MIDNIGHT COURT SESSION AT SABA

On Tuesday, Febr. 25, 1964, a midnight court session was held at Saba.

It all started on Monday when one of the owners of the land on which the road from the airport at Flat Point to Hell's Gate, is built decided to close the road - According to information on Monday Febr. 24, Mr. Lambert Johnson, an heir to the land on which the road leading from the airport to Hell's Gate has been built, closed the road by planting two posts (one of each side of the road) with the sign "NO TRESPASSING Atr. 483" and putting a heavy chain across the from post to post - He stood at the roadblock and refused to allow any jeeps to pass the roadblock unless a dollar was paid.

This was the situation, which Judge, Mr. J.V.M. van Koot, Prosecutor, Mr. F.C. Flick and Court Recorder, M.A. de Lannoy found when they arrived at Saba on Monday afternoon about 5 o'clock.

It was known that the next day, Tuesday Febr. 25, many flights had been scheduled and that about 30 tourists would be flown into Saba by the Windward Islands Airways - Since this is the only road by which the tourists would be able to get from the airport to the residential areas as well as the only road by which the mails and other
