, next door), and he couldn’t believe what Bob and I had done.

“He said, ‘I never had the money to do to this house, what I wanted to do.’

He asked Jo: ‘Do you think you and Bob would take this on?’

When Bob gutted the Sistrunk House, he found out where a lot of the original stuff had been located, Jo said. “He put it back originally, the way it was.”

There’s original glass in a window looking onto Church Avenue, and in the beveled glass front door. Much of the lighting is original, too.

There’s only been four owners since the house was built in the early 1890s. First, there was Laura Inglis, of Iowa; then Dr. Sistrunk, a beloved Dade City physician, and his family. Earl McKinney bought it in the early ’70s, and then the Larkins.

During the restoration, a library was created by enclosing a porch; a reading room was made by enclosing a gazebo; and a carport was converted into a kitchen.

Upstairs, Bob created new spaces, too.

“You have to understand, there were no bathrooms or closets when we got this. So, what Bob did, was — he bumped out the walls, and he added a closet and he added a bathroom,” Jo said.

The list of work done during the renovation goes on and on.

After giving the home new life, the couple loaded it up with interesting items.

“This is the fun part of doing houses,” Jo said. “You can tell I had an antique store.”

There’s a piece of furniture known as a “Larkin Side by Side,” which was available from the Larkin Soap Company. The soap company gave out stamps with soap purchases, which customers saved to buy items from a catalog.

There are conversation pieces throughout the 4,000-square-foot home, which has 13 rooms, including three bedrooms and three baths.

Jo is thrilled that her home was selected to be featured as the Dade City Garden Club’s annual ornament.

She buys the ornament every year. “In fact, all of my sisters, who have moved away, I buy for them and ship it to them because they all want it. Bob’s sister, too. It’s a great gift. It just reminds you of home, so many great things.

“I think it’s such a shame that Earl died and could not see what has happened with the home. That kind of thing would have just made his day.


“If anybody was in love with his home, it was Earl. He really was obsessed with it.

“He was a real character.

“He was interesting to talk to, but you never knew what Earl was going to say, and you never knew what was embellishment and what was the truth.”

The couple has the house on the market now, as they plan the next phase of their lives.

Dade City Garden Club annual ornament

The Dade City Garden Club’s annual ornament this year features The R.D. Sistrunk House, which is located at the corner of 14th Street and Church Avenue.

The two-story wood-frame house, at 3741 Church Ave., was the home of one of Dade City’s prominent pioneer doctors, Dr. Robert Don Sistrunk. Originally, it was a plain two-story square box, finished by Laura Inglis, from Iowa, in the early 1890s.

Doctor Sistrunk and his bride, Frances Bedgood, moved to the Church Street home in 1906. They remodeled it extensively in 1910, enlarging it, and adding porches and arts and crafts-style columns. They lived in the house the rest of their lives.

Earl McKinney bought the house in the early 1970s. He added porches, gazebos, and replaced the arts and crafts columns.

When McKinney’s health was deteriorating, he approached Bob and Jo Larkin about buying the house and restoring it. The Larkins bought the house in 2003 and began renovations in 2005.

The ornament commemorating the Sistrunk House is available for \$22, by check only, from the Greater Dade City Chamber.




